DANTEWADA: A District Reserve Guard (DRG) constable was killed and another policeman injured due to an accidental discharge of a firearm in Chhattisgarh's Dantewada district, officials said on Thursday.

The incident took place at around 11 pm on Wednesday when a joint team of the DRG and Bastar Fighter, both

units of state police, was out on an anti-Naxal operation in Barsoor police station limits, a statement issued by the police said.

Acting on an input about the presence of armed Naxalites in Handawada and Hitawada villages along the Dantewada-Narayanpur districts border, the security personnel had launched the operation, it said.

BJP strives to retain Rajnandgaon LS seat


RAJNANDGAON: The Rajnandgaon Lok Sabha seat in Chhattisgarh, which showed the influence of an erstwhile royal family in electoral politics and the journey of several powerful politicians in the state, is witnessing an interesting fight this time, with the sitting MP locking horns with a former chief minister.

People started looking at alternatives other than the Congress which gradually lost its hold over Rajnandgaon. The grand old party has tried its one of strongest and influential OBC leaders Baghel in this backward caste-dominated constituency this



time, he said.

However, caste factor has never influenced the outcome of the poll in this seat. During the last assembly polls, the BJP aggressively campaigned on the issue of Hindutva in Kawardha district falling in Rajnandgaon Lok Sabha seat, which virtually benefited the party, he said. This time, too, the



Hindutva card is going to play a crucial role for the ruling party, he added. An alleged incident of removal of religious flags from a thoroughfare in Kawardha town in 2021 that had resulted in a clash between the two communities was extensively raised by BJP during assembly polls.

Congress spokesperson Rupesh Dubey said

the results of previous Lok Sabha elections have not been in favour of his party, but this time it is in a strong position.

Exuding confidence in the party's victory, BJP spokesperson Neelu Sharma said, "We do not consider any election easy. But the equation in Rajnandgaon seat is in favour of BJP." "There is resentment among Congressmen themselves about not giving opportunities to local leaders. We had won only one assembly seat of the eight assembly constituencies in 2018, but won Rajnandgaon Lok Sabha seat in 2019 by more than one lakh votes," he said.



SAD's Amritsar candidate counts on work done as minister

CHANDIGARH: Shiromani Akali Dal candidate from Amritsar Lok Sabha seat Anil Joshi is banking on the work done by him as a minister in the erstwhile SAD-BJP government to clinch the seat in the June 1 election.

Former BJP MLA Joshi, a Hindu face, has been fielded by the Sukhbir Singh Badal-led Shiromani Akali Dal from the Sikh-dominated parliamentary constituency -- considered a Congress pocket borough.

Joshi was elected Amritsar North MLA in 2007 and 2012 on a BJP ticket and was the state's local bodies and medical education and research minister in the SAD-BJP regime from 2012 to 2017. In 2021, Joshi was expelled from the BJP after he criticised the party for "mishandling" the farm agitation. Thereafter, he joined the Akali Dal. **PTI**

INDIA bloc is fighting against NDA PM Modi wants to 'create rift' among people: Farooq Abdullah





"I pray that the INDIA alliance is successful in Delhi so that Ambedkar's Constitution is saved and it will undo the wrongdoings committed," the former J-K chief minister said. **PTI**

OMAR ABDULLAH ON POLLS 'BJP raking up religious sentiments as ground beneath its feet slipping'

SRINAGAR: The BJP is raking up religious sentiments as the ground beneath its feet is slipping, National Conference leader Omar Abdullah said on Thursday. He also said it is no secret that such attacks, especially against the Muslims, were carried out after the first phase of voting. "As far as the use of religion is concerned, this is not the first time. As the BJP sees the ground slipping beneath its feet, it starts talking again in the context of religion," Abdullah told reporters after the party's candidate Aga Syed Ruhullah Mehdi filed his nomination from the Srinagar Lok Sabha constituency. "It seems that the BJP had some expectations from the first phase of the elections and perhaps those expectations were not met," he added. The National Conference vice-president said the party has decided to field a covering candidate in wake of the BJP candidate winning unopposed from Gujarat's Surat after all other nominees withdrew from the fray. **PTI**

BJP's Kerala drive, Maha ambition on test amid soaring political temperature

Whether the soaring political temperature prevails over the heatwave-like conditions and pushes more voters to booths is something political watchers will be keeping an eye on.

NEW DELHI: Will the BJP's drought in Kerala finally end? Will a spike in political temperature following Prime Minister Narendra Modi's sharp attack on the Congress boost turnout? These are some of the questions weighing on people's minds as 89 Lok Sabha seats go to the polls on Friday.

Many senior BJP and opposition leaders, including Rahul Gandhi and Shashi Tharoor

of the Congress, and Union ministers Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, Kailash Choudhary and Rajeev Chandrasekhar, are in the fray as polling enters many saffron strongholds. In 2019, the BJP had won 53 and its existing allies 12 of these seats, including seven of eight in Uttar Pradesh, all 13, eight and seven in Rajasthan, Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh respectively, and four of the five seats each in Assam and Bihar. The constituents of the now

INDIA bloc had won 23 seats in the last general election.

Seeking to better its tally, the BJP must not

only retain its bastions but also make fresh inroads as it takes on the opposition INDIA bloc in a battle of narratives, with Modi leading its charge.

Following the first phase polls in 102 seats on April 19, the prime minister has stepped up his attack on the Congress, accusing it of seeking to provide nationwide reservation to Muslims in the quotas meant for Other Backward Classes.

He has also warned voters in his poll rallies

that a Congress government at the Centre will snatch their assets, including women's 'mangalsutra', to benefit those who are "intruders" and have more children as he cited a speech of his predecessor Manmohan Singh to back his claim.

The Congress, in turn, has accused him of lying and spreading communal divide, claiming that he has been rattled by the BJP's poor show and complaining to the Election Commission against him.

Congress, SP harbour negative sentiments for India: Yogi

AGRA: Mounting a blistering attack on the opposition, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath Thursday said those who are against welfare and development initiatives, and a secure India are conspiring against the country once again. Speaking at a rally here in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, he said the Congress and the Samajwadi Party harbour negative sentiments towards India. The members of the "INDI alliance" have a track record of "betraying the nation and dividing the society" on the basis of caste, region and language", he said. Adityanath alleged that whenever they were in power, they made deliberate efforts to rob rights of the Scheduled Castes, he said.

Polling will be held on Friday at 28,758 booths from 7 am to 6 pm. Around 2.80 crore voters are eligible to vote in the second phase.

JAIPUR: After a high-voltage electioneering in Rajasthan polling on 13 out of 25 Lok Sabha seats will be held on Friday.

Among the 152 candidates in the fray in this phase are two Union ministers, the BJP state president and a former Assembly Speaker. The sons of two former chief ministers are also contesting in this phase of Lok Sabha elections. This is the final phase of elec-

The sample of 250 grams of 'Bee Honey' packed, lot number 174.10 MFG October was sent to the State Food Analyst, Raipur for testing, on which the said food item was declared 'normal but misbranded' i.e. standard but misbranded.

On which under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, Section

Accused Shashank Jigyasi, food seller, Narendra Kothari distributor and wholesaler and Rajnikant Gupta manufacturer were asked to answer on the basis of prosecution and documents, on which all three accused admitted their mistake and were satisfied with the investigation report of the State Food Analyst, Raipur, due to which there was no need for arguments from either side.

After observing the case and the reply presented by the accused, under Section 27 (1) of the Food Safety and Standards Act 2006, the manufacturer or packer of

any food item will be liable for such food item as long as it does not comply with the provisions of this Act and the rules made there under.

Thus, in the absence of factual information on the part of M/s Gupta Honey Processors, the food item 'Bee Honey' (packed) weight 250 grams, lot number 174.10 MFG, written in the month of October as 100 percent natural and pure, was not acceptable, thus M/s Gupta Honey Processor was booked for violation of Section 26 (2) (PP), 27 (1) of the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, and M/s Narendra Pharma.

On the day of Hanuman Janmotsav, a Prabhat Pheri also took place in the morning, which passed through the main roads of the city and ended at









JD(U) leader Saurav shot dead by motorcycle-borne assailants

PATNA: A JD(U) leader was shot dead by motorcycle-borne assailants in Purnia area on the outskirts of Bihar's Patna, police said on Thursday.

The deceased has been identified as Saurav Kumar. Another person accompanying him, Munmun Kumar, was injured in the firing, they said.

"The incident took place around 12.15 am on Thursday when Saurav along with Munmun were returning from a wedding ceremony. The assailants fired at them and fled. A search operation has been launched to nab the culprits," said Kanhaiya Singh, SDPO, Masaurhi (Patna).

Both of them were taken to the nearest hospital, where Saurav Kumar succumbed to his injuries. The condition of the injured person is now stable, Singh said. Cong-SP alliance in UP based on 'appeasement': PM Modi

Prime Minister repeated charges against the Congress on "redistribution" of wealth

AGRA: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday said the Congress-Samajwadi Party alliance in Uttar Pradesh was based on a "policy of appeasement", and its leaders wanted to snatch the rights of the OBC through the back door. Addressing an election rally in Agra, the prime minister repeated charges against the Congress on "redistribution" of wealth and even depriving people of their inheritance.

"They have their eyes on the savings of mothers and sisters. But I am standing as your watchman to make the mothers and sisters maintain their claim on their property," Modi said, invoking the term "chowkidar" he has used for himself in the past. He said the Constitution doesn't allow reservation on the basis of religion. "But the Congress insults the Constitution by advocating this. The Congress is determined to steal from the OBC (Other Backward Classes) quota to provide reservation based on religion," Modi said.

"The policy of appeasement divided the country but we are ending 'tushtikaran' (appeasement) and work-

ing for 'santushtikaran' (satisfying people)," he added. He attacked the opposition alliance in Uttar Pradesh, referring indirectly to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi and Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav.

"Both talk of the OBC in their speeches but they want to snatch away their rights from the back door and strengthen their (own) vote bank," he said.

Tax, he switched lanes."

"Once again, his lies stand unraveled. Here is the paragraph from then-Finance Minister VP Singh's budget speech of March 16th, 1985, which proposed the abolition of estate duty. Paragraph 88 of the speech states the reasons clearly," Ramesh said and shared an excerpt from the speech.

"As both wealth-tax and estate duty laws apply to the property of a person, the former

While the accused sold the land to others, they abused and threatened to harm the builder whenever he sought a refund, the official said citing the complaint. Acting on a complaint by the builder, the Shanti Nagar police in Bhiwandi registered a case against the couple and their son on Tuesday, the official added.

MUMBAI: Two children missing for hours were found dead inside a parked car at Anopt Hill in central Mumbai, with the police suspecting that the kids lost their lives due to suffocation, an official said on Thursday.

The car was locked from inside and it appears that the children could not unlock it, the official said.

Muskan Mohabbat Shaikh (5) and Sajid Mohammed Shaikh (7) were playing outside their homes, where

the car was parked, on Wednesday afternoon.

When the children did not return home till evening, their parents started a search for them. Subsequently, they also lodged a missing complaint at the Antop Hill police station, the official said. A few hours later, an onlooker found the children lying unconscious inside the car. The vehicle doors were opened and the kids were rushed to the hospital but doctors declared them dead, the official said.

Prima facie, it seems the kids were suffocated to death as they were locked inside the car, the official said.

CBI files first FIR in Sandeshkhali case in WB





The top-seeded Korean trio defeated their Chinese Taipei rivals Tan Chih-Chun, Lin Zih-Siang and Tai Yu-Hsuan in straight sets 6-0 (57-50, 58-56, 58-54). Earlier, having got a first round bye in the season-opening tournament, the second seeded Indians overcame a first set deficit to beat 15th seeded Indonesia 5-3 (55-56, 54-54, 55-51, 55-53) in their tricky opening clash.

Bismah Maroof announces surprise retirement from international cricket

KARACHI: In a surprise development, Bismah Maroof, one of Pakistan's most high-profile women cricketers and former captain, on Thursday announced retirement from all international cricket with immediate effect.

Bismah, 32, was forced into a long break from cricket, first due to a fitness issue in 2020 and

then after giving birth to a baby girl in August 2021.

Bismah had grabbed headlines when she took her baby to the 2022 World Cup in New Zealand. She was the first Pakistani woman cricketer to avail a 12-month maternity leave with pay policy.

A left-handed batter, Bismah made her ODI debut against India in 2006 and went on to represent Pakistan in 276

international matches, the most by any Pakistan women cricketer. She had made her T20I debut against Ireland in 2009.

She has scored 6,262 international runs, including 33 half-centuries, and has taken 80 international wickets with her right-arm leg-spin.

"I have decided to retire from the game I love the most. It has been an incredible journey,

filled with challenges, victories, and unforgettable memories," Bismah said in a statement.

"I want to express my gratitude to my family, who has supported me throughout my cricketing journey, from the very beginning until now.

"I also want to extend my thanks to the Pakistan Cricket Board for believing in me and providing the platform to showcase my talent.

Modi has done an unbelievable job in India: JPMorgan CEO


NEW YORK: Prime Minister Narendra Modi is doing an "unbelievable job" in India by pursuing reforms and taking 400 million people out of poverty through inclusive financial programmes, JPMorgan Chase CEO Jamie Dimon has said. Dimon made these remarks while speaking at an event hosted by the Economic Club of New York. He praised Prime Minister Modi for the performance of his government. He also praised reforms undertaken by Modi in the recent past. "They have put in this unbelievable trend that every citizen by hand or eyeball or by finger is recognised. They opened bank accounts for 700 million people. Their transferred payments are going through." He also called Modi "tough" for breaking old bureaucratic systems and said, "We need a little bit more of that here (in the US)". Dimon, 68, also had words of praise for the country's indirect tax regime, which he said removed corruption emanating from the disparity in tax systems followed by different states. **PTI**

Doval, Russian Counterpart Review Bilateral Progress

MOSCOW: National Security Adviser Ajit Doval on Wednesday met with his Russian counterpart Nikolai Patrushev for a second time this month and they reviewed progress in bilateral cooperation and discussed important issues of mutual interest. Doval held a bilateral meeting with Patrushev, Secretary of the Security Council of the Russian Federation, on the sidelines of the XII International Meeting of High Ranking Officials Responsible for Security Matters in St Petersburg, the Indian Embassy in Moscow said in a post on X.

"Both sides reviewed progress in bilateral cooperation and discussed important issues of mutual interest," it added. During the talks, the two sides focused on bilateral cooperation on various fronts. A special emphasis was placed on cooperation between Russia and India on the track of international and regional security, Russia's state-run TASS news agency reported. The NSA had condemned the barbaric terror attack at Crocus City Hall in Moscow on March 22 and called for shunning double standards in combating the menace. Earlier this month, Doval met

Patrushev on the sidelines of the 19th annual meeting of the secretaries of security councils of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) member states in Astana and conveyed India's solidarity with the government and the people of Russia to address the threat from

terrorism in all its forms and manifestations. In his address at the security conclave of the SCO in Astana, Doval had said that the perpetrators of terrorism should be effectively and expeditiously dealt with including those involved in cross-border terrorist activities. Separately, Doval on Wednesday spoke at the luncheon meeting of BRICS NSAs hosted by the Secretary of the Russian Federation's Security Council and called for closer cooperation in the fight against terrorism and concrete actions to prevent transborder planning, funding and execution of terrorist

acts. Doval also had a bilateral meeting with his Myanmar counterpart Admiral Moe Aung and talked about the current situation in Myanmar and India-funded infrastructure projects in Myanmar. "They also discussed recent developments along the India-Myanmar border, including issues related to security, refugees, development projects, etc," the Indian mission in Moscow said in another post on X.

US, China naval officials held meeting

WASHINGTON: The United States slammed Russia on Wednesday for vetoing a UN Security Council resolution on the Outer Space Treaty that put a legally-binding obligation that countries should not be putting weapons of mass destruction (WMD), including nuclear weapons, in orbit. "As we have noted

previously, the United States assesses that Russia is developing a new satellite carrying a nuclear device. We have heard President (Vladimir) Putin say publicly that Russia has no intention of deploying nuclear weapons in space. If that were the case, Russia would not have vetoed this resolution," US National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan

said in a statement, after Russia vetoed the resolution at the UN headquarters in New York. "Today, Russia vetoed a UN Security Council resolution, proposed jointly by the United States and Japan, that would have reaffirmed the fundamental obligation of State Parties to the Outer Space Treaty not to place nuclear weapons in orbit around the Earth," Sullivan said.
