Justice Gautam Bhadrani further emphasized on importance of Nyaaya Bandhu mobile app and encouraged the participant advocates to register themselves to use the app to provide Pro Bono Services to poor and needy. His speech also advised young participants to take part in legal services programme and Pro Bono activities under guidance of their seniors.

He also added that disputes arising out of everyday life on today basis can be amicably settled in Permanent Lok Adalat (Public Utility Service) formed under Section 22A of the Legal Services Authority Act. Such Courts are established to settle dispute in relation to matters relating to everyday life relating to transport services, water, electricity, building societies. Permanent Lok Adalat has been conferred with wide scope of jurisdiction to order in their behalf. Another campaign
