Heritage Site tag

Bhubaneswar: Known as an Ayurvedic paradise with abundant flora and fauna, the Gandhamardan hills spread over in Bolangir-Bargarh districts, has now been designated a Biodiversity Heritage Site (BHS). Odisha's Forest, Environment and Climate Change Department which has issued a notification to this effect, said the Gandhamardan hill, spread over nearly 190 square kms, will now have the 'biodiversity heritage site' tag under the Odisha Biodiversity Rules - 2012 to protect its fragile ecosystem.

Appointment

New Delhi: The BJP on Thursday named four new state presidents, including Lok Sabha MP C P Joshi in Rajasthan and OBC leader and MLC Samrat Choudhary in Bihar, as the party moves to tone up its organisational machinery with an eye on consolidating its support base in the run up to crucial state and national polls. BJP president J P Nadda also appointed Manmohan Samal, a former state minister, as the head of the party's Odisha unit, while Delhi working president Virendra Sachdeva was elevated as its chief.

Ranchi: Six policemen have been suspended and an FIR lodged was against them following the death of an infant, who was allegedly crushed under police boots during a raid in Jharkhand's Giridih district, an official said on Thursday. The policemen were suspended after an initial inquiry, and the FIR was registered against them based on a complaint by the newborn's family members, he said.

MODI SURNAME REMARKS CASE

Court convicts Rahul Gandhi

■ **Cites his earlier apology in SC**

Surat, Mar 23 (PTI):

A court in Surat in Gujarat on Thursday sentenced Congress leader Rahul Gandhi to two years in jail in a 2019 criminal defamation case filed against him over his "why all thieves have Modi surname" remarks.

Gandhi, who was present in the court when the verdict was pronounced, reacted later by quoting Mahatma Gandhi in a tweet in Hindi about truth and non-violence.

The court of Chief Judicial Magistrate HH Varma, which held Gandhi guilty under Indian Penal Code sections 499 and 500, also granted him bail and suspended the sentence for 30 days to allow him to appeal in a higher court, the Congress leader's lawyer Babu Mangukiya said.

As per the representation of the

'You will be in more trouble'

The Bharatiya Janata Party on Thursday asserted that the law will take its course if Rahul Gandhi abuses people and slammed the Congress over its criticism of his conviction in a defamation case, asking whether the opposition party wants "complete freedom" for him to "abuse" others. Addressing a press conference, BJP leader and former law minister Ravi Shankar Prasad also cautioned Gandhi against making defamatory remarks, saying the Congress leader will find himself facing "more troubles" if he doesn't refrain from doing so.

Will appeal: Cong

The Congress said Gandhi will file an appeal against the Gujarat court verdict, with a host of its leaders, including party president Mallikarjun Kharge and general secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, speaking out angrily on the matter. In his first reaction to the Surat court's verdict, Gandhi quoted Mahatma Gandhi in a tweet in Hindi about truth and non-violence. "My religion is based on truth and non-violence. Truth is my God, non-violence the means to get it. -- Mahatma Gandhi," the Congress leader tweeted.

'BJP leaders against Gandhis'

Raipur: Reacting to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's conviction in a criminal defamation case regarding his "Modi surname" remark, Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Thursday spoke of the barbs such as "Mir Jafar" used by Bharatiya Janata Party leaders for Gandhi. Talking to reporters on the Assembly premises here, he also accused the BJP-led Centre of attempting to "threaten" and "suppress" constitutional institutions. "The court's decision is before everyone and bail has also been granted. The fight will continue further," Baghel said.

"And if the accused is given less punishment, then it sends a wrong message to the public and the purpose of defamation is not fulfilled and anybody will easily slander someone," the court observed.

The court also said the Supreme Court had in the past asked the accused to

remain alert in the future after he apologised in a case (SLP 46/2018) for his "chowkidar chor hai" remark.

"Despite the Supreme Court alerting the accused, there appears to be no change in his conduct. The accused is a MP, and addressing the public as an MP is serious because it makes a wide impact on the public," it said.

'Ghazwa-e-Hind' Terror Module Case

NIA searches locations in 3 states

New Delhi, Mar 23 (PTI):

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Thursday carried out raids in three states as part of its probe into the 'Ghazwa-e-Hind' terror module that was being "operated and controlled" from Pakistan.

Marghoob Ahmad Danish alias Tahir, administrator of a WhatsApp Group 'Ghazwa-e-Hind', launched by a Pakistani national, was arrested in the case, the NIA said. The agency had filed a chargesheet against him in January.

Danish, the agency said, had created 'Ghazwa-e-Hind' groups on different social media platforms, including WhatsApp, Telegram and BiP. The case stems from a

July 2022 FIR registered by the Bihar Police at the Phulwari Sharif police station in Patna against members of the 'Ghazwa-e-Hind' module that was being "operated and controlled" from Pakistan.

Personal info of 16.8 cr citizens hacked

New Delhi, Mar 23:

A massive data breach that has implications for national security was unearthed by the Cyberabad Police in Hyderabad, who arrested seven people of a gang allegedly involved in the theft and sale of sensitive data of the government and important organisations, including details of defence personnel as well as the personal and confidential data of about 16.8 crore citizens.

The accused persons were found selling more than 140 different categories of information, which include sensitive information such as details of defence personnel and the mobile numbers of citizens and NEET students, among others, Cyberabad Police Commissioner M Stephen Raveendra told reporters on Thursday. Seven data brokers were arrested from Delhi, the police said, adding that the accused had been operating through three companies (call centres) in Noida and other places. So far it has been found that the accused sold data to at least 100 fraudsters. Investigations are still on, police said. Sensitive data of defence personnel containing their ranks, email ids, place of posting, etc was found available with the accused. Commissioner Raveendra said. "This will have serious national security implications. The data of defence and government employees can be used for espionage; to

impersonate them and commit serious offences that may jeopardise national security. We are in the process of finding out how this data got leaked and who are the insiders who are doing it," he added.

The accused were also found selling information in categories such as energy and power sector, PAN card data, government employees, gas and petroleum, NHIs (high net-worth individuals), demat accounts, student databases, data of people who have applied for loans and insurance, and credit card and debit card holders (of private banks), WhatsApp users, Facebook users, IT organisation employees, frequent flyers etc.

Ruckus in Odisha Assly over Mahanadi water row with Chh'garh

Bhubaneswar, Mar 23 (PTI):

The Odisha Assembly was adjourned till 4 pm on Thursday amid ruckus over the demand of Opposition BJP and Congress MLAs for a discussion on the Mahanadi water row with Chhattisgarh through a special motion.

BJD leaders had on multiple occasions alleged that the construction of check dams on the upper catchment area by the previous BJP government in Chhattisgarh have caused problems for Odisha, "as the neighbouring state releases excess water during monsoons, leading to floods, and stops water flow in the summers, resulting

in hardship for people" The issue was raised in the Assembly as soon as the House assembled for the Question Hour.

Congress MLAs initially trooped into the Well of the Assembly while the BJP legislators later joined in pitching for a discussion relating to the Mahanadi water row through a special motion by suspending the Question Hour. Though Speaker B K Arukha urged the agitating members to return to their seats, it went unheeded.

The Speaker also said that a discussion through a special motion could not be conducted in the House unless the Appropriation Bill was passed.

'Booster jab can protect future Covid strains'

New Delhi, Mar 23 (PTI):

The Covid vaccines in use in India are providing cover for the original Wuhan strain but if the need for another booster dose is felt as new variants emerge, it should be able to provide protection against all circulating as well as future strains, according to former AIIMS director Randeep Guleria.

During an interview to PTI, he stressed on the need for two data sets - first to ascertain whether the degree of immunity is waning and secondly if the vaccines need to be tweaked when asked if it is time for another precaution dose almost a year after the first one amid

the recent uptick in Covid cases. "Currently the vaccines that we have in India are covering for what was originally the Wuhan strain. After that we had so many variants. And therefore if we have to have a new vaccine, it should provide cover for the circulating strains like we do for influenza," he said.

'Amritpal was building private militia'

Chandigarh, Mar 23 (PTI):

Fugitive radical preacher and Khalistan sympathiser Amritpal Singh had been targeting drug addicts and rogue ex-servicemen to help him build a gang that could be easily transformed into a terrorist outfit, officials here said on Thursday.

Giving details of his journey and plans that he was likely to execute at the best of Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), they said Amritpal Singh, upon his return from Dubai, started a drug de-addiction centre at his village Jallupur Kehra in Punjab's



Amritsar district.

In a simultaneous operation, he along with his men started looking for ex-servicemen who had been retired from the Army for bad behaviour so that they could be used for imparting arms training, the officials said.

Immediately after his return last year and he taking over the 'Waris Punjab De'

outfit after the death of actor-activist Deep Sidhu, Amritpal Singh had a cover of two private security officers, and by early this year, the number had gone up to 16. The surprising part was that seven of his personal security officers were youngsters, who had joined his drug de-addiction centre for rehabilitation, the officials said, adding that during their stay there for training they had been imparted training.

The youngsters, admitted at the de-addiction centre, were brainwashed and pushed towards gun culture and also incited to choose the path of slain terrorist Dilawar Singh, who blew himself up and killed former Punjab chief minister Beant Singh, they said.

This sports facility is being brought up in the ground that was lying vacant since long. Bhilai Nagar MLA Devendra Yadav reached the spot on Thursday morning to inspect the construction work being carried out to give shape to the stadium.

During the inspection, Devendra took minute took details from the engi-

neers and concerned contractors of the corporation who were also present. MLA gave strict instructions to them to pay special attention to the quality of construction work.

Any kind of negligence will not be tolerated and he insisted to complete the work in the stipulated time frame mentioned under the terms of the tender. There should not be any delay he stated. During the inspection Hudco councilor Siju Anthony, block president Dhaneshwari Sahu, Kunti Sahu, RBK Rao and ward residents were present.

Bore well digging banned till June 30

Bhilai, Mar 23: For the purpose of ensuring the availability of drinking water in summer season, Durg district has been declared as a water scarcity area till June 30 by Collector Pushpendra Kumar Meena. Till June 30, without the prior permission of the competent authority, new tube wells cannot be dug for drinking water or for any purpose other than drinking water.

But government/semi-government/urban bodies will not require permission for digging tube wells in the area coming under their jurisdiction for drinking water. But they have to follow certain prescribed rules.

An authorized officer has also been appointed to grant

permission after receiving the report from the Public Health Engineering/ Urban Body/ Tehsil in the concerned area. Additional District Magistrate (Durg) has been appointed as the authorized officer for the area coming under the entire Durg Municipal Corporation.

Similarly, the Sub-Divisional Officer (Revenue) Durg has

been appointed as the authorized officer for the area coming under the Revenue Sub-Division Durg Rural Area. Sub-Divisional Magistrate (Chhawani) Bhilai has been appointed for the area coming under Revenue Subdivision Chhawani Bhilai.

Sub-Divisional Officer (Revenue) Dhamda has been appointed for the area coming under Revenue Sub-division Dhamda. Sub-Divisional Officer (Revenue) Patan has been appointed for the area coming under Revenue Subdivision Patan. Sub-Divisional Officer (Revenue) Bhilai 3 has been appointed for the area coming under Revenue Division Bhilai 3. Registered bore-well agency is mandatory for bore-well digging or repair works.

CM orders probe into rally

Allegedly in support of pro-Khalistan preacher Amritpal Singh

Raipur, Mar 23:

Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Thursday said police will probe a rally held in capital Raipur a day earlier allegedly in support of wanted pro-Khalistan preacher Amritpal Singh.

Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel told the Assembly that anti-national activities would not be tolerated in the state and asked police to examine video footage of the rally and take action accordingly.

Raising the issue during Zero Hour, the BJP alleged the law and order situation in the state was deteriorating under Baghel, with the saffron party's MLAs Ajay Chandrakar and Brijmohan Agrawal also targeting police for intelligence failure over the rally being held.

The BJP legislators sought a discussion in the House on the law and

order situation, while state Parliamentary Affairs Minister Ravindra Choubey countered them asserting anyone indulging in anti-national activities will not be spared.

After the Chair rejected the opposition's demand for a discussion, BJP members started sloganning leading to the adjournment of proceedings for five minutes.

After the proceedings resumed, BJP legislators again raised the issue following which minister Choubey said the CM will give a statement on the rally later in the House.

Meanwhile, Congress MLA Kuldeep Juneja, who hails from the Sikh community, denied the rally was taken out in support of Khalistan.

Later, delivering his statement in the House, the CM said around 30-35 people took out a foot march raising slogans



from Telibanda area (on Wednesday) and he has directed police to examine the video footage of it.

Action will be taken if anyone is found raising anti-national slogans in the footage, the CM added.

As far as the Sikh community is concerned, their sacrifices for the country cannot be forgotten but anti-national activities will not be allowed to take place, Baghel asserted.

Subsequently, BJP MLA Ajay Chandrakar said the CM's statement should be considered as a resolution

and must be passed in the House with voice vote.

Chandrakar's colleague Brijmohan Agrawal said the rally had maligned the image of Chhattisgarh.

Speaker Charandas Mahant said he had allowed the statement as a resolution in the House.

On Wednesday, a rally was taken out allegedly in support of Amritpal Singh, after which police served notice to the organisers. They have been asked to furnish their replies at Civil Lines police station on Thursday.

Diler Singh, a member of Baba Budha Saheb Committee, who was part of the rally, had told media persons Amritpal Singh was innocent and accused the Punjab government of falsely implicating him.

Diler Singh had claimed Amritpal Singh was fighting against addiction and was uniting youth through religion.

However, a video of

Diler Singh, which was shared by police on Thursday, showed him claiming he had been misrepresented and that some persons were spreading propaganda that the rally was taken out in support of Khalistan.

He said the rally was held against the "illegal" action being taken against Sikhs in Punjab.

"We live in Chhattisgarh and love the people of Chhattisgarh. We respect every religion. We don't want Khalistan and have nothing to do with it. We only talk about Sikhism and we raise our voice for Sikhs. It is our responsibility and right to raise the issue of our community," he added.

Police action began in Punjab last week against radical preacher Amritpal Singh, who heads 'Waaris Punjab De' organisation, leading to several arrests, though he continues to remain elusive.

State Assembly passes bill to raise pension, travel allowance of former MLAs

Raipur, Mar 22:

The Chhattisgarh Assembly on Wednesday passed an amendment bill that proposed to increase the pension and travel allowance of former legislators.

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Ravindra Choubey had tabled the Chhattisgarh Legislative Assembly Members Salary, Allowance and Pension (Amendment) Bill 2023 on Monday, which was taken up for discussion on Wednesday.

That bill also proposes to provide telephone and orderly allowances to former MLAs. It was passed with a voice vote.

According to the bill, the pension of former MLAs will be increased from Rs 35,000 to Rs 58,300.

Apart from this, every former legislator will also be entitled to get an additional pension of Rs 1,000 per month for every one year after his/her first tenure of membership (excess tenure more than five years), the bill stated. As per the bill, each incumbent mem-

ber will be entitled to get an allowance of Rs 10 lakh per year for railway/air travel instead of the existing Rs 8 lakh per year. Similarly, this allowance will be increased from Rs 4 lakh per year to Rs 5 lakh per year for former MLAs, it said.

Besides this, former MLAs will be entitled to get telephone allowance and orderly allowance of Rs 10,000 and Rs 15,000 respectively, it stated.

According to officials, earlier there was no provision of telephone and orderly allowances for former legislators.

The increase in pension and allowances is likely to put an additional annual burden of around Rs 16.96 crore on the state exchequer, they said.

The state Assembly had passed bills to hike the salaries of the chief minister, speaker, ministers and MLAs in July last year, and the move had caused an annual burden of Rs 6.81 crore to the state exchequer.

The Chhattisgarh Legislative Assembly has 90 members.

'T'gana govt not to send crop loss report to Centre'

Hyderabad, Mar 23 (PTI):

The Telangana government will not send any report to the Centre on crop damage caused by recent unseasonal rains, in protest against the Central government's unhelpful attitude towards reports sent earlier, Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao said on Thursday, even as he announced financial assistance of Rs 10,000 per acre for farmers. Rao inspected the crops damaged due to recent unseasonal showers and hailstorms in Khammam, Mahabubabad and other districts.

Speaking to reporters in Khammam district, the CM alleged that the present policies of the Centre were not helpful to farmers in times of crop losses and that they benefited insurance companies instead. "The previous Central governments were like that, and (with) the present Central government, it is like (the mes-

sage is) falling on deaf ears. Not much use telling them (about losses to farmers)," he said.

Rao said the country requires a 'new integrated agriculture policy'. He disapproved of the present system whereby the state government had to report to the Centre about crop losses and a Central team would then visit and assess the damage, following

which financial assistance is announced after six months. The incumbent NDA government's attitude is such that they are only interested in politics and not bothered about farmers, he alleged. "So, we don't intend to send a report to the Centre, as a protest. Because nothing was given on the basis (of reports) sent earlier," he said.

Names Gajanan Kirtikar as parliamentary party leader

New Delhi, Mar 23 (PTI): Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena has sacked Sanjay Raut as the leader of its parliamentary party and appointed Lok Sabha MP Gajanan Kirtikar as his successor.

In a letter to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla and Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar, Shinde, who is chief leader of the Shiv Sena, said Kirtikar has been appointed as the leader of the Shiv Sena Parliamentary Party. Shiv Sena leaders on Thursday

felicitated Kirtikar at the parliamentary party office located on the third floor of the Parliament building. Of the 18 Shiv Sena members in the Lok Sabha, four have their loyalties with Uddhav Thackeray, who lost control of the party to Shinde.

Shinde had split the Shiv Sena last year accusing Thackeray of compromising with the core ideals of the party and joining hands with arch rivals Congress and NCP to form the government in Maharashtra. Last month, the Election Commission recognised the Shinde-led faction as the real Shiv Sena and allocated the name and the poll symbol to it.

Gadkari inaugurates, lays foundation stone for nine projects

In Jamshedpur

Ranchi, Mar 23 (PTI): Union Minister Nitin Gadkari on Thursday inaugurated and laid foundation stones for nine projects in Jharkhand's Jamshedpur, which entailed an estimated investment of Rs 3,378 crore.

The road transport and highways minister is scheduled to launch 31 projects in all, during the day, worth Rs 13,296 crore.

Of these, 21 pertain to state capital Ranchi, incurring an expense of Rs 9,453 crore. Noting that Jharkhand has made significant contributions to ensure the country's development, Gadkari said the new highway projects will drive growth and progress

in the state. A 44-km stretch between Jamshedpur and Mahulta on National Highway-33, constructed at a cost of Rs 465 crore, was among the projects unveiled in the Steel City. A senior National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) official said that this stretch will provide Delhi-Kolkata and Mumbai-Kolkata connectivity via Jamshedpur, significantly reducing travel time between the destinations.

The project will also drive commercial development in the Jharkhand, West Bengal and Odisha, he stated. Apart from these, Gadkari laid foundation stone for a four-lane double-decker elevated corridor on NH-33, connecting Kali Mandi, Dimna Chowk and Baliguma in Jamshedpur, at an estimated cost of Rs 1,876 crore, thus reducing traffic burden on the Steel City. As part of a Bharatmala package, a four-lane access control road will be constructed on Raipur-Dhanbad Economic Corridor of NH-320, the NHAI official said.

"After completion of the project, Raipur will be commercially connected to Dhanbad and travel time between Ranchi and Bokaro will reduce drastically, leading to social and industrial development of both the states," the official added.

Sri Lanka govt accuses opposition of trying to undermine IMF bailout programme

Colombo, Mar 23 (PTI):

Sri Lankan government on Thursday accused the opposition of trying to undermine the crucial IMF bailout programme by holding a meeting with the Colombo-based Ambassadors and seeking their assistance in getting the global lender to impose tougher conditions with respect to the delayed local polls.

The accusation came days after the International Monetary Fund approved a USD 2.9 billion bailout programme to help the debt-ridden country overcome its economic crisis and catalyse financial support from other development partners.

Speaking in parliament, Chief

Government Whip and Minister of Urban Development Prasanna Ranatunga claimed that the opposition at a secret meeting with foreign diplomats called for stringent conditions to be applied when the IMF starts releasing the disbursements.

"The opposition has asked the countries to delay the IMF facility or put stringent conditions," he said. "Don't do this at a time when people are out on the streets." The main opposition - the Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) - defended the meeting with the diplomats, saying they met to inform them about the government's action to postpone the local council elections.

denied that it was the intention of the opposition to use internal matters to curtail the assistance needed by the country.

The opposition sources said ambassadors or senior diplomats from the US and India were also present at the meeting.

Sri Lanka's election commission earlier this month announced April 25 as the new date for the local elections. The local body polls for 340 councils scheduled for March 9 were postponed due to a plethora of reasons linked to the current economic crisis.

The election to appoint new administrations to 340 local councils for a four-year term has been postponed since March last year

due to the ongoing economic crisis. The SJB alleged that President Ranil Wickremesinghe was bearing pressure as the minister of finance to block the money required for the poll as he feared losing the poll.

The ruling Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna won the majority of councils in the last election held in 2018. It has suffered major splits since the economic crisis. Sri Lanka was hit by an unprecedented financial crisis in 2022, the worst since its independence from Britain in 1948, due to a severe paucity of foreign exchange reserves, sparking political turmoil in the country which led to the ouster of the all-powerful Rajapaksa family.

China criticises possible US plan to force TikTok sale

Beijing, Mar 23 (AP):

China's government said on Thursday it would oppose possible US plans to force TikTok's Chinese owner to sell the short-video service as a security risk and warned such a move would hurt investor confidence in the United States.

Governments are worried TikTok's owner, ByteDance, might give browsing history or other data about users to China's government or promote propaganda and disinformation. The Wall Street Journal reported US authorities were considering banning TikTok ban if ByteDance doesn't sell the company.

"If the news is true, China will resolutely oppose it," said a Ministry of Commerce spokeswoman, Shu Jueting. She gave no indication what Beijing might do.

A forced sale "would seriously damage investors from multiple countries including China" and hurt "confidence to invest

in the United States", Shu said. TikTok is one focus of conflicts between China and other governments over technology and security that are disrupting processor chip, smartphone and other industries. Shu's comments on Thursday came hours

before the CEO of TikTok, Shou Zi Chew, is due to make a high-profile appearance on Thursday before a US Congressional committee to make the case for why the hugely popular video-sharing app shouldn't be banned.

American lawmakers

have called for a ban on TikTok over national security concerns, alleging that the app could be used to spy on US users. Chew is expected to tell the US House Committee on Energy and Commerce that TikTok prioritizes the safety of its young

users and deny allegations that the app is a national security risk, according to his prepared remarks released ahead of the hearing.

The United States, Britain and New Zealand's parliament have banned use of TikTok on government-issued phones. India has banned TikTok and dozens of other Chinese apps, including the WeChat message service, on security and privacy grounds.

On Thursday, the Norwegian parliament followed suit and banned TikTok and messaging app Telegram on devices with access to the assembly's systems with immediate effect, the Norwegian news agency NTB said.

Telegram is a messaging app founded by Russian-born brothers Pavel and Nikolai Durov. The loosely moderated platform is broadly popular in Ukraine, Eastern Europe and used by many conservatives in the United States.

Anger at Macron mounts as French unions hold new protests

Paris, Mar 23 (AP):

Labour strikes upended travel in France on Thursday as French labour unions held their first mass demonstrations since President Emmanuel Macron inflamed public anger by forcing a higher retirement age through parliament without a vote.

Protesters blockaded train stations, Charles de Gaulle Airport in Paris and refineries. High-speed and regional trains, the Paris metro and public transportation systems in other major cities were disrupted. About 30 per cent of flights at Paris Orly Airport were canceled.

Ensuring a dignified life for persons with disabilities

Efforts should be made to ensure a dignified life for persons with disabilities. However, our education system presents a significant challenge in achieving this goal. Inclusion of children with mild to moderate disabilities in regular schools remains a major challenge due to several factors. The availability of special schools, access to schools, trained teachers, and educational materials for the disabled are all issues that need to be addressed. Moreover, reservations for the disabled in higher educational institutions have not been met in many cases, which limits their opportunities to pursue higher education. Although many adults with disabilities are capable of productive work, their employment rates are much lower than the general population. This situation is exacerbated in the private sector, where very few people with disabilities are employed. To ensure a dignified life for persons with disabilities, it is essential to overcome the challenges in education and employment. This can be achieved by creating a more inclusive education system that caters to the needs of disabled children, providing equal opportunities for higher education, and increasing employment opportunities for adults with disabilities. By working towards these goals, we can create a more just and equitable society for all.

As per the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, "Person with Disability" means a person with a long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairment who, with barriers, may interfere with, interact with, or participate in their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others. Today there are crores of people with disabilities in India. The 2011 census pegs us at 26.8 million, which is 2.21 per cent of India's total population. But activists, academics and world bodies such as the WHO estimate it to be between 40 and 80 million. Article 41 of the Directive Principles of State Policy states that the State shall, within its economic limits, make effective provision for securing the right to work, education and public assistance in cases of unemployment, old age, sickness and disablement. The subject of 'Relief to the disabled and unemployed' is specified in the State List of the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution.

It becomes the duty of the Centre, States and Union Territories to take up this matter. It is also important to ensure that all government buses are disabled friendly as per the relevant guidelines. Disability is defined based on an

evolving and dynamic concept. The types of disabilities have been increased from 7 to 21. The Act covers a range of disabilities including mental illness, autism, spectrum disorders, cerebral palsy, muscular dystrophy, chronic neurological conditions, speech and language disabilities, thalassemia, haemophilia, sickle cell disease, deafness, blindness, acid attack victims and Parkinson's disease which were largely ignored in the first act. In addition, the Government has been authorized to notify any other category of specified disability. It increases the quantum of reservation for people with disabilities from 3% to 4% in government jobs and from 3% to 5% in higher education institutions. Every child with benchmark disability between the age of 6 to 18 years shall have the right to free education. Government funded educational institutions as well as government recognized institutions have to provide inclusive education. With the Accessible India Campaign, emphasis has been laid on ensuring accessibility in public buildings within stipulated time frame.

The Chief Commissioner and State Commissioners for Persons with Disabilities will act as regulatory bodies and grievance redressal agencies to monitor the implementation of the Act.

A separate national and state fund was created to provide financial assistance to persons with disabilities. Accessible India Campaign, a nationwide flagship campaign to create accessible environment for PWDs and achieve universal access to enable persons with disabilities to access equal opportunities and live independently and fully in all aspects of life in an inclusive society. Will be able to participate. The campaign aims to enhance the reach of the built environment, transport system and information and communication ecosystem. Under the Deen Dayal Handicapped Rehabilitation Scheme, financial assistance is provided to NGOs for providing various services to persons with disabilities, such as special schools, vocational training centres, community based rehabilitation, preschool and early intervention etc.

Assistance to persons with disabilities for purchase/fitting of assistive devices: The scheme aims to help persons with disabilities by bringing suitable, durable, scientifically made, modern, standard aids and appliances within their reach. The objective of the scheme is to enhance the opportunities for students with disabilities to pursue higher education. Under the scheme, 200 fellowships are given per year to students with disabilities. The National Trust has schemes for the welfare of persons with autism, cerebral palsy, mental retardation and multiple disabilities. A large number of disabilities are preventable, including those resulting from medical issues during birth, maternal conditions, malnutrition, as well as those resulting from accidents and injuries.

However, the health sector has failed to respond actively to disability, especially in rural India, besides lack of affordable access to proper health care, aids and appliances, and poorly trained health workers in rehabilitation centers is another concern subject to. Our education system is not inclusive. Inclusion of children with mild to moderate disabilities in regular schools remains a major challenge. There should be proper teacher training to meet the needs of children with disabilities and facilitate their inclusion in regular schools. Also there should be more special schools and ensure educational material for children with disabilities. Safety measures should be taken like road safety, safety in residential areas, public transport system etc. Also, it should be made legally binding to make buildings disabled friendly. More budgetary allocation for welfare of disabled. There should be a disability budget on the lines of gender budget. Proper implementation of the schemes should be ensured. There should be proper monitoring mechanism and counting of public money.

Reluctance to report a disability as a disability is considered a stigma in many places/societies. Poor implementation of policies and plans hinders the inclusion of persons with disabilities. Though various Acts and schemes have been laid down with the aim of empowering the disabled, they face many challenges in their implementation.

Preventive health programs need to be strengthened and all children should be screened at an early age. Kerala has already started an early prevention programme. The Comprehensive Newborn Screening (CNS) program seeks to identify deficiencies early in infants and reduce the state's disability burden. People with disabilities need to be better integrated into the society by overcoming stigma. Awareness campaigns should be conducted to educate and sensitize people about different types of disabilities. Success stories can be displayed. There is a need to empower adults with disabilities with employable skills. The private sector needs to be encouraged to employ them. There is a need to improve the measurement of disability to better understand the scale of disability in India. There is a need to prepare state wise strategy on education for children with special needs.

There should be proper teacher training to meet the needs of children with disabilities and facilitate their inclusion in regular schools. Also there should be more special schools and ensure educational material for children with disabilities. Safety measures should be taken like road safety, safety in residential areas, public transport system etc. Also, it should be made legally binding to make buildings disabled friendly. Women entrepreneurship, a key pillar for India at G20

Promoting women's entrepreneurship is among India's most important growth and equality priorities. It is a powerful vehicle that can speed up India's journey of becoming a \$5-trillion economy. Moreover, it is one of the most significant factors that will help raise household incomes, alleviate poverty, and help us achieve the 2030 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), especially SDG-5 on gender equality. India's promotion of nari shakti is reflected in various government initiatives. The National Rural Livelihood Mission supports rural women's entrepreneurship, with over 80 million women participating in 7.5 million self-help groups. The Mudra scheme enables access to finance and the GeM portal reserves 3% of all government procurement for women entrepreneurs.

Research by Niti Aayog indicates

that women's entrepreneurship needs support to make them sustainable and autonomous and bring them into the formal sector. The employment-generating capacities of these enterprises are well-documented and create collateral gains for the society and economy. Under its G20 presidency, India has identified eight priority areas, including inter alia women-led development and public digital infrastructure. In addition, the G20 Alliance for the Empowerment and Progression of Women's Economic Representation (G20 EMPOWER), led by the ministry of women and child development, aims to shift the narrative from women's development to women-led development. Women entrepreneurs are at the heart of this shift, leading G20 EMPOWER. We must transform challenges into opportunities and accelerate the shift towards greater inclusion of women in the workforce and

amenities, and enhancing participation in the labour force in public and private sectors. Three, work towards education that facilitates women's representation in decision-making roles. The Women Entrepreneurship Platform (WEP) is a key conduit to bridge the knowledge gap: As Indian women and girls make rapid strides and transition from the education system into the world of work, India is creating a strong entrepreneurship pathway for an additional 55 million women who could enter the workforce by 2030. Announced at the Global Entrepreneurship Summit 2017, the ideation and incubation of WEP happened at Niti Aayog. Today, it is a shining example of a robust public-private partnership, providing multi-sectoral support to women entrepreneurs. It is building the pipeline of women entrepreneurs through awareness, training, skilling, access to finance and marketing needs.

WEP has also emerged as a thought leader by producing data that help better understand women's entrepreneurship needs with a sharp focus on leadership and mental health. Also planned is an emphasis on technology, lowering barriers to allow women to avail multiple efficiencies without mandating a traditional brick-and-mortar approach to optimising growth.

In this year of India's G20 presidency, the world will witness the best collaboration between institutions, countries, initiatives, and people. It will showcase India's nari shakti, all of whom will emerge as pioneers of prosperous societies and economies. FM Nirmala Sitharaman likely to meet CEOs of PSU Banks on Saturday

New Delhi, Mar 23:

Finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman is scheduled to meet managing directors of public sector banks (PSBs) on March 25 for performance review in the backdrop of failure of few banks in the US and liquidity crisis faced by Credit Suisse.

The meeting is going to take stock of the progress made by banks in achieving targets set for the various government schemes, including Kisan Credit Card (KCC), Stand-Up India, Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY), and emergency credit line guarantee scheme (ECLGS) to help businesses affected by Covid-19, according to sources. This is the first full review meeting after the presentation of Budget 2023-24 and banks would



be asked to focus on the areas highlighted by the Budget including credit flow to productive sectors.

The finance minister would review credit growth, asset quality, and capital raising and business growth plan of banks for next financial year, the sources said, adding non-performing assets (NPAs) of Rs 100 crore and the recovery status would also be dis-

cussed. The meeting comes in the backdrop of global concern over failure of banks due to aggressive monetary tightening. The US Fed on Wednesday hiked interest rates by 25 basis points to tame high inflation despite the banking crisis.

To fight the persistent hot inflation, the Fed has so far increased rates from zero to 4.75 to 5 per cent, all in just one year. Meanwhile, policymakers and experts have said that the Indian banking system is in good shape and can handle the situation caused due to monetary tightening. Various reforms undertaken by the government have resulted in significant improvement in asset quality of public sector banks with gross NPA ratio declining from the peak of 14.6 per cent in March

2018 to 5.53 per cent in December 2022. All PSBs are in profit with aggregate profit of Rs 66,543 crore in 2021-22, and that further increased to Rs 70,167 crore in the first nine months of the current financial year.

At the same time, resilience has increased with the provision coverage ratio of PSBs rising from 46 per cent to 89.9 per cent in December 2022. Capital adequacy ratio of PSBs improved significantly from 11.5 per cent in March 2015 to 14.5 per cent in December 2022. Total market capitalisation of PSBs (excluding IDBI Bank, which was categorised as private sector bank in January 2019) increased from Rs 4.52 lakh crore in March 2018 to Rs 10.63 lakh crore in December 2022, she said.

Maruti Suzuki to hike prices of model range from April



New Delhi, Mar 23:

Maruti Suzuki India on Thursday said it will increase prices of its model range in April to partially offset the impact of "overall inflation and regulatory requirements".

The auto major, however, did not share the quantum of the price hike it intends to implement from next month. The company continues to witness increased cost pressure driven by overall inflation and regulatory requirements, the auto maker said in a regulatory filing. While the company makes maximum effort to reduce cost and partially offset the

increase, it has become imperative to pass on some of the impact through a price increase, it added. The company has planned this price increase in April, 2023, which shall vary across models, Maruti Suzuki India stated.

Already several automakers, including Honda Cars, Tata Motors and Hero MotoCorp, have announced increase in prices from April.

The Indian automobile industry is currently working to make their products meet the second phase of BSVI emission norms. From April 1, vehicles will need to have an on-board self-diagnostic device to monitor the real-time driving emission levels. The device will constantly monitor key parts for meeting emission standards such as the catalytic converter and oxygen sensors, to keep a close watch on emissions.

BMW Motorrad launches R18 Transcontinental bike



New Delhi, Mar 23:

BMW Motorrad, the two-wheeler arm of German luxury carmaker BMW, on Thursday said it has launched the all-new R 18 Transcontinental cruiser in India tagged at Rs 31.5 lakh (ex-showroom). The bike can be ordered as a completely built-up unit (CBU) from Thursday onwards, BMW Motorrad said in a statement. The company said it now offers three motorcycles in the cruiser segment in the country. These are - R 18, R 18 Classic and R 18 Transcontinental. "This motorcycle will have an enormous appeal for motorcyclists who live for unforgettable cruising moments," BMW Group India President Vikram Pawah noted.

Vedanta says talks of stake sale 'untrue', 'baseless'

New Delhi, Mar 23:

Vedanta Ltd on Thursday termed any talks of sale in oil-to-metals conglomerate as "untrue and baseless."

This comes in the wake of news report which said that mining mogul Anil Agarwal is contemplating a stake sale in Vedanta as a last-resort option and is examining the possibility of selling less than 5 per cent of the company. According to company's spokesperson, "Any talk of stake sale in Vedanta is untrue and baseless."

The media report said that stake sale in Vedanta is a last resort for Agarwal and will only be considered if other fundraising options fail.

Vedanta Resources which is a majority shareholder of Vedanta Ltd has been looking to reduce its debt

through the sale of its zinc assets for a cash consideration of USD 2,981 million to Hindustan Zinc Ltd (HZL). However, the government which holds 29.54 per cent stake in Hindustan Zinc has sternly opposed this move. Vedanta holds 64.92 per cent of the equity share capital of HZL. Vedanta Resources had earlier said that it has enough means to meet debt repayment liabilities in the coming quarters as it looked to assuage investor concerns around its financial position. In a statement, the firm, which is the majority owner of Mumbai-listed mining and oil and gas company Vedanta Ltd, had said it is in the advanced stage of finalisation to tie up USD 1.75 billion through a combination of syndicate loan and bilateral bank facilities.

US nominee for World Bank President Ajay Banga visits India; to meet PM Modi

New Delhi, Mar 23:

The US nominee for World Bank President Ajay Banga is on a two-day visit to India where he is scheduled to meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi and finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman, among others.

Banga's New Delhi visit (March 23 and March 24) is the final stop on his three-week global tour that began in Africa before progressing to Europe, Latin America and Asia. "While in India, Banga will meet with Prime Minister Narendra Modi as well as the minister of finance Nirmala Sitharaman and the minister of external affairs S Jaishankar. These discussions will focus on India's development priorities, the World Bank, and global econ-

ic development challenges," US Treasury Department said in a statement. Additionally, it said, Banga will visit the Learnet Institute of Skills, which is a network of vocational institutes established in collaboration with the National Skills Development Corporation, funded in part by the World Bank. Banga will learn about the Institute's programme and meet with

Rupee gains 32 paise to close at 82.27 against US dollar

Mumbai, Mar 23:

The rupee gained 32 paise to close at 82.27 (provisional) against the US dollar on Thursday, tracking the weakness of the American currency in the overseas market. Traders said the weak US Dollar and decline in US Treasury yields on the back of dovish Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) boosted investor sentiments.

The 25 basis points interest rate hike by the US Federal Reserve was on the expected lines, and the declining crude oil prices boosted the overall sentiments, they added. At the interbank foreign exchange, the domestic unit opened strong at 82.38



against the dollar and gained further ground and finally settled at 82.27 (provisional) against the American currency, registering a gain of 32 paise against its previous close. In intra-day trade, the rupee touched a high of 82.08 and hit the lowest level of 82.41 against the greenback.

Sensex snaps 2-day rally, falls 290 pts to close below 58K



Mumbai, Mar 23:

Equity benchmark Sensex declined 290 points in a volatile session to settle below the 58,000 mark on Thursday due to a sell-off in banking, financial and IT stocks amid a weak trend in European equities. Besides, heavy selling pressure in index heavyweight Reliance Industries added

to the pressure, traders said. After rallying for the two straight days, the 30-share BSE Sensex fell 289.31 points or 0.50 per cent to settle at 57,925.28. During the day, it declined 375.74 points or 0.64 per cent to 57,838.85. The broader NSE Nifty dipped 75 points or 0.44 per cent to end at 17,076.90. State Bank of India was the biggest loser in the Sensex pack, shedding 1.69 per cent, followed by Asian Paints, Kotak Mahindra Bank, HCL Technologies, Reliance Industries, Wipro, IndusInd Bank, Infosys, Power Grid and HDFC twins. In contrast, Nestle, Maruti, Bharti Airtel, Tata Motors, ITC and Hindustan Unilever were among the gainers.




"He helped me to push myself to entirely new
