President confers 106 Padma awards

New Delhi, Mar 22 (PTI):

President Droupadi Murmu on Wednesday conferred Padma awards to former Karnataka chief minister S M Krishna, noted industrialist Kumar Mangalam Birla and famous playback singer Suman Kalyanpur at a ceremony at the Rashtrapati Bhavan. Besides them, billionaire stock market investor Rakesh Jhunjhunwala, who had passed away last year, was given the honour posthumously along with several unsung heroes. The president had approved the conferment of 106 Padma awards, including three duo cases (in a duo case, the award is counted as one), on the eve of this year's Republic Day. Of these, over 50 people were awarded Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri on Wednesday. Krishna, who was external affairs minister in the Congress-led UPA government and had later joined the BJP, was awarded the Padma Vibhushan. Noted architect Balkrishna Doshi (posthumously) was also given the Padma Vibhushan, the country's second highest civilian honour. Birla, Delhi-based professor Kapil Kapoor, who is widely known for his books on Indian grammatical theories and models, spiritual leader

Amritpal's mentor Papalpreet helped escape police dragnet

Chandigarh: The brains behind pro-Khalistan fugitive Amritpal Singh's escape from the police dragnet was 38-year-old Papalpreet Singh, who was in close contact with Pakistan's ISI and was taking instructions from it, officials said on Wednesday.

They said Papalpreet Singh is considered one of Amritpal Singh's mentors who had been advising him on various issues. Papalpreet had been working with Amritpal closely since he returned to India last year and took over the reins of 'Waris Punjab De', an organisation founded by actor Deep Sidhu, who died in a road accident in 2021.

Papalpreet was seen driving a motorcycle with Amritpal riding pillion. The two-wheeler was found deserted at Phillaur in Jalandhar.

2.7 magnitude quake strikes Delhi

New Delhi, Mar 22 (PTI): A 2.7 magnitude earthquake struck the national capital on Wednesday, the National Centre for Seismology said.

The quake occurred at 4:42 pm. The epicentre was in west Delhi and the

depth was five kilometres, it said. A powerful earthquake of 6.8-magnitude had jolted the city on Tuesday night and its epicentre was in Afghanistan's Hindu Kush region, while its depth was 156 kilometres.

Awareness programmes to minimise earthquake damage'

As strong tremors jolted Delhi-NCR and other parts of northern India, officials on Wednesday said awareness programmes and mock drills are some of the measures being taken by the government to minimise earthquake damage. O P Mishra, the director at the Ministry of Earth Sciences' National Centre for Seismology (NCS), said earthquake risk mitigation awareness programmes are being held and mock drills are also being conducted in order to educate people about the dos and don'ts during an earthquake. "Earthquake cannot be stopped but its impact can be minimised by various measures. The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) is the nodal agency to conduct the mock drills in coordination with other institutes and such drills are conducted at regular intervals," Mishra told PTI. Mishra said that the Centre has tried using the new building design code for earthquake risk resilience in which seismic microzonation is done.

Doting parents place QR code on son's tomb to keep his memories alive

Thrissur (Kerala), Mar 22 (PTI): A QR code placed on a tombstone at a church in Kerala's Thrissur helps one to relive and reminisce on the creative work rendered by a doctor, who died young at just 26.

The parents of Dr Ivins Francis decided to place the QR code on the tomb of the youngster at St Joseph Church, Kuriyachira in the central Kerala district to give people a glimpse into his world as they can watch videos of his performances by scanning the code. His family from Kuriyachira has designed a web page containing all the works of Ivins and linked it with the QR code.

Ivins had created profiles of people using QR codes and his parents also decided to do the same. "He also used to send me a lot of QR codes for information. I could scan the QR code and could download the information I was seeking," Francis said.

Son of Francis, an officer with a private company in Oman, and Leena, principal of the Indian School in Oman, Ivins was well-versed in music and

sports, and found time to indulge in his passion along with his medical course. He was popular among the community with his performances.

Ivins' unfortunate death came in 2021 when he collapsed and died while playing badminton.

"We wanted his life to be a motivation for everyone and that is how we thought of placing a QR code on his tomb," Francis said.

The doting father said his daughter had asked him not to inscribe anything on the tomb when he ordered it. "She created the site and QR code and asked me whether that could be printed on the marble tomb. So I asked the maker, and he said it can be printed," Francis said.

He said when the tomb is placed in a cemetery and people see Ivins' grave, there will not be anyone available to tell them about his son.


'Will talk only after Rahul is allowed to speak'

Bhilai, Mar 22: As per the intentions of Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, RIPAs are being established by the district administration to provide employment to the maximum number of young entrepreneurs. RIPA infrastructure has been prepared in rural areas and land is being identified for this project in urban areas also.

In rural areas, 12 RIPAs have been prepared and allotments have commenced.

Collector Pushpendra Kumar Meena reviewed the enterprises taking place in RIPAs.

He said that youth in both urban and rural areas are interested in startups. They have courage and fresh ideas. All they need is infrastructure and counselling. Collector asked the officials to make it available to the youth through RIPA and Urban Industrial Park. Garment factory and two BPOs will come up in Bhilai. In this regard, Municipal Corporation Commissioner Rohit Vyas informed the Collector in detail about the preparations made so far.

He said that the land has been identified for the garment factory. Five hundred people will get employment in this factory. Along with this, two BPOs will also be started through which entrepreneurs would be able to take advantage of the huge outsourcing market. About five hundred youth will get employment through BPOs.

Similarly, a garment factory will be established in Durg. The administration will contact youth to make them aware about RIPA.

District Panchayat CEO Ashwini Dewangan and Durg Municipal Corporation Commissioner Lokesh Chandrakar were also present during the meeting.

DE to be conducted against Belgahana DFO: Minister

Raipur, Mar 22: Forest Minister Md Akbar on Wednesday announced that inquiry would be conducted against Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) on the issue of irregularities in Belgahana Circle of Bilaspur.

Replying to a question raised by the senior Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA) Dharmal Kaushik from BJP, the Minister informed that state government has already suspended four employees on the charges of irregularities and added that role of DFO would also be probed on the basis of the initial reports. He said that probe commit-

tee report had found the then Circle in-charge Vijay Kumar Sahu, Circle Officer Sewakram Baiga, Md Shamim, Hit Kumar Dhruv and Mulesh Kumar Joshi, Forest Conservator and subsequently they were suspended.

Hybrid pre-ventricular VSD devise closure done on 1 year-old child

● An exemplary team-work by cardiac sciences team at NH MMI

Raipur, Mar 22: A one-year-old girl, with severe malnutrition, was evaluated at a pediatric cardiology camp in Odisha. She was weighing 5 kg (expected-9 kg) found to have very large (14mm) VSD (ventricular septal defect) with very high PA pressure (pressure of lungs). VSD is an opening or hole (defect) in the wall (septum) separating the two lower chambers of the heart (ventricles). Addressing the scribes here, Senior Cardiologist Dr Sumanta Shekhar Padhi said that she was brought to our hospital for further treatment. At our hospital, she was evaluated, and the diagnosis was confirmed. She needed closure of the VSD. However, since the child was severely malnourished, it carried very high risk of death or prolonged hospital stay after open heart surgery. So, all efforts were made to under-



the risk. Device closure was a good option, but since the VSD (hole/opening in heart) was very large, it required proportionately very large device and its delivery system. The veins of the child were too small to insert the device delivery system into the heart and hence percutaneous closure was not a suitable option in such a small child with VSD. Hence the cardiac sciences team at NH MMI planned a novel technique. The chest was opened by the cardiac surgeon and the device closure was done by directly puncturing one of the walls of heart (right ventricle free wall) by the cardiologist. After the device was deployed the puncture was closed by the surgeon. The entire procedure was guided by trans-oesophageal echocardiography (TEE). TEE is

a kind of echocardiography done by inserting a probe with a transducer down the esophagus. This provides a clearer image of the heart and device placement in real time. The entire procedure was completed within 45- 50 min. The child had a smooth post operative course, and could be discharged on 7th day after the procedure. Such a procedure from planning, execution and post operative care needs extreme degree of coordination among the team members- the cardiac surgeon (Dr Hari Kumar, Dr Sumit), Cardiac Anesthetist (Dr Arun Andapan, Dr Rakesh Chand, Dr Dharmesh) and the Cardiologist (Dr Sumanta Shekhar Padhi, Dr Kinjal Bakshi). This case is of one of the youngest children to under-

go such a rare procedure in the state. We at NH MMI Narayana Superspeciality Hospital, Raipur are proud to have such an excellent team to help the most deserving child like this. If you look at the statistics of the traffic department, there have been 15 thousand deaths in the past years, while more than 30 thousand have been injured. Such routes where more than seven accidents or more than five deaths or more than 10 accidents are happening within a radius of 500 meters. With the survey of these roads, it is included in the black spot. A three-day festival here spanning the physical and virtual worlds will witness artworks, performances, gaming and installations created in collaboration between artists across India and the UK using Artificial Intelligence that convey the urgency of the climate emergency.

FutureFantastic, conceptualised by Jaaga's BeFantastic of Bengaluru in collaboration with FutureEverything of Manchester will be hosted at the Bangalore International Centre from March 24 to 26. It is part of the India/UK Together, Season of Culture that brings together artists from the two countries to address shared global challenges such as climate change, environment sustainability, equality and gender among others.

The audience will get a chance to interact with innovative, AI-powered interactive artworks, as well as to investigate the role of art and technology

through panel discussions and workshops led by experts in technology, arts, and climate action, the organisers said.

sponding to the climate emergency, a statement said.


The festival includes curated artworks by internationally recognised artists, as well as nine commissioned pieces created by collaborative artist groups from the BeFantastic Fellowship programmes.

CU of Kerala to confer honorary doctorate on P T Usha

Kasaragod (Kerala), Mar 22 (PTI):

The Central University of Kerala on Wednesday said it would confer an honorary doctorate on legendary track and field athlete P T Usha in recognition of her immense contributions to the field of sports.

Usha is a nominated member of the Rajya Sabha and the president of the Indian Olympic Association (IOA).

This will be the first honorary doctorate awarded by the Central University of Kerala, an

official statement said.

Representing India, Usha has won 33 medals, including 19 golds, in the Asian Games and Asian Championship.

She was the first Indian athlete to win medals in four consecutive Asian Games and also six medals, including five gold, in the Jakarta Asian Athletic Meet in 1985.

"Usha is the star who has given many moments that have made the country proud," the university said.

The former athlete heads the Usha School of

Athletics in Kinaloor, which has produced numerous successful athletes, who over 20 years have won 79 international medals for India so far.

"She is widely regarded as the genius who paved a strong athletic culture in the country," the university said.

University Vice Chancellor Prof H Venkateshwarlu said it was the duty of the university to honour those who are role models for the nation. "The life and achievements of P T Usha inspire students."

Man in skirt breaks gender stereotypes with Insta reel of ramp walk

Mumbai, Mar 22 (PTI):

A man in a stunning black skirt doing a ramp walk in a local train compartment of males made heads turn, garnering him more than 73,000 likes and 1,800 comments on Instagram. In the video, Shivam Bhardwaj, who goes by the Instagram handle "theguyinaskirt", is seen in a black ensemble walking across the compartment as commuters look on stunned, some of them amused.

"When I was editing my reel, I saw people's reactions to my ramp walk in the local train and it was shocking. Some people were left with their mouths wide open, but there was also a man who came up to me and asked if I am an artist and that made me happy that there are people who understand," the 24-year-old told PTI. Shivam, who is a part of the LGBTQ community, identifies himself as a gay man who sup-

ports gender neutrality. The lad from Uttar Pradesh's Meerut believes make-up and clothing such as skirts should not be restricted to any gender. "Men can wear skirts too. Because it hasn't been seen in Indian society, it is very shocking for people around and they don't want to believe that a boy is wearing a skirt. However, I do believe times are changing," Shivam said.

"When women can wear a pantsuit, men can also wear a skirt and it won't affect their manhood, if you're a man you will stay a man even if you wear a skirt," he reasoned.

Shivam knew that he always wanted to do something in fashion, but his parents' acceptance and approval did not come easily. Shivam was asked to leave his home when he was 19 as he was making fashion content which was against the wishes of his father who wanted his son to be a chartered accountant.

New Delhi, Mar 22 (PTI):

The Centre on Wednesday defended before the Delhi High Court the policy barring married individuals from applying for Judge Advocate General (JAG), the legal officer in the army, and said considering the "effects of marriage", the bar is a "reasonable restriction placed in public interest and the interest of national security".

In an additional affidavit filed in response to a petition challenging the embargo, the Central government said the condition of being unmarried for grant of commission to cadets aged 21-27 years is "restricted only for the period of recruitment and pre-commissioned training" which involves a high amount of stress and rigours of military training and the restriction on marriage before successful commission is in the interest of the candidates as well as organisation.

CENTRE TO HC

A bench of Chief Justice Satish Chandra Sharma and Justice Sachin Datta granted time to petitioner Kush Kalra to file his response to the Centre's stand.

Last year, the high court had asked the Centre to explain the reason behind the policy on an affidavit while remarking that the policy barring married individuals from applying for the post "does not make any sense". The Centre, in its earlier affidavit filed in March 2019, said that right to marry cannot be a right to life under the Constitution and there was no discrimination on the basis of marital status of the candidates. The authorities have sought dismissal of the PIL saying the Constitution does not stipulate right to marry as a fundamental right.

In the latest affidavit, the Centre submitted that in the Indian Army, both males

and females are treated equally and all army personnel have similar qualification requirements for basic military training and in all types of entries, "unmarried clause" is common.

It explained that once the unmarried cadets complete their training and are granted commission, there is no bar on marriage or its "natural consequences" like pregnancy and several service benefits are also given, but during conduct of basic military training that lasts for minimum one year, such provisions are not possible. "Since pregnancy and giving birth to a child is considered as natural right for a woman and she cannot be deprived of that, while formulating the rules such precautionary conditions have been laid down in the interest of women candidates themselves," the reply said.

"With regard to male officers the answering respons-


dents, without prejudice, respectfully submit that the rigour of training and initial years of service do not permit an officer to get married during training or to address certain requirements of married life to include situations of emergency," the additional affidavit said.

"Thus, the prohibition of marriage during training period and before successful commission is felt to be a reasonable restriction put in the interest of the candidates as well as organisation," asserted the document.

The Centre informed the court that an absence of more than three weeks during training leads to the cadets losing a term and being relegated to a junior term and further absence leads to discharge. "Having regard to the effects of marriage, the bar of marriage is a reasonable restriction placed in public interest and national security... due to such thought of policy governing the entry of males and females in Indian Army, either men or women officers, do not require them to resign or give up their service due to marriage or marriage related natural consequences if they get married after completion of training and are

granted commission," the additional affidavit said.

(LDF) and a Congress leader in the "monumental" corruption which caused the man-made disaster recently.

"There are three sons-in-law, two companies and a big scam. The LDF and the UDF have come together in looting Kerala," he said, claiming that the companies assigned to deal with waste management in the city are linked to the kin of politicians.

There was no immediate reaction from the Left and the Congress to the charge levelled by the former Union minister at a BJP press conference here. Kerala BJP leaders, including Union minister V Muraleedharan and former Union minister K J

Alphons, were part of the presser.

"I am directly saying that the chief minister has taken interest," Javadekar said.

Lone West Bengal Congress MLA takes oath

Kolkata, Mar 22 (PTI):

Bayron Biswas, the lone Congress MLA of the West Bengal Assembly took oath as a member of the House on Wednesday, 20 days after he won a by-election.

Speaker Biman Banerjee administered oath to Biswas who said he would strive to fight for the people's issues on the floor of the House.

The Congress which drew a blank in the 2021

assembly election in the state secured a seat as Biswas wrested the minority-dominated Sagardighi constituency from the ruling Trinamool Congress in a by-poll held last month. He was supported by the CPI(M)-led Left Front.

Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs Sandhya Rani Tudu was the lone TMC legislator who was present at the oath-taking ceremony. A few BJP MLAs and senior

Congress leaders were also there.

Speaking over the delay in the oath-taking ceremony, Biswas said he had been a TMC legislator; his oath-taking ceremony would have been completed within a week.

"Just because I am a Congress MLA, it took 20 days to organise my oath-taking ceremony," he said.

The result of the by-poll to Sagardighi in Murshidabad district was announced on March 2.

"The people of Sagardighi have allowed me to serve them and the people of the state. I will fight for the people's issues on the floor of the House. I would aim to uphold my party's views and fight the corrupt TMC regime and divisive forces," he told reporters.

Biswas's victory from Sagardighi has kicked off a war of words, with Chief Minister and TMC supremo Mamata Banerjee accusing the Congress of

having a tacit understanding with the BJP in the state.

The TMC recently also announced that it will maintain equidistance from the BJP and the Congress and would try to align with regional parties to fight the saffron camp in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

Meanwhile, hours before the oath-taking ceremony of Biswas, TMC spokesperson Kunal Ghosh demanded his ar-

Barricades, Cops at Indian Mission in London shortly after India's move

London, Mar 22:



More policemen and barricades were installed outside the Indian High Commission in London on Wednesday ahead of a planned protest, in an apparent effort to prevent a repeat of the vandalism seen three days ago.

The step came shortly after the police in New Delhi removed traffic barricades outside the British High Commission, in a move interpreted by some as a demonstration of India's displeasure with the breach in London.

Police officers, liaison officers, and patrol officers were seen on duty outside

the building known as India Place in central London, where a giant Indian flag remained strung between windows following Sunday's incident.

India had summoned a

senior British diplomat in Delhi after the demonstration at the High Commission in Aldwych where windows were broken, and the Indian flag was taken down from the first-floor balcony of the building by a protester before it was rescued by an official. The Ministry of External Affairs issued a statement saying the senior diplomat had been asked to explain "the complete absence of British security" as the crowd targeted the building, waving yellow "Khalistan" banners. The protest had been called over a massive

manhunt in India for Amritpal Singh, a supporter of the Khalistan movement who has been on the run since Saturday. Followed by hundreds of armed supporters, he had stormed a police station last month. Commenting on the removal of barricades outside the British High Commission, a senior police officer in Delhi told news agency PTI, "The security arrangements... are intact. However, barricades placed on the pathway towards the Commission that created hurdles for commutation have been removed."

Revival of Khalistan Movement

The threat of Khalistan terror is looming over Punjab, as Pakistan has once again resorted to its familiar strategy of reviving terror activity in the state. The anti-India lobbies abroad, led by Pakistan, have instigated the Sikhs for Justice movement and revived the Bhindranwale cult. Amritpal Singh, a self-styled Khalistan protagonist based in Dubai, has been tasked with launching a militant movement to demand a separate homeland for Sikhs. He recently stormed Ajnala Police Station near Amritsar with a large number of armed supporters to force the release of an associate. The Punjab police have started canceling arms licenses of his followers, and his social media handler was arrested at Amritsar International Airport, confirming the external links guiding the Khalistan movement. Pakistan's ISI is planning initial steps to gradually create an environment for militancy in Punjab, using drones to drop arms and drugs in the border districts to exploit the vulnerability of Sikh youth. Stray incidents of terror are beginning to occur in which enemy agents are using grenades and IEDs to target police and foment public scare. The state authorities should be vigilant against any activity designed to create a Hindu-Sikh schism, as the targeting of Hindu passengers in buses and terror attacks on Hindu leaders became pronounced during the days of Khalistan terrorism in Punjab in the 1980s. The concerned agencies of the Centre and the state have to work in a co-ordinated way to tackle the menace of drugs firmly without letting it create any communal ripples. The state of unemployment in Punjab makes the youth vulnerable to subversive propaganda, and a strategic measure would be to place Punjab in the care of a national security professional who had past experience serving the state in difficult times, as Governor for a few years. Against the backdrop of the narrative of authoritarianism and intolerance built by anti-India lobbies against the Modi government, inter-community goodwill must be maintained in the border state, and a service-oriented administration must be provided to the people in general. The emerging scene of militancy being restarted in Punjab in the name of Khalistan, by some elements manoeuvred by Pakistan, needs to be taken cognizance of and analysed. The security of the border state must be kept above domestic politics, and Hindus and Sikhs must show unity against the forces that seek to shatter communal harmony and serve the narrow agenda of Khalistan.

Reforming Parliament for Effective Functioning

The current state of Parliament is one of chaos and stalemate, with both the government and opposition unwilling to compromise on issues. While political differences are a natural part of a democracy, it is essential to find ways to ensure that Parliament functions effectively. There is an urgent need for reforms to make the legislative process more transparent and outcome-oriented. The Parliament spends less time on legislative business, resulting in lawmakers spending less time on law-making. The former chief justice N.V. Ramana recently lamented how Parliament passed laws without deliberation and debate. The National Commission to Review the Working of the Constitution recommended that Lok Sabha should have at least 120 and Rajya Sabha 100 sittings. A single minute in Parliament leads to an expenditure of Rs. 2.5 lakhs approx to the exchequer. Another area for improvement is the conduct of members. Both the government and opposition are guilty of resorting to disruptive tactics such as walkouts, running to the well of the House with placards, shouting slogans, etc., which could attract public and media attention. Instead, political parties must replace disorder, disruption, and delay in legislation with debate, discussion, and decision in a democracy. The adage is while the Opposition should have its say, the Government should have its right. There is also a need to make parliamentary committees more effective. Currently, the parliamentary committees have gradually decreased their number of sittings. The Government also only refers some pieces of legislation to the committee. A healthy democracy needs a fit functioning Parliament. Indian democracy has matured over the years, and it is time to make some necessary corrective issues. To achieve effective functioning of Parliament, the rules must be revamped to make clearing legislation and discussion on issues open, transparent, and outcome-oriented. Political parties should choose eminent men and women as members, and new members should be given adequate time to participate in the proceedings. Party leaders should focus more on Parliament's functioning as they are also stakeholders. Presiding officers should be given more teeth, and new members should be trained to understand the House's rules and regulations. The cancellation of Zero Hour and Question Hour indicates that parliamentary reforms are urgently needed. The Question hour is when the Government answers many questions, and it should not be disturbed. Accommodation and negotiations should be part of the conduct of the House. The current state of Parliament highlights the need for reforms to make the legislative process more transparent and outcome-oriented. A fit functioning Parliament is essential for a healthy democracy. It is time to implement some necessary corrective measures to ensure that Parliament functions effectively.



Self Defence Training : A necessity for school girls

Prone to women atrocities is not a recent phenomenon in the society. Women have been traditionally considered as prey to male chauvinism and aggression from the time immemorial. A typical Indian girl from a middle-class or affluent family is raised chaperoned and over-protected. After independence, in last few decades, guardians as well as society have come forward in extension of education for girls. Various other reforms have been evolved at State and national levels. Girls have crossed the closed doors and performed well in every walk of life. They have become more strengthened to protest against the attitude and act of violence of their male counterparts. Although rarely does she learn how to protect herself or react in a situation where she is attacked.

At this backdrop the school going girl students are the worst sufferers and they have every chance of being affected. Sometimes, the girls have to travel a long way to reach a Secondary or Higher Secondary school either on foot or by bicycle, sometimes even alone. The parents habitually stoop to this apprehension and restrain the girls' children to attend schools regularly, which

often results in chances of drop outs and discontinuation of their education & aspiration.

In this context, self defence training programme for girls studying in elementary as well as higher classes is must, so that they can build up in themselves certain self defence skills including life skill for self protection and self-development. Self Defence Training to girls in government institutions helps them become psychologically, intellectually, physically and spiritually strong to protect themselves in time of distress. They are trained to leverage daily usable articles like keychains, dupattas etc. for their protection.

In erstwhile centrally sponsored schemes namely National Programme for Education of Girls at Elementary Level (NPEGEL), Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) and Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA), the training programme for self defence have been imparted to school girls at elementary as well as secondary level in some sectors. Such activities helped to instill confidence in girls as well as ensuring attendance and reducing absenteeism & drop outs.

Under "Samagra Shiksha" programme, which has been launched

on 1st April 2018, provision of self defence training for elementary (upto class VIII) as well as secondary (upto class X or XII) level have been made with unit cost @ Rs 3000/- per month (to be enhanced @ Rs 5000/- in next extension of SS scheme) for 3 months per school. Martial Arts training are imparted various techniques namely; Karate, Taekwondo, Wushu, Boxing (Mushti-yuddha), Silambam (Lathi-yuddha), Judo etc. There is also provision of self defence training to enrolled girls of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya sanctioned with unit cost @ Rs 10000/- per vidyalaya per annum.

Objective :-

- To reduce irregular attendance of girl students,
- To equip the girls with some life skills and defence skills so that they can avert any kind of untoward situation at least at the first instances,
- To spread a message to the violence-maker that girls are being ready for counter-defence and awareness is being developed among the girls in this regards,
- To make the Physical Education teacher of each school aware of these skills for future practice of them as a part of school curriculum.

Strategy :-

The broad aim of the programme is to extend the Martial Arts training to all girls studying in schools upto class XII.

The States have their own strategy and schedule for implementation of this programme. The states like Bihar has extended the programme through a 36-day training schedule

in schools by black belt master trainers. After completion of the training, the girls will be graded & certified stepwise in various types of belt through recognized Martial Arts institutions. Finally, after getting black belt, class XII pass-out girls will have option to engage themselves as master trainer in Martial Arts and become "Atmanirbhar".

In Telangana, the Physical Education Teachers (PET) of Government schools are trained by experts, who in turn train girls in their respective schools. It is a 3 month course during which 24 vital techniques are taught to the students studying in classes VI to X. These techniques are taught in 36 sessions thrice in a week.

In Jammu & Kashmir, basic techniques of Judo & Taekwondo have been provided to girls under "Beti Bachao Beti Padhao" programme. Earlier Army had also organized four week martial arts course for school girls in remote areas.

Expected Outcome :-

- Girls became physically robust & psychologically empowered and their self confidence increases,
- Increase in enrolment and retention because of increased awareness among community,
- Girls participation in school activities has increased traditional roles.

The Self defence training programmes to girls will pave the way to ensure secured atmosphere not only in schools & colleges but in every walk of life, which will be fruitful for all round development of the country in long run.

Methanol economy may create wonders

Methanol is a low-carbon, hydrogen-carrying fuel made from high-ash coal agricultural residue, CO₂ from thermal power plants, and natural gas. It is the best way for India to meet its commitment to COP 21. The 'Methanol Economy' programme of the NITI Aayog on implementation leads, to reduce India's oil import bill, greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, and the conversion of coal reserves and municipal solid waste into methanol. Despite having a slightly lower energy content than gasoline, methanol can be used in transportation (road, rail, and marine), energy (DG sets, boilers, process heating modules, tractors, and commercial vehicles), and retail cooking (replacing LPG kerosene and wood charcoal). Blending 15% methanol into gasoline can result in a 15% reduction in crude oil imports. Furthermore, this would reduce GHG emissions by 20% in terms of particulate matter, NO_x, and SO_x, improving urban air quality. Methanol Economy will also generate nearly 5 million jobs via methanol production/application and distribution services. Additionally, blending 20% DME (Di-methyl Ether, a methanol derivative) in LPG can save Rs 6000 crore per year. This will save the consumer between Rs 50 and Rs 100 per cylinder as per NITI Aayog speculation.

Whether it's long hours, grueling tasks or just the repetitive nature of a day-to-day routine, work can sometimes be something we have to do rather than something we want to do. But given that the average person will spend 90,000 hours at work over a lifetime it makes sense to try and enjoy it if you can. So what can you do to be happier at work and reduce stress? I was the lead scientist in a government project that looked at how our wellbeing and emotional resilience can change over a lifetime. As part of this project, the team, with help from think-tank the New Economics Foundation, identified several things that can reduce stress and enhance wellbeing and happiness all of which can be applied to the workplace. So what helps?

1. Be active

Exercise and other physical activities won't make your problems or stress disappear, but they will reduce their emotional intensity and give you mental space to sort out problems as well as keep you physically fit. Research shows time and

time again the positive benefits of exercise, so why not bookend your working day with some physical activity. Walking to and from work is a great way to create separation from the working day. If that's not possible you could get off the bus a stop early, make your lunchtimes active or maybe find an exercise class to do before you start work for the day.

2. Connect with people

If you examine most of the happiness scales, relationships with others come near the top of these lists. During the pandemic, many people found their wellbeing suffered due

to a lack of social contact. Indeed, a good support network of friends and family can minimise your work troubles and help you see things differently.

It's also worth getting to know your colleagues. The more you invest in your relationships at work, the more enjoyable you may find your day.

3. Learn new skills

Helping work colleagues and others in your life, can also enhance your self-esteem and give you a sense of purpose, which is essential to your wellbeing and contentment.

critical to your psychological and mental wellbeing and can provide you with new opportunities in terms of your career development. So try to keep learning take a course, develop some new skills or learn a new hobby, it all adds up.

Having things going on in your life outside of work is also important for your emotional and mental wellbeing. In the UK we work some of the longest hours in Europe, meaning we often don't spend enough time doing the things we really enjoy. Don't work excessive hours. And ensure you make time for socialising, exercise, along with activities you find fun.

4. Stay present

This is all about "being in the moment" rather than in the past or looking too far forward. Enjoy the present and you will appreciate it more. Indeed, there is plenty of research on the positive aspects of mindfulness and how it can help with mental health.

You don't have to sit down for hours meditating either. Being in the moment is more about bringing your brain back to the now. A more mindful approach to life is something you can practice at any time of the day, it's just about being aware, noticing your surroundings the sights, sounds, smells. You can do this while you're walking, in a

meeting or making a cup of tea.

5. Recognise the positives

Staying present also helps you to recognise the positives in your life allowing you to be a glass half full rather than a glass half empty person. Accept there are things at work or in life you can't change and concentrate on the things you have control over. Remind yourself to feel grateful for the positives in your life.

6. Avoid unhealthy habits

Given what we know about their long-term consequences, using excessive alcohol or coffee consumption or smoking as a coping strategy for work stress is ultimately likely to have a negative impact on your happiness, even if they seem to provide a quick pick-me-up.

7. Work smarter, not longer

Prioritise your workload during working hours and you will have more disposable time to do the things you enjoy. Accept that your in-tray will always be full, so concentrate on the important things first. The more you take control of your work life and get the balance you need, the more likely you will be happier at work. Indeed, given that in the UK stress-related illness accounts for nearly 60% of all long-term sickness you must prioritise your wellbeing and try to reduce work stress where possible.







Nitu, Saweety cruise into semis, assure India of medals

■ Women's Boxing World C'ships

New Delhi, Mar 22 (PTI):

Commonwealth Games champion Nitu Ghanghas (48kg) and the seasoned Saweety Boora (81kg) assured India of two medals at the ongoing Women's Boxing World Championships after reaching the semifinals here on Wednesday.

The first Indian to take the ring, 22-year-old Nitu notched a second-round RSC (referee stops contest) win over Madoka Wada of Japan in her quarterfinal bout to assure herself and India of at least a bronze medal. Saweety, playing her first bout of the tournament, lived up to her top seeding to dispatch 2018 bronze-medal winner Viktoriya Kebikova of Belarus 5-0 to confirm her second world championship medal. She had won the silver in 2014. Sakshi Choudhary (52kg) and last edition's bronze

medallist Manisha Moun (57kg), however, failed to reach the last-four stage.

While Sakshi lost to Yu Wu of China 0-5, Manisha was outplayed by a 1-4 margin by Amina Zidani of France. Nitu looked a bit tentative at first but as the seconds ticked, she gained confidence to go ahead and attack. Halfway through the first round, Nitu, the 2022 Strandja

Memorial gold medallist, moved forward and threw a combination of clean, accurate punches to force the referee to give Wada her first standing count. Another set of combination punches by Nitu in the second round compelled the referee to stop the contest and rule in the home boxer's favour. Nitu has won all her three bouts in the tournament so far by RSC verdicts. "I had to be careful and couldn't be aggressive because she (Wada) was also a southpaw like me, but then towards the end (of the contest) I thought I could attack," Nitu said after the bout. "The advantage of winning all my three bouts by RSC is that in the coming bouts, my opponents will be under pressure," she said.

Mohammed Siraj slips from top spot to third in ICC rankings for bowlers in ODIs

Dubai, Mar 22 (PTI):

Pacer Mohammed Siraj was on Wednesday dethroned from the top spot by Australia's Josh Hazlewood in the latest ICC rankings for ODI bowlers, as the Indian slipped to third place.

Another Australian pacer, Mitchell Starc, who impressed during the first two ODIs of the three-match series in India, also moved up to join Siraj at joint third. Siraj, who returned with impressive figures of 3/29 to help India win the first ODI against Australia, was expensive in the second ODI giving away 37 runs in three overs and consequently lost his position as the top-ranked bowler.

The right-arm pacer had coped the brunt of the attack by Mitchell Marsh and Travis Head during the second ODI in Visakhapatnam. Siraj, who has had a successful run across formats in recent past, was crowned as the world No. 1 bowler in ODIs in January this year. Starc claimed three wickets in Mumbai to stage

while his 5/53 in the second ODI in Visakhapatnam powered the visitors to a 10-wicket win. Hazlewood, who missed the entire tour of India consisting four Tests and three ODIs, became world No. 1 bowler in ODIs for the first time ever.

"Hazlewood, whose career-best second position was attained for the first time in June 2017 and which he had kept since August 2022, is No. 1 in ODIs for the first time," the ICC said.

Mohammad Shami, who produced a match-winning spell in Mumbai, also moved five spots up to reach 28th in the list.

KL Rahul's unbeaten 75, which helped India recover from a poor start and win the first ODI by five wickets, helped him move up three places to get to the 39th spot.

In the ODI ranking among batters, India's Shubman Gill — who made marginal progress — and Virat Kohli remained fifth and seventh respectively, while captain Rohit Sharma moved up one place to ninth.

Fleming to be Texas Super Kings coach

■ In Major League Cricket in US as CSK announces partnership

Dallas (US), Mar 22 (PTI): Former New Zealand captain Stephen Fleming will be the coach of Dallas-based Major League Cricket (MLC) club Texas Super Kings (TSK), which announced its partnership with IPL side Chennai Super Kings (CSK). Four-time IPL champions, CSK had recently said that they would make a "major announcement" with regard to their association with the new T20 tournament in the US. TSK said in a statement that CSK will bring "operational expertise" and help "Texas compete on the field". "The (Texas Super Kings) team will be led by coach Stephen Fleming. Fleming is a former captain of the New Zealand national cricket team and head coach of Indian Premier League team Chennai Super Kings. He played in the first-ever Twenty20 international to be staged as

2023 World Cup likely to start on Oct 5, final in Ahmedabad

New Delhi, Mar 22:

The 2023 ODI World Cup is likely to start on October 5 and end on November 19. BCCI, the host for the 10-team marquee event, has shortlisted at least a dozen venues, with the final scheduled to be at the world's largest cricket stadium in Ahmedabad.

Ahmedabad aside, the shortlist comprises Bengaluru, Chennai, Delhi, Dharamsala, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Lucknow, Indore, Rajkot and Mumbai. In all the tournament will comprise 48 matches including three knockouts across the 46-day period.

The title bout aside, the BCCI has not specified venues for any games as yet, or the two or three cities where teams will play the warm-ups. The delay in finalising the venues is due to the complications posed by the monsoon season receding at different points in different parts of India. Usually the ICC announces World

Cup schedules at least a year in advance, but this time it has also been waiting for the BCCI to get the necessary clearances from the Indian government. This includes two key issues: getting a tax exemption for the tournament, and visa clearance for the Pakistan team, which has not played in India except at ICC events since early 2013.

At the ICC's quarterly meetings last weekend, held in Dubai, the BCCI is learned to have assured the global body that visas for the Pakistan contingent will be cleared by the Indian government.

As for the tax exemption issue, the BCCI is expected to update the ICC soon on the exact position of the Indian government. The tax exemption has been part of the host's agreement with the ICC in 2014, when three men's events were awarded to India: the 2016 T20 World Cup, the 2018 Champions Trophy (later changed to 2021 T20 World Cup, which was moved to the UAE and Oman due to the pandemic) and the 2023 ODI World Cup. As per the agreement, the BCCI was "obligated" to help the ICC (and all its commercial partners involved in the

Delhi Capitals, co-owned by GMR Group, are partnering with Seattle Orcas to "help build and operate a world-class cricket team", while Mumbai Indians have joined the US cricket revolution by acquiring the New York franchise.

The Treesa-Gayatri duo lost to second-seeded Indonesian pair of Apriyanti Rahayu and Siti Fadia Silva 14-21, 14-21 in 41 minutes in the opening

round on Tuesday night.

Treesa and Gayatri had made a sensational run in the All England Championships women's doubles last week before losing in the semifinals.

Meanwhile, Malvika Bansod qualified for the main draw of the women's singles after beating USA's Lauren Lam 21-17, 21-7 in the qualifying round.

New IPL Rule: Captains allowed to name playing XI after toss



New Delhi, Mar 22 (PTI): The captains of IPL teams can name their playing eleven after the toss instead of handing over team sheets before the spin of coin, stated the new playing conditions issued by the BCCI. According to playing conditions clause 1.2.1: "Each captain shall nominate 11 players plus a maximum of 5 substitute fielders in writing to the IPL Match Referee after the toss."

"Other than set out in Clause 1.2.9 no player (member of the playing eleven) may be changed after the nomination and prior to the start of play without the consent of the opposing captain."

This effectively means that after the toss, if a skipper feels that he needs to change his eleven as per demands of the situation, he is free to do that till the match starts.

New Delhi, Mar 22 (PTI):

As many as 11.49 crore households now have tap water connections and over 1.53 lakh villages have potable water supply as the government doubles down on its efforts to make drinking water available to all, according to latest official data.

The data as of March 21 showed massive jumps in piped water supply to schools, anganwadi centres and aspirational districts after the government allocated Rs 70,000 crore for the purpose in

the current financial year ending March 31, (2022-23). This was 12 times more than the Rs 5,500 crore allotted in 2018-19. The statistics came on a day that is marked as World Water Day with the UN World Water Development Report 2023 saying 26 per cent of the world's population do not have access to safe drinking water and 46 per cent lack access to basic sanitation.

The government is implementing various schemes including Jal Jeevan Mission, Atal Bhujal Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee

Yojana, Namami Gange and National Aquifer Mapping and Managing programme for water conservation and for raising the level of ground water.

Under Jal Jeevan Mission that targets to make provision of potable tap water supply to every rural household at the service level of 55 litre per capita per day by 2024, over 11.49 crore households have been provided tap water connections and over 1.53 villages have become Har Ghar Jal as of March 21, according to the data. Piped water supply to anganwadi centres has in-

creased 37 times to 9.34 lakh in less than three years. Similarly, piped water supply to schools has jumped 18 times to 9.02 lakh, and six times to aspirational districts.

Atal Bhujal Yojana, with an outlay of Rs 6,000 crore, is being implemented in 8,220 water-stressed gram panchayats in 80 districts of seven states of Haryana, Gujarat, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh for a period of 5 years for sustainable groundwater management. He cited the example of the TRISHNA mission, designed to observe the earth's surface in the thermal infrared domain, which has been developed by ISRO and its French counterpart CNES. "We are also discussing a possible mission to the moon with JASA (Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency) where the land rover will be built by them and they will launch it using a Japanese rocket," said Somanath, who is also Secretary of the Department of Space.
