Campaign for first phase of voting ends Raipur, Nov 05: The first phase of Chhattisgarh
Assembly Elections 2023 is to be held on November 7. Elections are going to be held in 20 assembly
seats in the first phase. At the same time, after 5 pm today, campaigning in the polling areas has
stopped. Now campaigning on public platforms will be prohibited 48 hours before the closing time
of voting.
As many as 223 candidates are in fray in 20 assembly constituencies in the first phase. Of them
198 are men and 25 are women. For the first phase, 40 lakh 78 thousand 681 voters will exercise their franchise. Among them are 19 lakh 93 thousand
937 male voters, 20 lakh 84 thousand 675 female vot-
ers and 69 third gender voters. A total of 5304 polling stations have been set up for the first phase of elections.
