# Ford under investigation for Bronco Sport gas leaks

Shariyf, who oversees

US says its remedy doesn't fix the problem

**Detroit (US), Apr 12 (AP):** 

The US government's auto safety agency has opened an investigation into a Ford recall for gasoline leaks from cracked fuel injectors that can cause engine fires, saying in documents that the remedy doesn't fix the The National Highway

Traffic Safety Administration said in documents posted on Friday that the probe will "evaluate the adequacy and safety consequences of the remedy" that Ford specifies in the recall.

The agency moved with unusual speed, posting documents detailing the "recall query" just two days after the recall was

The recall covers nearly 43,000 Ford Bronco Sport SUVs from the 2022 and 2023 model years, and Escape SUVs from 2022. All have 1.5-litre engines.

NHTSA said that fuel injectors can crack, causing gasoline or vapours to leak at a high rate onto hot surfaces in the engine compartment.

The Associated Press reported on Wednesday that Ford's remedy for the leaks is to add a drain tube to send the gas away from hot surfaces, and a software update to detect a pressure drop in the fuel injection system.

If that happens, the software will disable the high pressure fuel pump, reduce engine power and cut temperatures in the encompartment. Owners also will get a "seek service" message.

But the US said on Friday that Ford's fix lets

fuel drain from a cylinder head hole to the ground below the vehicles. "The recall remedy does not include replacement of the cracked fuel injector," the

agency said.

Ford said on Friday it is working with NHTSA on the investigation.

The company said in documents that it has reports of five under-hood fires and 14 warranty replacements of fuel injectors, but no reports of crashes or injuries.

In an email Wednesday, Ford said it is not replacing fuel injectors because it is confident the recall repairs "will prevent the failure from occurring and protect the customer".

The new software triggers a dashboard warning light and allows customers to drive to a safe location, stop the vehicle and arrange for service, the

#### **Uncertainty over impending elections could** risk Sri Lanka's economic recovery: ADB

Colombo, Apr 12 (PTI):

The "uncertainty" over the impending elections in Sri Lanka will cause a possible downward trend in the country's economic outlook, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) has said.

The island nation is set to face a presidential election in the last quarter of this year, while the parliamentary election is due mid-next year.

However, political uncertainty prevails in the country as opposition parties have pledged to reverse the current IMFlinked reforms, which have proved to be unpopular with the masses.

Ranil President Wickremesinghe, who has steered the recovery programme by going into a bailout deal with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for a USD 2.9 billion facility, maintains that the island could once again face economic collapse if the IMF pro-

gramme reforms are not

Outlining the economic risks Sri Lanka is facing. the ADB in its South Asian chapter's economic trends report released yesterday said, "Among them the most important is uncertainty associated with the upcoming elections, including any possible impact on fiscal policy and reform implementation."

The ADB noted that there are signs of economic recovery in Lanka and emerging growth had revived in the second half of 2023 and is expected to continue in 2024 and 2025.

"Inflation decelerated in single digits last year following a peak in 2022 and will remain below 10 per cent in 2024 and 2025. Challenges remain and the upcoming electoral cycle must not delay the reforms required to address the recent economic crisis. Sri Lanka needs to address vulnerability to poverty to ensure inclusive growth," the report said.

## 'Significant shortcomings' in Bank of England's economic forecasting

Ex-Fed chair Ben **Bernanke's findings** 

London, Apr 12 (AP):

A review of the Bank of England's economic forecasting that was published on Friday and undertaken by Ben Bernanke, the former chair of the US Federal Reserve, has found "significant shortcomings" that should be addressed to better inform future rate decisions.

Following widespread criticism about the Bank of England's forecasts, Bernanke was tasked last year to review the

forecasting models. Though noting that all central banks have had problems over the past few years as a result of a series of economic shocks, notably the coronavirus pandemic and the cost-of-living crisis heightened by

Ukraine, Bernanke said the Bank of England's issues were made worse by out-of-date software that had not been properly maintained. The review said that "in-

sufficient resources have been devoted to ensuring that the software and models underlying the forecast maintained".

Bernanke, who led the Fed between 2006 and 2014, a period that included the global financial crisis, made a series of recommendations that the Bank of England said it was committed to fulfilling.

Bank of England Gov. Andrew Bailey said the review was a "once-in-a-generation opportunity" for the central bank to update its models and make them fit for purpose to a "more uncertain world".

One recommendation is that the Bank of England start producing its own forecasts of what might

happen to interest rates in future, something that could help inform its inflation forecasts.

Over the past couple of years, the Bank of England has faced criticism for being too slow to respond to surging inflation stoked by Russia's invasion of Ukraine, which sent energy costs soaring, and supply issues connected to the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions.
As a result, critics have

argued that inflation ended up rising higher than it should have done to a multidecade high of more than 11 per cent two percentage points more than in the US, for example. The consequence of that, they say, is that the Bank of England's rate setting Monetary Policy Committee then had to rise interest rates by more than would otherwise have been required and will have to stay higher

## Nearly 12,000 homes are flooded in a Russian region bordering Kazakhstan

**Water levels keep rising** 

Moscow, Apr 12 (AP): Nearly 12,000 houses have been flooded in a Russian bordering Kazakhstan as water levels in the Ural River keep rising and threatening more deluge, authorities said Thursday.

The floods sparked evacuations of thousands in the Orenburg region, located some 1,200 kilometres (745 miles), southeast of the capital of Moscow after a dam on the river burst last week under the pressure of surging waters. Local authorities have declared a state of emergency in the region.

In a televised video conference with President Vladimir Putin, Orenburg governor Denis Pasler reported that a total of 11,972 houses are flooded, as well as 16 state medical facilities. Additionally, 3,600 houses — home to some 20,000 people — are in danger of imminent flooding as water levels continue

The situation is most dire in the city of Orenburg, the administrative capital of the region, Pasler said, where the water level in the Ural River reached a historical peak of 10.87 metres (about 36 feet).

A total of 7,800 people have been evacuated from the flooded areas so far, he added. The overall damage from the floods is estimated to exceed 40 billion rubles (USD 428 million).

Further east along the Kazakhstan border, authorities in the regions of Kurgan and Tyumen are also preparing for possible floods as water levels rise in local rivers.

Floods have also hit Kazakhstan, where authorities have declared a state of emergency in 10 out of 17 regions of the country, according to Russia's state news

agency Tass. As of Thursday, the state of emergency was still in place in eight regions, Tass reported. Since March, more than 98,000 people have been evacuated from the affected areas there.

Footage from the flooded regions in Kazakhstan showed water gushing down streets, vast fields covered with water and dozens of houses partially submerged. Kazakh President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev has called the floods "a natural disaster ... the likes of which have not been seen for many years.'

## Two Palestinians killed, 3 injured in confrontations with Israeli forces

In West Bank

**Jerusalem, Apr 12 (AP):** 

Palestinians were killed early Friday in confrontations with Israeli forces in the Israeli-occupied West Palestinian Bank, medics and the military said. The Palestine Red Crescent Society confirmed the two deaths and said three people were wounded, including one who sustained serious injuries.

The Islamic militant group Hamas said one of those killed was a commander.

Palestinian health offi-Palestinians, including several dozen children and teens, have been killed by Israeli fire in the West Bank since the start of the Israel-

Hamas war in Gaza.

Six months of fighting in Gaza have pushed the tiny the tiny Palestinian territory into a humanitarian crisis, leaving more than 1 million people on the brink of starvation. The head of the United States Agency for International Development, Samantha Power, told lawmakers Wednesday she accepted "credible" reports that famine is now occurring in hardhit northern Gaza. President Joe Biden said this week that Israel is not doing enough to increase the flow of humanitarian aid into Gaza.

bombard-Israeli ments and ground offensives have killed at least 33,360 Palestinians in Gaza and wounded 74,993, the Health Ministry says. The ministry doesn't differentiate between civilians and combatants in its tally, but says women and children make up two-thirds of the dead.

#### Lifting a near-total ban on abortion

Warsaw, Apr 12 (AP): Polish lawmakers voted Friday to continue work on proposals to lift a neartotal ban on abortion, a highly divisive issue in the traditionally Roman Catholic country, which has one of the most restrictive laws in Europe. Members of the lower house of parliament, the Sejm, voted to work on four separate bills. Two of them propose legalising abortion through the 12th week of pregnancy, in line with European norms.

There's a reason why President Joe Biden and former President Donald Trump are spending so much time attacking each other — people don't think either man has much to brag about when it comes to his own record. Americans generally think that while they were in the White House, both did more harm than good on key issues.

But the two candidates have different weak spots. For Biden, it's widespread unhappiness on two issues: the economy and immigration. Trump, meanwhile,

dent regularly decries the

number of asylum-seekers who have arrived in the US under Biden, describing the situation in apocalyptic and dark terms. And Biden has gone on the offensive against Trump on abortion, especially after this week's ruling from the Arizona Supreme Court that essentially criminalised the procedure in the state.

When asked which president did more to help people like them, roughly onethird say Donald Trump and about one-quarter say Joe Biden. Yet 30 per cent of adults said neither Biden nor Trump benefitted them. It's another data point reflecting an electorate that has been largely

disappointed with this year's general election choices, generating little enthusiasm among key parts of the Biden and Trump political coalitions.

Americans rate Biden

particularly negatively on a few specific issues. Only about 2 in 10 Americans think Biden's presidency helped "a lot" or "a little on cost of living, and 16 per cent say that about immigration and border security. Nearly 6 in 10 say his presidency hurt a lot or a little on these issues. Nearly half, 46 per cent, of Americans, by contrast, say that Trump's presidency helped a lot or a little on immigration or border security





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## Youth sentenced to rigorous life imprisonment in murder case

Raipur, Apr 12:

The court of 7th Additional Judge Sessions Vandana Deepak Dewangan today sentenced a youth to rigorous life imprisonment in case of murder. According to information available deceased Devraj Dhruv used to speak wrong things about his sister Manisha Yadav to the friends of accused Jai Prakash alias Bau, due to which the accused reached near the house of deceased Devraj on the night of February 11, 2022 to take revenge for the said thing.

On being called Devraj came out of his house. When he completed a couple of steps outside his house he was stabbed by accused Jai Prakash with the button knife. Jai Prakash hit Devraj in the neck with the intention of killing, causing injury. Complainant Lekhram (father of the deceased) went to save his son and in the meantime accused Jai Prakash ran away and Devraj fell on the ground. Devraj was admitted to Hospital for treatment but he died during treatment on February 15, 2022.

With his conviction Jai Prakash was punished under sections 302 of Indian Penal Code and sentenced to rigorous life imprisonment with fine of Rs 1000. He will have to service additional imprisonment of one month in case of default of payment of fine.

Statements of as many as 16 people were recorded in the case, informed Rajendra Jain Additional Public Prosecutor, District and Sessions Court Raipur Chhattisgarh.

# SC extends stay on ex-IPS officer's sentence on Dhoni's contempt plea

New Delhi, Apr 12 (PTI):

The Supreme Court has extended the interim stay on the 15-day simple imprisonment handed to retired IPS officer G Sampath Kumar by the Madras High Court in a contempt of court case filed by former cricketer Mahendra Singh Dhoni. A bench of Justices A S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan has listed the matter for hearing

"Interim order shall continue till further orders," the bench said on Thursday The high court had, on December 15 last year, found Kumar guilty of committing criminal contempt and sentenced him to simple imprisonment for 15 days.

In his contempt peti-

punishment for Kumar for his remarks against the judiciary in a written statement filed in response to a Rs 100-crore defamation suit. Dhoni had moved the court in 2014 against the former police officer for naming him in the Indian Premier League (IPL) betting In its order, the high

court had said Kumar had consciously made an attempt to scandalise and lower the authority of this court and the Supreme Court. It was established that an affidavit or pleading presented by a party before a court was an act of publication.

Kumar, by his specific words, had launched an

to scandalise and undermine the dignity and majesty of this court as well as the apex court, the high court had said.

It had said when a general statement was made against the court for granting an interim order, describing the order as an abuse of the process of law, it was not a fair com-Similarly, accusing the

Supreme Court that it failed to focus on the "rule of law" cannot be accepted as a fair expression of grievance of a party to the dispute, the bench had added. The high court had said Kumar was a responsible police officer who had the occasion to investigate a crime.

The freedom of speech

extended to undermine

the statutory limits contained in the Contempt of Courts Act, the court had said, adding that since maintaining the dignity of courts is one of the cardinal principles of the rule of law, any publication or public speech that results in undermining it cannot be allowed, as held by the apex court in several precedents

The high court had said the Contempt of Courts Act was enacted to secure public respect and confidence in the judiciary as an institution. "If persons like Sampath Kumar were allowed to shake the confidence of the public in the impartial administration of justice, it should be treated as an attack on the

"In the present case, we are convinced that the statements made by the respondent in the additional written statement is with an intention to scandalise this court, to lower its authority and to destroy the confidence of people in the administration of justice.

"From the language and the context, this court has no hesitation to hold that the respondent wants to convey a message in the additional written statement that the high court as well as the Supreme Court, while passing orders, either do not follow the rule of law or pass orders which are nothing but an abuse of the process of law", the high

#### **NASA's Quest for Extraterrestrial Life**

Europa's harsh radiation field poses a threat to the probe's delicate instruments, subjecting them to intense scrutiny akin to 100,000 chest x-rays per circuit. Moreover, the vast distances traversed by the Clipper entail a 45-minute lag in communication—a testament to the unfathomable scales of the cosmos. Power, too, emerges as a critical concern. While the probe's solar array boasts impressive capabilities near Earth, its efficacy diminishes amidst Jupiter's distant embrace. Jordan Evans, project manager for the Europa Clipper mission, elucidates the stark reality: from powering twenty houses to a mere handful of light bulbs, the transition underscores the logistical intricacies of deep space exploration. Amidst these challenges, the Europa Clipper mission symbolizes a testament to human ingenuity and perseverance. Decades in the making, the endeavor embodies the culmination of scientific ambition and technological prowess, offering a glimpse into the limitless possibilities that await beyond our terrestrial confines. As the probe embarks on its odyssey, the echoes of curiosity reverberate throughout the cosmos. ndia is facing a significant chal-■ lenge amidst its economic and industrial growth: a water crisis. Despite a population of over 1.4 billion, the country only has access to 4% of the world's fresh water. The water crisis affects people and the environment because of rapid population growth, cities spreading out, unpredictable monsoons caused by climate change, and not

managing water well. Groundwater levels are dropping because of too much farming, encouraged by wrong incentives and subsidized electricity. Scarcity of water is a challenge faced by almost every state in India during the summer months, aggravated by insufficient monsoon rains and rising temperatures. It is anticipated that by 2030, the demand for water will exceed the available supply, doubling the pressure on resources. The situation is dire in some areas, such as the Indo-Gangetic basin, where groundwater depletion has passed the tipping point. redictions indicate critically low groundwater availability in the northwestern region by 2025. The effects of the crisis are far-reaching, impacting sanitation, health, and finances, especially for vulnerable communities such as slum dwellers and low-income households. Despite the looming crisis, water remains affordable in India, benefiting the average person but leading to overuse and poor management in sectors like agriculture and power generation. Additionally, industries dependent on clean water often face challenges in controlling their runoff, resulting in considerable wastage. Furthermore, the lack of regulation has contributed to water pollution, affecting nearly 70% of households in India with contaminated water. To tackle the water crisis, immediate action is needed from multiple fronts. Firstly, subsidies must support water-efficient practices in agriculture. Promoting less water-intensive crops is crucial for conservation efforts. Additionally, improving water management and wastewater treatment systems is essential for sustainability. Cultivating a culture of water conservation through awareness and community engagement is vital, making water-saving habits a part of daily life for everyone. Examples like Bangalore highlight the importance of sustainable water management and community engagement. Effective measures are crucial for securing a sustainable water future for both Bangalore and India. Addressing issues such as mismanagement, climate change, and technology gaps is essential. Poor management depletes surface water sources, while excessive pumping drains groundwater reserves. Coordinated teamwork, innovation, sustainable practices, and AI integration are vital for ensuring a water-resilient future for India's people and industries.

# **Initiative to maintain balance** between inflation and development



ue to no significant decline in the level of inflation, on April 5, the Reserve Bank of India kept the repo rate unchanged at 6.5 percent in the monetary review and did not make any change in other policy rates. With this decision of the central bank, the current pace of development is likely to remain intact and due to this, along with the announcement of the results of the monetary review, a slight increase was also seen in the stock market.

The Reserve Bank has not made any change in the key policy rates for the seventh time. The central bank last raised the repo rate to 6.5 percent in February 2023. There has also been a history of not increasing the repo rate for a long time. During the economic recession of 2008, the repo rate remained at 6.5 percent for 10 months. Even during the debt crisis of 2013, the repo rate remained unchanged at 7.85 percent for 8 months. Then, in 2020, even during the Corona period, the repo rate remained at 4 percent for 25 months.

The Reserve Bank tries to fight inflation by increasing the repo rate. When the repo rate is high, banks get loans from the Reserve Bank at a higher rate, due to which banks also give loans to customers at a higher rate. By doing this, the liquidity of money in the economy decreases and due to lack of money in the pockets of the people, the demand for goods reduces and owing to the high price of goods and products, their sale declines, on account to which a waning in inflation is recorded. Similarly, when there is a slowdown in the economy, an attempt is made to increase the liquidity of money in the market to accelerate the developmental work and for this also the repo rate is cut, so that banks get loans from the Reserve Bank at a cheaper rate and after getting loans at a inexpensive rate, the bank also gives loans to the customers at a lower rate.

The main reason for not changing the repo rate and other policy rates is inflation. The Ministry of Statistics and Program Implementation released the latest inflation data based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) on March 12, 2024, according to which retail inflation declined marginally to 5.09 percent in February 2024, which is the lowest level in the last 4 months. Retail inflation was at 5.10 percent in January 2024, while it was at 5.69 percent in December 2023. It is within the tolerance limit set by the Reserve Bank of India, which is 2 percent more or 2 percent less than 4 percent. Despite this, this rate cannot be considered encouraging for rapid growth.

Inflation plays an important role in determining one's purchasing power. When inflation increases, the prices of both goods and services upsurge, which reduces the purchasing power of the person and the demand for goods and services detheir production shrinkages, the company suffers losses, workers are laid off, employment generation falls, etc. As a result, economic activities slow down, and the pace of development is hampered. Inflation rate is still very high in most countries of the world, while the level of inflation has decreased in some countries, the main reason for which is the diminution in the price of crude oil in the international market and the reduction in the obstacles in the way of supply chain.

Along with the latest data of World of Statistics, inflation in some countries of the world ranges from 100 percent to 250 percent. Argentina is the most expensive country in the world, where the inflation rate is 254 percent. Lebanon is at second place, while Venezuela is at third place. Pakistan is among the top 10 countries of the world with an inflation rate of 28.3 percent, while the inflation rate in Bangladesh is 9.86 percent. However, inflation is decreasing in developed countries. Inflation rate in England is 4.0 percent, while in USA It is 3.1 percent. Inflation rate is also 3.1 percent in France and this rate is 2.6 percent in Japan. At the same time, Thailand has the lowest inflation rate in the world at minus 1.11 percent, while the inflation rate in China is minus 0.8 percent, which ranks second in the world in terms of low inflation rate. India ranks 17th in the world in terms of low inflation.

As per credit rating agency ICRA, the loan growth rate of banks on vear-on-vear basis was 16.5 percent in December 2023, which is estimated to be 12 to 13 percent in the financial year 2024-25. At the same time, according to Care Edge Rating Agency, the loan growth rate can be 16 percent in the financial year 2023-24, while it can be 14.0 percent or 14.5 percent in the financial year 2024-25. There has been an increase

creases. Then, their sales decline, in revenue collection in the financial year 2024-25 and tax and non-tax revenue collection is expected to increase in the coming months as well. Goods and Services Tax (GST) collection has also remained above Rs.1.5 lakh crore continuously for the last 6 months. Therefore, it is believed that during the financial year 2024-25, the government will borrow less, which can reduce the tax burden on the common man and businessmen.

In line with the HSBC India PMI data released on April 2, the manufacturing figure has reached the level of 59.1 in March 2024, which is the highest level in the last 16 years i.e., since 2008. It was at the level of 56.9 in the month of February. Due to the rapid increase in production and new orders since October 2020, it has been able to reach the level of 59.1. Not only this, but the manufacturing PMI has also remained above the level of 50 for the 33rd consecutive month. It is noteworthy that a level above 50 is an indicator of expansion in manufacturing activities, while a level below 50 is an indicator of contraction.

Inflation has a negative impact on the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth rate, but despite the high lending interest rate for the past few months, loan disbursement is fostering, and the pace of growth is also fast. However, such a situation is still an exception. The HSBC India PMI data reaching the level of 59.1 is an indicator of a boom in economic activities. Inflation in India is a little high despite being within the tolerance limit set by the central bank. Therefore, it is a wise decision by the Reserve Bank of India to keep the repo rate and other policy rates unchanged in the monetary review. This will maintain a balance between inflation and growth rate, due to which the common man will not face much trouble and the pace of development will also remain fast.

#### **Heatwave Concerns**

April sees the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) issuing heatwave warnings for isolated regions in Rajasthan as temperatures soar past 45 degrees Celsius. However, India's rising relative humidity poses a significant threat. While recorded temperatures may hover around 30 degrees Celsius, the "feels-like" temperature, determined by relative humidity, often exceeds this. The wet-bulb test, internationally recognized for assessing heat stress, sets a safe limit of 30 degrees Celsius. Surpassing this threshold increases the risk of heatstrokerelated fatalities. Despite several regions in India surpassing the wet bulb temperature, the IMD's reliance solely on conventional measures prevents the issuance of heatwave warnings. Urgent reform is necessary for the IMD to incorporate wet bulb temperatures into its testing

#### **Noopur Baruah, Tezpur Heat Stroke Alert**

Lack of rainfall in April and May raises the risk of heat waves. Heat exhaustion, cramps, and heat stroke are common, with symptoms ranging from excessive sweating to its absence. Heat stroke, the most severe, can push body temperature to dangerous levels, surpassing 103 to 106 degrees Fahrenheit. Without sweating and dehydration, cooling becomes impossible. Immediate measures include drinking ice-cold water, exposure to fans or coolers, and applying ice to the forehead, neck, and armpits. If recovery isn't evident, hospitalization for intravenous fluids and medical intervention is crucial.

memorable incident hap-A pened at Metro Railway Kolkata five years ago. There was no trace of Covid at that time and I was only one and half years shy of becoming a senior citizen. I was returning home and was standing before a general seat in a Metro coach not before a seat reserved for the senior citizens. A young man in his twenties stood up vacating his seat and asked me to sit there. I declined the offer saying that I was quite okay. Seeing that he was not in a mood to listen to me, I forcibly pushed him to sit again telling him that I had no problem in standing. But again he stood up. Then he said with all the love in the world, "bolchhi tumi boso (I am telling you to sit)."

In Kolkata Metro Railway coaches, some seats are reserved for

women and a few seats for senior citizens and people with disabilities. But there would have been no need to reserve seats for anyone if all the people were like that young man. The reservation signboards over some seats actually indicate that there are many passengers who do not have enough compassion. The reservation of seats in a train therefore acts as a necessary antidote to inhumanity.

Similarly, reservation on the basis of caste indicates that caste hatred, untouchability, and caste favouritism are there in our society. We need caste reservation as an antidote to caste based nepotism. There would be no need for caste reservation when all the people will become as progressive, sane and humane as Noble laureate, Kailash Satyarthi.

When he was a fifteen-year-old boy, Kailash Satyarthi made a plan

to organise a community dinner where the food would be cooked and served by the Dalits in a hygienic, neat and clean environment. He invited prominent political leaders and people from upper castes. Interestingly, they gladly accepted the invitation. A newly built park in Vidisha with Gandhi's statue at the centre was chosen as the venue

The ladies who were to cook food had put on brand new clothes and had brought absolutely clean utensils for cooking. The dinner was ready. Everybody had been waiting anxiously for the guests for a long time. But not even a single person or political leader turned up. The food was still fresh but the incident dampened the enthusiasm of Kailash, his friends and the

The double standard of those people was out in the open. Kailash clearly understood that the so called leaders who used to speak against the practice of untouchability and discrimination in public gatherings were actually haters of backward castes. Then Kailash and others sat together for the dinner.

# IIP grows to 4-month high of 5.7 pc in Feb

India's industrial production growth accelerated to a four-month high of 5.7 per cent in February 2024, mainly due to the good performance of the mining sector, according to official data released on Friday. The factory output growth measured in terms of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP) was 6 per cent in February 2023. The previous high of IIP was recorded at 11.9 per cent in October 2023, which slowed to 2.5 per cent in November, 4.2 per cent in December and 4.1 per cent in January 2024. During the April-February period of 2023-24, IIP growth touched 5.9 per cent, up from 5.6 per cent in the year-ago period. India's



Production grew by 5.7 per cent in February 2024, according to a release by the Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation. As per the latest data, the mining output growth accelerated to 8 per cent in February against 4.8 per cent in the year-ago month. The manufacturing sector's output growth decelerated to 5 per cent in February against 5.9 per cent a year ago. The power generation growth also slowed to 7.5 per cent in February from

same month of last year. As per use-base classification, the capital goods segment growth fell to 1.2 per cent in February 2024 compared to 11 per cent in the year-ago period. In February this year, consumer durables output expanded 12.3 per cent. It had contracted by 4.1 per cent February Consumer non-durable goods output declined by 3.8 per cent during the month compared to a 12.5 per cent expansion in February 2023

#### Rupee falls 13 paise to close at 83.44 against US dollar

Mumbai, Apr 12: The rupee depreciated 13 paise to close at 83.44 against the US dollar on Friday, weighed down by a massive sell-off in domestic equities and a strong greenback against major crosses overseas. Forex traders said elevated crude oil prices also dented investor sentiments.

## Domestic PV sales soar to record high of 42 lakh units in FY24: SIAM

New Delhi, Apr 12:

Passenger vehicle wholesales in India touched a record high of 42,18,746 units in the financial year 2023-24, registering a year-on-year growth of 8.4 per cent on the back of robust demand for utility vehicles, industry body SIAM said on Friday.

As per the latest data issued by the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM), the overall passenger vehicle dispatches stood at 38,90,114 units in fiscal year 2022-23. Two-wheeler sales were up 13.3 per cent last fiscal at 1,79,74,365 units, as compared to 1,58,62,771 units in the financial year 2022-23. Vehicle sales across categories rose by 12.5 per cent to 2,38,53,463 units in the period under review, as against 2,12,04,846 units in



2022-23. Exports, however, saw a drop of 5.5 per cent at 45,00,492 units last fiscal, as compared to 47,61,299 units in FY23.

"On the backdrop of a robust economic growth of 7.6 per cent based on conducive policies of the government of India, the Indian automobile industry has posted a satisfactory performance with domestic industry growing by 12.5 per cent during the last financial year," SIAM President Vinod Aggarwal

told reporters here. He said the growth was led by the passenger vehicles (PV) segment which almost touched 50 lakh units in overall sales, which included 42 lakh units of domestic sales and 7 lakh units of exports. Within the PV segment, utility vehicles including SUVs grew by 25.8 per cent in FY24 at 25,20,691 units, as against 20,03,718 units in SIAM said. Aggarwal said the twowheeler segment contin-

cent in domestic sales to almost 1.8 crore units. even though it was still lower than the earlier peak of 2.1 crore units in FY19. However, he said the entry-ievei categories oi both passenger cars and two-wheelers continued to face challenges as the rural economy has not fully recovered. "The domestic commercial vehicle industry had a marginal growth to 97 lakh units and within that, some drop was experienced in light commercial vehicles (LCVs) and small commercial vehicles (SCVs) due to degrowth in the CNG segment," he said. The growth in commercial vehicles was also impacted due to migration to higher tonnage trucks which created higher payload capacity, which is not reflected in the number of units.

### Domestic air passenger traffic likely touched 15.4 crore in 2023-24: Report

New Delhi, Apr 12:

Domestic air passenger traffic is likely to have witper cent at around 15.4 crore in 2023-24 and the aviation industry's net loss is expected to have declined to Rs 3,000 to 4,000 crore during the same period, says a report.

Credit rating agency Icra on Friday also said the airlines' ability to raise yields proportionate to their input cost increases will be key to expand their profitability margins while supply chain challenges and engine failure issues pose near term head-For FY24, it said domestic air passenger traffic is estimated at around 154 million, an Year-on-Year (YoY) growth of about 13 per cent. "The domestic air passenger traffic in FY2024, thus, sur-

passed the pre-Covid levels of around 142 million in FY2020. For March 2024, domestic air passenger traffic was estimatnessed an annual growth of 13 ed at around 135.2 lakh. around 6.9 per cent higher than around 126.4 lakh in February 2024.

Further, it grew by around 4.9 per cent on a YoY basis," Icra said in a report. According to the report, the country's aviation industry is expected to report a significantly lower net loss of Rs 30-40 billion in FY2024 and FY2025 over Rs 170-175 billion in FY2023.

Indian real estate market size, which means the value of output generated from residential and commercial segments of construction and services, stood at USD 279 billion in 2015 and has grown to USD 482 billion in 2024. "Supported by a growing

economy, the real estate sector in India has transitioned significantly," the report said. India's real estate sector has forward and backward linkages with about 250 ancillary industries. It is one of the highest employment generators after the agriculture sector, accounting for 18 per cent of the total employment, the consultant noted.

Retail inflation declined to a five-month low of 4.85 per cent in March mainly due to cooling food prices, according to official data released on Friday. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) based retail inflation was 5.09 per cent in February and 5.66 per cent in March 2023. Previously, CPI-based inflation was the lowest at 4.87 per cent in October 2023. The inflation in the food basket was at 8.52 per cent in March, down from 8.66 per cent in February, according to the

data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO). The government has tasked the Reserve Bank to ensure inflation remains at 4 per cent, with a margin of 2 per cent on either side. According to the Reserve Bank, which factors in consumer inflation while arriving at its bimonthly monetary policy, food price uncertainties continue to weigh on the inflation trajectory going forward. The central bank has projected retail inflation at 4.5 per cent for the current fiscal assuming a normal Continuing geopolitical tensions also pose an upside risk to commodity prices and supply chains. # Patients struggle with doctor shortage in Civil Hospital

**Pregnant women** bear brunt of health facility shortage

**Female doctor** absence deepens healthcare woes

Khairagarh, Apr 12: The sole government civil hospital in the district is grappling with a severe shortage of medical staff, exacerbating the plight of patients seeking treatment.

As the sweltering summer months loom, the hospital witnesses a surge in patient influx from remote villages. However, the limited number of doctors, dwindling further to only three, poses significant challenges for patient care.

Moreover, exacerbating the situation, a considerable number of doctors, nurses, and dresser staff have either been transferred last year or this

suing further studies. ongoing staff changes have significantly strained the hospital's capacity to provide adequate care, leading to unnecessary suffering among pa-

#### Lack of female doctors in Civil Hospital

In the absence of a designated female doctor at the civil hospital, women seeking medical assistance face significant challenges. The vacancy in this critical position arose to Dr. Preeti Vaishnav's relocation to Dhamtari for diploma studies, with no replacement appointed since.

As a result, women with serious illnesses have no choice but to seek treatment in distant towns like Rajnandgaon or Raipur. Although Dr. Rupali Singh is currently stationed at the Civil Hospital, her presence remains largely unknown to city residents and many department em-



The reluctance of higher officials to address this issue further compounds the healthcare crisis. Approximately 21 months ago, Dr. Rupali Singh was appointed to the hospital, initially tasked with serving in the OPD to address the shortage of female doc-

However, her duties were redirected to the Haat Bazaar Clinic Scheme, initiated by the Chhattisgarh Government to provide healthcare in remote areas. Despite this, the Health Department's neglect of the scheme has resulted in a lack of clarity regarding Dr. Rupali Singh's current duty station.

#### Healthcare crisis deepens trauma

In the absence of a female doctor at the district's sole civil hospital, victims of sexual violence are forced to seek medical legal certificates (MLCs) elsewhere, adding further distress to their ordeal. With no female doctor available, victims must travel to Bazaar Ataria, erbating the challenges faced by already traumatized women, girls, and mi-

The failure to address this issue tarnishes the reputation of the district administration and the District Medical Department, highlighting the urgent need for action to address the shortage of female doctors and ensure the acceptance of Dr. Rupali Singh's appoint-

There are no female doctors in Civil Hospital Khairagarh, information about which has been informed to the government. In case of sexual violence, a doctor is called from another place to conduct MLC. As far as Dr. Rupali Singh is concerned, she is working under the Chief Minister Haat Bazaar Clinic Scheme.

Passengers exdismay press over inadequate cleaning efforts, highlighting that cleaning measures were undertaken for only two days recently, merely as a facade of progress. The deteriorating cleanliness standards have instilled reluctance among passengers to utilize train toilets, given the perva-

#### MPs neglect public concerns

Despite being appointed as a member of the Railway Advisory Committee, the MP representative of Kanker Lok Sabha constituency, residing in Gunderdehi, displays a blatant disregard for public welfare. 
