

PM bids adieu to old Parl building with paeans to Nehru, dig at Manmohan

New Delhi, Sep 18 (PTI):

'Lets move to new building with new hope, confidence'

Bidding farewell to the old Parliament building, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday sang paeans to first prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru and subsequent leaders, including Lal Bahadur Shastri, Indira Gandhi, P V Narasimha Rao and Atal Bihari Vajpayee, but also reminded the Lok Sabha of the 'cash-for-vote' scam during the Manmohan Singh government.

Initiating the discussion in the Lok Sabha on "Parliamentary Journey of 75 years starting from Samvidhan Sabha -- A chievement, Experiences, Memories and Learnings", Modi also said there were celebrations everywhere when three new states of Uttarakhand, Jharkhand

and Chhattisgarh were created during Vajpayee's time but lamented that Telangana being carved out of Andhra Pradesh led to only bitterness and bloodshed in both the states.

"It is a very emotional moment to bid farewell to this building. As we leave

this building our mind is filled with many emotions and memories," Modi said.

In his 52-minute speech, the prime minister recalled the bravery of Bhagat Singh and Batukeshwar Dutt who hurled bombs in the same Parliament to wake up the British empire from its slumber.

"The echo of that bomb still gives sleepless nights to those

who wish well for this country," he said. Singh and Dutt had hurled bombs in the Delhi Central legislative assembly (the present Parliament House).

Modi said it was in this Parliament that Pandit Nehru delivered his "tryst with destiny" speech "at the stroke of midnight hour" and his words continue to inspire everyone.

'Dead JU student possibly abused sexually'

Kolkata, Sep 18:

The inquiry committee formed by Jadavpur University to probe into the circumstances leading to the death of a fresher has concluded that the victim was singed out for severe pre-planned ragging, which included possible sexual abuse. In its report submitted to the authori-

ties, the committee said there are two possibilities for his death -- "a case of abetted incident and a case of homicide". The 17-year-old boy fell from the second-floor balcony of a hostel on August 9 allegedly during ragging by seniors who were staying in the facility illegally. The resident of Nadia district died in a hospital the next day.

SC TO MAHA SPEAKER

'Set timeline on Sena split'

New Delhi, Sep 18 (PTI):



The Supreme Court on Monday directed the Maharashtra assembly speaker to spell out the timeline within a week for adjudication of the disqualification petitions filed against Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and Shiv Sena MLAs loyal to him who had tied up with the BJP to form a new government in June 2022.

A bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra referred to the May 11 verdict of the apex court on the Maharashtra political crisis and the direction issued by it to the

speaker to decide the disqualification petitions within a reasonable time.

The speaker has to honour the dignity of the Supreme Court and abide by its verdict, the bench said. It asked Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the speaker, to inform it about the time

cation of Shinde and other Shiv Sena MLAs supporting him after two weeks.

The speaker is a "tribunal under the tenth schedule of the Constitution", and as a tribunal, he is amenable to the court's jurisdiction, the bench said, adding nothing has been done about the pending disqualification petitions after the May 11 judgement.

Youth killed in road mishap; denizens stage chakkajam

Bhilai, Sep 18: The Power House - Ahiwara road remained blocked for the entire day on Monday after the death of a youth in a road accident. The commuters took alternate routes to reach their destination. Taking idea from the Khursipar incident, kin of the deceased have also raised the demand of Rs 50 lakh compensation and a government job.


According to information, the incident occurred near Durga Mandir in Jamul in the wee hours of Monday. A youth moving on a scooter was crushed to death by a speeding truck. Another youth suffered fatal injuries in the mishap and was rushed to the hospital for treatment. On the other hand, the truck driver left his vehicle and escaped from the spot. The deceased was Manish Tondon (19) a resi-

dent of village Kherdha, Jamul. He was moving towards a hair cutting saloon with his friend when the mishap occurred.

On information, teams of Jamul and Old Bhilai Police Stations reached the spot. CSP Ashish Banchhor, Inspector Yakub Menon and Inspector Manish Sharma tried to interact with the demonstrators and diffuse the tension.

But the demonstrators were adamant on their demand of Rs 50 lakh compensation and a government job for the bereaved family. In the evening, police forcefully removed the demonstrators from the road.



Farmers will not fall into BJP's trap: Congress

● Shukla says farmers to get paddy price from 2800 to Rs 3600 per quintal

Raipur, Sep 18: Pradesh Congress Committee (PCC) President and MP Deepak Baij said that under the Congress government, farmers will get paddy price from Rs 2800 to Rs 3600 per quintal. He alleged that BJP's leaders in Chhattisgarh were trying to stall paddy procurement in the state through the central government. The Center cuts the quota for taking rice from the state from 86 lakh tonnes to 61 lakh tonnes. The quota of gunny bags was also cut, but the BJP leaders of the state are taking the side of the Center instead of the state on this issue, he said.

Baij said that farmers of Chhattisgarh will not fall prey to lies, illusions and deceptions of the Bharatiya Janata Party. Under Bhupesh government, the farmers of Chhattisgarh are getting higher price of paddy than promised and they are also expecting more

in the future. Farmers have got Rs 2640 and Rs 2660 per quintal, which is the highest in the country, he said.

The farmers of Chhattisgarh have accepted that in the coming time under the Congress government, the price of paddy will increase from Rs 2800 to Rs 3600 per quintal, he said. The farmers of Chhattisgarh do not trust even BJP's 2183, he said, adding that the farmers have understood that paddy and farmers are important for the Bharatiya Janata Party only from the electoral point of view.

During the 15 years of Raman government, farmers of Chhattisgarh were continuously cheated, Baij said, adding that promises were made in the name of bonus which was never given except in election years.

Farmers of Chhattisgarh have understood the fact that BJP starts pretending to be their well-wishers when elections are round the corner. Farmers also realized that promises and statements of the Modi government are false, he added.

CM Baghel inaugurates Bijapur Garment Factory located at Itpal

Flags off the first batch of market-ready products

Garment factory is built at a cost of Rs 6 crore 90 lakh

Bijapur, Sep 18: The Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel inaugurated the Bijapur Garment Factory located at Itpal. On this occasion, he also spoke with the women employed at the garment factory and inspected the current textile manufacturing operations there. The first shipment of goods from the factory that were ready for the market was flagged off by Baghel.

The main sources of

livelihood for the villagers living in Bijapur district are agriculture and forests. And considering the migration of rural people to other states for employment because of the lack of industry in the district, the district administration of Bijapur established a garment factory as a business model for stable livelihoods and women's empowerment. The garment factory is a business model of the district administration to provide employment to a maximum number of beneficiaries at a minimum cost. On account of it, the maximum number of beneficiaries can be provided employment by setting up a garment-based industry in less time and at less

cost. For setting up a garment factory, discussions were held with the country's big garment brands like Myntra, Max, Dixcy, etc. The representatives of Dixcy and Myntra companies visited the district and agreed to establish the factory. The garment factory is built at a cost of Rs 6 crore 90 lakh 27 thousand.

The counselling of 800 women to work in the garment factory was started, and training was provided to 200 beneficiaries. In June 2023, it was decided to start the production of vests at the District Project Livelihood College with 70 women by signing a 5-year contract with Dixcy Company.

Raipur, Sep 18: Traffic pressure at Bhathagaon Chowk is continuously increasing due to the movement of overloaded vehicles and hundreds of passenger buses every day at Bhathagaon Interstate Bus Terminal. Residents as well as the people of the city are facing the problem of traffic jam every day due to movement of buses and trucks. Movement of buses and trucks also raises risk of accident. Residents of the area had drawn submitted a memorandum to Collector Sarveshwar Narendra Bhure under the leadership of local corporator and MIC member of the corporation, Satnam Singh Panag over traffic congestion in the area. On this, the administration instructed the traffic police to prepare its draft.

Since the opening of the bus terminal in Bhathagaon, the traffic pressure on Ring Road 1 has been continuously increasing. The number of vehicles has increased on both sides of the road between Santoshinagar and Tatibandh intersection. Buses coming from different cities are moving through this road to reach the terminal, while pas-

sengers also have to use this road to catch the buses.

Police had surveyed Ring Road 1 two years ago to regulate traffic. In this survey, many patches of the Ring Road were considered dangerous. To reduce the risk of accidents, along with widening the road between Santoshinagar and Sundernagar Chowk, the

width of the service road was also increased.

Bhathagaon area is highly sensitive and has developed into a densely populated area with a population of about 40 thousand. There is a government school, government hospital and vegetable market adjacent to the road around Bhathagaon Chowk. Bhathagaon has the second largest vegetable market after Shastri Market.

Due to the constant movement of overloaded goods vehicles, buses and trucks, school children as well as the general public and residents face a lot of problems in commuting. Hospital ambulances often get stuck in traffic jams. To get rid of all these problems, the residents are mobilizing to demand that Bhathagaon Chowk be declared a no entry zone.


Dengue prevention Campaign: 2,449 houses surveyed in a day

Bhilai, Sep 18:

On Monday, 2,449 houses in the Bhilai township were surveyed and intensive spraying and fogging were carried out at as many as 104 houses under Dengue Prevention campaign. In view of the possibility of Mosquito Larvae breeding, stagnant water-bodies were inspected at 2,174 spots.

157 houses were found with spots having mosquito larvae, which were cleaned and sprayed with medicines along with Temephos distribution at 1,400 houses.

Oiling, spraying of medicines in the backline, fogging with portable mist blower machines etc., along with pamphlet distribution and loudspeaker announcements were also done in Sectors-1, 2, Maroda and Risali Sector areas to raise awareness.



Similar operations were also done at specific areas in Sectors-2 & 3. Strict warnings were issued to those individuals at whose premises mosquito larvae were found. All Bhilai residents

have been requested to keep a strict vigil and make collective efforts to check mosquito infestation around them. The residents are requested to adhere to special precautionary measures.

BSP's Public Health Department has made an appeal to the common public to take precautionary measures at individual as well as collective levels to ensure everyone's safety.

It could be recollected that the Public Health Department, under the TSD of SAIL-BSP and Durg Malaria Eradication Department, of Government of Chhattisgarh is jointly running an intense Dengue and other mosquito-borne diseases prevention campaign in the Township. New Delhi, Sep 18 (PTI):

Leader of Opposition Mallikarjun Kharge recalled former prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru's contribution to Indian democracy in the Rajya Sabha on Monday, saying his outlook was inclusive as he took the opposition along and had laid the foundation of the Constitution. He asked the government what did it achieve by shifting the parliamentary proceedings to a new building.

Kharge also expressed concern over the passage of several bills in a manner faster than the "bullet train", without referring to parliamentary standing committees, while accusing the government of using the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to weaken the opposition.

"He (Modi) goes to every corner of the country, but why does he not visit Manipur? He should visit Manipur and see the pain and sufferings of the people," the LoP said in the Upper House. Ethnic violence has gripped Manipur since May 3, he said, adding that people in the state are getting killed and houses burnt. The Congress has sought a statement on this, Kharge said.

HC rejects Chinese contract company petition

■ In case of Balco Chimney incident

Korba, Sep 18:

The High Court has rejected the petition of three Chinese officials of SEPCO company in the chimney accident that happened 14 years ago in Balco. The three officers had submitted a criminal revision in the High Court against the framing of charges by the Korba ADJ Court. The court has also ordered to prosecute the case against the responsible officials of SEPCO in the district court.

A crime was registered against the responsible officials of GDCL and SEPCO and they were arrested. After this the ADJ Court framed charges against 13 culprits. These include Chunian, Liu Jackson,



Wang Qiong, project manager of Chinese contracting company SEPCO. The court has framed charges under Sections 304 and 201, in which the accused have been charged with knowingly committing acts endangering life and hiding

evidence. Deputy Advocate General Madhunish Singh presented the case in the High Court on behalf of the government. In this case, the police has also presented a challan in the court, in which the officials of the Chinese con-

tract company SEPCO, sub-contract company GDCL and NCCBM, including Balco, have been charged under section 304 of the Indian Penal Code for intentionally committing an act which may cause death of someone and section 304 of the Indian Penal Code. 201 were accused of hiding evidence. On this, the accused had filed a petition to change Section 304 to 304A, culpable homicide not amounting to murder. The ADJ Court rejected the application of the accused and framed charges against everyone under sections 304 and 201. An appeal was made in the High Court against this decision of the ADJ Court.

In the case, Balco's then project manager Viral Mehta, additional general manager Deepak Narang,

GTE Atul Mahapatra, Chinese contracting company SEPCO's project manager Wu Chunnan, Lew Jackson, Wang Qiong, sub-contracting company GDCL's project manager Manoj Sharma, engineer Alok Sharma, Sunil Charges have been framed against Singh, Vishakti Pal, Vyankatesh, Sanjay Dev, Anirudh and Vikas Bharti. Apart from this, the court has also accused Dr MN Ansari, Joint Director of National Council for Cement and Building Materials NCCBM Vallabbgarh, Group Manager UK Mandal and General Manager RK Goswami, who checked the quality of construction materials after the accident. They are accused of hiding evidence and tampering with it. Goswami has died in this.

The primary objective behind this initiative is to disseminate crucial information about elephant movements to rural residents, fostering heightened vigilance in areas prone to such encounters. The Chhattisgarh Pashu Tracker and Alert App meticulously records critical data related to elephant activities, including their location, herd dynamics, dates of encoun-

ters, and behaviour. This invaluable information is gathered through inputs from dedicated Elephant Friend groups, individuals actively monitoring elephant sightings. Notably, the app functions seamlessly offline. Leveraging cutting-edge AI technology built upon precise elephant location data, the app triggers real-time SMS alerts and alert calls to residents residing within a 10-kilometer radius of the elephant's current location. This innovative approach empow-

ers communities to stay informed and take precautionary measures swiftly. Moreover, the app offers users the ability to track elephant herd activities over any desired timeframe, facilitating well-informed conservation planning and effective prevention of human-elephant conflicts. The Forest Department has successfully piloted the Hathi Alert App in the Udanti Sitanadi Tiger Reserve for the past three months, demon-

strating its effectiveness in minimizing human-elephant conflicts. The state government is now poised to roll out this transformative tool statewide, extending its reach and impact. In the next phase of implementation, the app will further enhance its community reach by sending alerts to rural residents through integrated siren systems, fortifying Chhattisgarh's commitment to harmonious coexistence with its majestic elephant population.

Russia urges UN's top court to toss out Ukrainian case

The Hague, Sep 18 (AP): Russia on Monday called a Ukrainian case alleging that Moscow abused the Genocide Convention to justify its invasion last

year an "abuse of process," as lawyers for Moscow sought to have judges at the United Nations' highest court throw it out. As a series of lawyers laid

A Sustainable Revolution

This directive compelled all European Union (EU) member states to enact legislation within the next two years, mandating a single universal connector, the USB-C, for smartphones, laptops, tablets, cameras, and a host of similar electronic devices. The significance of this directive cannot be overstated. Year after year, Europe contends with a staggering 11,000 tonnes of e-waste, a substantial portion of which comprises discarded chargers and cables. This relentless surge in electronic refuse has become an alarming concern, prompting the EU to take an assertive stance in addressing this crisis. After years of extensive consultations and negotiations with various stakeholders, the EU has delivered a resounding message—one that promises to revolutionize the way we approach technology and its environmental ramifications. The tech industry has long been characterized by a battlefield of proprietary connectors, where manufacturers have fiercely clung to their charging standards in an effort to assert dominance. Notably, Apple introduced its proprietary lightning charger in 2012, a move perceived as an attempt to maintain its stronghold on the market. However, in a surprising and laudable turn of events, Apple, recognizing the vastness of its EU customer base, has embraced the USB-C standard well in advance of the 2024 deadline. This transition is conspicuously reflected in its latest product offerings. Beyond the evident benefits of cost-saving and e-waste reduction, the integration of USB-C connectors across a wide range of electronic gadgets is poised to simplify the lives of consumers. This development assumes even greater significance as basic versions of these electronic devices are increasingly becoming indispensable in our daily lives. Recognizing this burgeoning need and the imperative to reduce electronic waste, India has set its sights on a significant milestone. The country has established March 2025 as the deadline for adopting the USB-C standard charging port. Given India's substantial population and its vigorous push toward digital payments, with a historic milestone of over 10 billion UPI transactions recorded in August alone, this decision is poised to curtail the generation of electronic waste stemming from incompatible connectors. Admittedly, in the initial stages of this transition, we may witness a surge in electronic waste as users, driven by the need to upgrade their devices and align with the USB-C standard, discard their old chargers and cables. However, it is essential to recognize that this policy represents a long-term investment—one that promises to yield substantial dividends in terms of sustainability and environmental responsibility. The pursuit of a universal charging standard, exemplified by the adoption of the USB-C connector, stands as a testament to the power of collective action and forward-thinking policy-making. The EU and India, by taking the lead in this endeavour, have embarked on a journey toward a more sustainable and responsible tech ecosystem. As consumers, it is our responsibility to embrace this transition, recognizing that it not only simplifies our lives but also contributes to a cleaner, greener future for generations to come.

Secondly, there are those students who do not have to study; for them, the use of any stick has been completely prohibited and declared illegal. To make corporal punishment is an appreciable step, and this is also scientifically proved that a child shouldn't be made afraid. In order to bring about the desired changes in their behavior, it has become the major responsibility of the teacher to treat them in a friendly manner and prepare them to receive education.

The aim is not to create fear on the personality and behavior of studies in the child but to generate interest and awareness towards studies so that the child realizes the importance of education and becomes serious about his studies. He has to be made to feel that he is not an ordinary student, but other children want to follow him. Today, seriousness regarding one's "ego" can be seen even in small children. They don't like it if someone hurts their ego. Parents and schools can jointly organize creative activities that elevate all children

to celebrity status. For example, recently a school organized a competition for writing the maximum number of slogans on bird conservation, in which almost all the children of the school together created a new National Record by writing many beautiful slogans. Due to which the achievements of all the participants were given a place in the entire media world. Within no time, the children became celebrities or went from ordinary to special.

This had a positive impact on the personality and behavior of children. Now they became more disciplined, serious, and responsible than before. They started avoiding doing anything wrong like abusing or harassing anyone, etc. By making children respect their "ego" through such constructive co-curricular activities, we can bring about the desired changes in children. Scolding children for their mistakes in the classroom or abusing them in front of their classmates when they come home hurts the innocent, soft heart of the child. And this very behavior of ours can create distrust and hatred towards us in the child. As a result, the child will avoid paying

attention to your words in the future or will gradually keep distance from you. Because he knows that if he makes any mistake, you will hurt his self-esteem or insult him. Whereas our aim is to correct the mistakes of the child and make him a responsible citizen. Which parents and teachers can easily create without any punishment, through positive thinking and creative activities. Today, children seem to be greatly influenced by social media and other communication mediums.

Parents and teachers have to take advantage of this influence and use the positive aspects of social media and communication mediums to encourage them to do good things. Like uploading a poem composed by a child on social media, etc., there are many such activities that can inculcate good values and qualities in the child. Our aim is to make the child disciplined, cultured, and serious towards his duties, which should not be a temporary but a permanent part of his personality.

On back of macroeconomic stability

New Delhi, Sep 18:



India's economic growth will be above 6 per cent in the current fiscal as the country has managed to strengthen its macroeconomic stability and performance even in a period of large global shocks, RBI Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) Member Ashima Goyal said on Monday. Goyal further said that a global slowdown reducing India's export growth, geopolitics fueling oil and food prices, and erratic weather are some of the continuing risks that the

country faces. "India has managed to strengthen its macroeconomic stability and performance even in a period of large global shocks. India's GDP growth in FY24 will be above 6 per cent," she told PTI in a telephonic interview. While GDP growth in 2022-23 was 7.2 per cent, lower than 9.1 per cent in 2021-22, the RBI projects India's GDP to grow at 6.5

per cent in the current fiscal year. Asked when retail inflation will decline to RBI's target of 4 per cent, the eminent economist said inflation expectations are getting anchored at around 4 per cent. "For a long time now, firms' inflation expectations are around 4 per cent. That means, despite cost shocks, their price increases do not exceed 4 per cent," Goyal noted.

Observing that core inflation is softening, she said inflation targeting is teaching price-setters to look through transient supply shocks.

According to Goyal, under transient even if repeated supply shocks (like the Ukraine war),

monetary tightening should be adequate to anchor inflation expectations, but not so sharp as to impose a large growth sacrifice on the economy. "But other supply-side policies will continue to reduce inflation," she opined. Retail inflation declined to 6.83 per cent in August after touching a 15-month high of 7.44 per cent in July, mainly due to softening prices of vegetables, but still remains above the Reserve Bank's comfort zone. RBI has the mandate to keep retail inflation in the range of 2 to 6 per cent. Commenting on a recent brokerage report which stated private capex actually declined in the last two quarters, Goyal asserted that it is

absurd to over-interpret quarterly changes. While observing that since the pandemic annual gross domestic capital formation has been rising, she said it has fluctuated in quarters. "quarter on quarter growth is normally negative in Q1 and shows the highest growth in Q4," Goyal said, adding that many other types of data, including bank credit, IPOs and capital goods imports, show a revival in private capex. Pointing out that the government capex creates opportunities for private capex in steel, cement, logistics, green infrastructure, she noted that people mistakenly think it is not happening because they expect a 2008 type boom.

FinMin approves welfare measures for LIC agents, employees

New Delhi, Sep 18:

The Finance Ministry on Monday approved a series of welfare measures, including enhancement of the gratuity limit and family pension, for the benefit of Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) agents and employees. The

them with increased financial stability. Currently, LIC agents are not eligible for renewal commission on any business completed under the old agency.

The term insurance cover for the agents has been expanded from the existing range of Rs 3,000-10,000 to Rs 25,000-1,50,000, it said, adding this enhancement in term insurance will significantly benefit the families of deceased agents, offering them a more substantial welfare benefit. With regard to LIC employees, the ministry has also approved family pension at a uniform rate of 30 per cent for the welfare of the families. Net direct tax collection rises 23.5 pc to over Rs 8.65 lakh cr; touches 47 pc of BE

New Delhi, Sep 18:



The net direct tax collection increased 23.51 per cent to over Rs 8.65 lakh crore till mid-September on higher advance tax mop-up from corporates, the Finance Ministry said on Monday.

The net collections have reached 47.45 per cent of the full-year budget estimates (BE) of Rs 18.23 lakh crore. The steady growth in tax collection was helped by a 21 per cent growth in advance tax mop-up. September 15 was the last date for paying the second instalment of advance tax for 2023-24. In a statement, the ministry said

the net direct tax collection includes corporate income tax (CIT) at Rs 4,16,217 crore and personal income tax (PIT), including Securities Transaction Tax (STT), at Rs 4,47,291 crore.

The net direct tax collection of Rs 8,65,117 crore for the current fiscal as of September 16 grew at over 23.51 per cent, the ministry said.

Ipsos survey believe formal guidelines will help increase adoption of adult immunisation

Mumbai, Sep 18:



A recently conducted survey by The Association of Physicians in India (API) and Ipsos, in 16 cities among adults aged 50 years and older, their caregivers and doctors has yielded compelling insights into why there is low adoption of adult immunisation in India. The survey shows that although 71% of adults aged 50 years are aware of adult vaccination, only 16% have taken any adult vaccines. Patients and doctors have provided significantly different reasons for low adoption. Dr. Arun Kedia, Senior Consultant Physician, Lifeworth Hospital Raipur and Chairman, The Association of Physicians of India, Raipur Chapter said, "The survey shows that there is a need to

bridge the gap between knowledge and action when it comes to adult immunisation. The first step to do this is to develop formal guidelines for adult immunisation. This will go a long way to provide the necessary structure & cue to ensure more conversations on adult immunisation take place among patients, caregivers & doctors. There is a need to make people aware of the impact of vaccine-preventable diseases, such as shingles, that are prevalent and affect adults across the country so that they

understand the importance of prevention through vaccination and do not take these conditions lightly."

A majority of doctors surveyed (90%) state that a lack of formal guidelines results in a lack of interest and adoption of vaccination by patients. Doctors also hesitate to discuss adult vaccination with their patients because they have limitations of time, and they also feel patients are less receptive to vaccination recommendations due to cost as well as prioritisation of treatment over prevention. Overall, doctors have recommended adult vaccination to only 16% of adults aged 50 years or older. Patients say that since they do not receive a firm recommendation from their doctors, they have not proactively taken adult vaccination.

Banking issues hinder growth of exports through e-commerce: GTRI report

New Delhi, Sep 18:

Banking issues like reluctance to process forex received through alternate channels and high processing fees are hindering the growth of e-commerce exports from India, and there is a need to bring mindset change to unlock the sector's potential, a report by think tank GTRI said on Monday. Unlocking India's e-commerce export potential to USD 350 billion by 2030 requires addressing banking issues that hinder growth and increase operational costs, the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI) said. "To initiate change, both the RBI and banks must shift their mindset towards treating small-value exports differently from larger ones. This

shift is essential to prevent misuse while streamlining processes. Without this fundamental change, any reforms attempted by the RBI and banks will fall short," it said. Small e-commerce businesses often face challenges because banks are not equipped to handle low-value transactions efficiently, it added. The key issues include reluctance to process forex through alternate channels, high processing fees, incorrect purpose code allocation, and limitations in the RBI's EDPMs (Export Data Processing and Monitoring System). The Reserve Bank of India tracks export payments and reconciliation through its Export Data Processing and Monitoring System.

"Banks are happy to process forex received through bank transfers but reluctant to process forex received through foreign currency cheques, payment gateways like PayPal, credit cards, Western Union, cash receipt when a buyer selects item live in the retail shop," it said.

Banks delay crediting forex received in a firm's account when payments are received through such channels, and this affects cash flow and hampers business operations, the report noted. Banks charge money multiple times at different stages for the same small-value shipment, it added. Elaborating this, it said that essential charges include charges for submitting shipping bills (Rs 80 to

Snapping its 11-day rally, the 30-share BSE Sensex fell 241.79 points or 0.36 per cent to settle at 67,596.84. During the day, it declined by 305.8 points or 0.45 per cent to a low of 67,532.83. The broader Nifty declined 59.05 points or 0.29 per cent to end at 20,133.30. Among the Sensex firms, HDFC Bank, Bharti Airtel, Infosys, UltraTech Cement, Tata Steel, Wipro, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Reliance Industries, Tech

"With the continued hike in interest rates in the US, inflation still higher than expectations, and growth rate slowing down, the appeal of gold as a safe haven and hedge against inflation is expected to continue," Santarita added.


Nortje, Magala uncertain for WC, to undergo fitness test this week

After days of bickering, AIADMK snaps ties with BJP

The bickering between allies AIADMK and BJP in Tamil Nadu over late Dravidian stalwart CN Annadurai peaked on Monday with the regional party snapping ties with the saffron organisation, saying it cannot tolerate any affront to the late Chief Minister and its other leaders. The party trained its guns against BJP TN president K Annamalai, saying he was only keen to "promote" himself and was therefore targeting late Dravidian stalwarts Annadurai, fondly addressed as Anna (elder brother), EV Ramasamy Periyar and

late AIADMK veterans MG Ramachandran (MGR) and J Jayalalithaa.

Responding, the BJP said the Dravidian party "has a problem," with its growth as well as the growing stature of a young leader like Annamalai.

The development came days after AIADMK General Secretary Edappadi K Palaniswami met BJP veteran and Union Home Minister Amit Shah in New Delhi.

Senior AIADMK leader D Jayakumar, lashing out at Annamalai for his criticism of Annadurai, said his party workers will not tolerate any insult to the late CM. While

Annamalai had made critical remarks about AIADMK leaders including the late J Jayalalithaa in the past, the party had sought that the former be restrained.

"Annamalai doesn't desire an alliance with AIADMK although BJP workers want it. Should we tolerate all this criticism of our leaders? Why should we carry you? BJP can't set foot here. Your votebank is known. You are known because of us," the former minister told reporters here while lashing out at the BJP and its state unit president.

"We can't tolerate anymore (the criticism of leaders). As far as the al-

liance is concerned, it is not there. BJP is not with AIADMK. (the matter) can be decided only during the election. This is our stand," he said.

Asked if this was his personal opinion, Jayakumar asked, "have I ever spoken to you in that capacity. I only talk what the party decides." A tall leader, Annadurai founded the DMK in 1949 and in 1967 heralded Tamil Nadu's first non-Congress government post-independence and is respected across party lines. MGR, who founded the AIADMK in 1972, named it the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam, as he had great reverence for

Annadurai.

Jayakumar said Anna was a respected scholar who ushered in TN's growth and that "we revere him.

"Our party has his (Annadurai) name. To promote himself, he belittles Periyar. He didn't budge even after condemnation. It is against coalition dharma; no AIADMK worker will accept this. 'Wilful denial of sexual relationship by spouse cruelty'

New Delhi, Sep 18 (PTI):

Wilful denial of sexual relationship by a spouse amounts to cruelty, the Delhi High Court has ruled while upholding the divorce granted to a couple whose marriage effectively subsisted for barely 35 days and failed on account of non-consummation of marriage.

A bench headed by Justice Suresh Kumar Kait, while rejecting the wife's appeal against the family court order granting divorce, said the high court has ruled in a case that "marriage without sex is an anathema" and that "there is nothing (more) fatal to marriage

than disappointment in sexual relationship".

In the present case, the court observed, the marriage was not consummated on account of resistance by the wife who also filed a police complaint claiming she was harassed for dowry about which there was "no cogent evidence". This can also be termed as cruelty, it said.

"In (a case), it (the high court has) .. observed that wilful denial of sexual relationship by a spouse amounts to cruelty, especially when the parties are newly married and this itself is a ground for grant of divorce," said the bench, also comprising Justice Neena Bansal Krishna, in



The Aditya-L1 spacecraft carries a total of seven different payloads to study the Sun, four of which will observe the light from the Sun and the remaining three will measure in situ parameters of the plasma and magnetic fields.

Aditya-L1 will be placed in a halo orbit around the Lagrangian Point 1 (L1), which is 1.5 million km from the Earth in the direction of the Sun. It will revolve around the Sun with the same relative position and hence can see the Sun continuously.

STEPS comprises six sensors, each observing in different directions and measuring supra-thermal and energetic ions ranging from 20 keV/nucleon to 5 MeV/nucleon, in addition to electrons exceeding 1 MeV.

India's G20 presidency 'exemplary': Saran

New Delhi, Sep 18 (PTI):

India's G20 presidency has been "exemplary" as it successfully navigated the global faultlines, especially between the G7 and Russia on the Ukraine crisis, and managed to garner unanimous support in bringing the African Union as a permanent member of the bloc, strategic affairs expert Pankaj Saran said on Monday.

The former deputy national security advisor (NSA) described the G20's New Delhi joint declaration as a "big achievement" as India built consensus on the Ukraine conflict without a single dissenting note when the grouping was sharply divided over it.
