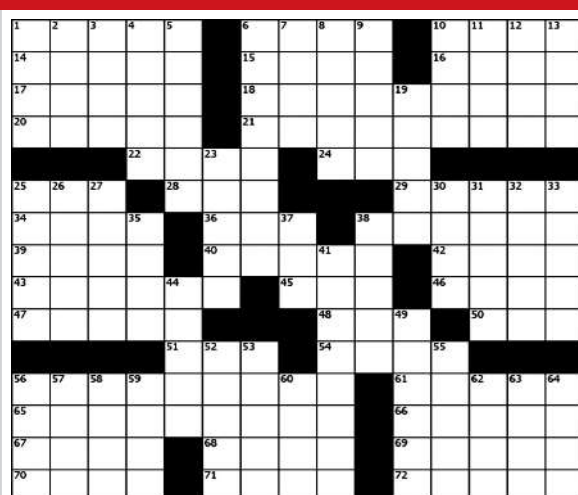

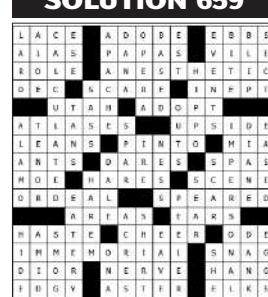

# India enter Junior Asia Cup semifinal with 17-0 win over Thailand

Salalah (Oman), May 29 (PTI): Defending champions India moved into the semifinals of the Men's Junior Asia Cup with a 17-0 win over Thailand in their last Pool A match. India, who are likely to top the four-team Pool A with 10 points from four games after victories over Chinese Taipei, Japan and Thailand and a 1-1 draw against Pakistan, were unstoppable with Angad Bir Singh scoring four goals (13th, 33rd, 47th, 55th min).



They will know about their semifinal opponents later on Monday when Pool B leaders Malaysia are scheduled to play Oman and Pakistan will take on Japan in Pool A. Pakistan could push India to second spot in Pool A if they beat Japan in their last group match by more than 14 goals. Besides Angad, the other goal-getters for India late on Sunday night were Yogember Rawat (17th), captain Uttam Singh (24th, 31st), Amandeep Lakra (26th, 29th), Arajjeet Singh Hundal (36th), Vishnukant Singh (38th), Bobby Singh Dhama (45th), Sharda Nand Tiwari (46th),

Amandeep (47th), Rohit (49th), Sunit Lakra (54th) and Rajinder Singh (56th). India began the contest with confidence, attacking Thailand with monotonous regularity, but were unable to break through in the early exchanges. Thailand not only soaked up the pressure but also made some forays into the rival territory. However, the defending champions

edged ahead just before the end of the first quarter when Angad (13th) found the back of the net. Yogember Rawat doubled the advantage in the 17th minute and before the half ended, captain Uttam (24th) had also got on the score-sheet, scoring from close range. Uttam (31st) made it 6-0 in the first minute of the third quarter, rifling it into

## BWF extends ban on 'spin serve' until end of Paris Olympics

New Delhi: The Badminton World Federation (BWF) has decided to extend the ban on the new 'spin serve' until the conclusion of the Paris Olympics and Paralympic Games next year. The ruling will be applied from the Thailand Open Super 500 tournament starting in Bangkok on Tuesday.

Ahead of the Sudirman Cup, the BWF had put an interim ban on the use of the experimental serve until May 29, 2023. "After consultation with the badminton community, BWF Council believed it best to forbid the spin serve for another 15 months so as to not impact the Olympic and Paralympic qualifying periods and the Games themselves," the BWF said in a statement.

The experimental spin serve had caught the attention of the world's top badminton players with even the Indian doubles shuttlers putting in the hard yards to master this latest skill, which many believe can give "unfair" advantage to the players. It was first started by Danish doubles player Marcus Rindshoj, who accumulated a bunch of points with this innovative spin serve at the Polish Open last month.

This is a kind of serve where the shuttlecock is between his or her thumb and middle finger and tries to put a spin to it with a carrom strike motion before sending it across the net with the racquet. BWF secretary general Thomas Lund reiterated that the "BWF welcomed innovation in badminton" but added that "more evidence was needed on the potential effects" of the serve before introducing it on a full scale.

It began with the ground staff immediately rushing to the middle to cover the centre with multiple layers of the sheet as the mid-innings show ended, but the

game began soon after as it was just a drizzle. However, a mere three balls into the second innings with CSK openers Devon Conway (0 not out) and Ruturaj Gaekwad (4 not out), the heavens opened up again. For the fans, unfortunately, it was yet another test of patience as sudden rains left them drenched, with plenty of them remaining seated while it poured heavily for about 10 minutes.

## Australia believe they can win from any situation: Sthalekar



New Delhi, May 29 (PTI): The Indian women's cricket team has been guilty of losing knock out matches at global events far too many times and Lisa Sthalekar, the former Australia captain who knows a lot about winning, feels it can only break the jinx by getting over the line in a high-stake game. Over the past couple of years, India have stretched Australia to the limit in bilaterals as well as ICC events but it has not been enough to end their title drought in world events. Both at the T20 World Cup this year and the Commonwealth Games in 2022, India had Australia on the mat before throwing it away. Australia ruled the game when Sthalekar was playing and the Meg Lanning-led side has taken that dominance to invincible levels. "When I was playing and it is the same now, the Australian team believes it can win from any situation, simply because it has done it in the past. I can talk about my generation. At my state team New South Wales, we used to win national titles regularly and there were times we should not have won but

we managed to somehow. "So once you have that belief, it is very hard to train and coach that. You got to be put in those situations and you need to come out of it successfully to start believing that (you can win from any situation). "For India, they have been this close so many times, they just need to get over the line and the tide will change," Sthalekar told PTI. The 43-year-old Pune-born cricketer believes a bigger pool of players will help India get more competitive on the field. "Besides the WPL (Women's Premier League), potentially if they can put together an India A side that travels that will be an important stepping stone to creating a bucket of players who are pushing for selection at the highest level. "Once there is a big influx for fighting for positions, then this Indian team would go to the next level. They are the one side that pushes Australia regularly. With more competitive cricket regularly, whether state or WPL or A side, you might see them win those crucial moments in an ICC event."

# WTC Final promises thrills, sell-out crowds

New Delhi, May 29 (PTI):

The International Cricket Council is expecting a sell-out crowd for at least the first four days of the World Test Championship final between India and Australia at The Oval in London from June 7. The ICC has also kept a reserve day for the title clash if weather plays spoilsport. "We have been working very closely with the local organising committee (ECB) to ensure it is a great spectacle for the fans. We are expecting full crowds for each of at least the first four days. We know we are heading in the right direction. "It has created huge interest in terms of fans, and two best teams in the world will be slugging it out, it is set to be a fantastic event. "We hope the weather stays clear so we can get the full amount of cricket, though we have a reserve day to make up for



lost time," said Wasim Khan, ICC general manager of cricket, in a select media interaction. The final of the inaugural edition also involved

India, who finished runners up to New Zealand in Southampton two years ago. Asked why the game is being played in the UK for the second edition in a row, Wasim said the location goes well with the scheduling of the final. The Oval also serves as a neutral venue for both teams. "The way the WTC cycle is set up, we are playing in the northern hemisphere summer. We look for diverse venues, currently as it stands within England. Lord's was considered but decision was made on The Oval for this edition. "In terms of the final every two years, the UK very much suits the set up of the tournament because it very much falls in line with the northern hemisphere," he said.

## Hazlewood in Australia's 15-member squad for WTC final against India



London, May 29 (PTI):

Australia pacer Josh Hazlewood has been included in the 15-member squad for the World Test Championship (WTC) final against India beginning at The Oval on June 7. The 32-year-old had flown back home from the Indian Premier League before his side Royal Challengers Bangalore's must-win game against

Gujarat Titans due to a side soreness. He has, however, been included in the squad alongside fellow pacers, Test skipper Pat Cummins, Mitchell Starc and Scott Boland. The inclusion of Hazlewood, a veteran of 59 Tests and 222 wickets, means the selectors no longer need to bring in all-rounders Michael Neser or Sean Abbott into the squad as cover. Both Neser and Abbott are playing country cricket and Australian chief coach Andrew McDonald had said recently they could be drafted into the squad if anyone in the touring party got injured. Hazlewood, though, has struggled with injuries of late. He joined the RCB camp late as he was recovering from an Achilles injury. He has played just four Tests since December 2021 due to a side strain.

## Sable finishes 10th in 3000m steeplechase at Rabat Diamond League

Rabat (Morocco), May 29 (PTI): National record holder Avinash Sable failed to live up to expectations as he finished 10th in the 3000m steeplechase event at the second leg of the prestigious Diamond League meeting series here. The 28-year-old Sable, a 2022 Commonwealth Games silver medallist, clocked 8:17.18s, nearly six seconds off his national mark of 8:11.20s in his season-opening race of his pet event on Sunday. Eighteen runners started the race but only 14 could finish it. Host country's world and Olympic champion Soufiane El Bakkali clocked a world leading and personal best time of 7:56.68s, the all-time eighth fastest of the event, as his ferocious pace destroyed the field. Ethiopia's Getnet Wale and Kenya's 2022



Commonwealth Games gold medallist Abraham Kibiwot were distant second and third respectively with personal best times of 8:05.15s and 8:05.51. Sable struggled to keep up with the pace and he found himself along with

the trailing pack, though he clocked his fourth career-best time. Last year, he had clocked 8:12.48s for a fifth-place finish at the same event here. Meanwhile, 18-year-old Selva Prabhu Thirumaran bettered his own junior national record in triple jump with a performance of 16.78m en route to winning gold in the World Athletics Continental Tour Bronze level meet at Venizeleia-Chania in Greece. Thirumaran's earlier junior national record of 16.58m was set in a meet in Havana, Cuba, earlier this month. He had won a silver in the U-20 World Athletics Championships last year. National record holder Jeswin Aldrin finished fifth in long jump with a best effort of 7.66m at the same meet on Sunday. Aldrin's national record stands at 8.42m.

## Neeraj Chopra pulls out of FBK Games after suffering muscle strain

New Delhi, May 29 (PTI):

Reigning Olympic champion javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra on Monday said he has suffered a muscle strain and was pulling out of next month's FBK Games as a precautionary measure. "Recently, I sustained a muscle strain during my training. Following a medical evaluation, me and my team have decided to avoid any risks which can aggravate the injury," the world No. 1 wrote on Twitter. "Unfortunately, it means that I have to withdraw from the FBK Games, in Hengelo. Wishing the organisers and the tournament all the success." A World Athletics Continental Tour Gold level event, the Fanny Blankers-Koen Games at Hengelo in the Netherlands is scheduled on June 4. The 25-year-old, who enjoyed a perfect start to the season by winning



the Doha Diamond League on May 5 with a throw of 88.67m, is likely to be back in action at the Paavo Nurmi Games in Turku, Finland, on June 13.

"Injuries are part of the journey, but it's never easy. I am on the road to recovery, and will aim to be back on the track in June," Neeraj added.

## Seven nabbed with banned tablets worth Rs 7000

well with them. On conducting checking, the police found banned psychotropic tablets in the car with Nitravet-10 and Alprajolam and they failed to produce any valid documents in support of keeping such banned tablets. On this the seven including a minor boy were nabbed with 1520 pieces of banned tablets worth Rs 7000 and sold amount of cash worth Rs 1400 and five mobile phones and Venue car bearing No.CG 04/N/D/9182 and Swift Dzire vehicle bearing No. CG 04-NU-4374. The police has filed a case under section 22 C of Narcotics Act against all the accused and the accused informed that they have brought the banned tablets from Odisha. ## LMWH effective in Thromboembolism

● Workshop on basic intensive care for pregnant and obstetrics at Pt JNM Medical College



Raipur, May 29: Pt JNM Medical College Dean Dr Tripti Nagaria, called for special care during vaginal delivery in women to avoid injury to babies on the last day of the two-day workshop organized at the Telemedicine Hall of Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar Memorial Hospital, Raipur on Monday. For this, she informed the participants about the correct methods of safe delivery through an artificial model. The workshop was organized under the joint auspices of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and the Department of Anesthesia and Critical Care of the Hospital. Senior Gynecologist and Obstetrician Dr. Asha Jain, while addressing the workshop on "Checking the condition of the fetus of seriously ill pregnant women", said that whenever there is a contraction in the uterus, the heart-beat of the baby increases, but it becomes normal as soon as the contraction is

removed. When the heart rate starts decreasing instead of increasing, it indicates the serious condition of the fetus. In such a situation, the baby can be saved through a caesarean delivery soon. She gave detailed information about antenatal CTG i.e. cardiocography in relation to the heart rate of the baby during pregnancy. Guest spokesperson Dr Simant Kumar Jha and Dr Prafulla Agnihotri, from New Delhi, told that many times the pregnant woman dies immediately after delivery. In such a sudden event, the causes of death are not known, while the cause can also be thromboembolic disease in pregnancy. The risk of thromboembolism during pregnancy is higher than that of normal women. This is because the uterus puts pressure on the vena cava (a large vein in the body

that carries blood from other areas of the body to the heart), reducing blood flow. Process of blood clotting also becomes unbalanced due to the effect of hormones in pregnancy. In such a situation, the possibility of death of the pregnant and the child increases due to the formation of thromboembolism. Its risk starts increasing during the increasing trimester of pregnancy. Now-a-days due to advancement of medical science this problem of pregnancy can be controlled by giving advanced medicines like blood thinner called Low Molecular Weight Heparin (LMWH). Dr. Jyoti Jaiswal, Head of the Department of Gynecology, said that there are not many options for drugs for thromboembolism in pregnant women, so only low molecular weight heparin can

be given. While giving it, it has to be kept in mind that the number of platelets in the blood of a pregnant woman should be above 75 thousand. Dr. Jaya Lalwani, Professor of Anesthesia and Critical Care of the Medical College and Dr. Sarita Ramchandani on Acute Kidney Injury also addressed the workshop on the topic of maternal mortality and heart attack. According to Dr. Jyoti Jaiswal, this workshop will prove to be very useful for all medical students and professionals in the direction of intensive medical care of pregnant women. The director of the workshop was Dr. Tripti Nagaria, Dean and Senior Gynecologist of Pt Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, while the coordinators were Dr. Jaya Lalwani and Dr. Jyoti Jaiswal.

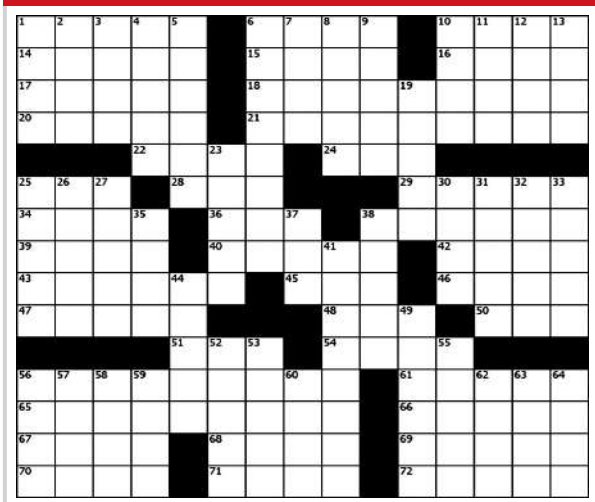
