## BJP to name central observers today for picking new CMs

New Delhi, Dec 07 (PTI)

The BJP is likely to name central observers for electing the leaders of its legislature parties in Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan on Friday amid indications that new chief ministers may be named over the weekend.

A senior party leader said the observers for all the three states are expected to be named on Friday. They will then travel to the respective states to oversee the meetings of newly elected MLAs where the future chief ministers will be named. The observers are likely to oversee meetings of the newly elected MLAs in the three states, where they will pick their leaders. Many within the BJP see

the massive mandate it has got in the three states as a strong statement of wider popular support for its policies and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership.

He said no decision has been taken yet on the choices of the chief minister and the party will keep in mind social, regional, governance and organisational interests in picking the three CMs. Leaders from three states have been meeting the top party brass, including Home Minister Amit Shah and party president J P Nadda, but sources played down their significance, saying such meetings are routine.

"So many state leaders have been meeting our national leadership. There

can be only three chief ministers. One should not be reading too much into it," a source said, noting that many of the probables include MPs who have resigned from Parliament and are meeting national leaders as courtesy.

Union minister Narendra Singh Tomar, a seasoned BJP leader from Madhya Pradesh, and Baba Balaknath, who is from Rajasthan, met Shah on Thursday. Both quit Lok Sabha after becoming members of assemblies of their states.

Former Rajasthan chief minister Vasundhara Raje, whose meeting with many newly-elected MLAs have raised a few eyebrows, is also in the national capital. She may also meet senior

party leaders, sources said. Tomar and Union minister Prahlad Singh Patel, who comes from politically significant Other Backward Classes, are seen as possible chief ministerial choices in Madhya Pradesh along with the incumbent Shivraj Singh Chouhan. Patel and Tomar are among 12 BJP MPs who have been elected to three state assemblies and have quit their parliamentary memberships.

Chhattisgarh BJP president Arun Sao, an OBC, Union minister Gomati Sai and Lata Usendi, both of whom come from Scheduled Tribes, are seen as serious contenders for the top seat in the state due to their social background, image and relatively young profile.

## 'Indian envoy met ex-Navy men on death row in Qatar'

New Delhi, Dec 07 (PTI)

The Indian ambassador to Qatar met on December 3 eight former Indian Navy personnel who were handed death sentence by a Qatari court in October; the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Thursday. MEA spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said two hearings on the appeal against the death sentence have already taken place.

"We are closely following the matter and extending all legal and consular assistance... Our ambassador got consular access to meet all eight of them in prison on December 3," Bagchi said at a media briefing. The Indian nationals were given consular access earlier as well. The Navy veterans were on October 26 given death sentence by Qatar's Court of First Instance. India described the ruling as "deeply" shocking and vowed to explore all legal options in the case.

## Govt bans use of sugarcane juice/sugar syrup

**For ethanol making**

New Delhi, Dec 07 (PTI)

The Centre on Thursday banned the use of 'sugarcane juice and sugar syrup' for ethanol production in the 2023-24 supply year that started this month, in order to maintain adequate sugar availability for domestic consumption and to keep prices under check.

However, the government has allowed use of 'B-molasses' for ethanol production in 2023-24, a move which sugar industry bodies welcomed.

In a letter issued to all sugar mills and distillers, the Food Ministry directed them "not to use sugarcane juice /sugar syrup" for ethanol production during the 2023-24 ethanol supply year (December-

November). The directive was issued as per clause 4 and 5 of the Sugar (Control) Order 1966.

"Supply of ethanol from existing offers received by Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) from B-Heavy molasses will continue. "Will it be withdrawn after the existing tender is over? There is no clarity," he told PTI.

The decision by the ministry comes in the backdrop of estimated fall in sugar production in 2023-24 marketing year (October-September).

Welcoming the move, the National Federation of Cooperative Sugar Factories (NFCSF) Managing Director Pakash P Naiknavare said, "There is huge stock of ethanol made from B-molasses lying in the country apart from contracted quantities. The letter resolves the industry's concern."

However, there are some

ambiguity in the letter that states supply of ethanol for assembly elections over the decades to assert that the BJP has become people's most preferred choice for governance as its record of retaining power is better than the Congress and other parties.

Also, some units have been built for making ethanol from sugarcane juice and sugar syrup alone. These units will become sick if they remain unoperational, he added.

All India Sugar Trade Association (AISTA) Chairman Praful Vithalani said, "As per the order, B-molasses production shall continue against existing offer but it is not clear if it will continue for next B-molasses tender." He also said the OMCs may not come with new tender for B-molasses ethanol till sugar situation is clear.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday cited poll data for assembly elections over the decades to assert that the BJP has become people's most preferred choice for governance as its record of retaining power is better than the Congress and other parties.

Speaking at the BJP Parliamentary Party meeting, he said not any leader but "team spirit" should be credited for the party's big win in the recent assembly polls, noting that besides winning in three states, the party's strength has also grown in Telangana and Mizoram, sources said. The prime minister also asked party leaders to use the language preferred by the masses in their interaction with them. While giving an example, he said they should use

terms facing assembly elections, the Congress' success rate is only 14 per cent compared to the BJP's 59 per cent, he added.

# Illegal eateries near liquor shops demolished

**Bhilai, Dec 07:** The illegal eateries (chakhna centres) being operated near the liquor shops are being demolished by the district administration and police. These chakhna centres were allegedly run under political patronage.

These shops make a good profit by selling snacks, disposable glasses, water pouches, etc to the boozers.

After the change of rule in the state, the administration is bulldozing all these illegal chakhna centres.

District Collector and SSP, the team led by Bhilai Municipal Corporation Commissioner and Additional Superintendent of Police (City) and CSPs of Durg, Bhilai and Chhattisgarh carried out the drive against the chakhna centres. The enforcement squad of Bhilai Municipal Corporation and Police team bulldozed the illegal chakhna centres even during the rains.

The team of Municipal Corporation and Police visited the liquor shops at Potiya Chowk, Mahmara Road, Naya Para Road and

other places and bulldozed the chakhna centres. Illegal chakhna centres operating near liquor shops in the city were also demolished. The drive commenced at 18:00 hrs. The chakhna centres at Umda in Bhilai 3, Nehru Nagar in Bhilai, Country Liquor shop in Junwani and other places were bulldozed.

The cops stated that these illegal ChakhnaCenters operating near public places in the city were spoiling the atmosphere as these centres allowed the gathering of anti-social elements for the entire day till late night. With the removal of all these chakhna centres from the city, boozing in the open and hooliganism will be curbed. Action will be taken against illegal chakhna centres in all places other than the Municipal Corporation area.

On Thursday, the joint team targeted the chakhna-center built near the liquor shop located in Jawahar Nagar, Kurud and Khursipar. The shops were demolished and banned water pouches and other materials were destroyed. Many illegal chakhna cen-

# J-K cop playing cricket shot at by terrorist dies

New Delhi, Dec 07 (PTI):

An inspector of the Jammu and Kashmir Police, who was critically injured in a terrorist attack in October, died at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) here on Thursday, officials said. Inspector Masroor Wani was on life support. He was shifted from Srinagar's Sher-e-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences to AIIMS-Delhi on Wednesday, the officials said.

Son of a retired police sub-inspector, Wani was playing cricket at the Eidgah ground when the lone terrorist fired three shots in the eye, abdomen and neck from close range on October 29, a Sunday when a number of youngsters were playing the game. Wani's teammates ran after the terrorist but he fired in the air and fled.

Wani was rushed to a hospital in Soura where he was undergoing treatment.

However, he was airlifted and brought to AIIMS Delhi on Wednesday and was on life support. Besides his wife, he is survived by his father and a brother. Wani's death has left a deep sense of loss among his colleagues and loved ones, said Director General of



## 'My child became orphan before being born'

**Srinagar:** "My child became an orphan even before being born," said the inconsolable wife of Inspector Masroor Ahmed Wani, who died in Delhi on Thursday 39 days after he suffered critical wounds in a terrorist attack while he was playing cricket in Srinagar. Expecting her first child, she was overwhelmed with grief after getting the tragic news. It was a sombre atmosphere in the congested colony of Eidgah in the downtown of this city as a multitude of people gathered at the residence of Wani. Wani, aged 34, was shot by a Lashkar-e-Taiba terrorist on October 29 while he was playing cricket with his friends at Eidgah.

The scene was heart-wrenching at his residence, where mourners went to offer their condolences to his grieving wife and family. According to his uncle Ghulam Mohammad Wani, Wani's health had deteriorated due to a severe chest infection. Initially, he was admitted to Soura Hospital in Srinagar, but was later shifted to Paras Hospital for further treatment from where he was flown to AIIMS in Delhi on Wednesday. Remembered as an amiable and compassionate individual, he was always expressed his willingness to assist others. Lamenting the tragic loss, relative Ghulam Nabi Kazagzai said, "Masroor was very frank. He would always help people. We are very depressed. He was crazy about cricket, and cricket took his life away."

## Reconsider 'tribal' prefix in university names: BJP MP

central tribal university is being established but the budget of existing good universities should not be reduced," the Samajwadi Party MP said.

## Paddy procurement for Kharif crops put on hold



Kurud, Dec 07:

Paddy procurement for Kharif crop, which started from November 1, was put on hold due to the havoc of Cyclone Michaug. Due to deteriorating weather, Delhi-like cold and intermittent heavy and slow rains, dozens of cooperative societies and paddy procurement centers of Kurud have been closed for the last two days and paddy procurement has come to a halt, due to which, on the one hand, farmers are seen to be deeply worried about the loss of their crops and on the other hand, about the possibility of being able to sell their crops or not.

Due to light showers in Kurud area on Tuesday morning, paddy procurement remained closed in all the 9 societies of the area, but due to bad weather, paddy was not purchased in the society even on Tuesday and Wednesday. On Tuesday, a token was issued for the purchase of 1607 quintals of paddy from 42 farmers in the Large Agricultural Credit Committee of Kurud on 5th December.



On December 6, a token was issued to purchase 1649 quintals of paddy from 43 farmers, but due to the impact of Cyclone Michaug, paddy purchase is closed. Paddy is purchased under the open sky.

Due to rain, paddy was not purchased in Kurud, Bagaud, Kuhkuha, Charra, Gadadih, Katalbod, Mandraud, Sivanikala, Bhathagaon Society under District Cooperative Central Bank Maryadit Raipur branch Kurud, and to protect from rain, the sacks of paddy purchased in the society have been kept safe by covering them with tarpaulin.

Circular Agricultural Credit Cooperative Society Kurud Manager TR Banskar said that till now 16884.40 quintals of paddy have been purchased, out of which 11820 quintals of paddy has been lifted and 5060 quintals have been covered with tarpaulin. And it has been secured that the paddy procurement which was disrupted for two days due to weather will be started again with double the speed as soon as the season opens.

# Rishi Sunak's leadership in turmoil over Rwanda deportation policy

London, Dec 07 (PTI):

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's leadership of the governing Conservative Party is facing turmoil on Thursday after a bruising Cabinet resignation and open attacks by backbenchers over his government's controversial policy to deport illegal migrants to Rwanda.

The 43-year-old British Indian prime minister is caught in the middle of two strands within his party, one on the extreme right voiced by sacked home secretary Suella Braverman calling for an extreme agenda to override legal challenges and the other more centrist view of the UK not being seen to breach its human rights obligations. The clash came to a head on Wednesday night when



Robert Jenrick, someone seen as a Sunak ally, resigned as his Immigration Minister, declaring that his boss' new Safety of Rwanda Bill designed to override a Supreme Court block "does not go far enough". "I cannot continue in my position when I have such strong disagreements with the direction of the government's policy on immigration," wrote Jenrick in his resignation

letter to Sunak. Describing the small boat crossings across the English Channel by illegal migrants as doing "untold damage" to the country, Jenrick insisted that the government needed to get much tougher against "highly contested interpretations of international law". "I have therefore consistently advocated for a clear piece of legislation that severely limits the op-

portunities for domestic and foreign courts to block or undermine the effectiveness of the policy. A bill of the kind you are proposing is a triumph of hope over experience," he added.

In his reply letter, Sunak countered by saying that the new bill would be "the toughest piece of illegal migration legislation ever put forward by a UK government" and that his former Cabinet ally's opposition to it was "based on a fundamental misunderstanding of the situation".

"If we were to oust the courts entirely, we would collapse the entire scheme. The Rwandan government has been clear that they would not accept the UK basing this scheme on legislation that could be considered in breach of our international law obligations."

## Cash-strapped Pakistan secures USD 658 ADB package

Islamabad, Dec 07 (PTI):

Management and Sustainability Mission met with Finance Minister Akhtar to review the debt management of the country, reported the Express Tribune newspaper.

## Police in Canada evacuate Hindi moviegoers at three theatres

### After unknown substance sprayed into air

Toronto, Dec 07 (PTI):

Several moviegoers in three different Greater Toronto Area regions in Canada were evacuated and some were treated for exposure to an unknown substance sprayed by masked men in theatres playing Hindi movies earlier this week, according to police and media reports.

One such incident happened around 9:20 p.m. on Tuesday at a cinema complex in Vaughan, York Regional Police said in a

statement on Wednesday. Numerous movie-goers started coughing after two men in masks and hoods sprayed an "unknown, aerosol-based, irritating substance into the air" in a theatre, the police said.

Around 200 people were inside when a Hindi film was playing at the time, according to police.

Several people were treated for exposure to the substance and the theatre had to be evacuated, the police said. No serious injuries were reported. The suspects however fled before the police arrived, investigators said.

Toronto police said officers similarly got a call on Tuesday night about someone setting off a "stink bomb" in a theatre at Scarborough Town Centre.

York police said they were liaising with both Peel and Toronto police about similar incidents that happened this week, CBC News reported.

"Coincidentally, they took place all within less than three hours on the same evening," a York police officer said on Wednesday.

"So we are certainly looking into the possibility that these incidents are linked," Peel police confirmed in a statement that officers were called to a theatre in Brampton on Tuesday following re-

ports of some sort of substance sprayed on the premises.

Officers evacuated the building and there were no reports of any serious injuries, it said.

No arrests have been made yet, the police said.

"It is unknown at this time if any other incidents are connected but our investigators are aware of those incidents that took place in York Region and Toronto," the statement said.

### Hottest Decade's Wake-Up Call

The World Meteorological Organization (WMO) has issued a dire warning: each decade since the 1990s has been hotter than the previous one, with the years 2011 to 2020 marking the hottest on record. This isn't just another statistic; it's a resounding alarm bell, a clarion call for collective action. The culprit behind this relentless surge in temperatures is the rising concentration of greenhouse gases, a grim reminder of our unchecked industrialization and dependence on fossil fuels. These gases have not only driven land and ocean temperatures to record highs but have also set in motion a cascade of consequences, from ice melting at an alarming rate to the inexorable rise of sea levels. Glaciers around the world are thinning by an average of one meter per year, a stark testament to the relentless heat engulfing our planet. The Antarctic continental ice sheet, a giant reservoir of freshwater, has lost nearly 75 percent more ice between 2011 and 2020 than it did in the preceding decade. The implications are staggering. Weather and climate-related events have accounted for nearly 94 percent of recorded disaster-induced displacement over the last decade. Heatwaves, relentless and unforgiving, have claimed the highest number of casualties, while the wrath of tropical cyclones has inflicted the most extensive economic damage. Amidst these sobering revelations, the WMO, a specialized agency of the United Nations, has issued a resounding call to action. Presented at the UN Climate Change Conference, COP28, the report issues an urgent plea to prioritize one overriding imperative: the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions. It's a clarion call that acknowledges the critical crossroads at which we stand. Yet, as noble as these goals may be, they are undeniably arduous. A rapid phase-out of fossil fuels, the very lifeblood of our industrialized world, presents challenges and complexities that cannot be resolved overnight. The exponential increase in climate finance, while necessary, will require time and unwavering commitment from the global community. But we must not falter. The hottest decade on record is not just a reflection of our past; it's a harbinger of our future. It's a stark reminder that the consequences of inaction are dire, and they will be borne by generations to come. Climate change, with its far-reaching impacts, respects neither borders nor political affiliations. In the face of this mounting crisis, we have a moral obligation to rise above our differences and act collectively. We must heed the call for more ambitious climate action, pushing the boundaries of what we once deemed possible. We owe it to ourselves, to future generations, and to the fragile ecosystems that sustain life on Earth. Let us not be remembered as the generation that witnessed the hottest decade but as the one that rose to the occasion, forging a path toward a more sustainable and resilient future for all. The clock is ticking, and the world is watching. The question is, will we rise to meet the challenge?

## Time to Introspect

### Challenges and Opportunities for INDIA Bloc

In the aftermath of recent assembly elections, it has become evident that there is a pressing need for introspection among the political parties vying against the ruling party at the Centre. The performance of a national party, the AAP, which recently acquired national status, raises crucial questions. The party contested 215 assembly seats, yet it forfeited its security deposit in all of them, receiving fewer votes than those polled for NOTA. This raises a significant point for reflection for all political parties in the world's largest democracy. The Cong, too, must take note of the BJP's journey from a two-member party to a formidable 302-member presence in the Lok Sabha. Political landscapes are known to witness such fluctuations, and the recent elections have certainly bruised the opposition, particularly the Congress. The defeat has left party leaders, workers, and supporters pondering the effectiveness of their campaign strategies and leadership choices. However, instead of embracing introspection, there is a likelihood that the party may resort to pandemonium, walkouts, slogans, and disruptions within the parliament. Such an approach risks further impacting the morale of Congress members, possibly leading to internal divisions and factionalism. Post-elections, it has become somewhat customary to attribute defeats to Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs), an unhealthy and unconvincing logic. In light of the surprising election outcomes, Prime Minister Modi has urged opposition MPs not to vent their anger in parliament. His call for a dignified and constructive approach to parliamentary proceedings underscores the importance of maintaining decorum and focusing on the nation's priorities. It is crucial for all political parties, including the BJP and Congress, to prioritize the nation's welfare over partisan interests. Rather than adopting a confrontational stance, the assembly election results should serve as a catalyst for introspection, reform, and unity. The upcoming session of Parliament provides the Congress with an opportunity to reassess its strategy to connect with the masses and articulate a clear vision for the future. It is a chance to demonstrate resilience and adaptability in the face of adversity. The somewhat subdued Congress is now recalibrating its course of action and considering its relationship with partners in the INDIA bloc. The postponement of the December 6 meeting to December 17 signifies this introspective phase. However, the ongoing exchange of unpleasant statements among various political leaders exposes the fragile foundation of the bloc, raising concerns about its cohesion. Rahul Gandhi's limited public statements following the results underscore the perception of him as a part-time leader. Another crucial takeaway from these elections is that voters cannot be swayed solely by freebies. Leaders within the INDIA bloc should refrain from making religious statements that hurt the sentiments of any community, as these controversies can be detrimental to the bloc's unity. At the top of the government's legislative agenda for the upcoming session are key bills aimed at replacing colonial-era criminal laws. The BJP's hat-trick victories in three Hindi heartland states have triggered a sense of reevaluation among the Congress' partners. The INDIA bloc must adopt a give-and-take policy and not remain inflexible on seat-sharing among its various parties. Dominance struggles within the bloc can undermine its collective efforts, especially if the parties believe that the present government is undermining the federal structure and misusing institutions like the ED, CBI, and income tax offices. The message from the voters is unequivocal: they cannot be taken for granted. The time for introspection is now, and it is essential for all political players to heed this call and prioritize the interests of the nation above all else.

# All sectors contributes significantly to high GDP growth: FM Sitharaman

New Delhi, Dec 07:



Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Thursday said India continues to maintain the momentum of the fastest-growing major economy, with all sectors contributing significantly in economic activities. Replying to a short-duration discussion on the state of the economy in the Rajya Sabha, the minister also highlighted the various achievements of the Modi government since May 2014.

"The second quarter growth was very high, it is the highest in the world. We continuously maintain that momentum of being the fastest-growing economy," Sitharaman said. She further said that in just

the last eight years, India has become the fifth largest economy from the 10th in 2014. "The activi-

ties are all across the economy. It's not as if one sector is doing well... All sectors are growing and growing significantly for us to notice it," she said. She emphasised that the manufacturing sector is also contributing significantly to the economy on the back of measures taken by the government, including the Make-In-India programme and production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme.

India is the second most sought-after manufacturing destination in world, she added. The finance minister further informed the House that direct tax collection grew by 21.8 pc this year till November 9 and monthly GST collections have stabilised at Rs 1.6 lakh crore in a sign of

economic growth. Dismissing assertions on the employment front, Sitharaman said the unemployment rate has declined to 10 per cent from 17.8 per cent in 2017-18. She further said 13.5 crore people have come out of 'multi-dimensional' poverty in the last five years. Several Opposition members also raised concern over the rising prices in the country.

To this, the minister replied that the government has taken "quite a few" measures to check inflation. The retail inflation based on the consumer price index (CPI) had touched a high of 7.8 per cent in April 2022. However, now it has been close to the Reserve Bank's target of 4 per cent.

## No 'spectacular announcement' likely in February 1 budget, says finance minister

New Delhi, Dec 07:

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Thursday said the budget to be presented on February 1, 2024 would not have any "spectacular announcement" as it would be a vote on account in run up to the general elections. "It is a matter of truth that February 1, 2024 budget that will be announced will just be a vote on account because we will be in an election mode. So the budget that the government presents will just be to meet the expenditure of the government till a new government comes to play," she said. Speaking at the CII Global Economic Policy Forum, Sitharaman said the country would be

preparing for the Lok Sabha elections which are due in the summer of 2024. Hence the February 1 budget, following the British tradition, is called vote on account. "No spectacular announcements come in that time (in vote on account). So you will have to wait till after new government comes in and presents next full Budget in July 2024," Sitharaman said. On February 1, 2024, Sitharaman will present an interim budget for 2024-25 fiscal, beginning April 1, 2024, in the Lok Sabha. The interim budget which is also known as a vote on account will allow the incumbent government to undertake expenditures till a new government is formed after general elections.

## India needs high economic growth to invest in energy transition: CEA

New Delhi, Dec 07:

India requires high economic growth to invest in energy transition, Chief Economic Advisor (CEA) V Anantha Nageswaran said, observing that the country needs time to move away from coal to renewable energy. Addressing an event here, India is well ahead of other G20 countries in meeting the Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) target. "(India) needs high economic growth to invest in energy transition... We basically need the time to move away from coal towards other fossil fuels, and later on towards other renewable energy," he said. NDCs are national action

plans adopted by various countries to limit the earth's average temperature rise to well below two degrees Celsius and preferably to 1.5 degrees Celsius compared to the pre-industrial (19850-1900) levels. "You will have to use coal for quite some time," he said.

## RBI unlikely to cut rates before June: Deutsche Bank

Mumbai, Dec 07:

The Reserve Bank-led Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) is unlikely to tweak repo rates till June next year, according to a foreign brokerage report. The bi-monthly MPC meeting started on Wednesday and the decision on rates will be announced on Friday. According to the report by Deutsche Bank, the interest rate cycle appears to have peaked and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is unlikely to go for further hikes, unless absolutely necessary. The rate is likely to be cut in June, it said. The RBI hiked the repo rate last on February 23, when it was raised to 6.5 per cent. With the RBI continuing to maintain tight liquidity, short-term rates are hovering around 6.85-6.9 per cent, which is 35-40 bps higher than the repo rate.



Forex traders said the rupee traded in a narrow range as the support from easing crude oil prices was negated by strong dollar demand from importers. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 83.36 and touched a low of 83.37 against the greenback. It finally settled at 83.36 (provisional) against the dollar, down by 4 paise from its previous close. On Wednesday, the rupee appreciated by 5 paise and settled at 83.32 against the greenback. "Indian rupee traded on a flat note on Thursday. A positive US Dollar and weak domestic markets weighed on the rupee. However, weak crude oil prices and FII inflows supported the rupee at lower levels," said Anuj Choudhary - Research Analyst at Sharehan by BNP Paribas. The rupee is expected to trade with a slight negative bias on positive tone in the US Dollar and risk aversion in global markets, Choudhary added.

"I was getting fed up with it so it was time to put in a performance and get back to the player that I know I am," he added.

Ahead of the second ODI Buttler had been dismissed for five single digit scores in eight outings.

But the match-winning knock on Wednesday made him the fifth England batsman to cross the 5,000-run

mark in ODIs. "Really pleasing. I've been playing for a while now so it's great when you get to those milestones after playing for a long period of time. It's been a frustrating time recently," Buttler had taken over the reins as white-ball skipper from World Cup-winning captain Eoin

Morgan last year. Under his leadership, England won the T20 World Cup last year. However, defending champions England made an embarrassing early exit from the ODI World Cup last month, finishing seventh to just qualify for the 2025 Champions Trophy.

## We should have varied pace more, fielded better: Shreyanka Patil

"The wicket was amazing to bat on, it was not easy (to bowl), but I think we did a pretty decent job. We will have a discussion as to what can be improved. Fielding could have been better, but we will bounce back stronger," she said. The 21-

year-old said it was difficult for her to get sleep after knowing that she would make her debut against England.

"I was very happy that I got the cap. I was a bit excited as well as nervous, I did not get any sleep (the previous night) but after one or two balls I was fine. (It felt like) I belong here," she said.

Patil said the inaugural Women's Premier League has helped her learn the tricks of playing under

lights with the white ball. "It (WPL) did help me personally playing against Harry di (Harmapreet Kaur), Smriti Mandhana, Jemimah (Rodrigues)," she said.

"I think that was the start for me and to carry the momentum here was a good achievement. It did help me to adjust under lights, bowling under pressure. Now I feel like this is where I belong and I am enjoying it."

Patil said she did scenario-based practice before the series in Bangalore which proved beneficial for her. # 'Chh'garh records highest rate of accidental deaths'

Raipur, Dec 07:

Chhattisgarh recorded the highest rate of accidental deaths at 56.4 and was placed third in rate of suicides among states in the country in 2022, according to the latest National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) data.

As per the NCRB's annual report, among the 28 states, the highest rate of accidental deaths was reported from Chhattisgarh (56.4) followed by Haryana (53.5) and Maharashtra (53.0) against the national average of 31.2. However, two Union Territories -- Ladakh and Puducherry -- reported rate of accidental deaths at 78.7 and 65.7, respectively, and were

ahead of Chhattisgarh. There are eight UTs in the country.

Nineteen out of 36 states/UTs have reported higher rates of 'accidental deaths' as compared to all- India average of 31.2 deaths per one lakh of population, said the report.

Accidental deaths have been grouped into two broad categories -- 'Deaths due to Forces of Nature', including lightning, heat/sun stroke, floor, landslide etc, and 'Deaths due to Other Causes', including traffic accidents, killed by animals, consumption of spurious liquor and factory mishaps, among others.

Chhattisgarh reported 16,893 accidental deaths in 2022, including 248 due to 'forces of nature' and 16,645 due to 'other causes', according to the data published by NCRB, which functions under the Union home ministry.

In 2021, the state had recorded 19,265 accidental deaths, including 244 due to 'forces of nature' and 19,012 due to 'other causes', which declined by 12.3 per cent in 2022.

Among the total 4,15,306 accidental deaths due to 'other causes' in the country in 2022, as many as 507 incidents of consumption of illicit/spurious liquor caused 617 deaths, it said.

States where various such deaths were reported included Bihar (134 deaths) followed by

Karnataka (98), Punjab (90), Chhattisgarh (60), Jharkhand (55) and Uttar Pradesh (50 deaths), said the report.

Similarly, rate of suicides in Chhattisgarh was 28.2, the third highest after Sikkim (43.1) and Kerala (28.5), among 28 states in 2022. All-India rate of suicides (ie the number of suicides per one lakh population) was 12.4 last year, the report said. Andaman & Nicobar Islands (42.8) and Puducherry (29.7) are among UTs which are ahead of Chhattisgarh in rate of suicides.

Chhattisgarh reported 8,446 suicides in 2022 which was 7.9 per cent more than the number recorded in 2021 at 7,828.
