BRIEF**Man apprehended**

New Delhi: A young man was apprehended for allegedly insulting a saffron flag placed near a mosque in northeast Delhi's Jyoti Nagar, police said on Friday. An FIR was registered against Falz Alam (18) for disrespecting the flag near the mosque Moula Baksh situated at B-Block, Ashok Nagar, a video of which went viral on social media. "Alam was booked under IPC sections 153A (promoting enmity between different groups on grounds of religion, race, place of birth, residence, language, etc.

CISF jawan

Srinagar: Muslims in Jammu and Kashmir's Kulgam district Friday helped perform the last rites of a Hindu CISF jawan who died of cardiac arrest, officials said. Balbir Singh, 55, a Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) jawan died Thursday evening of cardiac arrest at his home in Karkhan area of south Kashmir's Kulgam, the officials said. Singh's family is the only Hindu Rajput family living in the village, so, his friends and the local Muslim community came forward to help perform his last rites, they said. People from the Muslim community also shouldered his 'arthi' and arranged wood for the cremation, they added.

House blast

Bulandshahr (UP): Four people died in a suspected gas cylinder blast in a house here on Friday, police said. A call was received in the afternoon regarding a cylinder blast in a house built in the middle of the fields in Nayagaon in Kotwali Nagar area, SSP Shlok Kumar said. The house where the explosion took place was destroyed, police said. Some cylinders have been found and police, district administration, fire brigade and CMO teams are engaged in relief and rescue operations, the SSP said. District Magistrate Chandra Prakash Singh said that there was an explosion in a house built in the middle of the fields and the bodies of four people have been recovered so far.

Calf dies

Udhagamandalam (TN): A five-month-old orphaned elephant calf brought to Theppakkad Elephant Camp in Mudumalai Tiger Reserve in the Nilgiris district a fortnight ago, died in the early hours of Friday. The calf which fell into a farm well, was brought to the camp, after Forest department failed to unite it with its mother in Dharmapuri and handed over to the Oscar-winning documentary "The Elephant Whisperers" couple Bomman and Bellie on March 16. The health condition of the calf suddenly deteriorated reportedly due to dysentery late Thursday night and was under treatment and was given glucose after consulting an expert at Vandalur Zoo, Forest department sources said.

Excise policy case **'Sisodia architect of conspiracy'**

New Delhi, Mar 31 (PTI)

A court here on Friday dismissed a bail plea of incarcerated former Delhi deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia in the excise policy case lodged by the CBI, saying prima facie the AAP leader is the architect of the criminal conspiracy in the matter. The court said his release may adversely impact the ongoing investigation and "seriously hamper" its progress.

Special Judge M K Nagpal, who had reserved order on the AAP leader's bail plea on March 24, said he was not inclined to release him at this stage. "Thus, it is clear from the above discussion that the applicant had played the most important and vital role in the criminal conspiracy and he had

been deeply involved in the formulation as well as the implementation of the said policy to ensure the achievement of objectives of the said conspiracy... Thus, as per allegations made by the prosecution and the evidence collected in support thereof so far, the applicant can prima facie be held to be the architect of the said criminal conspiracy," the judge said.

"... This court is not inclined to release the applicant on bail at this stage of investigation of the case as his release may adversely affect the ongoing investigation and will also seriously hamper the progress thereof. Therefore, this bail application filed on behalf of the applicant is being dismissed," the judge said in his 34-page order.

SC dismisses PIL seeking declaration of all animals as legal entities

New Delhi, Mar 31 (PTI)

The Supreme Court has dismissed a PIL seeking declaration of all animals as legal entities having rights like any living person. A bench of Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and Justices P S Narasimha and J B Pardiwala dismissed the PIL saying "we find that the prayer sought in the writ petition cannot be granted by this court in its extraordinary jurisdiction under Article 32 of the Constitution of India."

"The writ petition is, accordingly, dismissed," it added. The PIL filed by the NGO People's Charioteer Organisation



said that of late cases of cruelty towards animals have come to light which have raised questions as to how humans have absolutely no respect for animals' lives and how can they be absolutely devoid of sympathy.

HC quashes CIC order asking Gujarat varsity to give information on PM Modi's degree

Court imposes Rs 25,000 cost on Kejriwal

Ahmedabad, Mar 31 (PTI)

The Gujarat High Court on Friday set aside the seven-year-old order of the Central Information Commission (CIC), asking the Gujarat University to provide information on Prime Minister Narendra Modi's degree to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal. Allowing the Gujarat University's appeal against the CIC order, Justice Biren Vaishnav also imposed a cost of Rs 25,000 on Kejriwal and asked him to deposit the amount within four weeks to the Gujarat State Legal Services Authority (GSLSA). Justice Vaishnav also refused to stay his order as requested

by Kejriwal's lawyer Percy Kavina. In April 2016, the then CIC M Sridhar Acharyulu had directed the Delhi University and the Gujarat University to provide information to Kejriwal on the degrees that Modi received.

Three months later, the Gujarat High Court stayed the CIC order after the var-

sity approached it against that order. The CIC order came a day after Kejriwal wrote to Acharyulu, saying he has no objection to government records about him being made public and wondered why the commission wanted to "hide" information on Modi's educational qualifications.

Sidhu likely to be released from jail on Apr 1

Chandigarh: Congress leader Navjot Singh Sidhu is likely to be released from the Patiala jail on April 1, said his counsel HPS Varma on Friday.

The 59-year-old was serving a one-year sentence in a 1998 road rage case. On May 20 last year, Sidhu, the former Punjab Congress chief, was jailed following his surrender before a court in Patiala after he was sentenced to one-year rigorous imprisonment by the Supreme Court. The top court had in its order said any sympathy in imposing an inadequate sentence would do more harm to the justice system and undermine the public confidence in the efficacy of law.

Govt raises interest rates on most small saving schemes

New Delhi, Mar 31 (PTI)

The government on Friday raised interest rates on most post office saving schemes by up to 0.7 per cent for the April-June 2023 quarter in line with the firming of interest rates in the economy.

While the interest rates for popular PPF and savings deposits have been retained at 7.1 per cent and 4 per cent, respectively, there has been an increase between 0.1 per cent and 0.7 per cent in other saving schemes, a finance ministry statement said.

The highest increase was in the interest rate of the National Savings Certificate (NSC), which will now attract 7.7 per cent, up from 7 per cent, for the April 1 to June 30, 2023 period.

The new rate for the girl child savings scheme Sukanya Samridhi has been increased to 8 per cent from 7.6 per cent.

The interest rate on the senior citizen savings scheme and Kisan Vikas Patra (KVP) is 8.2 per cent (up from 8 per cent) and 7.5 per cent (up from 7.2 per cent), respectively.

KVP will now mature in 115 months as against 120 months earlier.



Interest rates were increased in the last quarter as well.

Interest rates for small savings schemes are notified on a quarterly basis.

With the revision, a one-year term deposit with post offices would earn 6.8 per cent (up from 6.6 per cent), for two years — 6.9 per cent (up from 6.8 per cent), three years — 7 per cent (up from 6.9 per cent) and five years — 7.5 per cent (7 per cent).

The interest rate on Public Provident Fund (PPF) has been retained at 7.1 per cent and that of the savings deposit at 4 per cent.

Monthly Income Scheme has been increased by 30 basis points to 7.4 per cent.

Two Naxalites involved in March 27 IED attack held

Bijapur, Mar 31 (PTI)

Two Naxalites who allegedly planted an improvised explosive device (IED) that caused the death of a Chhattisgarh Armed Force assistant platoon commander on March 27 were arrested in the state's Bijapur district on Friday, a police official said.

"They have said they had planted an IED near Etapal camp to target security forces on March 27, leading to the death of an assistant platoon commander of the Chhattisgarh Armed Force. They also named two more Naxalites involved in the March 27 incident. Efforts are on to nab these two," he said.

"The security team was on an anti-Naxal operation at the time. Mangle and Muchaki are members of the outlawed outfit's IED team. A tiffin bomb, detonators, detonating cord, electric wire, battery and switch were seized from them," the official said.

"They have said they had planted an IED near Etapal camp to target security forces on March 27, leading to the death of an assistant platoon commander of the Chhattisgarh Armed Force. They also named two more Naxalites involved in the March 27 incident. Efforts are on to nab these two," he said.

2008 Malegaon blast trial**Another witness declared hostile by NIA court**

Mumbai, Mar 31 (PTI)

A witness in the 2008 Malegaon blast case, who had allegedly booked a hotel room for the accused days before the incident, turned hostile before a special court here on Friday.

He became the 32nd witness to be declared hostile in the case, in which BJP MP from Bhopal Pragya Singh Thakur is one of the key accused. The witness, who worked at a hotel in Madhya Pradesh's Indore, had in his statement to the Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) claimed that he had

booked rooms for the accused in the case. However, during his deposition before special NIA judge AK Lahoti on Friday, the witness said he doesn't remember what he told the probe agency. Following which, the court declared him hostile.

The court has examined 307 witnesses until now. Six people were killed and more than 100 injured on September 29, 2008, when an explosive device strapped to a motorcycle went off near a mosque in Malegaon town in north Maharashtra, some 200 km from Mumbai.



Raipur, Mar 31: Former minister and MLA Satyanarayan Sharma made a scathing attack on the central government and the BJP over disqualification of Rahul Gandhi in parliament. Addressing a press conference at Rajiv Bhawan, the Congress headquarters in the capital Raipur today he alleged that Rahul Gandhi was disqualified from Lok Sabha membership under a conspiracy. According to him Rahul Gandhi's question on Adani has become a crime.

He said that Rahul did not comment over any particular community or individual or OBC. The BJP government at the center is doing the work of strangling democracy, he said, adding that BJP is conspiring more than what the British didn't do. He said

BJP State Spokesperson Sandeep Sharma said that Congressmen were now insulting the Father of the Nation out of sycophancy in their thirst for power. Calling Rahul Gandhi the son of the nation, who questioned India's democracy by going to Britain against which the Father of the Nation fought for years, is an indication of the disgusting mentality of the Congress, he said.



He was raising the voice of the public in the Lok Sabha but he was not allowed to speak. The way BJP conspired, no other party has done it, said Sharma, adding that Rahul's mike was switched off and his statement was expunged from the proceedings of the House. This is a conspiracy to kill democracy, he alleged.

Hitting back at MLA Satyanarayan Sharma over his statement BJP MP Sunil Soni alleged that Congress MLA did insult to the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi with his statement. Congress has become a victim of madness, he said, adding that some are calling Rahul Gandhi the son of the nation, while others are saying something else.



There was huge rush of people on the last day of the FY for the registry and there was long-waiting for all since morning hours.

Unemployment allowance scheme in Ch'garh from today

Eligible beneficiaries will receive Rs 2500 per month

Process of online application will commence from April 1, there is no last date for applying

Beneficiaries will receive allowance directly in bank account

Family means husband and wife, dependent children and dependent parents.

About the eligibility conditions, the applicant of Berojgari Yojana i.e. the unemployment allowance scheme must be a domicile of Chhattisgarh. The age of the applicant should be between 18 to 35 years as on 1st April of the year of applying for the scheme. The applicant must have passed at least Higher Secondary i.e. 12th standard from a recognized board, should be registered in any district employment and self-employment guidance center of Chhattisgarh and his/her employment registration should be at least two years old with Higher Secondary or above qualification as on 1st April of the year of application.

The applicant should not have any source of income of his own and the annual income of the applicant's family from all sources should not exceed Rs.2.50 lakh. Income certificate issued by Tehsildar or higher revenue officer for the applicant should not be

more than one year old from the date of application for unemployment allowance.

Payment of unemployment allowance

Under the unemployment allowance scheme, a payment of Rs 2500 per month will be transferred directly to the beneficiary's bank account by the Directorate of Employment and Training, Nava Raipur. At the time of applying, the applicant has to give the correct information of his savings bank account number, IFSC code. Any non-payment due to error in the bank account will be the responsibility of the applicant.

Duration of unemployment allowance issuance

Unemployment allowance will be payable to the eligible applicant under the scheme for the first one year. If the particular beneficiary does not get gainful employment in this period of one year, then the unemployment allowance will be provided for a period of one more year. In any case this period shall not exceed two years.

Applicants who will be approved for the unemployment allowance under the scheme will be offered skill development training within a period of one year. After the skill development training, the applicant will be assisted in getting employment. Skill development training will be provided free of cost in any one of the trades mentioned in the application. If applicants refuse to undergo training or do not accept the offered employment, their unemployment allowance will be stopped.

Review of unemployment allowance beneficiaries

The concerned panchayats and bodies will regularly monitor the status of the beneficiaries receiving unemployment allowance every 6 months, to ensure whether they are still eligible to receive unemployment allowance or not. Notice will be issued to the beneficiaries found ineligible in the investigation and after the hearing, an order will be issued to stop their unemployment allowance. Information about the same will be uploaded on the portal.

UNICEF team gives training under 'Potth Laika' campaign

Bemetara, Mar 31: Under the 'Potth Laika' campaign, a training programme was organized through UNICEF in the meeting hall of the District Panchayat Office to reduce the malnutrition rate in the district, here on Wednesday. Sub-Divisional Officer (R) Bemetara Suruchi Singh, Mitanin, Anganwadi workers and assistants along with employ-

ees of Women and Child Development Department were present in the training programme.

In the training programme, Dr. Bharti Sahu, who came from UNICEF Chhattisgarh, informed all Mitanin, Anganwadi workers and assistants about the symptoms of malnutrition and how it can be removed.

He said that we should pay attention to the time when the child starts eating solid food because the chances of malnutrition are high at that time, so mothers should be made aware about it. During this, necessary guidelines were

given for better operation of the nutrition campaign being run to remove malnutrition. Pregnant women should also be informed about the ways to save themselves and their children from malnutrition.

The trainees were also explained about the importance of tricolour food, i.e. the color of the tricolour in the plate is for white rice, milk and eggs, green is for green vegetables and saffron or yellow is for lentils, chickpeas, soybeans, meat etc. Having all the three colours on our plate is important for a balanced diet. The importance of washing hands before and after the

meals, sanitation in the bathroom and other habits before eating food was also explained.

The focus is on providing as much nutritious food as possible to malnourished children, pregnant and lactating mothers. Mid-day meal scheme (MDM) takes care of school going children, hot meals are served to mothers and children to eat in Anganwadi under Poshan Abhiyaan.

Eggs and bananas are also being distributed under the Mukhyamantri Suposhan Yojana. These schemes along with the Public Distribution System have eliminated the prob-

lem of availability of food.

These are big steps towards eradicating malnutrition. However, a gap still exists in that information about when and what to eat is not readily available to all families. Thus, there is a need for nutrition counseling and behavior change programmes.

For all these reasons, Bemetara district has started the Pottha Laika campaign. The pilot project will cover 40 villages of Bemetara section. The main objective is to eliminate malnutrition in the district (to reduce the number of severely malnourished children to zero).

Land-mafia brother evades stamp duty worth Rs 11 lakh!


By hiding information about being adopted son and claiming waiver in stamp duty worth lakhs

To save actual stamp duty for cost of land at the plot rate, they got registry done by hiding facts

Role of Dy. Registrar dubious, as to how registry can be done with paper of affidavit related to adoption attached with registry and changing name of biological father in the registry?

Kawardha, Mar 31: Daily some or the other irregularity in evasion of stamp duty is coming to fore by the land-mafia brother by taking officers into their influence. The game of evasion of stamp duty and registry fees with nexus of Dy. Registrar is going on for quite some time. It is notable heretofore the well-known land-mafia Pankaj Jain and Mahavir Jain after the purchase of land, citing about adoption at the time of submission of an affidavit during registry and changing relations at the time of registry have cause loss worth lakhs to the government exchequer in terms of Stamp Duty fees through a conspiracy. If the local administration and government carry out checking of all the registries by the land-mafia, Dy. registrar, Patwari and role of the document writer in the evasion of Stamp Duty and Registry fees, then it may reveal stamp duty

and registry fee theft worth crores.

As per information in this regard, Pankaj Jain and Mahavir Jain got the registry of 0.272 hectare land of seller Jai Mannikpuri, S/o Khilawan Manikpuri, Kawardha on Kh. No. 831/1 and P.H.No. 3 on 2 Jan 2023 at the Dy. Registrar's office in Kawardha. As per the sale value of the land and rate of Rs 29 lakh, the 'bhar mukth shukl' was Rs 1.45 lakh; Nagar Palika fees was Rs 29000 and 'upkar' at Rs 7250, totalling at Rs 1,81,250 worth of e-Stamp Paper No. IN-CG 36519785937414U that different fees was paid.

The above registry was executed by Pankaj and Mahavir Jain by hiding their relationship. For this registry, Pankaj Jain submitted an affidavit before the Public Notary in Kawardha on 30 Dec 2022 saying that his 'grand-pa' adopted him through 'Godnama' (adoption procedure) and due to which he is his adopted so and therefore in all my documents my Father's name is registered as Dalichand Bothara and this include the PAN Card as well.'

At one place where Pankaj Jain accepted himself as adopted son of Dalichand Bothara, but at the time of registry, in order to save on stamp duty fees, both Pankaj and Mahavir Jain hid this information,

holding Sampatraj Jain as their single father and being brother in relations and got the registry done. By doing so, instead of taking the market value of the property, the purchasers claiming themselves to be each other's brother, got the calculation done at hectare rate market rate. The registry to be done at the plot rate in nexus with the Dy. Registrar was done at hectare rate through a conspiracy and thereby causing loss worth crores to the government in terms of revenue by not paying actual stamp paper fees and registry fees.

As per information in this regard, for registry of 0.272 hectare land with both being each other's brother, the market rate according to hectare was worked out at Rs 29 lakh and the registry was executed and for which stamp duty of Rs 1.81 lakh was paid. Whereas accord-

ing to the 'Godnama' (adopted son) procedure, both Pankaj and Mahavir not belonging to the same family, the market value of the land, instead of at the hectare rate would have been at the plot rate of 6300 sq. mts. and the cost of land would have been around Rs 1.36 crore, making the stamp fee worth Rs 11 lakh and an additional registry fees as well. So in this way in nexus with the Dy. Registrar and despite an affidavit of being an adopted son, both the persons used their biological father's name and cause loss to the tune of Rs 11 lakh of stamp duty and registry fees to the government exchequer.

It is notable here that as per section-21 of the Hindu Dattakar-Grahan & Bharan-Poshan Adhiniyam 1956, right from the date of adoption of the son, all other relations with the family giving birth to the son are treated as null & void and it is taken over by the family adopt-

Pithora, Mar 31: Total of 25 villagers got injured and seven were in critical including two women, when a Pick-up Van turned turtle near NH-53 'Dhak Toll Plaza' here on Thursday afternoon. Out of these, total 7 including three children, two woman and two man were sent in serious condition to Mahasamund Medical College and the police is investigating the case.

As per information the accidents of goods vehicles overloaded with 'baratis' and labourers on NH-53 and being driven at high speed are meeting with accident quite frequently. After the Nartora accident, it was about 10 kms from city near 'Dhak Toll Plaza', a Pick-up Van overloaded with more than 25 villagers turned turtle. In this majority were small children and woman. Some youth from Gram

Laxmipur informed that they too were in the same pick-up which met with accident. Actually the pick-up drive used to drive tractor and since the pick-up driver was not there, he was sent for 'Chouthiya' programme. There were about 35-40 persons in the pick-up Van. The vehicle started from Laxmipur of Mahasamund was running at high-speed on NH-53 and while overtaking a truck, the driver could not control the vehicle the turn ahead and it turned turtle. This led to shouting and cry for help and the passers-by called 112 and all the injured were taken to nearby CHC in 108 Ambulance vehicle.

After the first-aid, the doctor referred seven persons including three children viz. Mahi S/o Naveen Patel (3); Preeti Patel D/o Naveen Patel (8) and Shiv Kumar; S/o Bhagau (1) and 2 woman viz. Sirmotni (40 and Sewa Bai (55) all R/o Laxmipur and Labrakala (26) S/o Virendra in serious condition to Medical College Mahasamund.

According to the doctor, rest all the injured were asked to stay in the CHC after the first-aid.

Trump indicted, 1st US ex-prez charged with crime

New York, Mar 31 (PTI):



Donald Trump has been indicted by a Manhattan grand jury over hush money payments made to a porn star during his 2016 campaign, making him the first former US president to face a criminal charge and upending his bid to retake the White House in 2024.

The office of Manhattan District Attorney Alvin Bragg, who has been pursuing the investigation, confirmed that it had contacted Trump's lawyers on Thursday evening to "coordinate his surrender" on unspecified charges.

"This evening we contacted Mr. Trump's attorney to coordinate his surrender to the Manhattan D.A.'s office for arraignment on a Supreme Court indictment, which remains under seal."

Guidance will be provided when the arraignment date is selected," a spokesperson for District Attorney Bragg said.

The New York Times newspaper, quoting five people with knowledge of the matter, reported that the grand jury on Thursday voted to indict 76-year-old Trump, a Republican, for his role in paying money to porn star Stormy Daniels in an attempt to buy her silence over an alleged affair.

The report termed it "a historic development that will shake up the 2024 presidential race and forever mark him as the nation's first former president to face criminal charges."

Trump, the 45th US President from 2017 to 2021, is expected to fly from his home in Florida to New York on Monday and be arraigned in court on Tuesday, two sources familiar with the matter told CBS News. The proceeding is expected to be brief.

The charges in the indictment will be read to him at the hearing, which is set to last about 10-15 minutes.

Trump has denied all wrongdoing in connection with the payments made ahead of the election. In a statement responding to news of his indictment, the former president called it "Political

persecution and election interference at the highest level in history" and accused Democrats of "weaponizing our justice system to punish a political opponent, who just so happens to be a President of the United States."

"The Democrats have lied, cheated and stolen in their obsession with trying to 'Get Trump,' but now they've done the unthinkable indicting a completely innocent person in an act of blatant Election Interference," Trump said.

He lashed out at the Manhattan district attorney, calling the prosecutor a "disgrace," and accused him of "doing Joe Biden's dirty work." "This is third-world prosecutorial misconduct. It is the opportunistic targeting of a political opponent in a campaign year," Trump's son Eric tweeted.

Ukraine marks grim Bucha anniversary

Russia used its long-range arsenal to bombard anew several areas of Ukraine on Friday, killing at least two civilians and damaging homes as Ukrainians commemorated the anniversary of the liberation of Bucha.

President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said that Bucha, a town near Kyiv, stands as a symbol of the atrocities the Russian military has committed since its full-scale invasion began in February 2022.

"We will never forgive," Zelenskyy said in a post on his Telegram channel. "We will punish every perpetrator."

Zelenskyy attended an official ceremony in Bucha, where he was joined by the president of the Republic of Moldova and the prime ministers of Croatia, Slovakia and Slovenia.

The Kremlin's forces oc-

cupied Bucha weeks after they invaded Ukraine and stayed for about a month. When Ukrainian troops retook the town, they encountered horrific scenes:

bodies of women, young and old men, in civilian clothing, lying in the street where they had fallen or in yards and homes.

Other bodies were found in a mass grave. Over weeks and months, hundreds of bodies were uncovered, including some of children.

Russian soldiers on intercepted phone conversations called it "zachistka" cleansing, according to an investigation by The

Associated Press and the PBS series "Frontline". Such organised cruelty used by Russian troops in past conflicts as well, notably in Chechnya was later repeated in Russia-occupied territories across Ukraine.

More than 1,400 civilian deaths, including 37 children, were documented by Ukrainian authorities, Zelenskyy said.

More than 175 people were found in mass graves and alleged torture chambers, Zelenskyy said. Ukraine and other countries, including the US, have demanded that Russia answer for war crimes.

Prosecutor General Andriy Kostenko alleged on Friday that many of the dead civilians were tortured. Almost 100 Russian soldiers are suspected of war crimes, he said on his Telegram channel, and indictments have been issued for 35 of them.

such cases in interior Sindh with the lower courts flooded with applications from affected parents seeking justice and the return of their daughters, sisters and wives.

Unfortunately, no representative from the provincial government came out to listen to the pleas of the protesters who dispersed peacefully.

In 2019, the issue of abducting and forcibly converting of Hindu girls in various districts of Sindh province was taken up in the Sindh Assembly. A resolution was debated and unanimously passed after it was modified over objections of certain lawmakers that it should not be restricted to only Hindu girls.

"We wanted to highlight this big problem facing the Sindhi Hindus, especially in the rural areas where our young girls, some as young as 12 and 13 are abducted in broad daylight, forced to convert to Islam and then married off to older Muslim men," a member of the PDI said.

He said the protest on Thursday had left some impact as many people were not even aware of this crime but admitted they were expecting a bigger turnout.

The protest went off peacefully with a large number of policemen standing at a distance from the protesters.

The protesters carried placards and banners which urged the government to pass a stalled bill against the forced conversion of Hindu girls and women.

In recent months there has been a surge in

forced conversions and marriages of girls as young as 13 in Pakistan.

Forced conversion and forced marriages are prohibited in Islam. According to the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan's report, around 1,000 girls are forcibly converted to Islam every year.

Combatting Hate Speech

Politics and Religion Must be Separated

Hate speech is on the rise in India, and the Supreme Court has rightly identified the mixing of politics with religion as a major cause. In a recent hearing, the court observed that most of the problems of hate speech will go away if politicians stop mixing politics with religion. It also criticized the State for being impotent and powerless in stopping hate speech and warned that it imperils India's secular ethos and democratic credentials. It is no secret that mixing politics with religion is a time-tested ploy to polarize voters and reap electoral dividends. This dangerous cocktail has also been used time and again to incite violence against one community or the other, as witnessed in an unending series of communal clashes all across the country. The Supreme Court is right to condemn this phenomenon, but it is not enough to simply blame fringe elements for it. It is not uncommon for ministers, MPs, MLAs, and other leaders of mainstream political parties to spew venom during their speeches. And rarely does their respective party leadership admonish or punish them for their inflammatory utterances. These rabble-rousers certainly don't represent the fringe. It's leniency or indifference on the part of their party bosses that emboldens them to relentlessly pursue their vicious agenda. A stern message to separate politics from religion has to come from the top brass and percolate down to the grassroots workers. If no such message is conveyed, communal polarisation inevitably holds sway. The Central and state governments have a huge role to play in ensuring that all merchants of hate are brought to book, irrespective of their political affiliation. It is essential that politicians in India take this issue seriously and work to separate religion and politics to end hate speech. The Supreme Court's observation is especially timely given the current political climate in the country. India is witnessing a rise in hate speech and communal tensions, which threaten the country's social fabric and democratic values. Politicians must understand that their words have consequences and that their speeches can incite violence and hatred. They must realize that the cost of their political ambitions cannot be the destruction of communal harmony and social peace. The court's observation that hate speech stems from intellectual depravement and intolerance is particularly apt. When people engage in hate speech, they are not just expressing their views. They are also betraying their lack of empathy and compassion for others. Hate speech is a symptom of a deeper malaise in society, where people are unwilling or unable to understand others who are different from themselves. It is a sign of an intellectual and moral bankruptcy that cannot be allowed to take root in India. The Central and state governments must take immediate action to stop hate speech and hold those who engage in it accountable. They must also work to create an environment where people feel safe expressing their opinions without fear of reprisals. The media and civil society must also play a role in this effort, by exposing hate speech and challenging those who engage in it. It is time for all Indians to pledge not to vilify anyone and to work towards creating a society where everyone is respected and valued. The time for action is now.

Unlocking India's Tourism Potential in Mission Mode

As one of the fastest emerging tourist destinations in the world, India's travel and tourism sector offers promising growth; having crossed an inflection point, it is now poised for bigger things. India's Budget 2023 has outlined various initiatives and schemes to develop tourism in Mission Mode. The Hon'ble Prime Minister's re-iteration of the importance of the sector in driving India's growth in the post-budget session is a testimony to the enormous possibilities whereby tourism can contribute to both GDP growth and employment generation. There is a clear focus on collective action between industry stakeholders and government to shape an ever-brighter future for the sector, one that can make a positive impact to the economy and society at large.

Power of Collaboration
The basic premise for the Central Government's push to tourism is an acknowledgement of the fact that travel and tourism sector needs multiple means of support to prop it up. The union budget has listed convergence and public-private-participation as two of the six themes, underlining the thrust for collaboration.

The Kashi Vishwanath Dham temple, for instance, saw footfalls increase from 80 lakh a year on an average to 7 crore last year. The newly developed site around the Statue of Unity saw 27 lakh visitors within a year of its completion.

Tourism at a Tipping Point
Even the destination-centric approach, the first theme, in the list of six, talks about bringing together multiple power centres of governance in promoting 50 new destinations as tourism centres of the future. The Prime Minister gave the examples of locations like Kashi, Kedarnath, the Statue of Unity and Pavagadh, to show how this unified approach and coming together of different arms of the government led to a huge boost in the number of tourists visiting these locations.

As we have seen, the Prime Minister's call for Atmanirbhav Bharat and the initiative of Dekho Apna Desh spurred domestic tourism and led hospitality companies to add supply across all segments -- from business and luxury properties, home stays, villas and to budget hotels. The development of these 50 new destinations will see not merely an evolution but a revolution of tourism in India in the years to come.

Tourism is a socio-economic activity and a long-term ap-

proach to development that balances social and economic objectives with environmentally sound management is the way forward. The dominant themes in this year's budget include subjects such as leveraging local culture, preserving heritage, promoting wellness and spiritual tourism and improving lives at the grass roots level with sustainability at the core of all decision making.

Leveraging Technology
There is, however, one more key takeaway from the list of themes, and that is the ongoing digitisation and innovation in the sector. Digital technologies, AR/VR, and artificial intelligence are set to revolutionize the travel and tourism industry. Travel experiences are becoming more personalized, immersive, and interactive. AR and VR can help travellers explore destinations before they even arrive, providing virtual tours and simulations of famous landmarks, historical sites, and cultural experiences. AI-powered chatbots and digital assistants can help travellers plan their trips, recommend personalized activities, and offer real-time assistance while traveling. The emerging technology will also be a key to help the sector keep a tab on its carbon footprint, its sustainability and the dangers of over-tourism.

A coordinated approach boosted by adoption of technology can also help India beat the bug-bear of low spending foreign tourists. On an average, we find, foreign tourists spend 33% less than what they would spend in the USA and when compared to Australia, it is lower by more than 60%.

The Need of the Hour

Ease of doing business approach now needs to come to travel, tourism and hospitality. Unlocking India's immense tourism potential requires a comprehensive strategy that addresses the six key pillars of Planning, Place, People, Policy, Process, and Promotion. It is great to note that the post-budget session addressed all the 6Ps effectively by covering destination planning and management, infrastructure development, sustainability and safety, development of human capital, policy and process interventions to align Centre & State as well as promoting the narrative of Indian tourism.

Constitutionally, too, tourism remains a state subject, and the central tourism department has been batting for it to be moved to the concurrent list, to allow policy making both at the central and the state level. For instance, some Indian states have already provided the industry-status to tourism, a key demand of the sector for decades now.

Granting tourism infrastructure status will provide further impetus to the growth of the sector. It is understood that the idea of a National Tourism Board is under consideration by the government. Matched with the right policies and initiatives, this is the ideal launch pad for India to be among the Top-3 Travel & Tourism economies globally.

Urgent need for study on glaciers melting and Global Warming

The recent earthquakes in Turkey and Syria have highlighted the urgent need for scientists to study the effects of global warming and the melting of glaciers, which are closely linked. Shockingly, no government study has been conducted in the last seven decades to investigate the shrinking of glaciers. In response to this alarming situation, the parliamentary standing committee on water resources has issued a warning about the catastrophic changes that could occur in the Himalayan region. As an individual concerned about the impact of climate change on our planet, I find the recent report

of the parliamentary standing committee on water resources on "Glacier Management in India" to be of great importance. The report highlights the lack of data and the urgent need for scientists to study the effects of global warming and the melting of glaciers, which are closely linked.

According to the panel's report, the Indian Himalayan Region has 9,775 glaciers, and 1,306.1 cubic km of ice volume (about 1,110 cu km of water) is locked up in glacierised basins of the Indus, Ganga, and Brahmaputra. However, specific information about the separate volume of ice and snowwater is not available. It is evident that the melting of glaciers and global warming need to be studied thoroughly, given the potential catastrophic consequences for the Himalayan region and India as a whole.

It is alarming to know that no government study has been conducted in the last seven decades to investigate the shrinking of glaciers. In response to this alarming situation, the parliamentary standing committee on water resources has issued a warning about the catastrophic changes that could occur in the Himalayan region. As an individual concerned about the impact of climate change on our planet, I find the recent report

critically given the frequent disasters in the Himalayan region, including the most recent flash flood that occurred in Uttarakhand's Chamoli in February 2021 due to glacial lake outburst, resulting in the loss of many lives.

The ecologically fragile Himalayan zone is highly susceptible to the warming of glaciers, which can have significant impacts on lives, the environment, and the economy. It is worrying that by the end of this century, at least two-thirds of the glaciers in the region will disappear, which will have severe consequences for India's 1.3 billion population in terms of livelihood and water resource systems.

Despite an increase in extreme weather events in the Himalayan region, the government system has not conducted any study in the last seven decades to assess the loss of glacier volume or warming to be able to predict potential catastrophic changes in the region. This lack of study and data regarding the warming of glaciers and its potential consequences is alarming. It is imperative that the government takes immediate action to establish a dedicated institute and coordinate efforts to address this issue. Otherwise, we risk losing not only our natural resources but also our lives and the economy.

The panel's report on "Glacier Management in India" highlights the need for an overarching organization at the national level that can coordinate with others in handling different hydro-geological and hydro-meteorological hazards, including glacier-related hazards, bring findings at one place, maintain reliable database for everyone to access and issue timely alerts. It is essential to have such an organization to have specific information about the separate volume of ice and snowwater. Without such information, it will be impossible to predict the consequences of glacier melting accurately.

The lack of comprehensive information available about the volume of glaciers in the Indian Himalayan Region, nor has the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change conducted any study or awarded any project on the warming of Himalayan glaciers, according to the panel's report. The panel further notes that no study has been carried out by the GSI, ISRO, and Department of Science and Technology to even critically analyze the enlargement and origin of glacial lakes near human settlements and

their potential cause for a lake outburst.

It is essential to emphasize the importance of studying the effects of global warming and the melting of glaciers not only in India but also in other parts of the world. The recent earthquakes in Turkey and Syria have highlighted the urgent need for scientists to study the effects of global warming and the melting of glaciers. The catastrophic changes that could occur in the Himalayan region if we do not take action should be a warning for the entire world.

It is evident that the melting of glaciers and global warming need to be studied thoroughly, given the potential catastrophic consequences for the Himalayan region and India as a whole. The lack of data and comprehensive information about the volume loss of glaciers and its potential consequences is alarming. India unveils 'dynamic' foreign trade policy, eyes USD 2 trillion exports by 2030

New Delhi, Mar 31:

India on Friday came out with a 'dynamic and responsive' foreign trade policy with the objective of raising the country's outward shipments to USD 2 trillion by 2030, making Indian Rupee a global currency and incentivising e-commerce exports. The approach of Foreign Trade Policy (FTP) 2023 is to move from 'incentive to remission' based regime; encourage collaboration between exporters, states, districts and Indian Missions; reduce transaction cost; and develop more export hubs. India is likely to cross USD 765 billion merchandise and services exports in financial year 2022-23 which ends on Friday. The total exports were USD 676 billion in previous fiscal year. Unlike the practice of 5-year FTPs, this time the government has come out with a dynamic and re-

sponsive trade policy without any end date, and will be updated as per the emerging global scenario. "We have ensured there is no end date to this policy, it will be updated from time to time," said Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) Santosh Sarangi while briefing media on the salient features of FTP 2023 unveiled by Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal.

Goyal said Department of Commerce will be making a massive focused outreach to the world, either sectorally or country-wise, over the next 4-5 months. Ministry of External Affairs and Indian Missions abroad will work with the department. "We have to meet our exports targets going forward. We will achieve USD 2 trillion in exports by 2030, but it should not be that mer-

chandise exports are outperformed by services exports," the minister said. The DGFT said India is likely to cross USD 765 billion merchandise and services exports in financial year 2022-23 which ends on Friday. In 2021-22, the total exports were USD 676 billion. The FTP aims at internationalisation of trade in Indian Rupee. It allows international trade settlement in INR and required changes have been introduced for grant of export benefits and fulfilment of Export Obligation (EO) for export realisations in the domestic currency as per RBI. "If there are countries where there is currency failure or dollar shortage we are willing to trade in the rupee with them," said Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal. He also stressed that Indian exporters will have to become globally competitive and need not depend on subsidies.

Changes have been made in the FTP to allow international trade settlement in Indian Rupee with a view to making INR a global currency.

Addressing the gathering, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal exuded confidence that the export target of USD 2 trillion by 2030 will be met. He stressed that any industry cannot succeed only on the basis of subsidy or crutches. In the

The FTP has also introduced an amnesty scheme for one-time settlement of default in export obligation by Advance Authorisation and EPCG authorisation holders. All pending cases of the default in meeting export obligation (EO) of authorisa-

tions mentioned can be regularised by the authorisation holder on payment of all customs duties that were exempted in proportion to unfulfilled EO and interest at the rate of 100 per cent of such duties exempted. However, no interest is payable on the portion of Additional Customs Duty and Special Additional Customs Duty. Policy for export of dual use items under Special Chemicals, Organisms, Materials, Equipment and Technologies (SCOMET) has been consolidated at one place for ease of understanding and compliance by industry. SCOMET policy emphasises India's export control in line with its international commitments under various export control regimes (Wassenaar arrangement, Australia group and Missile Technology Control Regime) to control trade in sensitive/dual use items/technology.

Govt clears 26th tranche of electoral bonds; sale from Monday

last phase of electoral bonds (25th tranche) was open for subscription between January 19-28, 2023. Usually, electoral bond tranches are open for sale between 1-10 of a designated month. However, the 25th did not follow this order. Sale of the first batch of electoral bonds happened from March 1-10, 2018.

The authorised SBI branches include those in Bengaluru, Lucknow, Shimla, Dehradun, Kolkata, Guwahati, Chennai, Patna, New Delhi, Chandigarh, Srinagar, Gandhinagar, Bhopal, Raipur, and Mumbai. SBI is the only authorised bank to issue electoral bonds. An electoral bond will be valid for 15 days from the date of issuance.



Over 1 crore mobile numbers were seeded in Aadhaar following requests from residents in the month of February, an official statement said on Friday. The linking of mobile numbers with Aadhaar jumped 93 per cent in February from 56.7 lakh registration in January, according to the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI). "Over 10.97 million mobile numbers were seeded in Aadhaar following requests from residents in the month of February 2023, a jump of more than 93 per cent over the previous month," the statement said. Linking of Pan number with Aadhaar is considered to

be one of the key factors that pushed the growth of seeding mobile numbers with Aadhaar. Till date 90 crore Aadhaar holders are estimated to have linked their mobile numbers with their unique ID. "The UIDAI has been encouraging residents to link their Aadhaar with mobile number for better and effective communication while availing welfare services and accessing multitude of voluntary services," the statement said. Nearly, 1700 Central and State social welfare direct benefit transfer (DBT) and good governance schemes have been notified for use of Aadhaar. Aadhaar authentication transactions increased by 13 per cent to 226.29 crore in February over 199.

Global macroeconomic and financial sector headwinds are set to take a deep toll on the domestic IT companies' revenue growth in FY24, a report said on Friday. The Rs 10 lakh crore sector is likely to witness revenue growth plunging by up to 9 percentage points to 10-12 per cent in FY24 as against the nearly 20 per cent growth estimated in FY23, Crisil Ratings said. "Headwinds in key markets, especially the BFSI (banking, financial services and insurance) segment will affect the revenue growth of domestic IT services companies," it's senior director Anuj Sethi said.





Haryana arms recovery case

NIA seizes cash, car as 'proceeds of terrorism'

New Delhi, Mar 31 (PTI):

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has seized more than Rs 7.80 lakh in cash and a vehicle as "proceeds of terrorism" in a case related to the recovery of arms and explosives, smuggled from Pakistan by the proscribed Babbar Khalsa International, in Haryana last year, an official said on Friday. The cash and the Innova vehicle were seized on Thursday under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, a spokesperson of the federal agency said.

On May 5 last year, police had intercepted the vehicle at Bastara Toll Plaza by designated terrorist

in Haryana and recovered three improvised explosive devices (IEDs), one pistol with two magazines, 31 rounds of ammunition, and Rs 1.30 lakh in cash which had been concealed in a specially designed cavity. Four terror operatives - Gurpreet Singh alias "Gopi", Amandeep Singh alias "Deepa", Pardinder Singh alias "Pinder" and Bhupinder Singh - who were on their way to Adilabad in Telangana were arrested, the NIA said.

The spokesperson said the NIA investigations have revealed that multiple consignments of arms, explosives and drugs had been sent from Pakistan through

smuggling these contraband items. Investigations have exposed his modus operandi of depositing this money in bank accounts of others," the spokesperson said.

The official said an NIA team seized Rs 5.5 lakh from one such account and recovered Rs 1 lakh that Gopi had stashed away, raising the total recovery to Rs 7,80,000 in this case, besides the seized Innova vehicle. The NIA took over the investigation of the case on May 24 last year and filed the first charge sheet against six accused, including Rinda, in October. A supplementary charge sheet was filed against three more accused in March this year.

Man sentenced to 20 years in prison by Kerala court for sexual assault of minor

Palakkad (Kerala), Mar 31 (PTI):

A Kerala court on Friday sentenced a man to 20 years in prison for the repeated sexual assault of a minor girl whom he had befriended on social media.

Pattambi Fast Track Special Court judge Satish Kumar sentenced the man to 20 years for the offence of repeated aggravated penile sexual assault of a minor under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act.

The court also imposed a fine of Rs 1.5 lakh on the convict with a direction that the amount, if realised, be paid to the victim, Special Public Prosecutor Nisha Vijayakumar said. The

court also sentenced the man to two years in prison for the offence of house trespass under the IPC.

The man, hailing from Kollam, had befriended the minor girl on social media in 2021 and after they got close, he turned up at her house when her parents were not present and sexually assaulted her, the SPP said. Subsequently, he showed up at her house several times during that year in the absence of her parents and sexually assaulted her, the prosecutor added. As his sexual demands began increasing and he started making threats to make the victim comply, she told her parents who in turn informed the police, the SPP said.

Earlier this week, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann had hit out at Akal Takht Jathedar Gian Harpreet Singh for "provoking" people through an ultimatum to the state government to release all the Sikh youths.

The Jathedar had responded that he has the right and duty to speak about "innocent Sikh youths". He had also condemned the state government for invoking the stringent NSA against some of those held.

Two hybrid militants arrested in connection with attack on journalist

Srinagar, Mar 31 (PTI): Two hybrid militants of The Resistance Front (TRF) were arrested in Shopian district of Jammu and Kashmir for their alleged involvement in an attack on a social media journalist last year, police said on Friday.

During the course of investigation of the case, a special investigation team (SIT) was constituted, which, on the basis of oral, circumstantial and technical evidences, rounded up a number of suspects, a police spokesman said.

During questioning, two suspects identified as Suhaib Reyaz and Anayat Ullah Iqbal, both residents of Saidapora Payeen village of Shopian, admitted their involvement in the terror attack, the spokesman said.

He said it also came to fore that the duo was working as hybrid terrorists of proscribed terror group TRF - an offshoot of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT).

On their disclosure, the weapon of offence - a pistol along with its magazine and five pistol rounds besides, an IED were recovered by the security forces in the orchards of Saidapora Payeen, the spokesman said.

Waseem Ahmad Wani (27), a resident of Heerpura area of Shopian, who ran a YouTube news channel, escaped unhurt after two motorcycle-borne militants shot at him on December 25 last year.


