BRIEF**Rajnath holds talks with Chinese counterpart**

New Delhi, Apr 27 (PTI):

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Thursday held talks with his Chinese counterpart Li Shangfu and is learnt to have discussed the lingering border row in eastern Ladakh.

The talks took place hours after Li arrived in New Delhi to attend a meeting of defence ministers of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) being hosted by India. Li's visit to India is the first by a Chinese defence minister after the eastern Ladakh border stand-off began three years ago. There is no official word yet on the meeting between Singh and Li.

The meeting between the two defence ministers took place days after the Indian and Chinese armies held 18th round of military talks on ending the border row. In the Corps Commander talks on April 23, the two sides

agreed to stay in close touch and work out a mutually acceptable solution to the remaining issues in eastern Ladakh at the earliest. However, there was no indication of any clear forward movement in ending the row.

NIA probe ordered into Ram Navami violence**In Howrah**

Kolkata, Apr 27 (PTI):

The Calcutta High Court on Thursday ordered a probe by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) into the violence at Shibpur in Howrah and Rishra in Hooghly district during and after the Ram Navami celebration.

The judgement came on a PIL by the Leader of Opposition in the West Bengal Assembly Suvendu Adhikari of the BJP and three other petitions seeking an NIA probe into the

violence at these two places, during which bombs were allegedly hurled. A division bench presided over by Acting Chief Justice T S Sivagnanam directed the state police to ensure that all the FIRs, documents, materials seized and CCTV footage be immediately handed over to the NIA within two weeks from the date of receipt of the copy of this order.

It also directed that the NIA "on receipt of all the materials shall commence investigation and proceed in accordance with the law."

NAXAL ATTACK**Wreaths laid amid loud cries and chants**

Dantewada, Apr 27:

Amid cries and loud chanting of 'Bharat Mata ki Jai', wreaths were laid on Thursday at the mortal remains of 10 police personnel and a civilian driver who died in a blast carried out by Naxalites in Dantewada district.

Women, children and other family members of the deceased were seen crying while women security personnel were trying to console them.

After paying homage to the martyred personnel who died in the Naxal attack on Wednesday, Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel said the sacrifices of the jawans will not go in vain and the fight against Naxalites will be intensified. The CM lent his shoulder to the mortal remains of one of the jawans on way to a vehicle in which the mortals remains were being shifted to native places of the deceased. Ten personnel, belonging to the District Reserve Guard (DRG), and a civilian driver were killed after Naxalites blew up their Multi-Utility

Fight against Naxalites to be intensified'

Talking to reporters, Baghel said the martyrdom of the jawans will not go in vain and the fight against Naxalites will be intensified. "Our jawans have been giving a tough fight to Naxalites in their core areas. In the last four years, 75 camps (of security forces) have been set up in the core areas of Naxalites, while earlier the camps were established only in buffer areas," the CM said. Baghel said roads were being constructed in the interiors pockets of Bastar division and police camps were being set up. "People's confidence in the government has grown. Naxalites were pushed to the back foot, and such an attack has happened after a gap of two years which was carried out by them out of disappointment," he added.

IAF plane evacuating 246 from Sudan lands in Mumbai

Mumbai, Apr 27 (PTI):

An Indian Air Force aircraft with 246 Indians evacuated from war-torn Sudan landed in Mumbai on Thursday.

The plane, which took off from Jeddah around 11 am IST, landed here at 3.15 pm, an official said.

The passengers included at least two on wheelchairs.

"Another #OperationKaveri flight comes to Mumbai. 246 more Indians come back to the motherland," External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar tweeted.

The first batch of 360 Indians arrived in New Delhi on Wednesday.

REMOVED FROM JOB**DU ad hoc teacher found dead**

New Delhi, Apr 27 (PTI):

A 33-year-old Delhi University ad hoc teacher was found dead at his house in outer Delhi's Rani Bagh weeks after being removed from the job at the Hindu College, police said Thursday, triggering a protest by former colleagues and students. Samarveer, originally from Molki village in Rajasthan's Baran district, was found hanging from a ceiling fan in a room he shared with his cousin who had gone to duty at the time of the incident, police said. They said no suicide note was found, but accord-

ing to the cousin, he was under depression after he lost the job. The cousin told the police that Samarveer, who was unmarried, worked as an ad hoc lecturer in the Hindu College but a different person was appointed in his place in February. Hindu College principal Anju Srivastava did not respond to calls and texts requesting her reaction, but the university issued a statement condoling the "sad and untimely" demise of Samarveer.

"No words can ease the pain that is being felt by all, including us in the university fraternity," the statement said.

Govt brings up incest in same sex marriage hearing

New Delhi, Apr 27 (PTI):

The Centre on Thursday told the Supreme Court, which is hearing arguments on a clutch of pleas seeking legal sanction for same sex marriages, that arguments about freedom of sexual orientation and autonomy may be raised in future to challenge incest prohibition.

"As part of the first initiative, we have selected certain themes from 'Mann ki Baat' on the basis of which projection mapping and sound and light shows will be done at 13 different locations across the country on April 30 evening," Mohan said.

Justice D Y Chandrachud observed, adding sexual orientation or autonomy as an individual can never be exercised in all aspects of marriage including entry into wedlock and prohibited relationships, the grounds on which a marriage can be dissolved. All these, the CJL said, are subject to regulations by law. "The arguments... and I am saying this with a sense of responsibility, can be made, whether accepted or not is one thing, for challenging incest prohibition as well," Mehta told the bench, which also comprised justices S K Kaul, S R Bhat,

Hima Kohli and P S Narasimha. He referred to section 2(b) of the Special Marriage Act, 1954 which talks about degrees of prohibited relationship. "The proposition which I must mention here at this stage itself is would your lordships, I am posing a question to myself, read a particular enactment in such a fashion that it applies to a particular manner to one class, that is heterosexuals, and in a different manner to different class namely same-sex.... that exercise may not be a permissive interpretative exercise," he said.

Youth sentenced to jail for sexual assault of minor girl

Bhilai, Apr 27: A Fast Track Special Court in Durg sentenced a youth to three years of rigorous imprisonment for sexual assault of minor girl. Additional Sessions Judge (Fourth), FTSC - POCSO, Sangeeta Naveen Tiwari convicted 23-year-old Manish Sen alias Bobby of New Krishna Nagar, Supela. The girl's family had lodged a complaint at Supela Police Station on September 02, 2022.

Special Public Prosecutor Santosh Kasar informed that the accused stalked and sexually assaulted the 15-year-old vic-

tim when she was on her way to the school. When the family came to know about the incident, they lodged an FIR at Mohan Nagar Police Station after which the accused was arrested. After trial, the Special Court found the accused guilty and awarded different jail terms for Section 08 and Section 10 of POCSO Act under which the accused was tried. He was sentenced to three years of rigorous imprisonment and Rs 400 fine under section 08 of IPC and one year of rigorous imprisonment and Rs 100 fine under section 12 of POCSO Act, informed Special Public Prosecutor Santosh Kasar.

agreement is made by the department by reducing the amount in relation to the outstanding amount. The case of the party gets resolved in the Lok Adalat even before going to the Court.

PI Workshop organised to enhance percentage of 130-meter Rails

Bhilai, Apr 27: A Performance Improvement Workshop, aimed at increasing the percentage of 130-meter-long rails produced by Universal Rail Mill, was organized by SAIL-Bhilai Steel Plant, on April 25, 2023. Anish Sengupta, CGM(URM) was the Chief Guest of the event. The workshop was organized at the HRD Center, under the guidance of Nisha Soni, CGM(HRD & BE).

Inaugurating the Performance Improvement Workshop (PI workshop), Chief Guest Sengupta said that "the personnel working in the shop floor are well-acquainted with the operation and maintenance of equipment. I have firm faith that, by utilizing their experience, a detailed and result-oriented action plan will be prepared to increase the percentage of 130-meter-long rail, and this workshop shall be helpful in achieving this target. Sengupta also highlighted how noting down even the smallest creative ideas and later engaging in brainstorming can help in achieving the goal."

Highlighting the importance of producing 130-

meter-long rail, Special Guest AB Srinivas, GM (SMS-3) said that, besides helping in cost-cutting, it will also add to the comfort and safety of rail passengers. AV Manoj, GM (RCL) said that I am hopeful that with planning and discussion among ourselves, we will move towards achieving the target.

The Coordinator of the workshop Umesh Awadhiya GM (SP-2) informed that after the previous Performance Improvement Workshop on "increasing the percentage of 130-meter-long rail by optimizing the length of the billet", held on August 26, 2022, the percentage of 130-meter component had increased from 53.1% to 64.9%.

A target has been set for today's workshop, to in-

crease the 130-meter component from the annual average of 60.7% to 65%, Awadhiya said.

Rahul Srivastav, GM (URM), SK Oswal, GM (URM), Vishal Gupta, GM (URM), and S Mukhopadhyay, GM(RCL), provided a brief technical information on the subject. Under the guidance of Awadhiya GM(SP-2), the participants prepared a detailed action plan after contemplating various measures to increase the 130-meter component and removing the obstacles coming in its implementation.

During the year 2022-23, as many as 14 such workshops were organized by the HRD Department for various other departments, added Saharia. The program was conducted by SB Patel, Senior Manager (HRD) Officers and employees of the plant's various departments, including URM, SMS-3, RCL and INCOS participated in the workshop.



Applications of 24000 students received in RTE accepted

Lottery will be drawn on May 15 for admission in the first phase

Central Chronicle News

Raipur, Apr 27: The applications received for admission in private schools of the state are being verified under the Right to Education Act (RTE). More than one lakh applications have come from across the state under RTE. The documents of the applications received are being scrutinized by the nodal officers. After sorting, a list of eligible and ineligible will be made. So far applications of 24,052 students have been accepted.

It is noteworthy that applications were invited from March 6 to April 10 under RTE. More than one lakh applications have been received



across the state for about 54 thousand seats. The sorting of applications received from April 11 is going on, which will continue till May 11. According to the sorting done so far, 24,052 students have been considered eligible for admission. The lottery will be drawn on May 15 for the

first phase of admission.

The school will be allotted to the student after the name appears in the lottery. From June 16, the admission process will start in schools under RTE. Under RTE, 25 percent seats are reserved in private schools. In this context, there has been a decrease in RTE seats in

the state this year. In this academic session, 53,950 seats are reserved in private schools across the state. In the last education session, there were about 80,000 RTE seats across the state. Due to the change in the rules by the education department, there has been a decrease in the seats.

Till now, in many schools, admission was given under RTE in both first and nursery classes, but in this session only one class can be given by the School Education Department. Because of this there has been a decrease in RTE seats. Applications for the second phase for admission under RTE will start from July 1, students who

have missed applying in the first phase can apply in the second phase till July 15. The process of lottery and school allotment will begin on July 27.

The admission process will start in the allotted schools from August 3. The new academic session of most of the private schools in the state starts from April 1. Admission of children who get admission in first phase under RTE starts from 16th June. The admission process for the second phase continues till August 14. In this context, students taking admission on August 14 are left behind three months as compared to students studying from April.

Indian-American leader urges removal of Green Card cap

Washington, Apr 27 (PTI):

An eminent Indian-American community leader from Silicon Valley has urged US lawmakers

to remove the prevailing seven per cent cap on green cards, observing that the country-specific limit on the most sought-after residency document has created extensive backlog.

A Green Card is a document issued to immigrants to the US as evidence that the bearer has

been granted the privilege of residing in the country permanently.

Speaking at the US-India summit held at the US Capitol on Wednesday, Ajay Jain Bhutoria, an entrepreneur and community leader, asked why there was a cap on the Green Card if not on an H-1 visa.

"When we do not have a country's limit on giving an H-1 visa to support our companies, businesses and economy. Why should we have a country cap limit on green card issuance," Bhutoria said at the summit organised by Indian-American Congressman Ro Khanna in his capacity as Co-chair of the Congressional India Caucus.

The per-country caps are numerical limits on the issuance of green cards to individuals from certain countries.

Immigration law provides for approximately 140,000 employment-based green cards to be issued each year.

However, only seven per cent of those green cards can go to individuals from a single country annually.

If the number of individuals being sponsored from a single country is greater than seven per cent of the annual available total, a backlog forms and the excess approved petitions are not considered until a visa becomes available and their petition falls within the initial seven per cent per-country cap.

"These country-specific caps have created extensive backlogs, forcing individuals from certain countries – primarily India and China in the employment-based categories – to wait much longer than average to receive their green cards, simply because of their country of origin," he said.

We estimate that more than 880,000 people, including dependent spouses and children, are waiting in the US in employment-based green card backlogs.

In some categories, applicants who began the process in 2012 are just now able to file formally, meaning they may have waited more than a decade to join their families, even though they were already qualified to do so.

NATO countries have delivered more than 98 per cent of the combat vehicles promised to Ukraine amid its war with Russia, the military alliance's chief said on Thursday, giving Kyiv a bigger punch as it appears poised to launch a counteroffensive.

Along with more than 1,550 armoured vehicles, 230 tanks and other equipment, member nations have sent Ukraine "vast amounts of ammunition" and also trained and equipped more than nine new Ukrainian brigades, NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg said.

More than 30,000 troops are estimated to make up the new brigades. "This

Drug Safety Concerns

Pharmaceutical Industry Needs a Stronger Regulatory Framework

The another drug alert issued by the World Health Organization (WHO) about a contaminated cough syrup manufactured by a Punjab firm is yet another setback for India's pharmaceutical industry. This news is alarming and highlights the urgent need for reforms in India's drug regulatory system. India is considered to be the pharmacy of the world, with a pharmaceutical industry valued at \$50 billion, offering 60,000 generic brands across 60 therapeutic categories. However, quality concerns have plagued the industry, leading to distrust in the quality of drugs manufactured in the country. The lax and fragmented drug regulatory system in India has been a cause of concern for years, with reports of substandard and spurious drugs being sold in the market. The WHO alert is not the first of its kind. Last year, over 66 Gambian children died after consuming a syrup made by a Sonepat-based firm, which was linked to the lax regulatory system in India. The incident brought the regulatory system into the spotlight and highlighted the need for effective enforcement through capacity-building of state and national regulators. The Indian government has taken note of the issue and is working towards an overhaul of the drug regulatory mechanisms. The aim is to build trust in the quality of India-made drugs and salvage the image of being the pharmacy of the world, delivering affordable healthcare. The government has proposed a centralised database of drugs that will give regulators digital access to the credentials of pharmaceutical firms and drugs, ensuring time-bound and effective action against any firm flouting quality norms or not adhering to good manufacturing practices. The government also plans to create a unified digital portal that will bring together all stakeholders, be it the regulators, manufacturers, distributors, state-run departments or procurement agencies. Strengthening inspection teams under state drug controllers and increasing monitoring of repeat offenders are other measures being considered. Suggestions have also been put forth to consolidate drug regulation at the national level and cancel licenses of those found to be violating quality norms. However, these measures alone may not be sufficient to restore the confidence of consumers and the international community. The government needs to ensure that the reforms are implemented effectively and that the regulatory authorities have adequate resources and capabilities to enforce them. Moreover, the Indian pharmaceutical industry must also take responsibility for ensuring the quality of drugs manufactured in the country. The industry must adopt good manufacturing practices and comply with the regulatory requirements to ensure that their products meet the highest quality standards. India's pharmaceutical industry has made significant strides in the past few decades, providing affordable healthcare to millions of people around the world. However, the industry needs to balance its growth with a focus on quality to restore trust in India-made drugs. This requires a collaborative effort between the government and the industry, with a shared commitment to ensuring the safety and efficacy of drugs. WHO alert on the contaminated cough syrup manufactured in India is a wake-up call for the government and the pharmaceutical industry. The reforms being proposed by the government are a step in the right direction, but more needs to be done to ensure that India-made drugs are of the highest quality. The government must ensure effective implementation of the reforms, while the industry must take responsibility for complying with regulatory requirements and adopting good manufacturing practices. European countries fulfill more than half of their electricity needs from natural gas. In face of energy crisis led by war-lock Ukraine and Russia, European countries have now come to depend upon, along with other countries, India too to meet their demand of gas. For though we import crude oil, but export refined petroleum products that the refineries of the companies like 'Nyara' and 'Reliance' produce. Of such petroleum products most prominent is Vacuum gas oil (VGO), which is used as refinery feedstock and happens to be the main source of gasoline essential for the electricity production. And it is this gasoline that the European countries use for themselves. But among them France is exception to this. For within time it had fast started working in the direction of nuclear sector as an alternative to petrol. And therefore it is unaffected with the present crisis, as its 70% of electricity need gets fulfilled through nuclear power. Along with hydro-solar-wind power sector India also has long back taken forward the steps toward the acquiring nuclear power capabilities like France. One such plant is under construction in Kudankulam, Tamilnadu. It is notably regarding the same nuclear power plant that once church came into limelight for its protest against it. Demonstration, agitation and all the tactics that were possible it adopted to have the project shut down. The then minister of Manmohan Singh led UPA government, Narayan Samy, even had alleged that the two NGOs affiliated with bishop were given 54 crores rupees in the matter. Fortunately all the tactics failed, and construction of nuclear plant went ahead. Being built with the cooperation of Russia, the first phase construction of the plant had been completed in 2013. Second and third phases would have been completed by 2023. While rest of the phases are expected to have been completed by 2026-27. Today the biggest nuclear power plant of the Europe lies in Zaporizhzhia, Ukraine, which now has come under the occupation of Russia in the war. But now with completion, Kudankulam will get to be bigger than that, the cost of which is expected to be 90,000 crores. Now two reactors have got operative, their electrical production capacity being 1000 megawatt. While with 4 more reactors to have come into operation the total capacity will get to be 6000 megawatt.




Students perform during a religious procession of 15th-century Indian saint Chaitanya Mahaprabhu, in Kolkata, Thursday, April 27.

Janaki Navami or Sita Navami has great significance in Sanatan Dharma and Indian culture. JanakNandini and spouse of Bhagwan Ram was born or re-vealed on the Navami Tithi of Shukla Paksha of Vaishakh month. This day falls exactly one month after Sri Ram Navami and is celebrated with great pomp and gaiety all over the Indian Sub-continent.

MaaSita was the adopted daughter of Raja Janak, the king of Mithila (also called Videh), hence she is also termed as Janaki or JanakNandini. According to Sanatan Dharma mythology, Raja Janak was ploughing the land during a Yagna ritual at

present day Sitamarhi in Bihar, the border district of Nepal. He found a baby within a golden casket in the furrow of the field, whom the childless king accepted as the divine gift as his beloved daughter. Sri Ram was the Avatar of Bhagwan Vishnu and MaaSita is regarded as the embodiment of his wife Devi Lakshmi. She is also called Bhumija as she appeared from the Bhum i.e. the earth.

Prabhu Sri Ram and MaaSita are considered as an ideal couple. Although several hurdles had come in their way, they were firm about their relationship. The character of MaaSita is the epitome of an ideal woman in the human world and almost all

families have the ambition for a daughter, a spouse, a daughter-in-law, a sister-in-law, or a mother like Sita. She is known for her dedication, sincerity, courage, purity and self-sacrifice. She was a princess, but she accompanied her husband as a PativrataStree (devoted wife) during his exile. She loved Lakshman and Hanuman as her brother and son. She followed the traditions of helping the poor & Sant by providing Bhiksha to Ravan, who was disguised as Sadhu. She was intelligent and had the presence of mind to throw her jewels to the monkeys, which later helped Sri Ram-Sena to trace the abducted route. After her kidnapping, she warned Ravan for the debacle of his generation due to his misdeeds.

Sita was unhappy with her separation or informal divorce during her pregnancy, but she was courageous. She decided to give birth to children and equip them with all virtues. She lived as a single mother in the later part of her life. She didn't consider herself a victim and did not go back to Ayodhya to demand equal rights. She understood Sri Ram's internal struggle to choose the role between a king or a husband.

She performed her duty as the beloved daughter of Raja Janak's family, the daughter-in-law of Raja Dashrath's family, the spouse of Prabhu Ram, and lastly the mother of Maharaj Luv and Kush. When Luv and Kush were ac-

cepted by the Praja of Ayodhya and father Ram, her last role as mother was also completed and she returned to the womb of Dharmati Mata (the earth) to seek solace from the cruel world, where purity needs proof from women.

On the auspicious day of Janaki Navami, the married women observe Upwas (a day-long fast) for the longevity and success of their husbands and worship Sri Ram and MaaSita to seek their blessings. Along with deities of Ram, Sita and Lakshman, the plow representing Dharmati Mata (Earth) is also worshipped with proper Puja vidhi. Devotees chant the shlok of Rigveda (4.57.6) - "ArvachiSubhage Bhava Site VandamaheTva. Yatha Nah SubhagasakiYathah Nah Sufalasasi." (O Maa Site, come in front of us. We bow before you. O Goddess, enriched with supreme treasure and vibes, please show your kindness and generosity and be the harbinger of auspicious outcomes for us).

MaaSita, her character and struggle life is part and parcel of the enriched culture of the Indian Sub-continent. It is believed that by performing the Puja rituals and Vrat on Janaki Navami bestows virtues like modesty, motherhood, sacrifice and dedication and blesses a joyful and prosperous married life.

Legality of Same-Sex Marriages in India



'I won't forget the scene for the rest of my life'

Naxal Blast

Dantewada, Apr 27 (PTI): The driver of a Scorpio that was right behind the vehicle targeted by Naxals with an improvised explosive device (IED) in Chhattisgarh's Dantewada district on Wednesday said he won't be able to forget the day long as he lives.

He said a Multi-Utility Vehicle had just overtaken his Scorpio after he slowed down to chew pan masala. All 10 police personnel onboard the MUV and its driver died after Naxals detonated the IED and blew the vehicle into pieces. Soon after the blast, the security personnel travelling in his vehicle jumped out and took position along the road and opened fire towards the forest, said the driver requesting anonymity. "My vehicle was in the second position in the convoy. Seven security personnel were travelling in my vehi-

cle. I slowed down the vehicle 150-200 metres before the spot where the blast took place to chew pan masala. The vehicle which was behind us overtook us and suddenly an explosion occurred. I think my vehicle was the target but God saved us," said the driver, in his mid-20s. Before the cloud of dust and smoke settled, all the security personnel and he jumped out of the vehicle. "They took position along the road and started shouting to take cover and surround them (Naxals)

and firing randomly, he said. "The vehicle was blown in front of me. I saw pieces of bodies and the vehicle scattered on the road. I was completely shocked and crawled beneath my vehicle to hide," he said. The driver claimed that the firing continued for about 15 minutes but he did see any movement in the jungle.

"The security personnel told me to return to Aranpur following which I drove the vehicle back to the police station, around one km away from the attack site.

On the way back, I informed the two vehicles, carrying police personnel, which were coming from behind about the incident. However, by then they had realised that something had happened as the sound of the blast was so high that it could have been heard from far," he said.

'NCRB data on human trafficking in Kashmir just the tip of iceberg'

Srinagar, Apr 27 (PTI): The National Commission for Women (NCW) chairperson Rekha Sharma on Thursday said human trafficking increased by 15.56 per cent in Jammu and Kashmir last year as compared to the 2021-22 financial year but it is "just the tip of the iceberg". "In the last few years, we have seen in Kashmir also that women are getting targeted. The NCRB data shows that it has increased 15.56 per cent last year compared to 2021-22. And this is just the tip of the iceberg because the data does not give the true picture," Sharma told PTI, ahead of the anti-human trafficking workshop organised by

the NCW here. Sharma said the purpose of holding the workshop in Kashmir was to make people aware of the menace of human trafficking. "We must now work to save our daughters and our children. This is the main purpose of making it (work-

shop) happen in Kashmir," she said. "Human trafficking is a serious crime and it does not have boundaries whether it is Kashmir or Kanyakumari. This is prevalent everywhere. And sometimes, the victims of the trafficking do not even know that they are the victims," Sharma said. "The main problem is due to lack of awareness. This is our first of its kind programme in Jammu and Kashmir where all the forces — state commissions, NGOs — are together to make people aware, especially the students, that nobody is out of reach of this problem," the NCW chief said.



Anand Mohan walks out of jail amidst protests

Patna/Saharsa, Apr 27 (PTI): Gangster-turned-politician Anand Mohan, who was serving a life sentence for killing an IAS officer in Bihar three decades ago, walked out on Thursday amid protests by family members and well-wishers of the slain bureaucrat.

Mohan, who had been an MP prior to his conviction in 2007, was released from Saharsa jail on Thursday morning after being behind the bars for 15 years.

The gangster-turned-politician's supporters who believe that their leader was "framed" in the murder of G Krishnaiah,

the then district magistrate of Gopalganj, had planned a celebratory pro-

cession but the release was done in a manner which precluded any such gathering. Krishnaiah, who hailed from Telangana and was from a scheduled caste, was beaten to death by a mob in 1994 when his vehicle tried to overtake a funeral procession in Muzaffarpur district.

Mohan, who was the sitting MLA from Mahishi,

was leading the procession taken out upon the death of his close associate Chhotan Shukla, another dreaded gangster who fell to bullets of his rivals before realizing his political ambitions.

Mohan's name figured in a list of more than 20 prisoners who were ordered to be set free by a notification issued by the

state law department earlier this week as they had spent more than 14 years behind bars.

His remission of sentence followed an April 10 amendment of Bihar Prison Manual by the Nitish Kumar government whereby the restriction on early release of those involved in killing of a public servant on duty was done away with.

This, critics claim was done to help release Mohan. The relaxation has predictably been opposed by the wife and daughter of Krishnaiah. They have appealed to the Bihar government to reconsider the move, which has also drawn condemnation from the IAS Officers' Association.
