Poll process

New Delhi: The Nagaland government has told the Supreme Court that the election process for urban local bodies in the state will be completed by April 30. In November, the Nagaland Assembly passed a bill reserving 33 per cent seats in urban local bodies for women. Urban local body elections in the state were last held in 2004. A bench of Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul and Justice Sudhanshu Dhulia took note of an affidavit filed by the Nagaland chief secretary earlier this month that said the rules will be framed within a month - before January 8.

Party leader

New Delhi: The Aam Aadmi Party has appointed its MP Raghav Chadha as the leader of the party in Rajya Sabha in place of Sanjay Singh, sources said. In a letter to the Rajya Sabha Chairman, the AAP party leadership has said that in the absence of Sanjay Singh, who has "health issues", Raghav Chadha will henceforth be the party's leader in the upper house.

Arrested

Seraikela: A man wanted in at least 27 criminal cases was arrested along with his three aides in Jharkhand's Seraikela-Kharswan district on Saturday, police said. Acting on a tip-off, Sagar Lohar (41) and his three aides -- Raju Lohar (40), Bablu Das (40), and Bholu Kumar (42) -- were arrested from different parts of the district, Superintendent of Police Bimal Kumar said.

Suicide

Mumbai: A constable of the Central Industrial Security Force allegedly shot himself dead using his service weapon inside his cabin at the Jai Centre in BKC on Saturday, a Mumbai Police official said. The constable took the extreme step when he was alone in the security cabin in the morning hours, the official said, adding that some family issues might be the trigger behind the incident.

Decouple

Kolkata: Two coaches of a Mumbai-bound train got decoupled near Uluberia station in West Bengal on Friday evening, officials said. There is no report of any injury as the train was not moving at a high speed, they said. The two coaches of the 12810 Howrah-Mumbai Mail got decoupled around 9.30 pm in Birshibpur area.

Farmer ends life over debt burden

Narayanpur, Dec 16:

What victim's son said...

A 55-year-old farmer allegedly committed suicide in a village in tribal-dominated Narayanpur district, officials said on Saturday.

His family members and locals claimed he was upset due to debt burden and poor crop yield.

Heeru Badhai of Kukdajhor village consumed pesticide at his farm on December 12 and died in the district hospital in Narayanpur the next day, a police official here said.

No suicide note was found at the spot and a probe is underway after registering of an accidental death report, he added. Yogeshwar Badhai, the deceased's son, told PTI his family own around 9 acres

Zila Sahkari Bank (district cooperative bank) for the ongoing Kharif crop season. "A notice was received recently to clear the loan worth Rs 1.24 lakh (including the interest) and father was worried. Crop production was also not good this year, which added to his worry," he said. Other residents said the deceased was living in the village of his in-laws and had taken the loan in the name of his mother-in-law.

Terming the incident as tragic, Chhattisgarh Congress chief Deepak Baij claimed the BJP, which won the recent Assembly polls, had promised to waive farm loans of upto Rs 2 lakh but were now backtracking on it. However, Narayanpur BJP MLA Kedar Kashyap said his party had not promised farm loan waiver in its Assembly poll manifesto. The man who has committed suicide didn't own land and investigation is underway to ascertain why he took this extreme step, Kashyap said.

"My father used to express concern about the loan repayment. He was also worried about raising funds for my wedding. On the day of incident, father was alone at the farm while we had returned home to have our meals.

On finding him vomiting we rushed him to the hospital where he died the next day," Yogeshwar said.

Dismissed RPF man's bail rejected

Was in well settled position, mind: Court

Mumbai, Dec 16 (PTI): A court here on Saturday denied bail to dismissed Railway Protection Force (RPF) constable Chetansinh Chaudhary, accused of shooting dead his senior colleague and three passengers on a moving train in July this year, by stating he was in a "well settled position and mind" at the time of crime. His bail was rejected by Additional Sessions Judge (Dindoshi Court) AZ Khan who held the offence was serious. Chaudhary not only killed his senior but also three others of a "particular community" by making them specific targets, the court said. The accused uttered words which clearly show "he was in a well settled position and mind to commit murder of people belonging to a specific community", the court said while rejecting his bail plea.

Kanker, Dec 16: Four Naxalites, who were allegedly involved in the December 14 blast in Partapur area of Kanker district in which a Border Security Force (BSF) jawan was killed, were arrested on Saturday, police said.

They were nabbed in a forest area in Partapur on Saturday morning, a senior police official said.

Those held were identified as Mukund Narwas (45), Jaggu Ram Anchla (45), Arjun Potai (26) and Dasrath Dugga (35). All of them were allegedly active as Jan militia members of Maoists and natives of Partapur village, he said. On Thursday, Naxalites triggered a



blast near Sadaktola village under Partapur police station limits when a joint team of BSF and District Force was out on patrolling. Head Constable Akhilesh Kumar Rai (45) of the BSF sustained injuries in the explosion and later succumbed to injuries during treatment, he said.

Maha bureaucrat's son runs car over girlfriend, booked

Thane, Dec 15 (PTI): A 26-year-old woman was seriously injured after her boyfriend, who is the son of a senior bureaucrat in Maharashtra, allegedly tried to mow her down with his car near a hotel in Thane city, police said on Friday.

The incident occurred on December 11 and the police registered a case against accused Ashwajit Gaikwad and two others under Indian Penal Code (IPC) sections 323 (voluntarily causing hurt), 279 (rash driving), 504 (intentional insult with intent to provoke breach of the peace) and others at the Kasarvadavali police station. "The incident took place around 4.30 am on Monday near a hotel on Ghodbunder Road, where the woman had gone to meet Gaikwad. An argument broke out between the two. Later, when the

victim collected her belongings from his car and started leaving, the one who was driving the vehicle tried to mow her down, due to which she fell down and suffered serious injuries," a police official said.

The victim later put out several social media posts presenting her version of events. She claimed that doctors had to insert a rod in her right leg, which was severely injured. "My right leg is broken and I had to undergo surgery, had to put a rod in my right leg. I will be bedridden for a minimum 3-4 months and after that, I will have to take support to walk for another 6 months," she told the police.

PM to inaugurate Kashi Tamil Sangamam today

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the second edition of the Kashi Tamil Sangamam at his parliamentary constituency Varanasi's 'Namo Ghat' on Sunday and flag off the Kanyakumari-Varanasi Tamil Sangamam train, according to officials here. The cultural festival will be held from December 17 to 30. The first batch of the Tamil delegation departed from Chennai on December 15. Nearly 1,400 people (seven groups of 200 each) from varied walks of life are expected to be travelling from different parts of Tamil Nadu, they said. During their stay in Kashi, as per their tour itinerary, they will also visit Prayagraj and Ayodhya, the official said.

Man arrested for smuggling liquor from MP

Bhilai, Dec 16: Police arrested a man on charges of smuggling liquor from Madhya Pradesh. 15 crates of Goa whiskey and Bolero vehicle (CG-07/AU/8717) used in the incident were seized from the possession of the accused. The second accused managed to escape. It was a joint action of Anti-Crime and Cyber Unit Durg and Police Station Dhamdha.

Senior Superintendent of Police (Durg) Ram Gopal Garg had instructed his subordinates to run a campaign against illegal drug dealers in the district, trace the drug dealers and take action against them.

Police succeeded in arresting the driver Ramchandra Rajbhar. On checking the Bolero, a total of 15 crates of Goa Whiskey were found.

The accused Ramchandra Rajbhar alias Chhotu (45) son of Dhaniram Rajbhar, a resident of village Ashapar, Police Station Jalalpur, district Ambedkar Nagar, Uttar Pradesh was booked under the provisions mentioned in section 34 (2) of Excise Act and further action is being taken by Dhamdha Police Station.

The absconding accused is identified as Ramhit Jaiswal, a resident of behind Trimurti Temple, Shastri Nagar; Sakarta Chowk, Police Station Vaishali Nagar, District Durg. Ikred over the pendency of wage settlement of Bhilai Steel Plant employees even after 7 years, the Joint Trade Unions staged an aggressive demonstration at Equipment Square and appealed to the workers to gear up for a strike on 29th and 30th January.

Hundreds of office bearers and representatives of INTUC, AITUC, CITU, HMS, AICCTU, LOIMU, Ispat Shramik Manch and Steel

workers Union gathered at Equipment Square on Saturday morning and raised slogans against the dictatorial attitude of the SAIL management.

During this demonstration, the top leaders of all the unions addressed the employees.

The union leaders said that SAIL management has money to give to the

officers but now it does not have money for the employees.

No decision has been taken on 39 months arrears, house rent allowance and night shift allowance of SAIL employees. SAIL management has caused huge loss to the employees by arbitrarily imposing a ceiling on gratuity.

Despite the opposition of the central union leaders, only Rs 23000 bonus was arbitrarily credited to the accounts of SAIL employees. Despite the MoU being in place, even after 2 years, the wage agreement has not been finalised and the SAIL management is no longer even holding

A large number of employees also participated in the demonstration. Union leaders appealed to all the employees to join the strike on 29th and 30th January. Office bearers of the joint trade unions are going to contact all the organizations and federations of the Plant and appeal to join this strike.

- 17.02 lakh MT paddy lifted by millers for custom milling

Raipur, Dec 16: The drive to procure paddy at support price in the Kharif marketing year 2023-24 is underway from November 1, 2023. In the last one and a half month, 35 lakh 57 thousand 374 lakh metric tonnes of paddy has been procured from 7 lakh 86 thousand 463 registered farmers of the state.

Keeping in mind the con-

venience of farmers, 2 thousand 739 paddy procurement centers have been created this year. A total of Rs 7 thousand 313.02 crore has been released by MARKFED to Apex Bank for payment to farmers in lieu of paddy procurement. Instructions have been given to strengthen all the necessary arrangements in paddy procurement centres. Food department officials have also been told to continuously inspect the paddy procurement arrangements.

DO has been issued for lifting of 27.43 lakh metric tonnes of paddy, against which 17.02 lakh metric tonnes of paddy has been lifted by the millers.

The state government has set a target of procuring 130 lakh metric tonnes of paddy from the farmers of the state this year. As many as 26.86 lakh farmers of the state have registered to sell paddy in ongoing Kharif marketing year. The total registered area in this is 33.15 lakh hectares, while 2.59 lakh new farmers have registered. Former women militants are being trained in making sanitary napkins by the Bodoland Territorial Region (BTR) administration, with commercial production of a unit expected to commence soon.

"Rehabilitation of former militants is very important. We have tried to find out their areas of interest and expertise, and then train and engage

them accordingly," Pramod Boro, chief executive member of BTR, said here on Saturday.

He said that besides the financial assistance provided to surrendered militants by the central and state governments, the BTR is also helping them in finding employment.

"We have launched several flagship programmes. Among them is forming cooperatives of former militants and helping them etch out livelihoods," the BTR chief said.

The programme has been named 'Fin Rwdwmkhang' (Mission Blossom Again).

"From rice mills to sanitary pad-making units, different cooperatives are coming up under it," Boro added.

Sharing details of the Mission, Binual Warry, general secretary of its governing body, told PTI that a target has been set to establish 30 cooperatives, involving mostly former militants.

"We hope to start production within a couple of months," Warry, a former top militant of a now-disbanded faction of the National Democratic Front of Bodoland (NDFB), said.

Five of the sanctioned schemes are for setting up rice mills, one for a dairy processing unit and another for a stevia processing unit.

"This is something that we all know by now. There is no indication that they are stopping at it. But there is also no stopping at our level. We are resolutely fighting it and doing so very intelligently, scientifically and in a blatant and systematic manner," the DGP asserted.

He, however, made it

clear that those on the right side of the law need not fear as the government wants to have a lasting peace in the region. "Once there is security and peace, there will be education, roads, health, electricity, economic activities," Swain added. Swain presided over a public grievance redressal programme at the Police Headquarters (PHQ) here. This was the fourth event in a series of such programmes launched by the DGP. Asked what are police doing about foiling terror attacks, the DGP said the progress has to be seen in terms of the overall decline. "The progress is to be seen not in terms of episodes or incidents, but in terms of the overall decline," he said, adding, "We have a plan and I think the plan is in motion."

He said the government, at the highest level, has been saying plans to dismantle and degrade the terror ecosystem, which includes people who recruit youngsters into terror ranks, provide arms and ammunition to them, help in infiltration, provide logistics support and identify targets for terrorists, are afoot.

"All of that is part of the ecosystem. So we are constantly at work. People are being identified. For example, we have made some progress in identifying some (terrorist) associates who had planned some recent incidents. It is an ongoing exercise. As I was saying a little while ago, to be able to completely silence the last gun, it will take some time," Swain said.

Asked if Pakistan will try to push more terrorists into the valley before the snow blocks passages, he said the neighbouring country always tries to push in terrorists.

"This is something that we all know by now. There is no indication that they are stopping at it. But there is also no stopping at our level. We are resolutely fighting it and doing so very intelligently, scientifically and in a blatant and systematic manner," the DGP asserted.

Cash-strapped Sri Lanka's economy records positive growth for the first time since economic crisis

Colombo, Dec 16 (PTI):

Sri Lanka's bankrupt economy has recorded a positive growth for the first time since the economic crisis hit the island nation, according to official data.

"The year-on-year GDP growth rate for the third quarter has been reported as 1.6 per cent of positive growth rate," the Department of Census and Statistics (DCS) said in a press release on Friday.

Sri Lanka had recorded a minus 8 per cent growth when it declared bankruptcy in April 2022. The

country's economy continued to be in the negative from the fourth quarter of 2021.

The International Monetary Fund (IMF), which released the second tranche of its USD 2.9 billion bailout earlier this week, has said that Sri Lanka's overall growth for 2023 would remain negative.

However, the country's economy in 2024 is expected to grow with a positive one plus growth, it said.

Sri Lanka is currently going through a strict IMF based reform regime. President Ranil Wickremesinghe, who is

also the finance minister, insists on reforms despite strong criticism from the opposition.

The reforms, coupled with a high cost of living, are expected to play a significant role in the island's election year in 2024.

Wickremesinghe told Parliament this week that reforms were essential, despite the hardships faced by the public.

Sri Lanka, which defaulted on its sovereign debt, is still in negotiations with external creditors for concessions on repayments to achieve sustainability, a key component of the IMF bailout.

Iran is saying it has executed an Israeli Mossad spy in the country's southeast, state TV reported Saturday.

The report said the spy was linked to foreign intelligence services, including Mossad, and charged with involvement in releasing classified information. The judiciary body executed the person in a prison in Zahedan, the capital of the southeastern province of Sistan and Baluchestan.

The report did not identify the person.

In April 2022, Iranian intelligence officers arrested three people they said belonged to a group linked to Mossad. It is not clear if the executed person was

Washington, Dec 16 (AP):

The US-China relationship will be defined by strategic competition in the coming decades but must involve engagement when the interests of the two countries align, the US ambassador to China has said, one month after President Joe Biden met with Chinese President Xi Jinping to stabilise the fraught relations.

Nicholas Burns said the US and China are "vying for global power as well as regional power" as they compete militarily, politically and economically.

"I think we are systematic rivals, if you think about our national security and economic and political interests around the world," Burns said on Friday at the Brookings Institution, a

Pakistan's Lahore city receives first artificial rain to combat smog

Lahore, Dec 16 (PTI):

Lahore, one of the world's most polluted cities, on Saturday received its first artificial rain, following an experiment conducted by Pakistan's Punjab government with the help of the UAE to combat smog.

Addressing a press conference here, the Punjab Caretaker Chief Minister Mohsin Naqvi said that the experiment was conducted in 10 areas of Lahore and it was successful.

"Around 10 per cent of areas in Lahore received rainfall today due to cloud seeding experiments," he said, adding that at least 48 flares were deployed for cloud seeding.

"Light showers were

witnessed in the 10 areas of 15 km radius. The results of the experiment are being further gauged," he said.

"Not a single penny was spent for the artificial rain. To combat smog, the government is ready to take any measure," the chief minister said. He also thanked the UAE government's help in initiating the artificial rain, also known as cloud seeding, to wash away pollutants in the air in the provincial capital.

Last month, local media reported that the Punjab province is planning to carry out an artificial rain experiment with China's help in Lahore, a project estimated to cost Rs 350 million in the cash-strapped country.

Israeli military says it mistakenly killed 3 Israeli hostages in Gaza



Ramallah, Dec 16 (AP):

The Israeli military on Friday mistakenly killed three Israeli hostages during its ground operation in the Gaza Strip, military officials said.

The army's chief spokesman, Rear Adm. Daniel Hagari, said Israeli troops found the hostages and erroneously identified them as a threat. He said it was not clear if they had escaped their captors or been abandoned.

The deaths occurred in the Gaza City area of Shijaiyah, where troops

have engaged in fierce battles against Hamas militants in recent days.

He said the army expressed "deep sorrow" and was investigating.

The deaths were announced as a US envoy said the US and Israel were discussing a timetable for scaling back intense combat operations in the war against Hamas, even though they agree the overall fight will take months.

US national security adviser Jake Sullivan also met with Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas to discuss the be-

sieged enclave's postwar future, which, according to a senior US official, could include bringing back Palestinian security forces driven from their jobs in Gaza by Hamas in its 2007 takeover.

American and Israeli officials have been vague in public about how Gaza will be run if Israel achieves its goal of ending Hamas control.

The notion that Palestinian security forces could return was floated as one of several ideas. It appeared to be the first time Washington offered details on its vision for security arrangements in the enclave.

Biden Admin briefs five Indian-American lawmakers on Nikhil Gupta case

Washington, Dec 16 (PTI):

The Biden Administration officials on Friday briefed the five Indian-American lawmakers on the indictment of Nikhil Gupta, an Indian, who has been accused of plotting an assassination attempt on a Sikh separatist on American soil.

Congress members Ami Bera, Pramila Jayapal, Ro Khanna, Raja Krishnamoorthi and Shri Thanedar released a joint statement after receiving a classified briefing from the Biden Administration on Gupta's indictment.

On November 29,

Gupta was charged by federal prosecutors in the US in connection with his alleged participation in a foiled plot to assassinate Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, a US citizen, on American soil.

"As Members of Congress, the safety and well-being of our constituents is our most important priority. The allegations made in the indictment are deeply concerning," the statement said.




College students pose for photos as they participate in a carol singing competition ahead of Christmas, in Patna, Saturday, Dec. 16.

Disrespect for 'high command' culture, democratic values

Today the country's democracy is facing similar challenges of leadership change, where the issues are turning into a major crisis. At the root of these challenges is the 'high command' culture, in which the top national leadership of political parties exercises tight control over lower levels, thereby eroding the autonomy of state units. How right or wrong the decisions within an organization are also depends on the methods of that organization. Today, he has become the Chief Minister after big victories in three major Hindi-speaking states of the country. According to democratic norms, the Chief Minister should be elected by the majority of the winning MLAs, but rarely in recent decades in this country has the Chief Minister been decided on this basis. The culture of high command has developed and strengthened in the two major national parties of the country, and such decisions have been taken not in the state capitals but in the national capital, and this is what is happening today. Whenever a party contests elections without the face of the Chief Minister, then after victory the general public has no role in its selection. He is selected as per the wishes of the high command and the public does not know anything about the basis on which the

decision is taken in whose favor? This is a disrespect for democratic values. This is a question whose answer must be found so that Indian democracy can be further strengthened and the high command culture can end. This culture is completely against democratic values.

The beginnings of the high command culture can be traced to the early 1970s, after the 1971 national elections, and persists. So as of this till date, the high command alone takes decisions regarding all major appointments in the states and all its state units. The parties of the country have replicated the high command culture by choosing and removing Chief Ministers at will with complete control of their charismatic leaders and their political strategists. Such clear dominance of the top leadership over the lower levels of the party is also seen in other major parties of the country. Since state politics in a diverse polity like India is marked by generational rifts and power struggles among local political elites as well as high levels of internal conflicts between different factions representing a plethora of interests, there is a need for a national leadership. There is a certain level of hierarchical control. This is indispensable to keep the party united

at the state level. However, the high command culture that has now become the sine qua non of Indian politics often severely suppresses the autonomy of state-level party units of national parties, which largely operate at the will of the national party leadership.

Once the national party gains power in a state, the party's high command has a disproportionately large discretion in the selection of the Chief Minister, with state MLAs having little or no say in this regard. This practice insults the constitutional mandate that gives majority party MLAs the right to choose their leader as the chief minister of the state. It has also been found that the high command is directly influencing cabinet formation and functioning of state governments in the states from the national capital, thereby eroding the autonomy of the CM and the state leadership. Even heads of state units of parties and other officials are nominated directly by the high command rather than through internal party elections. Such a tendency appears to arise from the political leadership's insecurity about facing political challenges from a popular regional leader of its party. Therefore, the wings of ambitious leaders in the states are clipped by low-profile nominated leaders and frequent leadership changes. Maintaining the status quo or regime change in states is sometimes done in the name of prioritizing experience over youth or in the guise of bringing in the "new".

The second and most important factor shaping high command culture is the centralization of party finances. The high command decisively controls the party's finances, including resources emanating from the states so that the national leadership always has the upper

hand in regulating and distributing these scarce resources as per its discretion. Given that candidates are in dire need of money to contest elections, even more so as Indian elections are becoming more expensive than ever, this further strengthens the dominance of the high command. However, the high command's control over state leadership depends on both the popularity and power of the national leadership as well as the interests of the state leaders. It is seen that when the electoral prospects of the national party look good, riding on the popular appeal of the national leaders, state leaders find a reason to surrender to the high command. The national leadership, when electorally powerful, accommodates the demands of dissident factions within state units through the distribution of various forms of political patronage.

Given today's situation, there is a need to understand the importance of electoral success in politics. Success in an electoral democracy is not a bad thing, and in many ways, it is an essential tool for implementing its policies. No matter how good the policies of leaders and parties are, if they are not in power, they remain like wishes and slogans. Parties must win elections to carry forward their ideology, and after every election result, the parties associated with it should introspect. The party should do an honest introspection for its survival, if not for the good of the country's democracy. Many times, honest discussion is not possible within the house, in such a situation the party should seek an analysis of its defeat from some people outside.

Rushing Criminal Law Reforms: A Call for Thoughtful Deliberation

In recent times, the government has undertaken a swift process of introducing and withdrawing Criminal Law Bills, each time presenting newer versions. The urgency to revamp India's colonial-era criminal justice system is undeniable, but such a monumental task should not be executed without extensive delib-

eration and discussion in a democratic nation. After introducing the new laws in parliament, they were referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee. Now, with the committee's report in hand, it is essential to assess the final shape of these proposed changes.

The government's intent to expedite the Bills replacing the colonial-era Indian Penal Code, the Criminal Procedure Code, and the Indian Evidence Act is commendable as it marks a step towards shedding the last remnants of colonial thinking. However, amidst the rhetoric surrounding these Bills, there are concerns among a significant section of legal experts. A close examination of the Standing Committee reports suggests that this legislative process should have been more consultative, given that the proposed laws, in their current form, seem to reiterate provisions from the old statutes, raising questions about the true departure from the colonial past.

One particularly worrisome as-

pect of the proposed laws is the expansion of police powers. The Bills have increased the maximum limit of police custody to 60 or 90 days, depending on the nature of the offense, a move that raises concerns about the safety of individuals in police custody and the potential for coerced and fabricated evidence due to prolonged detention.

There are other contentious issues. While the government announced the repeal of three provisions in the IPC, including sedition and the criminalization of homosexuality and adultery, a closer look at the new laws reveals that the offense of sedition has merely undergone a name change. Additionally, the definition of some offenses is too broad and vague for effective enforcement.

Undoubtedly, laws need to evolve with time, especially given that these old statutes have been in place for over a century and impact both the general public and the field of criminal jurisprudence. However, this overhaul should not

be rushed. The proposed Bharatiya Nyaya Sahita (Second) Bill expands the definition of a terrorist act to include threats to economic security and monetary stability, broadening the law's scope to cover offenses against the state. It is crucial to dispel the impression that these bills are being hastily passed without thorough discussion. Informed debates outlining the nuances of the Bills are in the public's interest, particularly in a country known for its vibrant democracy.

Drawing lessons from recent events, such as the farmer's agitation, where the government had to repeal three Bills passed without proper consultation, it is evident that the concerns of the public must be addressed. While the Bills aimed at unclogging the criminal justice system are commendable, they must also address concerns related to the expansive powers granted to the police.

ganized crime under the umbrella of ordinary criminal law. These aspects were previously governed by stringent special legislation, and this shift has significant implications, including the reversal of the burden of proof on the accused to restrict bail.

While the Bills underwent review by the Parliamentary Standing Committee, concerns were raised about the rushed nature of the review and the choice of domain experts consulted. The Standing Committee reports indicate that it met with over 19 experts, but the revised versions of the Bills appear largely unchanged from the initial proposals.

In conclusion, the reform of criminal laws is a complex and important undertaking that demands thoughtful consideration, broad consultation, and meticulous examination of details. Rushing through such critical changes may lead to unintended consequences and undermine the principles of justice that India's legal system is built upon.

India's GDP will reach USD 5 trillion in 2026: Panagariya

Mumbai, Dec 15:

India will become the world's third largest economy by 2026 as its GDP in current dollar terms will reach USD 5 trillion in that year and further rise to USD 5.5 trillion in 2027, former Niti Aayog Vice Chairman Arvind Panagariya said on Friday. Delivering the 18th C D Deshmukh Memorial Lecture titled 'India at 125: Reclaiming the Lost Glory and Returning the Global Economy to the Old Normal', he said it is unlikely that GDP in current dollar terms of either Germany or Japan will cross USD 5 trillion-mark in the coming three years. Japan will have to sustain a growth rate of 3.5 per cent in current dollar terms to reach USD 5.03 trillion in 2027 from its 2022 level of USD 4.2 trillion, he said. At the 4 per cent annual growth rate,



German GDP will rise from USD 4.4 trillion in 2023 to USD 4.9 trillion in 2026 and USD 5.1 trillion in 2027, he said.

"Given these estimates, how soon can the Indian GDP cross the GDPs of these two countries?.. that is the question," Panagariya said. India has grown at an annual average rate of 10.22 per cent in current dollar terms.

"At this rate, India's GDP in current dollars will reach USD 5 trillion in

2026 and USD 5.5 trillion in 2027. This means that there are good prospects that India will become the world's third economy by the end of 2026, sooner than nearly all current predictions," he said.

To realise its full potential, Panagariya said India must take the steps necessary to help its economic units grow larger. "Small habitations, small farms, and small enterprises are intimately linked.

Reforms that will help the enterprises in industry and services grow larger will create job opportunities for the masses, which will, in turn, pave the way for workers to migrate from rural to urban areas," he said.

According to him, such migration will automatically increase land per worker in farming while also bringing more and more of the population to where development is.



13 states, UTs among 'achievers' in logistics performance index: DPIIT report

New Delhi, Dec 16:

Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Chandigarh, and Gujarat are among the 13 states and Union Territories that have again been categorised as "achievers" in the logistics index chart 2023, according to a report released by the Commerce and Industry Ministry on Saturday. The index is an indicator of the efficiency of logistical services necessary for promoting exports and economic growth. As against 15 states and UTs, this year the number has reduced to 13 as Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand have slipped into "aspirers" and "fast movers" categories, respectively, this year. Steps taken by Sikkim and Tripura have helped them move up the ladder to the "achievers" category from "fast movers" in 2022. The other states and UTs in the "achievers" category are Delhi, Assam, Haryana, Punjab, Telangana, and

Uttar Pradesh, Kerala, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Andaman and Nicobar, Lakshadweep, and Puducherry have been categorised as "fast movers" in the report. Those in the "aspirers" category include Goa, Odisha, West Bengal, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Daman and Diu, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh. The report ranks states on the basis of their logistics ecosystem, highlights the key logistics-related challenges faced by the stakeholders and includes suggestive recommendations, according to the fifth LEADS (Logistics Ease Across Different States) 2023 report unveiled by Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal. The index aims at enhancing focus on improving logistics performance across states, which is essential for improving the country's trade and reducing transaction cost. Goyal said the logistics sector will play a key role in taking the country's economy to about USD 35 trillion by 2047. Citing a report of economic think tank NCAER, he said the country's logistics cost is estimated in the range of 7.8 per cent to 8.9 per cent. "Going forward, the aim to bring it down to the 5-6 per cent level is certainly doable," he said, adding that the government has taken a series of measures such as investing huge amounts in infrastructure development to help promote cut logistics costs. He suggested the industry to focus on skilled manpower, enhanced participation of states, use of new technologies like AI, blockchain and data analytics, and steps to reduce carbon footprint will further help in the growth of the country's logistics sector.

Persistent sand mining scams raise concerns

Collusion between officials and sand mafia

Fingeswar, Dec 16: Despite raids on the Bidara-Khudsa sand mine, illegal sand excavation persists, with the use of chain mounting machines running rampant. The sand mafia's influence and collusion with officials remain so entrenched that, following public revelations of villagers' actions and illegal mining on December 8th, authorities conducted a raid at the Parsadakala sand ghat adjacent to Bidara-Khudsa, seizing a hidden chain mounting machine in the forest. However, the sand mafia's audacity led them to resume mining and

transportation using chain mounting machines at the same location on Sunday, December 10th, accompanied by threats to villagers and regular communication with transporters via WhatsApp.

The sand mafia charges Rs 2200 for 10 wheelbarrows, Rs 2700 for 12 wheelbarrows, Rs 3200 for 14 wheelbarrows, and Rs 3700 for 16 wheelbarrows, with royalty for 10 cubic meters set at Rs 2000 and Rs 2500 for 12 cubic meters.

Villagers report that, by colluding with departmental and revenue officers, the sand mafia illegally profits in the lakhs of rupees through unrestrained sand excavation. Complaints and irregularities become public knowledge, leading to minor superficial actions followed by a return to regu-

lation of illegal mining and transportation practices.

Parsadakala villagers assert that the sand mafia enjoys official support for its illegal mining operations, stealing thousands of rupees in royalties from the administration while contributing to environmental degradation and posing road safety hazards.

It is reported that the National Green Tribunal (NGT) has banned mining by revoking the No Objection Certificates (NOCs) for all mines, allowing only stock transportation regulations in local sand mines to alleviate persistent issues related to illegal activities. However, illegal min-

ing persists day and night in various locations, including Bidara, Khudsa, Pitaiband, Chaubebadha, and Pusaud Hatkhao. Despite the administration setting the price for sand loading and royalty at Rs 980, sand ghats charge loading fees ranging from Rs 2500 to 3000. The royalty value for sand is Rs 650, with an additional Rs 200 levied from vehicle owners. Royalty slips are not being provided.

The Mineral Department's lapses have contributed to the ongoing illegal sand mining and transportation activities in the district. Villagers demand strict adherence to mining and transportation regulations in local sand mines to alleviate persistent issues related to illegal activities.

India Women pulverise England

Record 347 runs biggest Test victory in history



Navi Mumbai, Dec 16 (PTI):

Dominated with the bat and destroyed with the ball by the third morning, England didn't make it past lunch as India, led by Deepti Sharma - again - and Pooja Vastrakar, completed a record 347-run victory at Navi Mumbai's DY Patil Stadium.

While Deepit's remarkable 5 for 7 had sent England into a tailspin on the second day, it was Vastrakar who sparked

their downfall on Saturday after India declared overnight on 186 for 6. Deepit finished them off, taking nine wickets in all to add to her first-innings half-century for Player-of-the-Match honours.

Given that the highest successful fourth-innings run chase in women's Tests is Australia's 198 for 3 to beat England in Sydney in 2011, to call it a 479-run "target" seemed trite and Vastrakar's early

inroads ensured that. It was India Women's first Test win at home against England in six attempts, the margin of victory the largest by runs in women's Tests, and was all wrapped up in an extended morning session on the third day.

After Renuka Thakur plucked out Tammy Beaumont with a ball that held its line to beat the outside edge and peg back off stump with just 27 runs on the board,

Vastrakar had an out-of-sorts Sophia Dunkley slicing straight to gully and easily taken by substitute fielder Harleen Deol, on for Shubha Satheesh, who scored 69 on international debut in India's first innings but didn't bat in the second because of a broken finger.

That put England in familiar territory in this match (they were 28 for 2 when bowled out for 136 in their first innings to concede a lead of 292) at 37 for

2. And, on the very next ball, Vastrakar removed Nat Sciver-Brunt - the only England batter to offer any resistance in the first innings - with a beauty that nipped back in from a perfect length outside off, went through the gate and crashed into the stumps.

When Vastrakar got one to hold its line from outside off and draw an outside edge from Heather Knight, England slumped to 68 for 4.

Shubha Satheesh doubtful for Australia match

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) informed before the start of the play on the third day of the four-day Test that Shubha, who played her maiden game for India across formats, will take no further part in the ongoing contest.

"Shubha Satheesh did not bat in the second innings due to broken finger and will take no further part in the ongoing India-England Test," the BCCI statement read.

The BCCI did not provide any details as to when and how the player suffered the injury, though she had warmed up ahead of the second day's play on Friday.

Deepti then orchestrated the procession, flummoxing Danni Wyatt with a fantastic offbreak taken at slip and removing Amy Jones via a loose pull to midwicket to get at the England tail. She removed Kate Cross with one that turned ferociously from outside off to peg back leg stump and lured Lauren Fifer down the pitch with the flight on one that kept low after turning in and pinged middle stump.

In between whiles, Rajeshwari Gayakwad bowled Sophie Ecclestone, then had Lauren Bell caught simply by Jemimah Rodrigues at silly point, the last wicket to fall. The latter sparked wild celebrations for the home side, who will be looking to bottle this feeling and form - for use in their next Test, starting against Australia at Wankhede Stadium on Thursday.

Navi Mumbai, Dec 16 (PTI): India women's cricket team captain Harmanpreet Kaur on Saturday credited head coach Amol Muzumdar for taking vital decisions for the team, conceding that she lacked the requisite experience of leading in Tests, after they completed a record 347-run win over England here. India took precisely seven sessions to create the world record in terms of the largest Test win by runs, while also registering their first-ever victory over England at home and overall their sixth in 39 Tests, here at the DY Patil Stadium.
