Importance

New Delhi: Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud Saturday underlined the importance of gender sensitisation and development of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) skills while unveiling the training calendar for apex court officials for 2023-2024. The calendar involves induction training for newly recruited officers, training in legal nuances, ICT and language skills, among others, a Supreme Court statement said.

Cheating

Mumbai: A court here has sentenced eight executives of a textile firm and a chartered accountant to three years' imprisonment for cheating a nationalised bank of more than Rs 13 crore by availing of credit facilities fraudulently. Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate (Esplanade court) Jaywant C Yadav found the accused guilty of cheating, forgery and other relevant offences under the Indian Penal Code on July 31.

Mishap

Hathras: Six devotees were killed and eight others got injured when the Mathura-bound tractor-trolley they were riding was hit here by a truck, police said on Saturday. The accident took place on Sadabad Road here on Friday night when the trolley was hit on one side by a speeding truck coming from the opposite direction, Superintendent of Police Devesh Kumar Pandey said.

Defused

Samba: A rusted mortar shell and a landmine were detected and later defused in controlled explosions at separate places in Samba and Poonch districts of Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday, police said. The powerful mortar shell was noticed by some villagers in Nad village along the Samba-Udhampur road in Samba district on Saturday morning, they said. Police said the whole area was cordoned off and the explosive device was destroyed in a controlled explosion by the Bomb disposal squad without causing any damage.

Arrested

New Delhi: A 31-year-old slaughterer was arrested for allegedly killing the husband of his one-sided love interest in north Delhi's Sadar Bazar area, police said on Saturday. Mohammad Aamir, a resident of Ahata-Kidara, was arrested for killing a man named Sameer during a drunken brawl, they said. His accomplice Mohammad Rizwan was earlier arrested in connection with the incident which took place on Tuesday.

Three killed in fresh violence in Manipur

Imphal, Aug 05 (PTI):

Three persons including a father-son duo were killed by militants in Manipur's Bishnupur district on Friday night while another three sustained bullet wounds following heavy exchange of fire between state forces and armed men in the same district even as the 24-hour general strike called by the coordinating committee of 27 assembly constituencies paralysed normal life in Imphal

valley, police said. The three were gunned down while they were sleeping and their bodies were later slashed with swords at Kwakta in the district by unidentified men, police said on Saturday morning, adding that the assailants came from Churachandpur. "The three used to stay in a relief camp but had returned to their residences at Kwakta on Friday after the situation improved," police said. Soon after the incident, an irate mob gathered at Kwakta

Curfew relaxation hours slashed

and wanted to head towards Churachandpur but was stopped by security personnel, they said. Eyewitnesses said several houses were burnt at Ukha Tampak in Bishnupur district by a mob in retaliation of the murders. In another incident, three persons including one policeman were injured following heavy exchange of fire

between state forces and militants near Kwakta on Saturday morning, police said.

"The policeman sustained splinter injuries on his face. All the three were taken to Raj Medicity in Imphal for treatment. They are out of danger," they said. Across Imphal valley, women protesters came out on the streets and burnt tyres to block the movement of vehicles. In the wake of renewed violence, the district administration clamped curfew from 10.30

am in the twin Imphal districts. "Instead of curfew relaxation from 5am to 6pm in the twin Imphal districts, it has now been shortened to 5am to 10.30am," an official said, adding fierce gunfights have been reported in Kwakta and its neighbouring areas since morning.

In a statement, the Indigenous Tribal Leaders' Forum (ITLF) asked the state government on the steps being taken to stem the violence.

ISRO transfers satellite bus technology to private firm

Bengaluru, Aug 05 (PTI):

ISRO on Saturday said it has transferred the IMS-1 Satellite Bus Technology to Alpha Design Technologies Pvt. Ltd in a step towards enhancing private industry participation in the country's space sector. NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), the commercial arm of ISRO, facilitated the technology transfer through an agreement signed during an event held at the NSIL headquarters on August 2, the space agency said on its website. The technology transfer documents were formally handed over by D Radhakrishnan, Chairman and Managing Director of NSIL to Col. H S Shankar (Retd.), Chairman and Managing Director of ADTL. ADTL is one of the two private players identified to receive the transfer of this technology through Interest Exploratory Note

(IEN) published by NSIL, it said. This transfer marks the beginning of satellite bus technologies developed by ISRO being transferred to private industries. Further, the PSLV is under production by a consortium of industries.

ISRO has been enabling private players to develop space technologies by facilitating and extending the expertise thus ensuring both out-bound and in-bound approaches.

The satellite bus, developed by ISRO's U R Rao Satellite Centre (URSC), is a versatile and efficient small satellite platform designed to facilitate low-cost access to space. The bus serves as a dedicated vehicle for various payloads, enabling earth imaging, ocean and atmospheric studies, microwave remote sensing, and space science missions while ensuring a quick turnaround time for satellite launches.

ASI conducts scientific survey of Gyanvapi mosque complex

For 2nd day

Varanasi (UP), Aug 05 (PTI):

The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) on Saturday resumed its scientific survey work at the Gyanvapi mosque here to determine whether the 17th-century mosque was constructed over a pre-existing structure of a Hindu temple.

Five members of the Muslim side also participated in the survey. Its advocate Tauheed Khan said advocates of the Intezamia Masjid Committee Akhlaq and Mumtaz accompanied the survey team. The Muslim side did not participate in the survey on Friday. Government counsel Rajesh Mishra, who was with the ASI survey team during the day-long exercise a day before as well, on Saturday said the team started work in the morning and it would continue

ELGAR PARISHAD CASE

Accused Vernon Gonsalves, Arun Ferreira walk out of jail

Mumbai, Aug 05 (PTI): Activists Vernon Gonsalves and Arun Ferreira, accused in the Elgar Parishad-Maoist links case, walked out of prison in Navi Mumbai on Saturday afternoon with a special court here issuing their release order a week after they were granted bail by the Supreme Court. The

two accused were lodged in Talaja jail. Some supporters and kin of the two activists waited outside the prison to receive them, a police official said. With their release, five out of the 16 accused arrested in the case are now out on bail. One of the 16 accused - Jesuit priest Stan Swamy - died at a

private hospital here in July 2021 during judicial custody. Earlier in the day, a lawyer linked to the case said a special court hearing cases related to the National Investigation Agency (NIA) issued their release order on Friday.

The apex court on July 28 granted bail to the two accused, noting that the actual involvement of Gonsalves and Ferreira in any terrorist act has not surfaced from any third-party communications.

The SC bench comprising Justices Aniruddha Bose and Sudhanshu Dhulia granted bail to them, noting that mere holding of certain literature through which violent acts may be propagated would not attract the provisions of Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. "Considering the fact that almost five years have elapsed, we are satisfied they have made out a case for bail."

'Summers in Arctic were ice-free over 100,000 years ago'

New Delhi, Aug 05 (PTI): A subpolar plankton species found in the Atlantic water expanded far into the Arctic Ocean during the Last Interglacial, indicating that summers in the Arctic were ice-free during this period. Published in Nature Geoscience, this research analysed the microfossil content of sediment cores to determine the extent of sea ice present during the Last Interglacial, a recent period of the Earth's geological history characterised by a climate warmer than today.

searchers have turned to analogues from our geological past. However, the extent of sea ice during this period has been intensely debated and there is no consensus, limiting understanding of this period and the ability of researchers to simulate it in climate models. To address this, a team of marine geology researchers from the Department of Marine Geological Sciences at Stockholm University analysed the microfossil content of an array of sediment cores from sites that today lie directly beneath the thickest parts of the modern Arctic ice pack.

In these cores, they investigated the variability in the occurrence and composition of planktonic foraminifera, a type of free-floating, shell-building unicellular zooplankton that is sensitive to changes in oceanographic and environmental conditions.

BharatNet Project Cabinet approves Rs 1.39 lakh cr for connecting 6.4 lakh villages with broadband

New Delhi: The Union Cabinet has approved a last-mile broadband connectivity plan for 6.4 lakh villages across the country under the BharatNet project with an outlay of Rs 1.39 lakh crore, according to sources. Around 1.94 lakh villages have been connected under the BharatNet project at present, and the balance is likely to be connected in two and a half years, they added. "The Cabinet in its meeting, held on Friday evening, has approved Rs 1,39,579 crore for providing last mile optical fibre-based connectivity to homes in all villages of the country," one of the sources said. The last-mile connectivity will be provided by Bharat Broadband Network Limited (BBNL), an arm of state-owned BSNL, in partnership with village level entrepreneur (VLE). "The model to take fibre-to-the-home, with the help of a local entrepreneur, was finalised after the successful completion of a pilot project.

Imran Khan arrested, to serve 3 years in jail

Barred from politics for 5 years

Islamabad, Aug 05 (PTI):

In a fresh jolt to Imran Khan, police in Pakistan on Saturday arrested the embattled former prime minister after he was sentenced in absentia to three years in prison in a corruption case over the sale of expensive state gifts when he was in power.



Additional Judge Humayun Dilawar of the Islamabad-based district and sessions judge also imposed a fine of Rs100,000 on Khan, adding that the 70-year-old leader would be kept in jail for another six months if failed to pay the fine.

"Charges of misdeclaration of assets have been proven against Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chairman," the judge ruled. "Imran Khan deliberately submitted fake details (of Toshakhana gifts)

to the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) and is found guilty of corrupt practices," Justice Dilawar stated and sent the cricketer-turned-politician to jail for three years under Section 174 of the Election Act.

Dilawar also directed that a copy of the order should be sent to the Islamabad police chief for the execution of the court orders. The Islamabad inspector-general of police (IGP) was instructed to ensure the immediate implementation of arrest warrants.

Rahul gets SC relief

Upholding the Pillars of Democracy

The order of the Supreme Court staying the conviction of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi in the 'Modi surname' defamation case has rekindled public faith in an institution that stands as the custodian of democracy in India. The court's stance on politicians misusing defamation laws to settle personal scores reiterates its commitment to safeguarding free speech, a cornerstone of any robust democratic setup. The Surat court's verdict convicting Rahul Gandhi was not without controversy. The conviction stemmed from a political statement made against an 'unidentifiable' group, raising concerns about the potential 'chilling effect' on free expression—an essential prerequisite for a thriving democracy. Even if one were to consider the conviction legitimate, the imposition of the maximum two-year imprisonment on an individual with no prior criminal record appeared unduly harsh and unjust. The Supreme Court astutely pointed out the absence of specific reasons cited by the trial judge to justify the severe sentence. A slightly lesser quantum of punishment would have saved Rahul Gandhi from disqualification under the provisions of the Representation of the People Act. Furthermore, imposing the maximum sentence for defamation, which is a bailable, non-cognisable, and compoundable offense, was deemed unwarranted. The failure of the Surat Sessions Court and the Gujarat High Court to rectify the trial court's decision only exacerbated the glaring flaws in the judicial process. While the Supreme Court's intervention has corrected the injustice, it also expressed reservations about Rahul Gandhi's speech not being in 'good taste' and emphasized the need for public figures to exercise caution when making statements. As Rahul Gandhi prepares to reclaim his Lok Sabha membership, there is a crucial lesson for politicians: to refrain from overstepping boundaries when criticizing their adversaries. The ramifications of the verdict extend beyond legalities to impact the political landscape. With Rahul Gandhi reinstated as a Lok Sabha member, the Congress party stands a chance to strengthen its parliamentary presence, potentially leading to political realignments and reshaping the country's political dynamics. During the Bharat Jodo Yatra, Rahul Gandhi's non-political slogan "Mohabbat ka Paigam" (message of love, affection, and brotherhood) holds newfound significance as communal violence continues to flare up in different parts of the country. Just recently, Nuh in Haryana witnessed communal violence that claimed six lives, including two homeguard personnel. The situation in Manipur remains tense for the past three months, with Rahul Gandhi having visited the state earlier. Discussions on the Uniform Civil Code have added to the tension in areas dominated by minority communities, with Sikhs expressing reservations. The caste-based census in Bihar may also pose challenges and trigger irritations among the population. Moreover, the Supreme Court's ongoing hearing on Article 370 could potentially delay elections. These circumstances present opportunities for the Congress party to expand its presence in new regions like Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Punjab. The success of such endeavors depends on the party's strength and effective implementation of its strategies. The Congress has a shining opportunity to mobilize its ground-level workforce and expand its sphere of influence. The verdict may also open doors for other political entities to join the political fray. However, the success of these endeavors will rest on the leadership of the Congress party. The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has advised its parliament members to avoid depending solely on issues like the Ram Temple or the image of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Instead, the focus should be on addressing voters' concerns and solving their problems, as evident from the outcome of the Karnataka assembly elections where 36 candidates, despite strong electioneering by top leaders, forfeited their security deposits. Governments in Karnataka and Himachal Pradesh are set to bolster the Congress party's prospects, as they fulfill their election promises related to pensions and financial assistance for women.

Women Empowerment

Handloom sector engages over 23 lakhs female weavers and allied workers

India has a rich tradition of handloom weaving since time immemorial with the earliest evidences going back to the Indus Valley civilisation. Various written treatise pertaining to the Rigveda, Ramayana, Mahabharata, Thalia (by Greek historian Herodotus) and Kautilya have mentioned not only spinning and weaving but also the high quality of silk and cotton. Export of handloom products, as early as the fifteenth century was reported, followed by Vasco da Gama's visit to India thereby opening of trade routes for Europe. Further, Jean-Baptiste Tavernier's memoirs from the seventeenth century mention Burhanpur in Madhya Pradesh as hub for international trade with exports to Egypt, Poland, Russia and the Gulf region. Further, it is said that by the end of the seventeenth century, 83% of The East India's Company trade accounted for clothing exports.

Over the centuries, handlooms have come to be associated with excellence in India's artistry in fabrics. Fabrics and designs were influenced by geographic, religious and social customs of a region. Different parts of India have produced distinct styles - muslin of Chanderi, Varanasi brocades, Rajasthan and Orissa have given tie and die products, Patola sarees from Patan, himroos of Hyderabad, phulkari and Khes from Punjab, Daccai and Jamdani from Bengal, traditional designs from Assam and Manipur like the Phenek and Tongam. Indian handloom designs and weaves have been famous world over and it is important to ensure sustenance of our cultural heritage.

Indian handloom sector is ancient and has served the economy well in terms of employment. The sector is very important from the point of view of its size and employment potential. The relevance of the handloom sector in the agrarian economy is massive because of its linkages with crucial and sensitive sectors like agriculture. It uses agricultural products as raw materials and, therefore, provides an ever-ready market for agricultural produce. Therefore, in an economy where majority of people still rely on agrarian sector for their livelihood, the

significance of handloom is well understood. Secondly, it is a sector that directly addresses women's empowerment. As per the present census, the sector engages over 23 lakhs female weavers and allied workers. The handloom sector is largely household-based, carried out with labour contributed by the entire family. Therefore, the engagement of a large number of women (over 70% of all weavers and allied workers are female) in any capacity in this sector has ensured direct remunerations for them, thus empowering them through financial independence and improved self-worth both within and outside of their homes.

Ministry of Textiles through the Office of the Development Commissioner for Handlooms is working for the sustainable development of the handloom sector by implementing various developmental, promotional, and welfare schemes like Block level cluster, Skill up-gradation, Hatkharga Samvardhan Sahayata (looms and accessories), Work shed, Engagement of designers, Yarn supply, MUDRA loan, Learning opportunities, Bunkar Mitra helpline, Welfare measures, Certification, Marketing assistance, and Handloom awards. The principal objectives of these schemes is to promote production and marketing of high quality and high value handloom products and thereby increase the earnings of weavers and other workers associated with this sector. Skill up-gradation, infusion of new and contemporary designs, product diversification, technology up-grades, improved access to sub-

sidised raw materials, access to low interest credit, common infrastructure development, brand building, marketing assistance including promotion of e-Commerce platforms and linking handloom with high-end fashion, are but some of the major interventions initiated by the present Government.

Despite adversity, Indian artisans have stood the test of time and have kept this great craft alive. Over the centuries, handlooms have come to be associated with excellence in India's artistry in fabrics. Fabrics and designs were influenced by geographic, religious and social customs of a region. Different parts of India have produced distinct styles - muslin of Chanderi, Varanasi brocades, Rajasthan and Orissa have given tie and die products, Patola sarees from Patan, himroos of Hyderabad, phulkari and Khes from Punjab, Daccai and Jamdani from Bengal, traditional designs from Assam and Manipur like the Phenek and Tongam. It has been found out by the judges that while rest of the pack had either not cared to hop resembling a frog (rather ran like human beings) or had strayed into different lanes in over-enthusiasm, the little Swastik had calmly completed the race with 100% fairness by literally hopping like a frog throughout the stretch and remaining true to his demarcated lane!

Well just like the Aesop tale where the tortoise was destined to lose had the rabbit not cared to have a nap, little Swastik also might not have won the prize if the rest actually hopped honestly in

their demarcated lanes. But there cannot be any denial of the fact that the tortoise to Swastik had won the game as they were in a mission to utilise their limited capabilities to the full possessing the positive mindset of accomplishing the necessary task in a consistent fashion without expressing lethargy or indulging in short cuts!

And let us take the opportunity in congratulating the judges also who had indeed exercised their God-awarded intellect to arrive at a rational decision instead of blindly branding the first three boys as winners. Rather the judges stormed their brains to arrive at the conclusion that despite being apparently the last, little Swastik is actually the first as he was the only soul to remain true to his brand of race(hopping like a frog) and completed the stretch absolutely honestly despite certain limitations. So apart from saluting the kid, we should doff our caps to the judges also for exercising their rationality and intellect instead of putting a blind stamp on the obvious.

After all, free and fair rational judgement is also fast turning out to be "extinct species" in this soci-

ety! For example projects on various subjects assigned to the school students. Previously students used to complete the projects according to their capabilities or knowledge. But nowadays the whole process is completely commercialised. Today professional individuals have mushroomed everywhere offering proposals of making project work on behalf of the students in lieu of a hefty sum! Now majority of the parents engage the services of them for completion of the project assignments of their children. Since professional players are engaged in it, obviously the project being churned out is also of top quality. So the projects submitted by the students who complete it independently are often found to be of inferior grade. But the teachers or assessors are least concerned about the real identity of the creators of the projects! They offer marks according to the quality of the projects as submitted! Obviously the projects created by the professionals fetch higher marks with the students trying to make it in their steam being the loser! When one such aggrieved

parent known to me pointed out this unfair advantage to the teacher concerned, nonchalantly she declared that "I am not concerned about the maker. I will judge according to the quality presented"! Thanks to such a "simplistic" mindset, honest students are finding themselves in a disadvantaged position in contrast to those who have delegated their assignment to the professionals!

Is this the price society will give them for being honest? If their honest effort does not get recognized, what message does get imparted to adolescent minds! That excellence needs to be achieved not through honest effort, but by hook or by crook!

It is high time we learn to follow the honest sincere consistent efforts of Swastiks in all sectors of life and judge them with a rational mind where not the result, but the methodology adopted will do the final talking.

lender HDFC from the market following its merger with HDFC Bank on July 1. HDFC Bank has not been active on the home loan front before the biggest merger (USD 40 billion) as after sourcing a home loan account it used to sell that to its parent HDFC for a fee. Accordingly, when it merged with the parent, the bank had a small home loan book only. According to many analysts, as of March 31, 2023, the combined mortgage book of HDFC Bank has been pegged at Rs 7.3 lakh crore, but the bank has not revealed the numbers in the June quarter earnings, though the merger was effective from July 1 and HDFC shares got extinguished from July 13. Then SBI's book was only Rs 6.4 lakh crore. SBI overtook the traditional

market leader HDFC in home loan assets in February 2021 when its book crossed the Rs 5 lakh

crore mark, marginally more than HDFC's then. That time the nation's largest lender enjoyed a

market share of 23.5 per cent of the home loan market as against HDFC's 17 per cent.

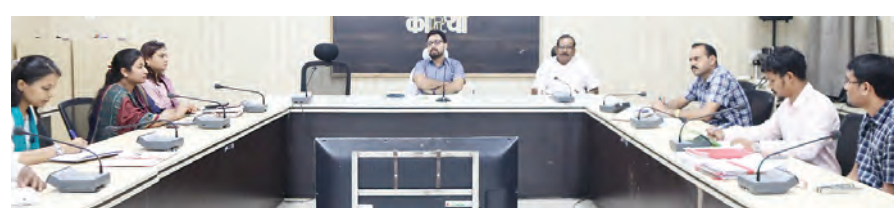

However, Spain quickly regained their lead with Redondo's header in the 17th minute, her third goal of the tournament.

Bonmati's second goal in the 36th minute showcased her impressive footwork, creating space in the box and finding the back of the net with precision. Codina redeemed herself in the 45th minute, making amends for her earlier mistake by scoring from a corner.

In the second half, Switzerland attempted a fightback, but Spain's solid defense thwarted their efforts. Jennifer Hermoso sealed Spain's triumph with her goal in the 70th minute, securing her third goal of the tournament.

Spain's remarkable performance has now propelled them into the quarterfinals, setting the stage for more thrilling action in the Women's World Cup.

Japan beats Norway 3-1 to reach quarterfinals

Wellington, Aug 05 (AP):

Japan scored its 14th goal of the FIFA Women's World Cup 2023 and conceded its first Saturday, beating Norway 3-1 to reach the quarterfinals for the fourth time.

Hinata Miyazawa sealed the win with her fifth goal of the tournament in the 81st minute to remain the leading scorer. Risa Shimizu's 50th-minute goal followed an Ingrid Syrstad Engen own goal in the first half to help give Japan its fourth straight win of the tournament.

Guro Reiten headed a superb goal for Norway in the 21st minute to end Japan's flawless defensive performance and leave the teams locked at 1-1 at half-time. After beating Spain 4-0 with only 23% of possession in its group-stage finale, Japan once again was a tactical chameleon in the pre-quarters playing with more than 60% of possession in a commanding performance.

Japan traded its regular blue uniform for pastel colours Saturday, pink and purple. The softer colour scheme did nothing to dull its attacking style; it pressed forward from the start and had its first corner after two minutes. While it was ineffective, it was an early declaration of intent. With long balls

When the defence finally yielded, it was in unusual circumstances. In the 15th minute, Miyazawa curled the ball in from depth on the left and Engen extended her leg to parry the ball. She managed only to deflect it wide of Aurora Mikalsen in goal for the eighth own goal of the tournament.

Japan seemed well on top but in the 21st minute, and from the first time in the match Norway had threatened, Vilde Boe Rise got away on the right, took the ball to the byline and crossed to the middle where Guro Reiten stood tall and headed wide of the diving Ayaka Yamashita into the left corner. The goal came entirely against the run of play. After a half-hour, Japan had 183 completed passes to Norway's 88, had more than 60%, and five shots on goal. Miyazawa,

Aoba Fujino, Jun Endo and others had been threatening. Shimizu's winner came in the 50th minute as Japan pushed forward again from halfway. Miyazawa tried to hold up the ball near the goal but lost possession to Boe Risa, who tried a back pass but rolled the ball into the path of Shimizu rushing in from the right to score. Miyazawa produced a copybook finish in the 81st, running onto a superb through ball and directing her shot wide of Mikalsen.

Compound archer Aditi becomes senior world champion at 17

Berlin, Aug 05 (PTI): Less than two months after she won the junior world title, 17-year-old Aditi Swami on Saturday became the senior world champion when she defeated Andrea Becerra of Mexico in the compound women's final of the World Archery Championships, here on Saturday.

The Satara teenager, who had won the Under-18 title in Youth Championships in Limerick in July, shot a near perfect score of 149 out of a possible 150 points to prevail over the Mexican giant-killer by two points.

The 16th seed Andrea had knocked out reigning champion Sara Lopez in the pre-quarterfinals.

But Andrea faced a tough challenge from the sixth seeded Indian, who started off with a bang, drilling in all her first three arrows closer to the centre (X) to take a 30-29 first round lead.



Aditi was on target in all of her 12 arrows in the first four rounds to extend her lead by three points.

It was only in the final end, she shot one 9 out of the three arrows, but by then she had already

sealed India's second World Championship gold ever.

Aditi along with Parneet Kaur and Jyothi Surekha Vennam had secured India's first ever World Archery Championships gold by winning the compound women's team final on Friday.

Earlier in the day, she had ousted her 'idol' and the most successful Indian compound archer Jyothi Surekha Vennam 149-145 in an all-Indian semifinal. Jyothi, however, went on to win a bronze medal when she shot a perfect 150 to defeat Ipek Tomruk of Turkey by four points in the third-place play-off.

Jyothi Yarraji wins India's first ever 100m hurdles medal at WUG

Chengdu, Aug 04 (PTI): Star athlete Jyothi Yarraji won India's first ever 100m hurdles medal - a bronze - at the World University Games while smashing her own national record time, here on Friday.

Another national record holder sprinter, Amlan Borgohain also won India's first ever 200m medal at the World University Games as he picked a bronze medal with a season's best time of 20.55 seconds.

Before Friday, India has won just four medals in track and field events at the World University Games.

In sprint races, only Dutee Chand had won a medal - a 100m gold in 2019 edition - in the World University Games before Yarraji and Borgohain's bronze medals on Friday.

The 23-year-old Yarraji clocked 12.78 seconds to finish third in the women's 100m hurdles final, bettering her earlier national mark of 12.82 seconds which she had recorded in October 2022.

India aims for improved batting in 2nd T20I against West Indies

Providence, Aug 05 (PTI):

India is gearing up to face a formidable West Indies side in the second T20 International of the five-match series in Providence on Sunday. In the opening game, West Indies secured a narrow victory on a slow batting track, showcasing an impressive bowling effort in the death overs. As India looks ahead to the T20 World Cup, skipper Hardik Pandya and his deputy Suryakumar Yadav are eager to put up an improved batting performance individually and as a team.

The Indian batting lineup, consisting of IPL stars like Ishan Kishan, Shubman Gill, and Sanju Samson, couldn't live up to expectations in the previous match. While debutant Tilak Varma showed promise with his knock of 39, the rest of the line-up flattered to deceive despite their IPL success.



However, with five T20 matches scheduled within nine days, across Trinidad and Tobago, Guyana, and the United States, the team management is aware of the need to manage players' workload and provide adequate rest.

Considering the T20 World Cup will be held in the Americas next year, this series presents an excellent opportunity for India to explore their options and try out players like Yashasvi Jaiswal, who gained prominence in the last IPL edition.

He said plans are in place to give the junior teams the best facilities as the senior side, coupled with enough international exposure, which would again make India a major hockey powerhouse.

"As far as the junior teams are concerned across genders, they will get all the facilities and support that are provided to the senior team, including an international coach. And I want to implement it within the next two months.

"We also have some grassroots programmes for our junior teams. We have their zonal tournaments, and many more such junior tournaments are expected to start. We will also have a junior national tournament, and the players selected there will get proper training as the senior team," he added.

The HI official said the junior sides will get to play more international tournaments.

He said the current HI brass under former India captain Dilip Tirkey is leaving no stone unturned to take Indian hockey to the top again.

"I have big plans for hockey and you will see some new things being introduced. We will try our best to change HI during this time," Bhola Nath told PTI.

"I want to assure you that if not the Paris Olympics, India will surely win a gold medal in the Los Angeles Olympics. If they don't, you can come back to me." To help Indian hockey recapture its past glory, Bhola Nath said HI is working on creating a bigger talent pool.

Prannoy reaches final of Australian Open

Indian badminton star HS Prannoy showcased his exceptional form as he dominated his young compatriot Priyanshu Rajawat to advance to the final of the Australian Open Super 500 badminton tournament in Sydney. In the men's singles semifinals, Prannoy demonstrated his power and precision, defeating Rajawat with a score of 21-18 21-12.

This victory marks Prannoy's second appearance in a Super 500 final this season. His impressive performance throughout the week, including a remarkable comeback win against world number 2 Anthony Ginting in the quarterfinals, has been a highlight of the tournament.

In the much-anticipated final, Prannoy will face China's Weng Hong Yang. Notably, Prannoy had previously defeated Weng in



the final of the Malaysia Masters, securing his first individual title in six years back in May. Their upcoming clash promises to be an exciting showdown.

For the 21-year-old Rajawat, it has been an outstanding week despite the semifinal loss. This tournament marked his first-ever super 500 semifinal finish, a promising achievement for the rising young shuttler.

In the semifinal match, Rajawat started strongly with a 2-0 lead, but Prannoy's skillful play gradually turned the tide in his favor. The experienced Indian shuttler capitalized on his opponent's errors and maintained a lead throughout the game. Rajawat tried to mount a comeback but couldn't sustain the attack against Prannoy's aggressive gameplay.

Injured Cummins likely to miss India series next month

Sydney, Aug 05 (PTI): Australia skipper Pat Cummins could miss the three-match ODI series against India next month having played the fifth Ashes Test with a suspected broken wrist. Cricket Australia is yet to reveal the details of Cummins' injured left wrist. The men from Down Under will fly to India for the ODI series, which is slated to begin on September 22 in Mohali. However, "two sources with knowledge of the matter but not authorised to speak publicly say medical staff have not ruled out a possible fracture," according to the 'Sydney Morning Herald'.

The Australian pace spearhead had injured his wrist on the opening day of the final Ashes Test at the Oval last week. He had played the remainder of the Test with a heavily-strapped wrist, and while the injury did not appear to impede Cummins' bowling, the skipper's discomfort while batting was evident.

India look to work on PC conversion rate against Malaysia in ACT



Chennai, Aug 05 (PTI): Tournament favourites and three-time champions India would look to work on their penalty corner conversion rate when they take on Malaysia in their next Asian Champions Trophy match here on Sunday. India struggled visibly when it came to penalty corner conversion rate against Japan on Friday at the Mayor Radhakrishnan Hockey Stadium here.

The Indians earned as many as 15 penalty corners but converted just one despite having a potent force in skipper Harmanpreet Singh, Varun Kumar, Amit Rohidas and

Jugraj Singh. India were lethal with their penalty corners in the 7-2 win over China in their opening match as six of the goals were scored through set pieces. However, it was a complete contrast in the 1-1 draw against Japan on Friday. Harmanpreet converted one of the 15 penalty corners India had secured in the hard-fought draw against Japan. India's chief coach Craig Fulton is visibly concerned but said the team is not far from attaining its full finishing potential. "It's every coach's concern if you are not converting your chances, whether corners or field goals," he said.

CM transfers Rs 15 cr online to beneficiaries

Raipur, Aug 05: Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Saturday transferred in online mode more than Rs 15 crore to cattle-rearers, women SHGs and 'gauthan' committees as a part of his government's flagship Godhan Nyay Yojna (GNY), officials said. The amount was transferred during a function held at the CM's official residence here, he said. Addressing the function, Baghel said the scheme has earned appreciation across



the country and several states have been implementing similar projects. This scheme has made women of SHGs self-reliant while farmers' interest in cattle rearing has increased, the CM said. "Of the Rs 15.29 crore, Rs 5.60 crore was transferred to accounts of cattle rearers in the lieu of cow dung sold by them in gauthans

(day care centres for cattle in villages). Besides, Rs 9.69 crore was given to gauthan committees and women SHGs which are associated with gauthans under the scheme," a state government official said. The state government had launched GNY scheme in July 2020 under which cow dung is procured at Rs 2 per kilogram at gauthans and is used to prepare vermicompost.

A total of Rs 541.66 crore has been given so far to the beneficiaries under the GNY, the official said. The state government in July last year started procuring cow urine at Rs 4 per kilogram.

CM announces hike in stipend for junior doctors

Raipur, Aug 05: Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Saturday said his government has decided to hike the stipend of junior doctors in the state.

As per the decision, MBBS students will get Rs 15,900 per month in place of Rs 12,600, while first-year postgraduate (PG) students will get Rs 67,500 per month, up from the current Rs 53,550.

Similarly, the stipend of second-year PG students will be hiked to Rs 71,450 per month from Rs 56,700 and third-year PG students will get Rs 74,600 per month in place of Rs 59,220, officials said.

"It is satisfying to share that we have decided to increase the stipend for junior doctors," Baghel tweeted.

The stipend hike was a

long pending demand of junior doctors who had staged strikes in support of it several times during the last three years.

"The stipend was not hiked for the last five years and the Junior Doctors' Association (JUDA) had been demanding a hike since the last three years. The hike move is welcome but the state government should have also considered salary hike of those under rural service bond after completing post graduation," former president of JUDA Dr Prem Chaudhary told PTI.

Under Chhattisgarh's mandatory rural service bond policy, students after completing undergraduate medical courses have to work at public health facilities for two years and again two years after the

post-graduation.

The penalty for refusal is Rs 25 lakh for undergraduates and Rs 50 lakh for PGs, Chaudhary said.

"JUDA had earlier demanded reduction in bond period to one year each after UG and PG but this was declined.

The post PG bond doctors are being paid Rs 55,000 per month which is much less than their juniors (third year PG students) who will now get stipend of Rs 74,600 per month after the hike," he pointed out.

This discrepancy should have been addressed by the government, said Chaudhary who cleared his PG exam in the previous academic session from Pt Jawahar Lal Nehru Memorial Medical College Raipur.

Chhattisgarh has received 616.1 mm of rain so far



More than normal rainfall in six districts including Raipur

Raipur, Aug 05: The state has received 616.1 mm of rain from June 1 to August 5, of which six districts including Raipur have received more than normal rainfall. According to the information received from the Meteorological Department, there has been normal rainfall in 16 districts and deficient rainfall in five dis-

tricts. Raipur district has received 775.2 mm of rainfall, which is 36 percent more than normal. Similarly, Bijapur has received maximum rainfall of 1074.6 mm. The Meteorological Department says that there will be an increase of two to four degree Celsius in the maximum temperature in the state in the coming three days.

It was partly cloudy across the state including Raipur since Saturday morning. Light rain also occurred in some areas of the state. Meteorologists said that now the rain activity will be slightly less in the state and there is a possibility of increase in the maximum temperature. The weather pattern will remain the same in the state for the coming

few days. In view of the rains received last week, it is expected to rain heavily in the month of August. Meteorologist HP Chandra told that a low pressure area is located over North East Madhya Pradesh. Also, the cyclonic circulation in the upper air extends up to 7.6 km height.
