Over the past decade, the number of foreign students, on average, pay tuition fees five times higher than their Canadian counterparts, making them a significant source of funding for educational institutions. While this financial influx is crucial, it also opens the door to exploitation. Many foreign students view college admissions in Canada as a stepping stone to permanent residency. Private colleges and immigration consultants have seized this opportunity for profit, leading to the prolif ration of makeshift institutions. The risk of fraud, exorbitant fees for visa arrangements, and the challenging living conditions Canada haven't deterred these aspirants. This phenomenon prospects in their home countries.

India has long maintained solidarity with Palestine, but this abstention raises questions about the consisten cy of our West Asia policy. It is crucial that India's foreign policy remains steadfast and unwavering, guided by human values. The UN
resolution condemned all acts of violence and called for adherence to international humanitarian laws. It emphasized the need for a just and lasting solution to the Israel-Palestine conflict. While India's intention to have Hamas specifically mentioned is understandable, a more explicit stance on the resolution itself could have been clearer. It is imperative for India to review its foreign policy decisions in line with its core values. Deviating from the established path war role as a responsible global player cannot be undermined. "India's Prudent Diplomacy" calls for a balanced approach that upholds our moral standards while maintaining our commitment to global peace. The world looks to us for leadership, and our foreign policy mus reflect the values we hold dear. In the face of international complexities, India's diplomatic choices carry significant weight.
