



through the letter that this route is of great importance because it directly connects Chhattisgarh, Uttar Pradesh and Delhi This route is the busiest route from a commercial point of view. Vegetables,

minerals, mineral produce and various goods are transported from Chhattisgarh to Uttar Pradesh through this

route in a large quantity. There are many small and big bridges, culverts, ghats, dangerous turns etc. in this route and the traffic pressure is also high. Therefore, it is very important to make Ambikapur-Dhanwar-Banaras a national highway in order to facilitate the traffic on this route.

It is also worth mentioning here that Banaras holds al significance for people of the country. Strengthening Indo-US Defence Ties

n anticipation of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to Washington, India and the United States have solidified their commitment to enhancing defence cooperation. The two nations have reached a consensus on a comprehensive roadmap for defence industrial collaboration, with the aim of expediting technology partnerships and co-production of vital military platforms, including air combat and land systems. As part of this collaboration, negotiations are set to commence on the Security of Supply Arrangement and a reciprocal defence procurement pact, both of which are geared towards promoting stability in the supply chain. Over the past decade, the defence ties between India and the United States have made significant progress, propelled by a series of crucial agreements. These include the Logistics Exchange Memorandum of Agreement (2016), enabling both militaries to utilize each other's bases for repairs and replenishment of supplies; the Communications Compatibility and Security Agreement (2018), fostering interoperability and the transfer of high-end technology; and the Basic Exchange and Cooperation Agreement (2020), facilitating the sharing of cutting-edge military technology, logistics, and geospatial maps. Despite these noteworthy initiatives, it is important to acknowledge that the United States currently ranks third on the list of India's major arms suppliers, accounting for a mere 11 percent, significantly trailing behind Russia (45 percent) and France (29 percent). This statistic highlights the considerable ground the US needs to cover in order to become a more significant participant in India's defence imports and a substantial contributor to the 'Make in India' program. Enhancing Banking Experience

Empowering Customers through RBI Panel Recommendations

he recently released recommendations of an expert panel established by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) are a much-needed catalyst for improving customer service in the banking sector, non-banking financial companies, and other regulated institutions. With proposals ranging from penal action against entities failing to meet customer service standards to rewards for systemic upgrades, these recommendations have the potential to significantly enhance the banking experience for customers. The report outlines a series of customer-centric initiatives, including online settlement of claims by heirs of deceased account holders and greater flexibility in the submission of life certificates by pensioners. One of the key proposals is the establishment of a centralized know-your-customer (KYC) database, which would streamline the process and eliminate the need for periodic updates to halt account operations. This move would alleviate the inconvenience faced by customers when their accounts are frozen due to pending KYC updates. Additionally, the report emphasizes the need for timely return of property documents after the closure of a loan account. It suggests imposing penalties on lenders who fail to adhere to the specified time limit, ensuring that customers are not subjected to unnecessary delays and inconveniences. A critical concern highlighted by the panel is the lack of effective enforcement actions. To address this, the recommendations call for empowering the RBI ombudsmen to direct regulated entities to review complaints, take corrective actions, and ensure compliance. Customers often face frustrating delays and templated responses from call centers when resolving complaints. The report suggests implementing a dedicated interactive voice response system flow, along with an automated call-back feature in case a call is dropped midway. The focus, according to the panel, should be on clear communication between executives and customers, including the provision of services in regional languages. Furthermore, the recommendations propose mandatory soft skills training for staff members who interact with customers, ensuring that they possess the necessary communication and interpersonal abilities. These recommendations align with the global emphasis placed by central banking regulators on the development of a "treating customers fairly" framework. The report suggests making the Charter of Customer Rights enforceable after updating it to reflect the current banking landscape. Additionally, it advocates for the creation of a customer service and protection index to monitor and evaluate the performance of banks and financial institutions in providing quality customer care. As the RBI seeks public feedback on these proposals until July 7, it presents an opportunitv for individuals to contribute informed inputs that can shape the future of banking customer service in India. Improving customer care and experience in the banking sector is of paramount importance. Customers are the lifeblood of any financial institution, and their satisfaction should be a top priority. The recommendations put forth by the expert panel aim to address the shortcomings and challenges faced by customers, providing them with a more streamlined and efficient banking experience. By holding entities accountable for their service standards, empowering regulators to enforce compliance, and investing in employee training and development, the RBI can foster a customer-centric banking ecosystem that instills trust and confidence among consumers.

The Environmental Challenges of Highway Expansion

Addressing Environmental Concerns with Green Highways **Policy**

The first Sustainability Report released by the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) sheds light on these challenges and outlines the solutions formulated under the Green Highways (Plantations, Transplantations, Beautification, and Maintenance) Policy framework. The report, titled "Building a Sustainable Road Infrastructure: Sustainability Report for 2021-2022," acknowledges that forest clearance and tree felling are sometimes inevitable consequences of highway development, leading to environmental degradation, including biodiversity loss and carbon emissions. The report emphasizes that addressing sustainability challenges for highways requires multidimensional solutions, encompassing traftic regulation, electric mobility, tuei efficiency, and more.

Progress and Impact of Green Highways Initiatives

The report highlights the positive impact of the Green Highways policy, which has been in place since 2015. Over the past decade, plantation works along the National Highways have shown marked improvements, with designated green corridors facilitating carbon sequestration, reduction of air and noise pollution, and the provision of shelter for nesting birds. These efforts reflect a transition towards greater environmental sustainability. The report also references a study conducted by the Ministry of **Environment, Forest and Climate** Change, titled "An Assessment of Avoided CO2 Emissions during

cluding forest clearance and tree felling, cannot be ignored. In India, highways and expressways, which constitute only 1.7% of the total road length, bear the burden of 40% of the country's road traffic. This disparity underscores the importance of highways and the increasing demand for their expansion. However, ensuring environmental sustainability during the construction of greenfield highways and the widening/development of brownfield highways presents enormous challenges.

The study evaluates the net greenhouse gas emissions resulting from the construction and maintenance of national highways.

Striving for Holistic

Environmental Solutions

The study's findings shed light on the environmental impact of rapid highway construction and expansion. For instance, felling of trees and forest removal for highway construction has resulted in the emission of 653 thousand tonnes of CO2. However, the adoption of green practices has led to significant fuel savings. Under businessas-usual conditions, fuel consumption by vehicles would have reached 51 billion liters over a 20-year period. However, with the improved highways, petrol savings range from 2% to 21%, and diesel savings range from 1% to 42% across the 20 stretches assessed. These savings translate to an estimated avoidance of 25.19 million tonnes of CO2 over the entire 2.191 km of national highway stretches in a 20-

year period. **A Call for Further Research**

and Regional Solutions While these figures offer promising insights into the positive outcomes of green policies, further examination is needed to fully understand the complexities of environmental challenges posed by highway expansion. For instance, assessing the survival and growth of planted trees, particularly in the ecologically fragile northeast region, requires independent thirdparty assessments. Additionally, region-specific solutions should be developed by contrasting data on tree plantations with data on tree felling and biodiversity loss caused by construction and highway exgion can play a crucial role by supporting studies on the environmental sustainability of road networks and contributing to the creation of a robust data bank for informed poli-

While the NHAI claims to have planted over 274 lakh plants on national highways since the adoption of the Green Highway Policy in 2016-17, it is essential to commission independent third-party assessments, supported by the Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change (MoEFCC), to evaluate the survival and growth status of these plants. This evaluation becomes even more critical in ecologically sensitive regions like the northeast, where the impact of plantation efforts must be thoroughly analyzed to reflect ground realities. Furthermore, a comprehensive analysis of tree plantation data should be contrasted with information on tree felling and biodi-

versity loss resulting from highway construction and expansion. Adopting region-specific solutions based on localized data is imperative, moving away from a one-sizefits-all approach. Understanding the nuanced challenges faced by each region will facilitate the development of targeted strategies to minimize environmental impact and enhance sustainability.

The Role of Technology and Innovation

Technology and innovation play a crucial role in addressing the environmental challenges associated highway expansion. Embracing advancements in electric mobility, promoting fuel-efficient vehicles, and implementing intelligent transportation systems can significantly reduce the carbon footprint of highway networks. Additionally, exploring alternative materials for road construction, such as recycled materials or ecofriendly alternatives, can further enhance the sustainability of infra-

structure projects.

Istanbul, Jun 07:

India has one of the best airfare regimes in the world, but there should not be "gouging" in terms of ticket prices to take advantage of a particular situation, according to Akasa Air CEO Vinay Dube. His comments come against the backdrop of concerns about a steep rise in airfares in certain routes amid capacity reduction due to the Go First crisis and higher travel demand, and the government asking airlines to devise a mechanism to ensure a reasonable ticket pricing system. India is one of the world's fastest-growing aviation markets, and domestic air traffic is recovering strongly after the coronavirus pandemic. Dube, also the founder of Akasa Air, said the civil aviation ministry has an excellent point in terms of





Head's counterattacking 60 off 75 balls and Steve Smith's patient 33 in bright sunshine took Australia to 170 for three at tea on day one of the World Test Championship final against India here on Wednesday.

Head played in his signature style and took the attack to the Indian pacers after Australia found themselves under pressure soon after the lunch break with the fall of Marnus Labuschagne (26 off 62).

Mohammed Shami, who was not his absolute best in the morning session, bowled a beauty for his first ball post lunch to disturb Labuschagne's off-stump. The full ball jagged back in from the fourth stump to clip the off stump.

Head joined Smith in the middle and hit a flurry of boundaries against Shami and Mohammed Siraj to put the pressure back on India. He was quick to flick anything directed towards his pads and was equally sharp with the cut shots. Head brought up his 14th Test fifty with a crisp

Earlier, Siraj breathed fire in his opening spell before Thakur got rid of a well-set David Warner to reduce Australia to 73 for two at lunch. Having survived challenging conditions in the first hour at The Oval, Warner (43 off 60) and Labuschagne were on course to see off the session until Thakur dismissed the lefthanded opener with a short ball targeting his rib cage. Wicketkeeper KS Bharat took a well-judged catch down the leg-side.

India expectedly opted to bowl in overcast conditions and on a pitch with fair amount of grass. They made the tough call to leave out Ravichandran Ashwin from the playing eleven

including Shami, Siraj, Yadav and Thakur.

Both Siraj and Shami kept Australia in check in the first hour, sharing six overs six each and conceding only 29 runs.

Siraj got more out of the surface than Shami by bowling with a scrambled seam. Usman Khawaja (0 off 10), who has an ordinary record in England. began the tour on a disappointing note as he got a faint edge off a ball that pitched outside the off stump and seamed away. There was minimal feet movement and he paid the price for playing away from the body and the nick was taken easily by Bharat behind the stumps. Warner, who has a point to prove in this game and cement his spot in the playing XI for the upcoming Ashes, battled with grit and took his chances every time he was offered width. After an engrossing opening hour, India took the foot off the pedal with Umesh Yadav offering plenty of scoring opportunities to Warner, who collected four boundaries off the pacer in the

Sri Lanka secures ODI series from Afghanistan after Chameera heroics



Hambantota, Jun 07 (PTI):

Sri Lanka bowled out Afghanistan for 116 and reached the target in only 16 overs to win their one-day international series 2-1 at Suriyawewa on Wednesday.

Sri Lanka made 120-1 to win by nine wickets.

Fast bowler Dushmantha Chameera, sidelined for eight months by an ankle injury, took a leading 4-63 to be named player of the third match, and six wickets in two matches to be named player of the series in his comeback. He missed the first ODI. Fellow quick Lahiru Kumara, recov-

ered from a hamstring strain, dismissed both openers and Chameera took out four of the top six batters. Legspinner Wanindu Hasaranga finished with three wickets after Afghanistan chose to bat first.

Afghanistan was all out in 22.2 overs. It was a poor effort on a good batting surface. Only three batters managed 20-plus runs amid too many soft dismissals.

Afghanistan lost opening batter Rahmanullah Gurbaz early again, trying to hook Kumara in the second over and top-edging to fine leg on 8. Chameera got Rahmat Shah and Hashmatullah Shahidi out nicks, and Afghanistan was reduced to 77-6 with little resistance from the tail against the spinners.

Mohammad Nabi topscored with 23. Sri Lanka wasted no time in chasing down the target. Openers Pathum Nissanka and Dimuth Karunaratne shared an 84-run stand.

Nissanka raced to his seventh half-century in just 32 balls with eight fours and two sixes. He was trapped on 51.

Karunaratne required 43 balls for his eighth half-century that included seven fours. Karunaratne was unbeaten on 56 when Sri Lanka secured the win with 34 overs to spare.

It was a good comeback from Sri Lanka after losing the first game by six wickets. The host won the second game by 132 runs and sealed the series with a nine-wicket win. It was their first come-from-behind series victory since 2014.

After successive half-centuries in his first ODI series in more than two years, Karunaratne appears to have secured a spot for the World Cup qualifiers that begin in Zimbabwe next week.

'Leave bats alone in their habitats for a pandemic-free future'

New Delhi, Jun 07 (PTI)

Scientists make the case that pandemic prevention requires a global taboo or ban whereby mankind agreed to leave bats alone, to let them have the habitats they need, undisturbed, in a study published in the Planetary Health.

The researchers from Cornell University, US, along with those from Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS), US, say that while we may never know the exact means by which a bat virus, to which the COVID-19 pandemic and SARS coronavirus outbreak of 2003 can be traced, we do not need to know all of the details in order to act.

Bats are known to be a source of rabies, Marburg filoviruses, Hendra and Nipah paramyxoviruses, coronaviruses such as Middle East Respiratory (MERS) Syndrome Coronavirus, and fruit

bats are strongly believed to be a source of

Ebolaviruses. This analysis, the researchers said, points to the value of humanity globally not fearing them or trying to chase them or culling them, all of them being activities only serving to disperse them and increase the odds of a zoonotic spillover.

They emphasised that humanity simply must take the most basic, common-sense upstream steps to lower our risk of incurring another pandemic at the interface where dangerous viruses can actually move from animals into people. "In a globalised world with 8 billion people, we can no longer ignore our interconnect edness with the wildlife and ecosystems around us. We must change humanity's relationship with nature if we want to prevent the next pandemic of zoonotic origin - and that can start with bats," said Susan Lieberman, WCS's Vice President for International Policy.

Mondal Sandeshkhali said his 18year-old son Dipankar had

boarded the ill-fated train this train with a huge waitwith his friends to look for a job in Chennai. "His phone has been

ringing since the accident but no one is picking it up. I spoke to him minutes before the accident. He is yet to be tracked and I decided to look for him again," he said. Swati Chamoli, who is also travelling in the train, said, "I'm travelling for work to Chennai. Let's hope the journey goes on safely." Paromita, who is also on board the train, said, "I hope nothing goes wrong now. There is a fear at the back of my mind, but hope the journey is safe." Another passenger Manik Bauri, who stood sweating with scores of others in a serpentine queue at the station, is a cook by profession and is travelling to Chennai to rejoin work. While some lucky passengers have managed to secure reserved berths on

ing list, many others such as Bauri are travelling by an unreserved coach. "I am scared the TV grabs from the accident last Friday are fresh on my mind. But I have a job in a guest house as a cook and my employers will dock my pay if I delay getting back to work," he said. Most of

those who stood in the queue for the general coach were labourers, cooks, restaurant workers and drivers travelling to Chennai, Vizag and other industrial cities, to join or rejoin work. "We got to know that this train would run on Wednesday quite late. No reservation was available. But getting there (to Chennai) is essential as our families depend on our earnings. So we have to go whichever way we can, however we can," said Bauri, while a fellow



'If all the anti-BJP parties unite and get the ordinance defeated in the Rajya Sabha, where the BJP is not in majority, it will be a semifinal of the next year's elections and send a strong message to the country," Kejriwal said. The Aam Aadmi Party chief has been reaching out to leaders of non-BJP parties to garner their support against the ordinance so that the Centre's bid to replace it through a Bill is defeated when it is brought in Parliament.

CPI(M) general secretary Sitaram Yechury, Telangana Minister Chandrashekar Rao, Shiv (UBT) leader Uddhav Thackeray, NCP chief Sharad Pawar, and Bengal West Chief Mamata Minister Banerjee have so far extended their support to the AAP. Bihar Chief Minister and JD(U) leader Nitish Kumar and

Minister M K Stalin have also supported Kejriwal in the matter. The Centre on May 19

had promulgated the ordinance to create an authority for the transfer and posting of Group-A officers in Delhi, which the AAP government had called a deception with the Supreme Court verdict on control of services.

The ordinance came a week after the Supreme Court handed over the control of services in Delhi, excluding police, public order and land, to the elected government. It seeks to set up a National Capital Civil Service Authority for the transfer of and disciplinary proceedings against Group-A officers from the DANICS cadre. Transfer and postings of all officers of the Delhi government were under the executive control of the lieutenant governor before the top court's May 11 verdict.

US closely watching AI flight that landed in Russia

Countering China

Strengthening Indo-US Defence Ties

n anticipation of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to Washington, India and the United States have solidified their commitment to enhancing defence cooperation. The two nations have reached a consensus on a comprehensive roadmap for defence industrial collaboration, with the aim of expediting technology partnerships and co-production of vital military platforms, including air combat and land systems. As part of this collaboration, negotiations are set to commence on the Security of Supply Arrangement and a reciprocal defence procurement pact, both of which are geared towards promoting stability in the supply chain. These include the Logistics Exchange Memorandum of Agreement (2016), enabling both militaries to utilize each other's bases for repairs and replenishment of supplies; the Communications Compatibility and Security Agreement (2018), fostering interoperability and the transfer of high-end technology; and the Basic Exchange and Cooperation Agreement (2020), facilitating the sharing of cutting-edge military technology, logistics, and geospatial maps. Despite these noteworthy initiatives, it is important to acknowledge that the United States currently ranks third on the list of India's major arms suppliers, accounting for a mere 11 percent, significantly trailing behind Russia (45 percent) and France (29 percent). This statistic highlights the considerable ground the US needs to cover in order to become a more significant participant in India's defence imports and a substantial contributor to the 'Make in India' program. India's preference for Russian and French manufacturers is influenced by factors such as reliability, quality control, cost-effectiveness, and ease of conducting business. Therefore, the key to forging a stronger strategic cooperation between India and the US lies in facilitating technology transfer and fostering indigenous production capabilities within India. In the current geopolitical climate, characterized by China's increasingly assertive posture in the Indo-Pacific region, it is imperative that both India and the US intensify their efforts to overcome any obstacles hindering the growth of their defence relations. The rise of China presents shared security concerns, making closer collaboration a necessity. By leveraging their respective strengths, India and the US can enhance their defence capabilities and jointly address the challenges posed by China's growing influence. For India, strengthening defence ties with the United States offers a multitude of benefits. First and foremost, it enables access to advanced military technology, which is vital for maintaining a competitive edge in an ever-evolving security landscape. Collaborative ventures in research, development, and production can foster innovation and create avenues for India to become self-reliant in defence manufacturing. This aligns perfectly with India's ambitious 'Make in India' initiative, which seeks to transform the country into a global manufacturing hub. The United States, with its technological prowess and expertise, can play a pivotal role in assisting India in achieving this goal. Moreover, closer cooperation between India and the US can contribute to the overall stability and security of the Indo-Pacific region. A united front against common challenges, including maritime security threats and territorial disputes, would send a strong message of deterrence to potential adversaries. By deepening their collaboration, India and the US can develop a robust framework for joint military exercises, intelligence sharing, and coordinated responses to regional security crises. However, it is essential to address the existing barriers and concerns that have hindered the full realization of the potential in the Indo-US defence relationship. Complex bureaucratic processes, stringent export control regulations, and limited technology transfer have often impeded progress. A concerted effort is required to streamline these processes, enhance transparency, and foster an environment conducive to collaboration and partnership.

Enhancing Banking Experience

Empowering Customers through RBI Panel Recommendations

he recently released recommendations of an expert panel established by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) are a much-needed catalyst for improving customer service in the banking sector, non-banking financial companies, and other regulated institutions. With proposals ranging from penal action against entities failing to meet customer service standards to rewards for systemic upgrades, these recommendations have the potential to significantly enhance the banking experience for customers. The report outlines a series of customer-centric initiatives, including online settlement of claims by heirs of deceased account holders and greater flexibility in the submission of life certificates by pensioners. One of the key proposals is the establishment of a centralized know-your-customer (KYC) database, which would streamline the process and eliminate the need for periodic updates to halt account operations. This move would alleviate the inconvenience faced by customers when their accounts are frozen due to pending KYC updates. Additionally, the report emphasizes the need for timely return of property documents after the closure of a loan account. It suggests imposing penalties on lenders who fail to adhere to the specified time limit, ensuring that customers are not subjected to unnecessary delays and inconveniences. A critical concern highlighted by the panel is the lack of effective enforcement actions. To address this, the recommendations call for empowering the RBI ombudsmen to direct regulated entities to review complaints, take corrective actions, and ensure compliance. Customers often face frustrating delays and templated responses from call centers when resolving complaints. The report suggests implementing a dedicated interactive voice response system flow, along with an automated call-back feature in case a call is dropped midway. The focus, according to the panel, should be on clear communication between executives and customers, including the provision of services in regional languages. Furthermore, the recommendations propose mandatory soft skills training for staff members who interact with customers, ensuring that they possess the necessary communication and interpersonal abilities. These recommendations align with the global emphasis placed by central banking regulators on the development of a "treating customers fairly" framework. The report suggests making the Charter of Customer Rights enforceable after updating it to reflect the current banking landscape. Additionally, it advocates for the creation of a customer service and protection index to monitor and evaluate the performance of banks and financial institutions in providing quality customer care. As the RBI seeks public feedback on these proposals until July 7, it presents an opportunitv for individuals to contribute informed inputs that can shape the future of banking customer service in India. Improving customer care and experience in the banking sector is of paramount importance. Customers are the lifeblood of any financial institution, and their satisfaction should be a top priority. The recommendations put forth by the expert panel aim to address the shortcomings and challenges faced by customers, providing them with a more streamlined and efficient banking experience. By holding entities accountable for their service standards, empowering regulators to enforce compliance, and investing in employee training and development, the RBI can foster a customer-centric banking ecosystem that instills trust and confidence among consumers.

The Environmental Challenges of Highway Expansion

Addressing Environmental Concerns with Green Highways **Policy**

The first Sustainability Report released by the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) sheds light on these challenges and outlines the solutions formulated under the Green Highways (Plantations, Transplantations, Beautification, and Maintenance) Policy framework. The report, titled "Building a Sustainable Road Infrastructure: Sustainability Report for 2021-2022," acknowledges that forest clearance and tree felling are sometimes inevitable consequences of highway development, leading to environmental degradation, including biodiversity loss and carbon emissions. The report emphasizes that addressing sustainability challenges for highways requires multidimensional solutions, encompassing traftic regulation, electric mobility, tuei efficiency, and more.

Progress and Impact of Green Highways Initiatives

The report highlights the positive impact of the Green Highways policy, which has been in place since 2015. Over the past decade, plantation works along the National Highways have shown marked improvements, with designated green corridors facilitating carbon sequestration, reduction of air and noise pollution, and the provision of shelter for nesting birds. These efforts reflect a transition towards greater environmental sustainability. The report also references a study conducted by the Ministry of **Environment, Forest and Climate** Change, titled "An Assessment of Avoided CO2 Emissions during Construction, Maintenance, and

ways and expressways, which constitute only 1.7% of the total road length, bear the burden of 40% of the country's road traffic. This disparity underscores the importance of highways and the increasing demand for their expansion. However, ensuring environmental sustainability during the construction of greenfield highways and the widening/development of brownfield highways presents enormous challenges. The study evaluates the net green-

Environmental Solutions The study's findings shed light on the environmental impact of rapid highway construction and expansion. For instance, felling of trees and forest removal for highway construction has resulted in the emission of 653 thousand tonnes of CO2. However, the adoption of green practices has led to significant fuel savings. Under businessas-usual conditions, fuel consumption by vehicles would have reached 51 billion liters over a 20-year period. However, with the improved highways, petrol savings range from 2% to 21%, and diesel savings range from 1% to 42% across the 20 stretches assessed. These savings translate to an estimated avoidance of 25.19 million tonnes of CO2 over the entire 2.191 km of national highway stretches in a 20year period.

A Call for Further Research

and Regional Solutions While these figures offer promising insights into the positive outcomes of green policies, further examination is needed to fully understand the complexities of environmental challenges posed by highway expansion. For instance, assessing the survival and growth of planted trees, particularly in the ecologically fragile northeast region, requires independent thirdparty assessments. Additionally, region-specific solutions should be developed by contrasting data on tree plantations with data on tree felling and biodiversity loss caused by construction and highway expansion. States in the northeast region can play a crucial role by supporting studies on the environmental sustainability of road networks and contributing to the creation of a robust data bank for informed poli-

While the NHAI claims to have planted over 274 lakh plants on national highways since the adoption of the Green Highway Policy in 2016-17, it is essential to commission independent third-party assessments, supported by the Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change (MoEFCC), to evaluate the survival and growth status of these plants. This evaluation becomes even more critical in ecologically sensitive regions like the northeast, where the impact of plantation efforts must be thoroughly analyzed to reflect ground realities. Furthermore, a comprehensive analysis of tree plantation data should be contrasted with information on tree felling and biodi-

versity loss resulting from highway construction and expansion. Adopting region-specific solutions based on localized data is imperative, moving away from a one-sizefits-all approach. Understanding the nuanced challenges faced by each region will facilitate the development of targeted strategies to minimize environmental impact and enhance sustainability.

The Role of Technology and Innovation

Technology and innovation play a crucial role in addressing the environmental challenges associated highway expansion. Embracing advancements in electric mobility, promoting fuel-efficient vehicles, and implementing intelligent transportation systems can significantly reduce the carbon footprint of highway networks. Additionally, exploring alternative materials for road construction, such as recycled materials or ecofriendly alternatives, can further enhance the sustainability of infra-

structure projects.







Mohammad Nabi topscored with 23. Sri Lanka wasted no time in chasing down the target. Openers Pathum Nissanka and Dimuth Karunaratne shared an 84-run stand.

Nissanka raced to his seventh half-century in just 32 balls with eight fours and two sixes. He was trapped on 51.

Karunaratne required 43 balls for his eighth half-century that included seven fours. Karunaratne was unbeaten on 56 when Sri Lanka secured the win with 34 overs to spare.



Bhopal/Sehore (MP), Jun 07 (PTI): More than 24 hours after a girl, aged around two-and-a-halfyears, fell into a borewell in Madhya Pradesh's Sehore district, efforts to rescue her on still on with the task becoming more difficult as she slipped further down and stuck at a depth of nearly 100 feet, state Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan said on Wednesday.

The girl fell into the 300feet deep borewell in a field at Mungavali village on Tuesday afternoon.

Talking to reporters in Bhopal, CM Chouhan said, "The girl named Srishti fell into the borewell around 1 pm on Tuesday and since then efforts were on to rescue her. She was initially stuck at the depth of about 40 feet in the borewell, but due to vibrations caused by the machines engaged in her rescue operation, she has slipped further down to about 100 feet, making the task more difficult.'

"We have called an Army team for the rescue operation, while teams of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and the State Disaster Emergency Response Force (SDERF) have already been working to rescue the girl," he said.

Efforts were on to bring out the girl safely, the CM

Meanwhile, district administration officials said oxygen is being supplied to the girl in the borewell through a pipe.

Nearly 12 JCB and Poclain machines are currently engaged in the rescue operation. An Army team has also reached the spot and joined the rescue operation, official sources said. CM Chouhan and a team of officials are also in touch with the district authorities to supervise the rescue operation, they said. State Home Minister government spokesperson Narottam Mishra said the presence of hard rocks is creating obstruction in carrying

'Leave bats alone in their habitats for a pandemic-free future'

New Delhi, Jun 07 (PTI)

Scientists make the case that pandemic prevention requires a global taboo or ban whereby mankind agreed to leave bats alone, to let them have the habitats they need, undisturbed, in a study published in the Planetary Health.

The researchers from Cornell University, US, along with those from Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS), US, say that while we may never know the exact means by which a bat virus, to which the COVID-19 pandemic and SARS coronavirus outbreak of 2003 can be traced, we do not need to know all of the details in order to act.

Bats are known to be a source of rabies, Marburg filoviruses, Hendra and Nipah paramyxoviruses, coronaviruses such as Middle East Respiratory (MERS) Syndrome Coronavirus, and fruit

bats are strongly believed to be a source of

Ebolaviruses. This analysis, the researchers said, points to the value of humanity globally not fearing them or trying to chase them or culling them, all of them being activities only serving to disperse them and increase the odds of a zoonotic spillover.

They emphasised that humanity simply must take the most basic, common-sense upstream steps to lower our risk of incurring another pandemic at the interface where dangerous viruses can actually move from animals into people. "In a globalised world with 8 billion people, we can no longer ignore our interconnect edness with the wildlife and ecosystems around us. We must change humanity's relationship with nature if we want to prevent the next pandemic of zoonotic origin - and that can start with bats," said Susan Lieberman, WCS's Vice President for International Policy.

Mondal Sandeshkhali said his 18year-old son Dipankar had

with his friends to look for a job in Chennai. "His phone has been

ringing since the accident but no one is picking it up. I spoke to him minutes before the accident. He is yet to be tracked and I decided to look for him again," he said. Swati Chamoli, who is also travelling in the train, said, "I'm travelling for work to Chennai. Let's hope the journey goes on safely." Paromita, who is also on board the train, said, "I hope nothing goes wrong now. There is a fear at the back of my mind, but hope the journey is safe." Another passenger Manik Bauri, who stood sweating with scores of others in a serpentine queue at the station, is a cook by profession and is travelling to Chennai to rejoin work. While some lucky passengers have managed to secure reserved berths on

ing list, many others such as Bauri are travelling by an unreserved coach. "I am scared the TV grabs from the accident last Friday are fresh on my mind. But I have a job in a guest house as a cook and my employers will dock my pay if I
