Bengaluru. Mar 15 (PTI):

The Karnataka High Court on Tuesday said Hijab was not part of the essential religious practice in Islamic faith and effectively upheld the ban against the headscarf in educational institutions in the state by dismissing pleas from Muslim girls seeking nod to wear it in classrooms.

A three-judge full bench of the High Court said the prescription of school uniform is only a reasonable restriction, constitutionally permissible which the students cannot object to, even as the aggrieved petitioner Muslim girls said they would continue their legal battle and termed todav's order as "unconstitutional."

The court suggested the possibility of some 'unseen hands' behind the hiiab row to engineer social unrest and disharmony and expressed dismay over the issue being blown out of proportion during the academic term.

CRPF for additional helipads in LWE areas

New Delhi, Mar 15 (PTI):

The CRPF is mulling creation of more night landing capable helipads as air evacuation of its injured troops from remote Left Wing Extremism-affected areas remains a sore point for the force.

The paramilitary force has deployed close to 40 percent of its total strength (about 1.20 lakh personnel) for anti-Naxal operations in various states with its troops and special jungle warfare units like the Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (CoBRA) undertaking a "decisive battle" in some of the worst violence affected areas Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Bihar.

The force, as per senior officers and documents accessed by PTI, is establishing at least 30 new forward operating bases (FOB) in jungles Chhattisgarh (south Bastar) while about half-adozen such locations are being scouted in Jharkhand and Bihar as

part of the strategy of "moving deep into the Maoist stronghold and hitting them hard."

The government has said the number of Left Wing Extremism (LWE) districts in the country has come down from 126 to 70 over the last few years and it is working to better these numbers.

"Helipads are a pre-requisite to meet any contingency while implementing the government's strategy of going deep. During an encounter or IED blast in these far flung areas, air evacuation of injured troops is the most important factor so that they can get quick medical care and lives are saved." a senior officer deployed in the LWE operations grid said.

Now, he adds, here is the catch. "There have been numerous instances when troops undertaking an operation secured a landing site near them but the helicopters got delayed or pilots refused the sortie due to a variety of technical reasons. The 'golden hour' is lost," he said.

The Centre on Tuesday told the Supreme Court that as on March 13 this year, a total of over 180

crore doses of COVID-19 vaccines has been administered in the country and 77,314 adverse events, which come to 0.004 per cent, have been reported.

The government said that over 8.91 crore doses of vaccine Covaxin has been administered in the age group of 15-18 years as on March 12 and the number of adverse events following immunization (AEFI) reported are 1,739 minor, 81 serious, and six severe.

Gavai that a substantial number of individuals in the country are vaccinated and the vaccines have proved to be very effective and safe

It said both vaccines --Covaxin and Covishield -generate antibodies and adverse events are also found to be minimum.

Further the efficacy, safety, and immunogenicity of these vaccines, which are rolled out after an elaborate procedure by domain experts, are also accepted by World Health Organisation which shows recognition by

Over 204 killed, 81 injured in elephant attacks

Raipur, Mar 15: At least 204 people were killed and 81 injured in elephant attacks, while 45 pachyderms died due to various reasons, including electrocution, in Chhattisgarh in the last three years, the state legislative Assembly was informed on Tuesday.

In a reply to a question by BJP MLA Rajneesh Kumar Singh, state Forest and Climate Change Mohammad Minister Akbar said that 72,112

life and damage to crops and properties in elephant attacks were registered in the state from January 1, 2019 to February 1 this year. As many as 204 people have died and 81 sustained injuries in elephant attacks, while 63,603 cases of crop damage, 5,232 of damage to houses and 2,992 of other property damages were reported in the last three years, he said in a written reply

Over Rs 60.5 crore were paid in compensation in these cases during this period, the minister said, adding that compensation to the tune of over Rs 1.01 crore was pending in 664 of these cases.

On October 7, the state government notified an area of 1,995.48 sq km (in northern Chhattisgarh) as Lemru elephant reserve. At least 39 coal mines in two coal blocks - Mand Raigarh and Hasdeo Arand - fall within limits of Lemru elephant reserve. Under the Forest (Conservation) Act 1980, the Central government has not permitted mining in any of the mines in the elephant reserve area, the minister said in the reply.



The polling for 109 civic bodies, including three municipal corporations, is scheduled to be held on March 24. After the withdrawal of nomination papers, 569 candidates are vying for the post of either chairperson or mayor, while 5.842 nominees are seeking election for the post of either councilor or corporator, the SEC said.

As many as 102 candi-

nations filed for the post of either chairperson or mayor, while 539 people opted out of the elections for the post of either councillor or corporator, the SEC said. The SEC has asked the district magistrates cum collectors to ensure that the ongoing campaigning for the urban polls ends at 5 PM on March 22, 48 hours before the polling. As per rules, no person shall convene, hold or attend any public meeting in any polling area during the period of 48 hours before voting. SEC Secretary R N Sahu, in a letter to all district collectors, said that public meetings and campaigning in any mode should be positively stopped at 5 PM on

High range areas of Walayar in Palakkad and Vellamunda in Wayanad were affected by wildfires occurred on Saturday and Sunday respectively, forest officials said and added that similar incidents were reported earlier in the month also in these two districts.

Wayanad North DFO, Darshan Gattani IFS, speaking to PTI, said the recent wildfire occurred in the grassland areas of the for-



est region of the district. He said that while the actual reason for the fire has to be determined, the extreme heat, rising temperatures, wind conditions and hilly terrain were contributing factors. Besides the recent wildfire incident, others were also reported earlier in the month from various parts of the district like

In just the past two months, the US presence in Europe has jumped from about 80,000 troops to about 100,000, which is nearly as many as were there in 1997 when the United States and its NATO allies began an expansion of the alliance that Putin says threatens Russia and must be reversed. By comparison, in 1991, the year the Soviet Union dissolved. the United States had 305,000 troops in Europe, including 224,000 in Germany alone, according to Pentagon records. The number then dropped steadily, reaching 101,000 in 2005 and about 64,000 as recently as 2020.

COVID-19 cases more than double in China

Beijing, Mar 15 (AP):

China's new COVID-19 cases Tuesday more than doubled from the previous day as the country faces by far its biggest outbreak since the early days of the pandemic.

The National Health Commission said 3,507 new locally spread cases had been identified in the latest 24-hour period, up from 1,337 a day earlier.

A fast-spreading variant known as 'stealth omicron' is testing China's zero-tolerance strategy, which had kept the virus at bay since the deadly initial outbreak in the city of Wuhan in early 2020. China has recorded more than 10.000 cases in the first two weeks of March, far exceeding previous flare-ups. No new deaths have been reported

across China, and the case count remains low compared to many other places in the world. The UK recorded more than 444,000 cases in the past week. Hong Kong, a semi-autonomous city that tracks its outbreak separately from the mainland, reported 26,908 new cases.

Nearly three-fourths of China's new infections were in Jilin, a province in the northeast that reported 2,601 cases. Smaller outbreaks have hit more than a dozen provinces and major cities including Beijing and Shanghai.

Jilin has barred residents from leaving the province and from traveling between cities within it. The 9 million residents of Changchun, the provincial capital and an auto manufacturing hub, have been locked down since Friday as authorities conduct repeated rounds of mass testing both there and in the city of Jilin.

Inspiring scientific collaboration

he Centre said that the campaign will include children in the age dren in the age group of 12-14 years and that the country's second indigenous vaccine, Corbevax, will be rolled out for the new group. The Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) had granted emergency use authorisation to Corbevax, for use on children between ages of 12-18. This is the second vaccine to be approved for use in the 12-18 age category. Zydus Cadila's threedose COVID-19 vaccine ZyCoV-D was the first jab to get approval from the DCGI for use on all individuals above the age of 12. Bharat Biotech's Covaxin has been used to inoculate teenagers in the 15-18 years category from January onward. Serum Institute of India (SII) has sought EUA from India's drug regulator for its COVID-19 vaccine Covovax for ages 12 to 17 group. Corbevax will inspire more scientific collaborations without intellectual property rights like patents and open source technology for humanity. The story of Corbevax is inspiring for international scientific cooperation. Two years ago, when a pair of Houston scientists first began crafting a cheap, easy-to-make COVID-19 vaccine, they had a tough time finding support for it at home in the US, a country that rewards expensive, flashy new tech. But the team at the Texas Children's Hospital Centre for Vaccine Development at Baylor College of Medicine, led by Dr Maria Elena Bottazzi and Peter Hotez, worked on their patent-free vaccine with donated money in relative obscurity, failing to garner much outside interest. Then one thing finally broke through and spoke to the people who had been overlooking their open-science approach to the vaccine known by its first producer as Corbevax. It came without strings or a secret formula, making it a true humanitarian pursuit that could finally reach the unvaccinated corners of the developing world. Bottazzi and Hotez, both pioneers in the field of immunology, run Baylor's National School of Tropical Medicine and have been developing coronavirus vaccines for more than a decade, including formulas for the SARS and MERS Their vaccine uses the same recombinant protein technology already used for decades in the hepatitis B vaccine, a common childhood shot. The vaccine technology has no intellectual property rights attached to it. That means the building blocks of the vaccine can be had for the price of a phone call. Once produced, the vaccine can be sold to governments for far less than any other vaccine currently on the market. much of the praise for Corbevax and its Texas inventors seems to be their willingness and that of Biological E and the investors to forgo a large profit in favour of the more altruistic goal of better access and distribution of the vaccine. Bottazzi and Hotez were nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize for practicing what Hotez calls 'Texas vaccine diplomacy,' by creating a path for the entire world to be inoculated. Earlier in the week, members of America's influential Congressional Hispanic Caucus have urged US President Joe Biden to champion vaccine collaboration with India to bring an end to the COVID-19 pandemic. In a letter to Biden, Texas delegation members and other members (Hispanic areas), requested the administration to lead distribution of low-cost vaccines to low-income nations with low vaccination rates to save millions of lives and bring an end to the worldwide pandemic. The lawmakers urged the President to use the two vaccines which are a result of India-US collaborations for the global good and to end vaccine inequity through Corbevax and Covovax. While the Corbevax vaccine is patent-free, another vaccine, developed by American biotechnology company Novavax, is in production in India and its export is planned to the COVAX facility.

Comparing hijab debates

he Karnataka High Court pronounced its judgment in the hijab case. The court has upheld the government's order and dismissed petitions challenging the ban on hijab in educational institutes. The petitioners for hijab plan to move the Supreme Court after reading the full high court order. Wearing of hijab is not a part of Essential Religious Practice in Islamic faith and thus, is not protected under Article 25 of the Constitution, the Karnataka High Court has held. An important question before the Court in this case was whether wearing of hijab is part of essential religious practise of Islam and whether State interference in such matters is warranted. The court was also called to consider whether wearing of hijab partakes the character of right to expression under Article 19(1)(a) of the Constitution and whether restriction can be levied only under Article 19(2). Internationally, particularly in Europe, the hijab is often in controversy as personal attire, not just school or work uniform. The debate over hijab in Europe is even more extreme than in India. The latest controversy over the hijab erupted in October last year. Ironically, the trigger was an anti-discrimination video campaign launched by the Council of Europe. The video caused an uproar in France. The French minister Sarah El Hairy, spoke out forcefully against the video and claimed credit for the Council's decision to withdraw it from circulation. Right-wing politicians such as Marine le Pen and Michel Barnier and prominent television pundits added their voices to the criticism of the campaign. France is not the only European country that restricts the hijab. The inflow of Muslim immigrants to Europe and the threat of violent Islamist groups have made Muslim minorities a target of hostility and discrimination, and the hijab has become a visual symbol of these tensions. Of the 27 EU member states and the United Kingdom, nine have some legal restriction on veiling; there have been legislative proposals to limit the practice in five more. In countries with no national restrictions, some regions have decided independently to ban face coverings. There are only six EU countries, Croatia, Cyprus, Greece, Poland, Portugal and Romania where there has been no public debate so far on restricting the veil. But there is nuance in the interaction between prior levels of religiosity and modernisation. Need to compare debates regarding hijab.

Law to protect camel is contributing to its decline in Rajasthan



amels were once a prized possession for breeders in Rajasthan. Madhavram Raika, a breeder from Pali district, said that his father owned 150 camels. Of these, both young and adult male camels would be sold at a handsome price, sustaining the family for

A law in 2015, the Rajasthan Camel (Prohibition of Slaughter and Regulation of Temporary Migration or Export) Act, that aimed to protect the state animal, however, is contributing to its downfall, lament breeders. The price of the animal has dipped so much and the losses have been so high that those like Madhavram have had to sell all their camels, even as others are struggling for sustenance, bringing down the total number of camels in the state significantly.

'Koi fayda nahin hua (There has been no gain),' Madhavram said about the state government's decision to declare the camel as the state animal back in 2014. 'We thought that after being declared the state animal, our animals' and our future would look brighter. But that has not been the case. On top of that, the 2015 law restricting selling our animals outside the state has caused the prices to dip by a large margin,' he said. Prices of camels have dropped by 80-90 percent from the price that they would fetch earlier. Hariram Raika, another camel breeder from Manigar village in the same district, chipped in, 'Before 2015 when the Act came into being,' he said, 'an eight-ten-month-old camel would be sold for Rs 15,000 or more. Now we hardly get Rs 3000 for a three-fouryear-old animal.' The animals would mostly be sold to buyers in Punjab, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, and Himachal Pradesh. Most of them would be farmers who use the camel for agricultural purposes, or for

milk; the camel is also used to carry heavy loads and for transportation. The Raika community are pastoralists and have been known to herd camels for a livelihood for centuries. Hardships have come in many forms over the years, but the community has fought through it all. This time, however, their very source of sustenance is at risk

'In the Pushkar Mela in 2019, for instance, for the first time ever, there were more horses on sale. They fetched better prices,' Hanwant Singh Rathore, director of Lokhit Pashu Palak Sansthan, a hody of camel breeders in Rajasthan. said. 'A six-month-old camel calf was earlier sold at Rs 10,000. Now it is sold at Rs 1000-1500. In desperation, people have begun selling their camels in hordes.' The Pushkar Mela, also known as the Pushkar Camel Fair, is an annual fair in which domestic animals, mostly camels, horses, and cattle are traded with buvers from across the country.

The 2015 law has changed that. As a result, the total camel population in the state has nosedived, Rathore said. The 20th Livestock Census shows that in 2012, the total number of camels in the state was 3.25 lakh. By 2019, this number had dipped to 2.13 lakh, a dip of almost 35 percent in just seven years. 'That's the official census,' Rathore told, 'We estimate the number to be even lower, at 1.5 lakh (150,000). And it's reducing every month.' Ironically, it was the camel breeders who wanted a law in place to prevent their animals from being sold outside the state, but they had two specific demands: that their animals should not be sold for slaughter, and that any kind of ban on sale should be applied only to female camels. 'We heard about the first instance of camel slaughter in 2002. So we wanted a ban but only on the sale of female camels who are the source

of life,' Rathore said. 'But when the Act was passed, there was a blanket ban on the sale of both male and female camels. This stopped all trade and hit us bad.' The law, however, is not the only reason why camel breeders are struggling. Loss of grazing land for their animals is another reason. Pastoralists like Hariram Raika for instance said that for generations, their animals would graze openly and venture into the forests of Kumbalgarh for two months in a year, during the monsoons. 'But once it was declared a wildlife sanctuary, we were no longer allowed,' he said

'Earlier we would earn as much as Rs 2-2.5 lakh a year by selling our animals,' Hariram said, 'Now (after the law) we make about Rs 25,000-30,000. This has severely impacted our economic status. From 60 camels, he now has 30, selling the rest in desperation since he could no longer afford their upkeep.

For Madhavram, things have been even more drastic. He now herds others' camels, and earns a monthly income of Rs 8.000. His lowered economic prowess affected his family, leading to domestic problems, and finally forcing his wife to work as a daily wage worker to run their house. Theirs are not uncommon stories. And the proof is in the depleting numbers of the camel. In a village called Ansh Ki Dhani in the Pali district where 100 families live, back in 1991, there were 5,000 camels. Now there are just 200. In another village called Jodhawar Ki Dhani, there were 7,000-8,000 camels about six years back; now there are just

In most cases, breeders are now letting go of the male camels to fend for themselves, while trying to keep the females. There has been an unprecedented rise in the number of stray camels in recent times, Rathore said. In desperation, some people have resorted to selling their animals illegally, walking across the state border on foot for trade. he added.

In a bid to check the declining camel population, the state government started a Camel Development Scheme in 2016 to give an incentive of Rs 10,000 for every newborn calf in three installments. Many breeders however could not avail of this incentive, and some did not get the final installment, making this scheme unsuccessful. As an alternative means of livelihood, breeders have begun to sell camel milk. This was after much persuasion since it went against their traditional beliefs. Camel milk has often been touted as a superfood, claimed to be beneficial for autism, diabetes, liver disease, iaundice, even cancer, Camel Charisma is one such initiative through which breeders of the Lokhit Pashu Palak Sansthan now sell camel milk. 'Through this, a family can earn between Rs 18,000 to Rs 30,000 a month,' Rathore said. Camel Charisma pays Rs. 60 per litre of camel milk to the breeders. They also make camel milk products like cheese and soap; even camel poop paper. Things, however, are moving slowly. Competitive pricing in comparison to cow's milk or buffalo's, and a lack of demand among the general populace because of inadequate marketing, they feel, is the reason behind this. Lack of infrastructure in the cold chain is another challenge. Ilse Kohler-Rollefson, who has been engaged in camel research for more than 30 years and is a co-founder of Lokhit Pashu Palan Sanstan, added that there is a huge demand for camel milk outside India, 'particularly China', but because of lack of infrastructure. they haven't been able to meet the need.

'We think that if the 2015 law is amended, we will be able to save our animals,' Hariram Raika said, 'Otherwise the next five years will be critical for our camels.

The state government had formed a committee to look into the issues after the camel breeders staged a protest against the ban during the 2019 Pushkar Mela. In the list of recommendations submitted thereafter, the breeders asked, in addition to amendment of the law, to include camel milk in mid-day meals in schools, to promote it in the market, and for free-range grazing rights.

An official of the Animal Husbandry department has now assured that the process to amend the law is underway. 'There is a proposal of amendments that have been cleared by the law ministry and will soon be introduced in the assembly,' the official told. 'The new provisions would be such that except for slaughter, breeders would be able to send their animals across the state's borders and earn their revenue.' There is no estimate of when this would happen so it is still a wait-and-watch game for the camel breeders of Rajasthan

Over Rs 53,600 cr GST compensation yet to be released to states

New Delhi, Mar 15 (PTI):

Over Rs 53,600 crore of GST compensation for the current fiscal is yet to be released to the states. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said in the Rajya Sabha on Tuesday.

So far this fiscal, Rs 96,576 crore has been released to the states on account of GST compensation, and an additional Rs 1.59 lakh crore has been given as back-to-back loan to make good the revenue shortfall on account of Goods and Services Tax (GST) implementation.

Under the Goods and Services Tax (GST) law, states were guaranteed to be compensated bi-monthly for any loss of revenue in the first five years of GST implementation from July 1,2017.

The shortfall is calculated assuming a 14 per cent annual growth in GST collections by states over the base year of 2015-16.

"Centre is committed to full release GST Compensation to the States/UTs as per GST (Compensation to States) Act, 2017 for the transition period by extending the levy of Compensation cess beyond 5 years to meet the GST revenue shortfall as well as servicing the loan borrowed through special window scheme,' Sitharaman said.

Giving details of GST compensation yet to be released to the states for current fiscal ending March, the minister said Rs 53,661 crore is yet to be released for the 2021-22 fiscal This include Rs 11,563

crore to be released to Maharashtra, Rs 6,954 crore to Uttar Pradesh, Rs 6,733 crore to Tamil Nadu. Rs 5.461 crore to Delhi and Rs 4.292 crore to West Bengal. Sitharaman further said

GST compensation for financial years 2017-18, 2018-19. 2019-20 and 2020-21 has already been paid to the

States/UTs. "The economic impact of the pandemic has led to higher compensation requirement due to lower GST collection and at the same time lower collection of GST compensation cess,' she said.

In a separate reply, Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary said the total GST collection during the current fiscal till February is over Rs 13.33 lakh crore. This include Central GST mop up of over Rs 2.43 lakh crore, Integrated GST of over Rs 6.87 lakh crore, State GST of over Rs 3.11 lakh crore and cess of Rs 90,442 crore.

"CGST is credited to Consolidated Fund of India (CFI) while SGST is credited to the Consolidated Fund of respective States. Out of this total IGST collected by the Centre, Centre received Rs 3 09 150 crore and Rs 2.60.467 crore have been received by the States by way of settlement (regular & adhoc) of IGST till February, 2022," Chaudhary

Sensex tumbles 709 pts on weak global trends






Indian campaign ends in Singapore after exit of Manika-Archana pair

Rising Indian shuttler Lakshya Sen rose a place to 11th in the men's singles chart, while double Olympic medallist PV Sindhu is static at the seventh spot among women in the latest BWF world rankings issued on Tuesday.

Sen has risen remarkably over the last few months in the BWF rankings riding on his impressive performances at the world stage. He currently has 70,086 points in the men's singles list which is being headed by Olympic champion Viktor Axelsen of Denmark, followed by Japan's Kento Momota and another Dane Anders Antonsen.

India's Kidambi Srikanth dropped a rung in the chart to be in the 12th spot with 69,158 points, while B Sai Praneeth also dropped a place to be in the 19th position. Sen rose up

the chart riding on his sensational form over the last six months, finishing runners-up at the German Open last week after his title-winning run at the India Open and his bronze medal feat at the World Championships

December last year. HS Prannoy and Sameer Verma are the next best placed Indians at the 24th and 26th spots respectively.

Among women, Sindhu has maintained her seventh spot with 90,994 points, while another Olympic medallist Sania Nehwal occupies the 28th position.

In the men's doubles rankings list, Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty are static at eight spot, while the next best Indians are MR Arjun and Dhruv Kapila in the 40th position. A 50 per cent rise in pediatric orthopaedic cases with complaints of excruciating pain in the neck and back have been noted in hospital OPDs with doctors attributing it primarily to wrong postures during online classes. The rise in multiple

Hospital in Jalandhar said, "Wrong sitting postures coupled with almost no physical activity are to be blamed.'

"Pediatric orthopaedic cases increased by 50 per cent. Most of them are overweight, have stamina and suffer from anxiety and attention deficit disorder," Dr Aggarwal said.

According Surbhit Rastogi, Paediatric Orthopaedic Consultant, Indian Spinal Injuries Centre, Vasant Kunj, a lot of children have been experiencing cervical neck and back stiffness observed mainly among the working adult population.

This is mainly attributed to children being confined to their homes and not getting exposed to sunlight, the doctor proper blood circulation said. "It's essential to observe some precautionary measures such as having calcium-rich diet, sunlight exposure, taking small breaks every half an hour, doing some stretching exercises, switching to ergonomic chairs with proper back support and adding some indoor and outdoor physical activities in the daily routine of kids," Dr Rastogi said.

Even teachers should ensure that during online classes they dedicate five minutes for some fun stretching activities, he said.

Ideally, one should stand upright for one minute after sitting for 10 minutes at a stretch. This helps to strengthen your back by ensuring and maintaining muscle tone, the doctor said. Parents should never

ignore such back and neck issues in their kids and should visit an orthopaedic if there is any such complaint. "Parents should be

concerned when their kids complain of pain in neck and back, even if an initial x-ray exam doesn't reveal a problem. "When children com-

plain of back pain, about a third of the time there's a serious reason, whether due to an injury, infection or a tumour. They should be imme-

diately rushed to the hospital," added Dr Vishal Gupta, Orthopedic Surgeon, Ujala Cygnus Rainbow Hospital, Agra.

India had sent a propos al to Pakistan on October 7 seeking the transit facility to send 50,000 tonnes of wheat to the people of Afghanistan via Pakistan and it received a positive response from Islamabad on November 24.

Following the Pakistani response, both sides were in touch to finalise the modalities for the transportation of the shipments. Each of the bags was stamped with the text: 'Gift from the people of India to the people of Afghanistan' in English, Pashto and Dari.

Ker ritual artist faces 'ban' to perform as son marries Muslim woman

Kannur (Ker), Mar 15 (PTI):

A Kerala artist is facing a "ban" to perform a ritual artform in local temple festivals here as his son married a Muslim woman at Karivelloor, a known Left bastion, in this north Kerala district.

Vinod Panicker, a known 'Poorakali-Marathukali' artist for the last 37 years, alleged that the management of some local temples informed him that he could not perform the traditional artform as he lives in the same house where his non-Hindu daughter-inlaw lives which is against rituals and customs.

The management committee of a temple, a shrine of Thiyya community here, even told him that if he shifts to some other place from his own house, where the non-Hindu woman resides, then he would be allowed to perform the rituals.

As he rejected their demand, they conducted the ritual with another artist recently, he said.

"I have clearly told them that I don't want to abandon my son and daughter-in-law or shift to any other house. I had been performing the ritual art for nearly four decades and it is such a pain to suffer this humiliation," Panicker said.

Claiming that the incident revealed the religious and communal mindset of the society, the artist said he is a follower of the teachings of Sree Narayana Guru, the saint-reformer who professed 'one caste, one religion and one God' for mankind. However, the temple

committee justified the action saying that rituals were not permitting to invite an artist for performance from a house where a non-Hindu person lives. The also said they did

not impose any ban but only informed Panicker that rituals could not be violated.

A temple management official said he was a Marxist party sympathiser but that does not mean that temple rituals need not be followed.

Karivelloor is a place where the ruling CPI(M) has deep roots.

As the issue triggered a controversy, senior Marxist Party leader and former minister E P Jayarajan came out criticising the temple management saying it was a 'grave lapse' from their side and the party was against that.

He also alleged that they had kept the development as a secret but now it has come to the public domain.

"Poorakkali" is a traditional dance ritual performed by men during the nine-day Pooram festival in Bhagavathy temples and sacred groves across Malabar (north Kerala).



Bengaluru. Mar 15 (PTI):

The Karnataka High Court on Tuesday said Hijab was not part of the essential religious practice in Islamic faith and effectively upheld the ban against the headscarf in educational institutions in the state by dismissing pleas from Muslim girls seeking nod to wear it in classrooms.

A three-judge full bench of the High Court said the prescription of school uniform is only a reasonable restriction, constitutionally permissible which the students cannot object to, even as the aggrieved petitioner Muslim girls said they would continue their legal battle and termed todav's order as "unconstitutional."

The court suggested the possibility of some 'unseen hands' behind the hiiab row to engineer social unrest and disharmony and expressed dismay over the issue being blown out of proportion during the academic term.

'Over 180 cr doses of COVID vaccines administered'

New Delhi, Mar 15 (PTI):

The Centre on Tuesday told the Supreme Court that as on March 13 this

year, a total of over 180 crore doses of COVID-19 vaccines has been administered in the country and 77,314 adverse events, which come to 0.004 per cent, have been reported.

The government said that over 8.91 crore doses of vaccine Covaxin has been administered in the age group of 15-18 years as on March 12 and the number of adverse events following immunization (AEFI) reported are 1,739 minor, 81 serious, and six severe.

The Centre told a bench

of Justices L N Rao and B R Gavai that a substantial number of individuals in the country are vaccinated and the vaccines have proved to be very effective and safe

It said both vaccines --Covaxin and Covishield -generate antibodies and adverse events are also found to be minimum.

Further the efficacy, safety, and immunogenicity of these vaccines, which are rolled out after an elaborate procedure by domain experts, are also accepted by World Health Organisation which shows recognition by

In a reply to a question by BJP MLA Rajneesh Kumar Singh, state Forest and Climate Change Mohammad Minister Akbar said that 72,112

life and damage to crops and properties in elephant attacks were registered in the state from January 1, 2019 to February 1 this year. As many as 204 people have died and 81 sustained injuries in elephant attacks, while 63,603 cases of crop damage, 5,232 of damage to houses and 2,992 of other property damages were reported in the last three years, he said in a written reply

Over Rs 60.5 crore were paid in compensation in these cases during this period, the minister said, adding that compensation to the tune of over Rs 1.01 crore was pending in 664 of these cases.

On October 7, the state government notified an area of 1,995.48 sq km (in northern Chhattisgarh) as Lemru elephant reserve. At least 39 coal mines in two coal blocks - Mand Raigarh and Hasdeo Arand - fall within limits of Lemru elephant reserve. Under the Forest (Conservation) Act 1980, the Central government has not permitted mining in any of the mines in the elephant reserve area, the minister said in the reply.

Ukraine war may lead to rethinking of US defence of Europe

Washington, Mar 15 (AP):

Russian Vladimir Putin's war in Ukraine and his push to upend the broader security order in Europe may lead to a historic shift in American thinking about defence of the continent. Depending on how far Putin goes, this could mean a buildup of US military power in Europe not seen since the Cold War. The prospect of a bigger US military footprint in Europe is a remarkable turnaround from just two years ago.

In 2020, President Donald Trump ordered thousands of American troops out of Germany as part of his argument that Europeans were undeserving allies. Just days after taking office, President Joe Biden stopped the withdrawal before it could start, and his administration has stressed NATO's importance even as Biden identifies China as the main

In just the past two months, the US presence in Europe has jumped from about 80,000 troops to about 100,000, which is nearly as many as were there in 1997 when the United States and its NATO allies began an expansion of the alliance that Putin says threatens Russia and must be reversed. By comparison, in 1991, the year the Soviet Union dissolved. the United States had 305,000 troops in Europe, including 224,000 in Germany alone, according to Pentagon records. The number then dropped steadily, reaching 101,000 in 2005 and about 64,000 as recently as 2020.

Beijing, Mar 15 (AP):

China's new COVID-19 cases Tuesday more than doubled from the previous day as the country faces by far its biggest outbreak since the early days of the pandemic.

The National Health Commission said 3,507 new locally spread cases had been identified in the latest 24-hour period, up from 1,337 a day earlier.

A fast-spreading variant known as 'stealth omicron' is testing China's zero-tolerance strategy, which had kept the virus at bay since the deadly initial outbreak in the city of Wuhan in early 2020. China has recorded more than 10.000 cases in the first two weeks of March, far exceeding previous flare-ups. No new deaths have been reported

across China, and the case count remains low compared to many other places in the world. The UK recorded more than 444,000 cases in the past week. Hong Kong, a semi-autonomous city that tracks its outbreak separately from the mainland, reported 26,908 new cases.

Nearly three-fourths of China's new infections were in Jilin, a province in the northeast that reported 2,601 cases. Smaller outbreaks have hit more than a dozen provinces and major cities including Beijing and Shanghai.

Jilin has barred residents from leaving the province and from traveling between cities within it The 9 million residents of Changchun, the provincial capital and an auto manufacturing hub, have been locked down since Friday as authorities conduct repeated rounds of mass testing both there and in the city of Jilin.

Inspiring scientific collaboration

he Centre said that the campaign will include children in the age dren in the age group of 12-14 years and that the country's second indigenous vaccine, Corbevax, will be rolled out for the new group. The Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) had granted emergency use authorisation to Corbevax, for use on children between ages of 12-18. This is the second vaccine to be approved for use in the 12-18 age category. Zydus Cadila's threedose COVID-19 vaccine ZyCoV-D was the first jab to get approval from the DCGI for use on all individuals above the age of 12. Bharat Biotech's Covaxin has been used to inoculate teenagers in the 15-18 years category from January onward. Serum Institute of India (SII) has sought EUA from India's drug regulator for its COVID-19 vaccine Covovax for ages 12 to 17 group. Corbevax will inspire more scientific collaborations without intellectual property rights like patents and open source technology for humanity. The story of Corbevax is inspiring for international scientific cooperation. Two years ago, when a pair of Houston scientists first began crafting a cheap, easy-to-make COVID-19 vaccine, they had a tough time finding support for it at home in the US, a country that rewards expensive, flashy new tech. But the team at the Texas Children's Hospital Centre for Vaccine Development at Baylor College of Medicine, led by Dr Maria Elena Bottazzi and Peter Hotez, worked on their patent-free vaccine with donated money in relative obscurity, failing to garner much outside interest. Then one thing finally broke through and spoke to the people who had been overlooking their open-science approach to the vaccine known by its first producer as Corbevax. It came without strings or a secret formula, making it a true humanitarian pursuit that could finally reach the unvaccinated corners of the developing world. Bottazzi and Hotez, both pioneers in the field of immunology, run Baylor's National School of Tropical Medicine and have been developing coronavirus vaccines for more than a decade, including formulas for the SARS and MERS Their vaccine uses the same recombinant protein technology already used for decades in the hepatitis B vaccine, a common childhood shot. The vaccine technology has no intellectual property rights attached to it. That means the building blocks of the vaccine can be had for the price of a phone call. Once produced, the vaccine can be sold to governments for far less than any other vaccine currently on the market. much of the praise for Corbevax and its Texas inventors seems to be their willingness and that of Biological E and the investors to forgo a large profit in favour of the more altruistic goal of better access and distribution of the vaccine. Bottazzi and Hotez were nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize for practicing what Hotez calls 'Texas vaccine diplomacy,' by creating a path for the entire world to be inoculated. Earlier in the week, members of America's influential Congressional Hispanic Caucus have urged US President Joe Biden to champion vaccine collaboration with India to bring an end to the COVID-19 pandemic. In a letter to Biden, Texas delegation members and other members (Hispanic areas), requested the administration to lead distribution of low-cost vaccines to low-income nations with low vaccination rates to save millions of lives and bring an end to the worldwide pandemic. The lawmakers urged the President to use the two vaccines which are a result of India-US collaborations for the global good and to end vaccine inequity through Corbevax and Covovax. While the Corbevax vaccine is patent-free, another vaccine, developed by American biotechnology company Novavax, is in production in India and its export is planned to the COVAX facility.

he Karnataka High Court pronounced its judgment in the hijab case. The court has upheld the government's order and dismissed petitions challenging the ban on hijab in educational institutes. The petitioners for hijab plan to move the Supreme Court after reading the full high court order. Wearing of hijab is not a part of Essential Religious Practice in Islamic faith and thus, is not protected under Article 25 of the Constitution, the Karnataka High Court has held. An important question before the Court in this case was whether wearing of hijab is part of essential religious practise of Islam and whether State interference in such matters is warranted. The court was also called to consider whether wearing of hijab partakes the character of right to expression under Article 19(1)(a) of the Constitution and whether restriction can be levied only under Article 19(2). Internationally, particularly in Europe, the hijab is often in controversy as personal attire, not just school or work uniform. The debate over hijab in Europe is even more extreme than in India. The latest controversy over the hijab erupted in October last year. Ironically, the trigger was an anti-discrimination video campaign launched by the Council of Europe. The video caused an uproar in France. The French minister Sarah El Hairy, spoke out forcefully against the video and claimed credit for the Council's decision to withdraw it from circulation. Right-wing politicians such as Marine le Pen and Michel Barnier and prominent television pundits added their voices to the criticism of the campaign. France is not the only European country that restricts the hijab. The inflow of Muslim immigrants to Europe and the threat of violent Islamist groups have made Muslim minorities a target of hostility and discrimination, and the hijab has become a visual symbol of these tensions. Of the 27 EU member states and the United Kingdom, nine have some legal restriction on veiling; there have been legislative proposals to limit the practice in five more. In countries with no national restrictions, some regions have decided independently to ban face coverings. There are only six EU countries, Croatia, Cyprus, Greece, Poland, Portugal and Romania where there has been no public debate so far on restricting the veil. But there is nuance in the interaction between prior levels of religiosity and modernisation. Need to compare debates regarding hijab.

Law to protect camel is contributing to its decline in Rajasthan



amels were once a prized possession for breeders in Rajasthan. Madhavram Raika, a breeder from Pali district, said that his father owned 150 camels. Of these, both young and adult male camels would be sold at a handsome price, sustaining the family for decades.

A law in 2015, the Rajasthan Camel (Prohibition of Slaughter and Regulation of Temporary Migration or Export) Act, that aimed to protect the state animal, however, is contributing to its downfall, lament breeders. The price of the animal has dipped so much and the losses have been so high that those like Madhavram have had to sell all their camels, even as others are struggling for sustenance, bringing down the total number of camels in the state significantly.

'Koi fayda nahin hua (There has been no gain),' Madhavram said about the state government's decision to declare the camel as the state animal back in 2014. 'We thought that after being declared the state animal, our animals' and our future would look brighter. But that has not been the case. On top of that, the 2015 law restricting selling our animals outside the state has caused the prices to dip by a large margin,' he said. Prices of camels have dropped by 80-90 percent from the price that they would fetch earlier. Hariram Raika, another camel breeder from Manigar village in the same district, chipped in, 'Before 2015 when the Act came into being,' he said, 'an eight-ten-month-old camel would be sold for Rs 15,000 or more. Now we hardly get Rs 3000 for a three-fouryear-old animal.' The animals would mostly be sold to buyers in Punjab, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, and Himachal Pradesh. Most of them would be farmers who use the camel for agricultural purposes, or for

milk; the camel is also used to carry heavy loads and for transportation. The Raika community are pastoralists and have been known to herd camels for a livelihood for centuries. Hardships have come in many forms over the years, but the community has fought through it all. This time, however, their very source of sustenance is at risk.

'In the Pushkar Mela in 2019, for instance, for the first time ever, there were more horses on sale. They fetched better prices,' Hanwant Singh Rathore, director of Lokhit Pashu Palak Sansthan, abody of camel breeders in Rajasthan, said. 'A six-month-old camel calf was earlier sold at Rs 10,000. Now it is sold at Rs 1000-1500. In desperation, people have begun selling their camels in hordes.' The Pushkar Mela, also known as the Pushkar Camel Fair, is an annual fair in which domestic animals, mostly camels, horses, and cattle are traded with buyers from across the country.

The 2015 law has changed that. As a result, the total camel population in the state has nosedived, Rathore said. The 20th Livestock Census shows that in 2012, the total number of camels in the state was 3.25 lakh. By 2019, this number had dipped to 2.13 lakh, a dip of almost 35 percent in just seven years. 'That's the official census,' Rathore told, 'We estimate the number to be even lower, at 1.5 lakh (150,000). And it's reducing every month.' Ironically, it was the camel breeders who wanted a law in place to prevent their animals from being sold outside the state, but they had two specific demands: that their animals should not be sold for slaughter, and that any kind of ban on sale should be applied only to female camels. 'We heard about the first instance of camel slaughter in 2002. So we wanted a ban but only on the sale of female camels who are the source

of life,' Rathore said. 'But when the Act was passed, there was a blanket ban on the sale of both male and female camels. This stopped all trade and hit us bad.' The law, however, is not the only reason why camel breeders are struggling. Loss of grazing land for their animals is another reason. Pastoralists like Hariram Raika for instance said that for generations, their animals would graze openly and venture into the forests of Kumbalgarh for two months in a year, during the monsoons. 'But once it was declared a wildlife sanctuary, we were no longer allowed,' he said.

'Earlier we would earn as much as Rs 2-2.5 lakh a year by selling our animals,' Hariram said, 'Now (after the law) we make about Rs 25,000-30,000. This has severely impacted our economic status.' From 60 camels, he now has 30, selling the rest in desperation since he could no longer afford their upkeep.

For Madhavram, things have been even more drastic. He now herds others' camels, and earns a monthly income of Rs 8.000. His lowered economic prowess affected his family, leading to domestic problems, and finally forcing his wife to work as a daily wage worker to run their house. Theirs are not uncommon stories. And the proof is in the depleting numbers of the camel. In a village called Ansh Ki Dhani in the Pali district where 100 families live, back in 1991, there were 5,000 camels. Now there are just 200. In another village called Jodhawar Ki Dhani, there were 7,000-8,000 camels about six years back; now there are just

In most cases, breeders are now letting go of the male camels to fend for themselves, while trying to keep the females. There has been an unprecedented rise in the number of stray camels in recent times, Rathore said. In desperation, some people have resorted to selling their animals illegally, walking across the state border on foot for trade, he added.

In a bid to check the declining camel population, the state government started a Camel Development Scheme in 2016 to give an incentive of Rs 10,000 for every newborn calf in three installments. Many breeders however could not avail of this incentive, and some did not get the final installment, making this scheme unsuccessful. As an alternative means of livelihood, breeders have begun to sell camel milk. This was after much persuasion since it went against their traditional

beliefs. Camel milk has often been touted as a superfood, claimed to be beneficial for autism, diabetes, liver disease, iaundice, even cancer, Camel Charisma is one such initiative through which breeders of the Lokhit Pashu Palak Sansthan now sell camel milk. 'Through this, a family can earn between Rs 18,000 to Rs 30,000 a month,' Rathore said. Camel Charisma pays Rs. 60 per litre of camel milk to the breeders. They also make camel milk products like cheese and soap; even camel poop paper. Things, however, are moving slowly. Competitive pricing in comparison to cow's milk or buffalo's, and a lack of demand among the general populace because of inadequate marketing, they feel, is the reason behind this. Lack of infrastructure in the cold chain is another challenge. Ilse Kohler-Rollefson, who has been engaged in camel research for more than 30 years and is a co-founder of Lokhit Pashu Palan Sanstan, added that there is a huge demand for camel milk outside India, 'particularly China', but because of lack of infrastructure. they haven't been able to meet the need.

'We think that if the 2015 law is amended, we will be able to save our animals,' Hariram Raika said, 'Otherwise the next five years will be critical for our camels.'

The state government had formed a committee to look into the issues after the camel breeders staged a protest against the ban during the 2019 Pushkar Mela. In the list of recommendations submitted thereafter, the breeders asked, in addition to amendment of the law, to include camel milk in mid-day meals in schools, to promote it in the market, and for free-range grazing rights.

An official of the Animal Husbandry department has now assured that the process to amend the law is underway. 'There is a proposal of amendments that have been cleared by the law ministry and will soon be introduced in the assembly,' the official told. 'The new provisions would be such that except for slaughter, breeders would be able to send their animals across the state's borders and earn their revenue.' There is no estimate of when this would happen so it is still a wait-and-watch game for the camel breeders of Rajasthan.

Over Rs 53,600 cr GST compensation yet to be released to states

New Delhi, Mar 15 (PTI):

Over Rs 53,600 crore of GST compensation for the current fiscal is yet to be released to the states. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said in the Rajya Sabha on Tuesday.

So far this fiscal, Rs 96,576 crore has been released to the states on account of GST compensation, and an additional Rs 1.59 lakh crore has been given as back-to-back loan to make good the revenue shortfall on account of Goods and Services Tax (GST) implementation.

Under the Goods and Services Tax (GST) law, states were guaranteed to be compensated bi-monthly for any loss of revenue in the first five years of GST implementation from July 1,2017. The shortfall is calculat-

ed assuming a 14 per cent annual growth in GST collections by states over the base year of 2015-16.

crore to be released to Maharashtra, Rs 6,954 crore to Uttar Pradesh, Rs 6,733 crore to Tamil Nadu. Rs 5.461 crore to Delhi and Rs 4.292 crore to West Bengal. Sitharaman further said

GST compensation for financial years 2017-18, 2018-19. 2019-20 and 2020-21 has already been paid to the

States/UTs. "The economic impact of the pandemic has led to higher compensation requirement due to lower GST collection and at the same time lower collection of GST compensation cess,' she said.

In a separate reply, Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary said the total GST collection during the current fiscal till February is over Rs 13.33 lakh crore. This include Central GST mop up of over Rs 2.43 lakh crore, Integrated GST of over Rs 6.87 lakh crore, State GST of over Rs 3.11 lakh crore and cess of Rs 90,442 crore.




Indian campaign ends in Singapore after exit of Manika-Archana pair

There was no respite for the Indians from the right-hander Ito either. Ito, with superb service variations, put them in the dock. Though the world No. 2 Japanese conceded seven points in the first game, they brought it down drastically in the second when the Indian duo not only made several unforced errors but failed time and again to capitalise on their service.

Vihari. Abhimanyu back at Dhaka **Premier League**



Kolkata: Test specialist Hanuma Vihari and Bengal skipper Abhimanyu Easwaran are among the seven Indian cricketers featuring in the Dhaka Premier League one-day tournament. It's a free window for the domestic Indian cricketers who were not picked for the IPL beginning March 26. Fresh from featuring in India's 2-0 sweep over Sri Lanka, Hanuma has joined Abahani Limited and is expected to join them after a short break in Hyderabad. Bengal captain Abhimanyu on the other hand was back at Prime Bank Cricket Club for his third season after 2017 and 2019. It's an invitational tournament and Abhimanyu got the BCCI's clearance on Monday to fly out to Dhaka for the one and a half month long tournament. Abhimanyu scored 30 in their 50-run win over City Club in their opening match at Savar on Tuesday.

Vishwanath, Vanshaj strike gold

New Delhi: Vishwanath Suresh (48kg) and Vanshaj (63.5kg) clinched gold medals in the men's youth competition as the Indian contingent concluded its campaign with a whopping 39 medals, including 15 gold, at the Asian Youth and Junior Boxing Championships in Amman, Jordan. The haul also included 10 silver and 14 bronze. Indian youth boxers secured seven gold, three silver and eight bronze medals while the junior team finished with 21 medals including eight gold, seven silver and six bronze. Chennai-boxer Vishwanath produced a clinical performance during his thumping 5-0 win over Kyrgyzstan's Ergeshov Bekzat late on Monday night. Later Vanshaj, who hails from Sonipat, added a second gold to youth men's tally as he registered a 4-1 win over Uzbekistan's Javokhir Ummataliev. However, in the +92kg category, Aman Singh Bisht ended with a silver medal after suffering a 1-4 loss to the local boxer Saif Al-Rawashdeh. Vishwanath, and Vanshaj had won silver while Aman had secured bronze in the last edition of the tournament.

Mumbai: Record five time IPL champions Mumbai Indians on Tuesday set the ground running for their 2022 campaign. Joining Zaheer and Mahela on this task will be Shane Bond, Robin Singh, Kiran More, Rahul Sanghvi, Vinay Kumar, TA Sekar, Paul Chapman and data analyst CKM Dhananjai.

PCB planning to introduce women's PSL early next year

Karachi: Alarmed by the poor showing of the national team in the ongoing ICC Women's World Cup, Pakistan Cricket Board chairman Ramiz Raja on Tuesday said the PCB is planning to introduce a proper domestic set-up for them, which includes a T20 franchise-based league to begin early next year to unearth new talent. "There is a lot of work to be done in our women's cricket set-up. You have to take into consideration the restrictions and other issues that are unique to women in sports. We have to take steps to have a proper domestic calendar for women with three-day matches," Ramiz told reporters here. Pakistan lost all its opening four games in the World Cup to lie at the bottom of the points table. Pakistan still have three league matches remaining against the West Indies, England and New Zealand.

Australia's dominant show continues in Women's WC

Wellington, Mar 15 (PTI):

A dominant Australia confidently carried on their march towards a record seventh title as they pummelled West Indies by seven wickets in a lopsided league stage contest to register their fourth consecutive win at the ICC Women's World Cup here on Tuesday.

Australia, the most successful team in the history of the event, has lived up to its favourites tag so far in the tournament as it has looked way too strong compared to the other seven teams in the frav.

The Meg Lanning-led side seemed to have all its bases covered, dishing out clinical performances one after another to lead the standings with eight points from four wins.

West Indies, the 2013 runner-up side, were no match for Australia as the team from the Caribbeans was bundled out for a meagre 131 in 45.5 overs after opting to bat.

India skipper Mithali Raj's descent in the ICC ODI rankings continued as she slipped three places to seventh while opener Smriti Mandhana dropped to 11th in the latest standings released on Tuesday, taking into account the ongoing World Cup in New Zealand.

'50% rise in pediatric orthopaedic cases, wrong postures during online classes to blame'

New Delhi, Mar 15 (PTI):

A 50 per cent rise in pediatric orthopaedic cases with complaints of excruciating pain in the neck and back have been noted in hospital OPDs with doctors attributing it primarily to wrong postures during online classes. The rise in multiple

skeletal issues among children can be attributed to incorrect posture. This, in turn, can be blamed on increased screen exposure following school closure due to Covid which made the children physically and mentally unwell, experts Dr Shubhang Aggarwal, Orthopaedic and Robotic Joint Replacement Surgeon and Director at NHS Hospital in Jalandhar said, "Wrong sitting postures coupled with almost no physical activity are to be blamed.'

"Pediatric orthopaedic cases increased by 50 per cent. Most of them are overweight, have stamina and suffer from anxiety and attention deficit disorder," Dr Aggarwal said.

According Surbhit Rastogi, Paediatric Orthopaedic Consultant, Indian Spinal Injuries Centre, Vasant Kunj, a lot of children have been experiencing cervical neck and back stiffness observed mainly among the working adult population.

This is mainly attributed to children being confined to their homes and not getting exposed to sunlight, the doctor proper blood circulation said. "It's essential to observe some precautionary measures such as having calcium-rich diet, sunlight exposure, taking small breaks every half an hour, doing some stretching exercises, switching to ergonomic chairs with proper back support and adding some indoor and outdoor physical activities in the daily routine of kids," Dr Rastogi said.

Even teachers should ensure that during online classes they dedicate five minutes for some fun stretching activities, he said.

Ideally, one should stand upright for one minute after sitting for 10 minutes at a stretch. This helps to strengthen your back by ensuring and maintaining muscle tone, the doctor said.

Parents should never ignore such back and neck issues in their kids and should visit an orthopaedic if there is any such complaint. "Parents should be

concerned when their kids complain of pain in neck and back, even if an initial x-ray exam doesn't reveal a problem. "When children com-

plain of back pain, about a third of the time there's a serious reason, whether due to an injury, infection or a tumour.

They should be immediately rushed to the hospital," added Dr Vishal Gupta, Orthopedic Surgeon, Ujala Cygnus Rainbow Hospital, Agra.

India sends fourth shipment of

India on Tuesday sent the fourth shipment of 2.000 metric tonnes of wheat to Afghanistan via Pakistani land route as part of its humanitarian assistance to the Afghan people. India despatched the first consignment of 2,500 metric tonnes of wheat to Afghanistan through Pakistani on February 22 and it reached the Afghan city of Jalalabad on February 26. Fifty trucks carried the consignment.

External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said India has so far sent 8,000 metric tonnes of wheat to Afghanistan as part of humanitarian aid. "Our partcontinues. nership Despatched fourth convoy of humanitarian assistance consisting of 2000 MTs of wheat to Afghanistan today. Total of 8000 MTs sent as on date. @WFP_Afghanistan is partnering with us for the internal distribution of wheat within Afghanistan," he tweeted.

India had sent a propos al to Pakistan on October 7 seeking the transit facility to send 50,000 tonnes of wheat to the people of Afghanistan via Pakistan and it received a positive response from Islamabad on November 24.

Following the Pakistani response, both sides were in touch to finalise the modalities for the transportation of the shipments. Each of the bags was stamped with the text: 'Gift from the people of India to the people of Afghanistan' in English, Pashto and Dari.

A Kerala artist is facing a "ban" to perform a ritual artform in local temple festivals here as his son married a Muslim woman at Karivelloor, a known Left bastion, in this north Kerala district. Vinod Panicker, a

known 'Poorakali-Marathukali' artist for the last 37 years, alleged that the management of some local temples informed him that he could not perform the traditional artform as he lives in the same house where his non-Hindu daughter-inlaw lives which is against rituals and customs.

The management committee of a temple, a shrine of Thiyya commu-

that if he shifts to some other place from his own house, where the non-Hindu woman resides, then he would be allowed to perform the rituals.

As he rejected their demand, they conducted the ritual with another artist recently, he said.

"I have clearly told them that I don't want to abandon my son and daughter-in-law or shift to any other house. I had been performing the ritual art for nearly four decades and it is such a pain to suffer this humiliation," Panicker said.

Claiming that the incident revealed the religious and communal mindset of the society, the artist said he is a follower of the teachings of Sree Narayana Guru, the saint-reformer who professed 'one caste, one religion and one God' for mankind.

However, the temple committee justified the action saying that rituals were not permitting to invite an artist for performance from a house where a non-Hindu person lives. The also said they did

not impose any ban but only informed Panicker that rituals could not be violated.

A temple management official said he was a Marxist party sympathiser but that does not mean that temple rituals need not be followed.

The incident raised many eyebrows as Karivelloor is a place where the ruling CPI(M) has deep roots.

As the issue triggered a controversy, senior Marxist Party leader and former minister E P Jayarajan came out criticising the temple management saying it was a 'grave lapse' from their side and the party was against that.

He also alleged that they had kept the development as a secret but now it has come to the public domain.

"Poorakkali" is a traditional dance ritual performed by men during the nine-day Pooram festival in Bhagavathy temples and sacred groves across Malabar (north Kerala).
