■ Unveils model of Netaji memorial

Port Blair, Jan 23 (PTI): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday virtually unveiled the model of a proposed memorial dedicated to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, to be set up in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, and said it will infuse feelings of patriotism among people.

Modi, on the occasion of Netaji's 126th birth anniversary, also named 21 islands of the Union Territory after Param Vir Chakra awardees. "Today, it is a proud moment for me as I address the people of Andamans because this is the land,

MP schools to teach Gita, Ramayan, Mahabharat

Bhopal, Jan 23 (PTI): Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Monday said Hindu religious scriptures will be taught to students in government schools and issued a warning to those trying to insult these revered texts, saying their acts will not be tolerated. The senior BJP leader's warning came in the backdrop of controversial statements made on the Ramcharitmanas, a Hindu religious book based on the Ramayan, by some political leaders in the last few days.

Addressing a programme here, Chouhan said ancient Hindu epics are invaluable holy texts and they help in building moral character of human beings. "The Ramayan, the Mahabharat, the Vedas, the Upnishads, the Bhagwad Gita are our invaluable scriptures. These texts have the ability to make a human being moral and complete. We will also (along with other subjects) teach these religious books in government schools. Why not study them?" he said.

Arun Khetrpal and Flying Officer Nirmaljit Singh Sekhon, will be a

source of inspiration for generations to come. "It gives me immense pleasure to announce the naming of 21 islands after Param Vir Chakra awardees and to inaugurate the model of a proposed memorial at Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Island (previously known as Ross Island). "One should see the naming of 21 islands as Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat" and the memorial will infuse feelings of patriotism in the hearts of people," he said. PM Modi also mentioned that islands named earlier in the day after Param Vir Chakra awardees "will be the land of inspiration for generations to come".

ED attaches assets worth Rs 7.90 cr

■ In Punjab drug cases

New Delhi, Jan 23 (PTI): Assets worth Rs 7.90 crore have been attached under the anti-money laundering law in connection with a probe linked to two narcotics trafficking cases of Punjab, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) said Monday.

The money laundering case stems from separate FIRs filed by the Punjab Police under various sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (NDPS) against Gurdeep Singh Rano and Rajesh Kumar.

The ED case has been registered under the criminal sections of the

Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). "The attached assets include 16 immovable properties (land and building) in Punjab of Gurdeep Singh Rano and his family members and 11 immovable properties of Rajesh Kumar and his family members. "The assets also include movable properties like balance in bank accounts, cash and gold ornaments," the federal probe agency said in a statement. The ED, quoting the police FIR, alleged that Rano had "links" with suspected drugs smugglers, Simranjit Singh and Tanvir Bedi, who are residing abroad.

SpiceJet flier offloaded

New Delhi: SpiceJet on Monday offloaded a passenger from a Hyderabad-bound aircraft for unruly behaviour at the Delhi airport. The incident happened onboard a SpiceJet wet-leased Corendon aircraft that was scheduled to operate SG-8133 flight from Delhi to Hyderabad. "During boarding at Delhi, one passenger behaved in an unruly and inappropriate manner, harassing and causing disturbance to cabin crew. The crew informed PIC (Pilot In Command) and security staff of the same. The said passenger and a co-passenger, who were travelling together, were offloaded and handed over to the security team," the airline said in a statement.

After Co-WIN, govt launches U-WIN

To digitise India's universal immunisation prog

MAJOR STEP

New Delhi, Jan 23 (PTI): Carrying vaccination cards of children and pregnant women, struggling to keep a tab on the next jab and other such hassles may soon become a thing of the past. After the success of the Co-WIN platform, the government has now replicated it to set up an electronic registry for routine vaccinations. Named U-WIN, the programme to digitise India's Universal Immunisation Programme (UIP) has been launched in a pilot mode in two districts of each state and Union Territory. The platform will be used to register and vaccinate every pregnant woman, record her delivery outcome, register every newborn delivery, administer birth doses and all vaccination events thereafter, official sources told PTI.

The platform that replicates Co-WIN, which has served as the "digital backbone" for India's COVID-19 vaccination programme, was launched on January 11 in 65 districts. The U-WIN is going to be the single source of information for immunisation services, updating vaccination status, delivery outcome, planning of RI sessions and reports like antigen-wise coverage, etc. "There will be digital registrations of all pregnant women and newborns for individualised tracking for vaccination, reminders for upcoming doses and follow-up of dropouts. "Healthcare workers and programme managers will be able to generate real-time data of routine immunisation sessions and vaccination coverage for better planning and vaccine distribution," an

official explained. For pregnant women and children, vaccine acknowledgement and immunisation card linked to ABHA ID (Ayushman Bharat Health Account) will be generated and all states and districts can access a common database to track and vaccinate beneficiaries. Besides, through the platform citizens can check nearby ongoing routine immunisation sessions, and book appointments, the official told PTI. All states and UTs have been sensitised on U-WIN functionalities and objectives for the pilot in 65 districts and staff and healthcare workers have been trained on all modules of U-WIN. "With this the entire vaccination system including records will get digitised, easing the tracking of beneficiaries.

RELIEF TO DESHMUKH SC dismisses CBI appeal against bail

■ To Maha ex-minister Anil Deshmukh

New Delhi, Jan 23 (PTI):

In a major relief for former Maharashtra home minister Anil Deshmukh, the Supreme Court on Monday dismissed the CBI's appeal challenging the Bombay High Court order granting bail to the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) leader in a corruption case. A bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justices V Ramasubramanian and JB Pardiwalla noted that Deshmukh has also been granted bail in the related money laundering case. The top court said it was not inclined to entertain the Special Leave Petition against the grant

of bail by the high court to Deshmukh. "Since the observations in the impugned order of the High Court are confined to the question as to whether the respondent was entitled to the grant of bail, we clarify that these observations shall be construed only for that purpose. "In other words, the observations shall not affect the merits of the trial or be pressed in any other collateral proceedings. The Special Leave Petition is accordingly dismissed," the bench said. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta appeared for the CBI in the matter. The CBI, in December last year, approached the apex court challenging the Bombay High Court order granting bail to Deshmukh in the graft case.

Two cyber thugs held over Rs 2.67 cr fraud

Noida, Jan 23 (PTI): The Noida Police has arrested two people, allegedly involved in duping a senior citizen of Rs 2.67 crore on the pretext of renewing his life insurance policy, almost two-and-a-half-year after the case was lodged, officials said on Monday. Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police (Noida) Ashutosh Dwivedi said the complainant worked in an eminent private company and had retired in 2005. He currently lives in Vasant Kunj in Delhi. "In 2020, the complainant got a phone call from an unknown person who informed him that his insurance policy has lapsed and he would have to pay some money if he wanted the policy renewed. "Eventually, the complainant ended up paying Rs 2.67 crore in multiple accounts in lieu of policy renewal assurance," Dwivedi said. The complainant's daughter had lodged a complaint on behalf of the senior citizen after which an FIR was lodged at the Sector 20 police station here under Indian Penal Code sections 420 (fraud), 406 (criminal breach of trust) and 34 (act done by several persons) as well as the IT Act and investigation launched.

Court awards double death penalty to Sandeep Jain for killing parents

Bhilai, Jan 23: In the high profile double murder case of renowned litterateur, social worker and former journalist Ravalmal Jain and his wife Surji Bai Jain, the Upper Sessions Court of Durg awarded double death sentence to their 42-year-old Sandeep Jain.

A well known poet and businessman, Sandeep Jain was found guilty of killing his father and mother. Upper Sessions Judge Shailesh Kumar Tiwari awarded double death sentence to Sandeep Jain. The court stated that it is the height of cruelty to kill the parents.

His crime fell in the category of rarest of rare cases. The court also sentenced him to five years of rigorous imprisonment under the Arms Act.

Aggregating the double death penalties and imprisonment, the court sentenced Sandeep Jain to be hanged by the neck till he is dead.

Two other accused Bhagat Singh Gurudutt and Shailendra Sagar have been awarded five years of rigorous imprisonment for supplying illegal pistol and cartridges to the prime accused

Sandeep Jain. It needs to be mentioned here that Sandeep Jain had shot dead his parents Ravalmal Jain and Surji Bai with a 7.65 caliber country-made pistol in the wee hours of January 01, 2018. Ravalmal Jain was a renowned litterateur, social worker and former journalist. He was one of the founders of Nagpura

Jain Temple. Being the managing trustee, he contributed a major part of his life for construction and expansion of Nagpura Jain Teerth. Sandeep Jain had also established himself as a renowned poet and businessman. The convict Sandeep Jain had killed his parents by firing three - three rounds on his father and mother.

In this high profile case, the prosecution proved that Sandeep Jain was irritated by his father Ravalmal Jain due to his traditional conservative behaviour. Ravalmal used to send his servant to Sheonath River to fetch water for worshipping purposes and insisted on using tap water only for other purposes. Ravalmal disliked

Sandeep's friendship with women and often scolded him. Ravalmal had even threatened Sandeep to disinherit him from property. Irritated by repeated scolding, Sandeep chalked out the plan to kill his father. He purchased a pistol and bullets from Agrasen Chowk Durg resident Bhagat Singh Gurudutt and kept it in the house. As per the plan,

he sent his wife and son to Dalli Rajhara at her maternal house. A servant Rohit Deshmukh used to sleep at their house in the night daily. On December 31, Sandeep asked him not to come that night. Around 05:45 hrs on January 01, 2018, Sandeep came down stairs and shot three rounds at his father; who was closing a door in the

gallery. Hearing the firing burst, his mother Surji Jain started screaming from the bedroom. She made a call on Sandeep's mobile, but he did not respond.

Sandeep then moved to his mother's room and shot three rounds at her also. After killing his parents, Sandeep unlocked the main gate of the house and went to his room upstairs. He threw the gun out of the house from the rear window and tried to narrate a false story that some outsider trespassed into the house and killed his parents.

However, police succeeded to recover his blood stained clothes and murder weapon on the same day. Later he confessed the crime before police. The prosecution also succeeded in getting him convicted in the court.

Conundrum - Subhas Bose's life after death

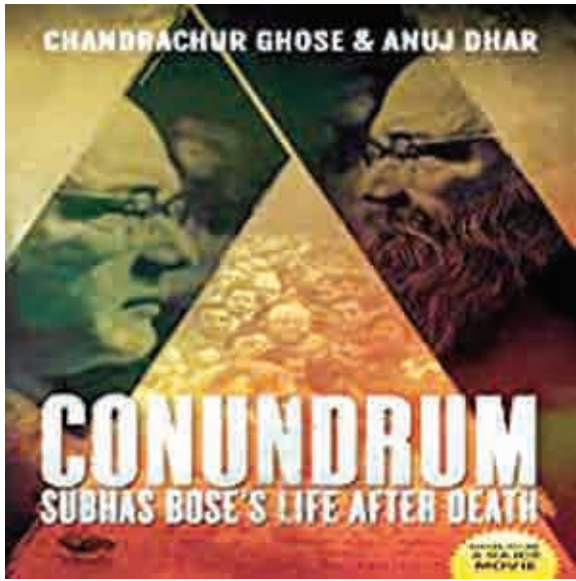
The book investigates the evidence on startling claims that an unseen monk in Uttar Pradesh was Netaji Bose. At this point I can hear readers exclaiming "what bosh and nonsense". My reaction was the same when my husband told me about the book, I told him he is being gullible and has fallen for yet another conspiracy theory. Yet when I started reading the book it was not only unputdownable it subsumed everything else I was doing at time.

The authors explore three lines of reasoning on what could have happened to Netaji. The first is the accepted Indian government take that he died in Taihoku air crash. The second is that after cooking up the air crash story he ended up in Russia. The third line is that he came back to India.

The research presented in the book is impressive in its details the authors have left no end unexplored to the extent they could. The evidence they have presented is fascinating and jaw dropping. The book is extremely well written all 834 pages of it.

The blurb at the back mentions the old monk called Bhagwanji telling his followers about the layout of Jessore cantonment in East Pakistan. The followers understood the significance only when Jessore fell a few weeks later to the Indian Army. The book tells many such fascinating conversations recalled by his followers. Another interesting one is how owner of Mohan Meakins was a follower of Bhagwanji later on he named his bestselling rum 'Old Monk'.

The book begins with describing the events surrounding the death of unnamed, mostly unseen monk in Faizabad. It details the high-pitched daily reports by local newspapers investigating whether the monk was



indeed Netaji. Many dedicated journalists like Ashok Tandon, AdheerSom, Anuj Dhar and others investigated and wrote on the issue for months.

The second chapter talks about appearance of an unnamed sanyasi in Neemsar in UP. The sanyasi would stay behind the curtains. Chief Minister Sampurnand and descendants of Nawab of Awadh were among his followers. Prof Atul Sen of Calcutta was the first person from Calcutta to meet the Sanyasi now known as Bhagwanji. When Prof Sen asked him "are you the man who asked me to stand for Dhaka Legislative seat" Bhagwanji replied "that man is dead now, mritabhooh". Nevertheless, recognising Netaji's voice Prof Sen wrote to Pandit Nehru. Its telling Pandit Nehru didn't outrightly reject his claims on the contrary he promptly asked people to investigate secretly.

The third chapter discusses visits by Netaji Bose's colleagues, the freedom fighters and Indian

National Army members. His close associates Leela Roy, Pavitra Mohan Roy and Prof Samar Guha came hunting for him once Prof Sen reported back. These are all prominent freedom fighters. Desh-Netri Leela Roy was then Chairwoman of Forward bloc a party Netaji Bose founded. After meeting Bhagwanji she retired from active politics. Pavitra Mohan Roy was Intelligence agent of INA. He was sentenced to death by the British. His death sentence was pardoned after Mahatma Gandhi wrote to the British government asking for clemency. The authors provide in detail the correspondence between these people; that was found in Bhagwanji's boxes. These prominent freedom fighters were close to Netaji Bose and all of them couldn't have mistaken someone else for him. There is a poignant poem Bhagwanji wrote for Leela Roy when she passed away. He calls her Lee and says she was the leeward side of his life.

The sixth chapter discusses the

Mukherjee commission which is the third commission to be setup to find out what happened to Netaji. The Mukherjee commission investigated the case from 1999 to 2006. The key evidence before the commission was handwriting match between the pre 1945 documents and post 1945 documents. The book discusses in great detail the handwriting evidence that was examined and how government experts committed fraud and said the writing didn't match. Other internationally well-known experts said that writing of Netaji matched with Bhagwanji in two languages. Another key evidence which was fudged by the government was the DNA of the teeth which were found in the belongings of the deceased Bhagwanji. The authors go to great lengths to explain how this deception was carried out.

The seventh chapter discusses articles in Calcutta magazine called Jayashree with title "Oi Mahamanavase" (He was a superman). The eight chapter is devoted to exposing how the first commission i.e., the Shah Nawaj commission to find out about Netaji was an eye-wash. Netaji's brother Suresh Bose didn't accept this commission's finding and submitted a dissenting report. Similar was fate of fourth

commission that is the Sahai commission which was setup in 2016. Noted Minister of Parliament Samar Guha after making contact with Bhagwanji wrote a book on how the Taihoku air crash never happened he personally visited Taihoku and investigated the documents. Justice Mukherji in 2006 concurred with him and said the air crash didn't take place. However, Justice Mukherji said he couldn't conclude that Bhagwanji was Netaji because there was no clinching evidence.

Chapter 9 throws light on stance of different Netaji family members on the matter. Chapter 10 discusses Netaji's days before Taihoku crash as well as what Bhagwanji told his followers about the crash. Bhagwanji mentioned in many conversations that he lived in Siberia for few years; that he had come back to India on foot across Nepal border. In an astonishing conversation the Sanyasi talked in detail about the Dalai Lama escape from Tibet. He mentioned to his followers that it was one General Shiva who lived with Khamba tribe who showed the way out and told Dalai Lama that he should go to India and planned the escape. He also revealed startlingly that India was not

given Independence in 1947 but was a dominion state. This fact is not common knowledge in India even today.

Chapter 11 talks about how Bhagwanji often gave hints that he felt betrayed by Bengal. A Sanyasi doesn't get aims in his own village he is said to have blurted out. At the battle of Imphal he said that British were about to surrender but 4 people defected from INA and gave away how stretched the INA was. "The British Indian Army fought with new vigour instead of surrendering and the beggar had to go back empty handed" he said. Bhagwanji would be furious about the mistakes of JLN combine (Jawahar Lal Nehru and his coterie) but said he had no rancour for Bapu.

Chapter 12 delves into why if Bhagwanji was Netaji he didn't come out. Bhagwanji talked about undivided motherland and wrote to Leela Roy in English "I know it as unalterable truth that divided wretched motherland will get back her undivided form and if someone's mental state so reacts to the situation then the undivided motherland will take larger form too". This chapter has an impressive lecture from the monk on what war is

about - "it's meant to break opponent's morale so he is forced to sue for peace". He talks in detail about China war with his comments written all over the book "Himalayan blunder". He was livid on Nehru's referral of Kashmir to UN he writes "A humiliating reptilian study of a stupid clown-posing statesmanship." I have read many critiques of Pandit Nehru including those of Ram Manohar Lohia but Bhagwanji's comments stand out as coming from a person who thinks he is on par with Nehru. On 1962 China war Bhagwanji made a sensational claim that he had intervened with Chinese to make a conciliatory offer to Nehru. With the offer went the message to Nehru that Bhagwanji wanted to come back but no reply came back from Nehru. He talks about Pakistan war and Tashkent agreement in great detail. He dropped hints to Pavitra Mohan Roy and Leela Roy about impending Bangladesh liberation and his plans and involvement in it. Bhagwanji talked in great detail about all the wars India had fought and war strategy in general. The deep insight he displayed is beyond a common man moreover its beyond most journalists. This book is worth reading just for this chapter on war strategy and understanding of wars India has fought. It's not surprising Gandhiji said at the time of partition to Shaheed Suhrawardi that "Only Subhas could have saved the country today".

Bhagwanji lived in dire poverty living in open shelters at times and houses with roof leaking at other times. He would go hungry for many days. Once Leela Roy met him she made sure that he accepted help and at least his basic needs were met. He was known to have achieved highest level of sadhana or spiritual practice. He had deep

insight on politics, war, religion and social issues. He was said to have travelled outside India to many countries including Pakistan and China.

In the last chapter authors explore why Bhagwanji chose to stay hidden. To his followers he said he has been declared war criminal by Allied powers. And that if he came out it will cause problems for Indian government. This was much later proven to be true when John Major refused to take off Subhas Chandra Bose's name from war criminals list. The authors have also tried to understand and debated over the possibility of Bhagwanji suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder in light of his unsubstantiated claims.

In modern forensics handwriting is considered enough evidence to identify a person. Bhagwanji's writing with Netaji has matched in two languages hence with nearly 99% certainty one can say they were same persons. The authors have done a commendable job of examining a complex set of evidences from all angles. Considering the apathy on this issue from mainstream media the nation is indebted to the authors for bringing the life of Netaji post 1945 to the fore. Indeed, it's heartening to see the moral courage and determination of these two authors.

One small issue I faced with the book is that it has no index.

'Is Governor waiting for 'muhurat' to sign reservation bills'

Raipur, Jan 23: Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Monday accused Governor Anusuiya Uikay of misusing Constitutional rights by delaying the assent to two quota amendment bills and asked if she was waiting for 'muhurat' to sign them.

His remarks came a day after the governor told the media to wait "till March" when she was asked about the pending approval for the bills.

The amendment bills, passed by the state Assembly last December,

are related to quotas in government jobs and admissions in educational institutions in proportion to the population of different categories in the state.

"Why (is the governor) waiting till March? Is she looking for a muhurat (auspicious time)? There are exams scheduled following which admissions will start in educational institutions and recruitment exams to various government departments are also pending," he told reporters.

Baghel said the governor holding the bills is the

"misuse of rights granted under the Constitution".

"Which muhurat is scheduled in March when she will sign? These bills were passed in December. The BJP is silent on it. The bills have been halted at the behest of the BJP. This is an injustice to the youth of the state," he added.

The Chhattisgarh Assembly on December 2, 2022, passed the Chhattisgarh Public Service (Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes Reservation) Amendment Bill and the Chhattisgarh

Educational Institutions (Reservation in admission) amendment bill related to quota in government jobs and admissions in educational institutions in proportion to the population of different categories in the state.

As per the bills, the Scheduled Tribe will get a quota of 32 per cent, Other Backward Classes 27 per cent, Scheduled Caste 13 per cent and the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) four per cent, taking the overall reservation in the state to 76 per cent.

Because of the busy pace of life, the general population is becoming more interested in Ayurveda and Yoga for the treatment of stress, insomnia, and other diseases. As the government intended, the Ayurveda Department continues to provide medical services in the district. Ayush Polynic, 1 Ayush Wing, 3 Specialized Therapy Centers, 23 Ayurveda Dispensaries, and 2 Homeopathy Dispensaries make up the district's total of 30 Ayush centers. The National Ayush Mission organises



district and block-level camps. The value of the AYUSH method and the inauguration of the camp are explained by the people's representatives. Patients are being treated and medicines are being delivered at the camp using Ayurvedic, Homeopathic, and Unani methods. 14 thousand 117 patients have been treated in the development block

level camp Churiya over the last four years. 6 lakh 19 thousand 52 people have registered for OPD therapy. From April 2022, the Sian Jatan Clinic Yojana will provide free care, Panchakarma, and medicine distribution to the elderly on every Thursday of the month. Twenty thousand 525 people have registered for treatment at the OPD. In addition to this,

Ayushdeep sub-committee operates in six AYUSH centers in the Rajnandgaon district. Ayushdeep Committee organises free health camps, supplies medicines to Ayush centers, and provides various facilities such as furniture and other contingency materials. The Mukhyamantri Haat Bazar Yojana imposes duties on officers and workers of AYUSH centers. In which allopathy and Ayush medicine are used to treat and distribute medicines to the people coming in Haat Bazar. 65 silver coins of Mughal era, other antiquities found



Rajnandgaon, Jan 23: A total of 65 silver coins of the Mughal era have been found kept in a pot, during the digging for laying water pipeline work in Village Bazar-Navagaon (Gram Panchayat Badgaon-Charbhatha) under Dongargaon development block of Rajnandgaon district. According to antique experts, these coins of the Mughal period date back to about 1700-1800 AD. Apart from this, 3 tiger-shaped rings of mixed metal and 2 bracelets of mixed metal have also been found. The work was being done under the 'Nal Jal Yojana'.

Dongargaon Sub Divisional Officer Sunil Nayak said that the departmental team including Dr. Pratap Chand Parakh, deputy director, Dr. Vrishottam Sahu, ex-

Arms syndicate busted ahead of R-Day

● Two held

New Delhi, Jan 23 (PTI):

Ahead of Republic Day, the Delhi Police has busted an arms syndicate by arresting two men and recovering 34 pistols from their possession, officials said on Monday.

The accused have been identified as Naved Rana (21) and Saleem (39), both residents Shamli district in Uttar Pradesh, they said. The consignment of firearms was supposed to be delivered to a member of the Gogi gang, police said. The police got a tip-off on January 13 and conducted a raid at a place on

the Delhi-Jammu Road in Narela and nabbed Rana who had 10 pistols in his possession.

The police then identified Rana's source — Saleem — who was arrested on Friday, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Special Cell) Ingit Pratap Singh said.

Based on the inputs given by Saleem, an illegal arms manufacturing unit was busted and huge cache of firearms and tools were recovered on Saturday from a sugarcane field at Kandhla village in Shamli district, the DCP said. A total of 24 finished single shot country-made pistols, six semi-finished automatic pistols, 10

body screws of country-made pistols, 20 freshly-cut barrels, one old barrel etc were recovered, Singh said. Rana told the police that his brother Asif is presently lodged in the Muzaffarnagar Jail of Uttar Pradesh in connection with various criminal cases, officials said.

He was informed about Saleem by Asif. He used to obtain illegal firearms and ammunition from Saleem and used to supply them at various places in Delhi-NCR and UP to members of crime syndicates, police said. Saleem has been involved in illegal firearms manufacturing and trading for last 10 years, police said.

Before 2012-13, he was in contact of various illegal arm dealers of western UP, but was not involved in any kind of illegal activity. Gradually, he learnt how to manufacture illegal firearms and ammunition and started his own set up at his home, police said.

Thereafter, he started supplying such firearms locally and also got associated with one Mukem Kala gang, they said.

In 2015, he was booked in four criminal cases, including a rioting case, registered at the Kandhla police station. In the riot case, he was involved in setting a police station on fire along with many others, police said.

The OSDMA provided effective response during various cyclones such as Hudhud (2014), Fani (2019), Amphan (2020) and Odisha floods (2020), the statement said. The OSDMA conducted disaster preparedness initiatives in building community resilience in 381 tsunami-prone villages and wards and 879 multi-purpose cyclone and flood shelters located within 1.5 km from coastline.

The Lunglei Fire Station responded efficiently and effectively to a massive forest fire which was reported on April 24, 2021 in the uninhabited forest areas that surrounded Lunglei town and spread to more than 10 village council areas.

Pak woman illegally staying in Bengaluru arrested

Bengaluru, Jan 23 (PTI):

Police have arrested a 19-year-old Pakistani woman for allegedly forging her identity and illegally staying in the city.

According to the police, the woman identified as Iqra Jeevani had entered India last year through the porous India-Nepal border.

They said she is married to Mulayam Singh Yadav, a 25-year-old security guard from Uttar Pradesh, whom she met through a gaming app.

They are said to have met on the app and fell in love and later decided to get married, police sources said, following this she came to Nepal a few months ago where

they got married. The couple then came to India crossing the India-Nepal border and reached Bihar.

Yadav brought Iqra Jeevani to Bengaluru, where he worked as a security guard, and the couple rented a house in Junnasandra.

He even got an Aadhaar card done for Iqra Jeevani after changing her name to Rava Yadav, mentioning her as his wife, and later she even applied for an Indian passport.

Her identity came to light when the Intelligence Bureau tracked Iqra Jeevani's trail, as she was trying to contact her family members back in Pakistan and alerted the state intelligence.

'Siddaramaiah won't contest Assly polls from Kolar'

Belagavi (K'taka), Jan 23 (PTI):

Senior BJP leader B S Yediyurappa on Monday claimed that Congress leader Siddaramaiah was allegedly playing a drama and that he would not contest the Assembly polls from Kolar segment as announced by the latter; and may go back to his home district of Mysuru instead.

Ending speculation, Siddaramaiah had earlier this month announced that he would be contesting the polls from Kolar, if the party high command agrees.

"Today itself I will say one thing, don't think I'm making a prediction, Siddaramaiah will not contest from Kolar for any reason, he is playing a drama and is trying to go back to Mysuru," Yediyurappa said.

Speaking to reporters here, the former Chief Minister said the Congress legislature party leader is aware that he would face a defeat and have to go home, if he contests from Kolar.

"He is playing political circus and drama, according to me, he will not contest from there (Kolar) and may try to go back to Mysuru, if that happens we will do the strategy we need to," he added.

Asked about talks that were doing rounds that Siddaramaiah may contest from two seats, Yediyurappa, who is the member of BJP's top parliamentary board, said, "I don't know about it, it is left to their party. Let him contest from two or three seats, but going home is certain."

Amid intense speculation that he may contest from

two seats like he did in 2018 Assembly polls, Siddaramaiah, a former Chief Minister, had recently made it clear that he would contest the upcoming polls from one constituency. Siddaramaiah, not wanting to contest from Badami, his current constituency, in Bagalkote district of north Karnataka region, was looking for a "safe seat",

and on January 9 had announced his willingness to contest from Kolar, if party permits. In the 2018 polls, he had contested from two seats- Chamundeshwari and Badami.

As the then sitting chief minister, he lost the polls in Chamundeshwari (in Mysuru) to JD(S) G T Deve Gowda by 36,042 votes. He, however, won Badami, the other constituency from where he had contested and defeated B Srimamulu (BJP) by 1,696 votes.

Making his debut in the Assembly in 1983, Siddaramaiah had got elected from Chamundeshwari on a Lok Dal Party ticket. He has won five times from this constituency and tasted defeat thrice. After neighbouring Varuna became a constituency in 2008 following delimitation,

Siddaramaiah represented it till he vacated the seat for his son Dr Yatindra (MLA) in the 2018 polls and went back to his old constituency of Chamundeshwari.

Siddaramaiah has made it clear several times that he would not contest from Chamundeshwari anymore, and if Yediyurappa's claims are to be believed, he may look for Varuna, in which case his son Yathindra would be left without a seat.

It is no secret that Siddaramaiah, who was Chief Minister between 2013-2018, is nursing his ambition for a second term in office, if the party wins the next Assembly polls.

With State Congress president D K Shivakumar too having similar aspirations, it has triggered a game of one-upmanship between the two leaders.

Pakistan suffers major power outage after grid failure

Islamabad, Jan 23 (PTI):

Pakistan faced a major power breakdown on Monday due to a “frequency variation” in the national grid, leaving millions of people in large parts of the country, including capital Islamabad and financial hub Karachi, without electricity.

According to the Ministry of Energy, the system of frequency of the national grid went down at 7:34 am local time, resulting in the breakdown.

“System maintenance work is progressing rapidly,” it tweeted.

Energy Minister Khurram Dastgir said the restoration work was going on.

“I can assure you that power will be fully restored across the country within the next 12 hours,”



he was quoted as saying by Geo News.

Explaining the failure, he said the authorities shut down the power generation system at night due to lower demand in winter to save fuel costs.

But when the systems were turned on in the morning, “frequency variation and voltage fluctuation were observed in the south of the country somewhere between Dadu and Jamshoro” resulting in shutting down of power

generating units one by one, he said.

People in Pakistan’s financial capital Karachi woke up on Monday with no electricity available anywhere in the metropolis. According to details, the major power breakdown also hit other cities across Pakistan but Karachi was the worst affected. In Peshawar, a city of over 2.3 million people, some people were reportedly unable to get drinking water as the pumps

were powered by electricity.

It is not the first time that the country has faced such a crisis.

Last year in October, Pakistan witnessed a 12-hour power outage due to technical glitches in the electricity distribution system.

Pakistan is grappling with one of the country’s worst economic crises in recent years amid dwindling foreign exchange reserves. The crisis forced the government earlier this month to order shopping malls and markets to close by 8:30 pm for energy conservation purposes.

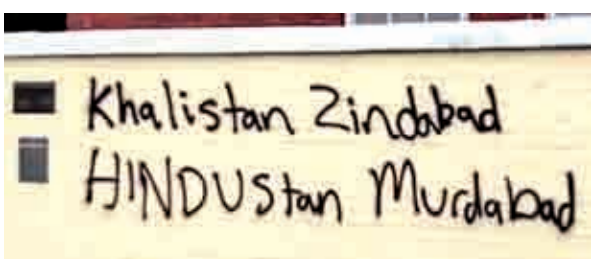
The sorry state of the country’s power sector is emblematic of its ailing economy. The power outages occur frequently due to lack of funds to upgrade aging infrastructure.

Third Hindu temple vandalised in Australia within fortnight



Melbourne, Jan 23 (PTI):

A third Hindu temple has been vandalised within a fortnight in Australia’s Victoria state allegedly by “Khalistani supporters” with anti-India graffiti, according to a media report on Monday. The management of the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) temple also known as the Hare Krishna Temple in Melbourne’s Albert Park on Monday morning found the walls of the revered temple vandalised with graffiti “Hindustan Mardabad”, The Australia Today website reported.

“We are shocked and outraged with this blatant

disregard for respect for the place of worship,” Bhakta Das, Director of Communication for ISKCON Temple, said.

“A complaint has been filed with Victoria Police and CCTV footage is being provided to assist them in their pursuit of culprits.”

This is the third such incident in the country within a fortnight.

On January 16, the historic Shri Shiva Vishnu Temple in Carrum Downs, Victoria, was vandalised in a similar manner.

On January 12, the Swaminarayan temple in Melbourne was defaced by ‘anti-social elements’ with anti-India graffiti.

Acting Premier of Victoria Jacinta Allan told

The Australia Today, “All Victorians deserve to practice their faith free from racism, vilification and hatred.” “This behaviour is not reflective of the majority of Victorians. The diversity of Victoria is one of our strongest assets, and we condemn these attacks,” Allan added. This attack on ISKCON Temple came just two days after Victorian multi-faith leaders had an emergency meeting with the Victorian Multicultural Commission after which a statement of condemnation was issued against the spread of Hindu hate allegedly by Khalistani supporters.

“This is disgusting. We must not allow this to happen,” Victorian Liberal Party MP Brad Battin has told The Australia Today.

Federal Member of Parliament Josh Burns also issued a statement saying, “I was shocked today to learn of the hateful attack on the Hare Krishna temple in Albert Park.”

Russia expels Estonia ambassador amid ‘destroyed’ relations

Moscow, Jan 23 (AP):

Russia is expelling Estonia’s ambassador and the country’s diplomatic mission will be headed by a charge d’affaires, the Russian Foreign Ministry said Monday.

Estonian Ambassador Margus Laidre was ordered to leave the country by February 7, the ministry said.

The statement said that Estonia’s diplomatic representation from now on will be downgraded to a charge d’affaires heading the European Union country’s mission in Moscow.

The ministry said that the move was made in retaliation for Estonia’s “new unfriendly step to radically reduce the size of the Russian Embassy in Tallinn.” The Estonian Foreign Ministry earlier this month ordered Russia to reduce the number of its embassy staff to eight diplomats and 15 administrative,

technical, and service staff members in order to “reach parity in embassy staff” by February 1.

Estonia has reduced its bilateral relations with Moscow “to the absolute minimum” since the Kremlin sent troops into Ukraine, Estonian Foreign Minister Urmas Reinsalu said in a statement on January 11.

“Now we are setting a limit to the number of Russian diplomats working in Estonia in order to achieve parity. Today’s step is in correlation with the low point of our relations in general,” he said.

The Russian Foreign Ministry said Monday that “the Estonian leadership has purposefully destroyed the entire range of relations with Russia.” “Total Russophobia, the cultivation of hostility towards our country have been elevated by Tallinn to the rank of state policy,” the statement read.

Imran Khan says he will challenge Punjab caretaker CM’s appointment in SC

Lahore, Jan 23 (PTI):

Pakistan’s ex-premier Imran Khan has said he will challenge in the Supreme Court the appointment of Mohsin Naqvi as the caretaker chief minister of Punjab, describing him an “enemy” of his party and slamming the election commission for reducing the country to a “Banana Republic”.

Naqvi was sworn in as the caretaker chief minister of Punjab on Sunday night, hours after the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) unanimously decided to appoint him to the post.

His appointment came after the ruling party and the opposition in the province failed to reach consensus on a name for the post. Naqvi, who was one of the two candidates suggested by ex-Chief Minister Hamza Shehbaz, is the owner of a media house and said to be very close to PPP leader Asif Ali Zardari.

“PML-N has history of selecting their own umpires but it’s incredible how ECP has selected a sworn enemy of PTI as caretaker CM Punjab a post meant for a non-partisan person,” Khan said in a tweet. The PTI chief posted a picture of Naqvi’s plea bargain to the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) requesting that he be allowed to pay Rs 3.5 million as plea bargain in the Haris Steels Mills corruption case.

“Naqvi made a voluntary return deal with the anti-graft watchdog and the Supreme Court had de-

clared in a suo motu case no. 17/2016 that a person responsible for voluntary return could not hold any public office at federal or provincial level nor in any state organisation,” he said.

“ECP has helped reduce Pak to a Banana Republic making our democracy a joke. I will be holding a presser tomorrow to expose this entire farce,” he said on Sunday. Khan said Naqvi has been tasked with delaying the elections in Punjab and to sabotage the PTI. Mohsin Naqvi has come with a two-point agenda extend the present set-up’s tenure for a year, and do all that he can to damage the PTI,” Pakistan Muslim League-Quaid (PMLQ) senior leader Moonis Elahi tweeted.

Former Chief Minister of PTI Chaudhry Parvez Elahi dissolved the Punjab Assembly on January 12 on the wish of Khan to push the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) led federal coalition to call for snap polls.

Biden’s next climate hurdle: Enticing Americans to buy green

Washington, Jan 23 (AP):

President Joe Biden persuaded Democrats in Congress to provide hundreds of billions of dollars to fight climate change. Now comes another formidable task: enticing Americans to buy millions of electric cars, heat pumps, solar panels and more efficient appliances.

It’s a public relations challenge that could determine whether the country meets Biden’s ambitious goal to cut greenhouse gas emissions in half by 2030.

Relying on tax credits and rebates made the climate legislation it was approved in August with only Democratic votes more politically palatable than regulations that force wholesale changes in polluting industries.

But it also means the administration’s battle against global warming



will be waged “one household at a time,” said Shannon Baker Branstetter, who works on energy issues at the Centre for American Progress, a liberal think tank closely aligned with the White House. “It is very incremental,” she said. “So it requires a very sophisticated communications strategy.”

Biden acknowledged the hurdle during a recent Cabinet meeting as he talked about the incentives that are becoming available this year. “Folks need to know how to take ad-

vantage of these benefits that we passed. That’s on all of us around the table here to make sure we get that message out clearly,” he said.

The White House says it is piecing together a plan to partner with state governments, contractors, retailers and social media influencers to get the word out. “Lowering utility bills is going to be a key driver,” said Josh Peck, a senior policy adviser on clean energy issues. It’s also collaborating with Rewiring America, a nonprofit focused on ways to electrify homes and businesses, and companies like Airbnb, Redfin and Lyft.

As part of the effort, Rewiring America created an online calculator that shows what credits or rebates homeowners might be eligible for, depending on their ZIP code and income.

India issues visa to 249 Pakistani pilgrims to visit Ajmer Sharif

Islamabad, Jan 23 (PTI):

India has issued visas to 249 Pakistani pilgrims to visit the tomb of Sufi saint Moinuddin Chishti in Ajmer, Rajasthan, an official said on Sunday.

Citing a spokesperson of the Ministry of Religious Affairs and Interfaith Harmony, the state-run Radio Pakistan reported that 488 applicants had applied for visas, but only 249 pilgrims were granted visas.

The spokesperson said that all the pilgrims have been informed to reach Lahore from where they will embark on a journey to India on Tuesday.

He said six officials were deputed to take care of the pilgrims during their stay in

India. However, only one of them was granted permission to go with the pilgrims, he added.

The two counties allow pilgrims to travel under the Protocol on Visits to Religious Shrines, signed by India and Pakistan in September of 1974.

However, it has been witnessed that the two sides routinely reject visas of pilgrims on various grounds.

Kyiv, Jan 23 (AP):

The speaker of the lower house of Russia’s parliament warned Sunday that countries supplying Ukraine with more powerful weapons risked their own destruction, a message that followed new pledges of armoured vehicles, air defence systems and other equipment but not the battle tanks Kyiv requested.

Ukraine’s supporters pledged billions of dollars in military aid to Ukraine during a meeting at Ramstein Air Base in

Germany on Friday, though the new commitments were overshadowed by a failure to agree on Ukraine’s urgent request for German-made Leopard 2 battle tanks. The issue appeared to

move close to a resolution late Sunday when Germany’s top diplomat said her country would not object if Poland decided to send some of its Leopards to Ukraine.

Asian community reeling after Lunar New Year shooting

Monterey Park (US), Jan 23 (AP):

It was a joyful kickoff to the first Lunar New Year celebration in Monterey Park since before the pandemic, with large crowds filling the streets in the majority Chinese American city near Los Angeles for live entertainment, carnival rides and plenty of food. But the celebrations

were marred by tragedy Saturday night after a gunman entered a ballroom dance hall and opened fire, killing 10 people, wounding 10 more and sending panicked revellers into the streets.

The shooting that left 5 men and 5 women dead brought a jarring end to the planned two-day party to ring in the Year

of the Rabbit, which featured dragon dancers parading through downtown streets decorated with red lanterns.

Sunday’s festivities were cancelled, though some Lunar New Year celebrations went on in neighbouring cities also home to large Asian-American populations.

“We haven’t had a celebration like this in

three years, so this was momentous. People came out in droves,” said Mayor Pro Tem Jose Sanchez, who was there with his 6-year-old daughter.

He estimated 100,000 people attended Saturday, and the festival is typically one of the largest Lunar New Year celebrations in the state.

Social media influencers
cannot go scot-free

The decision of the Union government announced on Friday making it mandatory for social media influencers to disclose all "material" interests such as gifts, hotel accommodation, equity, discounts and awards which they receive when endorsing any products, services or scheme, is a very welcome move. What is more welcome is the second part of the announcement – that, failing to make such disclosure would attract strict legal action, including ban on endorsements can be taken. This decision of the government comes as a part of the continuing efforts to clamp down on misleading advertisements as also to protect the interests of consumers – the common people – in the backdrop of the expanding social influencer market. According to latest estimates, the social influencer market is projected to grow 20 per cent every year to reach Rs 2,800 crore by 2025. The government has also empowered the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) to impose a penalty of up to Rs 10 lakh on manufacturers, advertisers and endorsers, and penalty of up to Rs 50 lakh for the subsequent offences. In addition, the penalty prescribed for misleading advertisement under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 will also remain applicable, the government said. The decision of the government is aimed at social media influencers which have material connection with the brand they want to promote on various social media platforms. This is also a kind of obligation for the social media influencers to behave responsibly as far as the disclosure is concerned to the consumers. It has been a trend in recent times across the globe for companies and manufacturers to actively collaborate with 'social media influencers' for marketing their products and brands. Influencer advertising is a major latest trend for gaining publicity, with manufacturers ranging from big multinational companies to local businesses resorting to this new game. With certain people attaining celebrity status through social media and thus becoming influencers, common people have been allegedly led into a trap, especially by unscrupulous companies and manufacturers. This in turn has opened up floodgates for the common people to be left cheated, especially when the innocent ones began to believe what the social media influencers say or endorse, not knowing that most of these people do not use or consume the products they endorse, and/or a sizable chunk of such products are not exactly what it is claimed to be.

Pros and Cons of Foreign Educational
Institutions in India

The decision of the Government and the University Grants Commission to allow foreign universities to set up campuses in India is a welcome step. This initiative will not only provide access to global quality education to our students but will also create healthy competition among institutions. But the new regulation allows free play to the foreign institution, and they are given more freedom, which is not given to the Indian institution "for example, they can decide their fees, and admission criteria, and have full say in faculty appointments". Can get freedom. "The policy will damage, weaken and destroy the Indian higher education system, leading to commercialization.

The decision of the Government and the University Grants Commission to allow foreign universities to set up campuses in India is a welcome step. This initiative will not only provide access to global quality education to our students but will also create healthy competition among institutions. The government of India is ready for this. Welcome foreign universities like Harvard, Oxford, and Yale to India. Foreign universities ranked in the top 500 globally, as well as other "prestigious" foreign higher education institutions, can set up campuses in India - as outlined in the country's National Education Policy (NEP), which was adopted in 2020. The final plans were unveiled by the University Grants Commission (UGC) chairman who pointed out that foreign universities with Indian campus-

es can offer full-time programs only "offline" and not through online or distance learning.

The decision of the Government and the University Grants Commission to allow foreign universities to set up campuses in India is a welcome step. This initiative will not only provide access to global quality education to our students but will also create healthy competition among institutions. In this environment, commercialization of the functioning of higher education institutions has become a top priority for Indian universities. Other challenges facing Indian higher education include demographic composition, poor performance, adherence to traditional systems, the digital divide, and struggles in scaling up. Over-centralization and lack of accountability and

professionalism are other issues. The burden of academic and administrative responsibilities has also increased significantly, undermining the core agenda of higher education, i.e. imparting knowledge, quality teaching and research, and improving governance structures. The lack of domain expertise in academic administrators has also hampered education reforms. hindered the progress of A primary reason for not prioritizing management reforms in India is that university leadership and academic administrators may not have the domain expertise to improve internal governance structures, processes, and managerial approaches. Meanwhile, uncertainty over funding of higher education, ever-increasing enrollment of students, global competition, the persistence of traditional systems, prioritization of digitization, and continued marketization of higher education indicate the need for complete modernization and commercialization of systems of higher education institutions.

A report by India-based business consulting firm Red Sear on higher education abroad estimated that the number of Indian students going for higher education abroad increased from 440,000 in 2016 to 770,000 in 2019. This is set to grow to around 1.8 million by 2024. Foreign spending was poised to increase from the current \$28 billion to \$80 billion (€18.5 billion to €74 billion) annually by 2024. Many students choose to go abroad for experience and earning opportunities abroad that are not available in India. However, some teachers are not sure how much of an impact the move will have and believe there is an urgent need to reform the current university system, where individuality is stifled. It is not clear whether the top foreign institutions that are being targeted by the scheme would be interested in coming to India, nor is the current political situation conducive for them. At

present, the space for any independent, critical analysis has been severely curtailed. This will certainly be on the minds of those who lead foreign universities being invited here. Establishing universities and campuses is a challenging proposition, not including developing curricula, building research facilities, hiring faculty staff, and relocating international workers, among other considerations.

The new regulation allows free play to foreign institutions, and they are given more freedom, which is not given to the Indian institution "for example, they can decide their fees, admission criteria, and complete freedom in faculty appointments". UGC's decision to allow foreign universities to set up branches in India will "damage" the country's higher education system. "The policy will damage, weaken and destroy the Indian higher education system, leading to commercialization. This decision will make education costlier and will adversely affect Dalits, minorities, and the poor. The decision is a reflection of the pro-rich approach of the government." The establishment of foreign universities here was inevitable in the era of globalization, and given that there are barriers to the exchange of goods, services, and ideas, it was inevitable that education would be the final frontier, where all barriers would break. The proposal to allow foreign universities to set up offshore campuses in India in the New Education Policy 2020 could significantly change the dynamics of higher education in India. It can also save India a significant amount of foreign exchange and over time become a source of foreign exchange earnings if foreign students also choose to enroll in these campuses.

Union Budget 2023-24: Must provide relief to workforce

Union Budget 2023-24 has a greater responsibility of protecting India's workforce at a time when they are at high risk of being forced into accepting lower quality jobs, as warned by ILO's World Employment and Social Outlook (WESO) Trend 2023, large scale job cuts is adding into the woes of the employed, unemployment rate have been rising, and job opportunities are set to shrink considerably. It is because, Indian Economic growth projections have been revised downwards for 2023 and likely to be so revised further, given deteriorating domestic and global conditions and faster than anticipated monetary tightening as per IMF, household consumption will be held back by the slow recovery of the labour market and by high inflation, as warned by the World Bank.

Working age population in India is above 90 per cent (about 126 crore) of the total population of the country which is likely remain above 87 per cent by 2030, as WESO Trend 2023

has estimated. However, as per CMIE data for December 2022, only 41 crore people were in job, and the unemployment rate was as high as 8.3 per cent. It clearly presents a case for framing of a National Employment Policy, as it was recommended long back in 2013 by Indian Labour Conference, the highest tripartite body of India for labour issues, but the Modi government has not been interested in it, an attitude that it must change for national interest. In contrast, Modi government has been pushing for implementation of the four labour codes after subsuming 29 labour laws. These codes were passed in the parliament in 2019 and 2020, and the labour rules are framed at the Centre and in majority of the states and UTs. PM Narendra Modi has labelled it as the biggest and long overdue labour reform in India. Government has said that they are ready to implement these codes, and hence it is expected that the Union Budget 2023-24 may announce its implementation from the next fiscal. Human resource Industry is expecting rollout of these

codes, while joint from to Central Trade Unions have been agitating for their roll back since they find these codes pro-corporate and anti-labour and fearing that these codes will bring modern day slavery for the workforce. This fear must be read with the WESO Trend 2023 warning that workforce in general would be forced into lower quality jobs. Therefore, rolling back these codes would be proper at this time of deteriorating job market as demanded by CTUs, rather than rolling them out. It is recalled that two months ago Central Trade Unions had boycotted the budget consultation exercise in the last week of November, since Union Finance Ministry did not give more than three minutes to every CTU. However, CTUs have sent a letter to Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman stating their expectations and demand from the Union Budget 2023-24. Demands of the CTUs are worth noting which included taking such policy decisions that could boost demand to invigorate the sagging economy. It would require putting money into the hands

of the people. The importance of full social security coverage for the entire workforce lies here. They have demanded increase in allocation of MGNREGA the rural employment guarantee scheme for rural India. Given the higher unemployment rate in the urban India at about 11 per cent in December, the government must announce similar urban employment guarantee scheme for urban areas. CTUs demands also include giving scheme workers the status of government employees, paying them minimum wages, filling vacant posts, giving up plans to sell PSUs, shelving the Electricity (Amendment) Bill, 2022, not privatizing government hospitals, reducing GST burden on common people particularly in fuel and essential commodities, and increasing taxes on corporates and introduction of wealth tax to fund social sector programmes. Creation of new decent jobs is of utmost importance, which can be possible only through reverting back from profit oriented economic policies to human centered ones, as the UN and ILO have been

emphasizing since especially since the outbreak of COVID-19. Informalisation of the job market is on the rise, and AITUC has said that it has reached now to 97 per cent of all jobs, who have no social security coverage. It should also be noted that above 81 crore people have been surviving for the last three years on 5kg of free foodgrains per month. Union Budget 2023-24 must create jobs for them or provide full social security coverage.

The high level of unemployment shows that all the earlier schemes of the Modi government towards job creation and improving the labour market have failed which included PLI Scheme, Make in India, Atmanirbhar Bharat, etc. It is imperative therefore for the Union Finance Ministry to announce correction measures in the Union Budget 2023-24. To bring the job market back on track Modi government does not only need human centric development policies, but also to reverse its present policy to promote gig or informal jobs to create decent jobs with full social security coverage.

Expansion



■ **Varanasi:** Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) will complete expansion of its Vizag oil refinery in Andhra Pradesh to 15 million tonne per annum by June, its Chairman Pushp Joshi said on Sunday. HPCL is expanding the 8.33 million tonne per annum (MTPA) refinery and building a new one at Barmer in Rajasthan to bridge the gap between the fuel it produces and sells. "We have started commissioning activity and hope to complete it by June-end," he said. HPCL sells 50 per cent more petrol, diesel and LPG than it produces. The Vizag expansion as well as the 9 MTPA unit in Rajasthan expected by 2024-end, would bridge the gap. Joshi said HPCL's residue upgradation project at Vizag refinery will improve its distillate yield and will be ready by the end of 2023.

FTA

■ **London:** The India-UK free trade agreement (FTA) is expected to be clinched this year but it won't involve any boost of free movement visa offers for Indians, British trade minister in charge of the negotiations has said. Kemi Badenoch, who was in New Delhi last month to kick off the sixth round of FTA talks with Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal, said that former prime minister Boris Johnson's "deal by Diwali" deadline last year was not feasible and had to be changed. In an interview with The Times' recently, the UK Secretary of State for Trade also ruled out any major similarities between the FTA the UK had struck with Australia one of the first post-Brexit trade deals and that with India. "We left the EU (European Union) because we didn't believe in free movement, we didn't think it was working. This is not a deal that's negotiating some kind of free movement with India," Badenoch told the newspaper, with reference to more visa offers.

■ **Bengaluru:** Former Prime Minister H D Deve Gowda has written to Prime Minister Narendra Modi requesting him to instruct the Ministry of Steel and the Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL) authorities to drop the proposal for closure of Visvesvaraya Iron and Steel Limited (VISL) at Bhadravati. The JD(S) supremo also has urged the Prime Minister to do the needful for the revival of VISL.

Apple looks to scale up manufacturing in India: Goyal

Gandhinagar, Jan 23:

iPhone-maker Apple is looking to scale up its manufacturing in India as the business environment is helping global firms make the country their base, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Monday. He said that India offers a rule of law, and transparent government policies and business models which help it become a preferred destination for foreign investors. Talking about success stories of certain foreign companies, he said Apple already have about 5-7 per cent of their manufacturing in India. "If I am not mistaken, they are targeting to go up to 25 per cent of their manufacturing. They launched their most recent models from India, manufactured in India." The minister was speaking at the inaugural session of the B20 India Inception Meeting here, which was organised by industry chamber CII.



Citing another example of a foreign company in the earth movers machine sector, the minister said that because of the competitiveness of India's manufacturing, that firm is supplying their products now to 110 countries at affordable competitive prices from India and also doing new launches. In November 2022, Telecom and IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw had said that the biggest unit to manufacture Apple iPhone in India is coming up at Hosur near Bengaluru, which will employ around 60,000 people. The compa-

ny gets iPhones manufactured by electronics giants - Foxconn, Wistron and Pegatron in India. When asked about the global economic uncertainties, he said that this would be a challenging year for the world. He said that inflation in several countries is "very high" but in such a situation also, India has managed prices. During the tenure of this government so far, average inflation would be around 4.5 per cent, he said adding earlier 10-12 per cent of inflation was common.

At a time when developed economies are facing slow down, the Indian economy is emerging as one of the fastest growing in the world due to steps taken by the Modi government, Goyal said. On increasing interest rates in the country, he said that the rates have increased recently due to the situation arising out of the Covid-19 pandemic and war between Ukraine and Russia.

Indigenously-developed 5G, 4G tech roll out this year: Vaishnaw

Will offer to world next year

Gandhinagar, Jan 23:

Indigenously-developed 5G and 4G telecom technology stack will be rolled out in the country this year and the platform will be offered to the world from next year, Union telecom minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Monday. While speaking at The Business 20 (B20), the official G20 dialogue forum with the global business community, Vaishnaw said that only five countries in the world have end-to-end 4G-5G telecom technology stack but now with the public-private partnership, India has developed its own technology which has been tested to handle 10 million simultaneous calls. 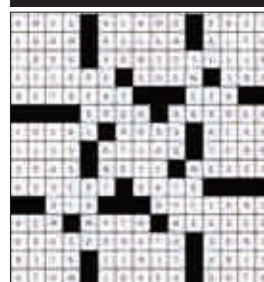

Indore, Jan 23 (PTI):

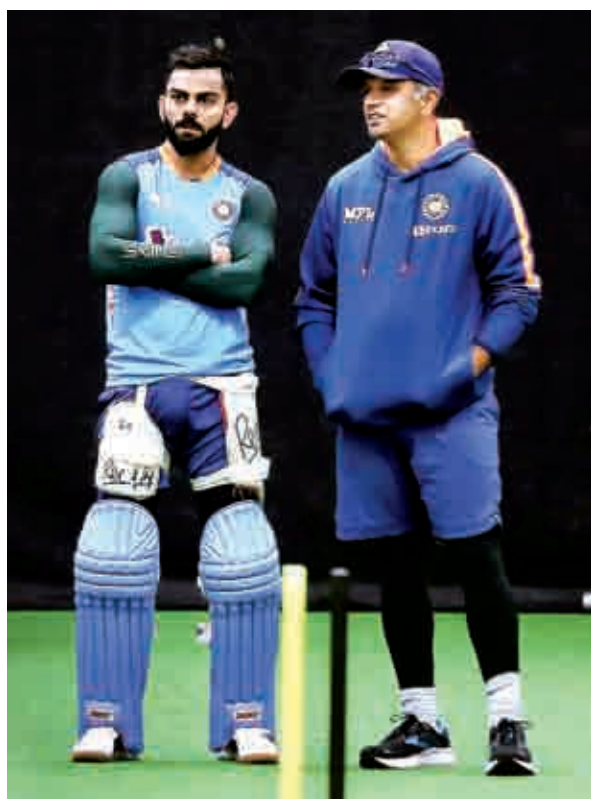
With a series sweep in sight, the middle order will be eager to give a better account of themselves as the Indian team management contemplates rotating its bowlers in the third and final ODI against New Zealand here on Tuesday.

Opener Shubman Gill has been in excellent form, having scored a sensational double hundred in the opener, followed by a 40-run knock in the low-scoring second ODI. Skipper Rohit Sharma, too, is having a good run.

However, the home team is aware that despite enjoying an unassailable 2-0 lead in the series, Shubman and Rohit have been the only two batters among runs for the hosts.

At the same time, it is also a fact that the others haven't been tested and the dead rubber will be the perfect opportunity for the likes of Ishan Kishan, Hardik Pandya and Suryakumar Yadav to get some batting practice in match situations.

Kohli's problem against left-arm spin has come to the fore once again as the talismanic batter has repeatedly gotten dismissed by Mitchell Santner.



After notching three hundreds in four innings, the former skipper was dismissed cheaply in both the ODIs as New Zealand's star left-arm spinner exposed the chinks in Kohli's armour. With the World Cup just months away, Kohli would be keen for some much-needed course correction. In the absence

of Shreyas Iyer, Suryakumar was expected to provide some firepower at the back end. However, the premier T20 batter failed to do that in the series-opener.

Hardik, too, has been underwhelming with the bat of late. He has had a mediocre series against Sri Lanka and hasn't im-

pressed against New Zealand yet.

The Indian bowlers were guilty of letting New Zealand score over 300 runs after being 131 for six in the first ODI, but the seamers came back strongly in the Raipur game.

Mohammed Shami, Mohammed Siraj and Hardik were clinical while the spinners have also done a decent job.

New Zealand, on the other hand, will be eager to grab a consolation win to boost their morale. For that to happen, the Black Caps, who are without the services of regular skipper Kane Williamson, will have to address their batting woes.

New Zealand's top six batters have scored 40 or more on just seven occasions in the last 30 innings. The only batter that has impressed in their line-up is Michael Bracewell, who along with Mitchell Santner almost took his side over the line in Hyderabad.

Even the bounce and smaller boundaries make the pitch at the Holkar Stadium batter-friendly and the bowlers will have to work hard to keep the scoring in check.

Jakarta, Jan 23 (PTI): Top Indian shuttlers, including Lakshya Sen, will look to quickly recover from the India Open disappointment when they begin their campaign at the Indonesia Masters Super 500 tournament, starting here on Tuesday. India cut a sorry figure at home as the country's challenge ended in the second round following the early exits of P V Sindhu, Sen and the withdrawal of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy due to a hip injury last week. While Sindhu and Satwik-Chirag are not playing this week, Sen will look to get back his mojo after his second-round exit against Denmark's Rasmus Gemke. A tough battle will be on the cards for the 21-year-old from Almora as he faces the fast and furious Kodai Naraoka, who has been in sensational form, having reached the finals of the Malaysia Open. The Japanese, who is from the same 2018 batch as Sen, has a 3-1 career record against the Indian, having beaten him at the Denmark Open last October. Eighth seed HS Prannoy, too, will look for a good show after a first-round exit against Sen in the India Open. He had reached the quarterfinals in Malaysia and will take on Japan's Kanta Tsuneyama, a tricky customer, in his opener.

Sabalenka tops Bencic for her first QF spot in Australian Open



Melbourne, Jan 23 (AP): Fifth-seeded Aryna Sabalenka defeated Belinda Bencic 7-5, 6-2 on Monday to reach the quarterfinals of the Australian Open for the first time.

Bencic double-faulted to drop the first set, which put Sabalenka in control from that point. No. 4-seeded Caroline Garcia faced Magda Linette later Monday for another place

in the women's quarterfinals. Garcia reached the semifinals of the U.S. Open last season but has never reached the quarterfinals in Australia. Top-seeded Iga Swiatek and No. 2 Ons Jabeur have both been eliminated, leaving No. 3 Jessica Pegula as the highest ranked women through to the final eight.

"I'm super happy with the win today," Sabalenka said. "She (Bencic) is an unbelievable player. She played so good. I'm really happy with the level today." Sabalenka said she had worked hard on controlling her emotions during matches. "It takes me a little while to understand that negative emotions are not going to help me on court," she said. "You just have to stay strong and believe no matter what." Sabalenka also said her fitness has improved. "We did a lot of work in the pre-season and I'm super happy that everything is working right now," she said. Novak Djokovic faced Alex de Minaur Monday for a place in the men's quarterfinals. Djokovic is aiming for this 10th title at the Australian Open and his 22nd Grand Slam title. The Grand Slam mark would tie him with Rafael Nadal for the most by any man.

Marry Kom to lead Oversight Committee to probe allegations against WFI president



New Delhi, Jan 23 (PTI):

Boxing great MC Mary Kom will lead a five-member Oversight Committee that will probe the sexual harassment charges against Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) president Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh.

The government-appointed committee will also run the day-to-day affairs of WFI for the next one month.

The other members of the panel are Olympic medallist wrestler

Yogeshwar Dutt, former badminton player and Mission Olympic Cell member Trupti Murgunde, ex-TOPS CEO Rajagopalan and former SAI executive director - teams - Radhica Sreeman. The announcement of the panel was made by Sports Minister Anurag Thakur on Monday.

Thakur had decided to form the committee on Saturday following a three-day sit-in protest by some of the country's top wrestlers including Vinesh Phogat, Bajrang

Punia, Sakshi Malik and Ravi Dahiya against the WFI and its chief.

The wrestlers ended their protest after a breakthrough was achieved during a marathon second round of talks with Thakur late on Friday night.

"The WFI president will not discharge his duties and stay away from day-to-day affairs of WFI. The day-to-day working of WFI will be looked after by the Oversight Committee till their mandated duration and it will also probe the serious allegations against WFI and its chief," Thakur said.

"The Oversight Committee will be under the chairmanship of world champion Mary Kom. Along with her, Yogeshwar Dutt, MOC member and Dronacharya awardee Trupti Murgunde, former TOPS CEO Rajagopalan and former ED Teams, SAI Radhica Sreeman will be part of the committee.

WIPL Team Bid: BCCI set for another 4000 cr windfall

New Delhi, Jan 23 (PTI):

The BCCI is all set to get richer by up to Rs 4000 crore with some of the top business houses set to bid aggressively for the five Women's IPL (WIPL) teams that would be auctioned on Wednesday.

According to market experts, the teams are expected to shell out in the "range of 500 to 600 crore INR" per team in the closed-bid auction.

"WIPL has huge potential but most of the legacy teams would like to mix optimism with pragmatism," an industry insider, who has previously worked on men's IPL team bid, told PTI ahead of auction.

"Expect a few bids in the range of Rs 500 crore upwards. Rs 800 crore plus could be a bit ambitious but BCCI won't complain," he added.

More than 30 odd companies have bought the bid documents



worth Rs 5 lakh including all the 10 men's IPL team. Well-known corporate houses such as Adani group, Torrent group, Haldiram's Prabhuj, Capri Global, Kotak and Aditya Birla Group have also shown interest in buying a team. Some of these companies were unsuccessful when BCCI in-

vited bids for two new men's teams in 2021.

Among the traditional IPL teams, Mumbai Indians, Rajasthan Royals, Delhi Capitals, KKR could seriously contemplate to add to the bouquet of their already existing men's teams across the globe.

According to market insiders, there are two

principles on which these bids are placed by the business houses.

First one is "Return on Investment" (ROI), which is the core principal of any business. It is profit on what an entity spends.

The second one isn't a business principle as such but in business community they call it

"Return of Ego".

This is something where some of the biggest business names are ready to shell out any amount if they have their eyes on buying a particular property. Even if it takes five to seven years for touching breakeven point.

It's about wanting to purchase something at any cost

An existing IPL franchise with its "steady revenue stream" in place can afford to "bleed" a bit more in initial years which is imperative.

A former IPL franchisee official, who had once worked on bids, explained the rationale which goes into the bidding.

"Let's say, a franchise makes a winning bid of Rs 500 crore for a period of five years. Now that's Rs 100 crore committed straightaway for each of next five years," the source explained.

First priority is to get 100 percent fit: Jadeja



Chennai, Jan 23 (PTI):

Star India all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja, who is making a return to competitive cricket after close to six months, on Monday said his first priority is to get "100 percent" match fit ahead of the crucial Test series against Australia. "I am feeling good to be back on the field.

Very excited. Hopefully it will come good as a team and as an individual also," Jadeja, who will lead Saurashtra in their final Ranji Trophy Group B league match against Tamil Nadu beginning here on Tuesday, told reporters.

"...See my first priority is to get on the field and be fit...100 per cent fit. Once I am 100 per cent fit, I will work more on my skills, whether it is batting or bowling. Now, my first priority is fitness..." Jadeja had to undergo a knee surgery last year after playing for India last in August. He said he had spent time at the National Cricket Academy (NCA) in Bengaluru and added that he wanted game time before the Test series against the visiting Australians. "I was at the NCA for 20 days. I was doing batting and bowling. Match scenario is different. I wanted one game before the Australia series, that's why I am here." He has been picked in the India squad for the first two Tests subject to fitness. When asked if there was any discomfort now, Jadeja said: "Not really...after five months I am playing competitive cricket, so you don't feel confident initially.

Overdependence on Harmanpreet, Hardik's injury cost India dear in disastrous WC campaign



Bhubaneswar, Jan 23 (PTI): Patchy, inconsistent and lack of execution. These are the words used frequently by head coach Graham Reid during India's disastrous FIH Men's World Cup campaign, which undid the team's historic bronze-winning feat at the Tokyo Olympics. The choice of adjectives from the veteran coach and former

Australia international was indicative of the struggle of his wards in this World Cup. This despite having 12 players from the Tokyo Games squad. For a team that had come into the tournament with hopes of a first podium finish after the 1975 gold, crashing out before the quarterfinals was nothing short of a debacle. This team was good

enough to at least reach the quarterfinals, if not the semifinals. But who would have thought that the world number six home side would lose to 12th ranked New Zealand in the penalty shootout of the crossover match after being ahead by two goals on two occasions. With crores of rupees being spent on the team's training, exposure tours and

support staff salaries, it ought to have done better. This was the fourth worst performance for the country in the history of the World Cup. The best India can finish in this tournament is ninth, for which they will begin with their classification match against Japan on January 26 in Rourkela. India is one of the four teams to have taken part in all the 15 editions of the World Cup and they had finished below ninth on four occasions — in 1986 (12th), 1990 (10th), 2002 (10th) and 2006 (10th). They had finished ninth in 1998 and 2014. In the last edition, India had finished sixth after losing to the Netherlands in the quarterfinals. The reasons for the early exit are numerous, as Reid himself said at the post-match press conference on Sunday. Two main reasons were the abysmal rate of penalty corner conversion and the lack of finishing by the forwards. Adding to this was the inconsistency in defending.

Kohli, SKY, Pandya in ICC T20 Team of 2022

Dubai, Jan 23 (PTI): Former India captain Virat Kohli, all-rounder Hardik Pandya and shortest format's number one batter Suryakumar Yadav were on Monday picked in ICC 'Men's T20 team of 2022'. The ICC also announced the Women's Team of 2022 with four Indians in the lineup — Smriti Mandhana, Deepti Sharma, Richa Ghosh and Renuka Singh. Kohli returned to his vintage form in 2022 and took the Asia Cup by storm, finishing as the second-highest run-getter with 276 runs in five games. He also brought an end to his century drought of close to three years with a magnificent century against Afghanistan. Kohli played one of the greatest T20I innings of 82 not out in India's heist against Pakistan in the World Cup opener in Melbourne. Kohli ended the tournament with three more fifties and finished as the highest run-scorer with 296 runs. Surya became the only second batter to score more than 1000 runs in a calendar year. He ended as the top-run getter (1164 runs) with two hundreds and nine half-centuries while striking at a stunning 187.43.

India's batting superstar Smriti Mandhana finished the year as the fourth highest run-scorer with 594 runs at an average of 33.00 and a strike-rate of

133.48. She also made two half-centuries and played a key role in India winning a historic silver at the Commonwealth Games.

Off-spin all-rounder Deepti had a standout year and was the Player of the Tournament in India's Asia Cup triumph.

She finished the year with 29 wickets, the joint third highest. She also made 370 runs averaging 37 with a strike-rate of 136.02.

Richa was named the wicket-keeper-batter following a stupendous year that saw her accumulate 259 runs in 18 matches.

With 22 T20I wickets at an average of 23.95 and an economy rate of 6.50, Renuka had a standout year and was one of the nominees for the ICC Women's Emerging Cricketer of the Year.

Delhi traffic crawls due to restrictions

For R-Day Parade rehearsal

New Delhi, Nov 23 (PTI):

The national capital saw massive traffic jams and a slowing down of vehicular movement in many areas on Monday owing to restrictions for the Republic Day Parade rehearsal, with commuters stuck for hours on roads. Major roads in and around Delhi including on the DND flyover and Ghazipur border were affected from the morning rush hours till around 2 pm. Busy stretches including ITO, Sardar Patel Marg, Kashmeri Gate and Chanakyaपुर were also choked.

The Delhi Traffic Police had issued an advisory on the arrangements and restrictions for the smooth conduct of Monday's full dress rehearsal of the Republic Day parade. Many

office goers had come prepared for traffic diversions, but alternative routes also witnessed slow traffic. "Sri Aurbindo Marg was completely blocked due to traffic. Even as I took the other route via Malviya Nagar, there was traffic from Hauz Khas onwards. The road leading towards Parliament Street from Chanakyaपुर was completely blocked due to heavy traffic and caused a delay of at least an hour," said Ananya Basu (35).

Even those who left early for their destination failed to beat the traffic woes. "Today I had to leave for work 30 minutes early as there were some traffic restrictions issued by the Delhi traffic police. Although there was enough deployment of police personnel, traffic near Ram

Manohar Lohia hospital, which is usually smooth, was moving slowly," Silpi, who was heading to Parliament Street, said. Several people also opted for Delhi metro due to the traffic jams. "I usually commute by car but today I knew that roads will be chock-a-block, so I took the metro," said Krishan Pal.

Police said they received several calls from commuters reporting traffic woes. Vikas Marg (from Laxmi Nagar to ITO), Pragati Maidan, and Akshardham were three of several such stretches which witnessed intractable snarls. Ankita Singh, a commuter, said, "Traffic from Noida till Akshardham was heavy. The route leading towards ITO also had traffic jams and the GPS showed 40

minutes to cover a distance of around 6 kilometres."

Several commuters took to Twitter to inform others about the traffic situation in the city, with one of them reporting heavy jams on ITO, Pragati Maidan, and Geeta Colony flyover. While one said that traffic did not move at ITO for over an hour, another commuter, who said he was stuck for two hours, advised people against venturing out on roads. Prerna Singh, who works in central Delhi, said, "I live in the southern part of the city and reach my office within an hour and a half. "However, there were several roads that were closed on Monday due to rehearsal of Republic Day and my cab took an extra 30 minutes to drop me at my place."

Adding to the woes, a

container truck got stuck under a metro track passing over a road in Noida on Monday morning, briefly leading to traffic congestion on the stretch leading to Delhi, officials said. Traffic congestion was witnessed on the road stretch from 8.30 am to around 9 am after which the flow of vehicles was at normal speed, the official added. Kautilya Marg, Sardar Patel Marg, Chanakyaपुर, and Hauz Khas also witnessed massive traffic. The Republic Day rehearsals started at 10.30 am from Vijay Chowk and the parade passed via the Kartavya Path, C-Hexagon, the roundabout statue of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Tilak Marg, Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg, and Netaji Subhas Marg before concluding at the Red Fort.

Rahul Gandhi defends Bharat Jodo Yatra

Says Cong not allowed to raise public issues in Parl

Jammu, Jan 23 (PTI):

Defending Congress' decision to start Bharat Jodo Yatra to 'unite' the country, Rahul Gandhi on Monday said the opposition party was forced to undertake the 3500-km foot march after it was not allowed to speak on the pressing public issues in Parliament.

He slammed the BJP government at the Centre for demonetisation, "hasty implementation" of Goods and Services Tax (GST) and the recently launched Agniveer scheme.

Gandhi alleged that the government is "facilitating" flight of money into the coffers of a few corpo-

rators and ruining the small businesses across the country. "The democracy in the country is under attack which is a major challenge for the nation. Before the com-

mencement of the Yatra, we tried to raise the issues like demonetisation, GST, farmers' bill and China's aggression in Parliament, both in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, but we were

not allowed and the mikes were being switched off," the former Congress president told a gathering at Satwari chowk here.

Gandhi reached Jammu on the 129th day of the Yatra after resuming from Vijaypur in Samba district in the morning, covering over 20 kilometres in six-and-a-half hours. After a night stay in Sidhra, the Yatra is scheduled to leave for Kashmir and it will enter there after Republic Day.

"We have come to open the shops of love in the markets of hatred. With this Yatra, we could see lakhs and crores of people have opened their shops of love, braving rains, cold and hot weather."

'RSS and Netaji have same goal of making India great'

Kolkata, Jan 23 (PTI):

RSS Chief Mohan Bhagwat on Monday said the goals of his right-wing organisation and that of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose are similar - making India a great nation. His comment comes amid the criticism that the ideologies of the RSS and the freedom fighter were not the same.

Lauding Netaji's contribution to India's freedom struggle, Bhagwat urged everyone to imbibe the qualities and teachings of Bose and work towards making the country a "vishwa guru" (world leader). "We remember Netaji not only because we

are grateful to him for his valuable contributions towards the freedom struggle but also to ensure that we imbibe his qualities. His dream of India, which he wanted to build, is still not fulfilled. We have to work to achieve it," he said.

Situations and paths might differ, but the destination remains the same, Bhagwat said while addressing a mega RSS event - 'Netaji Loho Pronam' - at Shahid Minar Ground here. Critics pointed out that Netaji believed in secularism which

is "against the 'Hindutva' ideology of the RSS". "Subhas babu (Netaji) was first associated with the Congress and followed its path of 'satyagraha', and 'andolon', but when he realised that this was not enough and there was a need for freedom struggle, he worked towards it.

Paths differ, but the goals are the same," he said. The RSS chief also said, "We have Subhasbabu's ideals in front of us to follow. The goals he had are our goals too... Netaji had said India is a smaller version of the world and the country has to provide relief to the world. We all have to work towards it,"

Delhi government's shopping fest delayed

New Delhi, Jan 23 (PTI):

The Delhi government's ambitious Delhi Shopping Festival has been postponed and is unlikely to happen in the next couple of months, officials said on Monday. The project was announced as a part of the Rozgar Budget in 2022 by Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal. The festival was due to begin on January 28 and continue till February 26. However, the December elections have put it on hold. "The Delhi Shopping Festival has been indefinitely delayed. Meetings were held between the Delhi Dialogue and Development Commission (DTTDC) and the Tourism Department, but due to the MCD and Gujarat polls in December, the consultations were put on hold," said a senior official. Due to be held at various markets, the festival also requires support from the Municipal Corporation of Delhi, the official said.

Berhampur ITI makes Netaji's 6 ft statue with scrap

Unveils it on his birthday

Berhampur (Odisha), Jan 23 (PTI):

Students of the government-run ITI here have built a six-feet-high statue of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose using automobile scraps after making one of Mahatma Gandhi. The 1.5 tonne statue was installed at the campus of the institute on Monday, the 126th birth anniversary of the nationalist leader, as a tribute to him.

Electric fan bearings, motorcycle chains, nuts and bolts, gears, iron rods and other scrap materials were used to make the statue. The ITI principal Rajat Kumar Panigrahi said. "The students collected the scraps used for making the statue from

electric workshops and automobile garages free of cost... Prime Minister Narendra Modi has called for creating wealth out of waste. Our institute has utilised waste and discarded materials to make different statues which dot the campus," he said.

There were two purposes in choosing scrap - promoting cleanliness and developing the innovative talents of students, the principal said. Around 30 students of the fitter, welder, painter and some other wings of the institute along with some faculty members took about 15 days to build the statue under his guidance, he said.

The statue will be kept in a glass box, Panigrahi

said. On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti last year the institute's students had built a six-foot high statue of Mahatma Gandhi using automobile scrap. It won the first prize in the 'Trash to Treasure' section at the National Competition on Welded Marvels - 2022.

A replica of a fish also made of scraps by them bagged the second prize in the same competition, the principal said. The prizes were given away at a function in Chennai organised by the Indian Institute of Welding (IIW) last week in association with the Association of Welding Products Manufacturers. The two works will be displayed at the IIW, he added.

'Centre should ban upcoming movie on Godse'

Hyderabad, Jan 23 (PTI):

AIMIM president Asaduddin Owaisi has demanded the BJP-led Centre to ban an upcoming Hindi film on Mahatma Gandhi's assassin Nathuram Godse like it blocked the BBC documentary on Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Addressing a public meeting here on Sunday, the AIMIM leader said the Government of India has to take a clear-cut stand that a ban will be imposed on the movie 'Gandhi Godse - Ek Yudh' and it will not be released in any theatre.

"The Modi government blocked the BBC documentary on YouTube and Twitter in India on the basis of a colonial-era law. We want to ask the Prime Minister...were you not the chief minister of

Gujarat when the (2002) riots took place?...Bilkis Bano was raped...a former Congress MP was killed," the Hyderabad MP said.

The BJP (government) banned the documentary, he said and sought to know from the Prime Minister and BJP leaders their opinion on Nathuram Godse.

"Godse killed Gandhi.

Then who is the biggest terrorist of independent India? Now, a film is being made on Godse. Will the Prime Minister of India ban the movie on Godse or will tell the people go and watch it," Owaisi asked.

The AIMIM chief further said: "I have myself seen it...the movie talks about why Godse killed Gandhi. I want to ask Prime Minister and the BJP when the BBC shows something about you, it's problematic and it gets banned".

Challenging the BJP to ban the movie on Godse, he asked whether the BJP and RSS would ban the movie. "If anything is shown against Modi, then it is banned. And the one who shot dead Gandhi, there is no ban (on it). Why so much love for Godse?"

Digvijaya Singh questions surgical strikes

BJP accuses Cong of insulting armed forces in 'hate' for Modi

Jammu/New Delhi, Jan 23 (PTI):

Congress leader Digvijaya Singh on Monday questioned the surgical strikes and accused the government of peddling lies, drawing furious reaction from the BJP which said the opposition party was blinded by its "hate" for Prime Minister Narendra Modi and has "insulted" the armed forces. Addressing a public meeting during the Bharat Jodo Yatra in Jammu and Kashmir, Singh alleged that the government did not agree to the CRPF request of flying its personnel from Srinagar to Delhi and 40 soldiers sacrificed their lives in Pulwama in 2019 to a terror attack.

"They talk of surgical strikes. They claim to have killed so many people but

no proof is given. They are ruling by peddling a bundle of lies," the former Madhya Pradesh chief minister, who has often courted controversy with his comments, said. In a tweet in Hindi later, he said, "From where did the terrorists get 300 kg of RDX in Pulwama incident? DSP Davinder Singh was caught

with terrorists but then why was he released? We also want to know about the friendship between the prime ministers of Pakistan and India." In his video message attached to the tweet, Singh said 40 CRPF personnel sacrificed their lives in Pulwama, but this government has not

been able to reveal from where three quintals of RDX came. "Besides, the government has not been able to answer where is DSP Davinder Singh, who was caught involved with terrorists. Why was he let free and why was a case of treason not registered against him?"

"We would also like to know from the prime minister as to what kind of relations he has with Pakistani prime minister that both are praising each other. At least, he should answer these questions," the Congress leader said in a video message. The BJP launched a sharp attack on the Congress, saying that such comments show that the Rahul Gandhi-led foot march

across the country is Bharat Jodo Yatra only in name while he and his party colleagues are working to "break" the country. It is essentially "Bharat todo yatra", BJP spokesperson Gaurav Bhatia said.
