Don't see any adverse impact of US Fed rate hike: DEA Secy

New Delhi, Jun 18: The government does not see any adverse impact on the Indian economy post the US Federal Reserve's decision to raise interest rates by 75 basis points, Economic Affairs Secretary Ajay Seth said. "All central banks are grappling with it and taking similar measures to control inflation," he said. "We are in coordination...directly or indirectly they are moving in tandem," Seth told reporters. "So, I don't see any adverse impact on India (rate hike by Fed) because Reserve Bank of India, in the two previous cycles, has taken adequate measures," he said. On Wednesday, the US Federal Open Market Committee, on expected lines, kept the range for federal funds rate at 75 basis points to curb inflation, and he said it would hike rates aggressively in the rest of the calendar year. Citing

upside inflationary pressures, the RBI has raised interest rates by 40 basis points and 50 basis points respectively in May and June to 4.25 per cent. Since May, the government has announced a host of steps to curb inflationary pressures, including a cut in petrol and diesel prices (rate hike by Fed) because of high energy and food prices and hoped that it would moderate in the coming months. "We are all aware that summer months are the difficult months in terms of vegetable and other items," Seth said.



Free blood also provided from licensed blood-banks

Raipur, Jun 18: About one percent of the population of Chhattisgarh is suffering from sickle cell, a genetic disease related to blood. All the community health centers, district hospitals and medical colleges of the state have the facility of free tests, medicines and consultation. Sicklecell patients are also provided free blood when needed from licensed blood banks.

State Sickle Cell Institute is also operating in Raipur, where there is a provision for Tertiary Care of patients. Research is also being done about this disease in the institute. Medical officers and lab technicians across the state are also given training on Sickle Cell. Sickle cell is a genetic disease. When sickle cell is not treated, it can lead to brain, kidney, heart, and lung problems. There are two types of this disease: sickle cell disease SS and sickle cell carrier AS. Sickle cell disease SS can cause severe pain and discomfort to the patient and may require frequent blood transfusions. By taking the medicine according to the doctor's advice, the patient can live a long life and can avoid serious problems.





Sickling patient undergoes surgery for Ebstein Anomaly

At Heart, Chest and Vascular Surgery Department of Ambedkar Hospital

Govt for unleashing the entrepreneurial skills of the youth: Sanjay

Don't see any adverse impact of US Fed rate hike: DEA Secy

New Delhi, Jun 18: The Government does not see any adverse impact on the Indian economy post the US Federal Reserve's decision to raise interest rates by 75 basis points, Economic Affairs Secretary Ajay Seth said.

Interest rates by 40 basis points and 50 basis points respectively in May and June to 4.5 per cent. Since May, the government has announced a host of steps to deal with inflation, including a cut in excise duty on petrol and diesel and reduction in import duty on some raw materials used in iron and steel, he said.

RBI not behind the curve, focus on inflation target could have been disastrous for economy: Das

Mumbai, Jun 18: Governor Shaktikanta Das refuted criticism of the RBI being behind the curve in its policies, making it clear that the consequences of focusing on the 4 per cent inflation target would have been disastrous for the economy.

Dispite its accommodative policies, the economy grew by 6.8 per cent in FY21 and recovered to barely above the pre-pandemic level in FY22, he said, stressing that a shift in policy management to focus on inflation even 3-4 months before April 2022 was not an option. I feel that we are much in line with the requirements of our time, the RBI has acted proactively and I would not agree with any perception or any sort of event organised by the Financial Express here. He said the RBI would have caused a major recession and to our financial markets would have been enormous. He said that the RBI's inflation target has not been met since October 2019 and in 18 of the 22 months since then, the headline consumer price inflation has breached even the RBI's ceiling of 6 per cent. It also raised question marks over forecasting.




