### Niti Aayog CEO

**New Delhi:** Former IAS officer B V R Subrahmanyam was on Monday appointed as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Niti Aayog replacing Parameswaran Iyer, who has been named as the Executive Director of World Bank. The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved Subrahmanyam appointment for a period of two years from the date of assumption of the charge of the post, a Personnel Ministry order said. Iyer, who was working as Niti Aayog CEO, has been appointed as Executive Director, World Bank headquarters, Washington DC, USA for a tenure of three years, it said.

### Chancellor Scholz

**New Delhi:** German Chancellor Olaf Scholz will pay a State visit to India on February 25 and 26, his first trip to the country more than a year after he took charge of the top post. Announcing the German chancellor's visit, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Monday that Scholz will be accompanied by senior officials and a high-powered business delegation. He is scheduled to arrive in Delhi on February 25 and will proceed to Bengaluru on February 26, the MEA said.

### G20 events

**New Delhi:** Two key ecological sites in the Yamuna riverfront area in Delhi are likely to host a G20 event each in March to promote conservation of nature and biodiversity and emphasise on sustainability - a focus area for India during its yearlong presidency of the influential bloc, officials said on Monday. While Asita East will host a birdwatching event, a cultural programme will be organised at Baansera - city's first bamboo theme park, they said.

### Trains cancelled

**Kolkata:** The South Eastern Railway has cancelled a number of express and passenger trains connecting West Bengal, Odisha and north-eastern states with Hyderabad, Bengaluru and other destinations in the southern states for development work. The trains have been cancelled in the last week of February and the first week of March for non-interlocking work at Ranital station of Kharagpur division in connection with the construction of the Narayanganj-Bhadrak third line.

## ED raids Congress party leaders in coal levy money laundering case

Raipur, Feb 20 (PTI):

The Enforcement Directorate on Monday conducted searches at multiple locations in Chhattisgarh, including at premises linked to Congress party leaders, as part of an ongoing investigation into the coal levy money laundering case, officials said. According to officials, the searches are underway since early this morning at over a dozen locations that include those of MLA Devendra Yadav in Bhilai (Durg district), Chhattisgarh Pradesh Congress Committee treasurer Ramgopal Agrawal, chairman of Chhattisgarh State Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board Sushil Sunny Agrawal and

party's state spokesperson RP Singh in Raipur. The raids also covered some other ruling party leaders. They said the ED is investigating those who have been the "beneficiaries" of the proceeds of crime of the alleged coal levy scam perpetrated during the tenure of the cur-

rent government. The ED investigation relates to "a massive scam in which an illegal levy of Rs 25 was being extorted for every tonne of coal transported in Chhattisgarh by a cartel involving senior bureaucrats, businessmen, politicians and middlemen", the agency has alleged. Nine

persons, including state administrative service officer Chaurasia, Suryakant Tiwari, his uncle Laxmikant Tiwari, Chhattisgarh cadre IAS officer Sameer Vishnoi and another coal businessman Sunil Agrawal have been arrested by it till now in the case.

## All central varsities must adopt CUET for UG admissions: UGC

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):

The University Grants Commission has written to Aligarh Muslim University and Jamia Millia Islamia, reiterating that all central universities have to mandatorily adopt the Common University Entrance Test for admission to undergraduate programmes. "UGC (University Grants Commission) has asked all the central universities to use CUET (Common University Entrance Test) scores for admissions to all the courses. However, this has been observed that Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) has opted to participate in CUET-2023 for a limited number of programmes/courses, as was done last year. "Please note that all the central universities, including AMU, are required to participate for all UG programmes in CUET 2023 to provide equal opportunities to aspiring candidates, which is in the student's best interests," the UGC said in the letter. The letter also stated that CUET provides a com-

mon platform and equal opportunities to candidates across the country, especially those from the northeast, rural and other remote areas, and helps to establish better connections with the universities. "A single examination enables the candidates to cover a broad outreach and be part of the admission process to various central and participating universities," the letter added. Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI) has no plans to implement CUET for admissions across all its undergraduate and postgraduate courses and will stick to its own entrance test to "ensure timely admissions" for the upcoming academic session, the vice-chancellor said earlier this week. The UGC introduced CUET last year for admission to undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. JMI, however, did not adopt the CUET for all its undergraduate and postgraduate courses. While JMI opted for CUET for admission to 10 undergraduate programmes last year, the number is likely to rise this year.

## 2 policemen killed in Naxal attack

Raipur, Feb 20 (PTI):

Two policemen were killed after Naxalites fired at them in Chhattisgarh's Rajnandgaon district bordering Maharashtra on Monday, police said. Following the incident, the Maharashtra Police along with their counterparts in Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh launched a joint operation to check the movement of Naxalites in the border areas of the three states, they said. The incident took place between 7 am and 8 am under Bortalav police station limits in Rajnandgaon district adjoining Maharashtra, when the two personnel were going on a motorcycle. Rajnandgaon Superintendent of Police Abhishek Meena told PTI. As per preliminary information, district force head constable Rajesh Singh Rajput and Chhattisgarh Armed Force constable Lalit Kumar Samrath were going towards the Maharashtra border from Bortalav police camp, he said, adding the two were not carrying weapons. A group of armed Naxalites fired at them. One of the personnel died on the spot and the other

### Cop hacked to death

**Dantewada:** A policeman was hacked to death by suspected Naxalites at a village in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, police said on Monday. The incident took place late Sunday night when the victim, head constable Maniram Vetti, had gone to attend a wedding in Belchar village under Bhairamgarh police station limits adjoining Dantewada district, a senior official said. Vetti, who was posted at the police lines in Dantewada, was on leave for the last four days and went to attend the marriage function in the village located in the Naxal-stronghold without informing anyone, he said. As per preliminary information, when the victim was busy at the function with family members, the assailants stormed there and slit his throat with a sharp-edged weapon leaving him dead on the spot, the official said. Soon after being alerted, a police team rushed to the spot, he said. "Prima facie, the modus operandi of the attack suggests it was executed by a small action team of Naxalites. A police team has launched a search in the area to trace the assailants," the official added.

### ED's action part of probe in scam but Congress in pain as it's linked to corruption: BJP

New Delhi: The BJP on Monday slammed the Congress for its criticism of the ED's raids on multiple locations in Chhattisgarh as part of its probe in a corruption case, claiming that this hints at the opposition party's link with the graft as it has always stood with the corrupt. BJP spokesperson Gaurav Bhatia also alleged that the Congress government in Chhattisgarh is treating the state like a party ATM while ignoring people's welfare. "The probe agency is doing it works and digging up fresh revelations. And it is the Congress, the ring leader of the corrupt cabal, which is in pain.

## IIT Guwahati researchers produce cardiac proteins to fix damaged heart

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):

A research team from Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Guwahati has developed a "Recombinant Protein Toolbox" comprising six special proteins, which can be used to convert healthy skin cells or any somatic cells from an adult human body into heart cells. According to officials, the heart cells created using this toolbox can have the same function as the original heart cells and can be used to regenerate damaged heart tissues. Importantly, this toolbox can facilitate the generation of autologous heart cells in a lab. "It is now well understood that a heart attack happens when a part of the heart is damaged. In some animals, like the Zebrafish, the heart can grow back after being damaged, but in humans, the heart usually gets scar tissues instead of growing back new heart cells. The only way to treat heart disease is with a new heart, but there aren't enough hearts available for transplanta-

tion, and it can be hard to make sure the new heart is accepted by the body," said Rajkumar P Thummer, Assistant Professor, Department of Biosciences and Bioengineering, IIT Guwahati. "Scientists around the world are studying ways to convert regular body cells into heart cells, which could help with regenerating damaged hearts. The challenge is that cells can change in ways that could be harmful. So, scientists need to find a better, safer way to do this," he added. Thummer said proteins produced from another source when applied can convert cells from one form to another in a process known as cellular reprogramming. This process involves the use of specific proteins, known as transcription factors, which can alter the expression of genes within a cell and direct it to take on a new cellular identity. He claimed that the IIT Guwahati team has successfully produced cell-permeant recombinant proteins that can convert skin cells to heart cells.

## NIA files chargesheet in 2022 Modakpal Maoist attack case

**New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):** The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Monday filed a chargesheet against a CPI (Maoist) member in connection with an attack on security forces in Chhattisgarh last year. Kawasi Ganga alias "Pandu" alias "Kawasi Anil", a member of the CPI (Maoist) from Bijapur, was arrested in an injured condition on August 8 last year, a day after the incident in a forest area along the state's Bogla-Pangur villages. The chargesheet against Ganga was filed in

the NIA Special Court, Jagdalpur, Chhattisgarh, under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, the Indian Arms Act, Explosive Substances Act and the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, a spokesperson of the federal agency said. The official said the case was initially registered at the Modakpal police station in Bijapur and re-registered by the NIA on October 19 last year. "Investigation revealed that exchange of fire between security personnel

and armed cadres of proscribed terrorist organisation CPI(Maoist) took place on August 7 last year. On the next day, Ganga who was involved in the incident was apprehended and arms, ammunitions, hand grenade and detonators were recovered from his possession," the spokesperson said. "He is a member of the CPI(Maoist) and was actively involved in the said exchange of fire," the official said and added that further investigation in the case is in progress.

## RS asks panel to investigate 'disorderly conduct' of 12 MPs

**New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):** Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar has asked a parliamentary committee to investigate the alleged breach of privilege by 12 opposition MPs from the Congress and the AAP for repeatedly entering the well of the House, shouting slogans and obstructing its proceedings. According to a Rajya Sabha bulletin, nine of the MPs are from the Congress and three from the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP). The Congress MPs are Shaktisinh Gohil, Naranbhai J Rathwa, Syed Nasir Hussain, Kumar Ketkar, Imran Prattapgarhi, Hanumanthaiah, Phulo Devi

Netam, Jebi Mather Hisham and Ranjeet Ranjan. The AAP members are Sanjay Singh, Sushil Kumar Gupta and Sandeep Kumar Pathak. In the bulletin dated February 18, the Rajya Sabha Secretariat said, "...the Chairman...has referred a question of alleged breach of privilege arising out of gross disorderly conduct displayed by (the MPs)...in violation of rules and etiquette of Rajya Sabha by repeatedly entering the well of the council, shouting slogans and persistently and wilfully obstructing the proceedings of the council, compelling the Chair to repeatedly adjourn the sittings of the Council."

## SC seeks Centre's reply on PIL alleging 'unnecessary' hysterectomies in Bihar, Rajasthan, Chh'garh

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):

The Supreme Court sought the Centre's response on Monday on a PIL alleging that doctors in Bihar, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh have been performing "unnecessary hysterectomies", a surgical procedure to remove the uterus, on poor women just to reap high insurance fees from governments under the Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojana

(RSBY). A bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud also sought the assistance of Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati to deal with the public interest litigation (PIL) matter filed by Narendra Gupta, himself a medical practitioner. The bench, also comprising Justices PS Narasimha and JB Pardiwala, granted four weeks' time to the Centre

for filing its response to the PIL. A hysterectomy is a surgical procedure to remove the uterus after which a woman can neither conceive nor can have menstrual periods regardless of her age. The PIL, based on media reports and researched facts, alleged a "widespread pattern of doctors performing medically unnecessary hysterectomies to reap high insurance fees from the government"

in states such as Bihar, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh. It sought compensation for the victim women and meaningful policy changes to deal with the problem. The women, aided by heavily subsidised state-funded health insurance schemes, usually go to private hospitals for medical care for symptoms such as "abdominal pain and general weakness" and doctors resort to "unnecessary hys-

terectomy operations after cursory or in some cases, no medical examinations", the petition alleged. "The present petition has been filed in the nature of public interest litigation...and arises from an influx of news stories and Right to Information (RTI) results in the states of Bihar, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan regarding unlawful hysterectomies and related insurance scams," it said.

### ● Opposition points out anomalies

**Bhilai, Feb 20:** On Monday, a special General Body Meeting of Bhilai Municipal Corporation was held in BMC Headquarters in Supela.

The only agenda of the meeting was the work-based tender for door-to-door garbage collection work and other works in residential and commercial areas like cleaning of drains, roads, markets and garbage collection through three-wheeler rickshaw / e-rickshaw under the scope of work in the wards under Bhilai Municipal Corporation.

In the special GBM, the proposal of city sanitation



was passed by majority vote in the presence of Mayor Neeraj Pal, Speaker Girwar Bunty Sahu, MIC members and councillors. Corporation Commissioner Rohit Vyas and Additional Commissioner Ashok Dwivedi and other officers were also present in the special GBM.

During the discussion, BJP Corporator Piyush Mishra raised questions on the agency, which is presently working for BMC. He said that the contractor PV Raman has been blacklisted by the Municipal Corporations of Dhamtari and Jagdalpur.

He said that during the

last GBM, he had submitted the documents related to the blacklisting of this firm but still the tender was awarded to this agency.

On the other hand, the newly formed Risali Municipal Corporation has taken action against this agency on the basis of the same relevant docu-

ments. The agency is not making regular payments to the sanitation labourers due to which the labourers had gone on strike a few days ago.

He further said that a proposal has been made to rent the BMC's vehicles to the agency. Mishra said that the Municipal Corporation Bhilai has fixed the rent which is much lower than the market prices.

It is proposed to give the JCB a monthly rent of Rs 25000 while the BMC itself has hired a JCB for PWD works at monthly rent of Rs 1.5 lakhs. BJP Corporators alleged that the entire proposal was unfair and illegal. As the Congress is in majority in the house, the proposal was approved with a majority vote.

## Bhilai exports large volumes of special quality plates to UAE

## Dev Sanskriti Vidyalaya Khapri celebrates Annual Day

**Bhilai, Feb 20:** SAIL-Bhilai Steel Plant's Plate Mill has been producing & supplying special quality plates in various grades ranging from Ship-building grade including plates for Indian Navy's warships, Boiler & High-Tensile grades for different applications including structural constructions such as bridges & flyovers, manufacture of earth moving equipment etc, both for indigenous customers as well as for export to traders & customers abroad.

South West Asia is a prolific market for plates and TMT bars due to presence of traders as well as various large-scale construction activities in the region. Since there are no facilities for production of plates in the region, there is demand to import mate-

rial from nearby Asian countries.

Steel producing countries China, South Korea, Ukraine, Russia are tough competitors for India when it comes to meeting the demand for plates in South West Asia. Competing against China and South Korea that are prominent suppliers in present global scenario, SAIL-Bhilai Steel Plant has forayed into the export market once again in the current fiscal year by bagging orders from UAE for supplying large volumes of plates, with the help of TATA International as trader. The requirement is for high strength (High tensile) plates conforming to both European and



American quality standards.

While around 18,000 tonnes of special quality high-tensile plates have already been exported by SAIL-BSP to various international customers in current fiscal year 2022-23 with dual-certification as per European & American

specifications, fresh export orders from UAE are being executed. Besides ensuring desired surface quality and proper marking on the plates for identification, one important factor that has been taken into account while executing export orders is conforming to delivery sched-

ules strictly, as this is linked to availability of vessel and its time at the port.

Exports of plates by SAIL-BSP to Middle-east countries including Dubai in UAE in current fiscal year include around 14,000 Tonnes supplied in August 2022 with different grades dual-certified to European & American specifications. The steel for these export grades has been made for the first time in SAIL-BSP with the addition of Boron in restricted quantity & Titanium, in compliance with National Export Tax norms.

Export order for additional volume of around 10,000 Tonnes of plates is currently being executed in Feb 2023. Plates of Mild

& High-tensile grades complying to the European & American specifications are being supplied to M/s Tata International, Dubai. Supply of additional export order of 10000 Tonnes that is in the process of production shall be completed within March 2023 with plates complying to European & American specifications.

It is worth mentioning that dual certification in the Grades BS 10025 JR-AR and A 572 Gr50 Type 3 has been done for the first time in Bhilai's Plate Mill. Step by step monitoring under guidance of Director I/c Anirban Dasgupta, ED (Works) Anjani Kumar and perseverance of Plate Mill team led by CGM (Plate Mill) RK Bisare along with support from Plant's Quality Dept has resulted in successful and timely execution of the export orders.

The proposal for the formation of Chhattisgarh State Innovation Commission (CSIC) was approved. ### Sanctions reimburse of Re. 1 cost of addl. Cowdung used in production

As the per kilogram conversion percentage

from cowdung to vermi compost is 40 to 33 per cent, it was decided to reimburse one rupee cost of additional cowdung used in production of vermi compost under Godhan Nyaya Yojana from cess amount. Similarly, the cost of additional cow dung in the Gauthans of the urban bodies will be reimbursed by the government from the amount provided to the urban bodies for procurement of cow dung and the remaining available amount will be used as revolving money for the procurement of cow dung and vermi compost. Cabinet has also decided to build a godown in Gauthan premises, with the approval of the District Collector, in convergence with other government schemes for safe storage.

### PHFW exempted from CSPR

Cabinet has decided to exempt the Public Health and Family Welfare (PHFW) and Medical Education Department from the Chhattisgarh Store Purchase Rules (CSPR), in context of purchase/procurement from a single source. Cabinet has decided to create the post of Commissioner Medical Education under the Department of Medical Education.

### Proposal for amendments in CMVTA approved

The proposal for necessary amendment in the Chhattisgarh Motor Vehicle Taxation Act (CMVTA)-1991 (No. 25 of 1991) was approved for collection of one-time (lifetime/optional) tax from goods vehicles. The

amendment proposal for Chhattisgarh Motor Vehicle Taxation-1991 Rule 158 Chhattisgarh Gazette (Extraordinary) notification dated December 31, 2013 clause (5) was approved. In Part-I of the second schedule of the Chhattisgarh Motor Vehicle Taxation Act, 1991, the proposal to assess the motor vehicle tax of motor caravan was approved.

### Decides to create temporary non-cadre posts

Cabinet has decided to create a temporary non-cadre post of Principal Secretary/Secretary for the Ministry. Cabinet has decided to temporarily create a new non-cadre post of Inspector General of Police/Additional

Director General of Police, Chhattisgarh Police Headquarters under the Indian Police Service Cadre of Chhattisgarh State for a period of two years.

### ITI upgradation scheme in partnership with TTL approved

Industrial Training Institute upgradation scheme in partnership with Tata Technologies Limited (TTL) was approved by the Cabinet. Under this scheme, a total of Rs 1216.80 crore will be spent on the development of 36 ITIs of Chhattisgarh. With this, other short term courses including Mechanic, Electric Vehicle, Basic Designer and Virtual Verifier (Mechanical), Manufacturing Process Control and Automation, Advanced CNC Machining, Industrial Robotics and Digital Manufacturing and Artisan Using Advanced Tools will also be started in the ITI institutions of the state.

The twenty-first annual report of the Chhattisgarh Public Service Commission (for the period from April 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022) was approved to be presented in the Legislative

### Govt to implement special incentive policy

#### For closed and sick industries in Ch'garh

Under the Industrial Policy 2019-24, it was decided to implement a special incentive policy for the closed and sick industries in Chhattisgarh. This will be applicable to closed and sick industries after November 1, 2019.

This policy will be applicable only to manufacturing industries. Chhattisgarh will be developed as a 'logistics and warehousing hub'. Cabinet has decided to implement the State Logistics Policy 2022.

The draft of Bill 2023 was approved for settlement of Chhattisgarh outstanding tax interest and penalty.

Assembly and the General Administration Department was authorized for further action.

The draft of amendment in Chhattisgarh Minor Mineral Ordinary Sand (Excavation and Business) Rules-2019 was approved. Cabinet has decided to procure grams under the subsidy scheme of Rs 8000 per ton from the buffer stock of Government of India, for distribution to the 'antyo-day' and priority beneficiary families of Mada and scheduled areas under the public distribution system.

Cabinet has decided to implement One Time Settlement Scheme to waive the interest and surcharge imposed on

the remaining premium payment from the allottees, on the land/buildup space allotted under miscellaneous land use in Nava Raipur Atal Nagar.

It has been decided to include widows, widowers, abandoned and unmarried men and women under the state-sponsored Chief Minister cum Prime Minister Housing Scheme and the date of registration for housing has been extended till March 31, 2024. The draft of the Chhattisgarh Municipal Corporation Act 1956 (Amendment) Bill was approved.

## DPI to operate RTE again

**Raipur, Feb 20:** Under Right to Education Act (RTE) the operation of admission, control and payment of fee reimbursement amount of BPL children has now been handed over to the Directorate of Public Instructions (DPI), School Education Department has withdrawn the responsibility of RTE from overall education by issuing an order from Mantralaya in this regard.

About two and a half months ago, the School Education Department had handed over the responsibility of conducting all the works of RTE to the State Project Office, Samagra Shiksha, but in view of the technical difficulties, now the operation of RTE has again been given to the Directorate of

Public Instructions.

In the letter issued by the government, it has been said that it will not be possible to take the sanctioned budget amount for fee reimbursement in the Single Nodal Account (SNA) of Samagra Shiksha. Other administrative control, including recognition and cancellation of private schools, rests with the District Education Officer. The District Education Officer works under the direct control of the Director of Public Instructions. The Managing Director of Samagra Shiksha has no direct control over the private schools.

Under the RTE, the state government is paying the fees of children from class nursery to class 8th to unaided private schools, but

the Government of India approves the amount for fee reimbursement of children from class 1st to 8th only. The School Education Department has clarified that the Government of India does not sanction funds for nursery. Under the Right of Children to Free Education Act, the fees of the children admitted and studying in the limit of 25 percent is paid by the Director of Public Instructions to unaided private schools after obtaining budget approval from the state government. The Government of India approves the amount for fee reimbursement of children from class 1st to 8th only, which is returned by this office to the Directorate of Public Instructions.

While teacher LB cadre is getting NPS since before 2018. Teachers do not seem to be taking interest even on the option being filled for old pension scheme. During this, many teachers addressed the protest and it was coordinated by Tuladas Manikpuri.

A memorandum was given by the Sangh in the name of Chief Minister, Education Minister, Chief Secretary, Principal Secretary School Education Department, Secretary Finance Department, Secretary General Administration Department, Director Public Education/Pension and Provident Fund calculation on five-point demands. Azam Khan, who was elected MLA from Rampur Sadar seat in the Uttar Pradesh Assembly elections held last year, was disqualified after being sentenced to three years imprisonment for giving hate speech during the campaign for the 2019 Lok Sabha elections.

His son Abdullah Azam, who won from Swar seat, was also disqualified after being sentenced to two years in prison recently for holding illegal sit-in demonstrations in 2008.

Talking about the upcoming 2024 general elections, Jaya Prada said the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) will once again get a huge majority and form the government under the leadership of Narendra Modi. Rampur seat will also be won by the saffron party, she added.


cise policy is designed to discourage liquor consumption.

## Bihar jail inmate swallows mobile phone

● **During checking**

Gopalganj (Bihar), Feb 20 (PTI):

An inmate of Bihar's Gopalganj district jail reportedly swallowed a mobile phone during checking out of fear being caught by prison officers, an official said on Monday.

Quaishar Ali, the prisoner, swallowed the phone on Saturday during inspection. The matter, however, came to light on Sunday after Ali developed extreme pain in his stomach.

"The prisoner informed the jail authorities and narrated the sequence of events. He was immediately

rushed to Gopalganj district hospital where the x-ray of the inmate revealed the presence of a foreign particle in his abdomen," Manoj Kumar, Gopalganj jail superintendent told PTI on Monday.

Salam Siddiqui, the doctor at the hospital's emergency ward said, "The prisoner was admitted in the hospital due to stomach pain. The x-ray of his stomach was taken and the presence of foreign particles was visible during the examination. There is a need to investigate it thoroughly".

A medical board was constituted by the hospital and the man was re-

ferred the prisoner to Patna Medical College and Hospital for further treatment.

Ali was arrested by Gopalganj police on January 17, 2020 under provisions of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (NDPS Act). He has been in jail for the last three years.

Use of mobile phone by inmates inside Bihar prisons has raised eyebrows over security officers' credentials. Around 35 cellphones, seven sim cards and 17 cellphone chargers were seized during raids conducted in jails across the state in March 2021.

## WB govt employees stick to 48-hour bandh call

● **For DA regularisation**

Kolkata, Feb 20 (PTI):

West Bengal government employees of different departments stuck to their decision to hold a 48-hour strike from Monday for DA parity with the central government, ignoring government warning of action against them.

They are also demanding corruption free appointment.

State government employees organisations, like the 'Sangrami Joutha Mancha' (United Struggle Platform), joined the cease work in different departments in the Writers' Buildings, New Secretariat, in courts, schools and other educational institutions in the city as well as in Siuri, Birbhum, Medinipur, Nadia, Malda, Murshidabad, Howrah, Hooghly and other districts. "We are sticking to our de-

cision on the ceasework for regularisation of dearness allowance and corruption free appointments. We are shocked with the state government's decision of a three per cent hike in the DA. We will continue with our agitation," said a protestor at the food and supplies department here.

The state government has issued an order stating that employees who stays away from work on these two days will have to face action. "The protestors will lose salary and this pen down will be treated as break in service. We will issue show cause and initiate disciplinary action if they fail to furnish satisfactory explanation for their absence from office," said an official at the state secretariat 'Nabanna'. The state government on February 15 announced pay hike of three per cent additional DA to its employees in the 2023-24 budget at the assembly.

## Drone delivers govt pension to disabled man

Nuapada, Feb 19 (PTI):

Hetaram Satnami, a physically challenged man who lives in a remote village in Odisha's Nuapada district, had to travel 2 km every month through a dense forest to collect his government pension. This month, however, he did not have to

face the ordeal as a drone came with the cash and dropped it at his house in Bhutkapada village in Bhaleswar panchayat area.

"The sarpanch sent the money with the help of a drone. It's a big relief for me as the panchayat office is over 2 km away from the village, which is surrounded by a dense forest," said a beaming Satnami, who is a beneficiary of the state's Madhu

Babu Pension Yojana.

Sarpanch Saroj Agarwal said she bought a drone online after getting to know about Satnami's ordeal.

"In our panchayat area, there is a village located in the forest, Bhutkapada. A physically-challenged man, Hetaram Satnami, lives in that village. He can't move, since birth," Agarwal said.

"I enrolled him for the pension under the state scheme. I have seen how things are sent through drones in other countries. That's why I placed the order for a drone and got the money delivered to his doorstep," she said.

Subadar Pradhan, the block development officer (BDO) of Nuapada, said it was made possible with Agarwal's own initiative as the government does not have the provision to buy such devices to deliver services.

## 'Disruption of House proceedings not in interest of democracy'

Lucknow, Feb 20 (PTI):

Disruption of House proceeding is neither in the interest of democracy nor for the state and the opposition should raise issues in a dignified way, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said on Monday.

Adityanath made the remarks ahead of the start of the Budget session of the Uttar Pradesh Assembly.

"There can be 'asahmati' (differences) between ruling and opposition parties. The ruling side cannot run away from answering issues of public interest. Disruption (of House) is neither in the interest of democracy nor the state," he told reporters in assembly premises.

He said the opposition should raise issues with "shalinta" (in a dignified way) and use "Prabhavi shabdavali" (effective

words) in the House.

"The budget for 25 crore people of the state will be presented on February 22. If needed, after discussion with other party leaders, the House will also meet on Saturday also," he said.

The government, he said, was ready for a discussion and will reply on all issues raised in the interest of the public.

"We should set an example by running the House in an excellent way. This is an opportunity for us to make it (House) a platform for good debate," he said.

## Delhi Varsity gears up to prevent 'hooliganism'

● **During Holi**

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):

Holding meetings with Delhi Police personnel operationalising a joint control room and asking colleges to constitute committees are among the preventive steps taken by the Delhi University to avoid any "untoward incident" during the Holi festival and "strengthen a feeling of security" among students, especially girls.

Holi will be celebrated on March 8.

Like every year, the university is cautious and is taking preventive measures to ensure safety and security on the campus.

"The University is to gear itself to curb any menace of hooliganism in the name of Holi and to

avoid any untoward incident during the festival on the university campus and in its colleges," Delhi University Proctor Rajni Abbi said in a circular to all colleges.

The Delhi University has asked its constituent colleges to form committees to avoid any "untoward incident" during the festival and "strengthen a feeling of security" among students, especially girls.

The notice has been issued by Abbi to combat "hooliganism" in the name of Holi.

The proctor said anyone found to be indulging in such acts of indiscipline and causing harassment would be subjected to strict disciplinary action.

"The university has taken necessary steps to make elaborate internal

and external security arrangements on the campus, its affiliated colleges and hostels, to combat acts of hooliganism and rowdyism in the name of Holi festival causing harm to members of the university community, particularly the girl students," the circular read.

It said that those who is found to be indulging in such acts of indiscipline and causing harassment would be subjected to strict disciplinary action under the provision of University Ordinances, and the Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place Act-2013.

The proctorial board has also called a meeting with the police officials of the NCT Delhi on March 1 to discuss various preventive measures to be taken to "combat hooliganism".

The university has issued a set of guidelines, asking all the students not to play the festival in a rowdy manner with wet colours, balloons or pistons in any of its educational institutions.

Also, it will be setting up control rooms on the north and south campus to receive complaints from students during the festival.

As reported, the control rooms jointly manned by Delhi Police and DTC authorities and the university officials at north and south campus would function to deal with any untoward incident.

Moreover, the varsity has directed principals, deans of faculties, head of departments and provost of halls and hostels to be available to take care of any incidence.

## Pak's current account deficit shrinks 90% to USD 0.24 billion

● In January

Islamabad, Feb 20 (PTI):

Cash-strapped Pakistan's current account deficit shrank 90.2 per cent to USD 0.24 billion in January from USD 2.47 billion in the same month last year, the data shared by the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) showed on Monday.

"Current Account Deficit (CAD) recorded USD 0.2 billion in Jan 2023 against a deficit of USD 2.5 billion in Jan 2022," the central bank said in a brief statement on Twitter.

The decrease in the deficit is also 16.55 per cent lower than December when the SBP announced that the deficit was USD 0.29 billion.

The deficit was recorded

as import restrictions continue to persist amid a balance of payments crisis that has brought the country on the verge of default, Dawn newspaper reported.

Pakistan has a chronic balance of payments problem which has exacerbated in the last year, with the country's forex reserves declining to critical levels. As of February 10, the central bank had only USD 3.2 billion in reserves, enough to cover barely three weeks of imports.

To stem dollar outflows, the government has imposed restrictions, allowing imports of only essential food items and medicines until a lifeline bailout is agreed with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), which is seen as essential for the country to stave off default.

Ismail Iqbal Securities' Head of Research Fahad Rauf said the shrinking current account deficit was "not an achievement but a result of low reserves," the paper reported.

The government's strategy to restrict imports in order to safeguard reserves has turned out to be a double-edged sword, however, as several industries rely on imported inputs to continue operations. As a result, multiple companies across sectors have either suspended operations or scaled down production levels, leading to layoffs.

The latest data shows that the country's current account deficit during the first seven months of the current fiscal year stood at USD 3.8 billion, which equates to a decline of

67.13 per cent compared to July-Jan FY-21-22.

During January, USD 3.92 billion worth of goods were imported, down 7.3 per cent from the last month. On the other hand, exports also declined, clocking in at USD 2.21 billion, down 4.29 per cent from the preceding month's USD 2.31 billion.

Meanwhile, workers' remittances stood at USD 1.89 billion, declining 9.89 per cent compared to USD 2.1 billion in December, according to the paper.

Pakistan heavily relies on remittances apart from exports and foreign loans for its foreign exchange reserves. Pakistan faces a crippling economic crisis, with decades-high inflation and critically low foreign exchange reserves depleted by continued debt repayment obligations.

## Pak authorities hand over 'Indian' monkey to street performer

Lahore, Feb 20 (PTI):

A monkey, which apparently crossed into Pakistan from India last week, was handed over to a local street performer after authorities at a local zoo in Pakistan's Punjab province refused to take the primate into the facility citing space crunch and lack of veterinarians, officials said on Monday.

Rescue teams captured the monkey from a 200-foot-high cellular tower after hours-long operation.

"Rescue 1122 of Emergency Punjab Services on Friday caught a monkey, which crossed into Pakistan from India bordering Bahawalnagar city (some 260 kms from Lahore)," Rescue 1122 official Muhammad Farooq told PTI on Monday.

Farooq said his department approached the

Bahawalnagar Wildlife Department to house the monkey in the zoo, but authorities refused citing space crunch. "The department said it has no extra cage in the zoo to put the monkey. Therefore it should be handed over to a madaari (local street performer) for its upkeep," he said. District Wildlife Officer, Bahawalnagar, Munawar Hassain Najmi, told the Dawn newspaper that apart from space crunch at the local zoo, the Bahawalnagar Wildlife Department does not even have a single vet to treat the monkeys. "The majority of the animals that crossed from India into Pakistan, especially langurs and monkeys, die from injuries, while the Bahawalnagar Wildlife Department does not even have a single vet to treat them," Najmi added.

## High-risk volcano search for Philippine plane with 4 onboard

Manila, Feb 20 (AP):

Philippine authorities said Monday they would verify whether the wreckage of a small plane spotted near the crater of a restive volcano was that of a Cessna aircraft that went missing with four people on board over the weekend. The Cessna 340, which was bound for Manila, took off from Albay province southeast of the capital Saturday morning with two Filipino pilots and two Australian passengers but has not been heard from since then, the Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines said.

The Australians were working for a geothermal power company, officials said. Mayor Carlos Baldo of Albay's Camalig town and other officials told reporters Sunday that, dur-

ing an aerial search, authorities spotted the suspected wreckage, including the tail, scattered about 1,150 feet (350 metres) near the crater on the southwestern slope of Mayon Volcano but there was no indication of people. Eric Apolonio, spokesperson of the government's civil aviation authority, said experts and investigators from the agency would have to examine the wreckage to determine if it was the missing Cessna plane with registry number RP-C2080 and to determine the fate of the four people on board. A ground search was hampered by rainy weather over the weekend and dozens of search and rescue personnel may scale the 8,077-foot (2,462-metre) Mayon if the weather clears Monday.

The search teams would

have to be closely monitored by volcano experts and local officials given the restiveness of Mayon, one of the country's 24 active volcanoes.

"It's a very risky operation," Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology director Teresito Bacolcol told The Associated Press. "It's a race against time and it's a matter of life and death but there's also the danger of rockfalls and volcanic lahar." Rescue contingents could enter a permanent danger zone 6 kilometres (3.7 miles) around the volcano because "it's an extraordinary situation," but the search and rescue should be carried out by well-trained experts, who should be backed up by standby emergency contingents and made aware of the high risks involved, Bacolcol said.

A popular tourist attraction because of its near-perfect cone, Mayon last erupted in 2018, displacing tens of thousands of villagers.

It's currently under the second of five volcano alert levels, meaning volcanic earthquakes, steam and gas emissions, ground deformation and intermittent ash and steam blasts have been sporadically detected. Alert five means a major and deadly volcanic eruption is underway.

Separately, a single-engine Cessna plane that went missing on January 24 with six people on board in the northern Philippine province of Isabela remained missing. Officials said a search for the plane was continuing on and off, depending on the weather, in a remote mountainous hinterland in Isabela.

## Tagore statue at Dhaka Varsity campus vanishes; then reappears

Dhaka, Feb 20 (PTI):

A newly-unveiled statue of Nobel laureate Rabindranath Tagore installed by students at the prestigious Dhaka University campus, which was vandalised last week, has been partially re-installed by authorities.

On February 14, students of Dhaka University's Faculty of Fine Arts installed a Tagore statue with duct tape plastered on his mouth, showing him holding a copy of Gitanjali, with a nail pierced through it, according to news agency UNB.

The symbolic statue was installed near the Raju Memorial Sculpture, a prominent landmark on the campus, to protest the censorship on the campus, the report said. On February 16, the statue mysteriously

disappeared, with its severed head being found nearly 2km from the university campus, UNB reported.

On Sunday, the statue was partially re-installed at the same spot — only with the head but the duct tape was removed, the report added. Shimul Kumbhakar, president of a faction of Dhaka University's Student Union, who was involved in the making of the statue, told UNB: "Dhaka University's proctor removed the sculpture in the dark of night and cut it into two parts. We collected the broken parts from Suhrawardy Udayan and re-installed it."

Responding to the Chhatra Union leader's comment, the University proctor told UNB: "We did not tear down the sculpture, we just relocated it from there.

## 15 killed as bus veers off road in Pak's Punjab province

● 60 injured

Lahore, Feb 20 (PTI):

A speeding bus carrying a wedding party veered off the road before falling in a ravine in Pakistan's Punjab province, killing at least 15 people and wounding 60 others, authorities said on Monday.

The bus, travelling from Islamabad to Lahore, overturned late on Sunday in the Kallar Kahar Salt Range region, some 240 km from Lahore.

"The bus, before overturning, hit three vehicles coming from the opposite direction and veered off the road," Rescue 1122 offi-

cial Muhammad Farooq told PTI on Monday.

The bus was carrying people returning from a wedding ceremony.

Rescue 1122 emergency service attributed brake failure as the apparent reason for the accident.

The dead and many injured had to be extracted by cutting the bus' body, Farooq said.

"The injured were shifted to hospitals in twin cities — Rawalpindi and Islamabad — where the condition of 11 of them is critical," he said, adding that among the dead, six were women. Pakistan's Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif expressed sorrow over the accident.

## Pakistan, Afghan Taliban trade fire at border crossing

Peshawar, Feb 20 (AP):

Pakistani border guards and Afghan Taliban forces traded cross-border fire on Monday morning, officials said, a day after Afghanistan's Taliban rulers closed the Torkham border crossing amid increasing tensions between the two neighbours.

There was no immediate word on casualties on either side.

On Sunday, the Afghan

Taliban shut Torkham, a key trade route, over Pakistan's alleged refusal to allow Afghan patients and their caretakers to enter Pakistan for medical care without travel documents, Pakistani security officials said.

They spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss border issues.

Khalid Khan, a local Pakistani police official, confirmed the border closure and what he de-

scribed as intermittent exchanges of fire at Torkham, located in Pakistan's northwestern Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province. Pakistan's military and the Foreign Ministry made no immediate comments. Mullah Mohammad Siddiq, a Taliban-appointed commissioner at Torkham, said Pakistan has not been abiding by its "commitments, so the crossing point was shut down."

## Farmer from Kerala goes missing in Israel

● During government-sponsored trip

Jerusalem, Feb 20 (PTI):

Authorities in Israel have registered a police case against a 48-year-old Kerala farmer, who reportedly went missing in Israel earlier this month while visiting the country on a state government-sponsored trip to study Israeli modern agricultural techniques. Biju Kurian, a native of Ulikkal panchayat in Kannur district, was part of a 28-member Kerala government's delegation of farmers, sent to Israel

to study state-of-the-art techniques such as hydroponics and precision farming.

On February 17, Kurian reportedly went missing.

Despite Israel's law enforcement agencies' best efforts to trace him, Kurian's whereabouts were not known. "We have registered a police case against him. He will be deported

once we nab him," an official said.

The delegation, led by Principal Secretary B. Ashok, left for Israel on February 11. The farmers' delegation left Israel on Sunday without Kurian, they added.

Kurian's family in Kannur are also clueless about his mysterious disappearance and were making desperate attempts to reach out to him.

## North Korea fires short-range missiles after making threats

Seoul, Feb 20 (AP):

North Korea fired two short-range ballistic missiles toward Japan on Monday in its second weapons test in three days that drew quick condemnation from its rivals and prompted Tokyo to request an emergency meeting of the United Nations Security Council.

The weapons firings follow an intercontinental ballistic missile launch Saturday and North Korea's threats to take an unprecedentedly strong response to U.S.-South Korean military drills that the North views as an invasion rehearsal. Some experts say North Korea could use a new testing spree to expand its arsenal

and intends eventually to use its boosted capability as leverage in negotiations with the United States.

South Korea's military said it detected the two missile launches from a western coastal town, just north of Pyongyang, the North Korean capital, on Monday morning. Japan said both missiles landed in the waters outside of the Japanese exclusive economic zone between the Korean Peninsula and Japan and that no damage involving aircraft and vessels in the area was reported. According to Japanese and South Korean assessments, the North Korean missiles flew at a maximum altitude of 50-100 kilometers (30-60 miles) and a distance of 340-400 kilometers (210-250 miles).

South Korea's military said North Korea's repeated missile launches are "a grave provocation" that undermine international

peace. Japan condemned the launches as violations to the U.N. Security Council resolutions and a threat to the peace and safety of Japan and the international society.

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida told reporters Monday that Japan is requesting an emergency security council meeting in response to North Korea's launches. "We must deepen Japan-U.S. and Japan-U.S.-South Korea cooperation," Kishida said.

An initial security council briefing led by Assistant Secretary-General for political affairs Khaled Khari was set for later Monday.

The U.S. Indo-Pacific Command said the missile launches highlight "the destabilising impact" of North Korea's unlawful weapons programs. It said the U.S.

commitments to the defense of South Korea and Japan "remain ironclad."

North Korea's state media said long-range artillery units on its western coast fired two rounds Monday morning cross-country toward the eastern waters, possibly referring to the same activity its neighbors said were missile launches.

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## 'Rating of Buildings'

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) today released its recommendations on "Rating of Buildings or Areas for Digital Connectivity". The exponential growth in digitalization during last decade has revolutionized the world impacting everything, from economy, innovation, science and education, to health, sustainability, governance, and lifestyles. Digital technologies are fundamentally changing business models, institutions and society. The demand for digital connectivity has increased many folds in recent years and COVID-19 has further given impetus to surge in the demand across all segments of users, irrespective of their locations. In the past, Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) and the Government have taken various policy initiatives to fulfil the demands of telecom connectivity. These policy interventions have helped in improving connectivity, resulting in wider coverage and higher data throughput. However, all these efforts have fallen short in achieving the desired level of digital connectivity experience of the users, who now prefer to work from anywhere, at any time. The rollout of 5G network has further stimulated the need of seamless experience of the 5G services, specifically inside the buildings. TRAI has conducted many studies to assess the quality of connectivity, identify challenges in providing connectivity and to suggest the way forward. Based on these studies TRAI published a Monograph on "Quest for a Good Quality Network inside Multi-Storey Residential Apartments: Reimagining ways to improve quality". Based on the above, TRAI undertook the process of consultation on Suo-moto basis to provide a framework for establishment of an eco-system wherein Digital Connectivity Infrastructure becomes part of all development activities. TRAI issued Consultation Paper (CP) on "Rating of Buildings or Areas for Digital Connectivity" on 25th March 2022, to seek inputs from stakeholders on issues raised, by 07th July 2022. Based on the comments received, discussions held with stakeholders during the Open House Discussion and analysis thereof, the recommendations of the TRAI on "Rating of Buildings or Areas for Digital Connectivity" have been finalized. The emphasis of these recommendations is on providing a framework for creation of an ecosystem for Digital Connectivity Infrastructure (DCI) to be an intrinsic part of building development plan similar to other building services such as water, electricity or Fire Safety System. DCI is to be co-designed and cocreated along with building development through collaborations among various stakeholders including Property Managers (owner or developer or builder etc.), service providers, infrastructure providers, DCI Professionals and Authorities at various urban/local bodies. This framework shall also open job opportunities for the young professionals to become DCI Professionals and be part of Design, Deployment and Evaluation of Digital Connectivity Infrastructure. TRAI has also proposed a new chapter on "Digital Connectivity Infrastructures in Buildings" to be included in Model Building Bye Laws 2016 by modifying and updating existing provisions added in MBBL, as Annexure through an Addendum to Model Building Bye Laws 2016 titled "Provisions for In-Building Solutions Digital Communication Infrastructure" issued by Town and Country Planning Organization (TCPO) of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), in March 2022.

## How the west is finally hitting back against China's dominance of cleantech

Climate change policy has entered a new era. The growing row between the United States and the European Union over the impacts of the new American green subsidy regime makes that all too clear. Yet in many ways, this story is ultimately about China. For the last 20 years, developed countries have used three main types of policy to cut their greenhouse gas emissions. Renewable energy mandates have required electricity generators to invest in solar, wind, hydro and geothermal power. Emissions trading schemes for energy and industrial businesses put a price on carbon. And energy efficiency standards have been progressively improved on a whole range of products from vehicles and white goods to homes. Applied across Europe and North America, this policy toolkit brought notable success. Developed countries' emissions fell sharply, even with economic growth. Green technologies from wind and solar to electric vehicles fell in cost and improved in performance as demand for them rose. A virtuous circle followed: climate policy increased demand for green technologies, which reduced costs, which allowed policy to be tightened, which stimulated demand and innovation further.

The rub There were two problems, however. First, much of the economic benefit went to China. From 2010 onwards China rapidly became the world's primary supplier of wind and solar technology, along with underpinning minerals like lithium, cobalt and rare earths. China's dominance reduced everyone's costs. But it also meant that, as industrial jobs were lost in developed countries, they were not replaced by equivalents in the new energy sectors. Second, climate policy began to create political opposition. As emissions targets tightened, countries started to see the costs reflected in consumer prices. The most dramatic response emerged in France in 2018, when a relatively small increase in fuel duty led the so-called gilets jaunes (yellow jacket) protestors to block roads across the country for over a year, even after President Emmanuel Macron withdrew the tax. In the US, congressional opposition stymied President Barack Obama's plans for a climate bill including a modest carbon pricing scheme for the whole of his presidency. Joe Biden has learned the lesson. His Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), passed in 2022, offers climate carrots instead of sticks and lots of them. The act which despite its name is almost entirely about climate change offers a mammoth US \$369 of tax credits and other subsidies to companies making low-carbon investments and to consumers buying green products. Critically, to take advantage of subsidies, a significant proportion of materials and equipment used must be produced in North America.

The EU position Orthodox economists deplore the IRA. Subsidies are much less efficient than taxes (not to say more expensive), and protectionism raises costs to consumers. Yet to any politician, Biden's approach looks like a no-brainer. Don't penalise businesses with carbon levies: reward them with tax credits. Don't allow the employment benefits of climate policy to leak overseas to China: ensure they stay at home. Nearly three-quarters of Americans backed the act, including over half of Republicans. The EU is alarmed at the likely effects. There are already reports of European cleantech companies planning to transfer production to the US, while others may be kept out of US markets. The European Commission has threatened the US with legal action at the World Trade Organization for breaking free trade rules, and has already secured US concessions, including extending tax credits to foreign-made electric vehicles. Even more significantly, the commission president Ursula von der Leyen has announced a "green deal industrial plan" for the EU. The core will be a Net Zero Industry Act relaxing rules on state aid and providing subsidies for cleantech investment. Meanwhile, a Critical Raw Materials Act will build partnerships with like-minded suppliers to reduce dependence on Chinese imports, mirroring what the recent EU and US chips acts do with semiconductors.

The broader context Both the EU and US are therefore turning climate policy into industrial and trade strategy. One might ask what took them so long. China's twelfth five-year plan in 2010 first identified seven environmental "strategic industries" on which to focus economic development. It is not a coincidence that China rapidly came to dominate the new low carbon sectors: it was literally the plan. The EU and US moves are a desperate attempt to catch up, with Japan and South Korea not far behind. And the strategy extends beyond their own continents. The new kids on this block are multi-billion dollar just energy transition partnerships which the EU, US and other western powers have recently negotiated with South Africa, Indonesia and Vietnam. These "JET-PS" aim to stimulate investment, not just in the renewables transition but also in domestic industrial capacity. Loans and guarantees provided by western governments aim to leverage much larger flows of private finance. The goal is for these countries to manufacture and export their own green technologies, charting a new path for economic development. More such partnerships will likely be announced over the coming year. This is not altruism on western countries' part, but an attempt to offer an alternative to China's huge investments in the developing world. What about the UK? These developments leave the British economy in a badly weakened position. The EU was the obvious partner in green industrial policy. On its own the UK is not nearly large enough to compete. It creates a compelling case for a future UK government to do a green trade deal with the EU. In return for a financial contribution to the EU's green innovation funds, the UK could re-join the single market for environment goods and services. Just a few years ago, climate change was a subset of environmental policy. Today it is a key dimension of both economic strategy and geopolitics. Given the extent of the economic transformation it demands, no-one should be surprised.



## Railway Protection Force: Securing the nation and its citizens

The Railway Protection Force (RPF) is a prime security and Law Enforcement Agency in the field of Railway Security in India. Having been constituted in 1957 for better protection and security of Railway property, the force has evolved itself from its main role of protection and safeguarding of Railway Property to additional roles of passenger security and passenger facilitation. With changing times, the role regarding passenger security and facilitation has been gaining in prominence. The Force today fulfils an active role in meeting the objectives of the Indian Railway. The force today identifies the changing security needs of the railway and its customers and adapts itself by equipping itself with skills and resources and implementing innovative solutions. The RPF is currently the central force in India with the largest share of women (9%) in its ranks and is committed to enhancing its reach and effectiveness for the security of the nation and its citizens. To meet the widening gamut of responsibility, RPF has launched various operations aimed at ensuring that passengers are protected from theft, human trafficking, suicide attempts, drug trafficking, and other crimes during their railway journey.

One of the most noteworthy operations is "Rail Suraksha." In this operation, the RPF took legal action against crimes involving railway property, registered 6492 cases of theft of railway property and made recoveries of stolen railway property worth Rs. 7.37 Crores, with the arrest of 11268 offenders.

The RPF has also been playing a crucial role in rescuing children in need of care and protection. In 2022, an intensive drive, "Nanhe Farishtey," was launched to rescue children in need of care and protection found in trains or railway stations. During the year, 17,756 children were rescued by RPF personnel.

Another important operation is "Operation AAHT" against human trafficking. RPF Anti-Human Trafficking Units were made operational at more than 740 locations over the Indian Railways to tackle the issue of human trafficking. During the year, 559 persons were rescued from traffickers with the arrest of 194 traffickers.

RPF personnel have been risking their own lives to save the lives of others in "Mission Jeevan Raksha." During the year, 852 precious lives were saved by RPF personnel.

RPF has also been empowered to tackle the issue of drug trafficking through the railways with the launch of "Operation NARCOS." During the year, RPF arrested 1081 criminals involved in drug trafficking and succeeded in recovering NDPS worth about Rs. 80 Crores.

The RPF has been retrieving lost luggage and restoring it to the rightful owners through "Operation Amanat." During the year, RPF retrieved approximately 25,500 luggage valued at more than Rs. 46.5 Crores.

The RPF has also been taking stringent action against the illegal trade of wildlife through railways with "Operation WILEP." During the

year, 129 cases of illegal trade were detected with the arrest of 75 persons.

The RPF has launched "Operation Yatri Suraksha" to provide real-time security-related assistance to passengers during their journey. The Emergency Response initiative, which provides immediate assistance to passengers in need of security-related help, received over 2 lakh calls during the year.

The RPF has launched the "Meri Saheli" initiative to provide safety and security to women travelling alone or with minors. Teams of lady RPF personnel have been formed across all zonal railways and equipped with an IT module to identify target groups of women who need security and reassurance.

The RPF goes above and beyond to assist pregnant women who go into labor during their train journeys with the "Matrishakti" operation. Lady personnel of RPF assisted in 209 such child births during the year.

Under the "SEWA" operation, the RPF helps elderly citizens, women, physically disabled, and sick or injured persons with their travel, providing amenities like wheelchairs, stretchers, medical help, and infant food. Over 37000 such persons were assisted by the RPF in 2022.

The RPF also takes action against the carriage of contraband and illegal goods with the "Satarak" operation. The RPF arrested 2331 persons involved in the transportation of contraband items and handed them over to the concerned authorities for further legal action.

The RPF has played an important role in ensuring free and fair elections during the assembly elections in several states, including Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat, Goa, Manipur, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand. Additionally, the RPF has rescued 3400 adults in need of care and protection under the "Dignity" operation.

The International Union of Railways (UIC) and RPF of India have now joined hands to host the 18th

World Security Congress in Jaipur from February 20th to 23rd, 2023. The UIC, established in Paris in 1922, is a professional association representing the railway sector worldwide, promoting interoperability, standardization, and cooperation in the industry. The UIC's security platform is responsible for organizing international events, analyzing and formulating policies, and promoting the exchange of information and best practices among security directors of UIC members.

The World Security Congress of the UIC is a prominent international event, attended by the heads of security of member railway organizations and representatives of UIC, Indian Railways, RPF, and senior police officers. The congress provides a platform for technical cooperation, collaboration, and the sharing of solutions and best practices in railway security. The RPF, a prime security and law enforcement agency in India, has been an active member of the UIC Security Platform and has successfully organized and hosted the UIC World Security Congress in 2006 and 2015 in New Delhi.

The Director General of RPF has taken measures to enhance the involvement of member organizations operating in Asia, Africa, and several other developing countries to address their concerns through the UIC Security platform.

The 18th World Security Congress in Jaipur, centred on the theme of "Railway Security Strategy: Responses and Vision for Future", is a testament to the UIC's commitment to promoting the security of rail transport worldwide. With India taking over the presidency of the G-20 group of nations and the Director General of RPF serving as the Chairman of the UIC Security Platform, this event is poised to be a prominent global gathering for railway security. With the RPF taking the lead, the 18th UIC World Security Congress in Jaipur promises to be a landmark event in the history of railway security.

### Amend RoPA 1951

The role of the Election Commission of India in conducting free and fair elections in India is immense. It has a constitutional status which means its powers are paramount and that it cannot be harnessed by the government. But there is a very big loophole left by the constitution makers which puts a damper on the powers of the ECI. The ECI is tasked to register political parties and give them recognition as national or state based on the criteria, they fulfill but ECI cannot deregister political parties. As ECI cannot deregister political parties the amount of Registered Unrecognised Political Parties (RUPPs) has grown to the tune of 2796 as of 2022. These 2796 RUPPs have the potential to be involved in money laundering and hawala activities as political parties do not need to disclose their income. Political parties also get a 100 percent tax exemption which clearly, they are misusing because according to ECI reports more than 2000 of these parties have not submitted their annual audited accounts. More than 1000 crore of donations these parties have garnered is also in question as they have not been able to mention the source. There is a need for an exclusive and comprehensive legal framework that empowers the ECI to deregister and de-recognize political parties. To attain this the Representation of the People Act 1951 needs serious amendments.

## Crucial role of Matribhasha in children's education

UNESCO has declared 21st February as International Mother Language Day to promote the dissemination of mother language and awareness of linguistic and cultural traditions around the world and to inspire solidarity based on understanding, tolerance and dialogue. It believes that education based on first language or mother language must begin from the early years as Early Child Care & Education is the foundation of learning.

Mother Language is usually the language which the child speaks at home with the family. Education in mother language refers to when a school integrates the child's language into classroom and school lessons. Mother Language plays vital

role in the overall development of personnel, social and cultural identity of the human beings. Language may be just a way to communicate with each other, but mother language is something that helps us to stay connected with our roots and unique culture. Young children learn and grasp more quickly when they are taught in the mother language, because when they develop their mother tongue, they simultaneously foster other basic skills like literacy and critical thinking. A strong mother language foundation equips the children with skills required to learn a second or additional language. Cognitive as well as intellectual development is relatively faster when a person is proficient in the mother language. The children learning in mother language feel comfortable in the school environment and learn faster. They have a better understanding of the curriculum and do not have to re-learn the skills learned when the child transfers to second language.

Parent-child interaction increases as the parent assist in home-works easily. Knowing mother language boosts one's confidence and increases self-esteem. There is a long way to go before guaranteeing all children their right to education in their mother language. In most of the countries, the majority of learners are taught in a language other than their mother tongue, which compromises their ability to learn and understand effectively. Approximately 40% population of the world does not have access to an education in a language they speak, understand or communicate.

In our country, the "Mother Language" is often neglected and actively suppressed on the name of globalization. The present education system has completely ignored the mother language as the medium of instruction in schools, especially in English medium schools. The teachers at the local level are also not so fluent in foreign languages. Neither they are able to transfer the required

knowledge nor are the learners in a position to grasp it, resulting in knowledge deficit. Children whose primary language is not the language of instruction in schools are more likely to drop out of school or fail in early grades. National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 has emphasised on its mandatory use in the education system at the foundational stage. Clause 4.11 of NEP 2020 states, "Wherever possible, the medium of instruction until at least Grade 5, but preferably till Grade 8 and beyond, will be the mother-tongue/ home language/local language/regional language. Thereafter, the home/local language shall continue to be taught as a language wherever possible. High quality textbooks, including in science, will be made available in home language/mother tongue. The teachers will be encouraged to use a bilingual approach, including bilingual teaching-learning materials, with those students studying whose home language may be

different from the medium of instruction".

In India, Matribhasha Diwas is celebrated every year in schools on this day to promote the use of mother tongue with the following objectives :- (1) To highlight the unity among the linguistic diversity in our country, (2) To encourage usage, not only of the respective mother tongue but other Indian languages as well, (3) To understand diverse cultures, in India and the various forms of literature, craft, performing arts, scripts and other forms of creative expression. Mother Tongue can be used as an effective tool for learning and developing holistic education and knowledge. The government should strictly implement the provision regarding use of Mother language in all government and private schools of the country to safeguard the learning skills of children.

**Gradual recovery**

About inflation, Gupta told PTI the "worst" is behind and he sees a gradual recovery for the FMCG (Fast Moving Consumer Goods) segment with rural market making a comeback. The rural FMCG market, which has witnessed a decline in the last 4-5 quarters, is expected to have a turnaround in the next 2-3 quarters, he said.

## Govt taking steps to control inflation, will continue to focus on it: Sitharaman

Jaipur, Feb 20:

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Monday said that the government is taking a lot of steps to control inflation and will continue to focus on it. For instance, in the case of pulses, the government is encouraging farmers to grow pulses to boost domestic production and has also reduced the import duty on some of the pulses to improve local availability. When asked whether Budget 2023-24 would bring down inflation, Sitharaman said: "The government is taking a lot of steps to control inflation and will continue to focus on it."

She was in the city for a post-budget 2023 discussion with various stakeholders. "We have taken a lot of steps, for example,



encouraging farmers to sow pulses so that the production of pulses in India increases in the coming season," Sitharaman told reporters here.

She further said that as a short-term step, "whether we are importing, whether Masoor, Moong or whatever pulses, the government has reduced the import duty to single digit or has completely removed it. It has made imports convenient and pulses are

available quickly and cheaply in India." The Union Minister said, "the import of edible oil has been made almost free (tax) for the last three consecutive years, due to which palm crude or palm refined oil has also been (route) opened so that the supply of edible oil is easy and sufficient." The wholesale price-based inflation declined to a 2-year low of 4.73 per cent in January on easing prices of manufactured items, fuel and power, even though food articles turned expensive. Retail inflation again breached the Reserve Bank's upper tolerance limit and touched a three-month high of 6.52 per cent in January, mainly due to higher prices in the food basket, including cereals and protein-rich items.

## EPFO unveils procedure to apply for higher pension under Employees Pension Scheme

New Delhi, Feb 20:

Retirement fund body EPFO on Monday came out with a procedure to enable subscribers and their employers to jointly apply for higher pension under Employees' Pension Scheme (EPS). Earlier in November 2022, the Supreme Court had upheld Employees Pension (Amendment) Scheme 2014. The EPS amendment of August 22, 2014 had raised the pensionable salary cap to Rs 15,000 a month from Rs 6,500 a month, and allowed members along with their employers to contribute 8.33 per cent of their actual salaries (if it exceeded the cap) towards the EPS. In an office order, the Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) pro-

vided for dealing with the 'Joint Option Form' by field offices of the body. EPFO stated that "a facility will be provided for which URL (unique resource location) will be informed shortly. Once received, the regional PF commissioner shall put adequate notice on the notice board and banners for wider public information". It provided that each application will be registered, digitally logged and the receipt number will be provided to the applicant. It further stated that the office in-charge of the concerned regional provident fund office shall examine each case of joint option on higher salary and intimate the decision to the applicant through e-mail/post and later through SMS also. It also provided that

any grievance by the applicant can be registered on EPFIIGMS (grievance portal) after submission of his joint option form and payment of due contributions, if any. The order stated that these directions are being issued in compliance with the order of Supreme Court on November 4, 2022. EPFO has asked its field offices to provide an option for higher pension to eligible subscribers in accordance with the Supreme Court order. According to the EPFO circular on December 29, 2022 the central government has directed to implement the directions in the order. The apex court had given all EPS members, as on September 1, 2014, six months to opt for the amended scheme. The apex court in its order gave four more months to

NMDC Steel Limited (NSL) was listed at Bombay Stock Exchange on Monday. NSL, NMDC's 3 MTPA Integrated Steel Plant at Nagarnar in Chhattisgarh, was listed to become a public company today.

The listing ceremony was held at BSE, Mumbai in presence of Sumit Deb, CMD, NSL, Amitava Mukherjee, Director, NSL, D.K. Mohanty, Director, NSL, Independent Directors of NMDC and Senior Officials of NMDC and NSL. Manoj Kumar, Joint Secretary, DIPAM, Government of India; Nayan Mehta, CFO, BSE Limited; Amitava Chatterjee, MD & CEO, SBI Capital Markets Limited; and Kamal Kant Upadhyay, MD & CEO, IDBI Capital Markets & Securities Limited wit-



nessed the listing ceremony. NMDC Steel Limited was incorporated as a wholly owned subsidiary of NMDC Limited on January 2, 2015 under the Companies Act, 2013 with a registered office at NMDC Iron & Steel Plant Nagarnar, Bastar, Chhattisgarh. The now demerged company NMDC Steel Limited is a

central public sector enterprise with a paid-up capital of Rs. 2,930 crores owned by the Honourable President of India, under the administrative control of the Ministry of Steel, Government of India. The Government owns 60.79% stake in this company.

Expressing his gratitude towards everyone in-

involved in the listing of the company, Sumit Deb, CMD, NMDC said, "Nagarnar Steel Plant is in the final stages of commissioning and is likely to be commissioned shortly. This plant will cater to the domestic steel needs and fulfil the vision of the National Steel Policy 2017 of the Government of India."

## Govt opposes Vedanta move to sell zinc assets

New Delhi, Feb 20:

In a setback to billionaire Anil Agarwal's mining group, the government has opposed Vedanta Ltd's proposal to sell its international zinc business to Hindustan Zinc Ltd for USD 2.98 billion over concerns of valuation. The government has threatened to take legal action to stop the sale of the Africa-based assets to HZL, in which it holds a 29.54 per cent stake.

In a letter to HZL, posted by the company to stock exchanges, the Ministry of Mines said the deal is a "related party transaction" and the government would "like to reiterate" its dissent. HZL in January agreed to buy THL Zinc Ltd Mauritius from its parent, Vedanta Ltd, for USD 2.98 billion in phases over 18 months. Vedanta holds a 64.92 per

cent equity share of Hindustan Zinc Ltd (HZL), which is an integrated producer of zinc, lead and silver. HZL in a separate filing said it would place the ministry's letter before the board and that a meeting of the shareholders to approve the deal was yet to be called.

The Rajasthan-based company has long been a cash cow for Agarwal's Vedanta group, squeezing out rich dividends. The latest proposed transaction is being seen as another way of extracting more funds out of HZL. The ministry in the letter said it is writing on behalf of the government on the resolution approved by the HZL board in its meeting on January 19 "for the creation of a wholly-owned overseas subsidiary of the company, funding such subsidiary to the extent of USD 2.981

billion and such subsidiary acquiring the shares of THL Zinc Ltd from THL Zinc Ventures Ltd (an entity of the Vedanta Group)." It said its nominee directors on the board had recorded their dissent to the proposal.

"The proposed resolutions which envisage the acquisition of THL Zinc (a Vedanta company) by HZL (also a Vedanta company) thus being a related party transaction, we, the government of India would like to reiterate our dissent on the matter and the resolutions forming part of the agenda matter," it said.


It wanted the company to explore other cashless methods of acquisition of assets. The government, it said, would continue to oppose the transaction and "will explore all legal avenues available."

## Sensex, Nifty extend losses for 2nd day on lingering worries over interest rates

Mumbai, Feb 20:

Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty declined for a second straight session on Monday, losing more than half a per cent due to selling in energy, banking and financials stocks amid lingering concerns over interest rates and inflation. Reversing its early gains, the BSE Sensex closed lower by 311.03 points or 0.51 per cent at 60,691.54 as 18 of its scrips declined.

The index opened higher at 61,112.84 and gained further 290 points to hit the day's high of 61,290.19. However, selling in index major Reliance Industries, HDFC twins, ICICI Bank Maruti and Kotak Bank dragged down the barometer to a low of 60,607.02. The NSE Nifty fell 99.60



points or 0.56 per cent to end at 17,844.60 as 30 of its constituents declined while 20 advanced. Nifty touched a high of 18,004.35 in early trade but later fell to a low of 17,818.40. Sensex lost nearly 317 points while Nifty

declined by 91 points on Friday. From the Sensex pack, Maruti, HDFC, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Axis Bank, Bajaj Finance, Reliance Industries, Nestle and ICICI Bank were among the major laggards.

## India's domestic air passenger traffic nearly doubled to 1.25 crore in January: DGCA data

Mumbai, Feb 20:

India's domestic air passenger traffic nearly doubled to 1.25 crore in January compared to 64.08 lakh recorded in the year-ago period, according to official data released on Monday.

In January, IndiGo saw its domestic market share decline for the fifth consecutive month at 54.6 per cent. It carried 68.47 lakh passengers last month. In August last year, the carrier had a market share of 59.72 per cent.

As per the data from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), the regulator received more complaints from the passengers of various airlines on account of flight problems, baggage issues and staff behaviour com-

pared to December. Air India and Vistara carried 11.55 lakh and 11.05 lakh passengers, respectively, in January, with a market share of 9.2 per cent and 8.8 per cent, respectively.

During the month under review, budget carriers — Go First and AirAsia India — transported a total of 10.53 lakh and 9.30 lakh passengers, respectively. The number of domestic passengers flown by low-cost airline SpiceJet stood at 9.14 lakh, according to DGCA.

The total number of domestic passengers flown by the Tata Group airlines — Air India, Vistara and AirAsia India — together stood at 32.30 lakh, accounting for around 26 per cent of the total domestic market in January 2023.

## India's GDP likely grew 5-5.1 pc in third quarter of FY23: Analysts

Mumbai, Feb 20:

The economy is likely to have grown at 5-5.1 per cent in the October-December 2022 quarter due to normalising base, much lower than the 6.3 per cent growth recorded in the previous quarter, according to analysts. Normal base refers to the comparable figure of the corresponding period of the preceding fiscal. But the base is lowered for calculating growth rate when the previous numbers are not comparable due to certain extreme conditions. Compared to the pre-Covid number, the GDP is likely to have grown 11.6 per cent in Q3 from 7.6 per cent in the previous quarter, boosted by continued recovery in the services sector, said Aditi Nayar, chief economist and head of re-

search at Icm Ratings. On the other hand, Rahul Bajaria, head of British brokerage Barclays India, said the economy would have grown at a tad lower at 5 per cent in the October-December quarter of FY23. The government is expected to release the third quarter macro-economic data on February 28. The government expects the economy to close the current fiscal with 7 per cent or higher growth. "Economic activity in Q3 remained distinctly uneven, amid the up-sides offered by robust demand for contact-intensive services and upbeat festive season sentiment. Trends in government spending were disparate, with a healthy revenue spending by the Centre amid a base effect-led contraction in capital spending.

## Rupee gains 10 paise to close at 82.72 against US dollar

New Delhi, Feb 20:

The rupee appreciated by 10 paise to close at 82.72 (provisional) against the US dollar on Monday, as the American currency retreated from its elevated levels. Forex traders said a muted trend in domestic equities and foreign fund outflows weighed on investor sentiments and restricted the appreciation bias. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 82.69 against the American currency and finally settled at 82.72 (provisional) against the greenback, registering a gain of 10 paise over its previous close of 82.62.

During the trading session, the rupee touched a high of 82.62 and a low of 82.74 against the dollar.



The dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, rose 0.04 per cent to 103.90. Global oil benchmark Brent crude futures advanced 1.05 per cent to USD 83.87 per barrel. "Rupee traded strong near 82.75 as dollar index traded below USD

104 guiding rupee strength. Asian currencies were trading strong on the back of weakness in the dollar," said Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst at LKP Securities. Trivedi further noted that the US Fed's minutes update will be keenly watched this week for further trend. On the domestic equity market front, the 30-share BSE Sensex declined 311.03 points or 0.51 per cent to end at 60,691.54, while the broader NSE Nifty fell 99.60 points or 0.56 per cent to 17,844.60. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) were net sellers in the capital market on Friday as they offloaded shares worth Rs 624.61 crore, according to exchange data.



## Hazlewood out with Achilles injury

Indore, Feb 20 (PTI):

Already down 0-2 in the Test series, Australia were on Monday dealt further blow when fast bowler Josh Hazlewood was ruled out of the remaining two matches of the Border-Gavaskar Trophy after failing to recover from his left achilles injury.

Australia head coach Andrew McDonald confirmed that Hazlewood, who missed the Nagpur and Delhi Tests, will continue his rehabilitation in Sydney. The 32-year-old Hazlewood sustained the injury during his comeback Test against South Africa in Sydney.

“Josh Hazlewood out, he’ll be going home,” McDonald said.

McDonald, however, is uncertain about David Warner’s status after the opener was hit on his elbow in the second Test and was subbed out of the match due a concussion.

“Warner’s still sore at the moment. We had a meeting just before discussing this. We’re in no rush to make any decisions at this point in time around Davey. Just seeing how that settles, how functional that is,” said



McDonald. “It will be basically how sore and how functional it is as to what decision we make with him and then the length of the injury. There’s some talk the length of injury could be anywhere be-

tween a week plus depending how that settles down. There’s a bit of unknown there. I’ll leave that to the medical team and they’ll inform me once they know.” Travid Head came out to bat in Australia’s

second innings in place of Warner in Delhi and McDonald said he will replace Warner if the veteran left-handed opener fails to recover on time.

“If Dave’s unavailable it would make perfect sense. We did discuss before coming over here that if we were to lose an opening batter that Trav would be one we’d look to put up there. We feel in the sub-continental conditions that he can get off to the fast starts which he showed,” he said.

“We don’t see (Head) as an opener in all conditions, more sub-continental and in other conditions back to the middle order.”

The coach, however, said that all-rounder Cameron Green will be fit for Indore. “He was close. It’s about building confidence. He had the setback in Bangalore, a little setback batting in Bangalore where he had some jarring and there was a fair bit of discomfort in that finger,” McDonald said.

“If he didn’t have that, I think the second Test was real. But it probably just delayed it those few days. And we contemplated him as a concussion sub as well.

With India winning the second Test inside three days on Sunday, both teams have got an additional couple of days’ break as the next game begins in Indore on March 1.

## Alcaraz beats Norrie on clay for 1st title since US Open


Buenos Aires, Feb 20 (AP):

Top-seeded Carlos Alcaraz won his first title since his milestone U.S. Open triumph by beating Cameron Norrie in straight sets at the Argentina Open.

The world No. 2 overcame No. 12 Norrie 6-3, 7-5 in the clay-court final on Sunday.

“I felt very comfortable,” Alcaraz said. “This is the level that I have to play in a final. It is really special, I struggled in these four months.”

A right leg injury sidelined Alcaraz from the Australian Open, with Novak Djokovic reclaim-

Norrie lost his second final of the year after Auckland in January. Alcaraz next defends his title at the Rio Open.

## Team think tank using twin tons in defence of his continuous selections

The curious case of KL Rahul

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI): KL Rahul’s continuation in the Test team, despite his repeated failures, is proving to be one of the most curious cases in Indian cricket.

Not many have survived the kind of failures that the man from Bengaluru has endured. Fewer have received such unwavering support from the who’s who of Indian cricket, making for a fascinating watch.

So why is he being persisted with?

Talent or favouritism? a match winner or a liability? There are varied opinions, but for the men who

matter, he is precious. There aren’t too many videos of Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma in same frame. But there was one shot right after the Indian team finished its Asia Cup campaign in Dubai, where Kohli was interviewed by his skipper for the BCCI TV after his much-awaited 71st international hundred, against Afghanistan.

That interaction stood out for a different reason.

“We shouldn’t ignore KL’s knock as we know how important it is for KL to be in a good head space, heading into the World Cup. We know what he can do in this format, plays

very clean shots, and once he bats in T20 cricket, our team looks even more strong,” Kohli said when Rohit asked how the former skipper was helping the other players.

The only thing that appeared a bit out of place in that particular interview was that the question on Rahul didn’t seem organic. It seemed as if they were trying to make a statement in support of Rahul on behalf of the team. The two biggest names in that dressing room wanted to get a protective shield around a teammate, whom they consider a minefield of talent

but whose deliverables have been few and far in between.

What has surprised many is the carte blanche that the Rahul Dravid-led team management has given to the Bangalore man.

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):

Top Indian wrestlers continued to opt out of big events as the likes of Vinesh Phogat and Bajrang Punia have decided to give the upcoming 2nd Ranking Series Ibrahim-Moustafa tournament a miss.

It is the second time in the month that Vinesh, Bajrang, Ravi Dahiya, Deepak Punia, Anshu Malik, Sangeeta Phogat and Sangita Mor have decided to sit out of an important tournament, to be held in Alexandria, Egypt from February 23 to 26. The top grapplers had earlier pulled out of the Zagreb Open, saying they are not ready for the competition.

The Mary Kom-headed oversight committee managing the WFI affairs cleared a contingent of 27 Indian wrestlers for the upcoming tournament.

The event will be crucial for gaining ranking points for better seeding at the Senior Asian Championships 2023 and the Senior World Championships 2023. The Indian team consists of nine freestyle, eight women and 10 greco-roman wrestlers, besides 16 coaches and support staff. The 27 wrestlers will also include three Target Olympics Podium Scheme (TOPS) grapplers — Ashu (67kg GR), Bhatari (65kg women) and Sujeet (65kg FS).

## New Delhi’s Slum Soccer nominated for Laureus Sport for Good Award

London, Feb 20 (PTI):

The race for the Laureus World Sportswoman of the Year Award is led by two athletes who lit up the World Championships in Eugene, USA — Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce and Sydney McLaughlin-Levrone.

Katie Ledecky, who won four

golds, taking her total to 22, a record for a female swimmer, footballer Alexia Putellas, Mikaela Shiffrin, who regained her overall title at the Alpine Ski World Cup, and tennis player Iga Swiatek are the other nominees for the women’s top award. The nominees for the Laureus World Team of the Year Award include the Argentina men’s football team, which won a third World Cup, Real Madrid, who claimed their 14th title, NBA champions The Golden State Warriors, the Oracle Red Bull Racing team, France men’s rugby side and England women’s football team.

The award winners will be announced at the Laureus World Sports Awards.

## I am neither a rebel nor a trend-setter: Sania Mirza

Dubai, Feb 20 (PTI):

Sania Mirza is not apologetic for being one of a kind.

A few people chose to call her a trailblazer while some labelled her a rebel. She says she is none and just lived life “on her own terms”.

Splashed with mind-blowing success and achievements that no Indian female tennis player could enjoy and which are unlikely to be emulated in the imminent future, Sania has lived an inspiring life.

During a free-wheeling chat at her villa in Dubai, Sania implored the society to accept differences in opinion and not brand as “villain or heroes” the people who dare to do things in their own way.

“I don’t think that I broke the rules. Who are these people who are making these rules and who are these people who are saying this is the norm and this is the stereotype.

“I think each individual is different and each individual should have the freedom to be different,” Sania told PTI in an exclusive interview, before bidding adieu to her tennis career.

The 36-year-old Indian added, “I think that’s where as a society we can probably do better, a little bit where we are trying to hail people or make people the bad guys just because they are doing something differently.

“And I don’t necessarily think that I was some kind of a great rule-breaker or some trendsetter. That’s

not what I was trying to do. I was living my life.

“We all say things differently, we all have different opinions. I think once we all accept that we are all different, and we can co-exist with those differences is when it will not be about breaking the rules anymore.”

Holder of six Grand Slam doubles titles and a year-end WTA Championships trophy to go with a career-best singles rank of 27, if Sania is not a trend-setter then what is she?

“I do look at myself as trying to be as authentic as possible. That’s what I’ve tried to do. I’ve tried to stay true to myself. And I have tried to live life on my own terms.

“I think everybody should be able to do that

and have the freedom to do that without being told that you are breaking the rules because you are doing something that you want to do,” she said.

“That is something I take a lot of pride in because I think that it’s not that I was necessarily different. I might have been different to you, but that doesn’t mean that I am someone who is a rebel, or someone who is breaking some kind of rules.

“It’s just my individuality and another person’s individuality.”

A lot has changed in Indian sport in the last few years, but in the not too distant past, women athletes struggled for acceptance and recognition, and were not even considered worthy of pursuing a career in sport.



## League leader Barcelona beats Cadiz 2-0 after turbulent week

Madrid, Feb 20 (AP): With yet another win, Barcelona left its problems off the field after a turbulent week. Barcelona defeated Cadiz 2-0 on Sunday as it extended its winning streak and lead over Real Madrid in the Spanish league. Sergi Roberto and Robert Lewandowski scored late in the first half to give Barcelona its seventh straight league win and get its lead over second-place Madrid back to eight points. Madrid had cut the gap to five points with a 2-0 win at Osasuna on Saturday. “We played well in the first half,”

Barcelona coach Xavi said. “There was a bit of a let-down in the second, but it was expected. We have been playing a lot, the team is tired.”

Barcelona’s home game at Camp Nou came after it became publicly known that a state prosecutor is probing Barcelona’s payment of millions of dollars over several years to a company that belonged to the vice president of the Spanish federation’s refereeing committee. Barcelona has been heavily criticized but denied any wrongdoing, saying it paid for reports on refer-

ees but never tried to influence their decisions in games. On the field, Roberto opened the scoring in the 43rd with a shot from the middle of the area after Lewandowski’s header off a cross by Ferran Torres was cleared by a defender on the goal line. Lewandowski added to the lead before halftime with a low shot from just inside the area for his league-leading 15th goal and first overall after three scoreless matches in all competitions.

It was the 17th clean sheet for Barcelona in the league this season.

## Kushwaha quits JD(U) again, floats yet another party

Patna, Feb 20 (PTI):

Disgruntled JD(U) leader Upendra Kushwaha on Monday resigned from Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's JD(U), less than two years after returning to the party, and announced formation of the Rashtriya Loktantrik Janata Dal. JD(U) national president Rajiv Ranjan Singh alias "Lalan", however, berated the former parliamentary board chairman as an over-ambitious party-hopper, whose return was "opposed by all, but materialised only at the insistence of the CM" whom Kushwaha had assured "I will now live and die here".

Kushwaha, who has been venting spleen against Kumar for some time, also announced that he will be seeking an appointment with chairman of the legislative council to resign from his membership of

the House, adding with rhetorical flourish "zameer bechkar amir nahin banenge" (I cannot barter my conscience for perks)". He alleged that Kumar, his political benefactor, had "pawned his political capi-

tal (rajneetik sampatti ko girwi rakh diya) by having hinted that Tejashwi Yadav (the deputy CM) shall be the future leader of the coalition", which JD(U) had joined nearly six months ago.

Lalan, however, pointed out that Kushwaha, who then headed the Rashtriya Lok Samata Party (RLSP), had aligned with the RJD after quitting the NDA in 2018, "and he appeared to be fine with Tejashwi Yadav back then". The JD(U) chief also rubbished Kushwaha's allegation that Kumar, the party's de facto leader, no more exercised his own judgement, but acted on the advice of a coterie with vested interests.

## SC refuses to initiate contempt proceedings over demolition of mutt associated with Guru Nanak

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):

The Supreme Court on Monday refused to initiate contempt proceedings over demolition of a mutt associated with Sikhism founder Guru Nanak Dev in Puri, Odisha. The petitioners, represented by a senior counsel, argued the demolition was in violation of a judicial order.

The bench headed by Justice M R Shah, said it was dismissing the plea as there was no "disobedience". "We don't want to initiate contempt proceedings. We are dismissing it. We see no reason to initiate contempt proceedings," said the bench, also comprising Justice C T Ravikumar.

The petitioners submitted that in 2019, the top

court had passed an order recording that while clearing the area in the vicinity of the Jagannath Temple, the authorities would ensure that the deities, samadhi of the mutt, its relics etc would not be disturbed and remain at their current place with better beautification in line with Kalinga style of architecture.

The petitioners claimed the demolition of the premises, which Guru Nanak visited over 500 years ago, took place in spite of the undertaking given by the authorities. The authorities had in 2019 told the apex court that the area near Jagannath Temple needed to be cleared to avoid any stampede, incidents of fire and

to take care of emergencies as well as security and safety of the devotees. In December 2019, protests were held over the demolition of the Sikh mutt complex in Puri.

Scores of Sikh community members had taken out a march in Bhubaneswar to protest against state government's decision to carry out the demolition of three mutt complexes, prominent among them being the Mangu Mutt which was said to have been visited by Guru Nanak Dev. The two-storey complex, constructed over 100 years ago, was declared unsafe by the Puri administration a decade ago. It also housed a hotel, nine shops and a restaurant.

## 'Decision to cap number of visits by prisoners' kin, counsel not arbitrary'

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):

Delhi High Court has said the authorities' decision to cap the number of visits by prisoners' families, friends and legal advisers to twice a week has been taken considering the number of inmates and it cannot be said to be "completely arbitrary".

The high court said the decision has been taken after careful consideration of the facilities available in the prisons, availability of staff and the number of undertrials.

"In matters of policy, the courts do not substitute its own conclusion with the one arrived at by the government merely because another view is possible. Therefore, this court is not inclined to pass any order

issuing writ of mandamus," a bench of Chief Justice Satish Chandra Sharma and Justice Subramonium Prasad said.

The judgment came while disposing of a petition challenging certain provisions of the Delhi Prison Rules, 2018.

The petition by advocate Jai Anant Dehadrai prayed for amendment of the Rules to allow interviews with legal advisers be open from Monday to Friday for an appropriate allotted time with no cap on interviews per week.

The petitioner, in the interim, prayed for visits of the legal counsel to their clients in Delhi prisons more than twice a week.

The high court, in its verdict, said keeping in

view the fact that the present PIL is not an adversarial litigation and the petition has been filed in the interest of prisoners, it permits the petitioner to give a representation to the state providing suggestions.

It said the state shall consider the suggestions in the right spirit.

"Depending upon the number of undertrials and prisoners, the State has taken a decision of capping total number of visits by family members, relatives, friends and legal advisers to two times a week and it cannot be said that the said decision is completely arbitrary. The said decision has been taken after careful consideration of the facilities available in the prisons,

availability of the staff and the number of undertrials," the bench said.

The petitioner contended that limiting the number of visits by family members, relatives, friends and legal advisers to twice a week is violative of Article 21 of the Constitution as it limits the rights of an undertrial to have adequate resources to legal representation.

Fixing a cap on the number of visits to an undertrial is manifestly arbitrary as it imposes an unreasonable restriction on the right to legal representation and is violative of the right to access justice which is guaranteed under Article 14 of the Constitution, the petitioner said.

## RPF to host International Union of Railways' World Security Congress in Jaipur from Feb 21-23

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):

Railway Protection Force (RPF) will host the prestigious International Union of Railways' 18th World Security Congress in Jaipur from February 21-23, the Railways said on Monday. Union internationale des chemins de fer (UIC) or International Union of Railways represents the railway sector and promotes rail transport worldwide.

"Having assumed the chair of UIC Security platform, DG RPF has taken up measures to enhance the involvement of member organizations operating in Asia, Africa and several other developing countries with similar demographic pattern so that their voice could be heard and concerns ad-

ressed by the multilateral platform provided by the UIC.

"It is in this backdrop and with India taking over the mantle of the presidency of G-20, India will be proudly hosting the 18th World Security Congress for the International Union of Railways in the Pink City Jaipur," the Railways said in a statement. The RPF will be the host for engaging with the delegates (security representatives) of the member organizations of UIC.

The 18th edition of the Congress, centred around the theme of 'Railway Security Strategy: Responses and Vision for Future', will be attended by the heads of security of railway organizations from across the world,

apart from the concerned officials of UIC, partner international organizations, Indian Railways, RPF and senior police officials from India.

"It will be an event befitting with the occasion of India taking on the leadership of hosting railway security delegates from around the world. RPF is geared up to host impactful deliberations on issues of concern and challenges for railway security across the world and has devised the sessions in a way to focus on second order problem solving matrix so as to come up with practical and immediately implementable solutions that will result into a transformative metamorphosis of railway security across the globe," the statement said.

## Narendra Dabholkar murder

### Bombay HC grants CBI four weeks to decide on probe conclusion report

Mumbai, Feb 20 (PTI): The Bombay High Court on Monday granted the Central Bureau of Investigation four more weeks to decide on the probe conclusion report into the 2013 killing of rationalist Narendra Dabholkar. On January 30, the CBI had informed HC its probe in the case was complete and that the investigating officer has sent a closure report to the probe agency's head office for approval. On Monday, advocate Sandesh Patil, appearing for the CBI, informed a division bench of Justices A S Gadkari and P D Naik that some more time was required to get a clearer picture on the approval for the conclusion report. The bench accepted the statement and granted the agency four weeks time to decide on the probe conclusion report. Dabholkar (67), founder of the Maharashtra Andhashradha Nirmoolan Samiti, was shot dead by two persons, allegedly linked to the radical outfit Sanatan Sanstha, while he was on a morning walk in Pune on August 20, 2013. The HC was hearing a petition filed by Narendra Dabholkar's daughter Mukta Dabholkar, seeking that the court continue monitoring the progress of the probe.

## Accused seeks bail claiming huge delay in trial

New Delhi, Feb 20 (PTI):

An accused, who allegedly pointed a pistol at a police head constable during the communal violence in the northeast Delhi in February 2020, Monday sought bail from the Delhi High Court claiming there was a huge delay in the trial.

Shahrulk Pathan said in the last over one year and three months only two witnesses in the case out of 40 have been examined.

The submissions were made before Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma who listed the matter for further hearing on May 2 and directed the counsel for police and Pathan to file their brief written submissions.

During the hearing, Pathan's counsel argued that though the charges were framed in the case in December 2021, only two prosecution witnesses have been examined so far.

"There is a huge delay in conclusion of trial," the counsel contended, while claiming that Pathan was also attacked in the jail. The counsel said he had filed the bail plea in January 2022 and it has been pending for over a year.

The Delhi Police, in its status report filed in March 2022, have opposed the bail plea of Pathan, saying he has a criminal family history and can adversely influence the witnesses.

Police have said the accused can threaten and endanger the safety of

prosecution witnesses and abscond, if granted bail, and can also hamper the process of investigation and destroy evidence. They have also claimed the accused has no remorse for his illegal actions.

The case relates to rioting, causing injuries to police personnel and inflicting gunshot wound on a man named Rohit Shukla by an armed mob in the Jafraabad.

The status report has stated, "The accused has been keeping illegal arm and ammunition and has no remorse for his illegal act. His daring act of firing at a policeman and the public shows that if released on bail, he can repeat such a criminal act."

It said there are police and public witnesses who

have identified him. The report said from the criminal family background of Pathan and his desperate nature, it can be inferred that he can adversely influence the witnesses.

The report said the statement of the eyewitnesses and seized CCTV footage establish that Pathan was leading the mob and indulged in the act of rioting on February 24, 2020 during which he fired at the complainant and public from his pistol.

Pathan approached the high court after his bail plea was rejected by a trial court in December 2021. The trial court was of the view that the CCTV footage of a nearby camera installed at the relevant location showed his presence in the riotous mob.
