purposes, emphasizing the need for a coordinated global strategy against designated terror groups and their sponsors. It is a stark re-
aminder that, despite progress in some areas, the international comminder that, despite progress in some areas, the international com
munity still lacks a comprehensive and cohesive approach to com bating terrorism. The LeT and its front organization, Jamaat-udNations, underscoring their global threat. Yet, China's support for Pakistan has obstructed efforts to impose sanctions on Islamabad
