#### **Futala Lake**

New Delhi: The Supreme Court has extended till March 21 the order asking the Maharashtra government and its metro rail corporation not to carry out any construction activity at the famous Futala Lake in Nagpur. Initially, on January 25, a bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud had stayed the ongoing construction at the lake, built by the Bhosle dynasty to which Maratha King Chhatrapati Shivaji belonged, over 60 acres of land. It was hearing a petition filed by NGO 'Swaach Association, Nagpur'.

#### **CISF** march ■ Thane: Central Industrial

Security Force jawans and police carried out route marches in Kasara and Vashind areas of Thane district as part of the law and order maintenance drill in view of the upcoming Lok Sabha polls, an official said on Friday. The route march was carried out under the guidance of Thane (Rural) **Superintendent of Police** DS Swami and Additional SP Deepali Ghate on March 5-6 in Kasara, Shirol, Veluk and Vashala under Kasara police station limits and Vashind Bazarpeth, Vashind West, Khativali and Sarmal under Vashind police station limits, the official said. "These are considered vulnerable villages. Similarly, route marches were also carried out in Navghar and Bhayander police station limits on March 5.

**IT raid** ■ Patna: Income Tax sleuths on Friday searched the premises linked to Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) MLC Vinod Jaiswal over an alleged tax evasion case. sources said. The raid was conducted by I-T officials of the West Bengal unit, they said. # **Bhupesh Baghel to contest LS elections from Rajnandgaon**

Rahul Gandhi fielded from Wayanad


New Delhi, Mar 08 (PTI)

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi will contest the Lok Sabha polls from Kerala's Wayanad again, the party announced on Friday as it released its first list of 39 candidates. Congress general secre-

tary K C Venugopal will contest from Alappuzha (Kerala), former Chhattisgarh chief minister Bhupesh Baghel from Rajnandgaon, Jyotsna Mahant from Korba, Tamradhwaj Sahu from Mahasamund and Shashi Tharoor Thiruvananthapuram.

Venugopal said the list has 15 general category candidates while 24 are from the SC, ST, OBC and minority communities.

Congress treasurer Ajay Maken said the list has a good mix of youth and experience. The announcement came a day after the Congress' Central Election Committee (CEC) finalised the names for the upcom-



ing Lok Sabha elections after having a discussion on over 60 Lok Sabha seats from 11 states and union territories

The CEC meeting which was chaired by party president Mallikarjun Kharge. Discussions were held

on Lok Sabha seats in

Delhi, Karnataka, Kerala, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Tripura, Sikkim, Nagaland, Manipur, Meghalaya Lakshwadeep. "We are in election mode and on an aggressive path of campaigning with Rahul Gandhi undertaking the Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra which is in Gujarat," Venugopal said.

The Nyay Yatra will end on March 17 in Mumbai with a mammoth rally planned and Congress president Kharge is writ-

ing to all INDIA bloc part-

ners to attend that rally, he

Kharge, former party chief Sonia Gandhi and Venugopal, as well as other senior leaders who are part of the CEC were present at the meeting.

There is speculation that Rahul Gandhi may also contest from Amethi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra from Rae Bareli, a seat which was previously held by Sonia Gandhi. Both the seats are considered bastions of the Gandhi family and the local units of the Congress have demanded that the two scions of the Congress first family should contest from there.

Rahul Gandhi, who was previously an MP from Amethi, lost the seat in 2019 but won from Wayanad in Kerala.

Dantewada, Mar 08 (PTI): Chhattisgarh Minister Vishnu Deo Sai on Friday appealed to the Naxalites to join the mainstream by leaving the path of violence, and said his government was open to holding a dialogue with

The BJP government in the state will fulfill their every legitimate demand if they were ready for talks, he said.

The chief minister made the statement while interacting with women personnel from District Reserve Guard, Bastar Fighters and Danteshwari Fighters, all units of the state police engaged in anti-Naxal opera-Jawanga tions. at Hub Education Dantewada district on International Women's Day. Sumitra Sahu, a DRG commando posted in Narayanpur, spoke about her ordeal when she was a Naxalite. Sahu, who was an active Naxalite for 14 years, quit the outlawed

CPI (Maoist) in 2018 and was subsequently recruited in the police force.

CM Sai said he saluted her valour. "I would like to tell our local people who are Naxalites to quit Naxalism. They should live like ordinary people do, and hold dialogue (with the government) and tell what problem they have with the government. Their every legitimate demand will be fulfilled by the Chhattisgarh government," the chief minister said.

"I too hail from a tribal community and village, and therefore I understand the pain of tribals and villagers. They should hold dialogue with us without getting influenced (by others). They should hold talks about their demands. Today, on Women's Day, I would like to appeal to them to join the main-stream of development and (we are) ready for dialogue," he added.

Prime Modi an-Narendra nounced a reduction of Rs 100 in cooking gas cylinder prices on Friday on the occasion of International Women's Day. This will significantly ease the financial burden on millions of households across the country, especially benefiting "Nari Shakti" (women power), he said in a post

on X. "By making cooking gas more affordable, we also aim to support the well-being of families and ensure a healthier environment. This is in line with our commitment to empowering women and ensuring Ease of Living' for them," he said. In a related decision, the government on Thursday announced the extension of Rs 300 per LPG cylinder subsidy to poor women

#### LPG price cut height of political cynicism: TMC Kolkata, Mar 08 (PTI): The Trinamool Congress on

Friday criticised Prime Minister Narendra Modi's announcement of a cut in LPG cylinder prices, asserting that the move was the "limit of political cynicism" ahead of the Lok Sabha polls. New Delhi, Mar 08 (PTI):

The time has come to enlighten and educate the police machinery about the concept of freedom of speech and expression, the Supreme Court has said and set aside an order of the Bombay High Court against an academic accused of criticising the abrogation of Article 370 that bestowed special status on Jammu and Kashmir and greeting the citizens of Pakistan on the country's Independence

The Maharashtra Police had registered an FIR against professor Javed Hajam Hatkanangale police station in Kolhapur under Section 153A (promotion of communal disharmony) of the Indian Penal WhatsApp messages that denounced the abrogation of Article 370 and congratulated the people of Pakistan on Independence day.

"August 5-Black Day

August-Happy '14th Independence Pakistan," he had written on WhatsApp.

"Now, the time has come to enlighten and educate our police machinery on the concept of freedom of speech and expression guaranteed by Article 19(1)(a) of the Constitution and the extent of reasonable restraint on their free speech and expression. They must be sensitised about the democratic values enshrined in our Constitution," a bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan said.

If a citizen of India extends good wishes to the citizens of Pakistan on 14th August, which is their Independence Day, there is nothing wrong with it, the apex court observed.

"Our country has been a democratic republic for more than 75 years. The people of our country know the importance of democratic Therefore, it is not possible to conclude that the

disharmony or feelings of enmity, hatred or ill-will between different religious groups. "The test to be applied is

not the effect of the words on some individuals with weak minds or who see a danger in every hostile point of view. The test is of the general impact of the utterances on reasonable people who are significant in numbers," the bench Merely because a few in-

dividuals may develop hatred or ill will, it will not be sufficient to attract Section 153-A of the IPC, it

The court said continuation of the prosecution of the appellant for the offence punishable under Section 153-A of the IPC will be a "gross abuse" of the process of law.

'Accordingly, we set aside the impugned judgment dated April 10, 2023 of the High Court of Judicature at Bombay and quash the impugned FIR," the bench said.

# Kerala unveils first AI teacher in a school

Thiruvananthapuram, Mar 08 (PTI): "What is the most expensive thing in the world," was a question asked by a student from the KTCT Higher Secondary School in Kallambalam here loudly, even as a humanoid draped in a saree listened attentively.

A necklace on the humanoid changed colour from green to orange, and it shook its head before giving out the answer with informative details as other children curiously listened. This silk sareedraped humanoid is 'Iris', the first AI teacher unveiled in Kerala.

A disturbed network connection and the chatter from the children often slowed down Iris as it tried to catch the noises, pre-

suming them to be questions asked to 'her'. And when there were too many noises. Iris took time to process the question. But when the hall was

silent and a student asked a question, either from their syllabus or anything under the sun, Iris gave out the answer in no time, with examples and references. "Our next step is to give her 'eyes' so that she will identify each student and answer their questions. She would be becoming more interactive and completely automated," said Abhijith, an 8th standard student and one of the students who closely worked with Makerlabs **Edutech Private Limited** in the development of this

AI-based teacher as part of

an initiative of the Atal

Tinkering Lab at the school. He said that the AI teacher will not be able to answer the questions of the children if the classroom is noisy, so this teacher will make children more disciplined.

"The children are very excited, especially the lower KG students. They like this 'teacher' because she never gets angry or irritated and always has an answer to their questions. She also does not ask questions and never gives homework Suresh, the principal of the KTCT Higher Secondary School, told

### SC to hear on Mar 11 SBI's plea seeking extension of time to disclose details

New Delhi, Mar 08 (PTI): A five-judge constitution

bench of the Supreme Court will hear on March 11 an application filed by the State Bank of India (SBI) seeking extension of time till June 30 to disclose details of each electoral bond encashed by political parties before the scheme was scrapped last

The bench, headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud, will also hear a separate plea which has sought initiation of contempt action against the SBI alleging it "wilfully and deliberately" disobeyed the apex court's direction to submit details of the contributions made to political parties through electoral bonds to the

**Election Commission by March** 6. In a landmark verdict delivered on February 15, a fivejudge constitution bench had scrapped the Centre's electoral bonds scheme of anonymous political funding, calling it "unconstitutional" and order ing disclosure by the Election Commission of the donors, the amount donated by them and the recipients by March 13. Ordering closure of the

scheme forthwith, the top court had directed the SBI, the authorised financial institution under the scheme, to submit by March 6 the details of the electoral bonds purchased since April 12, 2019 till date to the **Election Commission which** was asked to publish the information on its official website by March 13.

Lord Shankar's identity is the ashes of the cremation ground on his body, a necklace of snakes around his neck, poison in his throat, the holy Ganga in his 'Jatas' (string of hair) and the

destructive flame on his forehead. It is believed that bathing in the confluence of Mahanadi, Sondhur and Pari not only purifies the body but also removes the impurity of the mind. On this day there is also a tradition of taking dry hoist on the dry sand of Sangam. It is believed that Bholenath visits the fair in disguise.

Raipur, Mar 08: Labour Lakhanlal Dewangan on Thursday in the meeting of the Board of Directors of Chhattisgarh Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board in the building of Labour Welfare Board located in Nava Raipur for the implementation of public welfare schemes for the welfare and protection of construction workers for the financial year 2024-25 approved the annual budget of Rs 524.06 cr.

# Global South believes in India: Jaishankar

China does not participate in voicing their concerns

Tokyo, Mar 08 (PTI):

Highlighting India's leadership in the Global South, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Friday said the 125 countries of the platform placed their trust in India and not in China which skipped the two meetings convened by India last year to listen to their concerns. Addressing the Nikkei Forum on the India-Japan partnership here, India's top diplomat said that countries of the Global South feel for each other on several issues.

"On a lot of issues, these countries feel for each other. The feeling has been intensified by COVID because many countries of the Global South felt that they were the last in the line to get the vaccine. They even felt at the time



when India became G20 President that their concerns were not even on the agenda of the G20.

'So we did last year two meetings of the voice of the Global South because we wanted to listen to these 125 countries and then put before the G20 a set of issues which were the collective views of these 125 countries

Within Asia and Africa. Global South is very popular in those continents. They know exactly what is happening, who's speaking up for them, and how their issues are getting on the table.

"They don't think it is a coincidence that it was under the Indian presidency that the African Union, which had long been promised a seat in the G20. got a seat. So the Global South believes us," he said. "The two summits which we convened last year to listen to their concerns, I don't believe was present,' Jaishankar said, referring to 1st Voice of Global South Summit 2023 held in January and the 2nd Voice of Global South Summit in November last year.

The ties between India and China nosedived significantly following the fierce clash in the Galwan Valley in June 2020 that marked the most serious military conflict between the two sides in decades. About India's relation-

ship with Russia and its criticism of Moscow's war in Ukraine, he said: "Sometimes in world politics, countries pick one issue, one situation, one principle and they highlight it because it suits them. But if one looks at the principle itself, we in India know better than almost any other country.

"Immediately after our independence, we experienced aggression, an effort to change our boundaries and even today parts of India are occupied by another country but we did not see the world respond saying, oh, there's a great principle involved and therefore, let us all go with

# **Democracy and freedom under 'threat'** in US and world under Trump: Biden

US President Joe Biden delivered a feisty speech on Thursday to defend his policies before skeptical voters in an election year as he launched a vitriolic attack on his Republican rival Donald Trump who he said was a "threat" to democracy within the country and globally.

Without taking the name of Trump, Biden, a Democrat, in his final State of the Union Address to the joint session of the US Congress, less than eight months ahead of the presidential elections, identified him as "my predecessor", which he mentioned as many as 13 times in his speech that lasted for over an hour.

Following Super Tuesday primary contests, it has become clear that it will be a rematch of 2022 in the November 5,



2024 presidential elections.

Biden, 81, who is the oldest American president, slammed Trump, 77, on several issues ranging from his recent comment on Russian President Vladimir Putin, immigration, January 6 insurrection, abortion, and gun

"A president, my predecessor, who failed the most basic duty. Any President owes American people the duty to care. That is unforgivable," Biden, said amidst multiple standing ovations from Democratic Party lawmakers.

"Now, my predecessor, former Republican President, tells Putin, "Do whatever the hell you Α American President actually said that, bowing down to a Russian leader. It's outrageous. It's dangerous. It's unacceptable," Biden said.

Trump recently said he would encourage Russia to do "whatever the hell they want" to any NATO member country that doesn't meet spending guidelines on defence in a stunning admission he would not abide by the collective defence clause at the heart of the alliance if reelected.

Biden said he came to the office determined to get America through one of the toughest periods in

# **UNICEF: 230 million females are circumcised** globally, 30 million more than in 2016

Cairo, Mar 08 (AP):

Over 230 million women and girls have undergone female genital mutilation, most of whom live in Africa, according to a report issued on Friday by the United Nations children's agency.

In the last eight years, some 30 million people have undergone the procedure, in which external genitalia are partially or fully removed, UNICEF estimated in the report, which was released on International Women's

percentage of women and girls who experience female genital mutilation is declining, UNICEF said, but it warned that efforts to eradicate the practice are too slow to keep up with fast-growing populations.

"The practice of female genital mutilation is declining, but not fast enough," the report said.

The practice, incorrectly believed to control women's sexuality, can cause serious bleeding and

Girls are subjected to the procedure at ages ranging from infancy to adolescence. Long term, it can lead to urinary tract infections. menstrual problems, pain, decreased sexual satisfaction and childbirth complications, as well as depression, low

"We're also seeing a worrying trend that more girls are subjected to the practice at younger ages, many before their fifth birthday. That further reduces the window to inter-

self-esteem and post-trau-

matic stress disorder.

UNICEF vene," said Executive Director Catherine Russell.

Some 144 million women and girls have been through female genital mutilation in Africa alone, followed by Asia and the Middle East with 80 million and 6 million respectively, the report said. Somalia tops the list of countries where the practice, also known as female circumcision, is prevalent, with 99% of the female population between the ages of 15 and 49 having been circumcised.

# Iran is responsible for the physical violence that killed Mahsa Amini in 2022, UN probe finds

Dubai, Mar 08 (AP):

Iran is responsible for the "physical violence" that led to the death of Mahsa Amini September 2022 and sparked nationwide protests against the country's mandatory headscarf, or hijab, laws and its ruling theocracy, a UN fact-finding mission said on Friday.

The stark pronouncement came in a wideranging initial report submitted to the UN Human Rights Council by the Fact-Finding Mission on Iran. It also found that the Islamic Republic employed "unnecessary and disproportionate use of lethal force" to put down the demonstrations that erupted following Amini's death, and that Iranian security forces sexually assaulted detainees.

The monthslong security crackdown killed more than 500 people and saw over 22,000 detained.

There was no immediate comment on the report from Iran. Iranian officials did not respond to requests for comment from The Associated Press on the mission's findings. The release of the report is unlikely to change the trajectory of Iran's government, now more firmly in the hands of hard-liners after a lowturnout vote last week put them back in charge

## **Muizzu's Misstep**

#### The Maldives' Risky Diplomatic Shift

he Maldives, a picturesque archipelago in the Indian Ocean, has recently made headlines for its diplomatic maneuvering that seems to be steering it away from its traditional ally, India, towards a closer relationship with China. This shift, spearheaded by President Mohamed Muizzu, is not just a change in foreign policy but a strategic realignment that carries significant implications for the region's stability and the Maldives' long-term prosperity. At the heart of this diplomatic pivot lies a recent agreement between the Maldives and China, wherein Beijing pledged to provide free 'non-lethal' military equipment and training to Maldivian soldiers. This marks a significant departure from the Maldives' previous stance, where India had primarily assisted the nation in urban and economic development. The timing of this agreement is particularly noteworthy, coming shortly after President Muizzu's announcement that no Indian personnel, whether civilian or uniformed, would be allowed to operate helicopters deployed by India after May 10. President Muizzu's decision to distance the Maldives from India is not a sudden development but rather a culmination of a trend that began with his election campaign last year. During his bid for the presidency, Muizzu championed the 'India Out' narrative, portraying Indian assistance as intrusive and detrimental to the Maldives' sovereignty. This sentiment of resentment towards India was further amplified when Muizzu labeled India as a bully, signaling a significant shift in the Maldives' foreign policy orientation. However, India's response to Muizzu's provocations has been firm yet diplomatic. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar highlighted India's substantial financial assistance, amounting to \$4.5 billion, provided to the Maldives during times of crisis, contrasting it with Muizzu's accusations. Jaishankar's remarks underscore India's commitment to its longstanding friendship with the Maldives and its willingness to support the nation's development and security needs. From a strategic perspective, the Maldives' decision to cozy up to China while alienating India raises several concerns. The Maldives, known for its stunning beaches and luxury resorts, heavily relies on tourism as its primary source of revenue. Any disruption in diplomatic relations, particularly with India, could have far-reaching consequences for the Maldivian economy, potentially deterring tourists and investors alike. Furthermore, India's response to the Maldives' diplomatic tilt towards China has been telling. India commissioned a new naval base at Minicov Island, a mere 125 kilometers from the Maldives, signaling its intent to safeguard its strategic interests in the Indian Ocean region. This move, coupled with India's continued support for the Maldives' development projects, underscores the significance of the Indo-Maldivian partnership. Domestically, Muizzu's confrontational approach towards India has not gone unnoticed. The recent victory of the Opposition in the politically significant Male Mayor's seat, previously held by Muizzu, suggests growing discontent with his administration's handling of foreign affairs. Additionally, India's symbolic gesture of naming the new naval base INS Jatayu, after the mythical bird from the Ramayana, serves as a subtle reminder of India's historical ties with the Maldives and its commitment to regional stability. President Muizzu's diplomatic overtures towards China and his confrontational stance towards India represent a risky gamble for the Maldives. The nation must strike a delicate balance between its strategic interests, economic stability, and regional security to ensure its continued prosperity in the face of evolving geopo-

### The GDP is estimated to be 173 Lakh crore in 2023-24

he data of third quarter (Q3) of the financial year 2023 -24 is out. To the amazement of everybody else GDP growth is declared to have achieved 8.4 % mark Notably, the GDP comes out according to the universal practice by the summing up of the private consumption; government expenditures, particularly in the distribution of salaries and constructions and building in-

frastructures; net export (export- import).

The calculation is done by the simple norms in vogue of comparing it with previous year's (here, 2022-23) same 3rd quarter (Q3) composed of the months October, November, December. Report says that in the current GDP growth the consumption constitutes 25.60 lakh crore rupees; while the greatest boost came from investment with 14.80 lakh crore rupees, attributive of investors' booming sentiments towards Indian economy, contrary to the critics and more particularly Rahul Gandhi's much day-night hyped recession in the market. On the other hand, the total spending done by the government came out to be 3.4 lakh crore rupees. Previous financial years 2022-23 (FY 23) the total sum of production in goods and service, the two parameters of GDP, in all 4 quarters taken together was 160 lakh crore rupees. While the same is notably estimated to touch the figure of as high as 173 lakh crore rupees by the end of current financial year 2023-24(FY24) on 31st March. Moreover, the sectors yielding proportionally more jobs such as manufacturing and construction propelled into 11.6% and 9.5 % growth respectively, leaving many to immense surprise. And, obviously, would have caused shock to the likes of Raghuram Rajan, who had once derided to have said that country would be fortunate if GDP remained to be even just 5%. Now Raghuram Rajan is needed to remember the year 2013, when the country has Manmohan Singh as the PM, and he being Finance minister. The inflation went bounced up as high as 11.06%, and he got into increasing the repo-rate to 8% in order to contain it. But in 2014 Modi government came to power. It adopted strict fiscal discipline, gradually bringing inflation rate down to as low as 4.5 % in less than two years. Now government wanted reporate being brought down. So that money flowed into the market, businesses and industries flourished yet again subsequently. But Raghuram Rajan was unwilling to respond to government's perception, giving no tenable ground either. As the time went on and no change was seen in the stance of Raghuram, whispers of his being involved in promoting the interest of developed world began to gain ground in the higher circle of governance and political corridors. However country got rid of him only when his tenure ended, and government went not in extending his service any further.

The Saat-Nischay includes (1) Aarthik Hal Yuvaon Ko Bal for financially helping students & youths to become self-reliant, (2) Aarakshit Rojgar Mahilaon Ka Adhikar through reservation for female in jobs as well as Panchayat & local bodies, (3) Har Ghar Bijli, (4) Har Ghar Nal Ka Jal, (5) Har Ghar Tak Pakki Gali-Naliyan, (6) Gharon Mein Shauchalay Nirman, (7) Awsar Badhe Aage Padhe by opening Technical/ Medical/ Nursing/Polytechnic/ ITI/Para Medical institutes in every districts.

The positive face of Nitish is that his priority is not only government welfare schemes. His start-ups in the social sectors are more praiseworthy. The public campaign against age-old social evils such as Child marriage, Dowry System and Alcoholism is unique, as these issues are not said to be vote pulling agenda for politicians. Jal-Jiwan-Hariyali scheme for water conservation is also an ambitious mission. The ban on alcoholism has reduced domestic violence to a great extent. The Sharab Mafias are campaigning aggressively against Nitish and under their pressure a lobby comprising of opposition as well as some BJP leaders are opposing the ban in the name of revenue collec-

The shortcomings prevailing in schools, colleges, hospitals, transport and other sectors should be carefully rectified. Criminals and Corrupt personals should be crushed. Officers belonging to depressed class should also be positioned on strategic posts. The government should make time bound programme in all works sector for its timely implementation.

Nitish Kumar has always been criticized by his so-called secular political opposition parties for his alignment with the BJP, although previously all non-Congress governments in Bihar have been formed with direct or indirect support from BJP or the erstwhile Jansangh. In 1990, Laloo Prasad had become CM with the support of BJP. In 2014, Nitish also tried to part away from the BJP when its leadership was transferred to Narendra Modi; but in the election, his works were not converted in to votes and as earlier castes & religion remain the major poll issue. Despite being in alliance with BJP, he never compromised with 3 "C" i.e. Crime, Corruption and Communalism. Unlike the Congress regime, his whole tenure remained riot-free.

Nitish Kumar has always been a struggler since the inception of his political career. In the political war of 2020, it was his struggle that despite being the target of all powerful groups comprising of opposition alliances, Liquor Mafia, biased electronic media as well as his own ally BJP's core upper caste voters, he won the battle, with some bruises

Such a conspiracy, forced Nitish to reconsider his alliance with Lalu Prasad and ultimately he stepped down from the post of Chief Minister on 28th January 2024 and formed the NDA government again in Bihar on the same day. Nitish Kumar took oath as CM for the record 9th times. Nitish Kumar also holds the record of serving as the Chief Minister of Bihar for the longest period of over 17 successful years.

#### Helmet saves life

Although wearing a helmet is definitely discomforting to the riders, its advantages easily outweigh the hardship of sporting one because there is much more to safety than mere comfort. Linear or direct impact forces on the head are considerably reduced and the foam shell of the helmets largely absorbs the impact thereby dissipating its energy. Skull injuries and fractures are avoided or minimised, so are brain injuries. Several reports have indicated that fatalities due to two--wheeler accidents are lessened by thirty seven percent when a driver or pillion rider protect their heads with helmets. Head injury risk is reduced by sixty nine percent due to helmet use. An AIMS Trauma Centre study has said that, in 2022, forty percent of pillion riders of Delhi suffered injuries because they did not wear helmets. The 2019 amendment to the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 makes it clear that every individual above the age of 4 years shall wear protective gears while driving motorcycles including both the driver and the pillion rider.

# United Nations has failed to keep peace and security in the world

wo ongoing devastating wars - one in Ukraine and the other in the Gaza strip - have so far killed and injured tens of thousands of civilians since last year. The Ukraine-Russia war started in February 2022. As of February 15, this year, the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (UNHCHR) verified a total of 30,457 civilian casualties in the course of Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Of them, 19,875 were reported to have been injured. Nearly 3.7 million Ukrainians were internally displaced. Around 6.5 million refugees from Ukraine have been recorded globally. Approximately 14.6 million people are in need of humanitarian assistance in 2024. In Gaza, at least 29,782 people have been killed and 70,043 wounded in Israeli attacks since October 7, last vear. The revised death toll in Israel stands at 1.139. The war continues. Gaza-based Palestinians, comprising large numbers of children and women, are dying in hordes almost every day. So far, little pressure has been exerted by the friends of Israel and Palestine on the two sides to bring the mindless war to an end.

So far, the UN, including its allpowerful Security Council, proved to

be totally ineffective to stop the wars in Ukraine and Gaza to establish peace and human security in the two politically explosive regions. In Ukraine, the US and its allies are actually fanning the war by providing massive arms and financial assistance adding to the endless suffering of the people of the east European nation. Last week. French President Emmanuel Macron went to the extent of openly discussing the possibility of sending European troops to Ukraine to help the country fight the war against Russia. threatening a major escalation of the largest ground war Europe has witnessed since World War II and challenging the authority of the UN. Russia has responded immediately with the possibility of a nuclear war in Europe. France is one of the UN Security Council's five permanent members. In a way, President Macron's public outburst once again undermined the authority of the UN. There are at least 10 other coun-

tries and regions where civil wars, armed violence and terror attacks have been causing human disasters for years and even for decades. They include Afghanistan, Burkina Faso and the Sahel, the Central African Republic, Chad and the Lake Chad Basin, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Somalia, South

Sudan, Sudan, Syria and the Yemeni

Houthi rebels-controlled Red Sea. In Afghanistan, nearly 150,000 civilian casualties have been recorded since the US military withdrawal in 2021. By now, some 28.3 million people need humanitarian assistance in Afghanistan. The inter-communal conflict in Chad and the Lake Chad Basin has been going on for nearly 15 years. The conflict in Congo has so far affected 26.4 million people who badly need humanitarian assistance. The violence and brutality in Somalia, ethnic cleansing in South Sudan and inter-communal conflict in Sudan have sent millions of peoples in utter distress. Syria is one of the world's worst affected countries trapped in the violence assisted by outside powers. In the Red Sea. controlled by allegedly Iran-backed Yemeni Houthi pirates, a trillion-dollar annual global sea trade has been severely impacted. All the countries mentioned in the list are UN members. Yet, the UN stands totally ineffective. if not unconcerned, to help establish peace and security in the

The helpless condition of the UN and its rarely cooperative five-member Security Council, led by two rival groups (one under the US and the other a Russia-China combine) are increasingly creating a situation which the world witnessed in the 1930s under the League of Nations.

The League was the first worldwide intergovernmental organization whose principal mission was to maintain world peace. The League of Nations was established on January 10, 1920, at the initiative of victorious Allied powers at the end of the first World War. The League of Nations failed as aggressor nations — as also its powerful permanent members such as France and Britain — undermined the authority of the world body. France and Britain even ignored the League in their efforts to appease Germany's Hitler at the early stage, which arguably led to the outbreak of the Second World War in 1939. By 1937, the League became a totally useless body. It was formally disbanded on April 19, 1946.

Right now, trust between the UN's member-governments appears to be reaching a breaking point. Not many countries trust the UN for resolving or reshaping critical intergovernmental issues. China is seriously questioning the legitimacy of the US to help establish the world order. New intergovernmental bodies such as BRICS (Brazil-Russia-India-China-South Africa group). Ouad (Quadrilateral Dialogue involving the US, Japan, India and Australia), US-Japan-Australia Strategic Cooperation, Aukus (the Australia-UK-US strategic pact), and

Beijing's own multibillion dollar Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) or a Chinese Marshall Plan for global dominance involving so far some 60 countries pose a new challenge to the diminishing UN authority. Interestingly, China is believed to be the main opposer to the UNSC reforms for now. Earlier, the western powers resisted the call for the re-

To be effective, the UN needs to be urgently revamped. The UNSC must recognize the changing world order - economic and strategic. It is unthinkable that some of the world's most influential countries today such as India, Japan, Germany and Brazil are still to become permanent members of the UNSC. India is the world's most populous country, fifth largest economy, and the fourth largest military power after the US, Russia and China. Japan and Germany are economic and technological super powers. Brazil is South America's most influential country. Their presence as permanent members of the UNSC would have made the council much stronger to deal with the global political impasse. The deepening global crisis demands a fundamental and rapid shift in the operational style of the UN. The UNSC must recognize and represent the contemporary global power dynamics.

# FTA possible' before India elections: Kemi Badenoch

A trade deal being negotiated with India is "possible" to be concluded before a general election in the country but Britain does not want to use that as a deadline, UK Secretary of State for Business and Trade Kemi Badenoch has said. The minister in charge of signing off on the free trade agreement (FTA), now in its 14th round of negotiations, pointed to India's "protectionist economy" in comparison with the UK's liberalised regime as one of the factors behind the long-drawn discussions. Badenoch, who was speaking during a Global Trade conference at the think tank Chatham House on Thursday, stressed that she wanted to ensure a "commercially meaning-



ful" pact as opposed to just a pre-election picture opportunity. "India is still very protectionist where we are very, very liberalised," claimed Badenoch. "I am not interested in just taking a picture and moving on.

It has to be something is commercially meaningful. People need to be able to say ah now I can do this', like we had with our Australia agreement or with Japan for example," she said, referring major economies. On the timeline for getting to the finishing line with the talks with India, she added: "We can actually sign an agreement before the Indian election. I suspect that that is not necessarily going to be the case because I don't want to use any election as a deadline. "It's really a staggering figure. The ability of all of you (AIFs) to go out and bring in that kind of money from your foreign Limited Partners (LPs) convince the Indians to become LPs," he said. Observing that AIFs space is getting more exciting, he said, there is still a lot

of money to be tapped by fund managers. Easy exit and further ease of doing business could help more capital to flow in from offshore, he said. The interim budget for 2024-25 has proposed to extend the tax benefit offered to Startups, sovereign and pension funds, and certain investment units located at the International Financial Services Centre (IFSC) at GIFT City by one year till March 31, 2025.

"Certain tax benefits to start-ups and investments made by sovereign wealth or pension funds as also tax exemption on certain income of some IFSC units are expiring on 31.03.2024.

To provide continuity in taxation, I propose to extend the date to 31.03.2025, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said in her budget speech last month.

# Rohit, Gill put India in driver's seat

Skipper Rohit Sharma and Shubman Gill's splendid hundreds gave India complete control of the fifth Test against England despite a late batting collapse that saw the hosts end day two at 473 for eight here on Friday.

India lost as many as five wickets for 97 runs in the final session after Rohit (103 off 162 balls) and Gill (110 off 150 balls) shared a stroke-filled 171run partnership off 244 balls for the second wicket.

Debutant Devdutt Padikkal (65 off 103) showed a lot of class in his debut innings while Sarfaraz Khan (56 off 60) was guilty of throwing away his wicket first ball after tea. The home team. which began the day at 135 for one, led England by 255 runs at stumps.

Off-spinner Bashir (4/170 in 44 overs), who was taken to the cleaners by the Indian openers, bounced back strongly to take three wickets in the final session. Left-arm spinner Tom Hartley (2/126 in 39) too was impressive towards the end of the day while Mark Wood (0/89 in 15) was the most expen-

The pitch remains good for batting and at 376 for three at tea, India looked set to bat England out of the game before the combination of good bowling



and reckless batting kept the visitors alive in the match. India scored at close to 4.5 runs per over until slowing down significantly in the final session.

#### Sindhu loses epic battle against Olympic **champion Chen**

India's PV Sindhu produced a gallant fight before marginally falling short against reigning Olympic champion Chen Yu Fei of China in an epic quarterfinal at the French Open Super 750 badminton tournament here on Friday. On a comeback trail from a four-month-long injury layoff, Sindhu gave ample display of her strokeplay and physical fitness during a marathon one hour and 32-minute battle before settling for a 24-22 17-21 18-21 loss to the second seed and defending champion Chen in a riveting last eight battle here.

The last time Sindhu had beaten the world no. 2 Chen was en route to her 2019 World Championships gold. Since then the Indian has lost to the Chinese twice in the last two meetings although she held a better 6head-to-head record against her opponent coming into the crucial tie.

Playing a top-class opponent after quite sometime, Sindhu didn't show any sign off the left knee injury that had pushed her out of the circuit since October last year. There was nothing to separate the two as Sindhu produced an attacking display and also moved well on the court but a steady Chen Yu Fei managed to keep her

nose ahead in the end.

# HC issues directions to deal with surrender petitions

Chennai, March 8 (PTI): The Madras High Court on Friday held that surrender petitions filed by accused who have voluntarily surrendered before a Magistrate having no jurisdiction to try the case, were not maintainable.

Justice N Anand Venkatesh, who gave the ruling, further said no order of remand can be passed by the Magistrate under section 167 (2) Cr.P.C (on detention) on such petitions, in the light of the decisions of the Supreme Court.

In the context of cases concerning offences under the Indian Penal Code, a person accused of an offence who has not been forwarded under Section 167(1) Cr.P.C, and who voluntarily appears and files a surrender petition before the Magistrate cannot be dealt with under Section 167(2) Cr.P.C.

Consequently, the period for the purpose of the proviso to Section 167(2), the period of 15 days police custody or 60/90 days custody will commence only from the date on which he comes into the custody of the Court, upon being forwarded by the police under Section 167(1) Cr.P.C, the judge added.

The judge gave the directions while disposing of a petition filed by the Tamil Nadu government, challenging an order of the Judicial Magistrate, Sathyamangalam, accepting the surrender of four accused and remanding them to judicial custody under Section 167(2) Cr.P.C in connection with a murder.

The judge said in the event an accused voluntarily appears before the Magistrate having no jurisdiction to try the case, it would be open to the Magistrate to direct the Station House Officer of the nearest police station under his jurisdiction to take the accused into custody and deal with him in accordance with the procedure set out in Clauses (3) to (5) of Police Standing Order.

# 'Congress lacks a strong leader like PM Modi'

mind for some time, but she had not shared it with anyone else, she said.

"So, they (Congress) were shocked by my sudden decision. They never thought I would take such a decision. I told them that anyone pushed into a corner would push back," she said.

On reporters seeking her views about what Youth Congress state President Rahul Mamkootathil said about her parentage a day ago, she said that his comments amounted to insulting her mother and therefore, she would be filing a complaint against him in that regard.

Regarding what her elder brother, Congress MP K Muraleedharan, said about her decision, Padmaja said that he has no right to blame her when he has changed parties several times in the past.

"I never said anything bad about him when I was in the Congress and he left it to join some other parties. He is my brother, so I have no intention of saying anything against him.

"But, we need to keep our political and personal lives separate. My political life is different," she said.

On reporters pointing out that Muraleedharan said she was working from home and therefore, does not need any more consideration than what she has already got, Padmaja said that was an unfair statement coming from him.

She said that Muraleedharan was aware of the health problems she had been suffering for over one-and-a-half years and therefore, he should not have made such a statement.

"What he said, therefore, was for political gains and votes," she remarked.

## 'Bullets of unjustified accusations lead to fatal wounds between spouses'

New Delhi, Mar 8 (PTI)

The bullets of unjustified accusations cause wounds that make it impossible for spouses to live together, and the "rabbit hole" of criminal litigation pushes them toward the point of no return, the Delhi High court has said while granting divorce to a man on grounds of cruelty by wife.

The court, while granting divorce, said false complaints of dowry and harassment by the wife, which dragged the husband and his family into the "loop of endless criminal litigations", were sufficient to conclude mental, emotional and physical cruelty to him.

"Though the aggrieved person is entitled and well within their rights to avail the remedy under laws, but, crossing the point of 'no return' becomes inevitable once the spouses get engulfed in this rabbit hole of criminal litiga-

The bullets of unjustified accusations and complaints cause such fatal wounds, leading to unendurable mental and physical acrimony, making it impossible for the spouses to live together," said the bench headed by Justice Suresh Kumar Kait in a recent order.

"Making such unsubstantiated allegations of dowry harassment which are palpably not made out from the family circumstances of the parties is nothing but an act of mental trauma and cruelty," the bench, also comprising Justice Neena Bansal Krishna, held.

# Govt focus on integrating new technology into tribal welfare: Arjun Munda

New Delhi, Mar 8 (PTI): The government will focus on leveraging new technology such as artificial intelligence and machine learning for tribal welfare going ahead, Union Minister Arjun Munda said on Friday.
