TERROR FUNDING Court awards lifer to Yasin Malik

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI): All the sentences will run concurrently. Earlier NIA on Wednesday sought the death penalty before a Delhi court for Kashmir separatist leader Yasin Malik, who had earlier pleaded guilty to all the charges, including those under the stringent Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA), in a terror funding case.

The court also imposed a fine of over Rs ten lakh on Malik. The life term was awarded for two offences - Section 12 (waging war against the government of India) of IPC and section 17 (raising funds for the terrorist act) of the UAPA.

The agency told Special Judge Praveen Singh in an in-chamber proceeding that Malik was responsible for the Kashmiri exodus. On the point of sentences, sources said that Malik submitted that he would not beg for mercy and that court could decide at its discretion. The amicus curiae appointed by the court to assist Malik, sought minimum punishment, i.e. life imprisonment in the matter, Malik, meanwhile, said that he had been involved in various terrorist activities or violence in 28 years, then he would retire from politics, and will also accept the hanging.

The judge, however, said that since he has already been convicted, there was no point in awarding a life term. He said that Malik was responsible for the Kashmiri exodus. On the point of sentences, sources said that Malik submitted that he would not beg for mercy and that court could decide at its discretion.

ED registers money laundering case against Karti Chidambaram

New Delhi, May 25 (PTI): The ED has registered a money laundering case against Congress MP Karti Chidambaram and others in connection with the alleged irregularities in the issuance of visas to 263 Chinese nationals in 2011 when his father, P Chidambaram was the home minister, officials said on Wednesday.

The federal agency has filed its case with the criminal sections of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) taking cognizance of a recent first information report (FIR) registered by the CBI in the same case, they said. The case pertains to allegations of Rs 50 lakh being paid as kickbacks to Karti and his close associate S Bhaskararam by a top executive of Vedanta group company Talwandi Sabo Power Ltd. (TSPIL), which was setting up power plant in Punjab, the CBI FIR had said.

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) had raided the premises of the Chidambaram family and arrested Bhaskararam that week, even as Karti Chidambaram is expected to depart before he is questioned. This is the third money laundering case against Karti Chidambaram written by the IANX Media and Aircel-Max cases being probed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) for some years now. The ED will probe the possible links of crime 'that could have been generated due to the alleged illegal activity in the visa case, they said.

CRPF constable commits suicide Couple held for rape and murder of minor

Bijapur, May 25: A constable of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) allegedly committed suicide by slitting his wrist in the township of Bijapur district, police said on Wednesday.

The incident took place at the camp of the CRPF's 70th battalion, located at Jalalpur near Bijapur police station, on Tuesday, Bijapur state police officer (SHO) Shankhanik Barwal said. Constable Mohan, who hailed from Haryana, committed suicide by slitting his wrist on Tuesday afternoon. Senior officials rushed to the camp and sent the body to autopsy, he said. The body of the deceased constable was sent to his native village in Haryana on Wednesday, he said, adding that the cause for the extreme step was not known.

Ukraine: 200 bodies found in basement in Mariupol's ruins

Workers digging through the rubble of an apartment building in Mariupol found 200 bodies in the basement, Ukrainian authorities, as more horrors come to light in the ruined city that has seen some of the worst suffering of the 3-month war.
