PREZ R-DAY ADDRESS

'75th year a historic milestone'

New Delhi, Jan 25:



Addressing the nation on the eve of the 75th Republic Day, President Droupadi Murmu expressed pride over how far the country has travelled despite adversities, calling the 75th year of the Republic a "truly historic milestone" for the nation. "Tomorrow is the day when we celebrate the commencement of the Constitution. Its Preamble begins with the words "We, the People of India", highlighting the theme of the document, namely, democracy. In India, democratic system is much older than the concept of western democracy. That is the reason why India is called the 'mother of democracy', she said.

For this, I will appeal to all my fellow citizens to abide by our Fundamental Duties enshrined in the Constitution. These duties are essential obligations of every citizen towards making Bharat a developed nation when it completes 100 years of independence. Here, I think of Mahatma Gandhi who had rightly said, 'No people have risen

who thought only of rights. Only those did so who thought of duties,' she said. President droupadi Murmu said the Constituent Assembly had spent nearly three years holding detailed discussions on all aspects of governance and produced the great founding document of our nation - the Constitution of India. "Today, the nation gratefully remembers the leaders as well as the officials who contributed to the framing of our splendid and inspiring Constitution," she said. In her speech to the nation, President droupadi Murmu called the late Karpoori Thakur, who has been conferred the Bharat Ratna this year, "a tireless champion of social justice" and "greatest advocates of backward classes".

31 CBI officers get police medals on R-Day

New Delhi, Jan 25 (PTI): CBI officers who probed big corruption cases like coal and Delhi excise policy scams and the Nirav Modi case were among 31 former and serving agency personnel who

were awarded police medals by the President on the occasion of Republic Day, officials said on Thursday. Former Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) joint director Amit Kumar, who is now posted as Chhattisgarh Police ADG, led the probe into the coal scam that resulted in convictions in a number of cases. He has been awarded the coveted President's Police Medal for Distinguished Service, they said. During his stint in the CBI, Kumar held many crucial positions, including that of joint director (Policy). He was instrumental in supervising probes against online child sexual abuse, cyber-crimes and economic frauds. He also investigated the Bharatpur riots case and was part of the G-20 Anti-Corruption Working Group (Kolkata, Rishikesh and Bali), according to the officials.

Buzz on Nitish's return to BJP

Amid rift in INDIA bloc

New Delhi, Jan 25 (PTI): Signs of deepening fissures between Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and his INDIA bloc allies have given rise to the possibility of his return to the BJP fold amid hectic ef-

forts within the opposition camp to stall any such development. On a day RJD president Lalu Prasad's daughter Rohini Acharya took a swipe at Kumar for "changing his ideology as the wind changes its direction" in posts on 'X' following the JD(U) president's swipe at parties promoting family members in politics, a BJP leader well-versed with the state's politics said the party will be guided by its future political imperatives, and not past bitterness.

He, however, noted that any call has to be taken by the party's top brass. The BJP has been showing signs of warming up to Kumar, who has swapped his alliance preference between the saffron party and the RJD-Congress-Left camp frequently while remaining in power, with its leaders toning down their criticism of him of late and even praising him at times. Union Home Minister Amit Shah himself sounded more open to such a possibility in a recent interview. Asked about the likelihood of the Janata Dal (U) president's return to the BJP-led alliance, Shah said the party will consider if such a proposal is ever made.

Earlier, Shah had often asserted that the doors had been closed for Kumar's return to the country's ruling alliance. Bihar's longest-serving chief minister has been cut up with the INDIA bloc for not getting a position in the alliance commensurate with his stature and also favours an early assembly poll to go with the Lok Sabha elections, a suggestion which has not drawn a positive response from the RJD, the biggest party in the state's ruling alliance, sources said.

JD(U) and RJD leaders have also been sniping at each other amid apprehensions among Kumar's supporters that their ally has been trying to undermine him in matters of governance as well as politics.



Energy Conservation Building Code will be implemented in new commercial buildings

Energy Conservation Building Code information given to stakeholders by CREDA

Raipur, Jan 25:

Chhattisgarh Energy Conservation Building Code (CECBC) has been created to promote energy conservation by making necessary improvements in the design and structure of new commercial buildings in Chhattisgarh. This code will improve the energy efficiency of new commercial buildings. This code will prove useful for reducing electricity consumption as well as for environmental protection. The use of renewable energy will also be encouraged in this new code. With the help of State Renewable Energy Development Agency (CREDA) and Bureau of Energy Efficiency, Government of India, Chhattisgarh, a stakeholders' meeting was organized to provide



detailed information about the Chhattisgarh Energy Conservation Building Code. Chief Executive Officer Rajesh Singh Rana said that Energy Conservation Building Code is an important regulatory measure in bringing energy efficiency in commercial buildings and new buildings. The energy requirement of buildings constructed using this code will be reduced by 25 to 30 percent. He said that notification of the rules of energy conservation building

code is under process. Implementation of this code will result in saving of at least 3 crore units of electricity per year through new commercial buildings. He also said that this has to be included in the building rules, building permission process and SOR with the cooperation of stakeholders. Speaking at the programme, Managing Director of Chhattisgarh State Electricity Distribution Company, Manoj Khare said that since most of

the thermal power plants are coal based and the electricity produced in the state is exported to many other states, the burden of carbon emissions through the industrial sector is already high. These emissions are increasing due to the development of Chhattisgarh's building construction sector and infrastructure. To save our environment, energy efficiency initiatives should be implemented in various sectors like industries, buildings, transport, discoms and municipalities. The cumulative savings of each sector would be able to achieve substantial savings in greenhouse gas emissions.

At the meeting, Mohit Tripathi, Sustainability Consultant and Building Energy Expert, Design Occupancy Services, Jaipur, made a technical presentation on how to move forward for an integrated approach from all stakeholders for the implementation of CGCEBC in the state.

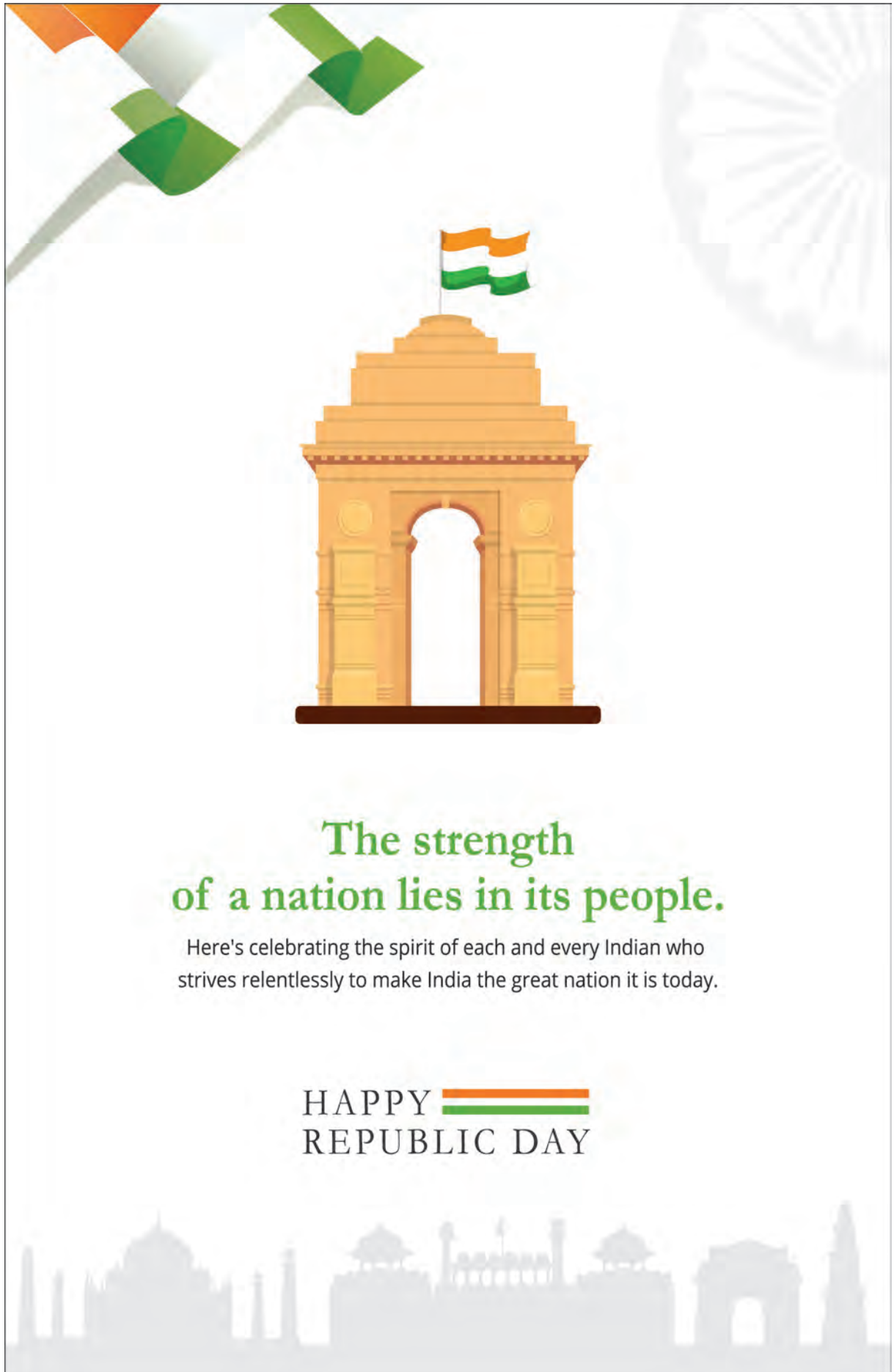

chanics, and more. To bolster evidence for enforcement, sound measuring instruments and videography will be employed.

Additionally, authorities are tasked with identifying festive locations, silence zones, and other noise-sensitive areas. Joint task forces will swiftly take action, presenting compelling evidence in the appropriate courts. The initiative extends to processions, rallies, festivals, weddings, and other mass gatherings, where evidence collection and enforcement will be executed promptly and efficiently.

Mamata's Solo Act Challenges for Rahul

The political landscape in India is no stranger to heated exchanges and personal jibes, but the ongoing tussle between Rahul Gandhi and Mamata Banerjee is taking the rivalry to new heights. As Rahul Gandhi embarks on his ambitious Manipur-Mumbai yatra, aimed at covering 100 Lok Sabha seats, he finds himself facing not just political opposition, but also a formidable challenge from within his own party's past. The bitterness between Rahul Gandhi and Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, who once shared the same political platform, has escalated to a point where personal egos seem to have eclipsed rational discourse. Sarma, on the other hand, has threatened to have Gandhi arrested after the upcoming Lok Sabha elections. This acrimony between former allies paints a stark picture of the political climate. While Gandhi's yatra initially seemed like a promising outreach effort before the elections, the situation has grown more complicated as it enters West Bengal. Mamata Banerjee, the feisty Chief Minister of the state, has made it abundantly clear that her party, the Trinamool Congress (TMC), intends to contest all 42 Lok Sabha seats in West Bengal independently. This stance has disrupted the seat-sharing plans of the 28-party INDIA bloc, overshadowing Gandhi's yatra. Negotiating political alliances requires finesse and a willingness to compromise, yet the tough posturing from both sides threatens to derail any prospects of cooperation. As Rahul Gandhi navigates this treacherous political terrain, his ability to employ diplomacy and reconciliation will be put to the test. The paramount goal right now is to "INDIA jodo," to unite India under a common banner. However, the clashes between prominent leaders within the opposition do not bode well for the larger cause of unifying the nation against the ruling party. In an era where unity and collaboration are essential to counterbalance the dominant political force, the ongoing animosity between Rahul Gandhi and Mamata Banerjee serves as a stark reminder of the challenges ahead. In the realm of politics, personal egos and rivalries have the potential to overshadow the greater good. As the Lok Sabha elections draw near, it remains to be seen whether these two leaders can set aside their differences and work towards a shared vision for India. The fate of the opposition's unity and the electoral landscape itself may hinge on their ability to do so.

A Solar Revolution

India has taken a giant leap towards a brighter and more sustainable future. The government's recent announcement of the Pradhan Mantri Suryodaya Yojana, aimed at installing rooftop solar power systems in one crore households, marks a significant milestone in the nation's energy journey. With a relentless need to reduce its heavy reliance on petroleum product imports, India's renewed focus on solar energy couldn't have come at a better time. This endeavour is not India's first foray into solar energy. In 2014, the government launched the Rooftop Solar Programme with the ambitious goal of achieving 40 gigawatts (GW) of cumulative installed capacity by 2022. Despite an extension until 2026, the target remained elusive. Now, the Pradhan Mantri Suryodaya Yojana represents a fresh attempt to realize that 40 GW dream, with the potential to transform the nation's energy landscape. The impact of this scheme extends far beyond the promise of reduced electricity bills for the middle class and impoverished citizens. It aligns seamlessly with India's aspiration to attain self-reliance in the energy sector. As of December 2023, India boasts a solar power installed capacity of approximately 73.31 GW, with rooftop solar contributing 11.08 GW to this impressive figure. Rajasthan leads the pack with 18.7 GW in total solar capacity, closely followed by Gujarat with 10.5 GW. In the rooftop solar capacity arena, Gujarat is the front-runner with 2.8 GW, trailed by Maharashtra at 1.7 GW. These statistics underscore solar power's integral role in India's renewable energy capacity, which currently stands at around 180 GW. According to the International Energy Agency's World Energy Outlook, India is poised to experience the most substantial growth in energy demand globally over the next three decades. This necessitates the development of a reliable energy source beyond coal plants. India's commitment to achieving 500 GW of renewable energy by 2030 underscores the urgency of expanding its solar power capacity. From less than 10 MW in 2010, India's solar capacity has surged to a remarkable 70.10 GW by 2023. Prime Minister Modi's announcement of a solar energy scheme for the poor and low-income groups, immediately following the Ram Temple ceremony, demonstrates the government's genuine commitment to the cause. This initiative is not a mere political stunt, but a sincere endeavor to harness the abundant sunshine that graces India for 250-300 days each year. Mobilizing residential power consumers across the nation to adopt solar systems on a large scale is part of the government's strategy to capitalize on this natural advantage. A report by the Council on Energy, Environment, and Water, released in November 2023, reveals that over 25 crore households in India possess the potential to install a staggering 637 GW of solar energy capacity on rooftops. Despite this vast potential, only 2.7 GW is currently installed in the residential sector. This discrepancy emphasizes the urgent need to make grid-connected solar rooftop power systems accessible and manageable for all, especially in rural areas where electricity supply remains erratic. The benefits of solar energy are manifold. It provides a domestic and abundant source of energy, reducing dependence on foreign imports and enhancing energy security. Furthermore, solar energy is clean, renewable, and free from carbon emissions and pollutants. Its widespread adoption can significantly diminish India's reliance on fossil fuels, combat greenhouse gas emissions, and contribute to the fight against climate change. India, as one of the most vulnerable countries to climate change, has a crucial role to play in fulfilling its international commitments under the Paris Agreement. By embracing solar energy, the nation can aspire to achieve its net-zero target by 2070, demonstrating its unwavering dedication to a sustainable and resilient future. The Pradhan Mantri Suryodaya Yojana is not just a scheme; it is a catalyst for transformation. It represents India's determination to lead the way in renewable energy, to secure its energy future, and to protect the planet. With the power of the sun at its disposal and the government's sincere intent, India is poised for a solar revolution that will light up homes, create jobs, and leave a lasting legacy for generations to come.

Press Freedom is essential for democracy

Each time a political party in power is unable to withstand public criticism; it considers tightening the screw on the media. The freedom of the press depends upon free functioning of government. So the government should try to keep the press free. Only a free press can serve the people best. There is lot of controversy about freedom of Press. What would be the duty of the Press, if it finds that the administrative machinery of a particular government is sloth, or its economic policy is extremely sluggish and the government would not care to implement the promises made to the electorate?

Now a journalist must carefully study both points of view and he should shape his own career as per the dictates of his own conscience. Mrs Gandhi's father, Mr Jawahar Lal Nehru was of course extremely liberal. He once said, "I am against any sort of restrictions on Press, in spite of the fact that I know there is danger in such a policy." But if followed as advocated by Nehru, there may emerge a situation in the state which might be difficult to manage. Irresponsible men in the profession of 'Journalism' are those who may cause national or international complications by scurrilous and irresponsible writings. Thus the question arises whether reasonable restrictions on press's freedom are desirable or a complete press freedom is desirable?

In fact, a very senior and well known journalist wrote almost in identical forms a letter to Mrs Indira Gandhi during the emergency period in 1974. He drew her attention to the restriction imposed on newspapers. A conscientious journalist must weigh the viewpoints very carefully and draw his own conclusion independently. But, what Mrs Gandhi's Sachivalaya wrote in reply is also remarkable: "Because of the restrictions imposed on newspapers, situa-

tion in the entire country has changed during the past days. Freedom of Press is only a part of the freedom of individuals and all over the world in times of emergency this freedom is curbed. Besides, the Press has used the freedom of press in an unwanted manner. Not only false and mischievous reports have found its way in the Press, but these have been innumerable instances of inadvertent and malicious writings in mass newspapers."

Bulldozer action on house of main accused in murder of cow shelter worker

Kawardha, Jan 25: Authorities on Thursday demolished a shop and other "illegal" encroachment in the front portion of the house of the main accused in the murder of a cow shelter worker in Kawardha city, officials said.

Sadhram Yadav, a gau sevak (cow shelter worker), was killed allegedly by six persons on the night of January 21 on the outskirts of Kawardha when he was heading to his village Lalpur on a bicycle. Yadav died after his throat was slit.

According to the police, Ayaj Khan was the main accused among the five adults arrested in this connection, while a minor was detained.



A shop had been allegedly "illegally" built in the front portion of Khan's house and no requisite permission was obtained from the civic body for using the residential premises for commercial purposes, Kabirdham Superintendent of Police Abhishek Pallava said.

The Kawardha municipal

pal council staffers along with police personnel reached his house on Thursday morning and demolished the illegal construction and encroachment using a bulldozer, he said.

The administration will take similar action against those committing serious offences in future, he



added.

Asked if the other accused in the murder case would face bulldozer action, the SP said Khan was the mastermind. Details about the illegal construction of other accused are being collected and the administration will act accordingly, he said.

Nine cases, including

dacoity, were already registered against Khan in Karwadha. He was also accused in the 2021 flag removal case, Pallava said.

On October 3, 2021, a clash broke out between people belonging to two communities over the removal of religious flags from a thoroughfare in Kawardha town.

Corporator urges BMO to host disability certification camp

anything but that. Jaiswal and Rohit added 80 runs in just 12.1 overs to give their side a wonderful launching pad. The most impactful work, though, happened either side of lunch after England had made a quick start against Jasprit Bumrah and

Mohammed Siraj. Well not as quick as India's, but still you will take 41 for 0 in eight overs against two bowlers of that quality any day of the week. Especially when you have edged or missed 12 balls in that period of play.

India women beats Namibia 7-2, enter QFs of Hockey5s WC

Muscat, Jan 25 (PTI): The Indian women's team stormed into the quarterfinals of the FIH Hockey5s Women's World Cup after thrashing Namibia 7-2 here on Thursday. 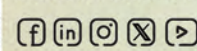
