Denied bail

The court had on Saturday sent all the accused in the case, including Azad, Manoranjan D, Sagar Sharma, Lalit Jha, Amol Shinde and Mahesh Kumawat, to judicial custody after they were produced before it on expiry of their police remand.

'Light diyas, celebrate Ram temple consecration like Diwali'

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday asked his Cabinet colleagues to celebrate the Ayodhya Ram temple consecration ceremony on January 22 like Diwali by lighting up diyas at their homes and also feed the poor, sources said. He made these remarks at the Union Cabinet meeting amid a nationwide religious fervour in the run-up to the ceremony which he will be attending.

Aadhaar not a valid proof of date of birth: EPFO

New Delhi, Jan 18 (PTI):

Retirement fund body EPFO has said it will no longer use Aadhaar as a valid document for proof of date of birth.

In an official circular on January 16, the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) said the decision to remove Aadhaar was taken following a directive from the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI).

As per the circular, Aadhaar is also being removed from the list of documents for correction in date of birth. The UIDAI in a circular on December 22, 2023, had said an Aadhaar num-

ber can be used for establishing identity of an individual, subject to authentication, and thereby, per se, it is not a proof of date of birth. The UIDAI also noted that many bodies like the EPFO have been using Aadhaar to validate date of birth. UIDAI had also said that many high courts in their orders have highlighted that Aadhaar is not a valid proof of date of birth.

Various documents like birth certificate issued by the Registrar of Births and Deaths, marksheets issued by any recognised government board or university, PAN (Permanent Account Number) card are used as valid proof for date of birth.

Half-day holiday for central govt staff on Jan 22

New Delhi: All central government offices across the country will remain closed for half a day on January 22, due to the Ram temple consecration ceremony in Ayodhya, a Personnel Ministry order issued on Thursday said. The 'Pran Pratishta' ceremony of the new idol of Ram Lalla at the sanctum sanctorum of the Ram temple is scheduled for Monday. The ceremony is set to be performed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "The Ram Lalla Pran Pratishta at Ayodhya will be celebrated on 22nd January 2024 across India. To enable employees to participate in the celebrations, it has been decided that all central government offices, central institutions and central industrial establishments throughout India will be closed for half day till 1430 hours on 22nd January 2024," it said in the order issued to all central government ministries/departments. When contacted, Union Minister of State for Personnel Jitendra Singh told PTI that the decision has been taken in view of the "overwhelming" public sentiments.

GUIDELINES FOR COACHING CENTRES

'No intake of students below 16 years, no misleading promises'

New Delhi, Jan 18 (PTI):

Coaching centres cannot enrol students below 16 years of age, make misleading promises and guarantee rank or good marks, according to new guidelines announced by the Ministry of Education. The guidelines for regulating coaching institutes have been framed to address the need for a legal framework and manage the unregulated growth of private coaching centres.

"It comes following complaints received by the government about rising cases of student suicides, fire inci-

dents, lack of facilities in coaching incidents as well as methodologies of teaching adopted by them. "No coaching centre shall engage tutors having qualifications less than graduation. The institutions cannot make misleading promises or guarantee rank or good marks to parents for enrolling students in the coaching centres. The institutes cannot enrol students below 16 years of age. Student enrolment should be only after secondary school examination," the guidelines said. "The coaching institutes cannot pub-

lish or cause to be published or take part in the publication of any misleading advertisement relating to any claim, directly or indirectly, of quality of coaching or the facilities offered therein or the result procured by such coaching centre on the student who attended such class," it added. The coaching centres cannot hire the services of any tutor or person who has been convicted of any offence involving moral turpitude. An institute will not be registered unless it has a counselling system as per the requirement of these guidelines.

Eyewitness identifies Yasin Malik as shooter who killed 4 IAF men

Jammu, Jan 18 (PTI):

JKLF chief Yasin Malik lifted his 'phera', pulled out his gun and opened fire at a group of IAF personnel, an eyewitness deposed before a special CBI court on Thursday while narrating what happened in Srinagar on January 25, 1990.

A charge sheet was filed on August 31, 1990 against Malik and five others before the designated TADA Court at Jammu. Besides Malik, others accused in the killing of the IAF personnel are JKLF operatives Ali Mohammed Mir, Manzoor Ahmed Sofi alias Mustafa, Javed Ahmed Mir alias 'Nalka', Showkat Ahmed Bakshi, Javed Ahmed Zargar and Nanaji.

Ravi Khanna, who were killed, 40 people were injured on January 25, 1990, in Rawalpora on the outskirts of Srinagar. The IAF employees were waiting for their pickup to old Srinagar airfield for duty when they came under fire from terrorists.

The safety and security of citizens is primary for the government, he said.

SCINDIA ON PASSENGERS EATING ON TARMAC

Hyderabad, Jan 18 (PTI):

Union Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia on Thursday said incidents like passengers having food on tarmac at Mumbai airport were unacceptable and that penalties were imposed.

The fact that passengers were inconvenienced and that they had to eat on the tarmac, apart from security being compromised across all points was unacceptable, he said. The minister pointed out that within three to four hours, notices were issued

and within 24 hours, the necessary penalties were levied. "This or any incident like this is unacceptable for us. Therefore, penalties were issued," he said. He added that two separate Civil Aviation Requirements (CAR) were issued.

Boat capsizes; death toll rises to 16

Vadodara, Jan 18:

At least 16 people, including three school children and teachers, died after a boat they had boarded in the Lake Zone of the Harni Lake in Vadodara capsized on Thursday evening during a picnic organised by a private school. Several school children died after a boat overturned in Harni Lake on the outskirts of Vadodara city in Gujarat on Thursday. The students were on a picnic when the incident happened. A search operation is underway to trace the remaining students.

According to the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), the boat had around 27 occupants at the time of



the incident. While 19 children and four teachers, were pulled out and rushed to various hospitals, a search operation is currently on to look for four missing children. Many students are still reported missing in this accident. Inter-district gang of bike lifters busted

● 22 vehicles worth
Rs 14.70 lakh seized

Bhilai, Jan 18: With the arrest of three ruffians, police claimed to have busted an inter district gang of bike lifters. One Activa scooter, 03 Splendor bikes and 18 Hero HF Deluxe bikes worth Rs 14.70 lakhs were recovered. It was a joint action of Anti Crime and Cyber Unit Durg and Police Stations Mohan Nagar, Pulgaon and Padmanabhpur.

Taking a serious note over the incidents of bike lifting, Senior Superintendent of Police (Durg) Ram Gopal Garg gave instructions to take prompt action in the cases of vehicle theft, trap the accused and recover the vehicles. Acting on the instructions, Additional Superintendent of Police (City) Abhishek Jha, Additional Superintendent of Police (Crime) Dr Anurag Jha and City Superintendent of Police



(Durg) Manishankar Chandra constituted a joint team led by Inspector Naresh Patel (I/c ACCU), Inspector Santosh Mishra, Inspector Vijay Yadav, Inspector Tapeshwar Netam and Inspector Anil Sahu.

The team maintained vigil on the suspects and criminal record holders. The network of informers was also activated. Habitual criminals released from jail were also monitored. Meanwhile, police received a tip off about Mukhtar Ahmed, a resident of New Adarsh Nagar

Durg, and his partner Sheikh Salim, a resident of Shankar Nagar Durg.

They were searching for a customer to sell the stolen motorcycle. Acting on the tip off, police team swung into action and arrested the suspects Mukhtar Ahmed and Sheikh Salim in Mohan Nagar. They kept misleading during the initial enquiry, but after sustained and factual enquiry, both of them confessed to committing vehicle thefts.

They had stolen a total of 22 vehicles in the last one year from the liquor shops located under Mohan Nagar, Pulgaon and Padmanabhpur Police Station areas. They had sold the stolen vehicles to their friend Mohammad Baig alias Golu, a resident of Hanoda Durg. He works as a building construction contractor.

Mohammad Baig was caught and interrogated. He disclosed that he had given the motor cycles to the labourers. Police recovered one Activa scooter, 03 Splendorikes and 18 HF Deluxe motorcycles worth Rs 14.70 lakh. The stolen bikes were recovered and

confiscated. Further action is being taken from the concerned police stations.

The accused Mukhtar Ahmed alias Sonu (27) son of Mustaq Ahmed, a resident of Dallu Wali Gali, New Adarsh Nagar; Sheikh Salim (33) son of Sheikh Ismail, a resident of Shankar Nagar Durg and Mohammad Baig alias Golu (33) son of Hakim Baig, a resident of village HanodaChandkhuri Road, Padmanabhpur were produced before the court and have been sent to jail on judicial remand.

Expelled Assam Cong leader holds protest during Yatra

● Seeks justice from Rahul Gandhi

Sivasagar (Assam), Jan 18 (PTI):

Former Assam Pradesh Youth Congress president Angkita Dutta, who was expelled for anti-party activities last year, on Thursday demonstrated demanding justice and sought to meet Rahul Gandhi, who is currently leading the 'Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra' in the state.

The Congress, however, termed her a political stooge of Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma who, the party claimed, acted like 'Narad Muni' in her case. Dutta along with a few supporters were on a sit-in at Amguri town in

Sivasagar district, seeking 'nyay' (justice) from Gandhi who passed through the town leading the Yatra. She also brought a memorandum for giving it to the Congress MP, but did not get a chance to meet him.

"I am here to seek justice in my case. I have been in vana (exile) for 10 months. I complained about harassment and instead of giving justice to me, the party expelled me," Dutta told reporters. Failing to hand over the memorandum, she broke down in front of the media and said she really hoped that Gandhi would listen to her.

Prior to this, several hoardings bearing a photograph of Dutta and Gandhi together were put

up along the route of the march in and around Amguri, seeking justice for women in the Congress party. "Are you tired of the injustice women face everyday?... Nyay for Angkita," read the hoardings, which also had the logo of 'Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra'. Dutta in April last

year had filed an FIR against Youth Congress president Srinivas B V alleging that he was "persistently harassing and torturing" her for six months by making sexist comments, using swear words and also threatening her with dire consequences if she complained to the senior leaders.

She had also mentioned in the complaint that during the party's plenary session at Raipur, the accused had physically heckled her and threatened to ruin her career if she made any complaint against him. The Congress issued a show cause notice to Dutta and later expelled her from the primary membership of the party for six years for anti-party activities.

● Dies in hospital


Indore, Jan 18 (PTI):

tacked by a bull lurking nearby. The attack inflicted severe injuries on the woman, requiring immediate medical attention. Local bystanders intervened to chase away the rampaging bull,

and she was promptly admitted to SECL Mudapar for initial treatment. However, due to the gravity of her injuries, she was later referred to Apollo Hospital for specialized care.

Bull injured many people

Reports suggest that the marauding bull had injured several other people on the same day. Strikingly, the Municipal Corporation appears to be oblivious to these incidents, despite the evident risks posed by cattle roaming freely on the streets. It is worth noting that the Corporation is responsible for capturing stray cattle and relocating them to the Kanji House. However, this essential task remains unfulfilled, seemingly putting the community at risk of further accidents. Many believe that the Corporation's inaction is inviting disaster. Previously, the Corporation had initiated a campaign against stray cattle and impounded several of them. Had this campaign continued, the tragic incident might have been averted.

Mayor's unresponsiveness

Amidst the chaos, Sikandar Usar Varsha, the injured woman's son, attempted to contact Mayor Rajkishore Prasad to report the incident and seek assistance. Regrettably, the Mayor declined the call, citing a meeting in progress. Despite the passing of time, the Mayor did not find it necessary to inquire about the situation. In response, Sikandar Usar Varsha voiced his frustration, stating that if the Corporation failed to address these pressing issues, they would be left with no choice but to stage a protest demanding action and accountability.

Pakistan conducts 'precision military strikes' against 'terrorist hideouts' in Iran

Islamabad, Jan 18 (PTI):

Pakistan Thursday conducted "precision military strikes" against what it called "terrorist hideouts" in Iran's Sistan-Baluchistan province that killed 9 people, a day after Islamabad recalled its envoy from Tehran and suspended all planned high-level bilateral visits following Iranian missile attacks in Balochistan.

"This morning Pakistan undertook a series of highly coordinated and specifically targeted precision military strikes against terrorist hideouts in Sistan-o-Baluchistan province of Iran,"

Pakistan's Foreign Office said in a statement on Thursday morning.

It said a number of terrorists were killed during the intelligence-based operation - codenamed "Marg Bar Sarmachar". In Persian language, "marg bar" means "death to" while "Sarmachar" means guerrilla in the Baloch language.

The Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), the Pakistan military's media wing, in a statement said that the precision strikes were carried out using killer drones, rockets, loitering munitions and stand-off weapons.

It said that "hideouts used by terrorist organisations namely Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) and Balochistan Liberation Front (BLF) were successfully struck in an intelligence-based operation." The two groups have carried out several attacks in Pakistan in the past. Meanwhile, Iranian Foreign Ministry spokesman Nasser Kanani condemned the attack and said that the Pakistani charg d'affaires had been summoned by the ministry to convey Tehran's protest to Islamabad and provide an explanation about the at-

tack, Iran's state-run Press TV reported. Quoting Deputy governor of the province Alireza Marhamati, the channel said nine non-Iranian nationals, including two men, three women and four children, were killed in the attack, which is being investigated by the Iranian security officials.

There was also an explosion near Saravan city, 347 km southeast of the provincial capital Zahedan, where there were no casualties, he added.

Iranian Interior Minister Ahmad Vahidi confirmed the figures later in the day.

UN: Palestinians are dying in hospitals as estimated 60,000 wounded

United Nations, Jan 18 (AP):

Palestinians are dying every day in Gaza's overwhelmed remaining hospitals which can't deal with the tens of thousands people hurt in Israeli's military offensive, a UN health emergency expert said Wednesday, while a doctor with the International Rescue Committee called the situation in Gaza's hospitals the most extreme she had ever seen.

The two health professionals, who recently left Gaza after weeks working in hospitals there, described overwhelmed doctors trying to save the lives of thousands of wounded people amid collapsing hospitals that have turned

Al-Shifa Hospital, once Gaza's leading hospital with 700 beds, has been reduced to treating only emergency trauma victims, and is filled with thousands of people who have fled their homes and are now living in operating rooms, corridors and stairs, he said.

Traffic through the Panama Canal is being slashed because of drought

Panama City: A severe drought

that began last year has forced authorities to slash ship crossings by 36 per cent in the Panama Canal, one of the world's most important trade routes. The new cuts announced Wednesday by authorities in Panama are set to deal an even greater economic blow than previously expected. Canal administrators now estimate that dipping water levels could

cost them between USD 500 million and USD 700 million in 2024, compared to previous estimates of USD 200 million. One of the most severe droughts to ever hit the Central American nation has stirred chaos in the 50-mile maritime route, causing a traffic jam of boats, casting doubts on the canal's reliability for international shipping and raising concerns about its affect on global trade.

LAC Clashes

India Must Remain Vigilant

In recent revelations, it has come to light that Indian and Chinese troops clashed multiple times along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) between September 2021 and November 2022. These previously unreported incidents shed light on the ongoing tensions in the region, requiring India to conduct covert operations to monitor the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA). These clashes and operations were brought to public attention during the presentation of gallantry awards by the Western and Central Army Commands. Secrecy surrounding such operations is paramount for national security, and the Army has acted swiftly to remove a video clip containing classified information from the public domain. While this breach needs thorough investigation, it is evident that the border tensions have not subsided in recent years, following the Galwan clash of June 2020. Last year, a Pentagon report highlighted China's increased deployment of forces and infrastructure buildup along the LAC in 2022, including the construction of underground storage facilities near Doklam, a new bridge over the Pangong lake, a dual-purpose airport, and multiple helipads. Indian Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande recently described the LAC situation as 'stable but sensitive.' Given the prolonged standoff, India cannot afford to lower its guard, necessitating round-the-clock vigilance to preempt any misadventures by the PLA. China appears keen to gain tactical superiority and exert pressure on India. New Delhi must respond to provocations with caution and resolve. It is commendable that External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar conveyed to his Chinese counterpart that 'unless a solution is found at the border, they should not expect other relations to move on normally.' The responsibility now lies with Beijing to take sincere steps towards resolving the LAC dispute and restoring normalcy in bilateral relations. India must remain resolute in safeguarding its territorial integrity and security, recognizing that the need for vigilance along the border remains unabated.

Milk and meat in the body politic

Meal and milk both have high nutritional value. They build our body. But the combination of the two can be dangerous. Drinking milk after eating meat or combining the two can trigger several issues like gas, discomfort, stomach ache, nausea, acidity, heartburn, ulcers to name but a few. To put it simply the combination of the two can cause several ailments in the body. Similarly, politics and religion both have high societal value. But the combination of the two is as toxic as that of the mixture of meat and milk. The immediate outcome of such a combination is hate speeches which can be compared with vomiting acid after consuming meat and milk together. The Supreme Court of India rightly observed that hate speeches would end the moment politicians stop using religion in politics. Justice Joseph hit the nail on the head when he observed that the country was caught in a "vicious circle of hate" and the solution lay in expunging religion from politics. Earlier in feudalism, a king or a feudal lord used to favour his own religion over other religions. History witnessed that such a practice spelt disaster on every occasion. Just like people learned from their mistakes the need to separate milk from meat, here also they felt the need for a complete separation of religion from politics. This gave birth to secularism. All modern progressive nations have embraced secularism after learning how painful it would be to deviate from its path. The mixture of politics and religion causes two major problems. When a particular religion is favoured in a country over other religions, it divides the citizens. This mixture does not allow the policy makers to follow the progressive ideals of equality and fraternity. Rather it attracts negative things such as discrimination, marginalisation, conflict and unrest. Some of our neighbouring countries have experienced the danger of not walking in the path of secularism.

This mixture creates the second problem when a political leader tries to usurp the role of a representative of God. This sounds the death knell for democracy. How can a voter hold a ruler accountable for his actions if he is seen as being chosen by divine power? Therefore, it completely destroys accountability as well as the lock-gate to check corruption and abuse of power. It has been reported that the Prime Minister has recently issued an audio message saying he had begun an 11-day "special observance" as prescribed in the scriptures, to "awaken divine consciousness" within himself in the lead-up to the January 22 consecration. He also claimed that God had chosen him as "an instrument to represent all Indians during the consecration" of the Ram temple in Ayodhya. In a democracy a ruler has to remain accountable to the voters. But it would be difficult to hold a person accountable if he proclaims that he is chosen by God. The emergence of India as a secular, democratic country was certainly a gain of the evolution. It appears that the gains are likely to be eclipsed for a time because efforts are being made to create an impression that a religious ceremony is but a State event to exploit religion as a political instrument. Even Sankaracharyas raised objections regarding the inauguration of Ram temple in Ayodhya before its completion to coincide with the preparation of the ensuing 2024 Lok Sabha election. Swami Avimuktteswaranand Saraswati, the sankaracharya of Jyotispeeth in Uttarakhand has said the four sankaracharyas will not attend the January 22 inauguration of the Ram temple in Ayodhya as "it is a bad idea to inaugurate an incomplete temple." Secularism separates milk of religion from political meat. It is like a doctor who advises us to consume meat and milk separately. Undoubtedly, there will be several ailments in the body politic without secularism.

Alarm bells: Antibiotic abuse

Antibiotics are important medicines. Many antibiotics can successfully treat infections caused by bacteria (bacterial infections). Antibiotics can stop the disease from spreading. Antibiotics can reduce serious disease complications. However, some antibiotics that used to be typical treatments for bacterial infections no longer work as well. And some drugs don't work at all against some bacteria. When an antibiotic no longer works against certain strains of bacteria, those bacteria are said to be antibiotic-resistant. Antibiotic resistance is one of the world's most urgent health problems. Taking antibiotics for colds and other viral illnesses doesn't work – and it can create bacteria that are harder to kill. Taking antibiotics too often or for the wrong reasons can cause bacteria to change so much that antibiotics no longer work against them. This is called bacterial resistance or antibiotic resistance.

But if a person is using antibiotics repeatedly, then the bacteria develop immunity against that medicine. After this, it becomes very difficult to fix it. This is called anti-microbial resistance. In such a situation, treatment is not done properly but toxins start accumu-

lating in the liver. A recent survey by the National Centers for Disease Control found that more than half of the nearly 10,000 hospital patients surveyed for the study were given antibiotics to prevent rather than treat infections. This is a worrying sign as India has one of the highest burdens of drug-resistant pathogens worldwide, leading to the high incidence of antimicrobial resistance (AMR). Overuse of antibiotics – especially when they are not the right treatment – promotes antibiotic resistance. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, about one-third of antibiotic use in people is neither necessary nor appropriate.

Antibiotics treat infections caused by bacteria. However, they do not treat infections caused by viruses (viral infections). For example, antibiotics are the right treatment for strep throat caused by bacteria. But it is not the right treatment for most sore throats that are caused by viruses. India has taken a major step in reducing antimicrobial resistance, which is becoming a growing concern across the world, by implementing the National Action Plan on Antimicrobial Resistance (NAP-AMR). It is a key component of

India's National Action Plan on Antimicrobial Resistance. The strategy emphasizes the importance of educating healthcare workers, the general public as well as stakeholders in the veterinary and agricultural industries. This educational initiative is important in promoting responsible behavior and reducing the misuse of antibiotics. The plan recognizes that antimicrobial resistance is not just a challenge to human health; it is also a result of antibiotic misuse in veterinary and environmental settings. Which includes ministries responsible for health, animal husbandry, agriculture, and the environment.

The National Action Plan on Antimicrobial Resistance underlines the importance of robust data collection and surveillance. This includes closely monitoring the use of antibiotics in the agricultural, human health, and veterinary sectors. Every day, thousands of people are admitted to hospitals for treatment of infectious diseases that require antibiotic therapy. Antibiotic misuse is a leading cause of antimicrobial resistance, adverse events, and treatment costs among hospitalized patients. Antibiotic safety must be ensured in hospital settings to promote effective and rational therapy. There is growing evidence that measures to increase antibiotic prescribing may help patients. To help healthcare practitioners reduce inappropriate inpatient prescribing, it is necessary to determine how often inappropriate inpatient prescribing occurs in hospitals and how much less prescribing would benefit patients.

There should be a strong regulatory framework to monitor and en-

force compliance with antibiotic prescription guidelines. It includes mechanisms to punish non-compliance and encourage compliance. Regular monitoring of antibiotic resistance patterns is important. The effectiveness of guidelines can be assessed by the ability to track changes in resistance patterns over time and take corrective action. Restricting access to reserve antibiotics is important to reduce resistance. Overuse and misuse of antibiotics are major factors in antibiotic resistance. The general public, healthcare providers, and hospitals can all help ensure that medications are used correctly. This may reduce the growth of antibiotic resistance. Healthcare professionals and especially pharmacists play/can play an important role in drug abuse and drug safety.

Appropriate and effective patient education and counseling by pharmacists is key to achieving desired outcomes for treating patients, including clinical, economic, and humanitarian outcomes. Medication abuse and misuse can be prevented/reduced by educating patients about medications when prescribing and dispensing them and how they can use them appropriately. It is very important and necessary to increase awareness among the public, patients, and healthcare professionals about the complications of the misuse and abuse of medicines. It is very important to follow drug dispensing regulations and stop dispensing prescribed and controlled drugs to prevent misuse and abuse of drugs.


New Yatra

Lok Sabha Elections 2024

Political Landscape in Northern India



Introduction

The political landscape of Northern India is poised for a significant transformation in the upcoming 2024 Lok Sabha elections. This region comprises four states - Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, and Uttarakhand - along with four union territories - Chandigarh, Delhi, Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh. A total of 46 Lok Sabha seats are at stake in this fiercely contested battleground. As the election drama unfolds, let's delve into the dynamics, alliances, and key players that will shape the political future of Northern India.

Punjab

Punjab has been a political hotbed with four major players in the fray: the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD), Congress, BJP, and Aam Aadmi Party (AAP). The SAD, once a stalwart ally of the BJP within the NDA, severed ties in September 2020 to protest against the BJP-led NDA government's stance on farmers' issues. The possibility of a reunion between these former allies remains uncertain. In the 2022 assembly elections, both the BJP and SAD faced a setback, winning just two and three seats, respectively, while AAP secured a whopping 92 seats. In the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, when the BJP and SAD contested 13 seats together, the BJP won four, Congress secured eight, and AAP clinched one. Although Congress and AAP are part of the Indian National Congress, the chances of an alliance between them in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections appear bleak.

Haryana

Haryana, often considered a BJP stronghold, will witness a fierce battle with ten Lok Sabha seats up for grabs. The Jannayak Janata Party (JJP) and the Haryana Lokhit Party (HLP), NDA allies, played crucial roles in the recent assembly elections. Apart from these regional parties, AAP and Congress also have a significant presence. In the

2014 elections, the BJP won seven seats, a number that soared to all ten seats in 2019. With an impressive rise in vote share from 36 lakh to 73 lakh in 2019, the BJP strengthened its grip. In a strategic move, the BJP and JJP have forged a formal alliance, likely boosting their chances in the upcoming elections.

Chandigarh

Chandigarh, a union territory, has been consistently represented by the prominent actress Kirron Kher. She clinched victory in both the 2014 and 2019 Lok Sabha elections, defeating Congress' Pawan Kumar Bansal by a substantial margin in 2019. However, Aam Aadmi Party's candidate Harmohan Dawan secured just 13,781 votes, indicating the dominance of Kirron Kher.

Himachal Pradesh

Himachal Pradesh contributes four Lok Sabha seats: Kangra, Mandi, Hamirpur, and Shimla. The BJP triumphed in all four seats in the 2019 elections, maintaining its winning streak from 2014. The 2019 elections witnessed significant margins of victory for BJP candidates. However, the 2022 assembly elections marked a remarkable resurgence for Congress, securing 40 out of 68 seats. This victory has rejuvenated Congress and may boost their confidence in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

Uttarakhand

Uttarakhand, carved out of Uttar Pradesh in 2000, has five Lok Sabha constituencies: Garhwal, Tehri Garhwal, Nainital, Almora, and Haridwar. BJP, Congress, and BSP are the prominent parties active in the state. The BJP demonstrated its supremacy by winning all five seats in both the 2014 and 2019 elections.

Jammu and Kashmir

The special status of Jammu and Kashmir under Article 370 was revoked by the Indian government in August 2019, a move upheld by a unanimous Supreme Court verdict in December 2023. Jammu and Kashmir will be represented by five Lok Sabha members, with constituencies in Baramulla, Srinagar, Anantnag, Udhampur, and Jammu. Additionally, Ladakh will have one representative in parliament. In the 2019 elections, the Jammu and Kashmir National Conference secured three seats, while the BJP won three as well. The BJP dominated Udhampur, Jammu, and Ladakh, whereas the National Conference emerged victorious in Baramulla, Srinagar, and Anantnag. Notably, Farooq Abdullah, the National Conference leader, won the Srinagar seat with a substantial 70,000-vote margin. For the upcoming elections, the BJP, Congress, National Conference, and the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) are

the key contenders. The National Conference has indicated its ambition to secure all valley seats, possibly forming alliances only where BJP poses a challenge. This suggests a lack of alliance between opposition parties in Jammu and Kashmir, potentially putting them at odds with the PDP and Congress.

Delhi

Delhi, a union territory with seven Lok Sabha seats, might witness a triangular battle if Congress and AAP do not form an alliance. The BJP could benefit from this three-cornered contest and stand a better chance of retaining all seven seats, which it won in both the 2014 and 2019 elections.

The Road Ahead

In summary, Northern India presents a diverse political landscape, with BJP's dominance evident in several states. However, the winds of change seem to sweep quickly, as seen in recent assembly elections. The outcome of the 2024 Lok Sabha elections in Northern India will be influenced by evolving alliances, regional dynamics, and the performance of key players. The Modi wave, which played a pivotal role in the BJP's success in 2014 and 2019, may face new challenges in the upcoming polls. Stamp Bill

New Delhi: The finance ministry on Wednesday invited suggestions from the public on the draft Indian Stamp Bill, 2023, which would align the stamp duty provisions with the modern regime. Stakeholders can submit their suggestions within 30 days in a specified format. Once enacted, the Bill shall replace the Indian Stamp Act, 1899, the finance ministry said in a statement. "The Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance, Government of India, has prepared a draft 'Indian Stamp Bill, 2023' to align it with modern stamp duty regime," it said.

New Delhi: The agriculture ministry on Wednesday said a tripartite agreement has been signed to leverage artificial intelligence (AI) in the agriculture sector. The agreement was signed between the National Farmers' Welfare Programme Implementation Society (NFWPIS), IndiaAI under Digital India Corporation and Wadhwan Foundation, according to the agriculture ministry.

'Indian economy to see stronger-than-expected growth in 2023-24'

Mumbai, Jan 18:

The Indian economy is projected to record stronger-than-expected growth in 2023-24, and the government's thrust on capex has started to crowd-in private investment, said an article published in the latest RBI Bulletin. The world economy faces divergent near-term growth prospects and emerging market economies led by Asia are poised to outperform the rest of the world, said the article on 'State of the Economy'. "The Indian economy recorded stronger-than-expected growth in 2023-24, underpinned by a shift from consumption to investment," it said. The government's thrust on capex is starting to crowd-in pri-

vate investment, said the article authored by a team lead by Reserve Bank Deputy Governor Michael Debabrata Patra. In India, the authors said potential output is picking up with actual output running above it, although the gap is moderate.

"In 2024-25, the objective should be to sustain this momentum by securing real GDP growth of at least 7 per cent in an environment of macroeconomic stability," they said. Accordingly, inflation needs to align with the target by the second quarter of the year, as projected, and get anchored there. Also, balance sheets of financial institutions need to be strengthened and asset quality improved even further, the article said, and added the

ongoing consolidation of fiscal and external balances needs to continue. "The gains of the transformative technological change that is underway must be harnessed for inclusive and participative growth in a sound risk-free environment.

"Above all, the virtuous thrust to investment from government capex must be partnered and even led by the corporate sector, supplemented by foreign direct investment," it said. The article also stressed that the weak global outlook can be brightened if geopolitical conflicts end and their repercussions through commodity and financial markets, trade and transportation, and supply networks are contained. "Inflation must

be vanquished, paving the way for financial conditions to ease in support of growth," it added. The RBI, however, said the views expressed in the Bulletin article are of the authors and do not represent the views of the central bank. The Reserve Bank has called upon internal ombudsmen of banks, NBFCs, and CICs to provide inputs for enhancing internal systems and processes. As part of the Reserve Bank's continuing engagement with regulated entities, the second Conference of Internal Ombudsmen on the theme 'Orchestrating Customer Delight through an Empowered Internal Ombudsman', was held in Mumbai on January 16, 2024.

NMDC committed to India's steel demand

National Miner NMDC is scaling up production of iron ore to meet the demands of a thriving domestic steel market, earning higher sales realizations with zilch export.



Speaking on the economics of export, the company said that even though iron ore export prices are showing an increasing trend, the net sales realizations in the domestic market are superior.

Rupee rises 2 paise to 83.12 against US dollar

Mumbai, Jan 18:

The rupee appreciated 2 paise to settle at 83.12 (provisional) against the US dollar on Thursday, tracking a weak American currency against major rivals overseas. A weak trend in domestic equity markets and rising crude oil prices kept the movement of the domestic currency restricted, forex traders said. At the interbank foreign exchange, the domestic currency opened at 83.16 and traded in the range of 83.10 to 83.18 against the



greenback. The unit finally settled at 83.12 against the dollar, registering a gain of 2 paise over its previous close.

Bank of Maharashtra net profit rises 34% at Rs 1,036 crore

New Delhi, Jan 18:

The Pune-based lender had posted a net profit of Rs 775 crore in the same quarter a year ago. Its total income increased to Rs 5,851 crore during the quarter under review against Rs 4,770 crore in the same period last year. Speaking about quarterly numbers BoM MD & CEO AS Rajeev said, "The net interest income (NII) grew by 24.56 per cent to Rs 2,466 crore against Rs 1,980 crore in the year-ago period. The bank earned an interest income of Rs 5,171 crore during the quarter compared to Rs 4,129 crore a year ago." Rajeev further said, "Operating profit has shown a growth of 27.32 per cent to Rs 2,012 crore from Rs 1,580 crore in Q3 FY23. The bank was able to reduce gross non-performing assets (NPAs) to 2.04 per

cent of the gross loans by the end of December 2023 from 2.94 per cent a year ago. Similarly, its net NPAs or bad loans came down to 0.22 per cent from 0.47 per cent at the end of the third quarter of the previous fiscal. Its provision coverage ratio improved to 98.40 per cent from 97.18 per cent at the end of December 2022. Net interest margin (NIM) of the bank rose to 3.95 per cent from 3.60 per cent in the same quarter a year ago." Going forward, Rajeev said, "The NIM is expected to be in the range of 3.75-4 per cent in the fourth quarter. The total Basel III Capital adequacy ratio stood at 16.85 per cent, with a Common Equity Tier 1 ratio of 11.56 per cent at the end of the December quarter."

Air passenger traffic in India expected to reach 300 million by 2030: Scindia

Hyderabad, Jan 18:

The number of domestic air passengers in India is expected to double to about 300 million annually by 2030 and the country would still have a vast untapped market, Union Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia said on Thursday. Speaking at the inaugural session of Wings India 2024, a civil aviation conclave and exhibition here, Scindia said India under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in the last decade has been a "shining star" on the global firmament of civil aviation. He said the number of airports and waterdromes will go up to over 200 from the existing 149 in the country. With 300 million passengers a year in 2030, India's aviation penetration would be at 10-15 per cent and still be a potential market in the decades to come. "That is the potential that India holds not only to herself and Asia, but to the world. ...even with achieving



300 million domestic passengers by 2030, we will still be

one of the most under-penetrated markets across the top 20 in the world. Today our penetration is roughly about 3 to 4 per cent that will grow to about 10 to 15 per cent. We still have 85 per cent penetration to go," he said.

Under the guidance of PM Modi, steps have been taken to create capacities, remove bottlenecks and simplify processes and procedures and ensure that in 2047, the aviation sector in the country supports a USD 20 Trillion economy in the country, Scindia said.

Dhamtari: Challenges, expectations and unfulfilled promises

No well-groomed pond, Gokul Nagar, hi-tech bus stand, multi-level parking are still in limbo

tives to address the city's pressing issues and fulfill the demands that have been pending for years.

Makai Chowk in Dhamtari serves as a crucial entry point for those travelling from the capital, Bastar. Despite the deployment of two constables for traffic control, the situation on the National Highway, including Sadar, remains chaotic, with never-ending traffic snarls and frequent accidents.

The cattle issue persists from the wards to the National Highway, adding to the challenges. Promised developments like Gokulnagar, a hi-tech bus stand, pond beautification, and the Gol Bazaar project still elude the city.

Market areas remain cramped, and the dust from rice mills continues to trouble residents. Unfinished projects like shopping complex relocation, PM Awas Colony auditorium, and water augmentation scheme phase-2 further exacerbate the city's woes. Despite being included in the budget annually, these plans remain unrealized.

1. Hi-tech Bus Stand: The existing bus stand in Dhamtari faces space constraints and disorganization due to poor shop construction.



proximately Rs 10 crore.

3. Transport Nagar: Dhamtari faces a parking challenge for 200 buses, 1200 trucks, 1000 autos, and other vehicles, including cargo ones. The proposal for a Transport City has been in the budget for a decade, with regular appeals to the government for attention to this issue.

3. Gokul Nagar: The persistent issue of stray cattle roaming the city streets affects more than 30 wards. Despite being included in budget plans for years, Gokul Nagar, proposed in Soram-Bhatgaon, remains unrealized under both past and present city

administrations.

4. Pond Beautification: Dhamtari, known as the city of ponds, boasts 22 ponds, none of which are properly maintained. Proposals worth lakhs of rupees have been submitted to the government for pond improvements, with Rs 3 crore approved for 8 ponds. Regrettably, work on any of these ponds has yet to commence.

Mayor Vijay Dewangan highlighted accomplishments over the past four years, securing approvals exceeding Rs 130 crore. Notably, Rs 30 crore was allocated for drainage improvements and Rs 35 crore for Water Augmentation Scheme Phase-2, both in progress.

Road networks expanded, societies saw construction progress, and National Highways were illuminated with 500-700 high mast lights under the Chief Minister's Urban Electrification Scheme.

The Urban Slum Health Scheme reached every home, focusing on Pauni Pasari, Chowpatty, and electricity NOC work. Electronic curation facility approval during the pandemic is now under construction.

Initiatives include Barthan bank, pond beautification, clinics in 7 wards, city footpaths, and

"Development will take place in Dhamtari only when there are only development talks and work, leaving aside the politics of personal interest and credit. FRESH FINDINGS

- Owned by Kerala CM's daughter

Thiruvananthapuram, Jan 18 (PTI): Accusations against the company owned by Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan's daughter T Veena continue to rock Kerala politics, with the opposition Congress-led UDF on Thursday demanding a central agency investigation into fresh allegations about its illicit transactions.

Leader of Opposition in the State Assembly V D Sathesans demanded a CBI or Enforcement Directorate (ED) investigation into the allegations

surrounding the now-defunct IT company of Vijayan's daughter, T Veena. This comes in the wake of reported findings by the Registrar of Companies (ROC) against the company.

Quoting the said ROC report, he said offences of receiving money using false documents and without providing services have been committed under sections 447 and 448 of the Companies Act.

The grand-old party questioned whether the ongoing probe initiated by the Corporate Affairs Ministry was part of a political settlement between the ruling CPI(M) and the BJP. The saffron party re-

jected the charges of a secret pact and asserted that the guilty would be punished.

As the opposition intensified its criticism of the CM and his daughter over the issue, the ruling CPI(M) reiterated that the central investigation against Veena's company was a "politically motivated" move ahead of the Lok Sabha polls.

Political reactions emerged following a section of the media releasing the said report recently submitted by the Bengaluru-headquartered ROC to the Centre. This report contained adverse remarks against the IT firm.

Based on the ROC's re-

port, the Ministry of Corporate Affairs recently ordered an investigation into complaints about financial transactions between private minerals company CMRL and Veena's IT firm Exalogic.

Neither the chief minister nor his daughter have reacted on the issue.

Stepping up his attack on CM Vijayan and the CPI(M), Sathesans said Veena's IT firm has failed to submit any documents regarding its legitimate transactions with the minerals company. He said there was no record to prove that Exalogic had provided software services to the Kochi-based minerals company.

Man climbs high voltage tower in Kerala demanding house

Comes down after over six hours

Kottayam (Kerala), Jan 18 (PTI): A small village in this southern Kerala district on Thursday morning witnessed hours-long dramatic scenes when a man climbed up a high voltage tower demanding a house for his family as well as seeking to meet Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and actor-politician Suresh Gopi.

A fire official told PTI that when they tried to get onto the over 80 feet tall tower to rescue him, the man, a resident of Erattupetta, threatened to climb further up.

"So, we came back down," the official said.

Finally, at around 12 noon, after panchayat officials assured him that his demand for a house would be addressed, he came down from the tower and was taken into police custody.

'More girls than boys aspire to continue studying after class 12'

ASER 2023 REPORT

New Delhi, Jan 18 (PTI): More girls aspire to continue studying after class 12 than boys, the Annual Status for Education Report, 2023 has revealed.

The report is based on a survey and found that the reasons behind the trend included -- the girls' belief that education would enable them to become better homemakers and also their interest in studying.

In general, boys were able to take or at least shape these decisions: if they were not interested in studying further, they could drop out regardless of their family's preferences. Among girls, these decisions were often not in their hands, the report said. "In the ASER

2023 survey findings, a larger proportion of boys than girls reported not wanting to study after class 12. During the discussion, girls discussed wanting to study at least to undergraduate level, while boys talked about the likelihood of discontinuing their education after completing their schooling," the report said.

"Among girls, shifting social norms with regard to the appropriate age of marriage emerged as a key driver of young women's ability to study further. Most girls talked about how they expected to get married only at the age of 21 or 22, giving them time to continue to study until then. "However, even though this perceived increase in the appropriate age

of marriage enabled higher secondary and college level studies to be a socially acceptable pathway for these girls, further education was rarely connected to better preparedness for the job market," it added.

The ASER 2023 'Beyond Basics' survey was conducted in 28 districts across 26 states, reaching a total of 34,745 youths in the age group 14-18 years. One rural district was surveyed in each major state, except for Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh, where two rural districts were surveyed.

ASER is a nationwide citizen-led household survey that provides a snapshot of the status of children's schooling and learning in rural India. First implemented in 2005, the

'basic' ASER survey was conducted annually until 2014 and switched to an alternate-year cycle in 2016.

The 'basic' ASER collects information about the enrolment in preschool and school for children in the age group of three to 16 and assesses children aged five to 16 one-on-one to understand their foundational reading and arithmetic abilities.

In the intervening years, ASER dives deeper into different aspects of children's schooling and learning in rural India.

Manipur is divided and the prime minister has not even once visited the state. Violence has been continuing for months now. People

are dying and houses are being burnt, and peace has not returned yet," he added. In Nagaland, a framework agreement (to bring about a solution to the Naga political issue) was signed nine years ago and people are now asking what happened to it as the Prime Minister has not spoken about it at all, the Congress MP said.

Countering the BJP's statement that such marches will not benefit the Congress, Gandhi said last year's 'Bharat Jodo Yatra'
