China's Latest Provocation
A s China continues to provoke India through aggres sive measures, including renaming places in Arunachal Pradesh, India is rapidly working to bolster its dependence on foreign countries by developing and producing indigenous defence technology and equipment trengthening the Defence Research and Developmen Organisation (DRDO), and increasing the percentage of equipment used by the armed forces procured from still room for improvement in areas such as defence prorement, indigenous defence manufacturing, and coor dination among different agencies. China's tendency to hrow its weight around, notwithstanding its occasiona cent move to rename 11 places in Arunachal Pradesh is amed at riling India. China has conducted similar exercises in the past, and rejecting China's meddllesome ac has been, and will always be an integral and inalienable part of India" and "attempts to assign invented names will not alter this reality." However, such "strong" statements have failed to deter China from indulging in misadventures. China's aggressive moves on the ground and its doublespeak make it an unreliable neighbour. Beijing has stated that it wants to strengthen ties with India and Russia, but a triad comprising China, India and Russia will remain a treacherous distraction as long as the Chinese persist with their duplicity. India's main confrontation is with China, which has the world's largest standing army, larger air force and navy, and significantly larger defence budget than India. Both countries have nuclear weapons, and both have been strengthening their military presence along the border. China is the world's largest exporter of its defence export capabilities. However, India has a clear edge in terms of its battle-toughened army, which has the ultimate experience in the highest battlefields, counterterrorism, and regular warfare. As the world order rapidly changes, new and emerging security threats are constantly evolving, driven by advances in technology ors. Drones are one of the main perceived threats, with errorists or other malicious actors using them to carry out attacks, gather intelligence, or disrupt critical infrastructure. Cyber attacks, the misuse of AI, terrorism, and the increasing use of space technology for military pur-
 COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted the threat posed by biological agents. India must expeditiously ramp up its infrastructure in Arunachal Pradesh while continuing to focus on reducing its dependence on foreign countries fo its defence preparedness. India must be vigilant against China's aggressive moves and ensure its military pre paredness to counter any threats from emerging security threats. India must also build strategic alliances with countries that share its concerns an
tain peace and stability in the region.

## New research shows the impact of illiteracy in India

New findings released highlights the financial cost and social impact brought about due to $33.9 \%$ of "Econle in India with low level literacy skills. The "Economic Cost and Social impact of iliteracy" report has economy in India at $\$ 53.36$ billion USD per year. World Literacy Foundation Chief Executive Officer and co-author of the report Andrew Kay said reduced income earning capacity and social costs are the main reason why illiteracy is costed the Indian economy each year. "As a commuthe early data shows a drop in literacy rates post-pandemic," Mr Kay said. "Literacy can change everything in the life of a young person and provide a pathway to reach 475 million people struggle to read, write and hold basic numeracy skills. To highlight the true impact of illiteracy in India, Mr Kay has spoken about this economic cost and social impact report at the Oxford University World Literacy Summit 2023 on Monday April 3. Dr Tony Cree, Chair of the World Literacy Council said the literacy con erence this week played a central role for the first time post-pandemic, which brought together prach and learnings to address a spike in illiteracy. Dr Cree said "the 3day meeting put a spotlight on people and organizations doing exemplary and innovative work in the literacy sechighlighted the need for communities to unite for literacy". The World Literacy Summit hosted around 500 liter ary specialists from 85 countries from April 2-5 2023 at Oxford University in the United Kingdom. A further 48,000 people from the developing world attended the event via virtual/online TV channel. Globally, 770 million people to read a sentence. The Summit was a vital opportunity or the wider literacy community to come together, find solutions, and create a roadmap for the future.

## Regenerative Medicine: A Promising Solution for Chronic Diseases
