US national

New Delhi: A US national allegedly carrying six live bullet rounds in his baggage was apprehended by the CISF at the Delhi international airport recently, official sources said on Wednesday. The passenger, who was bound for Helsinki onboard a Finnair flight on May 22 from the Indra Gandhi International (IGI) Airport, was handed over to the Delhi Police, which booked him under sections of the Arms Act. The passenger has now been released on bail, they said, adding the bullets were of the Hornady 357 Mag caliber.

Vande Bharat

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will flag off the inaugural run of the Vande Bharat Express from Dehradun to Delhi on Thursday via video conferencing, his office said. This will be the first Vande Bharat to be introduced in Uttarakhand, the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) said on Wednesday. With world-class amenities, it will herald a new era of comfortable travel experience, especially for tourists travelling to the state, the PMO said. Prime Minister Modi will flag off the inaugural run of the Vande Bharat Express from Dehradun to Delhi on May 25 at 11 am, it said.

Cryptocurrency fraud

New Delhi: Three men were arrested for allegedly duping people of lakhs of rupees on the pretext of investing in cryptocurrency, police said on Wednesday. The accused were identified as Pushkar Jat (22), Vishal Tank (21) and Nitesh Mali (20), they said. According to police, the matter came to light in April after a complaint was filed by a resident of Mayur Vihar who alleged that she was cheated on the pretext of investing money in cryptocurrency. She was, instead, duped of Rs 7.80 lakh by a group of cheaters active on the Telegram application.

Car crash

Mathura (UP): Four people were killed and one was seriously injured on Wednesday when a car ramed into a tree in this district, police said. The accident took place near Pilkhuni village under Raya police station limits, they said. The car was travelling to Mathura from Baldeo town of the district, police said. Five people were injured and rushed to district hospital, where doctors declared four of them brought dead, Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Shailesh Kumar Pandey said.

PARLIAMENT BUILDING INAUGURATION

19 opposition parties to boycott ceremony

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

As many as 19 parties, including the Congress, Left, TMC, SP and AAP, on Wednesday announced their decision to boycott the inauguration of the new Parliament building by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on May 28, saying they find no value in a new building when the "soul of democracy has been sucked out".

Noting that the inauguration of the Parliament building is a momentous occasion, the opposition parties in a joint statement said, "despite our belief that the government is threatening democracy, and our disapproval of the autocratic manner in which the new Parliament was built, we were open to sinking our differences and marking this occasion".

'Sengol' in new building will serve as reminder of responsibility to uphold righteous governance

New Delhi: Installation of the sceptre 'Sengol' in the new Parliament building will be a historic moment for India as it will serve as a reminder of the responsibility to uphold righteous governance for the nation, Union ministers and BJP leaders said on Wednesday. Union Home Minister Amit Shah earlier in the day announced that the historical sceptre from Tamil Nadu will find a place in the new Parliament building to be inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on May 28. The sceptre was received by first prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru to represent transfer of power from the British and was kept till now in a museum in Allahabad.



Modi's decision to inaugurate the new Parliament building by himself, "completely sidelining President Droupadi Murmu, is not only a grave insult but a direct assault on our democracy which demands a commensurate response".

Modi will inaugurate the new Parliament building on May 28 following an invitation by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla. "When the soul of democracy has been sucked out from Parliament, we find no value in a new building. We announce our collective decision to boycott the inauguration of the new Parliament building," the parties said.

"We will continue to fight - in letter, in spirit, and in substance - against this 'authoritarian' prime minister and his government, and take our message directly to the people of India," the opposition parties said.

Houses of eight Pak-based terrorists raided

Jammu, May 24 (PTI)

The Jammu and Kashmir Police Special Investigation Unit (SIU) on Wednesday conducted raids on houses of eight Pakistan-based terrorists at multiple locations in Kishtwar and Ramban districts, senior officials said. The raids were carried out in Padder, Keshwan and Thakrai in Kishtwar and Khari and Banihal in Ramban to scuttle attempts by these terrorists to revive militancy in the Chenab valley region, they said. Senior Superintendent of Police, Kishtwar, Khalil Ahmad Poswal said the searches at the houses of Azad Hussain, Gazi-ud-Din, Bashir Ahmed Mughal and Sattar Din, alias Rajab, were conducted after search warrants were obtained from a special NIA court in Jammu in a case under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. "The searches are aimed at eliminating the militant ecosystem in the district by identifying various over-ground workers and supporters of militancy," the officer said.

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Two killed as bus overturns in Raigarh

Raigarh, May 24 (PTI)

Two passengers were killed and 26 others, including women and children, injured when a private bus overturned in Chhattisgarh's Raigarh district on Wednesday morning, police said. Eleven of those injured are serious, they said. The accident took place when the bus was going to Raigarh from Lailunga town in the district.

The bus driver lost control of the vehicle which overturned at Charbhanta turn under Gharghoda police station limits, said Dipak Mishra, sub-

divisional officer of police, Dharamjaigarh area.

Two passengers died on the spot, while 26 others, including 10 women and two children, sustained injuries, he said. After being alerted about the accident, police reached the spot and launched a rescue operation, he said. Of the injured, 11 were referred to a medical college in Raigarh as they are in serious condition, while 12 were admitted to the Primary Health Centre, Gharghoda. The remaining three are being treated at a hospital in Raigarh, Mishra said.

'Why interested in telecasting narco test of Aaftab on TV'

HC asks news channel

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

The Delhi High Court Wednesday sought to know from news channel Aaj Tak why it wanted to telecast the recording of narco analysis conducted on Aaftab Amin Poonawala, the man accused of strangling his live-in partner Shraddha Walkar and dismembering her body. Justice Rajnish Bhatnagar's poser came while hearing an application by the news channel seeking vacation of its April 19 order by which all media channels were re-

strained from displaying or telecasting any material connected with the case.

The high court issued notice and sought the response of the Delhi Police on the application and listed the application for further hearing on August 3, the date already fixed in the main petition.

The application was filed in a pending petition of the Delhi Police in which they have sought restraining media houses from publishing, printing and disseminating confidential information contained in the charge sheet and other such material collected during the course of investigation.

Special Prosecutor Amit Prasad, representing the Delhi Police, opposed the channel's application and said he will file a reply.

During the hearing, the high court said there are more heinous cases than this and 20 murders take place all over India daily. "What is so special about this case?" asked the bench.

"Was the Nirbhaya case played on TV channels? Why are you choosing this particular case?" it asked and wondered whether the channel would similarly display the developments in the Atiq Ahmed murder case investigation.


'India-Australia ties in 'T-20 mode' now'

Sydney, May 24 (PTI)

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday used cricket analogy to describe the rapid upswing in India-Australia ties as he said that the bilateral relations have entered the "T-20 mode".

Modi made the comments after holding wide-ranging talks with his Australian counterpart Anthony Albanese that focused on further expansion of the comprehensive strategic partnership between the two countries.

The prime minister also invited Albanese and Australian cricket fans to India for the Cricket World Cup tournament which is taking place in the coun-

statement. "If I may say in the language of cricket, our ties have entered the T-20 mode," he said in the presence of Albanese.

"I invite Prime Minister Albanese and all Australian cricket fans to come to India for the Cricket World Cup to be held in India this year. At that time, along with cricket, you will also get to see the grand celebration of Diwali," he said.

Modi also highlighted the importance of India-Australia relations for the region.

"The scope of India-Australia relations is not limited to merely our two countries. It is also linked to regional stability, peace and global welfare," he said.

Man impersonates Army officer to cheat people, held

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

A 26-year-old man was arrested for allegedly posing as an Army officer and duping people on the pretext of purchasing goods for army school, police said on Wednesday.

The accused, Harish, hails from Hidayatpur village in Palwal district of Haryana. He used to run 'White Global ATM' in Bamni village in Bharatpur district of Rajasthan, they said.

As of now, a total of five complaints registered in various states have been identified that are linked to the accused and money trail of more than Rs 70

lakh is found in these fraudulent accounts, police said. According to police, the matter came to light after a Delhi resident told them that he received a call from an unknown caller on June 30, 2022. The person called him on the pretext of purchasing pipes for army school and introduced himself as an Army officer. The accused duped him of Rs 10,47,605. Deputy Commissioner of Police (Shahdara) Rohit Meena said that the probe team collected all the relevant information including Call Detail Record and WhatsApp chat. All bank details and phone numbers of the accused were analysed.

Ram temple to open in January next year

Infra works expedited in Ayodhya

Lucknow, May 24 (PTI)

The Uttar Pradesh government has expedited infrastructure works in Ayodhya, including expansion of its airport and railway station, as the city prepares for the opening of the Ram temple in January next year, according to a statement.

Work is also in progress on the Ram Path, a 13-km road from Sahadatganj to Naya Ghat, it said. The

outline for the construction of the Ramjanaki Path and the Bhakti Path is also ready, the statement issued here said. The airport and the railway station are also being expanded, it added. These road corridors are important as these will facilitate the movement of devotees to the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi and the Hanuman Garhi temple, the statement said.

The width of the Ram Janmabhoomi Path will be 30 metres and the width of the Bhakti Path will be 14 metres, it said. Chief

Minister Yogi Adityanath has invited people to come for the Ram temple's opening, it said and added that he is reviewing the progress of different works regularly. Supporting the government's initiative to develop Ayodhya, shopkeepers, without any resistance, have given the land of their shops for the construction of the "grand" temple and its other facilities, the statement said.

There has been no complaint of any irregularity in disbursement of compensation under this project, it said.

Delhi court dismisses default bail pleas of two accused

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

A Delhi court on Wednesday dismissed the bail applications of two accused persons in a money laundering case lodged against AAP leader Satyendar Kumar Jain in a disproportionate assets case. Special Judge Vikas Dhull dismissed the default bail application filed by Vaibhav Jain and Ankush Jain, who are accused of abetting Satyendar Kumar Jain in acquisition of assets disproportionate to his known sources of income. Both had moved the application, claiming they deserved to be granted statutory bail as the charge sheet filed against them was incomplete.

Entire process of Rs 2000 notes withdrawal will be non-disruptive: RBI Guv


New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das on Wednesday said that RBI is monitoring the situation regularly with regard to the withdrawal of Rs 2,000 currency notes and expressed confidence that the entire exercise will be completed in a non-disruptive manner.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Friday announced the withdrawal of Rs 2000 denomination banknotes as part of its currency management and permitted the exchange of Rs 2000 currency notes up to Rs 20,000 in one go from Tuesday onwards. The exchange or deposit

window is available until September 30, 2023. He said that RBI has given four-month time for exchanging as well as depositing the Rs 2,000 currency notes to ensure that there is no hardship faced by anyone. "Yesterday there was no crowd anywhere. And we are monitoring the situation regularly. I don't think there is any concern or any major issue which is coming out...business activities going on," he said. Justifying the deadline, he said unless there is a timeline in any process, it's not effective. "So you need to give a timeline and we have given sufficient time," he added. Replying to ques-

tions at an event organised by industry body CII, Governor Das said the entire process of withdrawal of the high-denomination currency will be non-disruptive. "The entire process will be non-disruptive. We have made our analysis about that," the Governor said. The Rs 2000 notes constitute around 10.8 per cent of total currency in circulation or Rs 3.6 lakh crore. Das said these notes had completed the lifecycle and the purpose has been fulfilled. "It's not being used in transactions...any high denomination currency just remaining here and there, it has other collateral issues," he said.

BJP Dist Prez inspects Gauthans; condemns govt for mismanagement

**Bhilai, May 24:**

BJP workers led by Bhilai District President Brijesh Bichpuriya inspected various Gauthans and condemned the state government over several issues. Bichpuriya alleged that it is a Gauthan scam of Rs 1300 crores. He said that about 150 cattle were seen in a sorry condition at Gauthan located in front of D Mart in Bypass Road. They also inspected the Gauthan located near Kurud overbridge, where not even a board was installed. They saw a bull in

a dying condition at this Gauthan and there were neither doctors nor any other arrangement. When the bull died in front of the BJP workers, Bichpuriya immediately contacted Durg District Collector and apprised him about the situation and narrated the chaos prevailing in Gauthan. After this, the administration made arrangements of fodder at this Gauthan. Bichpuriya said that an amount of Rs19 lakh has been approved for this Gauthan, but works worth not even Rs 19000 are visible. There

is no arrangement of drinking water, fodder, shed, etc. The cattle were in a sorry condition under the scorching sun. BJP Dist President tried to contact the BMC Commissioner as well as the Zone Commissioner, but they did not respond to the mobile call. Bichpuriya said that they are conducting 'Chalbo Gauthan Kholbo Poll' campaign to expose the irregularities in the Gauthans, which have become the center of scams. He said that they have found huge irregularities

in the Gauthans. He alleged that the entire scheme has been made for the purpose of corruption, in which money from central schemes has been misused. A scam of Rs 1300 crore is clearly visible, he asserted. He further alleged that Congress leaders and the top officials are filling their pockets through this scheme.

Three commercial areas being developed in Bhilai-Charoda

Bhilai, May 24:

Collector Pushpendra Kumar Meena reviewed the development works in the urban areas of the district at a meeting held on Tuesday. Planned phase for the development and construction in the urban areas was discussed. Collector sought information from the concerned officers regarding the development of the four urban bodies. In the meeting, the road map being made for development in the urban body was presented by Ajay Tripathi, Commissioner of Municipal Corporation Bhilai Charoda. He gave information regarding the ongoing development in Market Niharika (near Sirsa Chowk), Bhilai 03 Market (ward no 16 near Old Bhilai Bazar Chowk) and beside Charoda Marketline GE Road identified for ideal commercial premises. The commissioner said that there is a heavy load of traffic in all these areas. Therefore, places have been marked for parking at the nearest

site of these areas. Along with this, due to being a marketplace, special attention has been given to basic things like CCTV, drinking water, toilets, storm water drains, street lights, plantations etc. The works related to the proposed vending zone are also being done on a war footing. By setting up the market in a planned manner, the disorganized kiosks on the road can be arranged and the shopkeepers working in the kiosks can be given a permanent option. Niharika Complex (Near Sirsa Chowk) - Due to high traffic load in Niharika Complex area, three places have been marked for parking in the vacant lot nearest to the campus, along with vending zone, plantation,

drinking water, toilet, CCTV, the work of storm water drain, street light etc is being done with continuous monitoring. The parking site on the side of GE Road and Service Lane is complete. Apart from this, work is being done on other work plans with continuous monitoring. Bhilai 3 Market - Information was also given by the Commissioner regarding Bhilai 3, the oldest and densely populated market. He said that 3 parking spots have been marked here as well. Raipur, May 24: Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, while inaugurating a three-day National Consultative Workshop on soil and water conservation in Raipur on Tuesday evening, stated that the whole world is concerned about Climate Change, but the welfare of forest dwellers is equally important.

India, Australia aim to conclude comprehensive trade deal by end of 2023

Sydney, May 24 (PTD):

India and Australia on Wednesday inked a migration and mobility partnership pact to open up opportunities for students, academic researchers and business people and resolved to conclude a comprehensive trade deal by the end of year to significantly expand economic ties.

The pact was signed after wide-ranging talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Australian counterpart Anthony Albanese.

In his media statement, Albanese said the aim is to conclude the comprehensive economic cooperation agreement (CECA) by the end of the year.

"We reiterated our shared ambition for an early conclusion of the Australia-India comprehensive economic cooperation agreement later this year," he said in the presence of Modi.

Last year, India and Australia finalised the Economic Cooperation Trade Agreement (ECTA) and it came into force in

December last. The two sides are now working on the CECA.

"Today, in my meeting with Prime Minister Albanese, we talked about taking India-Australia Comprehensive Strategic Partnership to greater heights in the next decade," Modi said.

"We discussed in detail the possibilities of cooperation in new areas. Last year India-Australia ECTA came into effect. Today we have decided to focus on

CECA — Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement," he said.

Modi said the pact will give further strength and new dimensions to trade and economic cooperation between the two countries.

"We had constructive discussions on strengthening our strategic cooperation in the sectors of mining and critical minerals. We have identified concrete areas for cooperation in renewable energy," Modi said.

"It was decided to set up a task force on Green Hydrogen," he added.

Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra said the next two rounds of talks on the economic partnership pact have been scheduled for June and July.

Modi and Albanese also witnessed the signing of the terms of reference of the Australia-India Green Hydrogen Taskforce which will explore opportunities in the area of renewable hydrogen.

Russia's Wagner boss says more than 20,000 of his troops died in Bakhmut battle

Kyiv, May 24 (AP):

The head of the Russian private army Wagner says his force lost more than 20,000 fighters in the drawn-out battle for Bakhmut, with about 20 per cent of the 50,000 Russian convicts he recruited to fight in the 15-month war dying in the eastern Ukrainian city.

The figure was in stark contrast with claims from Moscow that it lost just over 6,000 troops in the war, and is higher than the official estimate of the Soviet losses in the Afghanistan war of 15,000 troops between 1979-89.

Ukraine hasn't said how many of its soldiers have died since Russia's full-scale invasion in February 2022.

Analysts believe the

nine-month fight for Bakhmut alone have cost the lives of tens of thousands of soldiers, among them convicts who reportedly received little training before being sent to the front.

Russia's invasion goal of "demilitarising" Ukraine has backfired because Kyiv's military has become stronger with the supply of weapons and training by its Western allies, Wagner chief Yevgeny Prigozhin said in an interview published late Tuesday with Konstantin Dolgov, a pro-Kremlin political strategist.

Prigozhin also said the Kremlin's forces have killed civilians during the war, something Moscow has repeatedly and vehemently denied.

Prigozhin, a wealthy businessman with long-time links to Russian President Vladimir Putin, is known for his bluster — often spiced with obscenities — and has previously made unverifiable claims, some of which he later backtracked on.

Earlier this month, his spokespeople published a video of him shouting, swearing and pointing at about 30 uniformed bodies lying on the ground, saying they were Wagner fighters who died in a single day. He claimed the Russian Defence Ministry had starved his men of ammunition and threatened to give up the fight for Bakhmut.

He also said in Tuesday's interview it was possible that Kyiv's anticipated counteroffensive

in coming weeks, given continued Western support, might push Russian forces out of southern and eastern Ukraine as well as annexed Crimea.

"A pessimistic scenario: the Ukrainians are given missiles, they prepare troops, of course they will continue their offensive, try to counterattack," he said. "They will attack Crimea, they will try to blow up the Crimean bridge (to the Russian mainland), cut off (our) supply lines. Therefore, we need to prepare for a hard war."

The Ukrainian General Staff said Wednesday that "heavy fighting" is continuing inside Bakhmut, days after Russia said that it completely captured the devastated city.

UK PM Sunak gives Suella Braverman clean chit on driving fine row

London, May 24 (PTD):

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak on Wednesday said that his Home Secretary, Suella Braverman, will not face an investigation into her reported actions related to a driving fine after she was caught speeding last year.

After days of speculation around The Sunday Times' newspaper claims that Braverman appealed to civil servants to try and avert the normal course of action after being caught speeding, Sunak wrote to his minister to say that he did not believe the actions amounted to a breach of the ministerial code of conduct. The Opposition parties had been demanding Sunak refer the Indian-origin minister to his Independent Adviser on ethics, Sir Laurie Magnus, to determine if there had been a breach.

"I have consulted with my Independent Adviser. He has advised that on this occasion further investigation is not necessary and I have accepted



that advice. On the basis of your letter and our discussion, my decision is that these matters do not amount to a breach of the Ministerial Code," Sunak writes in a letter to Braverman.

"As you have recognised, a better course of action could have been taken to avoid giving rise to the perception of im-

propriety. Nevertheless, I am reassured you take these matters seriously. You have provided a thorough account, apologised and expressed regret," he said, with reference to Braverman's letter to her boss apologising for the "distraction" the controversy had caused the government.

Sunak reiterated that he believes integrity, professionalism and accountability are core values of his leadership and it is right when issues are raised, they are looked at professionally to ensure the appropriate course of action.

In the exchange of letters released by Downing Street, the Home Secretary admitted that "if faced with a similar situation again, I would have chosen a different course of action".

She said she had "at all times been truthful and transparent, and taken decisions guided by what I believed was right and appropriate given my office, not by any personal motivation".

"The Sunday Times' newspaper reported that instead of signing up for an in-person speed awareness course with other motorists or completing one online that would show her name and face to other participants, Braverman allegedly asked civil servants to arrange a private one-to-one course.

Germany cracks down on climate activists

Berlin, May 24 (AP):

German police raided 15 properties linked to the Last Generation climate activist group Wednesday, seizing assets as part of an investigation into its finances in a sign of growing impatience with disruptive protest tactics also seen in other European countries.

Members of the group have repeatedly blocked roads across Germany in an effort to pressure the government to take more drastic action against climate change. In recent weeks, they have brought traffic to a halt on an almost daily basis in Berlin, gluing themselves to busy intersections and highways. Over the past year,

they have also targeted various artworks and exhibits.

The raids, ordered by Munich prosecutors, come days after Chancellor Olaf Scholz said that he thought it was "completely nutty to somehow stick yourself to a painting or on the street." Leading figures with the environmentalist Green party, part of his governing coalition, have also said the group's actions are counterproductive. A spokesperson for Last Generation said that the police searches had hit the group and its supporters hard, but that it wouldn't let up its activities.

"They make us afraid, but we must not be frozen by fear," Aimee van Baalen told reporters in Berlin.

US aircraft carrier arrives in NATO-member Norway



The American aircraft carrier USS Gerald R. Ford on its way into the Oslo Fjord, at Jelya, Moss, Norway, on Wednesday, May 24. The ship is the world's largest warship and will be in port in Oslo for four days.

Copenhagen, May 24 (AP):

A US aircraft carrier arrived on Wednesday in Oslo with the Norwegian armed forces saying it gives them "a unique opportunity to further develop cooperation and work more closely with

our most important ally, the United States."

The nuclear-powered ship USS General Ford entered the Oslo fjord escorted by a rapid dinghy-type boat with armed people on board.

The Norwegian armed forces has said any boats

must stay a half-kilometre (half-mile) away from the aircraft carrier and a no-fly zone was created over the area where the aircraft carrier was.

Described as the largest aircraft carrier in the world, the vessel's first foreign call was broadcast live on Norwegian public television.

Onlooker, some using binoculars, were seen on land watching as the large aircraft carrier glided deeper and deeper into the fjord and eventually reach the city of Oslo.

The vessel will stay in the Norwegian capital until Tuesday.

Japan to provide 100 military vehicles to Ukraine

Tokyo, May 24 (AP):

Japan held a ceremony on Wednesday marking its planned donation of about 100 military vehicles to Ukraine, as Tokyo seeks to provide equipment that can be of broader military use than its earlier shipments of helmets and hazmat suits.

In a ceremony at the Defence Ministry at which two half-ton trucks were on display, Japanese Vice Defence Minister Toshio Ino handed a document to Ukrainian Ambassador Sergiy Korsunsky listing the three types of ve-

hicles included in the donation.

"We hope the invasion ends as soon as possible and peaceful daily lives return," Ino said. "We will provide as much support as we can."

The donation, which also includes 30,000 food rations, comes as Japan's government is seeking to ease its military equipment transfer policy under a new national security policy that allows its military a

greater offensive role, in a major break from its post-World War II self-defence-only principle.

While other countries have provided Ukraine with tanks, missiles and fighter jets, Japan has limited its donations to non-lethal equipment because the transfer policy prohibits the provision of lethal weapons to countries at war.

Japan has provided Ukraine with bullet-proof vests, helmets, gas

masks, hazmat suits, small drones and food rations since Russia's invasion began last year.

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida pledged the trucks to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy when they met in Hiroshima on Sunday on the sidelines of the Group of Seven summit. Japan has also offered to treat injured Ukrainian soldiers at a Japanese military hospital.

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China's Hypocrisy Exposed

Boycott of G20 Meet Reveals Duplicity

In a blatant display of duplicity, China has boycotted the G20 Tourism Working Group meeting in Srinagar, citing its misguided notion of Jammu & Kashmir as a 'disputed territory.' 

Indian Economy has Potential to Surpass China at a faster pace

United Nations declared in Mid-April this year that India has become the most populous country overtaking China at 1.43 billion. Can it do the same with regard to GDP to become second largest economy in the world? On the face of it, the proposition seems difficult in the next few decades as China is the second largest economy in the world at over \$18.5 trillion as against United States' nearly \$25.5 trillion. There have however been suspicion for quite some time that Chinese figures are exaggerated and the size of its economy is not as big as it is made out to be. If this is true, it is within realms of reality that India overtakes Chinese economy in the foreseeable future.

This is because of new evidences emerging now to show that Chinese economy can at best be around \$5-6 trillion and hence it is around the size of Japan and not at around \$18 trillion. Japan's GDP is put at around \$5.16 trillion and is the third largest economy after US and China. India is the fifth largest economy at around \$3.5 trillion. It recently overtook Britain and is widely expected to overtake Germany and Japan to become third largest economy in the next few years. Germany and Japan are the two other economies ahead of India apart from United States and China. While India is now on a bright spot with foreign investors looking up to India,

experts lately say that China's economy has tuned slippery and its reopening boom is a charade.

According to John Burn Murdoch of Financial Times, China has stopped publishing many date points like electricity consumption on a periodical basis ever since Xi Jinping came to power in 2012 implying Chinese economy is not doing well and that downside had started in several sectors. But more importantly, according to a US based Chinese analyst, Lei, China's real GDP is less than half of what the Chinese government claims to be. She argues that China's GDP was just \$9 trillion officially in 2012 and wondered how is it that its economy has doubled to over \$18 trillion in the next ten years when the economy has been on the downside since then. She says China's published GDP in 2022 was \$17.9 trillion against US \$25.5. However, people believe that China's GDP is "overstated and manipulated".

According to the method adopted by Louis Martinez of Chicago University, data are exaggerated by 35 per cent in autocratic countries including China. He had come to this conclusion after analyzing data using satellite images of various countries based on when people turn off their lights on a daily basis since 1984. His study is silent on the data prior to 1984.

Lei used this as a deflator to calculate the real GDP of China since 1992. China's official GDP in 1992 was \$493 billion and in 2022 it was \$17.99 trillion. This meant that China's annual GDP growth was 12.7 per cent annually. If Martinez method was used as deflator, then the GDP growth rate comes down after the adjustment to 8.25 per cent annually. This meant that China's real GDP in 2022 was just \$5.3

trillion, about the size of Japan.

But Japan's population is just one tenth of China, which meant Japan's per capita income is ten times more than that of China. Also Chinese currency is administratively pegged at 6.3 Yuan to a dollar. But in the grey market, which reflects the real value, is around 10 Yuan to a dollar. If this also is factored in an economy where exports accounted for more 40 per cent of the GDP, the China's GDP will be much less than \$5.3 trillion, some analysts argue.

That apart a recent study by experts said nominal and real GDP growth of China was over calculated by two percentage points year after year from 2008 to 2016 and that the miscalculation only got compounded in those years. As a result China's GDP said to be \$ 13.5 trillion in 2018 is actually 18 per cent lower at around \$11 trillion. The study is authored by Chen Wei, Chen Xilu and Michael Song of Chinese University of Hong Kong and Chan-Tai Hsieh from University of Chicago. But even at around \$11 trillion after the necessary correction of the figures, Chinese economy is still quite large and is twice the size of Japan. But the new evidences by Lei indicate that China's GDP would be just half of \$11 trillion arrived at by these professors. The Chinese GDP was merely \$5.3 trillion or around that of Japan.

Many indicators of growth in China are underwhelming. A growth model dependent on stimulus and debt was always going to be unsustainable and now it has run out of steam, Ruchir Sharma, who is Rockefeller international chair, wrote in the Financial Times. Confidence that China's economy can rebound from Covid restrictions is untethered to economic realities.

"Something is rotten in the Chinese economy, but don't expect wall street analysts to tell you about it," Sharma said listing several indicators that point to underlying weakness.

For example, Wall street's assumption of 5 per cent GDP growth would suggest that corporate revenue growth of 8 per cent, but it rose by 1.5 per cent in the first quarter, he said adding in fact, corporate revenue is slower than GDP in 20 of the country's 28 sectors, and MSCI China stock index down 15 per cent from a January peak. Imports, a strong indicator of consumer demand dropped 8 per cent while youth unemployment hit 20 per cent and is rising. "These facts point to the source of the rot," he said. China's economic model since 2008 has been driven by government stimulus and rising debt, particularly in real estate and now Chinese debt service already account for a third of disposable income. China's growth potential is only half of 5 per cent target this year due to shrinking population.

Lei goes on further to say there are about 30 provinces in mainland China, of which only six are in a position to manage their finances. The rest are severely debt-ridden at an unsustainable level.

Given these data points and analysis, it is quite possible that Indian economy has the potential to overtake China in near future if its economy continued to fire on all cylinders. The figures do certainly indicate that Chinese economy is on the decline while Indian economy is on the rise India's GDP in real terms may not take much time to reach near the level of real GDP figure of China. The big gap which was thought earlier, is not that big after taking a realistic estimates of Chinese data. (Views are personal).

Next print of inflation likely to be lower than 4.7%: RBI Governor

New Delhi, May 24:

Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das on Wednesday said inflation has moderated, and the next print is expected to be lower than 4.7 per cent though there is no room for complacency and the war on inflation will continue. Retail inflation fell to an 18-month low of 4.7 per cent in April, mainly due to cooling food prices. "Inflation has moderated (and) the last print is 4.7 per cent. Perhaps the next print could be lower," he said while addressing CII members here. The governor, however, emphasised that although inflation has moderated, there is no room for complacency. He said that inflation was looking benign, but the sudden outbreak of the Russia-Ukraine war changed the situation, resulting in a disruption in

the global supply chain and firming up global commodity prices. He assured that the war against inflation is not over and the RBI will remain alert to evolving situations. Drawing confidence from macroeconomic stability, Das said there is a platform for supporting domestic growth. Talking about macroeconomic stability, he said in-

flation has moderated, there is sustained GDP growth, and Current Account Deficit is manageable. He also said that the fiscal deficit is on a consolidation path.

"So, on the back of macroeconomic stability and a robust financial sector...the percentage of gross non-performing assets of the banking sector

at the systemic level was 4.4 per cent at the end of December 2022," he noted. So, he said, the non-performing asset, which was a huge challenge for the Indian banking sector, has come down, and it is showing very good signs of resilience. Besides, he said, credit offtake in banks also is remaining quite resilient, and it is 15.5 per cent as per the latest figure. "And on top of that, we have the advantage of demography, which again is a huge opportunity for India. And it's something which will eventually add to our potential output or what some people prefer to call it India's growth potential. That's a theme, which will play out in the medium to long term," he said. He expressed confidence India could clock a growth of 6.5 per cent during the current financial year on the back of these tailwinds.

New Delhi, May 24:



A strong dollar against major rivals overseas and weak domestic equities weighed on the local unit and capped the appreciating bias, forex traders said. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 82.83 against the US dollar and settled at 82.70, higher by 15 paise over its previous close. During the day, the domestic unit witnessed an intraday high of 82.64 and a low of 82.84 in the day trade. On Tuesday, the rupee closed at 82.85 against the US currency. The dollar index, which gauges the green-



back's strength against a basket of six currencies, rose 0.18 per cent to 103.67. Global oil benchmark Brent crude futures advanced 1.81 per cent to USD 78.23 per barrel. The rupee gained on the soft dollar and FII inflows, said Anuj Choudhary - Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas.

The minister was speaking at the annual session of industry body CII here. He added that no other developing country in the world is in such a "sweet spot" and it was the first time in many years that business persons are seeing interest rates almost at par with developed countries. "I believe this is a compelling case for investments, for growth and for expanding our international outreach, for bringing technology for bringing innovation into the country," he said, suggesting the in-

dustry should focus on quality, innovation and skilled manpower. Further he said that India's trading partners want India to fast track negotiations for free trade agreements (FTAs).



Stock markets halt three-day gaining streak on weak global trends

Among the Sensex firms, Tata Motors, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank, HDFC, Bajaj Finserv, Reliance Industries, Hindustan Unilever, Larsen & Toubro, Asian Paints and Tata Steel were the major laggards. Sun Pharma, Titan, ITC, IndusInd Bank, Tech Mahindra and Power Grid were among the winners.

There is no role for anchor in T20 cricket: Rohit Sharma

Mumbai, May 24 (PTD):

India captain Rohit Sharma believes T20 cricket has changed and there is no role for anchors left in the format, adding that he has been exploring what he can achieve more as a batter even though his change in approach has brought about failures.

The Indian captain across formats, Rohit says as a batter he wants to do things 'differently' now without worrying too much about the outcomes, and that power-hitting could never be his forte.

"As I see it, there is no role for an anchor now. It is just how T20 cricket is played these days, unless you are 20/3 or 4, which is not going to happen every day," Rohit told Jio Cinema.

"Once in a while, you will be in that position and then someone needs to anchor the innings and finish off to a good score. There is no role for an anchor anymore, guys are playing differently." Rohit feels a change in mindset is mandatory.

"If you do not change your mindset, you are



going to get smashed. People on the other side are thinking about the game differently and taking it to the next level.

"All seven batters need to play their role, I believe that if you get a good score, it is good, but even if you get a good 30-40 off just 10-15 or 20 balls, it is (just) as good because you are doing the role for the team. The game has changed," he added.

The Mumbai Indians and India captain said he has played T20 cricket long enough for him to stick to a particular approach to batting. "I just want to play that way and see what I can do. I have played this format for a long time and in a certain manner. But I want to do different things now. While doing that, (if) I get out, (it) does not really bother me," he said.

Rohit added, "If you see, in Chennai (vs Chennai Super Kings) and before that in Mohali (vs Punjab Kings), I got out zero. In the third game, against RCB, I stepped down the first ball. I thought I have failed thrice in as many attempts but it is fine, this is what I am going to do."

Ronaldo scores winner in Saudi Arabia

Riyadh, May 24 (AP):

Cristiano Ronaldo helped Al-Nassr keep its Saudi Arabian title hopes alive by scoring the winning goal in a come-from-behind 3-2 victory over Al-Shabab. If second-place Al-Nassr had lost the Riyadh derby then leader Al-Ittihad, which beat Al-Batin 1-0 earlier, would have been crowned champion with two games of the season remaining.

Cristian Guanica scored twice for Al-Shabab before Anderson Talisca of Brazil pulled a goal back for Al-Nassr just before the break. Six minutes after the restart, the nine-time champions were level as Abdulrahman Ghareeb made it 2-2 from close range. Just before the hour, Ronaldo put Al-Nassr ahead in style, sprinting past two defenders to curl a shot into the top corner from the edge of the area. It was the Portugal star's 14th goal since joining after the World Cup. "To be 2-0 down is very difficult but we believed until the end and scored three goals so congratulations to the team and the supporters who were amazing today," the former Real Madrid star said. Al-Ittihad is three points clear at the top of the standings. Ronaldo said the Saudi league is slowly improving: "Step-by step I think this league will be in the top five leagues in the world but they need time, they need players, they need infrastructure."

the country and whenever given the opportunity, we must do justice to it. Of course, we also help each other be in the right frame for such opportunities whenever they present themselves. "Overall, the desire is to see the team win, than to just be on the

pitch," he added. Playing back-to-back internationals tournaments prior to next year's AFC Asian Cup is "very good" for the Indian team, feels Gurpreet. The team is set to play in a number of matches, with back-to-back international tournaments lined up -- the

Intercontinental Cup in Bhubaneswar, the SAFF Championship in Bengaluru, followed by the Kings Cup in Thailand (September) and the Merdeka Cup in Malaysia (October).

Preparing for the Asian Cup, which is set to be held in January-February in Qatar, the Blue Tigers are hard at work in their training camp in Bhubaneswar ahead of the Intercontinental Cup.

Gurpreet believes that it is a great opportunity for players to polish their skills. "Back-to-back tournaments are very good for us. We've got a good number of games in front of us, and that's something that I personally appreciate. I don't think we have ever done this before," Gurpreet told the-aiff.com.

Warner will really play big part in Ashes and WTC final: Andrew McDonald

Melbourne, May 24 (PTD):

Australia's head coach Andrew McDonald has backed David Warner to "play a really big part" in the upcoming World Test Championship final against India and the Ashes series against traditional rivals England.

Warner endured a difficult tour of India earlier this year and even though the Delhi Capitals skipper showed attacking intent while amassing 516 runs from 14 matches in the IPL, he will have his task cut out in the seaming English conditions.

Regardless of Warner's recent struggles, McDonald is confident of the seasoned Australian delivering at the top of the order in the UK. "We're op-



timistic with what Dave's got left, we've picked him in the squad and we feel he'll play a really big part in the Ashes and the World Test Championship (final)," McDonald told Australian radio station SEN. Warner was included in Australia's squad for the WTC final against India and the first two Ashes Tests but selectors have also picked Marcus Harris and Matt Renshaw as options.

IPL has taken a heavy toll, I have 8-9 months to decide: MS Dhoni



Chennai, May 24 (PTD):

Describing himself as an "annoying skipper," Mahendra Singh Dhoni said months of intense preparation for the IPL has taken a "heavy toll" on him and that he would take a call on his retirement in eight to nine months.

There have been speculations that 2023 could be a swansong season for Dhoni, who has led Chennai Super Kings to their 10th IPL final with a 15-run win over Gujarat Titans in the Qualifier 1 here on Tuesday.

"Frankly, it takes a heavy toll. I have been out of home for literally four months," Dhoni said at the post-match presentation after winning the last game of the season at Chepauk. "I will always come to CSK. I have been out of home from January, been practicing since March, so we will see," he added. "January 31 was when I got out of the house, finished my work, and started practicing from 2nd or 3rd of March. It takes a lot, but I have ample time to decide."

"I don't know... I have 8-9 months to decide. Why take that headache now. I have ample time to decide. The auction is in December," the 41-year-old said.

Personally, Dhoni has had a quiet season with the bat, managing just 104 runs from 15 matches at an average of 34.67, and was also seen struggling with his knee especially while running between the wickets.

The World Cup-winning captain, however, has not missed a match this season. After CSK's final league game, he was also seen wearing a brace.

"I will always be there for CSK, whether that is in the playing form or sitting somewhere outside...I don't really know."

Shastri wants both Ashwin and Jadeja in Indian playing XI for WTC Final



Dubai, May 24 (PTD):

Former head coach Ravi Shastri feels that Indian team should play to its strength and include both Ravichandran Ashwin and Ravindra Jadeja in the playing eleven against Australia in the upcoming World Test Championship final at the Oval, next month.

Under Shastri's coaching, Indian team won a Test match at the Oval in 2021 but it was largely due to performance of India's pace attack comprising Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Siraj, Umesh Yadav and Shardul Thakur apart from a classy hundred by the then vice-captain Rohit Sharma. Picking his XI for the marquee WTC Final, Shastri felt the void left by Bumrah will hurt India's chances and they should counter it by

picking another spinner to accommodate for the lack of quicks.

"India did very well in England last time round because you had Bumrah, you had Shami, you had Shardul Thakur, and you had Mohammed Siraj," Shastri said in ICC Review.

"So you had four fast bowlers. One being an all-rounder there, Shardul. "That combination is a very good combination in England. Especially from India's point of view. It allows someone like Rohit Sharma to control the game far better. At times in England, you need to slow it down as well. And suddenly it can get overcast," he explained. For Shastri, it is important to pick players as per conditions and current form. Mohammed Shami and Umesh Yadav are a couple of years older and might be a few yards slower compared to 2021.

"You have got horses for courses, you've got all bases covered. But then if the quality is not good in your fast-bowling attack. If you think the guys are older, they are not as quick as they used to be, and the form is a little doubtful, then you play that second spinner because Ashwin is quality, as is Jadeja."

Defence main focus in next two games in Australia: Ekka



Adelaide, May 24 (PTD):

The focus would be on defence and not conceding easy goals as the Indian women's hockey team looks to bounce back and sign off with wins against Australia A in their last two games of the tour here.

The Indians have played three games against Australia, losing 2-4 and 2-3 in the first two games, respectively, and then coming from behind in the third game to ensure a 1-1 result.

In their final two games of the tour, the visitors

will face Australia 'A' here on Thursday and Saturday.

The exposure trip is part of India's preparation for the upcoming Asian Games and vice-captain Deep Grace Ekka believes that a strong defence line will be critical to the team's chances.

"Given that we played against a strong team like Australia, we produced a good show in the first three games, especially attacking-wise, but we conceded quite a few goals, which shouldn't be happening," Ekka said.

"Hence, we are focusing on improving our defend-

ing in the next two games and ending our tour on a high by winning the remaining matches."

The Indian team demonstrated brilliant attacking prowess in all three games, but they struggled to keep Australia from scoring goals.

"Also, if we ensure that we don't concede goals easily, it will help our forward line put pressure on opponents by attacking freely, which will ultimately increase our chances of winning games not only in this tour but also in our upcoming tournaments," the 28-year-old added.

'Banks cannot forcibly take possession of loan-default vehicles by engaging musclemen'

Patna, May 24 (PTI)

The Patna High Court has held that forcibly taking away vehicles from owners by musclemen engaged by financial institutions and banks for defaulting on loans is violation of the fundamental right to life and livelihood.

Justice Rajeev Ranjan Prasad, while disposing of a batch of writ petitions, said the rights of the banks and the finance companies must be exercised within the constitutional limitations and in accordance with the law.

The single bench observed that banks and finance companies "cannot act in conflict with the fundamental principles and policy of India which means that no person may be deprived of his livelihood and the right to live with dignity without following the established procedure of law".

A Supreme Court order "completely bans taking such possession by engaging gangsters, goons and musclemen as so-called recovery agents", the bench said in its order.

The high court said that vehicle loans should be re-

covered following provisions of securitisation that empower banks and financial institutions to recover bad debts by acquiring physical possession of the mortgaged properties of defaulting borrowers with the aid of the district administration and getting them auctioned in order to enforce their security interest.

The bench directed all police superintendents in Bihar to ensure that no vehicle is seized forcefully by any recovery agent and fined erring banks and finance companies Rs 50,000 each.

"The right to recovery of these banks and financial institutions if pitted against the constitutional right of life of a person/petitioner to live with dignity and not to be deprived of without following the established procedure of law, the constitutional rights of the person/petitioner shall prevail," it said.

In the garb of the power acquired by the financier under the loan agreement to repossess the vehicle, they cannot be allowed to take the law into their hands, the high court said in its May 19 order.

Ordinance on control of services in Delhi means Modi govt doesn't believe in Supreme Court: Kejriwal

Mumbai, May 24 (PTI)

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Wednesday claimed the ordinance issued for control of services in Delhi implies the Narendra Modi government does not believe in the Supreme Court.

After meeting Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray at the latter's residence in Mumbai, Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) national convener Kejriwal said state governments were being toppled by using the CBI and the ED.

Slamming the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Thackeray said they have come together to defeat forces that are against democracy.

Kejriwal met Thackeray to seek support for the AAP's fight against the Centre's ordinance on control of services in Delhi.

He said the Shiv Sena has promised to support the people of Delhi when the

ordinance comes to the Rajya Sabha in the form of a bill.

"This will be like a semi-final in the Rajya Sabha. If the bill is defeated in the Rajya Sabha, then the Modi government will not come back to power in 2024," Kejriwal claimed.

The Shiv Sena (UBT) has three members in the Rajya Sabha.

"The ordinance on control of services in Delhi means the Modi government doesn't believe in the Supreme Court. The ordinance implies that how can the Supreme Court give a judgment against us (the Centre)," Kejriwal said. Backing the AAP leader, Thackeray said the Supreme Court's order was important for democracy.

10 booked in Indore for distributing 'objectionable' pamphlets against RSS and Bajrang Dal

Indore, May 24 (PTI)

Police have registered an FIR against 10 persons in Indore city of Madhya Pradesh for allegedly distributing objectionable pamphlets against the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) and the Bajrang Dal, a police official said on Wednesday.

The First Information Report (FIR) was registered based on a complaint lodged by a 45-year-old woman, said Raoji Bazar police station in-charge Pritam Singh Thakur.

"The case was registered against nearly 10 unidentified persons under section 153-A (promoting enmity between different groups on grounds of religion) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). The complaint stated that the pamphlets, which were distributed on the

night of May 20, allegedly used objectionable words against the RSS and the Bajrang Dal," he said.

"The identity of the people who distributed the pamphlets is yet to be established. We are trying to identify the accused with the help of CCTV footage," he said.

Another police official said the pamphlets, published in the backdrop of the issue of religious conversion, were addressed to young women. The pamphlets, titled "Open Letter", have "Your Faithful Brother" printed as the sender at the end, he said.

Two days back, the Indore police arrested a 23-year-old man on the charge of raping a woman, with whom he was in a relationship, and pressuring her to change her religion.

DU to launch centre on tribal studies

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

The Delhi University will start a multi-disciplinary centre on tribal studies to educate students about the contribution of tribal leaders to society during various eras of Indian history, a senior varsity official said on Wednesday.

The proposal in this regard will be presented at a meeting of the Academic Council on Friday, the official added.

An ordinance issued recently said the new centre will have seven major objectives, which include understanding the term "tribe" from an India-centric perspective and studying the "social, cultural, linguistic, religious, economic, and environmental diversity and commonalities" of different tribes.

The students will get to "study and document various Lok traditions of India's tribes including their indigenous/traditional knowledge", according to the ordinance.

The centre also aims to highlight the role of tribal leaders in India's struggle for freedom and "bring out to prominence the unsung heroes among them", the ordinance added.

Another focus area of the new centre is the identification of the problems of Denotified and Nomadic tribes and Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) with reference to conservation, development and special health needs.

Students of the centre will also get a chance to study the significance of forest-tribe relationships with a focus on the stability

of forest ecosystems and livelihood issues.

According to the ordinance, a new body will be set up under the Executive Council of the university to monitor the multi-disciplinary centre's governance. All expenditures of the centre such as on seminars, research projects, teaching, publications, administration, equipment and other support activities shall be made adhering to the General Financial Rules, allocation and other rules and regulations as applicable, the ordinance mentioned.

"Additional financial support can be sought from various government agencies or through collaborations with national and international agencies according to the requirements from time to time," it added.

Heavy rains lash Jammu region, landslide blocks highway

Jammu, May 24 (PTI) In a respite from the scorching heat wave conditions, heavy rains on Wednesday lashed various areas of the Jammu region bringing down the temperature.

The Jammu-Srinagar national highway was blocked for a brief period due to landslides triggered by heavy rains in Ramban district.

There were rains in various areas of Kishtwar, Doda, Ramban, Udhampur, Rajouri and Reasi districts on Wednesday, officials said.

Student accused of setting afire court premises acquitted

Mumbai, May 24 (PTI)

A sessions court here has acquitted a 22-year-old student who was arrested for setting afire the premises of another court and causing damage to the property, observing that the prosecution failed to prove the case against him. In his order passed last month, Additional Sessions Judge A A Kulkarni let off Omkar Pawar and said the prosecution had claimed that the alleged incident occurred in broad daylight but it did not

examine any witness who might have seen the accused at the spot. "In such circumstances, I am of the opinion that evidence of prosecution is not sufficient to conclude that prosecution has proved that accused set fire in the premises of Girgaon court and caused damage to the property," the court said. As per the prosecution, the assistant superintendent of Metropolitan Magistrate Court, Girgaon, had on June 19, 2021, received a call about a fire on the premises.

Mumbai BJP chief Ashish Shelar meets NCP supremo

Mumbai, May 24 (PTI)

Bharatiya Janata Party's Mumbai unit chief and MLA Ashish Shelar on Wednesday called on Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) president Sharad Pawar at the latter's residence in south Mumbai.

What transpired at the meeting, however, could not be known.

The meeting between the two leaders assumes significance as Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal is scheduled to meet the NCP chief in the city on Thursday. Kejriwal, who met Shiv Sena (UBT) president on Wednesday, is seeking support of different political

parties and leaders for the Aam Aadmi Party's fight against the Centre's ordinance on control of services in Delhi.

Although Shelar and Pawar belong to rival parties, they have been on the same page when it comes to controlling the cricket boards of Mumbai or the apex body of the sports. Shelar, a BJP MLA from Bandra West, has been in the world of cricket politics for almost a decade, while Pawar had earlier served as the president of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), the International Cricket Council (ICC), and the Mumbai Cricket Association (MCA).

Age-old stories like those told in Ramayana and Mahabharata will be rewritten and retold in every era, says writer Anand Neelakantan, who is known for his interpretation of Indian epics from the perspective of the antagonist.

The 49-year-old rose to fame with his 2012 mythological fiction, "Asura: Tale of the Vanquished", which depicted the tale of Ramayana from the perspective of Ravana. His another bestseller, "Ajaya", also depicts the epic of Mahabharata from the point of view of Duryodhana.

Calling himself more of a "storyteller" than a novelist, Neelakantan

said "Indian civilisation" does not believe in "one god, one religion, and one book".

"It is not the first time somebody is reinterpreting or rewriting it, every Ramayana is different, every Mahabharata is different. There are more than 1000-1200 Mahabharatas and 300-340 Ramayanas. This is a tradition continuing from the last 2000-3000 years, or more than that in different languages," Neelakantan told PTI in an interview.

The author said retelling an old story in a slightly different manner

was never considered "blasphemy".

"Traditionally, it was never that, which is why we have got so many Ramayanas and Mahabharatas. It's an all accepting culture. And more will be written, it's not going to end.

According to police, the matter came to light in April after a complaint was filed by a resident of Mayur Vihar who alleged that she was cheated on the pretext of investing money in cryptocurrency. 19 opposition parties to boycott ceremony

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

As many as 19 parties, including the Congress, Left, TMC, SP and AAP, on Wednesday announced their decision to boycott the inauguration of the new Parliament building by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on May 28, saying they find no value in a new building when the "soul of democracy has been sucked out".

Noting that the inauguration of the Parliament building is a momentous occasion, the opposition parties in a joint statement said, "despite our belief that the government is threatening democracy, and our disapproval of the autocratic manner in which the new Parliament was built, we were open to sinking our differences and marking this occasion".

However, Prime Minister

'Sengol' in new building will serve as reminder of responsibility to uphold righteous governance

New Delhi: Installation of the sceptre 'Sengol' in the new Parliament building will be a historic moment for India as it will serve as a reminder of the responsibility to uphold righteous governance for the nation, Union ministers and BJP leaders said on Wednesday. Union Home Minister Amit Shah earlier in the day announced that the historical sceptre from Tamil Nadu will find a place in the new Parliament building to be inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on May 28. The sceptre was received by first prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru to represent transfer of power from the British and was kept till now in a museum in Allahabad.



Modi's decision to inaugurate the new Parliament building by himself, "completely sidelining President Droupadi Murmu, is not only a grave insult but a direct assault on our democracy which demands a commensurate response".

Modi will inaugurate the new Parliament building on May 28 following an invitation by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla. "When the soul of democracy has been sucked out from Parliament, we find no value in a new building. We announce our collective decision to boycott the inauguration of the new Parliament building," the parties said.

"We will continue to fight - in letter, in spirit, and in substance - against this 'authoritarian' prime minister and his government, and take our message directly to the people of India," the opposition parties said.

Houses of eight Pak-based terrorists raided

Jammu, May 24 (PTI)

The Jammu and Kashmir Police Special Investigation Unit (SIU) on Wednesday conducted raids on houses of eight Pakistan-based terrorists at multiple locations in Kishtwar and Ramban districts, senior officials said. The raids were carried out in Padder, Keshwan and Thakrai in Kishtwar and Khari and Banihal in Ramban to scuttle attempts by these terrorists to revive militancy in the Chenab valley region, they said. Senior Superintendent of Police, Kishtwar, Khalil Ahmad Poswal said the searches at the houses of Azad Hussain, Gazi-ud-Din, Bashir Ahmed Mughal and Sattar Din, alias Rajab, were conducted after search warrants were obtained from a special NIA court in Jammu in a case under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. "The searches are aimed at eliminating the militant ecosystem in the district by identifying various over-ground workers and supporters of militancy," the officer said.

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Two killed as bus overturns in Raigarh

Raigarh, May 24 (PTI)

Two passengers were killed and 26 others, including women and children, injured when a private bus overturned in Chhattisgarh's Raigarh district on Wednesday morning, police said. Eleven of those injured are serious, they said. The accident took place when the bus was going to Raigarh from Lailunga town in the district.

The bus driver lost control of the vehicle which overturned at Charbhanta turn under Gharghoda police station limits, said Dipak Mishra, sub-

divisional officer of police, Dharamjaigarh area.

Two passengers died on the spot, while 26 others, including 10 women and two children, sustained injuries, he said. After being alerted about the accident, police reached the spot and launched a rescue operation, he said. Of the injured, 11 were referred to a medical college in Raigarh as they are in serious condition, while 12 were admitted to the Primary Health Centre, Gharghoda. The remaining three are being treated at a hospital in Raigarh, Mishra said.

'Why interested in telecasting narco test of Aaftab on TV'

HC asks news channel

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

The Delhi High Court Wednesday sought to know from news channel Aaj Tak why it wanted to telecast the recording of narco analysis conducted on Aaftab Amin Poonawala, the man accused of strangling his live-in partner Shraddha Walkar and dismembering her body. Justice Rajnish Bhatnagar's poser came while hearing an application by the news channel seeking vacation of its April 19 order by which all media channels were re-

strained from displaying or telecasting any material connected with the case.

The high court issued notice and sought the response of the Delhi Police on the application and listed the application for further hearing on August 3, the date already fixed in the main petition.

The application was filed in a pending petition of the Delhi Police in which they have sought restraining media houses from publishing, printing and disseminating confidential information contained in the charge sheet and other such material collected during the course of investigation.

Special Public Prosecutor Amit Prasad, representing the Delhi Police, opposed the channel's application and said he will file a reply.

During the hearing, the high court said there are more heinous cases than this and 20 murders take place all over India daily. "What is so special about this case?" asked the bench.

"Was the Nirbhaya case played on TV channels? Why are you choosing this particular case?" it asked and wondered whether the channel would similarly display the developments in the Atiq Ahmed murder case investigation.


'India-Australia ties in 'T-20 mode' now'

Sydney, May 24 (PTI)

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday used cricket analogy to describe the rapid upswing in India-Australia ties as he said that the bilateral relations have entered the "T-20 mode".

Modi made the comments after holding wide-ranging talks with his Australian counterpart Anthony Albanese that focused on further expansion of the comprehensive strategic partnership between the two countries.

The prime minister also invited Albanese and Australian cricket fans to India for the Cricket World Cup tournament which is taking place in the coun-

statement. "If I may say in the language of cricket, our ties have entered the T-20 mode," he said in the presence of Albanese.

"I invite Prime Minister Albanese and all Australian cricket fans to come to India for the Cricket World Cup to be held in India this year. At that time, along with cricket, you will also get to see the grand celebration of Diwali," he said.

Modi also highlighted the importance of India-Australia relations for the region.

"The scope of India-Australia relations is not limited to merely our two countries. It is also linked to regional stability, peace and global welfare," he said.

Man impersonates Army officer to cheat people, held

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

A 26-year-old man was arrested for allegedly posing as an Army officer and duping people on the pretext of purchasing goods for army school, police said on Wednesday.

The accused, Harish, hails from Hidayatpur village in Palwal district of Haryana. He used to run 'White Global ATM' in Banni village in Bharatpur district of Rajasthan, they said.

As of now, a total of five complaints registered in various states have been identified that are linked to the accused and money trail of more than Rs 70

lakh is found in these fraudulent accounts, police said. According to police, the matter came to light after a Delhi resident told them that he received a call from an unknown caller on June 30, 2022. The person called him on the pretext of purchasing pipes for army school and introduced himself as an Army officer. The accused duped him of Rs 10,47,605. Deputy Commissioner of Police (Shahdara) Rohit Meena said that the probe team collected all the relevant information including Call Detail Record and WhatsApp chat. All bank details and phone numbers of the accused were analysed.

Ram temple to open in January next year

Infra works expedited in Ayodhya

Lucknow, May 24 (PTI)

The Uttar Pradesh government has expedited infrastructure works in Ayodhya, including expansion of its airport and railway station, as the city prepares for the opening of the Ram temple in January next year, according to a statement.

Work is also in progress on the Ram Path, a 13-km road from Sahadatganj to Naya Ghat, it said. The

outline for the construction of the Ramjanaki Path and the Bhakti Path is also ready, the statement issued here said. The airport and the railway station are also being expanded, it added. These road corridors are important as these will facilitate the movement of devotees to the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi and the Hanuman Garhi temple, the statement said.

The width of the Ram Janmabhoomi Path will be 30 metres and the width of the Bhakti Path will be 14 metres, it said. Chief

Minister Yogi Adityanath has invited people to come for the Ram temple's opening, it said and added that he is reviewing the progress of different works regularly. Supporting the government's initiative to develop Ayodhya, shopkeepers, without any resistance, have given the land of their shops for the construction of the "grand" temple and its other facilities, the statement said.

There has been no complaint of any irregularity in disbursement of compensation under this project, it said.

Delhi court dismisses default bail pleas of two accused

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

A Delhi court on Wednesday dismissed the bail applications of two accused persons in a money laundering case lodged against AAP leader Satyendar Kumar Jain in a disproportionate assets case. Special Judge Vikas Dhull dismissed the default bail application filed by Vaibhav Jain and Ankush Jain, who are accused of abetting Satyendar Kumar Jain in acquisition of assets disproportionate to his known sources of income. Both had moved the application, claiming they deserved to be granted statutory bail as the charge sheet filed against them was incomplete.

Entire process of Rs 2000 notes withdrawal will be non-disruptive: RBI Guv

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das on Wednesday said that RBI is monitoring the situation regularly with regard to the withdrawal of Rs 2,000 currency notes and expressed confidence that the entire exercise will be completed in a non-disruptive manner.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Friday announced the withdrawal of Rs 2,000 denomination banknotes as part of its currency management and permitted the exchange of Rs 2,000 currency notes up to Rs 20,000 in one go from Tuesday onwards. The exchange or deposit

window is available until September 30, 2023. He said that RBI has given four-month time for exchanging as well as depositing the Rs 2,000 currency notes to ensure that there is no hardship faced by anyone. "Yesterday there was no crowd anywhere. And we are monitoring the situation regularly. I don't think there is any concern or any major issue which is coming out...business activities going on," he said. Justifying the deadline, he said unless there is a timeline in any process, it's not effective. "So you need to give a timeline and we have given sufficient time," he added. Replying to ques-


tions at an event organised by industry body CII, Governor Das said the entire process of withdrawal of the high-denomination currency will be non-disruptive. "The entire process will be non-disruptive. We have made our analysis about that," the Governor said. The Rs 2,000 notes constitute around 10.8 per cent of total currency in circulation or Rs 3.6 lakh crore. Das said these notes had completed the lifecycle and the purpose has been fulfilled. "It's not being used in transactions...any high denomination currency just remaining here and there, it has other collateral issues," he said.

India, Australia aim to conclude comprehensive trade deal by end of 2023

Sydney, May 24 (PTD):

India and Australia on Wednesday inked a migration and mobility partnership pact to open up opportunities for students, academic researchers and business people and resolved to conclude a comprehensive trade deal by the end of year to significantly expand economic ties.

The pact was signed after wide-ranging talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Australian counterpart Anthony Albanese.

In his media statement, Albanese said the aim is to conclude the comprehensive economic cooperation agreement (CECA) by the end of the year.

"We reiterated our shared ambition for an early conclusion of the Australia-India comprehensive economic cooperation agreement later this year," he said in the presence of Modi.

Last year, India and Australia finalised the Economic Cooperation Trade Agreement (ECTA) and it came into force in

December last. The two sides are now working on the CECA.

"Today, in my meeting with Prime Minister Albanese, we talked about taking India-Australia Comprehensive Strategic Partnership to greater heights in the next decade," Modi said.

"We discussed in detail the possibilities of cooperation in new areas. Last year India-Australia ECTA came into effect. Today we have decided to focus on

CECA — Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement," he said.

Modi said the pact will give further strength and new dimensions to trade and economic cooperation between the two countries.

"We had constructive discussions on strengthening our strategic cooperation in the sectors of mining and critical minerals. We have identified concrete areas for cooperation in renewable energy," Modi said.

"It was decided to set up a task force on Green Hydrogen," he added.

Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra said the next two rounds of talks on the economic partnership pact have been scheduled for June and July.

Modi and Albanese also witnessed the signing of the Australia-India Green Hydrogen Taskforce which will explore opportunities in the area of renewable hydrogen.

Russia's Wagner boss says more than 20,000 of his troops died in Bakhmut battle

Kyiv, May 24 (AP):

The head of the Russian private army Wagner says his force lost more than 20,000 fighters in the drawn-out battle for Bakhmut, with about 20 per cent of the 50,000 Russian convicts he recruited to fight in the 15-month war dying in the eastern Ukrainian city.

The figure was in stark contrast with claims from Moscow that it lost just over 6,000 troops in the war, and is higher than the official estimate of the Soviet losses in the Afghanistan war of 15,000 troops between 1979-89.

Ukraine hasn't said how many of its soldiers have died since Russia's full-scale invasion in February 2022.

Analysts believe the

nine-month fight for Bakhmut alone have cost the lives of tens of thousands of soldiers, among them convicts who reportedly received little training before being sent to the front.

Russia's invasion goal of "demilitarising" Ukraine has backfired because Kyiv's military has become stronger with the supply of weapons and training by its Western allies, Wagner chief Yevgeny Prigozhin said in an interview published late Tuesday with Konstantin Dolgov, a pro-Kremlin political strategist.

Prigozhin also said the Kremlin's forces have killed civilians during the war, something Moscow has repeatedly and vehemently denied.

Prigozhin, a wealthy businessman with long-time links to Russian President Vladimir Putin, is known for his bluster — often spiced with obscenities — and has previously made unverifiable claims, some of which he later backtracked on.

Earlier this month, his spokespeople published a video of him shouting, swearing and pointing at about 30 uniformed bodies lying on the ground, saying they were Wagner fighters who died in a single day. He claimed the Russian Defence Ministry had starved his men of ammunition and threatened to give up the fight for Bakhmut.

He also said in Tuesday's interview it was possible that Kyiv's anticipated counteroffensive

in coming weeks, given continued Western support, might push Russian forces out of southern and eastern Ukraine as well as annexed Crimea.

"A pessimistic scenario: the Ukrainians are given missiles, they prepare troops, of course they will continue their offensive, try to counterattack," he said. "They will attack Crimea, they will try to blow up the Crimean bridge (to the Russian mainland), cut off (our) supply lines. Therefore, we need to prepare for a hard war."

The Ukrainian General Staff said Wednesday that "heavy fighting" is continuing inside Bakhmut, days after Russia said that it completely captured the devastated city.

UK PM Sunak gives Suella Braverman clean chit on driving fine row

London, May 24 (PTD):

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak on Wednesday said that his Home Secretary, Suella Braverman, will not face an investigation into her reported actions related to a driving fine after she was caught speeding last year.

After days of speculation around The Sunday Times' newspaper claims that Braverman appealed to civil servants to try and avert the normal course of action after being caught speeding, Sunak wrote to his minister to say that he did not believe the actions amounted to a breach of the ministerial code of conduct. The Opposition parties had been demanding Sunak refer the Indian-origin minister to his Independent Adviser on ethics, Sir Laurie Magnus, to determine if there had been a breach.

"I have consulted with my Independent Adviser. He has advised that on this occasion further investigation is not necessary and I have accepted



that advice. On the basis of your letter and our discussion, my decision is that these matters do not amount to a breach of the Ministerial Code," Sunak writes in a letter to Braverman.

"As you have recognised, a better course of action could have been taken to avoid giving rise to the perception of im-

propriety. Nevertheless, I am reassured you take these matters seriously. You have provided a thorough account, apologised and expressed regret," he said, with reference to Braverman's letter to her boss apologising for the "distraction" the controversy had caused the government.

Sunak reiterated that he believes integrity, professionalism and accountability are core values of his leadership and it is right when issues are raised, they are looked at professionally to ensure the appropriate course of action.

In the exchange of letters released by Downing Street, the Home Secretary admitted that "if faced with a similar situation again, I would have chosen a different course of action".

She said she had "at all times been truthful and transparent, and taken decisions guided by what I believed was right and appropriate given my office, not by any personal motivation".

"The Sunday Times" newspaper reported that instead of signing up for an in-person speed awareness course with other motorists or completing one online that would show her name and face to other participants, Braverman allegedly asked civil servants to arrange a private one-to-one course.

Germany cracks down on climate activists

Berlin, May 24 (AP):

German police raided 15 properties linked to the Last Generation climate activist group Wednesday, seizing assets as part of an investigation into its finances in a sign of growing impatience with disruptive protest tactics also seen in other European countries.

Members of the group have repeatedly blocked roads across Germany in an effort to pressure the government to take more drastic action against climate change. In recent weeks, they have brought traffic to a halt on an almost daily basis in Berlin, gluing themselves to busy intersections and highways. Over the past year,

they have also targeted various artworks and exhibits.

The raids, ordered by Munich prosecutors, come days after Chancellor Olaf Scholz said that he thought it was "completely nutty to somehow stick yourself to a painting or on the street." Leading figures with the environmentalist Green party, part of his governing coalition, have also said the group's actions are counterproductive. A spokesperson for Last Generation said that the police searches had hit the group and its supporters hard, but that it wouldn't let up its activities.

"They make us afraid, but we must not be frozen by fear," Aimee van Baalen told reporters in Berlin.

US aircraft carrier arrives in NATO-member Norway



The American aircraft carrier USS Gerald R. Ford on its way into the Oslo Fjord, at Jelya, Moss, Norway, on Wednesday, May 24. The ship is the world's largest warship and will be in port in Oslo for four days.

Copenhagen, May 24 (AP):

A US aircraft carrier arrived on Wednesday in Oslo with the Norwegian armed forces saying it gives them "a unique opportunity to further develop cooperation and work more closely with

our most important ally, the United States."

The nuclear-powered ship USS General Ford entered the Oslo fjord escorted by a rapid dinghy-type boat with armed people on board.

The Norwegian armed forces has said any boats

must stay a half-kilometre (half-mile) away from the aircraft carrier and a no-fly zone was created over the area where the aircraft carrier was.

Described as the largest aircraft carrier in the world, the vessel's first foreign call was broadcast live on Norwegian public television.

Onlooker, some using binoculars, were seen on land watching as the large aircraft carrier glided deeper and deeper into the fjord and eventually reach the city of Oslo.

The vessel will stay in the Norwegian capital until Tuesday.

Japan to provide 100 military vehicles to Ukraine

Tokyo, May 24 (AP):

Japan held a ceremony on Wednesday marking its planned donation of about 100 military vehicles to Ukraine, as Tokyo seeks to provide equipment that can be of broader military use than its earlier shipments of helmets and hazmat suits.

In a ceremony at the Defence Ministry at which two half-ton trucks were on display, Japanese Vice Defence Minister Toshiro Ino handed a document to Ukrainian Ambassador Sergiy Korsunsky listing the three types of ve-

hicles included in the donation.

"We hope the invasion ends as soon as possible and peaceful daily lives return," Ino said. "We will provide as much support as we can."

The donation, which also includes 30,000 food rations, comes as Japan's government is seeking to ease its military equipment transfer policy under a new national security policy that allows its military a

greater offensive role, in a major break from its post-World War II self-defense-only principle.

While other countries have provided Ukraine with tanks, missiles and fighter jets, Japan has limited its donations to non-lethal equipment because the transfer policy prohibits the provision of lethal weapons to countries at war.

Japan has provided Ukraine with bullet-proof vests, helmets, gas

masks, hazmat suits, small drones and food rations since Russia's invasion began last year.

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida pledged the trucks to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy when they met in Hiroshima on Sunday on the sidelines of the Group of Seven summit. Japan has also offered to treat injured Ukrainian soldiers at a Japanese military hospital.

China's Hypocrisy Exposed

Boycott of G20 Meet Reveals Duplicity

In a blatant display of duplicity, China has boycotted the G20 Tourism Working Group meeting in Srinagar, citing its misguided notion of Jammu & Kashmir as a 'disputed territory.' This maneuver serves as yet another attempt by China to appease Pakistan while provoking India. However, the world sees through Beijing's malicious ploy, which aims to claim the moral high ground. Despite New Delhi's steadfast assertion that Jammu & Kashmir is an integral and inalienable part of India, China consistently questions the abrogation of Article 370 and the bifurcation of the state in 2019. 

Indian Economy has Potential to Surpass China at a faster pace

United Nations declared in Mid-April this year that India has become the most populous country overtaking China at 1.43 billion. Can it do the same with regard to GDP to become second largest economy in the world? On the face of it, the proposition seems difficult in the next few decades as China is the second largest economy in the world at over \$18.5 trillion as against United States' nearly \$25.5 trillion. There have however been suspicion for quite some time that Chinese figures are exaggerated and the size of its economy is not as big as it is made out to be. If this is true, it is within realms of reality that India overtakes Chinese economy in the foreseeable future.

This is because of new evidences emerging now to show that Chinese economy can at best be around \$5-6 trillion and hence it is around the size of Japan and not at around \$18 trillion. Japan's GDP is put at around \$5.16 trillion and is the third largest economy after US and China. India is the fifth largest economy at around \$3.5 trillion. It recently overtook Britain and is widely expected to overtake Germany and Japan to become third largest economy in the next few years. Germany and Japan are the two other economies ahead of India apart from United States and China. While India is now on a bright spot with foreign investors looking up to India,

experts lately say that China's economy has tuned slippery and its reopening boom is a charade.

According to John Burn Murdoch of Financial Times, China has stopped publishing many date points like electricity consumption on a periodical basis ever since Xi Jinping came to power in 2012 implying Chinese economy is not doing well and that downside had started in several sectors. But more importantly, according to a US based Chinese analyst, Lei, China's real GDP is less than half of what the Chinese government claims to be. She argues that China's GDP was just \$9 trillion officially in 2012 and wondered how is it that its economy has doubled to over \$18 trillion in the next ten years when the economy has been on the downside since then. She says China's published GDP in 2022 was \$17.9 trillion against US \$25.5. However, people believe that China's GDP is "overstated and manipulated".

According to the method adopted by Louis Martinez of Chicago University, data are exaggerated by 35 per cent in autocratic countries including China. He had come to this conclusion after analyzing data using satellite images of various countries based on when people turn off their lights on a daily basis since 1984. His study is silent on the data prior to 1984.

Lei used this as a deflator to calculate the real GDP of China since 1992. China's official GDP in 1992 was \$493 billion and in 2022 it was \$17.99 trillion. This meant that China's annual GDP growth was 12.7 per cent annually. If Martinez method was used as deflator, then the GDP growth rate comes down after the adjustment to 8.25 per cent annually. This meant that China's real GDP in 2022 was just \$5.3

trillion, about the size of Japan.

But Japan's population is just one tenth of China, which meant Japan's per capita income is ten times more than that of China. Also Chinese currency is administratively pegged at 6.3 Yuan to a dollar. But in the grey market, which reflects the real value, is around 10 Yuan to a dollar. If this also is factored in an economy where exports accounted for more 40 per cent of the GDP, the China's GDP will be much less than \$5.3 trillion, some analysts argue.

That apart a recent study by experts said nominal and real GDP growth of China was over calculated by two percentage points year after year from 2008 to 2016 and that the miscalculation only got compounded in those years. As a result China's GDP said to be \$ 13.5 trillion in 2018 is actually 18 per cent lower at around \$11 trillion. The study is authored by Chen Wei, Chen Xilu and Michael Song of Chinese University of Hong Kong and Chan-Tai Hsieh from University of Chicago. But even at around \$11 trillion after the necessary correction of the figures, Chinese economy is still quite large and is twice the size of Japan. But the new evidences by Lei indicate that China's GDP would be just half of \$11 trillion arrived at by these professors. The Chinese GDP was merely \$5.3 trillion or around that of Japan.

Many indicators of growth in China are underwhelming. A growth model dependent on stimulus and debt was always going to be unsustainable and now it has run out of steam, Ruchir Sharma, who is Rockefeller international chair, wrote in the Financial Times. Confidence that China's economy can rebound from Covid restrictions is untethered to economic realities.

"Something is rotten in the Chinese economy, but don't expect wall street analysts to tell you about it," Sharma said listing several indicators that point to underlying weakness.

For example, Wall street's assumption of 5 per cent GDP growth would suggest that corporate revenue growth of 8 per cent, but it rose by 1.5 per cent in the first quarter, he said adding in fact, corporate revenue is slower than GDP in 20 of the country's 28 sectors, and MSCI China stock index down 15 per cent from a January peak. Imports, a strong indicator of consumer demand dropped 8 per cent while youth unemployment hit 20 per cent and is rising. "These facts point to the source of the rot," he said. China's economic model since 2008 has been driven by government stimulus and rising debt, particularly in real estate and now Chinese debt service already account for a third of disposable income. China's growth potential is only half of 5 per cent target this year due to shrinking population.

Lei goes on further to say there are about 30 provinces in mainland China, of which only six are in a position to manage their finances. The rest are severely debt-ridden at an unsustainable level.

Given these data points and analysis, it is quite possible that Indian economy has the potential to overtake China in near future if its economy continued to fire on all cylinders. The figures do certainly indicate that Chinese economy is on the decline while Indian economy is on the rise India's GDP in real terms may not take much time to reach near the level of real GDP figure of China. The big gap which was thought earlier, is not that big after taking a realistic estimates of Chinese data. (Views are personal).

Next print of inflation likely to be lower than 4.7%: RBI Governor

New Delhi, May 24:

Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das on Wednesday said inflation has moderated, and the next print is expected to be lower than 4.7 per cent though there is no room for complacency and the war on inflation will continue. Retail inflation fell to an 18-month low of 4.7 per cent in April, mainly due to cooling food prices. "Inflation has moderated (and) the last print is 4.7 per cent. Perhaps the next print could be lower," he said while addressing CII members here. The governor, however, emphasised that although inflation has moderated, there is no room for complacency. He said that inflation was looking benign, but the sudden outbreak of the Russia-Ukraine war changed the situation, resulting in a disruption in

the global supply chain and firming up global commodity prices. He assured that the war against inflation is not over and the RBI will remain alert to evolving situations. Drawing confidence from macroeconomic stability, Das said there is a platform for supporting domestic growth. Talking about macroeconomic stability, he said in-

flation has moderated, there is sustained GDP growth, and Current Account Deficit is manageable. He also said that the fiscal deficit is on a consolidation path.

"So, on the back of macroeconomic stability and a robust financial sector...the percentage of gross non-performing assets of the banking sector

at the systemic level was 4.4 per cent at the end of December 2022," he noted. So, he said, the non-performing asset, which was a huge challenge for the Indian banking sector, has come down, and it is showing very good signs of resilience. Besides, he said, credit offtake in banks also is remaining quite resilient, and it is 15.5 per cent as per the latest figure. "And on top of that, we have the advantage of demography, which again is a huge opportunity for India. And it's something which will eventually add to our potential output or what some people prefer to call it India's growth potential. That's a theme, which will play out in the medium to long term," he said. He expressed confidence India could clock a growth of 6.5 per cent during the current financial year on the back of these tailwinds.

New Delhi, May 24:



A strong dollar against major rivals overseas and weak domestic equities weighed on the local unit and capped the appreciating bias, forex traders said. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 82.83 against the US dollar and settled at 82.70, higher by 15 paise over its previous close. During the day, the domestic unit witnessed an intraday high of 82.64 and a low of 82.84 in the day trade. On Tuesday, the rupee closed at 82.85 against the US currency. The dollar index, which gauges the green-



back's strength against a basket of six currencies, rose 0.18 per cent to 103.67. Global oil benchmark Brent crude futures advanced 1.81 per cent to USD 78.23 per barrel. The rupee gained on the soft dollar and FII inflows, said Anuj Choudhary - Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas.

Modi invites Australian businesses to invest in infra, semiconductors, space sectors

Sydney, May 24:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday invited Australian businesses to take advantage of investment opportunities in India in sectors like digital infrastructure, telecom, and semiconductors. He suggested the Australian CEOs to forge partnerships with their Indian counterparts. The prime minister, while addressing top Australian CEOs at a business round-table here, also talked about numerous economic reforms undertaken by the government. He "invited them to take advantage of investment opportunities offered by India in domains of infrastructure including digital infrastructure,



IT, fintech, telecom, semiconductors, space, renewable energy including green hydrogen, education, pharma, healthcare including medical devices manufacturing, mining including critical minerals, textile, agriculture and food processing." Official Spokesperson, Ministry of External Affairs, Arindam Bagchi said in a tweet.

The government has taken steps like reducing compliance burden, intro-

duction of production linked incentive scheme and easing of foreign direct investment norms. have, India is comfortable for the next 5 or 6 years, given our forex reserves today, to be able to meet our forex requirements."

The minister was speaking at the annual session of industry body CII here. He added that no other developing country in the world is in such a "sweet spot" and it was the first time in many years that business persons are seeing interest rates almost at par with developed countries. "I believe this is a compelling case for investments, for growth and for expanding our international outreach, for bringing technology for bringing innovation into the country," he said, suggesting the in-

dustry should focus on quality, innovation and skilled manpower. Further he said that India's trading partners want India to fast track negotiations for free trade agreements (FTAs).



Stock markets halt three-day gaining streak on weak global trends

Mumbai, May 24:

Benchmark stock indices closed lower on Wednesday, snapping their three-day gaining streak following profit-taking in financials, metal and oil shares amid a bearish trend in the global markets.

The 30-share BSE Sensex fell 208.01 points or 0.34 per cent to settle at 61,773.78 in volatile trade. The index opened lower but bounced back in late-morning deals to hit a high of 62,154.14. The barometer later gave up gains to hit a low of 61,708.10 in line with weak European markets. The broader NSE Nifty declined 62.60 points or 0.34 per cent to end at 18,285.40 after losses in Adani Entertainment, Adani Ports and Tata Motors.



Among the Sensex firms, Tata Motors, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank, HDFC, Bajaj Finserv, Reliance Industries, Hindustan Unilever, Larsen & Toubro, Asian Paints and Tata Steel were the major laggards. Sun Pharma, Titan, ITC, IndusInd Bank, Tech Mahindra and Power Grid were among the winners.

There is no role for anchor in T20 cricket: Rohit Sharma

Mumbai, May 24 (PTD):

India captain Rohit Sharma believes T20 cricket has changed and there is no role for anchors left in the format, adding that he has been exploring what he can achieve more as a batter even though his change in approach has brought about failures.

The Indian captain across formats, Rohit says as a batter he wants to do things 'differently' now without worrying too much about the outcomes, and that power-hitting could never be his forte.

"As I see it, there is no role for an anchor now. It is just how T20 cricket is played these days, unless you are 20/3 or 4, which is not going to happen every day," Rohit told Jio Cinema.

"Once in a while, you will be in that position and then someone needs to anchor the innings and finish off to a good score. There is no role for an anchor anymore, guys are playing differently." Rohit feels a change in mindset is mandatory.

"If you do not change your mindset, you are



going to get smashed. People on the other side are thinking about the game differently and taking it to the next level.

"All seven batters need to play their role, I believe that if you get a good score, it is good, but even if you get a good 30-40 off just 10-15 or 20 balls, it is (just) as good because you are doing the role for the team. The game has changed," he added.

The Mumbai Indians and India captain said he has played T20 cricket long enough for him to stick to a particular approach to batting. "I just want to play that way and see what I can do. I have played this format for a long time and in a certain manner. But I want to do different things now. While doing that, (if) I get out, (it) does not really bother me," he said.

Rohit added, "If you see, in Chennai (vs Chennai Super Kings) and before that in Mohali (vs Punjab Kings), I got out zero. In the third game, against RCB, I stepped down the first ball. I thought I have failed thrice in as many attempts but it is fine, this is what I am going to do."

Ronaldo scores winner in Saudi Arabia

Riyadh, May 24 (AP):

Cristiano Ronaldo helped Al-Nassr keep its Saudi Arabian title hopes alive by scoring the winning goal in a come-from-behind 3-2 victory over Al-Shabab. If second-place Al-Nassr had lost the Riyadh derby then leader Al-Ittihad, which beat Al-Batin 1-0 earlier, would have been crowned champion with two games of the season remaining.

Cristian Guanica scored twice for Al-Shabab before Anderson Talisca of Brazil pulled a goal back for Al-Nassr just before the break. Six minutes after the restart, the nine-time champions were level as Abdulrahman Ghareeb made it 2-2 from close range. Just before the hour, Ronaldo put Al-Nassr ahead in style, sprinting past two defenders to curl a shot into the top corner from the edge of the area. It was the Portugal star's 14th goal since joining after the World Cup. "To be 2-0 down is very difficult but we believed until the end and scored three goals so congratulations to the team and the supporters who were amazing today," the former Real Madrid star said. Al-Ittihad is three points clear at the top of the standings. Ronaldo said the Saudi league is slowly improving: "Step-by-step I think this league will be in the top five leagues in the world but they need time, they need players, they need infrastructure."

Sindhu, Srikanth enter second round of Malaysia Masters

Star Indian shuttler PV Sindhu had to dig deep to beat

Denmark's Line Christophersen in the women's singles opening round and enter the pre-quarterfinals of the Malaysia Masters here on Wednesday.

While Ashmita lost 17-21 7-21 against fourth seed Yue Han of China, Aakarshi was shown the door by top seed Japanese Akane Yamaguchi 17-21 12-21. Among Indian men,

Kidambi Srikanth defeated Toma Junior Popov 21-12 21-16 to enter the singles second round.

He will be next to be up against Thailand's Kunlavut Vitidsarn, seeded eighth.

Later in the day, HS Prannoy will take on sixth seed Tien Chen Chou of Chinese Taipei, while Lakshya Sen will be up against seventh seed Kean Yew Loh of Singapore in the men's singles opening round.

Malvika Bansod will be in action against second seed Zhi Yi Wang of China in women's singles.

Manika out of singles competition

World Table Tennis Championships

Durban, May 24 (PTD):

Star Indian paddler Manika Batra fought hard before going down to Adriana Diaz of Puerto Rico 3-4 in the round of 32 at the World Table Tennis Championships here on Wednesday.

Up against Diaz, ranked 13th in the ITTF chart, world number 39 Manika took the first game before her opponent stepped on the pedal. It was fairly balanced till the sixth game with both the players locked at 3-3.

But Diaz ran away with the decider as Manika lost 3-4 (6-11, 12-10, 11-9, 6-11, 13-11, 9-11, 11-3), to book her place in the last 16.

Even though she lost, Manika managed to ensure the best result for India in singles com-



petition here. Later in the day, Achanta Sharath Kamal and Sathiyam Gnanasekaran will play the English pair of Paul Drinkhall and Liam Pitchford in the men's doubles round of 16. The Indian combination had defeated the same English duo en route to a gold medal in last year's Birmingham Commonwealth Games. Manika will then pair up with Archana Kamath and take on Japan's Hina Hayata and Mima Ito in the round of 16 of women's doubles.

Back-to-back international commitments very good for India: Gurpreet

New Delhi, May 24 (PTD):

Indian football team's first-choice goalkeeper Gurpreet Singh Sandhu says there is competition with his challenger Amrinder Singh but winning matches is more important than just being on the pitch for both.

Earlier this year, at the Tri-Nation Cup in Imphal, where India beat Myanmar 1-0 and the Kyrgyz Republic 2-0 to lift the trophy, both Gurpreet and Amrinder jointly won the 'Goalkeeper of the Tournament' award.

"The relation between the players is extremely good. There is competition for places in a way, but we are like brothers, and we all know that either of us can slot in and do the job on a given day," Gurpreet said. "It's an honour to play for



the country and whenever given the opportunity, we must do justice to it. Of course, we also help each other be in the right frame for such opportunities whenever they present themselves. "Overall, the desire is to see the team win, than to just be on the

pitch," he added. Playing back-to-back internationals tournaments prior to next year's AFC Asian Cup is "very good" for the Indian team, feels Gurpreet. The team is set to play in a number of matches, with back-to-back international tournaments lined up -- the

Intercontinental Cup in Bhubaneswar, the SAFF Championship in Bengaluru, followed by the Kings Cup in Thailand (September) and the Merdeka Cup in Malaysia (October).

Preparing for the Asian Cup, which is set to be held in January-February in Qatar, the Blue Tigers are hard at work in their training camp in Bhubaneswar ahead of the Intercontinental Cup.

Gurpreet believes that it is a great opportunity for players to polish their skills. "Back-to-back tournaments are very good for us. We've got a good number of games in front of us, and that's something that I personally appreciate. I don't think we have ever done this before," Gurpreet told the-aiff.com.

Warner will really play big part in Ashes and WTC final: Andrew McDonald

Melbourne, May 24 (PTD):

Australia's head coach Andrew McDonald has backed David Warner to "play a really big part" in the upcoming World Test Championship final against India and the Ashes series against traditional rivals England.

Warner endured a difficult tour of India earlier this year and even though the Delhi Capitals skipper showed attacking intent while amassing 516 runs from 14 matches in the IPL, he will have his task cut out in the seaming English conditions.

Regardless of Warner's recent struggles, McDonald is confident of the seasoned Australian delivering at the top of the order in the UK. "We're op-



timistic with what Dave's got left, we've picked him in the squad and we feel he'll play a really big part in the Ashes and the World Test Championship (final)," McDonald told Australian radio station SEN. Warner was included in Australia's squad for the WTC final against India and the first two Ashes Tests but selectors have also picked Marcus Harris and Matt Renshaw as options.

IPL has taken a heavy toll, I have 8-9 months to decide: MS Dhoni



Chennai, May 24 (PTD):

Describing himself as an "annoying skipper," Mahendra Singh Dhoni said months of intense preparation for the IPL has taken a "heavy toll" on him and that he would take a call on his retirement in eight to nine months.

There have been speculations that 2023 could be a swansong season for Dhoni, who has led Chennai Super Kings to their 10th IPL final with a 15-run win over Gujarat Titans in the Qualifier 1 here on Tuesday.

"Frankly, it takes a heavy toll. I have been out of home for literally four months," Dhoni said at the post-match presentation after winning the last game of the season at Chepauk. "I will always come to CSK. I have been out of home from January, been practicing since March, so we will see," he added. "January 31 was when I got out of the house, finished my work, and started practicing from 2nd or 3rd of March. It takes a lot, but I have ample time to decide."

"I don't know... I have 8-9 months to decide. Why take that headache now. I have ample time to decide. The auction is in December," the 41-year-old said.

Personally, Dhoni has had a quiet season with the bat, managing just 104 runs from 15 matches at an average of 34.67, and was also seen struggling with his knee especially while running between the wickets.

The World Cup-winning captain, however, has not missed a match this season. After CSK's final league game, he was also seen wearing a brace.

"I will always be there for CSK, whether that is in the playing form or sitting somewhere outside...I don't really know."

Shastri wants both Ashwin and Jadeja in Indian playing XI for WTC Final



Dubai, May 24 (PTD):

Former head coach Ravi Shastri feels that Indian team should play to its strength and include both Ravichandran Ashwin and Ravindra Jadeja in the playing eleven against Australia in the upcoming World Test Championship final at the Oval, next month.

Under Shastri's coaching, Indian team won a Test match at the Oval in 2021 but it was largely due to performance of India's pace attack comprising Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Siraj, Umesh Yadav and Shardul Thakur apart from a classy hundred by the then vice-captain Rohit Sharma. Picking his XI for the marquee WTC Final, Shastri felt the void left by Bumrah will hurt India's chances and they should counter it by

picking another spinner to accommodate for the lack of quicks.

"India did very well in England last time round because you had Bumrah, you had Shami, you had Shardul Thakur, and you had Mohammed Siraj," Shastri said in ICC Review.

"So you had four fast bowlers. One being an all-rounder there, Shardul. "That combination is a very good combination in England. Especially from India's point of view. It allows someone like Rohit Sharma to control the game far better. At times in England, you need to slow it down as well. And suddenly it can get overcast," he explained. For Shastri, it is important to pick players as per conditions and current form. Mohammed Shami and Umesh Yadav are a couple of years older and might be a few yards slower compared to 2021.

"You have got horses for courses, you've got all bases covered. But then if the quality is not good in your fast-bowling attack. If you think the guys are older, they are not as quick as they used to be, and the form is a little doubtful, then you play that second spinner because Ashwin is quality, as is Jadeja."

Defence main focus in next two games in Australia: Ekka



Adelaide, May 24 (PTD):

The focus would be on defence and not conceding easy goals as the Indian women's hockey team looks to bounce back and sign off with wins against Australia A in their last two games of the tour here.

The Indians have played three games against Australia, losing 2-4 and 2-3 in the first two games, respectively, and then coming from behind in the third game to ensure a 1-1 result.

In their final two games of the tour, the visitors

will face Australia 'A' here on Thursday and Saturday.

The exposure trip is part of India's preparation for the upcoming Asian Games and vice-captain Deep Grace Ekka believes that a strong defence line will be critical to the team's chances.

"Given that we played against a strong team like Australia, we produced a good show in the first three games, especially attacking-wise, but we conceded quite a few goals, which shouldn't be happening," Ekka said.

"Hence, we are focusing on improving our defend-

ing in the next two games and ending our tour on a high by winning the remaining matches."

The Indian team demonstrated brilliant attacking prowess in all three games, but they struggled to keep Australia from scoring goals.

"Also, if we ensure that we don't concede goals easily, it will help our forward line put pressure on opponents by attacking freely, which will ultimately increase our chances of winning games not only in this tour but also in our upcoming tournaments," the 28-year-old added.

'Banks cannot forcibly take possession of loan-default vehicles by engaging musclemen'

Patna, May 24 (PTI)

The Patna High Court has held that forcibly taking away vehicles from owners by musclemen engaged by financial institutions and banks for defaulting on loans is violation of the fundamental right to life and livelihood.

Justice Rajeev Ranjan Prasad, while disposing of a batch of writ petitions, said the rights of the banks and the finance companies must be exercised within the constitutional limitations and in accordance with the law.

The single bench observed that banks and finance companies "cannot act in conflict with the fundamental principles and policy of India which means that no person may be deprived of his livelihood and the right to live with dignity without following the established procedure of law".

A Supreme Court order "completely bans taking such possession by engaging gangsters, goons and musclemen as so-called recovery agents", the bench said in its order.

The high court said that vehicle loans should be re-

covered following provisions of securitisation that empower banks and financial institutions to recover bad debts by acquiring physical possession of the mortgaged properties of defaulting borrowers with the aid of the district administration and getting them auctioned in order to enforce their security interest.

The bench directed all police superintendents in Bihar to ensure that no vehicle is seized forcefully by any recovery agent and fined erring banks and finance companies Rs 50,000 each.

"The right to recovery of these banks and financial institutions if pitted against the constitutional right of life of a person/petitioner to live with dignity and not to be deprived of without following the established procedure of law, the constitutional rights of the person/petitioner shall prevail," it said.

In the garb of the power acquired by the financier under the loan agreement to repossess the vehicle, they cannot be allowed to take the law into their hands, the high court said in its May 19 order.

Ordinance on control of services in Delhi means Modi govt doesn't believe in Supreme Court: Kejriwal

Mumbai, May 24 (PTI)

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Wednesday claimed the ordinance issued for control of services in Delhi implies the Narendra Modi government does not believe in the Supreme Court.

After meeting Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray at the latter's residence in Mumbai, Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) national convener Kejriwal said state governments were being toppled by using the CBI and the ED.

Slamming the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Thackeray said they have come together to defeat forces that are against democracy.

Kejriwal met Thackeray to seek support for the AAP's fight against the Centre's ordinance on control of services in Delhi.

He said the Shiv Sena has promised to support the people of Delhi when the

ordinance comes to the Rajya Sabha in the form of a bill.

"This will be like a semi-final in the Rajya Sabha. If the bill is defeated in the Rajya Sabha, then the Modi government will not come back to power in 2024," Kejriwal claimed.

The Shiv Sena (UBT) has three members in the Rajya Sabha.

"The ordinance on control of services in Delhi means the Modi government doesn't believe in the Supreme Court. The ordinance implies that how can the Supreme Court give a judgment against us (the Centre)," Kejriwal said. Backing the AAP leader, Thackeray said the Supreme Court's order was important for democracy.

10 booked in Indore for distributing 'objectionable' pamphlets against RSS and Bajrang Dal

Indore, May 24 (PTI)

Police have registered an FIR against 10 persons in Indore city of Madhya Pradesh for allegedly distributing objectionable pamphlets against the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) and the Bajrang Dal, a police official said on Wednesday.

The First Information Report (FIR) was registered based on a complaint lodged by a 45-year-old woman, said Raoji Bazar police station in-charge Pritam Singh Thakur.

"The case was registered against nearly 10 unidentified persons under section 153-A (promoting enmity between different groups on grounds of religion) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). The complaint stated that the pamphlets, which were distributed on the

night of May 20, allegedly used objectionable words against the RSS and the Bajrang Dal," he said.

"The identity of the people who distributed the pamphlets is yet to be established. We are trying to identify the accused with the help of CCTV footage," he said.

Another police official said the pamphlets, published in the backdrop of the issue of religious conversion, were addressed to young women. The pamphlets, titled "Open Letter", have "Your Faithful Brother" printed as the sender at the end, he said.

Two days back, the Indore police arrested a 23-year-old man on the charge of raping a woman, with whom he was in a relationship, and pressuring her to change her religion.

DU to launch centre on tribal studies

New Delhi, May 24 (PTI)

The Delhi University will start a multi-disciplinary centre on tribal studies to educate students about the contribution of tribal leaders to society during various eras of Indian history, a senior varsity official said on Wednesday.

The proposal in this regard will be presented at a meeting of the Academic Council on Friday, the official added.

An ordinance issued recently said the new centre will have seven major objectives, which include understanding the term "tribe" from an India-centric perspective and studying the "social, cultural, linguistic, religious, economic, and environmental diversity and commonalities" of different tribes.

The students will get to "study and document various Lok traditions of India's tribes including their indigenous/traditional knowledge", according to the ordinance.

The centre also aims to highlight the role of tribal leaders in India's struggle for freedom and "bring out to prominence the unsung heroes among them", the ordinance added.

Another focus area of the new centre is the identification of the problems of Denotified and Nomadic tribes and Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) with reference to conservation, development and special health needs.

Students of the centre will also get a chance to study the significance of forest-tribe relationships with a focus on the stability

of forest ecosystems and livelihood issues.

According to the ordinance, a new body will be set up under the Executive Council of the university to monitor the multi-disciplinary centre's governance. All expenditures of the centre such as on seminars, research projects, teaching, publications, administration, equipment and other support activities shall be made adhering to the General Financial Rules, allocation and other rules and regulations as applicable, the ordinance mentioned.

"Additional financial support can be sought from various government agencies or through collaborations with national and international agencies according to the requirements from time to time," it added.

Heavy rains lash Jammu region, landslide blocks highway

Jammu, May 24 (PTI) In a respite from the scorching heat wave conditions, heavy rains on Wednesday lashed various areas of the Jammu region bringing down the temperature.

The Jammu-Srinagar national highway was blocked for a brief period due to landslides triggered by heavy rains in Ramban district.

Student accused of setting afire court premises acquitted

Mumbai, May 24 (PTI)

A sessions court here has acquitted a 22-year-old student who was arrested for setting afire the premises of another court and causing damage to the property, observing that the prosecution failed to prove the case against him. In his order passed last month, Additional Sessions Judge A A Kulkarni let off Omkar Pawar and said the prosecution had claimed that the alleged incident occurred in broad daylight but it did not

examine any witness who might have seen the accused at the spot. "In such circumstances, I am of the opinion that evidence of prosecution is not sufficient to conclude that prosecution has proved that accused set fire in the premises of Girgaon court and caused damage to the property," the court said. As per the prosecution, the assistant superintendent of Metropolitan Magistrate Court, Girgaon, had on June 19, 2021, received a call about a fire on the premises.

Mumbai BJP chief Ashish Shelar meets NCP supremo

Shelar, a BJP MLA from Bandra West, has been in the world of cricket politics for almost a decade, while Pawar had earlier served as the president of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), the International Cricket Council (ICC), and the Mumbai Cricket Association (MCA).

'Ramayana, Mahabharata will be rewritten in every era'

Age-old stories like those told in Ramayana and Mahabharata will be rewritten and retold in every era, says writer Anand Neelakantan, who is known for his interpretation of Indian epics from the perspective of the antagonist.

The 49-year-old rose to fame with his 2012 mythological fiction, "Asura: Tale of the Vanquished", which depicted the tale of Ramayana from the perspective of Ravana. His another bestseller, "Ajaya", also depicts the epic of Mahabharata from the point of view of Duryodhana.

Calling himself more of a "storyteller" than a novelist, Neelakantan

said "Indian civilisation" does not believe in "one god, one religion, and one book".

"It is not the first time somebody is reinterpreting or rewriting it, every Ramayana is different, every Mahabharata is different. There are more than 1000-1200 Mahabharatas and 300-340 Ramayanas. This is a tradition continuing from the last 2000-3000 years, or more than that in different languages," Neelakantan told PTI in an interview.

The author said retelling an old story in a slightly different manner

was never considered "blasphemy".

"Traditionally, it was never that, which is why we have got so many Ramayanas and Mahabharatas. It's an all accepting culture. And more will be written, it's not going to end.

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
