US drone deal pending, price 'Dark days of Emergency unforgettable reports misleading: Govt

New Delhi, Jun 25 (PTI):

India is yet to finalise the cost and specific terms of purchase of 31 MQ-9B long endurance drones from the US and it will examine the "best price" offered by the manufacturer to other nations before concluding the procurement, the defence ministry said on Sunday while trashing reports in a section of social media on the price as well as the acquisition process

It said the Acceptance of Necessity (AoN) accorded to the procurement by the Acquisition Defence Council (DAC) noted the

estimated cost of USD 3,072 million (one million=10 lakh) as provided by the US government, adding the price will be negotiated once policy approval from Washington is received. The DAC headed by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on June 15 accorded the AoN or initial approval for acquisition of 31 MQ-9B High Altitude Long Endurance (HALE) drones from the US under the foreign military sale (FMS) route.

June 21, 1961, that the monsoon arrived in Delhi and Mumbai at the same time,' said DS Pai, a senior scien-Meteorological Department (IMD). The Safdarjung Observatory, Delhi's pri-

logged 48.3 mm rainfall in the 24 hours ending at 8.30 am on Sunday. The Dhansa weather station logged around 80 mm, Jafarpur and Lodi Road around 60 mm each, Ayanagar Mungeshpur around 50 mm each and SPS Mayur Vihar 40 mm, according to the IMD. The Met office termed the monsoon activity over Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi as 'vigorous'.

On eight US products

New Delhi, Jun 25 (PTI):

India will remove additional duties on eight US products, including chickpeas, lentils and apples, which were imposed in 2019 in response to America's measure to increase tariffs on certain steel and aluminium products, government sources said.

During the recent state visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the US, both countries decided the termination of six WTO (World Trade Organisation) disputes and the removal of these

retaliatory tariffs on cer-

tain US products.

Addl duties to be removed.....

As part of the agreement, India will be removing additional duty on chickpeas (10 per cent), lentils (20 per cent), almonds fresh or dried (Rs 7 per kg), almonds shelled (Rs 20 per kg), walnuts (20 per cent), apples fresh (20 per cent), boric acid (20 per cent), and Diagnostic Regents (20 per cent), the sources added.

In 2018, the US imposed an import duty of 25 per cent on steel products and 10 per cent on certain aluminium products on grounds of national security. In retaliation, India in June 2019 imposed cusduties on American products.



Trace money trail to China

Nagpur, Jun 25 (PTI):

The Nagpur cyber police probing a "task fraud" have unearthed a transaction involving the transfer of crime money to a individual Chinese through cryptocurrency and arrested six men from Mumbai, Gujarat and Rajasthan, a senior official said. Three of the six arrested men hail from Mumbai and suburban Nallasopara and the others from Rajasthan and Surat in Gujarat.

The police seized 19 debit and credit cards, nine mobile phones, a laptop, and cash worth Rs 7.87 lakh. Additionally, the police have frozen Rs 37.26 lakh from the bank accounts of the accused individuals, the official said on Saturday. On the modus operandi of such a crime, Deputy Commissioner of Police (cyber) Archit Chandak at a press conference said fraudsters em-

ploy different teams to handle various tasks, including an IT team to monitor transactions and a banking team to facilitate their activities. The fraud involves promise of money for performing tasks like liking videos and giving reviews for products. Later, the fraudsters lure the targeted individuals with "prepaid" tasks. They keep on increasing the fees and the victims keep paying the amounts expecting higher

they have been cheated. "The task fraud involves a systematic process consisting of three key stepstrust building, laying trap and treachery. Cyber criminals first entice individuals with tasks promising lucrative monetary re-

returns till they realise

"In the second stage, they set a trap wherein they win the victims' trust over a month and persuade them with prospects

of an elevated profile in exchange for various fees. This ultimately leads to the third step-treacherywherein the accused absconds with the money and cuts off all communication with the victim,' said Chandak.

He said the modus operandi resembles the operations of corporate enti-

"Seventy-five border villages spreading across all the eight districts will be identified by the districtlevel committees. The administration had already prepared a list of freedom fighters from the state and their contribution to the country's freedom struggle," Information and Cultural Affairs Secretary PK Chakravorty told PTI.

Statutes of the 75 freedom fighters will be erected in these villages and their family members will be felicitated by the government he said

Emergency trauma still haunts those who were jailed Lucknow, Jun 25 (PTI): June 25 night, suspending

It has been nearly 50 years but Lucknow-resident Tej Narayan Gupta vividly remembers the evening a police team knocked on his door and picked him up.

A nationwide crackdown had begun on June 26 in 1975, a day after the Emergency was imposed in the country, with scores of opposition leaders and activists put behind bars. "Around 9 pm I had just returned home when a police team raided my house and arrested me," Gupta, who was then an activist and lawyer, said.

A policeman took him on a bicycle to Bazar Khala police station, two km away from his home. He was then taken to Kaisarbagh police station and finally lodged in the Lucknow district jail along with other arrested persons. "The policemen was riding the bicycle, which was taken from a labourer, and I sat on the rod in front of him. He was riding the cycle very slowly. The motive was to create terror in the minds of the residents of my locality," Gupta, 83, told PTI.

Equating the imposition of the Emergency with dacoity, he said, "Generally, dacoity is carried out around midnight. Similarly, this dacoity of democracy in the country also took place around midnight."The Indira Gandhi government imposed the Emergency on

civil liberties and censoring the press. The morning after a crackdown began on opposition leaders and activists with scores of them being jailed across the country. "In jail, we were not

sure about the future and whether we will ever walk out of it," Gupta said. Months later the situation and changed Emergency was lifted on March 21, 1977. In his 'Mann Ki Baat' radio broadcast on June

Prime Minister Narendra Modi described the Emergency as a "dark period" in India's history and said those who supported democracy at that

A Pakistani accountability court has acquitted former prime minister Nawaz Sharif in a 37-yearold case alleging that he transferred a "precious state land" here in the capital of Punjab province to one of the country's leading media barons as a

Saturday's ruling came days after the federal government led by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif. the younger brother of Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) supremo Nawaz Sharif, made crucial amendments to laws to lift the life-long ban on politicians.

The 73-year-old threetime former prime minister's acquittal may allow him to contest and lead PML-N in the next general



election scheduled later this year.

Nawaz Sharif was disqualified in 2017 by the Supreme Court. In 2018, he became ineligible to hold public office for life after a Supreme Court verdict in the Panama Papers

Russian mercenary leader's exile ends revolt

Moscow, Jun 25 (AP):

The greatest challenge to Russian President Vladimir Putin in his more than two decades in power fizzled out after the rebellious mercenary commander who ordered his troops to march on Moscow abruptly reached a deal with the Kremlin to go into exile and sounded the retreat.

The brief revolt, though, exposed vulnerabilities among Russian government forces, with Wagner Group soldiers under the command of Yevgeny Prigozhin able to move unimpeded into the Russian city of Rostov-on-Don and advance hundreds of kilometres toward Moscow. The Russian military scrambled to defend Russia's capital. Under

the deal announced Saturday by Kremlin spokesman Peskov, Prigozhin will go to neighboring Belarus, which has supported Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Charges against him of mounting an armed rebellion will be dropped.

The government also said it would not prosecute Wagner fighters who took part, while those who did not join in were to be offered contracts by the Defence Ministry.

Prigozhin ordered his troops back to their field camps in Ukraine, where they have been fighting alongside Russian regular soldiers. Putin had vowed earlier to punish those behind the armed uprising led by his one-

Pak to raise Rs 215 billion through taxes to fulfil IMF loan conditions: FM Dar

One policeman was killed and another was injured on Saturday in a attack by a suicide bomber in Pakistan's Balochistan province, police said.

The attack happened in Balochistan's Turbat when the female suicide bomber targeted a vehicle of the Paramilitary Frontiers Corps (FC). "A policeman was killed and a lady police constable was wounded in the attack who was immediately rushed to the hospital for medical treatment," police said.

Officials of law enforcing agencies reached at the scene and initiated the collection of evidence to investigate the incident. The banned Baloch Liberation Army accepted the responsibility for the attack. It said in a statement that the attack was carried out by Samia Qalandrani Baloch of the Majeed Brigade of the group. Balochistan Chief Minister Mir Abdul Qudoos Bizenjo condemned the blast and expressed regret at the at-

tack and extended his condolences to the families of killed and injured officials. "The aim of terrorism is to halt the development process and intimidate the security forces. The evil intentions of terrorists will never be successful," the chief minister said in a statement. The province has been grappling with a wave of terrorism and insurgency for several years, with various militant groups carrying out attacks targeting security forces and civilians alike.

sixth grade and barring Afghan women from public life and work, especially for nongovernmental organisations and the United Nations.

The message was distributed in five languages: Arabic, Dari, English, Pashto and Urdu. Akhundzada said the negative aspects of the previous 20-year occupation related to women's wearing of the hijab and "misguidance" will end soon.

"The status of women as a free and dignified human being has been re-

have been obliged to help women in securing marriage, inheritance and other rights," he added.

Despite initial promises of a more moderate rule than during their previous stint in power in the 1990s, the Taliban have imposed harsh measures since seizing Afghanistan in August 2021 as US and NATO forces were pulling out.

Modi's US Visit

Subtly Signaling Strength to China

n the realm of international diplomacy, messages are often conveyed not through explicit statements, but rather through nuanced gestures and actions. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's state visit to the United States exemplified this approach, sending a strong signal to China without uttering its name. The visit showcased the deepening strategic partnership between the United States and India, emphasizing shared interests and highlighting India's emergence as a rising power. The implications for China are clear, despite the absence of direct references during the visit. China has emerged as India's primary security threat in recent years, overshadowing its historical rival, Pakistan. Border clashes and growing tensions between the two populous nations have revived a long-standing rivalry in the Indo-Pacific region. Recognizing this shift, the United States has found common ground with India, aligning their strategic interests and fostering a convergence between the world's largest democracy and the global superpower. National security adviser Jake Sullivan clarified that the visit was not explicitly about China, but the question of China's influence was undeniably on the agenda. The visit witnessed several significant agreements, including the manufacturing of General Electric fighter-jet engines in India and the procurement of General Atomics armed drones. These deals hold immense importance for India, as they enhance its defense capabilities and equip it to counter China's military maneuvers effectively. The provision of sensitive jet engine technology, previously unrevealed even to treaty allies, signifies a long-term commitment between the United States and India in the defense sector. It opens avenues for future collaborations and paves the way for India's defense innovation advancements over the next few decades. India's recognition of the need to compete with China's military modernization campaign is evident in its efforts to foster technological advancements. By facilitating tech and defense collaboration, PM Modi's visit aims to break down barriers and promote cooperation between the two countries. An example of this is the partnership between Micron Technology Inc., the largest US memory chipmaker, and India. This agreement not only represents a significant investment but also contributes to the rebalancing of global supply chains away from China. India's objectives in pursuing these initiatives go beyond countering China. The deals serve to reduce its reliance on Russian military equipment and revitalize its manufacturing sector. By attracting foreign investment, India aims to become an alternative manufacturing destination, a prospect that gained momentum as investors sought alternatives to China during the pandemic. India's ambitions extend beyond regional influence. As the host of the upcoming G-20 summit, India aspires to assert itself as a great power with its unique approach to alliances and partnerships. While the United States and China vie for influence in the Pacific, India positions itself as a champion of the developing world. Its recent interactions with Pacific Island nations, warmly received by leaders in the region, reinforce India's standing as a prominent global player. The United States recognizes India's strategic autonomy and does not expect it to become a formal treaty ally like Japan or Australia. India's refusal to condemn Russia's actions in Ukraine or join in sanctions underscores its independent foreign policy approach. However, India's perception of China as a threat has significantly evolved in recent years. The border conflict and China's aggressive actions have strained relations and led to public sentiment against China in India. Bans on Chinese apps, restrictions on Chinese telecom giants, and other measures reflect India's growing concerns. While the visit was not framed as a direct response to China, the subtext is clear: the United States and India are aligned in their pursuit of a free and open Indo-Pacific. The message to China is unmistakable - India's emergence and partnership with the United States serve as a counterweight to its regional aspirations. As the geopolitical landscape continues to evolve, the United States and India's strategic partnership will play a pivotal role in shaping a future that promotes peace, stability, and prosperity in the Indo-

By doing so, India can bridge the competence gap and create a skilled workforce capable of meeting the demands of the semiconductor industry. The growth potential of the global chips market, coupled with Micron's investment and India's emphasis on semiconductor manufacturing, opens up numerous job opportunities. Titanic Expedition Tragedy: Unveiling the Deep-Sea Dangers

I n a tragic turn of events, an adventure to explore the wreckage of the RMS Titanic claimed the lives of five individuals, raising concerns and demanding answers to prevent such devastating accidents in the future. The submersible Titan, carrying a team of explorers, met a

catastrophic fate with a fatal implosion, shattering the hopes of a successful expedition. The allure of the Titanic, which sank in 1912 after striking an iceberg, continues to captivate nautical experts and underwater tourists alike. Resting 900 nautical miles east of Cape Cod, Massachusetts, the ship's wreckage remains a testament to its historical significance.

The search for the missing

Titan grew increasingly desperate as the submersible's estimated 96-hour air supply dwindled. Among the individuals on board were Stockton Rush, the founder and CEO of OceanGate, the company owning the Titan, and four others. The team included British billionaire and explorer Hamish Harding, Pakistani-born businessmen Shahzada Daand and his son Suleman, both British citizens, and French oceanographer and renowned Titanic expert Paul-Henri,

fondly known as 'Mr. Titanic.'
The undersea expedition, operated by OceanGate since 2021, carried a price tag of \$250,000 per person.

The tragic loss of these "true explorers" has triggered widespread shock and grief globally, highlighting concerns about potential safety compromises made OceanGate. While the cause of the Titan's destruction remains unclear, the US Navy reportedly detected an acoustic anomaly consistent with an implosion shortly after the submersible lost contact with the surface. An extensive international search involving US, Canadian, British, and French teams led to the discovery of debris, confirming it to be from the Titan. However, the bodies of the victims are yet to be recov-

The legal ramifications surrounding this disaster are complex. OceanGate, as the responsible company, may face accountability for the fate of the passengers, including their CEO. However, the presence of waiver forms, in which passengers released the company from liability, complicates the situation. Families could potentially pursue legal action against OceanGate if negligence on the part of the crew is proven. Additionally, liability extends to the operator of the parent vessel, Polar Prince, as it is Canadian flagged and based.

Canadian-flagged and based. Deep-sea exploration inherently carries risks, and while waivers acknowledge this fact, companies involved must prioritize employee and passenger safety. Certification of vessels and adherence to rigorous safety protocols are paramount. The tragedy involving the Titan stands out as an outlier, as its maker chose not to certify the vessel, defying industry conventions. Previous concerns about the Titan's safety were raised in 2018 during a symposium of

submersible industry experts and in a subsequent lawsuit, which was later settled.

As we navigate the realm of deep-sea tourism, it is essential to acknowledge that accidents may occur even with the most reliable technology. The recent rail accident in Orissa, along with incidents on ropeways in Uttarakhand, Kashmir, and Himachal Pradesh, serve as reminders of this reality. It is crucial to address the liability, improve safety measures, and ensure that companies exceed expectations in safeguarding the lives of those involved in deep-sea expeditions.

In the aftermath of this tragedy, lessons must be learned, questions answered, and protocols strengthened to protect future adventurers. The Titan expedition serves as a stark reminder that the pursuit of discovery must always be accompanied by an unwavering commitment to safety and responsibility.

Mumbai: Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das has said that within a month of the recall order, more than two-thirds of the Rs 2,000 currency notes have returned to the system. In a surprise move, but as part of the clean note policy, the Reserve Bank had on May 19 ordered the recall of the Rs 2,000 banknotes worth around R 3.62 lakh crore. Adani eyes Rs 90,000 cr EBITDA in 2-3 yrs renewables, solar panels,

New Delhi, Jun 25 (PTI):

Embattled Adani group is eyeing a 20 per cent year-on-year growth in pre-tax profits to reach Rs 90.000 crore EBITDA in 2-3 years on the back of robust growth in businesses ranging from airports to energy, according to a company note.

Earlier this month, the group repaid loans aggregating USD 2.65 billion to complete a prepayment programme to cut overall leverage in an attempt to win back investor trust post a damning report of a US short seller.

The ports-to-energy conglomerate is now looking at robust growth in sectors such as airports, cement, ables, transportation and

transportation and logistics, and power and transmission, it said adding several of Adani's new infrastructure investments will also begin to fructify and generate cash in the coming years. Adani is expected to see an increase of more than 20 per cent in EBITDA on a consolidated basis in the coming years as it drives robust and sustainable growth across its business portfolio. Its target EBITDA of over Rs 90,000 crore is expected by FY23, the note said.

In recent years, the group has made substantial investments in ports and completed significant projects across renew-

ports. Businesses such as airports and renewables are also exhibiting improved cash flows. Its solid asset base, built over three decades, supports resilient critical infrastructure and ensures high asset performance throughout their life cycles.

The group's listed portfolio EBITDA increased 36 per cent yoy to Rs 57,219 crore in FY23 (April 2022 to March 2023 fiscal). Core infrastructure businesses, which constitute 82.8 per cent of the portion including energy, transport, logistics, and flagship Adani Enterprise Ltd's infrastructure ventures, registered a robust 23 per cent yoy growth in EBITDA to

War of billionaire: Musk, Tata, Mittal & Amazon on one side, Ambani on other for satellite spectrum

New Delhi, Jun 25 (PTI):

Elon Musk wants his Starlink to beam down wireless internet in India from satellites orbiting the earth, but the licensing regime his group favours has put him at odds with Mukesh Ambani's Reliance.

After meeting Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New York last week, Musk on June 21 said he was keen to launch Starlink in India that "can be incredibly helpful" in bringing the internet to remote villages that lack onground infrastructure.

But Starlink wants India to just assign a license for the service and not insist on auctioning the signal-carrying spectrum or airwaves. This stand finds Musk on the side of Tatas, Sunil Bharti Mittal's firm, and Amazon, who too prefer the same route. But Ambani's Reliance says there must be an auction of spectrum for foreign satellite service providers to offer voice and data services to pro-

vide a level playing field to

traditional telecom players who offer the same services using airwaves bought in government

space-based communication services (SS) spectrum decision is key. Mobile spectrum has been auctioned since 2010 with the government's cumulative sale of USD 77 billion and several players are keen on SS," brokerage CLSA said in a note on 'Satellite Spectrum Battle Ahead'.

Based on comments provided by various companies to the sector regulator TRAI's consultations on the issue, CLSA said several players, including Starlink are keen on India

Amazon's Kuiper, Tata, Bharti Airtel-backed OneWeb, and Larsen & Toubro are against the auction while Reliance Jio and Vodafone-Idea support an India SS auction, it

Sources said some in the government believe an auction is the best route as it would get the foreign companies to commit in-

CLSA said OneWeb's view is that SS should be assigned administratively. on a shared basis, and harmonised internationally. Through Starlink, Musk's SpaceX, which is authorised in 84 administrations (1.5 million users) sees the best approach for SS spectrum is a shared model with administrative assignment.

The Kuiper project of Amazon, which plans to launch its first set of satellites in 2024, recommends administrative assignment and also says spectrum-sharing obligations after auctions would create inefficiencies.

As per Reliance Jio (RJio), which is the market leader in India with close to 440 million telecom users and 8 million wired broadband subscribers, satellite operators are planning networks to compete with terrestrial service providers and auctioning SS is the sole viable strategy. Vodafone-Idea, too, has



Bharti Airtel believes auctioning SS spectrum will create barriers for competition as some may block access by winning the spectrum in spite of having no global allocation. Reliance Jio and Bharti

are currently rolling out 5G services in the country. SS, when integrated with existing 5G coverage, will extend capabilities of 5G networks to where cell coverage is not expected to reach and will also boost enterprise offering, CLSA said.

"However, in India, low mobile tariffs in 5G of USD 0.17 per GB (vs USD 6 in US and USD 0.4 in China) will be a challenge for providing SS," it said. "SS spectrum allocation via auction or administrative allotment will also be key to telecom's competitive landscape, including in 5G and access to the under-served."

Deloitte expects India's satellite broadband service market to grow by 36 per cent a year to reach USD 1.9 billion by 2030.



'Govt kept same rules for Indian, foreign firms while procuring Covid vaccines'

New Delhi, Jun 25 (PTI):

Foreign-made vaccines were not procured during the Covid pandemic as the firms were demanding indemnity, which was not made available to Indian vaccine manufacturers, Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya has said, asserting that the "same rule applies for all".

He also said that it was wrong to suggest that India stopped foreign made vaccines like that made by Moderna and Pfizer from coming to India.

"We may have certain requirements strengths and other countries may have some other strengths and needs. It is wrong to say that India stopped any country from coming to India.When they applied with required data, we gave them emergency use approvals just like we gave to Indian companies," Mandaviya said in an exclusive interview to PTI recently.

However, their demands

for indemnification and immunity sovereign waivers were a major impediment and eventually the government did not go ahead with it, the minister

"At that time, Sputnik vaccine was also there and so were Indian vaccines. Whichever global company wants to come to India, they can come and sell their products, whether they are medicines or vaccines, we have no problem with that. But all need to follow India's rules and regulations. Our own companies did not ask for an indemnity. Sputnik did not ask for it," Mandaviya

"If our own companies are not seeking such relaxations and following our rules and regulations, then it is natural that global companies also do the same," he said.

The minister stressed that countries need to cooperate with each other in the health sector in times of globalisation.

Highlighting that India

wants to expand its relationship with the world in the pharma and health sectors, Mandaviya said, We are not against anyone or in favour of anyone". India is such a country that applies the same rules and regulations for Indian and foreign companies with equal rights.

"Not many countries give such equal rights, but India does. The world also appreciates this position country," Mandaviya stated.

Recounting the fight against the pandemic, Mandaviya, who took charge of the health ministry in the middle of the

coronavirus crisis in July 2021, said Covid management was a big challenge for a vast and diverse country like India, but its success story has now become an example for the entire world. The minister also dis-

missed suggestions that

approvals for vaccines were rushed without taking into account long-term side effects and that the recent spate of heart attacks was linked to it, saying the entire process from vaccine research to its administration followed all established international standards. He said vaccine development and approvals used to take much longer earlier due to various physical and manual processes but the authorities and scientists made full use of the latest technology, including artificial intelligence, this time and, therefore, the entire process could be fasttracked. 



India will remove additional duties on eight US products, including chickpeas, lentils and apples, which were imposed in 2019 in response to America's measure to increase tariffs on certain steel and aluminium products, government sources said.

During the recent state visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the US, both countries decided the termination of six WTO (World Trade Organisation) disputes and the removal of these

retaliatory tariffs on cer-

tain US products.

will be removing additional duty on chickpeas (10 per cent), lentils (20 per cent), almonds fresh or dried (Rs 7 per kg), almonds shelled (Rs 20 per kg), walnuts (20 per cent), apples fresh (20 per cent), boric acid (20 per cent), and Diagnostic Regents (20 per cent), the sources added.

In 2018, the US imposed an import duty of 25 per cent on steel products and 10 per cent on certain aluminium products on grounds of national security. In retaliation, India in June 2019 imposed cusduties on American products.

The Nagpur cyber police probing a "task fraud" have unearthed a transaction involving the transfer of crime money to a individual Chinese through cryptocurrency and arrested six men from Mumbai, Gujarat and Rajasthan, a senior official said. Three of the six arrested men hail from Mumbai and suburban Nallasopara and the others from Rajasthan and Surat in Gujarat.

The police seized 19 debit and credit cards, nine mobile phones, a laptop, and cash worth Rs 7.87 lakh. Additionally, the police have frozen Rs 37.26 lakh from the bank accounts of the accused individuals, the official said on Saturday. On the modus operandi of such a crime, Deputy Commissioner of Police (cyber) Archit Chandak at a press conference said fraudsters em-

ploy different teams to handle various tasks, including an IT team to monitor transactions and a banking team to facilitate their activities. The fraud involves promise of money for performing tasks like liking videos and giving reviews for products. Later, the fraudsters lure the targeted individuals with "prepaid"

creasing the fees and the

returns till they realise

they have been cheated. "The task fraud involves a systematic process consisting of three key stepstrust building, laying trap and treachery. Cyber criminals first entice individuals with tasks promising lucrative monetary re-

"In the second stage, they set a trap wherein they win the victims' trust over a month and persuade them with prospects

of an elevated profile in exchange for various fees. This ultimately leads to the third step-treacherywherein the accused absconds with the money and cuts off all communication with the victim,' said Chandak.

Tripura to rechristen 75 border villages after names of freedom fighters

Agartala, Jun 25 (PTI):

The Tripura government has decided to rechristen 75 border villages in the state after the names of freedom fighters who had sacrificed their lives during the country's independence movement, a senior official said on Sunday. The project to rename 75 border villages will be taken up as part of the 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav', an initiative to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of the country's independence and the glorious history of its people, culture and achievements. "The programme to recall the contribution of freedom fighters to the country's independence will commence in July and is scheduled to be completed by August 15 this year.

"Seventy-five border villages spreading across all the eight districts will be identified by the districtlevel committees. The administration had already prepared a list of freedom fighters from the state and their contribution to the country's freedom struggle," Information and Cultural Affairs Secretary PK Chakravorty told PTI.

Statutes of the 75 freedom fighters will be erected in these villages and their family members will be felicitated by the government he said

Emergency trauma still haunts those who were jailed Kaisarbagh police station and finally lodged in the Lucknow, Jun 25 (PTI):

It has been nearly 50 years but Lucknow-resident Tej Narayan Gupta vividly remembers the evening a police team knocked on his door and picked him up.

A nationwide crackdown had begun on June 26 in 1975, a day after the Emergency was imposed in the country, with scores of opposition leaders and activists put behind bars. "Around 9 pm I had just returned home when a police team raided my house and arrested me," Gupta, who was then an activist and lawyer, said.

A policeman took him on a bicycle to Bazar Khala police station, two km away from his home. He was then taken to Lucknow district jail along with other arrested persons. "The policemen was riding the bicycle, which was taken from a labourer, and I sat on the rod in front of him. He was riding the cycle very slowly. The motive was to create terror in the minds of the residents of my locality," Gupta, 83, told PTI.

Equating the imposition of the Emergency with dacoity, he said, "Generally, dacoity is carried out around midnight. Similarly, this dacoity of democracy in the country also took place around midnight."The Indira Gandhi government imposed the Emergency on

June 25 night, suspending civil liberties and censoring the press. The morning after a crackdown began on opposition leaders and activists with scores of them being jailed across the country.

"In jail, we were not sure about the future and whether we will ever walk out of it," Gupta said. Months later the situation and changed Emergency was lifted on March 21, 1977. In his 'Mann Ki Baat'

radio broadcast on June Prime Minister Narendra Modi described the Emergency as a "dark period" in India's history and said those who supported democracy at that

A Pakistani accountability court has acquitted former prime minister Nawaz Sharif in a 37-yearold case alleging that he transferred a "precious state land" here in the capital of Punjab province to one of the country's leading media barons as a

Saturday's ruling came days after the federal government led by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif. the younger brother of Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) supremo Nawaz Sharif, made crucial amendments to laws to lift the life-long ban on politicians

The 73-year-old threetime former prime minister's acquittal may allow him to contest and lead PML-N in the next general



election scheduled later this year.

Nawaz Sharif was disqualified in 2017 by the Supreme Court. In 2018, he became ineligible to hold public office for life after a Supreme Court verdict in the Panama Papers

Accountability Court in Lahore acquitted three-time premier Nawaz Sharif in a case related to illegal transfer of 54-kanal (6.75 acres) precious state land to Jang/Geo media group owner Mir Shakilur-Rehman in Lahore while he was the chief minister of Punjab 37 years ago," a court official

Rao Abdul Jabbar acquitted him after the country's antigraft body (National Accountability Bureau) informed the court that after recent amendments to its law (by the Shehbaz Sharif-led coalition government), the case does not fall in its preview," the official said.

The former prime minister's lawyer contended that NAB had malicious intentions while filing the case against his client, who had no involvement in plot allotment.

Russian mercenary leader's exile ends revolt

Moscow, Jun 25 (AP):

The greatest challenge to Russian President Vladimir Putin in his more than two decades in power fizzled out after the rebellious mercenary commander who ordered his troops to march on Moscow abruptly reached a deal with the Kremlin to go into exile and sounded the retreat.

The brief revolt, though, exposed vulnerabilities among Russian government forces, with Wagner Group soldiers under the command of Yevgeny Prigozhin able to move unimpeded into the Russian city of Rostov-on-Don and advance hundreds of kilometres toward Moscow. The Russian military scrambled to defend Russia's capital. Under

the deal announced Saturday by Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov, Prigozhin will go to neighboring Belarus, which has supported Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Charges against him of mounting an armed rebellion will be dropped.

The government also said it would not prosecute Wagner fighters who took part, while those who did not join in were to be offered contracts by the Defence Ministry.

Prigozhin ordered his troops back to their field camps in Ukraine, where they have been fighting alongside Russian regular soldiers. Putin had vowed earlier to punish those behind the armed uprising led by his onetime protege.

Pak to raise Rs 215 billion through taxes to fulfil IMF loan conditions: FM Dar

Islamabad, Jun 24 (PTI):

Pakistan will raise Rs 215 billion through taxes to meet the stringent conditions set by the IMF, Finance Minister Ishaq Dar said on Saturday, as the cash-strapped government tried to meet the conditions set by the IMF for a muchneeded loan

Speaking at the closing of a three-day-long general discussion with International Monetary Fund (IMF) on the budget for the financial year 2023-24 held in the National Assembly, Dar said that Pakistan is trying to fulfil all the formalities the global lender wants them to complete prior to availing the loan. "As a result of the talks with IMF, for the fiscal year 2023-24, the final taxes of only Rs 215 billion (approximately USD

Impressed by the rendition of the Kishore Kumar-Manna Dey number, the Prime Minister expressed surprise when Jena said she knew very little Hindi and had never visited India.

Islamabad, Jun 25 (PTI):

One policeman was killed and another was injured on Saturday in a attack by a suicide bomber in Pakistan's Balochistan province, police said.

The attack happened in Balochistan's Turbat when the female suicide bomber targeted a vehicle of the Paramilitary Frontiers Corps (FC). "A policeman was killed and a lady police constable was wounded in the attack who was immediately rushed to the hospital for medical treatment," police said.

Officials of law enforcing agencies reached at the scene and initiated the collection of evidence to investigate the incident. banned Baloch Liberation Army accepted the responsibility for the attack. It said in a statement that the attack was carried out by Samia Qalandrani Baloch of the Majeed Brigade of the group. Balochistan Chief Minister Mir Abdul Qudoos Bizenjo condemned the blast and expressed regret at the at-

tack and extended his condolences to the families of killed and injured officials. "The aim of terrorism is to halt the development process and intimidate the security forces. The evil intentions of terrorists will never be successful," the chief minister said in a statement. The province has been grappling with a wave of terrorism and insurgency for several years, with various militant groups carrying out attacks targeting security forces and civilians alike.

Islamabad, Jun 25 (AP):

The supreme leader of the Taliban released a message on Sunday claiming that his government has taken the necessary steps for the betterment of women's lives Afghanistan, women are banned from public life and work and girls' education is severely curtailed.

The statement from Hibatullah Akhundzada was made public ahead of the Eid al-Adha holiday, which will be celebrated later this week in traditional oppressions, Afghanistan and other Islamic countries

Akhundzada, an Islamic scholar, rarely appears in public or leaves the Taliban heartland in Afghanistan's southern Kandahar province. He surrounds himself with other religious scholars and allies who oppose education and work for women. In his Eid message Akhundzada said that under the rule of the Islamic Emirate, concrete

measures have been taken

to save women from many

including forced marriages, "and their Shariah rights have been protect-

Moreover, "necessary steps have been taken for the betterment of women as half of society in order to provide them with a comfortable and prosperous life according to the Islamic Shariah", the message continued.

Lately, Akhundzada appears to have taken a stronger hand in directing domestic policy, banning girls' education after the sixth grade and barring Afghan women from public life and work, especially for nongovernmental organisations and the United Nations.

The message was distributed in five languages: Arabic, Dari, English, Pashto and Akhundzada said the negative aspects of the previous 20-year occupation related to women's wearing of the hijab and "misguidance" will end soon.

"The status of women as a free and dignified human being has been re-

stored and all institutions have been obliged to help women in securing marriage, inheritance and other rights," he added.

Despite initial promises of a more moderate rule than during their previous stint in power in the 1990s. the Taliban have imposed harsh measures since seizing Afghanistan in August 2021 as US and NATO forces were pulling out.

They have from public women spaces, like parks and gyms, and cracked down on media freedoms.

Modi's US Visit

Subtly Signaling Strength to China

n the realm of international diplomacy, messages are often conveyed not through explicit statements, but rather through nuanced gestures and actions. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's state visit to the United States exemplified this approach, sending a strong signal to China without uttering its name. The visit showcased the deepening strategic partnership between the United States and India, emphasizing shared interests and highlighting India's emergence as a rising power. The implications for China are clear, despite the absence of direct references during the visit. China has emerged as India's primary security threat in recent years, overshadowing its historical rival, Pakistan. Border clashes and growing tensions between the two populous nations have revived a long-standing rivalry in the Indo-Pacific region. Recognizing this shift, the United States has found common ground with India, aligning their strategic interests and fostering a convergence between the world's largest democracy and the global superpower. Although President Joe Biden referred to Chinese President Xi Jinping as a "dictator" prior to the visit, both leaders refrained from framing their engagement as a direct response to the China challenge. However, it is evident that the issue of China's role in various domains, including the military, technology, and economy, loomed large throughout the discussions. National security adviser Jake Sullivan clarified that the visit was not explicitly about China, but the question of China's influence was undeniably on the agenda. The visit witnessed several significant agreements, including the manufacturing of General Electric fighter-jet engines in India and the procurement of General Atomics armed drones. These deals hold immense importance for India, as they enhance its defense capabilities and equip it to counter China's military maneuvers effectively. The provision of sensitive jet engine technology, previously unrevealed even to treaty allies, signifies a long-term commitment between the United States and India in the defense sector. It opens avenues for future collaborations and paves the way for India's defense innovation advancements over the next few decades. India's recognition of the need to compete with China's military modernization campaign is evident in its efforts to foster technological advancements. By facilitating tech and defense collaboration, PM Modi's visit aims to break down barriers and promote cooperation between the two countries. An example of this is the partnership between Micron Technology Inc., the largest US memory chipmaker, and India. This agreement not only represents a significant investment but also contributes to the rebalancing of global supply chains away from China. India's objectives in pursuing these initiatives go beyond countering China. The deals serve to reduce its reliance on Russian military equipment and revitalize its manufacturing sector. By attracting foreign investment, India aims to become an alternative manufacturing destination, a prospect that gained momentum as investors sought alternatives to China during the pandemic. India's ambitions extend beyond regional influence. As the host of the upcoming G-20 summit, India aspires to assert itself as a great power with its unique approach to alliances and partnerships. While the United States and China vie for influence in the Pacific, India positions itself as a champion of the developing world. Its recent interactions with Pacific Island nations, warmly received by leaders in the region, reinforce India's standing as a prominent global player. The United States recognizes India's strategic autonomy and does not expect it to become a formal treaty ally like Japan or Australia. India's refusal to condemn Russia's actions in Ukraine or join in sanctions underscores its independent foreign policy approach. However, India's perception of China as a threat has significantly evolved in recent years. The border conflict and China's aggressive actions have strained relations and led to public sentiment against China in India. Bans on Chinese apps, restrictions on Chinese telecom giants, and other measures reflect India's growing concerns. While the visit was not framed as a direct response to China, the subtext is clear: the United States and India are aligned in their pursuit of a free and open Indo-Pacific. The message to China is unmistakable - India's emergence and partnership with the United States serve as a counterweight to its regional aspirations. As the geopolitical landscape continues to evolve, the United States and India's strategic partnership will play a pivotal role in shaping a future that promotes peace, stability, and prosperity in the Indo-

By doing so, India can bridge the competence gap and create a skilled workforce capable of meeting the demands of the semiconductor industry. The growth potential of the global chips market, coupled with Micron's investment and India's emphasis on semiconductor manufacturing, opens up numerous job opportunities. Titanic Expedition Tragedy: Unveiling the Deep-Sea Dangers

I n a tragic turn of events, an adventure to explore the wreckage of the RMS Titanic claimed the lives of five individuals, raising concerns and demanding answers to prevent such devastating accidents in the future. The submersible Titan, carrying a team of explorers, met a

catastrophic fate with a fatal implosion, shattering the hopes of a successful expedition. The allure of the Titanic, which sank in 1912 after striking an iceberg, continues to captivate nautical experts and underwater tourists alike. Resting 900 nautical miles east of Cape Cod, Massachusetts, the ship's wreckage remains a testament to its historical significance.

The search for the missing

Titan grew increasingly desperate as the submersible's estimated 96-hour air supply dwindled. Among the individuals on board were Stockton Rush, the founder and CEO of OceanGate, the company owning the Titan, and four others. The team included British billionaire and explorer Hamish Harding, Pakistani-born businessmen Shahzada Daand and his son Suleman, both British citizens, and French oceanographer and renowned Titanic expert Paul-Henri,

fondly known as 'Mr. Titanic.'
The undersea expedition, operated by OceanGate since 2021, carried a price tag of \$250,000 per person.

The tragic loss of these "true explorers" has triggered widespread shock and grief globally, highlighting concerns about potential safety compromises made OceanGate. While the cause of the Titan's destruction remains unclear, the US Navy reportedly detected an acoustic anomaly consistent with an implosion shortly after the submersible lost contact with the surface. An extensive international search involving US, Canadian, British, and French teams led to the discovery of debris, confirming it to be from the Titan. However, the bodies of the victims are yet to be recov-

The legal ramifications surrounding this disaster are complex. OceanGate, as the responsible company, may face accountability for the fate of the passengers, including their CEO. However, the presence of waiver forms, in which passengers released the company from liability, complicates the situation. Families could potentially pursue legal action against OceanGate if negligence on the part of the crew is proven. Additionally, liability extends to the operator of the parent vessel, Polar Prince, as it is Canadian flagged and based.

Canadian-flagged and based. Deep-sea exploration inherently carries risks, and while waivers acknowledge this fact, companies involved must prioritize employee and passenger safety. Certification of vessels and adherence to rigorous safety protocols are paramount. The tragedy involving the Titan stands out as an outlier, as its maker chose not to certify the vessel, defying industry conventions. Previous concerns about the Titan's safety were raised in 2018 during a symposium of

submersible industry experts and in a subsequent lawsuit,

which was later settled. As we navigate the realm of deep-sea tourism, it is essential to acknowledge that accidents may occur even with the most reliable technology. The recent rail accident in Orissa, along with incidents on ropeways in Uttarakhand, Kashmir, and Himachal Pradesh, serve as reminders of this reality. It is crucial to address the liability, improve safety measures, and ensure that companies exceed expectations in safeguarding the lives of those involved in deep-sea expeditions.

In the aftermath of this tragedy, lessons must be learned, questions answered, and protocols strengthened to protect future adventurers. The Titan expedition serves as a stark reminder that the pursuit of discovery must always be accompanied by an unwavering commitment to safety and responsibility.

Elon Musk wants his Starlink to beam down wireless internet in India from satellites orbiting the earth, but the licensing regime his group favours has put him at odds with Mukesh Ambani's Reliance.

After meeting Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New York last week, Musk on June 21 said he was keen to launch Starlink in India that "can be incredibly helpful" in bringing the internet to remote villages that lack onground infrastructure.

But Starlink wants India to just assign a license for the service and not insist on auctioning the signal-carrying spectrum or airwaves. This stand finds Musk on the side of Tatas, Sunil Bharti Mittal's firm, and Amazon, who too prefer the same route. But Ambani's Reliance says there must be an auction of spectrum for foreign satellite service providers to offer voice and data services to pro-

vide a level playing field to

'Govt kept same rules for Indian, foreign firms while procuring Covid vaccines'

New Delhi, Jun 25 (PTI):

Foreign-made vaccines were not procured during the Covid pandemic as the firms were demanding indemnity, which was not made available to Indian vaccine manufacturers, Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya has said, asserting that the "same rule applies for all".

He also said that it was wrong to suggest that India stopped foreign made vaccines like that made by Moderna and Pfizer from coming to India.

"We may have certain requirements strengths and other countries may have some other strengths and needs. It is wrong to say that India stopped any country from coming to India.When they applied with required data, we gave them emergency use approvals just like we gave to Indian companies," Mandaviya said in an exclusive interview to PTI recently.

However, their demands

for indemnification and immunity sovereign waivers were a major impediment and eventually the government did not go ahead with it, the minister

"At that time, Sputnik vaccine was also there and so were Indian vaccines. Whichever global company wants to come to India, they can come and sell their products, whether they are medicines or vaccines, we have no problem with that. But all need to follow India's rules and regulations. Our own companies did not ask for an indemnity. Sputnik did not ask for it," Mandaviya

"If our own companies are not seeking such relaxations and following our rules and regulations, then it is natural that global companies also do the same," he said.

were rushed without taking into account long-term side effects and that the recent spate of heart attacks was linked to it, saying the entire process from vaccine research to its administration followed all established international standards. He said vaccine development and approvals used to take much longer earlier due to various physical and manual processes but the authorities and scientists made full use of the latest technology, including artificial intelligence, this time and, therefore, the entire process could be fasttracked. Mandaviya, a BJP leader from Gujarat known to enjoy the trust of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, said, "Let me tell you that PM Modi followed scientific ways for all procedures from the very beginning, from Covid management to vaccine research to approvals to the vaccination drive."

"It was the PM's direction because of which IN-SACOG (Indian SARS-Genomics Consortium) and several other taskforce and empowered groups were set up for vaccine approvals and other protocols. In the entire Covid journey, we followed scientific ways to fight this pandemic.

"Scientists told us when the vaccines should be approved, and the entire data and data analysis was done as per international standards. India followed the same international standards that were followed by global companies," he said.

Shahjahanpur (UP), Jun 25 (PTI):

With steely courage and determination to provide for her family, Anju Verma sets up her humble shop every night to dole out mouth-watering 'kachoris', thus earning the moniker "Kachori wali Amma"

Her husband Vinod Verma, the sole earning member of the family, died of heart attack five years ago, leaving her distraught and with no means to raise her four children.

Not one to accept failure, Anju (60) decided to march on and continued with her husband's 'kachori' (snack) business.

At 10 every night, she sets up her shop on the empty platforms in front of closed shops and serves hot 'kachoris' with potato stuffing, soyabean along
