CAA comes into force

Non-Muslim migrants to benefit

Afghanistan who came to India till December 31, 2014. These include Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, Buddhists, Parsis and Christians.

The CAA was passed in December 2019 and subsequently got the president's assent but there were protests in several parts of the country against it. Over a hundred people lost their lives during the anti-CAA protests or police action.

The law could not come into effect as rules had not been notified till now. According to the Manual on Parliamentary Work, the rules for any legislation should be framed within six months of presidential assent or the government has to seek an extension from the Committees on Subordinate Legislation in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha. Since 2020, the Home Ministry has been taking extensions at regular intervals from the parliamentary committee for framing the rules.

The Ministry of Home Affairs has readied a portal for the convenience of the applicants as the entire process will be online. The applicants will have to declare the year when they entered India without travel documents. No document will be sought from the applicants, an official said.

Designed to polarise polls: Cong

The Congress on Monday alleged that the timing of notifying the rules for the Citizenship (Amendment) Act is evidently designed to polarise the coming Lok Sabha elections, especially in West Bengal and Assam.

Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh also alleged that the announcement is yet another attempt to "manage the headlines" after the Supreme Court's strictures on the electoral bonds issue. Ramesh said it has taken four years and three months for the Narendra Modi government to notify the rules

for the law cleared by Parliament in December 2019. "After seeking nine extensions for the notification of the rules, the timing right before the elections is evidently designed to polarise the elections, especially in West Bengal and Assam," the Congress leader said.

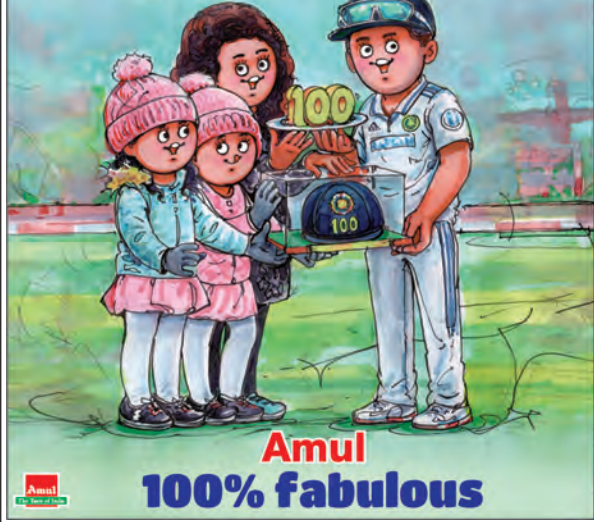
"The prime minister claims that his government works in a business-like and time-bound manner. The time taken to notify the rules for the CAA is yet another demonstration of the prime minister's blatant lies," he said in a post on X.

'No water to TN, facing worst drought in 40 yrs'

Bengaluru, Mar 11 (PTI): Amid the acute water shortage in Bengaluru, Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister D K Shivakumar said on Monday the State had not witnessed such a severe drought in the past three-four decades, and the next two months are "very much important" but the situation is not as grave as being projected by the opposition BJP.

Following the woes, the Bangalore Water Supply and Sewerage Board (BWSSB) has said it will take legal action against those drilling unauthorised borewells within the city limits.

Naxalite killed in encounter

Dantewada, Mar 11: A Naxalite was killed in an encounter with security personnel in Bastar division on Monday, a police official said. The gun battle took place in a forest along the border of Dantewada-Bijapur districts when joint teams of various security forces were out on an anti-Naxal operation, Dantewada Superintendent of Police Gaurav Rai said. The operation was launched on Sunday based on inputs about the presence of armed Naxalites along the inter-district border,

Bijapur: A 35-year-old man was allegedly abducted and killed by Naxalites on suspicion of being a police informer in Bijapur district, police said on Monday. The victim, Pusu Hemla, who hailed from Telipetha village under Kutru police station limits, was found dead on the Telipetha-Patakutru road by some locals on Monday morning, an official said.

Survey

Indore: The Madhya Pradesh High Court here on Monday directed the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) to carry out a scientific survey of the medieval-era Bhojshala complex in Dhar district. Hindus consider Bhojshala, an ASI-protected 11th century monument, to be a temple dedicated to Vagdevi (Goddess Saraswati), while the Muslim community call it Kamal Maula Mosque.

Aizawl: The Mizoram government has suspended a teacher for allegedly leaking the social science question paper of the class 10 board examination, a state minister told the assembly on Monday. The minister said the teacher had provided specific students with suggestions before the exam held on March 8.

Ghazipur: At least five people were killed and 11 others injured when a bus in which they were travelling came in contact with an overhead high-voltage wire here on Monday, police said. The accident took place when members of a marriage party from Mau were on its way to Mahahar temple in the Mardah police station area, SHO Dharmendra Kumar Pandey told PTI over phone.

With the CAA rules being issued, the Modi government will now start granting Indian nationality to persecuted non-Muslim migrants from Bangladesh, Pakistan and

'Disclose electoral bond details today'



The five-judge constitution bench headed by Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud during hearing on the SBI's plea seeking more time to disclose Electoral Bonds, in New Delhi, Monday.

New Delhi, Mar 11 (PTI): In a major setback to the State Bank of India, the Supreme Court on Monday trashed its plea seeking an extension of time and ordered it to disclose the details of electoral bonds to the Election Commission by close of business hours on March 12. A five-judge Constitution bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud also directed the EC to publish the details shared by the bank on its official website by 5 pm on March 15. The bench, also comprising Justices Sanjiv Khanna, B R Gavai, J B

Pardiwala, and Manoj Misra, put the SBI on notice that the apex court may be inclined to proceed against it for "wilful disobedience" of its February 15 verdict if the bank failed to comply with its directions and timelines. In a landmark verdict delivered on February 15, a five-judge Constitution bench had scrapped the Centre's electoral bonds scheme that allowed anonymous political funding, calling it "unconstitutional" and ordered disclosure by the EC of donors, the amount donated by them and the recipients by March 13.

'Modi accuses Cong, allies of negativity'

Gurugram (Haryana), Mar 11 (PTI): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday launched a scathing attack on opposition Congress and its allies saying that they are full of negativity, as he promised to double the pace of implementation of infrastructure projects to make India a developed nation by 2047. Inaugurating the 19km-long Haryana section of the Dwarka Expressway that will cut travel time between Delhi and adjoining business hub in Gurugram, he said the astonishing pace of starting and completing infra projects has given Congress and its 'ghamandia gathbandan' or 'INDI-alliance' 'sleepless nights', as they are used to only tommorow projects whose foundation stones were laid with no completion in sight. Detailing the pace of his government's approach to infrastructure projects, the Prime Minister said he has laid the foundation stone or inaugurated projects worth Rs 10 lakh crore in less than three months of the current calendar year.

India tests Agni-5 missile carrying multiple warheads

New Delhi, Mar 11 (PTI): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday congratulated DRDO scientists over the first flight test of indigenously developed Agni-5 missile, capable of deploying multiple warheads. "Proud of our DRDO scientists for Mission Divyastra, the first flight test of indigenously developed Agni-5 missile with Multiple Independently Targetable Re-entry Vehicle (MIRV) technology," Modi said on X'. Sources said that with the test of Mission Divyastra, India has joined the select group of nations that have MIRV capability. This will ensure that a single missile can deploy multiple warheads at different locations, they said. The project director is a woman and it has a significant contribution from



avionics systems and high-accuracy sensor packages which ensured that the re-entry vehicles reached the target points within the desired accuracy. The capability is an enunciator of India's growing technological prowess. The Agni-5, with a range of 5000 km, is developed considering the long-term security needs of the country. The missile can bring almost the entire Asia including the northernmost part of China as well as some regions in Europe under its striking range. The Agni 1 to 4 missiles have ranges from 700 km to 3,500 km and have already been deployed. India has been developing capabilities to intercept hostile ballistic missiles both inside and outside the earth's atmospheric limits.

Three including a juvenile arrested for murder

Bhilai, Mar 11: Police arrested two persons and a juvenile on charges of murder. They attacked a person with a sickle, sticks and axe and stabbed him to death. One of the accused suspected that the man had some illicit relations with his wife. After committing the crime, the accused remained sitting near the body.



SDOP (Patan) Devansh Singh Rathore informed that the incident occurred late evening on March 10 at village Mahakakala of Utai Police Station limits. The deceased was identified as Kameshwar Markande, a resident of Mahakakala. After receiving information, a police team rushed to the spot and found a

man lying dead in a pool of blood. The accused with blood-stained hands was sitting at the crime scene. On the instructions of senior police officers, the police team interrogated the witnesses and lodged an FIR under section 302, 34 IPC at Utai Police Station against the accused Sunil Kumar Kurre, Sugriva

alias Premal Kurre and a juvenile.

During interrogation, police came to know that the accused attacked Kameshwar with a sickle, stick and axe and stabbed him to death. The accused Sunil Kumar Kurre (37) son of Late Sukaloram Kurre; Sugriva alias Premal (45) son of Late

Sukaloram Kurre and a juvenile, all residents of village Mahakakala, Utai were taken into custody. During interrogation, they confessed to the crime. The accused Sunil disclosed that his wife often spoke to Kameshwar Markande. Sunil suspected that they have some illicit relationship. The accused were arrested and produced before the court. They have been sent to the jail on judicial remand.

Application seeking land allotment for Govt Colleges submitted at Jandarshan

Bhilai, Mar 11: Collector Richa Prakash Chaudhary met a large number of people during Collector Jandarshan and listened to their problems. She gave instructions to the concerned departments to take immediate action and take necessary initiatives to provide proper resolution. A resident of Urla complained about illegal drain construction on a government public road. In Ward 58, the Municipal Corporation has built a 10 feet wide CC road near Lodhi Para. A person is constructing a new house nearby and has constructed drain and stairs illegally on the government road. The locals raised objections but the person is con-



tinuing construction works. The Collector asked the Commissioner of Municipal Corporation Durg to take necessary action.

A delegation submitted an application seeking allotment of land for Government College in Khursipar. They said that

the Government College Khursipar is operating from the rented school building of Bhilai Steel Plant since 2014. Undergraduate and post-graduate classes are being conducted in the college. Taking cognizance of their application, the Collector instructed to take neces-

sary action. Similarly, an application was submitted for allotment of land for construction of building of Government Naveen College, Risali. This school is currently running in 06 rooms of Government Higher Secondary School. Presently BA, BSc, BCom classes are being conducted here. The number of students in the college is continuously increasing and is likely to increase further in the coming years. Due to the lack of a science laboratory, students face difficulties in conducting practical classes and due to lack of a playground, students are unable to participate in sports competitions. Khursipar residents submitted an ap-

plication for a new sewerage line. The residents are troubled due to the drainage problem for the last several years. Due to clogged old sewerage lines, sewer water enters into the houses. Sewer water is also getting mixed with the tap water due to cracked pipes. The Collector instructed the Commissioner Municipal Corporation Bhilai to take necessary action. 124 applications were received in Jandarshan on Sunday. Most of the applications were for the old age pension, ration card, instalment under Rajiv Gandhi Kisan Nyay Yojana, widow pension, inspection of physiotherapy clinic, irregularities in land lease, etc.

The Mill has during the April to Feb period of current fiscal year, rolled out 6.07 lakh tonnes of TMT bars and

Do not have fear of failure while taking initiatives: PK Jha

Bhilai, Mar 11: Whatever their position in the hierarchy, Bhilais have always striven to do better in their own respective fields of working. Even after retirement, their bonding remains. One among many such persons is PK Jha who retired as CGM (C&IT Dept). Here he shares his experience and insights gained, challenges faced, certain initiatives & actions that he took along with his team and

specifies how these impacted the organization. Jha who joined the Plant's C&IT Dept in 1989, and after working in different capacities in the dept, retired as CGM of same department in Dec 2022 also shares some tips for those still in service. Jha joined BSP in 1985 and was posted in Plate Mill where he worked in maintenance and planning section. It was quite an enriching experience, understanding closely the issues faced by maintenance and production teams and their solutions for short and long terms.

After his selection for EDP (now C&IT), Jha worked with many upcoming technologies and platforms and took many initiatives along with his colleagues which helped transform systems contributing towards cutting costs, higher efficiency and better quality of service at Unit and Company levels.

Jha says that during the first few years, he was given the task to transform the manual and COBOL based system of Township revenue billing and receipt collec-



tion - which he and his team made online in a few months time. Thereafter many online systems were developed by us for Town Services Dept, he said.

Integration of HRIS and Payroll : Jha says that we at BSP were the first to develop Payroll system in RDBMS and subsequently we developed the same for BRP (now SRU). Integration of HRIS and Payroll and development of e-Sahyog portal for employee self service was a major milestone. Many improvement projects were taken up in SAP like e-tendering and e-procurement system, SRM7. We were the first in SAIL to use encryption and digital signature. GST, e-waybill, e-invoice and many more followed. Many improvement projects were also taken up under MES with enhanced coverage to finishing mills URM, BRM, WRM and MM.

E-notesheet under SAP changed the work culture: The system for paperless certification by RITES has contributed immensely - providing an additional 45

minutes of production time in each 8 hourly shift of URM. Enabling cashless transactions and paperless working for notesheets and approvals are landmark achievements. E-notesheet under SAP has in fact, changed the work culture. C & IT helped other units too in development and implementation of e-notesheet. During Covid time, C & IT provided system based support to Plant, Township and Medical Dept. One of the most challenging tasks was implementation of Centralised Payroll System (CPRS) for entire SAIL that had 25 different systems under different platforms being maintained and operated by people with different Digital maturity levels. With the consistent support from top management of BSP, the C&IT team steered, developed and implemented CPRS in one go for all executives and non-executives in April 2020. While all employees' payments are made by BSP

Finance Dept using this C&IT maintained system, CPRS has made the corporate finance job easy for allocation of budget. Integrating data from different SAP systems, BSP developed Vendor Payment Query Portal where any vendor of SAIL can login and see the payment status of their supply to any unit from their mobiles.

Feel content: I feel quite satisfied with my achievements as I got full freedom to devise my roadmap and got guidance, support and cooperation from all sides in bringing about transformation. Last few years were full of challenges, opportunities and accomplishments.

Be Positive & Challenge Yourself: Suggesting few mantras for the benefit of those presently engaged in similar capacities, Jha advises that one should always listen to his/her internal customers, encourage them to share their pains and ask for suggestions to improve while at the same time thinking of ways including out of box solutions to provide customer delight. Be positive and challenge yourself. Ask why can't I/we do it instead of feeling it is a bother and so why to do it! Most importantly, don't have a fear of fail-

ure, he said.

Trust & Support can bring about improvements : Sharing his views on how performances can be improved, Jha opines that encouragement, trust and support can bring about large improvements. Encourage colleagues and others in the department to take a few calculated risks and stand by them when one fails after putting sincere efforts, he said, adding that fear of failure is a big restraint while taking many initiatives.

Technology is changing fast and Industry 4.0 has a huge potential. Training, skilling, collaboration and investment are required for meeting new challenges and remaining competitive, Shri Jha stated.

Work life balance is reasonably good. However there is always the scope of improvement. We need to appreciate contributors in the team publicly and if need be, talk to them about their mistakes in private.

Flavour of Bhilai not easy to resist : Bhilai has a nice climate and good social framework. Nice and handy Medical facility, cultural mix and the mix of rural and urban flavours are not easy to resist.

Successful open heart surgery of a 20-yr-old patient at Ambedkar Hospital

Raipur, Mar 11: A 20-year-old patient was successfully operated upon through Minimally Invasive Cardiac Surgery (MICS) in the Department of Heart, Chest and Vascular Surgery of the Advanced Cardiac Institute (ACI) in Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar Memorial Hospital, affiliated to Pt Jawahar Lal Nehru Memorial Medical College, Raipur.

With this successful surgery conducted under the leadership of Department Head Dr Krishnakant Sahu, the name of Heart, Chest and Vascular



Surgery Department of ACI has been registered as the first government institute of the state, where open heart sur-

gery facility is available with this method. In this method, the surgical procedure is carried out by making a small incision on the patient's chest, due to which the patient recovers very quickly.

The 20-year-old patient living in Dhamdha had congenital heart disease. He had come to know about the disease when he became short of breath and started swelling in his hands and legs. This condition is called heart failure. In this condition, the patient was admitted to the medicine department



and after examination it was found that there was a 4 X 3 cm defect in his heart. There is a big hole in the heart which is

called atrial septal defect (ASD) in medical language. Operation for this disease should be done in childhood itself. Otherwise, with age, the heart function (pumping) decreases and after some time, heart failure occurs, as happened with this patient.

This patient underwent antifailure treatment for about 10 days in the medicine department. After that the patient was sent to Dr Krishnakant Sahu, Head of the Department of Cardiac Surgery for operation. Dr. Krishnakant Sahu says that this patient was kept stable in

the cardiac surgery department for a few more days and the hole in his heart was closed with minimally invasive cardiac surgery (MICS) and the patient returned to his normal life on the very next day. This operation is called minimally invasive cardiac surgery because in normal open heart surgery, the process of open heart surgery is done by cutting the chest bone called sternum, in which an incision/cut of about 20 centimeters is made. This wound takes a little more time to heal. In minimally invasive cardiac

surgery (operation through small incisions), the heart lung machine is connected to the veins of the legs (veins of the thigh - femoral artery and femoral vein) to stop the function of the heart and lungs and the hole located inside the heart. To close it, the heart is opened with a special instrument by making a 2-inch incision in the middle of the fourth rib in the right chest and the hole is closed with a special type of cloth called Dacron patch. The patient is now ready for discharge from the hospital

after five days. The team which carried out this successful operation comprised Department Head Dr. Krishnakant Sahu, Dr. Vivek Wadhwa, Dr. Nishant Chandel, Cardiac Anesthetist Dr. Devendra Pandey, Perfusionists Bikash Mahapatra and Digeshwar, Technicians Bhupendra, Harish, Nirakar, Chetan and Sarita, Nursing Staff OT Rajendra, Chowa, Munesh, Narendra and Tejendra, ICU Care Kiran, Jagruti, Bhavana and Kusum.

More than 35 thousand applications received from RTE

For admission in private schools in nine days

Raipur, Mar 11: The application process for admission in private schools under the Right to Education (RTE) has started from March 1. More than 35,000 children have been registered in just nine days. The registration process in the first phase will continue till April 15. Then verification of applications, lottery and admission will be done. Every year more applications are received than seats, yet seats remain vacant.

The timetable for the RTE admission process has been released by the Directorate of Public Instruction (DPI). Admission in all private



schools of the state is done under RTE. If there are more applications than seats, admission is given through lottery. Students choose three schools at the time of application.

In comparison to the last academic session, there has been a reduction of 4,887 RTE seats in this academic session. There were 55,158 RTE seats in the education session 2023-24, which have reduced to 50,271 this year. 6,573

schools from 33 districts of the state have registered in RTE. Last year there were 6,507 schools registered. This year there has been an increase of 66 schools. Officials said that now the number of schools may increase, due to which the number of seats will also increase. Earlier in 2022-23, there were 80 thousand RTE seats in the state. Last year, 25,000 RTE seats were reduced. Last year, even after three stages of admis-

sion process, more than eight thousand seats remained vacant.

According to the notification issued by DPI, the portal will be opened again for registration of schools. After completion of the first phase admission process, new schools will be given the opportunity to register from June 15.

Under RTE, economically weaker students get admission in private schools of the state. In big private schools, 25 percent seats are reserved for admission under RTE. This fulfills the dream of economically weaker people of educating their children in big and private schools. After admission in nursery or first class, they study free till class 12th. Under this scheme, currently three lakh students are studying in private schools.

UNSC Needs Evolution

India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations, Ruchira Kamboj, underscored the urgent need for reforms within the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), portraying the global body's current trajectory as one towards "oblivion." Her impassioned plea during an informal meeting on Security Council reforms resonates with a growing frustration over the lack of tangible progress despite over two decades of deliberation since the Millennium Summit in 2000. Ms. Kamboj's call for concrete progress in reform efforts is not merely a diplomatic exercise but a pressing demand rooted in the imperatives of our time. With the world evolving rapidly, the UNSC's structure and composition must adapt to effectively address contemporary challenges and reflect the diversity of voices in the international community. The impetus for reform lies in rectifying historical injustices and ensuring equitable representation, particularly for regions like Africa, which have long felt marginalized within the current framework. Ms. Kamboj rightly emphasizes the importance of heeding the voices of the younger generation, whose aspirations and perspectives must be integrated into the Council's decision-making processes. India's stance on UNSC reform aligns with that of the G4 countries—India, Brazil, Germany, and Japan—who advocate for a more inclusive approach to reflect the plurality of views and interests among the 193 member states. The G4's emphasis on diversity and representation underscores the necessity of expanding both the permanent and non-permanent categories within the Council. To translate these aspirations into actionable steps, Ms. Kamboj proposes a pragmatic approach that involves identifying specific groups or countries deserving special consideration in the reform process. By listening attentively to their concerns and aspirations, member states can foster a more inclusive and transparent dialogue, essential for building consensus and advancing reform efforts. Moreover, Ms. Kamboj advocates for cross-regional arrangements to ensure that the General Assembly's diversity is adequately reflected in the Council. Such mechanisms not only promote inclusivity but also enhance the Council's legitimacy by incorporating a broader range of perspectives and experiences. India's steadfast support for comprehensive reforms across all five clusters, including expansion in both permanent and non-permanent categories, underscores its commitment to strengthening the multilateral system. As a rising global power and a staunch advocate for global justice and equity, India's leadership in this endeavor is pivotal. However, achieving meaningful reform will require more than rhetoric; it demands collective action and political will from member states. The status quo is no longer tenable, and the longer we delay meaningful reform, the greater the risk of rendering the UNSC obsolete and irrelevant in addressing the world's most pressing challenges. The imperative for UNSC reform is not merely a matter of bureaucratic restructuring but a moral imperative rooted in principles of fairness, equity, and representation. As the world grapples with complex geopolitical shifts and unprecedented global challenges, a reinvented, inclusive, and effective UNSC is essential for fostering peace, security, and prosperity on a global scale. It is incumbent upon member states to seize this opportunity and embark on a transformative journey towards a more just and equitable international order.

Engaging the Taliban

The prospect of a Taliban-led Afghanistan necessitates a nuanced approach from India. While encouraging signs of accommodation toward Indian interests emerge, New Delhi must tread cautiously. Past experiences serve as a sobering reminder of the volatility inherent in Afghan politics. As India extends a tentative hand of cooperation to the post-Mullah Omar generation, it must remain vigilant against the pitfalls of overreliance and misplaced trust. India's engagement with Afghanistan is emblematic of its broader aspirations for regional stability and security. As Afghanistan grapples with its complex realities, India's role as a responsible stakeholder in the region becomes ever more pronounced. The path forward demands pragmatism, resilience, and a steadfast commitment to safeguarding India's interests while fostering constructive dialogue with all stakeholders. In this intricate geopolitical landscape, India's diplomatic acumen will be tested like never before. As the dust settles on Afghanistan's turbulent past, India stands poised to shape its future trajectory. The road ahead may be fraught with uncertainty, but with strategic foresight and diplomatic finesse, India can navigate these challenges and emerge as a beacon of stability and progress in the region.

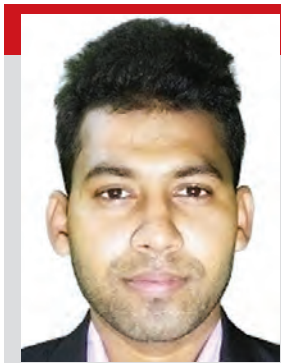

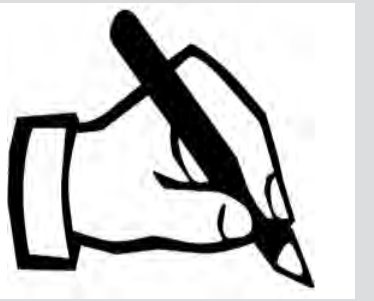

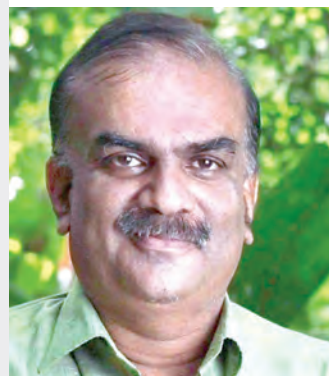

Polling Officers: Unsung Heroes of Democracy

Typically, four to five officials are stationed in each booth, alongside police and army personnel. Poll workers are tasked with setting up polling stations and ensuring the area remains lawful and orderly.

Some booths are designated as sensitive due to law and order concerns, for which specialized poll workers known as micro observers are assigned. The work of a polling officer commences on election eve and extends late into the following day, with little to no access to food or breaks during election day. Their shift only concludes once electronic or ballot boxes are handed over to the relevant authorities. Polling officers play a crucial role in conducting elections in India.

They face many difficulties and challenges in their duty, such as:

1. **Logistical issues:** At the heart of their responsibilities lies the meticulous organization and execution of elections. From the intricate logistics of transporting sensitive equipment like Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) and Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) machines to the farthest reaches of the country, to the intricate setup of polling stations with adequate security measures, lighting, ventilation, and sanitation facilities, polling officers shoulder the burden of ensuring a smooth and seamless electoral process.

Boxer Nishant Dev one win away from securing Paris Olympic quota

Busto Arsizio, Mar 11 (PTI):

World Championships medallist Nishant Dev moved within touching distance of a Paris Olympic quota after he registered a dominant victory over Christos Karaitis of Greece to enter the 71kg quarterfinals of the first World Olympic Boxing Qualifier here.

The 23-year-old, who won the featherweight bronze at the World Championships last year, continued his rich vein of form, as he out-punched Karaitis by a 5-0 unanimous decision in the pre-quarterfinals late on Sunday.

With the qualifying tournament offering four quota places in the men's 71kg weight class, Dev needs to win his quarterfinal on Monday to seal his passage for Paris Games and earn the fifth 2024 Olympic quota for India and the first in the men's category in boxing.



However, Dev, who is vying to compete in his debut Olympic, will have his task cut out as he faces a tough opponent in 2021 World Championship silver medallist Omari Jones of the USA in the last eight round on Monday. The Haryana boxer is the

only Indian boxer out of the nine-member contingent who is still in the fray for a quota.

All others, including 2023 World Championship bronze medallists Deepak Bhoria (51kg) and Mohammed Hussamudin (57kg) crashed out after losing their opening bouts.

Four Indians — Nikhat Zareen (50kg), Preeti Pawar (54kg), Parveen Hooda (57kg) and Lovlina Borgohain (75kg) — have so far secured Paris quotas at the Asian Games last year.

The remaining Indian boxers will get a final chance to seal their passage to Paris during the second World Olympic Boxing Qualifier, scheduled to be held in Bangkok from May 23 to June 3. Between 45 and 51 boxers will qualify from the Bangkok meet.

Pistol shooter Rudransh Khandelwal wins silver in Para World Cup

New Delhi, Mar 11 (PTI):

India's Rudransh Khandelwal and Nihal Singh settled for silver and bronze respectively in the mixed 50m pistol (SH1) category as the hosts on day three of the Para Shooting World Cup here on Monday.

Rudransh, Nihal and Tokyo Paralympics silver medallist Singhraj also bagged the mixed 50m pistol (SH1) team silver with China claiming the top step on the podium. Teenaged shooter Rudransh, who had secured a Paris Paralympic berth last year, shot 223.2 in final to finish behind Italy's Davide Franceschetti, who totalled 230.0 for the gold medal.

Nihal had to settle for a bronze medal with 202.8 points.

Earlier in the qualification round, Rudransh shot 530 and Nihal 527 to



enter the eight-shooter final placed sixth and seventh.

In the mixed 50m pistol (SH1) team event, the trio of Rudransh (530), Nihal (527) and Singhraj (516) aggregated 1573 for the silver medal with China taking the gold with a combined score 1611.

Rifle shooter Mona Agarwal is the only one so far to have won a gold medal for India in the prestigious Para World Cup for India.

Lifter Mirabai Chanu to train in Paris ahead of Olympics

New Delhi, Mar 11 (PTI):

Former world champion weightlifter Mirabai Chanu's proposal to train in Paris ahead of the Olympic Games was on Monday cleared by the government.

The Tokyo Olympics silver medallist will acclimatise to the weather and prepare for the quadrennial showpiece during her month-long stint in La Ferte-Milon in Paris, according to a statement by the Sports Ministry's Mission Olympic Cell.

The 29-year-old Chanu, who competes in the 49kg category, will be accompanied by two coaches and a physiotherapist.

The government will bear the cost for air tickets, visa fees, accommodation, food, training, local transport and medical insurance among other expenditures under the Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS).

The Mission Olympic Cell also cleared the proposals of equestrian exponent Anush Agarwalla to compete in eight competitions and buy equip-

ment for his horses. "TOPS will cover his and his coach's accommodation costs, entry fees, two horse feed costs, coach fees, and horse grooms costs

While young Musheer Khan reined in his aggression to make a gritty 51 not out, Rahane negotiated the Vidarbha bowling attack with utmost patience and precision to put Mumbai, who are aiming for a record 42nd Ranji title, in pole position. At stumps, the hosts were 141 for 2 in their second innings. Having being shot out for a meagre 224 in

the first innings on the first day, Mumbai came roaring back in the first session to take a 119-run lead as Vidarbha, resuming at 31/3, were dismissed for 105 in the first innings.

Rahane and Musheer came together after Mumbai lost openers Prithvi Shaw (11) and Bhupen Lalwani (18) early in their second dig, with the game delicately placed shortly after lunch.

Shaw was cleaned up when Yash Thakur got one to nip back as the ball sneaked between the India player's bat and pads. Lalwani was caught at mid-wicket off Harsh Dubey (1/46). Old warhorse

At the other end, Musheer kept committing himself on the front foot, meeting most of the deliveries with a dead bat to consume 134 balls for his unbeaten 51 with three fours.

Indian Well, Mar 11 (AP): Iga Swiatek avenged her Australian Open ouster at the hands of Linda Noskova, beating the Czech teenager 6-4, 6-0 in the third round of the BNP Paribas Open.

Second-seeded Carlos Alcaraz and third-seeded Jannik Sinner each advanced in straight sets in the men's draw, but fifth-seeded Andrey Rublev lost to No. 32 seed Jiri Lehecka 6-4, 6-4.

Swiatek advanced to the round of 16, where the top-ranked Polish star will face Yulia Putintseva of Kazakhstan. Putintseva beat Madison Keys 6-4, 6-1, part of a tough day for American singles players.

Francis Tiafoe lost 6-3, 6-3 to Stefanos Tsitsipas, and Katie Volynets was eliminated by Caroline Wozniacki 6-2, 4-6, 6-0. The final American on the court, Ben Shelton, did manage a pulsating 7-6, 3-6, 7-6 victory over Francisco Cerundolo.

Shelton won the decisive tiebreaker 7-5. The 16th-seeded Shelton advanced to face Sinner in the round of 16. The 11th-seeded Tsitsipas will face Lehecka.

Noskova beat Swiatek in three sets in Australia, becoming the first teen to beat a No. 1-ranked woman at that event in 25 years. The rematch was



competitive for a set, but Swiatek eventually rolled to victory in just under 73 minutes. "I made some mistakes at the beginning. I tried to maybe play to finish the rallies too early," Swiatek said. "But I knew that if I'm going to try to stay consistent and make a little bit less mistakes, my chances may come."

Jasmine Paolini won another tight match against Anna Kalinskaya, 6-3, 3-6, 6-4. Paolini won the Dubai Championships two weeks ago, rallying to win a three-set final over Kalinskaya. Alcaraz beat Felix Auger-Aliassime 6-2, 6-3, and Sinner ousted Jan Lennard-Struff 6-3, 6-4.

"I love playing here. I think it's called the fifth Grand Slam, and I know why," Alcaraz said. "I mean, the site is amazing, the courts. I mean, I feel here so peaceful that I think that tennis players, we are going to every tournament and we try to find, you know, that peace off the court, to feel calm, you know, and we find it here."

Dharamsala, Mar 11 (PTI):

India's premier pacer Mohammed Shami, who is recuperating from an ankle surgery, is expected to make his comeback with the home Test series against Bangladesh later this year, BCCI secretary Jay Shah told PTI. "Shami's surgery is done,

he is back in India. Shami's return is likely for the home series against Bangladesh. KL Rahul needed an injection, he has started rehab and is at the NCA," said Shah while talking to media here.

Rahul missed the last four Tests of the England series after complaining of

pain in his right quadriceps. He is expected to turn up for Lucknow Super Giants in the IPL, having undergone treatment in London.

The BCCI secretary also gave an update on Rishabh Pant, who is set to make his much-awaited comeback in the IPL. Pant has been out of action since a horrific car accident in December 2022.

"He is batting well, he is keeping well. We will declare him fit very soon. If he can play the T20 World Cup for us, that will be a big thing for us. He is a big asset for us.

"If he can keep, he can play the World Cup. Let's see how he does in the IPL," said Shah.

'I targeted Richa's toes on the last delivery'

New Delhi, Mar 11 (PTI): Delhi Capitals' left-arm spinner Jess Jonassen is happy to have executed a perfect block-hole delivery last-up which didn't allow the dangerous Richa Ghosh to tee off during her team's thrilling one-run win against Royal Challengers Bangalore in the Women's Premier League. However, the ace Southern Star spinner cheekily admitted that since she became the holder of 'Purple Cap' for highest wicket-taker, she hasn't been bowling well.

Needing 17 to win off the last over, RCB's Richa hit two huge sixes to bring the equation down to 2 off one ball but the India international, who was al-



ready out of breath, couldn't complete a single to take the game into a Super Over with Jonassen hardly giving her any room to manoeuvre.

"In the last ball, I targeted on her toes, I think (I) executed well and thankfully it went straight to Shafali, who got it in quick enough.

Stokes gave India the upper hand: Chappell

Sydney, Mar 11 (PTI):

Legendary Australian cricketer Ian Chappell has punched holes in England skipper Ben Stokes' aggressive leadership tactics during the just-concluded five-Test series against India, saying some of his decisions were responsible for the visitors' 1-4 series humiliation.

He said that while the need of the hour on the third evening of the fourth Test in Ranchi was to give the ball to pace stalwart Jimmy Anderson to make early breakthroughs, Stokes decided to bowl part-time spinner Joe Root, thus missing a trick.

"On the third evening, Stokes desperately needed to start India's chase with his best two bowlers and



try to claim at least one wicket. Incredibly, he gave the ball to a part-timer, Joe Root, and ignored the experienced, probing bowling of Jimmy Anderson. India took full advantage and scored an invaluable 40 runs off just eight

overs," said Chappell in his column. "Stokes missed a trick in Ranchi. He then compounded his error by allowing too many easy singles on the final day (day four) by resorting to some cautious field placings. At a time when Stokes needed to be extremely brave as captain and hope he got lucky, he was abnormally conservative."

"India probably would still have won but at least by going on the attack, Stokes would have given England their best chance of an upset victory."

He said that Stokes could probably take a lesson or two from former Pakistan skipper Javed Miandad, who was a "leadership master" in trying situations.

Carey stars as Australia beats New Zealand by 3 wickets

Christchurch, Mar 11 (AP): Wicketkeeper Alex Carey made an unbeaten 98 and shared a 140-run partnership with Mitch Marsh which guided Australia through various hazards to a three-wicket win over New Zealand in the second Test at Christchurch, New Zealand and a 2-0 sweep of the series.

Throughout the day as the contest played out on a relatively mild fourth-day pitch, both sides had moments when they took control. But it was Marsh's innings of 80 and Carey's steady hand which guided Australia to victory.

But Carey kept Australia on track and added another 61 unbeaten runs with captain Pat Cummins who hit a four through cover for the winning runs and finished 32 not out.

Carey had strike on 97 with three runs needed and a chance to complete his century which would have been the first century of the match. But he gloved a single and Cummins ended the run chase a few balls later.

US beats Brazil 1-0 in Women's Gold Cup title game

San Diego Mar 11 (AP):

Lindsey Horan scored on a header in first-half stoppage time and the United States beat Brazil 1-0 to win the CONCACAF Women's Gold Cup.

Horan scored just moments into stoppage time with a header off a well-placed lofted pass from Emily Fox. It was Horan's third goal of the tournament, her earlier goals were from the penalty spot. Lynn Williams nearly scored a second for the United States in the 79th minute but the play was offside. Casey Krueger headed out a dangerous Brazilian cross in the final moments. The United States was stunned in the group stage of the tournament

by a 2-0 loss to Mexico just the second loss in the 43-game series. The Americans rebounded

with a 3-0 win over Colombia in the quarterfinals, before advancing to the final on penalties

after a rain-soaked 2-2 draw with Canada in the semifinals. Brazil had won each of its five matches in the tournament, including a 3-0 victory over Mexico in the semifinals, scoring 15 goals. The Brazilians allowed just two total goals in the team's first competitive tournament under coach Arthur Elias, who took over for Pia Sundhage after Brazil's exit at last summer's Women's World Cup. Likewise, the United States was playing its first tournament under interim coach Twila Kilgore, who assumed her role after the team parted ways with coach Vlatko Andonovski after the earliest-ever World Cup exit.

SC asks Delhi CM whether he wants to tender apology

New Delhi, Mar 11 (PTI):

The Supreme Court on Monday asked Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, who has challenged a Delhi High Court order upholding the summons issued to him as an accused in a criminal defamation case, whether he wanted to give an apology to the complainant in the matter. On February 26, Kejriwal told the apex court that he made a mistake by retweeting an allegedly defamatory video circulated by YouTuber Dhruv Rathee related to the BJP IT Cell.

During the hearing on Monday, a bench of justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta was told by the counsel appearing

for complainant Vikas Sankrityayan that Kejriwal may issue an apology on public platforms like microblogging platform 'X' or Instagram.

"You tell us what you want. We can put it to the other side. We are not going to step into your shoes or the other side's shoes," the bench told the counsel. The bench said the complainant can give the format of the apology to Kejriwal.

"So, if you want to give an apology, you can circulate it without prejudice to your rights and contentions. Let him examine," the bench told senior advocate Abhishek

Singhvi, who was appearing for Kejriwal.

"Otherwise we will examine the legal issue whether merely re-tweeting is criminal offence or not. We may agree with you, we may agree with the other side. We will examine that," the bench said. When one of the lawyers sought time to take instructions, the bench said, "Show him the apology. If he agrees to it, then it is fine". While posting the matter for hearing in the week commencing May 13, the bench said its earlier order asking the trial court not to take up the defamation case till March 11 would continue

till the next date of hearing. On February 26, the apex court, without issuing notice on Kejriwal's plea challenging the high court order; had asked the complainant whether he wanted to close the matter in view of the petitioner accepting it was a mistake. Singhvi had said it was a case for retweeting on social media platform 'X' and the complaint filed was immediately followed by recording of pre-summoning evidence.

"Thereafter, the complaint was withdrawn. When it was refiled, after nine months of the retweeting, it was suppressed that the original complaint was withdrawn," the senior lawyer had said.

Maha cabinet gives nod to 300-acre park in Mumbai

Guesthouse for pilgrims in Ayodhya

Mumbai, Mar 11 (PTI):

Just ahead of the Lok Sabha elections, the Maharashtra cabinet on Monday cleared 18 proposals, including the development of a 300-acre park in Mumbai and the construction of a guesthouse in Ayodhya for pilgrims from the state. As per an official statement, Chief Minister Eknath Shinde chaired a cabinet meeting, during which he cleared the urban development department's proposal to develop a 300-acre landscaped park along the lines of New York's Central Park. The cabinet approved the public works department's proposed construction of a guesthouse in Ayodhya for pilgrims from the state visiting the newly inaugurated Ram temple and other sites in the Uttar Pradesh town, it said.

'Over 40 % cab drivers, delivery persons face violence at work'

New Delhi, Mar 11 (PTI):

Nearly 47 per cent cab drivers and 41.5 per cent delivery persons face some form of violence at work with a majority of the latter demanding to discontinue the 10 minutes delivery policy, a survey report has revealed.

Several companies offer discount and provide the order for free if the delivery is not made within 10 minutes of placing the order. In an incident in October last year, a pizza delivery man in Pune, Maharashtra, was assaulted and threatened by firing in the air by an angry customer due to late arrival of the pizza at his doorstep. According to the survey by a Delhi-based NGO, PAIGAM, 41.5 per cent of the respondents reported that they have faced violence at work.

The survey studied responses from a sample size of 10,000 gig and app-based drivers, and deliv-

ery workers between April 2022 to 2023 across eight states, including Delhi, Lucknow, Jaipur, Indore, Mumbai, Kolkata, Hyderabad and Bangalore.

The survey highlights the challenges faced by app-based drivers and gig workers, who are grappling with lack of employment benefits, job insecurity, legal protection concerns, income instability, violence and discrimination. As per the survey, 72 per cent of the gig workers find it difficult to manage their expenses with a substantial percentage earning below Rs 15,000 per month. "83 per cent of cab drivers work over 10 hours a day, with a staggering 31 per cent exceeding 14 hours daily. Still, 72 per cent of workers find it difficult to manage expenses and a substantial percentage earns below Rs 15,000 per month," the survey said. The long working hours adversely

impact the health of these workers with about 93.3 per cent of the cab drivers complaining that they face physical pain, including joint pain and backache, and 98.5 per cent delivery persons said they experience anxiety, depression, stress and irritability.

Additionally, customer behaviour negatively impacts 68 per cent of delivery persons, it said.

A 'gig employee' is described as someone who engages in income-earning activities out of the doors of a traditional organisation-employee relationship, often working in the casual sector, according to a report presented by the Ministry of Labour and Employment in 2020.

Akriti Bhatia, a research director, said, "Gig and app-based workers should be treated as employees and the companies should ensure that drivers get a minimum wage."
