### Compensation

**New Delhi:** The Delhi High Court has awarded Rs 50,000 each as compensation, to be borne by the State, to two accused who were acquitted in a murder case, saying it was a "classic example of terrible investigation" which made them suffer the ordeal of long trial and undergo incarceration for a crime they never committed.

### Unwell

**Kolkata:** West Bengal Law Minister Moly Ghatak on Tuesday complained of uneasiness in the assembly and was later admitted to a hospital, assembly sources said. Ghatak tabled The West Bengal Labour Welfare Fund (Amendment) Bill, 2023, and the House was adjourned for the day with a discussion on the Bill slated for Wednesday.

### Mishap

**Jaipur:** Six people were killed and 11 others injured after a truck rammed into a jeep in a road accident in Rajasthan's Dausa district on Tuesday, police said. The accident occurred on Mahwa-Alwar state highway near Ukrudd village falling under Mandawar police station area today when the truck carrying cold drinks rammed into the passenger jeep carrying 17 people, police said. Local people informed the police after which the injured were rushed to hospital in Mahwa and Mandawar, police said.

### Honour killing

**Gonda:** A man, together with his son, allegedly murdered his 19-year-old daughter and her partner in Uttar Pradesh's Gonda district, police said on Tuesday, in a suspected case of honour killing. Superintendent of Police (SP) Ankit Mittal said Mehauna resident Prabhavati approached police on Monday to lodge a report for his son Satish Chaurasia (20), who went missing the night before.

## BRICS SUMMIT

# PM arrives in S Africa

Johannesburg, Aug 22 (PTI):

Prime Minister Narendra Modi was warmly welcomed upon his arrival in South Africa on Tuesday on a three-day official visit during which he will attend the 15th BRICS summit and hold bilateral meetings with several world leaders.

Modi was welcomed by South Africa's Deputy President Paul Mashatile at Waterkloof Air Force Base where he received a ceremonial guard of honour.

"PM @narendramodi touches down at the Waterkloof Air Force Base, South Africa. Warmly received by Deputy President @PMashatile of South Africa. Accorded a ceremonial welcome upon arrival." Ministry of External Affairs spokesman Arindam Bagchi said in a post on X, formerly Twitter.

Africa entails participation in the 15th BRICS Summit and engagements with leaders of BRICS and invited countries in pluri-lateral and bilateral settings, he added.

A large number of Indian community members, including activists of the Pretoria Hindu Seva Samaj and the local chapter of the BAPS Swaminarayan organisa-

tion, greeted him.

Modi then left for Sandton Sun Hotel in Johannesburg, the venue of the BRICS Summit. At the hotel, he met with local and expatriate Indian community members ahead of the BRICS Business Forum Leaders' Dialogue. The Indian community members carrying musical instruments welcomed prime minister

upon his arrival at the hotel. At the community meeting, Modi is expected to view a model of the huge Swaminarayan Mandir which has been under construction since 2017 and is expected to be completed next year. The new temple at North Riding, north of Johannesburg, will be similar to one in Nairobi in Kenya, which is built entirely of stone. It will also include classrooms and a clinic.

Modi is visiting the African country from August 22 to 24 at the invitation of South African President Cyril Ramaphosa. South Africa is hosting the first in-person summit of BRICS comprising Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa, since 2019.

Earlier in his departure statement in New Delhi, Modi said BRICS has been pursuing a strong cooperation agenda across various sectors. "We value that BRICS

has become a platform for discussing and deliberating on issues of concern for the entire Global South, including development imperatives and reform of the multilateral system," he said.

This summit will provide a useful opportunity for BRICS to identify future areas of cooperation and review institutional development, he said. Modi posted on X that he will also take part in the BRICS-Africa Outreach and BRICS Plus Dialogue events. The Summit will give the platform to discuss issues of concern for the Global South and other areas of development.

The BRICS bloc - comprising Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa - brings together five of the largest developing countries of the world, representing 41 per cent of the global population, 24 per cent of the global GDP and 16 per cent of the global trade.

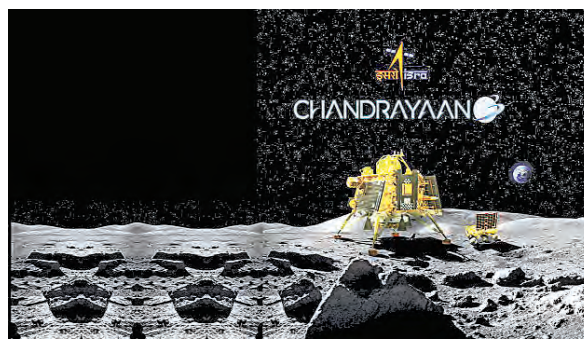
## Chandrayaan-3 gets ready to make history

With soft-landing on Moon's surface

Bengaluru, Aug 22 (PTI):

ISRO's ambitious third Moon mission Chandrayaan-3's Lander Module (LM) is all set to land on the lunar surface on Wednesday evening, as India eyes to become the first country to reach the uncharted south pole of Earth's only natural satellite. The LM comprising the lander (Vikram) and the rover (Pragyan), is scheduled to make a touch down near the south polar region of the Moon at 6:04 pm on Wednesday.

If the Chandrayaan-3 mission succeeds in making a touchdown on moon

Union. Chandrayaan-3 is a follow-on mission to Chandrayaan-2 and its objectives are to demonstrate safe and soft-landing on the lunar surface, roving on the Moon, and to conduct in-situ scientific experiments.

## Worker killed as molten slag falls on him at steel plant

Raigarh, Aug 22:

A 52-year-old worker died after hot slag fell on him at a steel plant in Raigarh district on Tuesday, the police said. Slag is a byproduct of steel manufacturing.

The incident took place in the early hours when the deceased, payload operator Chini Lal Patel, was working in the "Steel Melting Shop (SMS)-2 section of Jindal Steel and Power Limited" in Patrapali village under Kotra road police station limits, a police official here said. As per pre-

liminary information, molten slag from the furnace fell on Patel, causing serious burns that left him dead on the spot, he said.

After being alerted, a police team was rushed to the plant and the body was sent for post-mortem, the official said. The police have registered an accidental death report and launched a probe to ascertain the cause of the incident, he said.

Meanwhile, the plant management has also initiated an internal enquiry into the accident, said officials.

## SC sets aside Kerala HC verdict staying conviction of Lakshadweep LS MP

Says approach 'erroneous'

New Delhi, Aug 22 (PTI):

Terming as "erroneous" the Kerala High Court's approach, the Supreme Court on Tuesday set aside its verdict suspending the conviction of Lakshadweep Lok Sabha MP Mohammed Faizal in an attempt to murder case, but shielded him from immediate disqualification by keeping in abeyance the operation of its order for six weeks. The top court temporarily protected the status of Faizal as an MP saying the benefit of the high court's impugned order, staying the suspension, will remain in operation during the period keeping in mind that there should not be any "vacuum" with regard to representation of the Lakshadweep Lok Sabha constituency in Parliament. It remanded the matter back to the high court and asked it to decide afresh the lawmaker's application seeking a stay of his conviction within this period.

## What led to collapse of over 100 buildings in Shimla?

Water saturation in soil, indiscriminate construction led to collapse

Shimla, Aug 22 (PTI):

Falling in seismic zone IV and highly vulnerable to landslides, Shimla saw over 100 buildings suffering damage or collapsing during recent incessant rains, with experts attributing it to water saturation in soil, construction on drains, seepage and overburdening of hills. Himachal Pradesh received 752.1 mm of rainfall since the onset of Monsoon on

June 24 till date against average rainfall of 730 mm during the whole Monsoon season from June to September, according to the Met department. About 46 persons have died in rain-re-

**Raipur, Aug 22:** During the last two days of ED's raid in the state and this time there was a twist when the ASI Chandrabhushan Verma of the Police department posted in Bijapur was taken into custody and brought to Raipur. As per information in this regard, being in the Police department, for all types of transfers he used to play an important role in the region.

Apart from this four persons from Bhilai too have been taken into custody and brought to Raipur for interrogation and on completion of which it is expected to make surprising revelation.

### Raid in the house of Bhatia's CA

In case of Mahadev Satta App ED conducted raid at the residence of Chartered Accountant Harshal Sadvani in Avanti Vihar here on Tuesday. As per information in this regard, Harshal is CA of Piyush Bhatia, in whose account there were transactions related to income from 'satta'. In addition to

## India-China Entente

### Path to Cooperation

In a rare display of diplomatic engagement, India and China have embarked on a two-day military dialogue to address the remaining complexities along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh. The outcome of these discussions has been touted as positive and profound, culminating in a joint statement underlining the imperative of upholding tranquility along the border. Against the backdrop of the intense Galwan Valley clash in June 2020, India has orchestrated a comprehensive, multi-pronged strategy to de-escalate border tensions with China. This strategy encompasses not only covert negotiations but also diplomatic initiatives at the highest echelons, including interventions by the National Security Advisor. Simultaneously, India has executed substantial enhancements in its border infrastructure, mirroring China's strides in areas like roads, tunnels, equipment, communication networks, airports, helipads, all-weather bunkers, and the strategic deployment of tanks and advanced fighter jets. Amidst these progressions, India has swiftly airlifted and stationed an impressive troop presence, tanks, infantry combat vehicles, radar systems, artillery guns, and other vital equipment following the Galwan incident. A noteworthy addition to India's arsenal is the deployment of Haron Mark-2 drones, which boast capabilities such as carrying long-range missiles and other armament systems, rendering them effective for deep-penetration strikes within enemy territory. These drones can employ laser illumination to designate adversary targets for obliteration by long-range fighter aircraft. Additionally, the Indian Air Force (IAF) has unleashed a formidable fleet of Remotely Piloted Aircraft in Eastern Ladakh, intensively surveilling Chinese activities. The resolute commitment to augmenting defence capabilities is evident through multifaceted initiatives, underscoring India's unflinching resolve to safeguard its territorial integrity. A comprehensive approach is underway, addressing diverse defence needs through meticulous evaluations and apt upgrades. Through a sustained series of military and diplomatic dialogues, India and China successfully navigated the disengagement process in 2021, covering the north and south banks of the Pangong Lake as well as the Gogra area. India has consistently advocated for the restoration of Chinese troops to their pre-2020 positions. The current focus rests on swift resolutions for persistent issues in Depsang and Demchok. Continuing discussions, including those between National Security Advisor Doval and top Chinese diplomat Wang Yi, in conjunction with the 19th round of military dialogue, hold exceptional significance due to the imminent presence of Prime Minister Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping during the BRICS meeting in Johannesburg. Both India and China must acknowledge their stature as the world's most populous nations, endowed with shared interests and avenues for mutual growth. Prolonged confrontation serves neither India nor China. India's prominence on the global stage is undeniable, having emerged as a prominent nation. India is fervently advancing the indigenization of its armed forces and exhibits the capability to comprehensively safeguard its territories. With an array of nuclear-capable missiles spanning various domains, including surface-to-air, air-to-air, and underwater-to-air or surface variants, India's military prowess is formidable. Furthermore, India's historical record is devoid of instigating aggression or territorial annexation. Instead, India has often embraced a role as a supportive and influential neighbor, evident in its interactions with Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and others. The trajectory of escalating confrontation is an untenable one for India, and both nations must immerse themselves in negotiations to address persistent issues. India and China share a multitude of mutual interests that could lay the groundwork for cooperative dominance in the global market. China must recalibrate its expansionist approach towards India, acknowledging the merits of pursuing harmonious solutions for the collective advancement of both nations. The pursuit of amicability holds the promise of a new era of collaboration and prosperity.

## Maritime Sovereignty

### Atmanirbhar Naval Triumph

In the wake of India's recent achievement - the inauguration of the advanced stealth frigate "Vindhyagiri" built by Kolkata's Garden Reach Shipyards - the nation's march towards self-reliance in shipbuilding has taken an impressive stride. The grand event, graced by President Droupadi Murmu on the banks of the Hooghly River, signifies more than just the launch of a ship; it symbolizes India's technological prowess, its steadfast commitment to self-sufficiency, and its increasing influence as a global player in the realm of defense. This landmark occasion is a testament to India's rapid progress in maritime capabilities, underpinning its role as a key player in international defense scenarios. The nation's pursuit of naval self-reliance has been invigorated through the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative, a testament to its resolve to establish indigenous excellence in shipbuilding. The goal to achieve 70 percent indigenization of the Navy's capital budget by 2025 is driving various strategic initiatives. Central to this endeavor is the Government's unwavering financial support, fostering the growth of indigenous technologies and products within Indian defense enterprises. An exemplar of this commitment is the DRDO's pioneering work on fully indigenous stealth frigates, known as P-17A. By nurturing public-private partnerships, the Government is encouraging private players to invest in defense, fostering innovation. Simultaneously, the Ministry of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises is proactively supporting smaller defense enterprises, promoting innovation through financial backing. The export of Indian defense products is also on the agenda, with the Government actively working to establish favorable trade conditions through international agreements. Notably, the indigenous content in the Navy's capital budget has surged from 40 percent in 2014-15 to 64 percent in 2021-22. With this trajectory, the Navy appears on track to meet its ambitious 70 percent indigenization target by 2025. Alongside the unveiling of the "Vindhyagiri," the Navy's achievements span further, including the integration of INS Surat, the first of a series of six indigenous P-8I maritime patrol aircraft, as well as progress in the construction of four submarines under Project 75-India. Against the backdrop of recent global events, particularly attempts to disrupt crucial sea routes, fortifying naval prowess assumes paramount significance for India. Given the nation's extensive coastline, challenges like arms and narcotics smuggling and safeguarding critical national installations necessitate a robust naval command. Additionally, China's expansionist aspirations, particularly its presence-seeking endeavors in nations like Sri Lanka and neighboring island nations, demand attention. In this dynamic context, the current Government has not only addressed operational needs but also elevated self-reliance to a national imperative. The benefits of this strategic focus are palpable, saving substantial foreign exchange and reinforcing India's capacity to counter emerging threats effectively. As global commerce heavily relies on sea routes, safeguarding maritime trade is paramount, considering the implications of route disruptions on the economy and national security. Thus, India's emphasis on bolstering naval strength and self-sufficiency is not just judicious but a decisive response to evolving challenges. This emphasis ensures the nation's readiness to secure its maritime domain and uphold the sanctity of its maritime interests in the face of intricate global dynamics.

### Economic Resilience

## India's Unwavering Path Amidst Global Challenges

There are many factors that bolster the economy. Recently, many such parameters which strengthen the economy have improved. Rating agencies have also spoken about the make stronger of the Indian economy. However, other countries of the world, including developed countries, are struggling with Corona pandemic, geopolitical crisis, recession, high price of crude oil in the international market, ever-increasing inflation etc & due to them, their economy's growth rate is lower than India's.

The total number of Jan Dhan accounts in the country has crossed the 50-crore mark, out of which 56 per cent accounts are of women. It is noteworthy that about 67 per cent of these accounts have been opened in rural and semi-urban areas. This figure shows that we are moving fast on the path of financial inclusion.

Till August 13, the total deposits in Jan Dhan accounts were more than Rs 2.03 lakh crore & in the 50 crore accounts, 34 crore Rupay cards have been issued free of cost so far, which shows that the propensity to saving is enhancing in rural and semi urban areas. Online market has got wings with Rupay card. This figure also confirms that people are spending in villages as well, which is increasing demand and reinforcement the economy. Today, Amazon, Flipkart, Ajo, Myntra etc. are delivering in the villages as well, due to which the villagers are getting the goods of their choice sitting at a reasonable price and they got rid of the touts. The

Modi government in 2014 launched a nationwide campaign to open Jan Dhan accounts in the banks to promote financial inclusion, with the aim of making a range of financial services, benefits of government sponsored schemes including Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT), accessible to the poor. Even during the Corona period, due to the Jan Dhan accounts, the government was able to provide timely financial assistance to the poor, due to which thousands and lakhs of people were saved from untimely death. The bank will start implementing Pradhan Mantri Vishwakarma Yojana from September 17 to benefit 30 lakh families of traditional artisans, weavers, goldsmiths, blacksmiths, washermen, barbers etc. To give shape to this scheme, the government has allocated Rs 13,000 crore for 5 years. The bank will provide loans up to Rs 1 lakh in the first phase and up to Rs 2 lakh in the second phase at 5 percent interest. The Finance Ministry has directed the heads of banks to ensure speedy disposal of applications received under the Pradhan Mantri Vishwakarma Yojana and to continuously monitor the sanction & disbursement of loans under this scheme.

Moody's has retained India's stable outlook status. This means that India's economy has a strong potential to continue to grow rapidly by international standards. According to Moody's, India's GDP growth will continue in incoming days too, and the Indian economy will continue to grow stronger. If the economy remains

strong, it will be easier for fiscal consolidation and stabilization of the government's debt. Moody's believes that India's economic growth will be faster than the economies of all other G-20 countries for at least 2 years. India's potential growth rate is expected to be around 6 to 6.5 percent, which was less than 6 percent during the pandemic. However, this is less than the 7 percent increase in the middle of the last decade.

Moody's also said that India is continuously trying to consolidate the economy and hence its economic and contingent liability risks are coming down. It is also believed that if India's fiscal consolidation accelerates as expected, Moody's may upgrade India's rating. Fiscal consolidation will reduce the debt burden of the government and improve debt affordability and increase fiscal strength. According to Moody's, at present, due to increase in global and domestic interest rates in India, there is a situation of increase in debt burden and weak credit distribution.

According to the research report Ecowrap published by State Bank of India's Economic Research Department, Corporate Centre, Mumbai, based on income tax returns, the weighted average income in the financial year 2022-23 will be Rs 13 lakh, whereas it was Rs 4.4 lakh in the tax assessment year 2013-14. According to SBI Research, even smaller states like Manipur, Mizoram and Nagaland have registered more than 20 per cent growth in income tax return filing in the last 9 years. It is clear from this that not only the income of the people has increased in recent times, but tax compliance has also increased.

According to the Prime Minister's LinkedIn post, there has been at least a three-fold increase in the tax-base across various income groups and filing of income tax returns for each group in FY 2022-23. When comparing the income tax returns filed between 2014 and 2023, the picture of increased tax participation in all the states looks rosy. Uttar Pradesh has emerged as the leading performing

state in terms of income tax return filing. According to Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, India can become a developed country by the time India completes 100 years of independence in the year 2047 if the current pace of development is maintained. Currently India is the fifth largest economy in the world.

During the first 4 months (April-July) of FY 2023-24, among India's top 10 export hubs, only merchandise exports to the UK grew, while exports to all other major economies declined due to lower global demand. Exports to the UK grew by 20.6 per cent to \$4.5 billion during the period. The UK has moved up from the eighth largest export hub to become India's fifth largest export destination during this period in FY23.

According to the Minister of State for Electronics and Information Technology, Rajeev Chandrasekhar, by the year 2026, the contribution of the digital economy to the country's GDP is estimated to be more than 20 percent. India is a country which has adopted technology very fast and now it has started offering technological solutions to the world. The contribution of digital economy to GDP was four and a half percent in 2014, which has increased to 11 percent today. India has adopted technology not only for innovation but also for providing solutions in various fields, which has brought about radical changes in people's life, operational system, administration, education, health, technical nature of democracy etc. in the last few years. It is because of these reasons that Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has called the coming decade as the decade of technology.

In such a situation, it can be said that the Indian economy is getting better gradually even in difficult times, and all this is possible due to the appropriate steps and initiatives being taken from time to time by the government and the Reserve Bank of India.

## Youth gets 20 years RI for raping juvenile girl

**Bhilai, Aug 22:** A Fast Track Special Court in Durg sentenced a youth to rigorous imprisonment of 20 years for raping a 15-year-old girl. Additional District and Sessions Judge (First, FTSC - POCSO) Sarita Das convicted 25-year-old M o h a m m a d Shahrukh Khan, son of Mohammad Salim a resident of Atal Awas, Kurud. The girl's parents had lodged a complaint at Jamul Police Station in January 2022.

Special Public Prosecutor Rajesh Kumar Sahu informed that the accused and the victim reside in the same locality and the victim called the accused as Uncle. The victim was alone at home on January 26, 2022 when the accused reached her residence and asked her to come with him.

When the girl refused, he insisted and managed to take her to the backyard of the house. The accused raped the girl in the bushes behind the house and threatened her for not disclosing the incident to anyone.

However, the girl narrated the entire story to her younger sister after which the parents rushed to the police station and lodged a complaint.

After trial, the Special Court found the accused guilty and awarded different jail terms for Section 506 and 376(3) of IPC under which the accused was tried. He was sentenced to rigorous imprisonment of one year and Rs 1000 fine under section 506 of IPC and rigorous imprisonment of 20 years and Rs 5000 fine under section 376 (3) of IPC, informed Special Public Prosecutor Rajesh Kumar Sahu.

This problem has prompted villagers to submit an application to the local Panchayat, seeking a resolution to the matter. The ongoing construction of a drainage along the Kodwa-Saja road without the Berla Development Block has become a cause for concern. The villagers have expressed their dissatisfaction, asserting that the construction work is currently only partially finished. Recognizing the significance of this issue



to the community, local legislator Ashish Chhabda had initially sanctioned the construction of the drainage work. However, the villagers had specifically requested the extension of the drainage's coverage area, spanning from Omprakash Vaishnav's residence to the Chikhla drain, and further from Kedar Sahu's bicycle shop to the Chikhla drain. Regrettably, the contractor has proceeded to construct the canal from Omprakash Vaishnav's house to Pappu Prajapati's house on one

side, and from Kedar Sahu's bicycle shop to Shankar Sahu's house on the opposite side. Taking into account these discrepancies, the villagers have now taken the initiative to address the issue formally by submitting a letter to the Panchayat. In this letter, they are urgently calling for the proper completion of a permanent drainage system. Their proposal stipulates the drainage's extension from Pappu Prajapati's residence to connect with the Chikhla drain on one end, and similarly, from Shankar Sahu's house to the Chikhla drain on the other end.

## Have caught more than 23000 snakes in last 13 yrs: Suraj Kumar

Mainpur, Aug 22: Snakes are one of the most beautiful and important aspect of nature and with dangerous issues and stories prevalent for last many decades, it has made people more fearful just about their presence. Contrary to this there are many species of Snakes which are non-venomous and they do not cause any harm to human life. The President of Nova Nature Society Suraj Kumar who has been catching the venomous and non-venomous snakes from houses and institutions for last 14 years and then leaving them safely in the jungles spoke to our correspondent during his visit to Mainpur here on the eve of 'Nagpanchami'. He informed that in six districts of Chhattisgarh viz. Gariyaband, Durg, Raipur, Kawardha, Bijapur and Rajnandgaon, the members of Nova Nature Welfare Society (NNWS) are working to save the snakes for last 13 years and in this work around 50-60 persons are involved round the clock. Suraj Kumar informed that

- From houses of people in state and left the snakes safely in the jungle
- 'King Korba' found in large number in Udanti-Sitanadi
- Total 75 different species of 'Sari' snakes found in state
- 40 species of snakes found in the state



snakes are protected wildlife species of reptiles under Wildlife Conservation Act 1972 and it is giving information to the Forest department that the snakes are released safely in a safe habitat in the jungles. So far the members of NNWS have caught more than 23000 snakes from the houses of the citizens in different parts of the state and left them safely in the jungle. President NNWS Suraj Kumar informed that he has alone caught around 8000 snakes. He informed that the institution was formed in 2004 and about a year back there were

around 32 different species of snakes found in entire Chhattisgarh. Suraj informed that in entire Chhattisgarh 75 different species of 'Sari' snakes have been found and on which a book has been made. This includes 40 different species of snakes. Ornet Flying Snake, Vine Snake, Sascaled Viper, King Kobra are very rare species of snakes in the region and work is going on for conservation of King Kobra. In the Central India, Korba in Chhattisgarh is one such place where King Kobra is found and NNWS is working along with the Forest depart-

ment for its protection and conservation. Suraj Kumar informed that the most venomous snakes is Spectacled Kobra (Indian Nag), 'Common Karait', Russel Viper (Juda Mahamandal) and apart from there are many other venomous snakes like Ahiraj, King Kobra, but so far no bite cases of these snakes have come forward. According to a study in India, there is death of more than 50000 persons every year due to snake bite and the main reason behind it is delay in reaching to the hospital. Today also there are many people who believe in curing through 'Jhad-Phook'

(treatment by quacks) and which ultimately proves dangerous for the victim of snake bite. Found 35 different species of Snakes in Udanti-Sitanadi Tiger Reserve NNWS President Suraj Kumar informed that they have found 35 different species of Snakes in Udanti-Sitanadi Tiger Reserve district. Here the strength of 'Naagraj' (King Kobra) is the highest. M Suraj further informed that there is need to change the false rumours spread related to snakes. To wear 'Mani' or a snake killing with his tail, drinking of milk are

absolutely wrong notions which have been created related to snakes. Contrary to this the survival of these reptiles including snakes is very important for the nature and its living beings. Kumar informed that more than 250 snakes are rescued from the houses of the people in Gariyaband district every year and are safely released in the jungle and there are many persons of NNWS who are working in this direction. Suraj informed that there is good presence of 'Nag' in the hilly areas of Gariyaband and he has himself seen big 'King Kobras' in the dense forest

of Udanti-Sitanadi Tiger Reserve and have captured them in his camera. From Mainpur area also we have caught huge snakes and left them in jungles and here also 'Nag' is found in large number, he added. Rare Ornet Flying Snake found in Udanti The rare species of snake viz. Ornet Flying Snake' was found in the Jungles of Udanti in Gariyaband district. This snake can glide from one branch of tree to another by flattening their body and this has been seen many times. They can glide upto 50-100 mts. These snakes are of rare species and are found in large number in Udanti-Sitanadi Tiger Reserve. Primary treatment in case of Snake Bite 1. The victim of snake bite should be kept clam and quiet, as in case of becoming hyper, the blood pressure would rise and this spread the venom much faster. 2. Do not make any incision at the place of snake bite, or try to squeeze it out from mouth or tie a rope

above the bite, as this will worsen the situation, instead of solving it. 3. Do not provide any poisonous or intoxicating item to the victim of snake bite. 4. Avoid going to quacks using 'Jhad-Phook', 'Baiga' or 'Guniya' for treatment of snake bite. Primary Treatment If possible one should try to identify the snake which has bitten and try to take a photo of it and move away from the place. Wrap around the place of snake bite with a bandage or broad cloth as much as possible and leave for the nearby hospital having anti-venom. Pollivent, Anti-Venom is very much effective in treating the patient with snake bite from venomous snakes and it should be given only on doctor's advice. Even if there is doubt of snake bite from non-venomous snake, then staying back in the hospital for one day for observation is okay. In case if any snake is found in the house, then one should try to take it out from the house using a long stick and do not kill it.

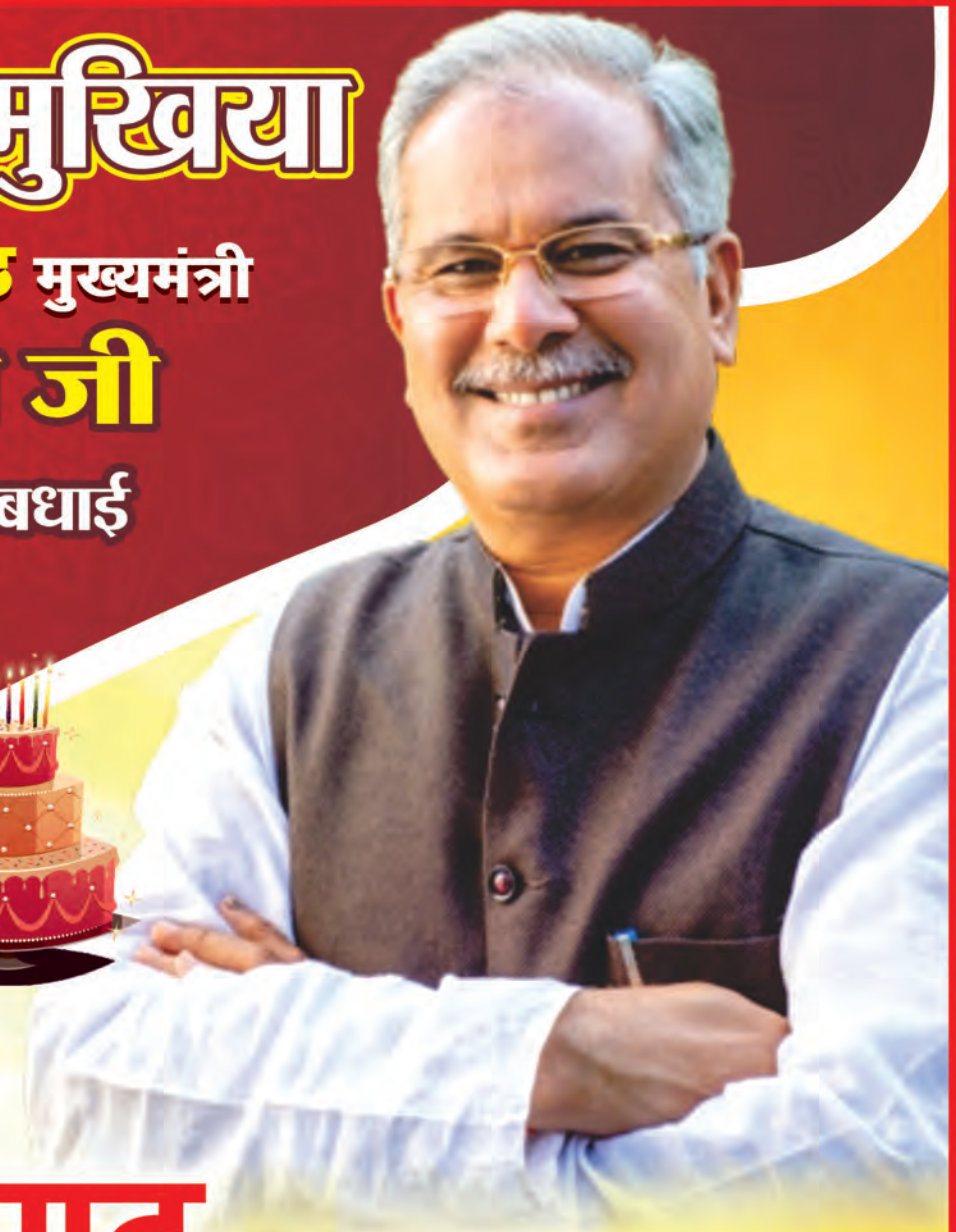

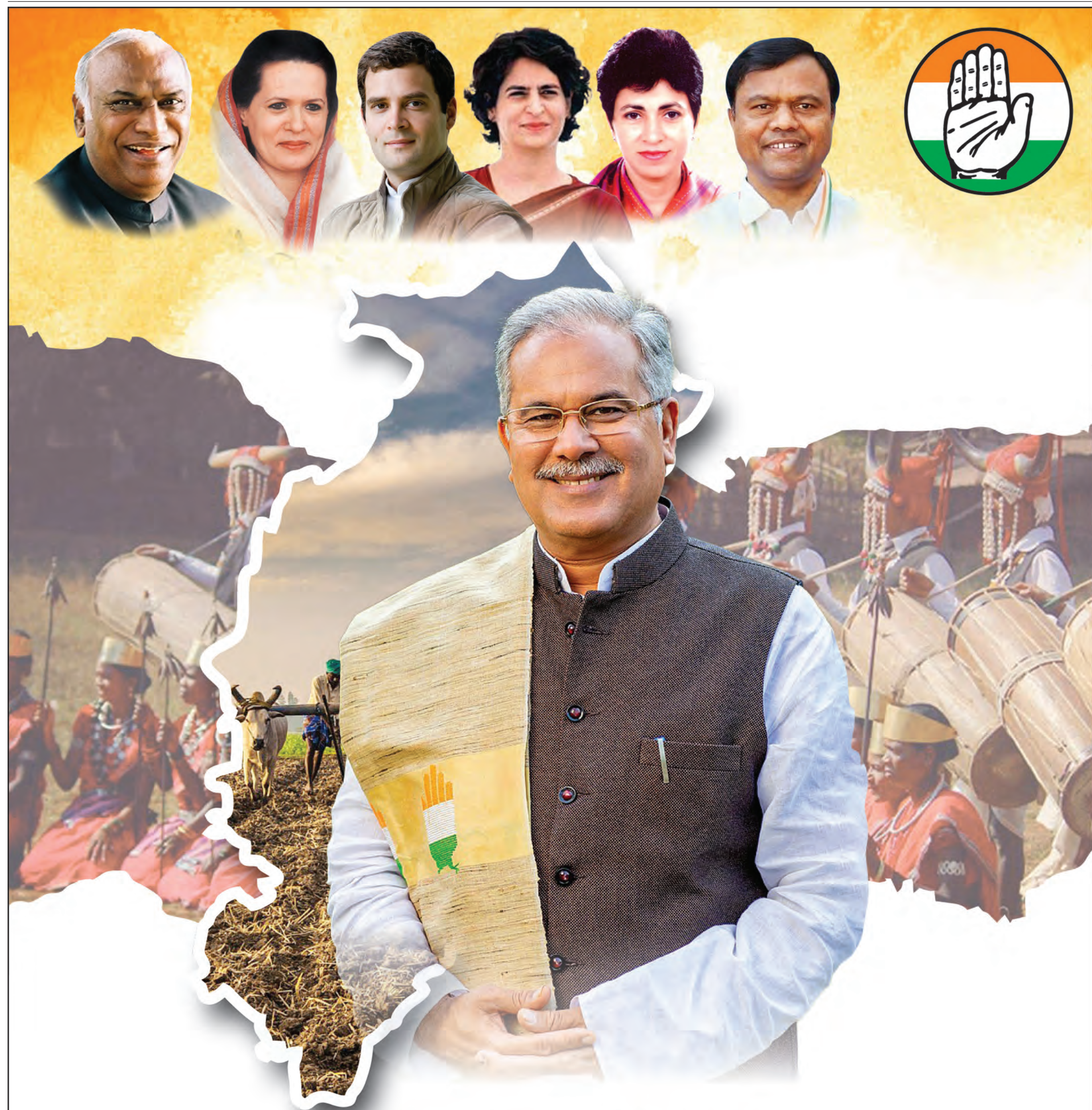
