SC quashes ED case against former IAS officer, son

New Delhi, Apr 08 (PTI):

The Supreme Court on Monday quashed the money laundering case against former IAS officer Anil Tuteja and his son Yash in the alleged Rs 2,000 crore liquor scam in Chhattisgarh, saying there were no proceeds of crime.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan quashed the complaint after noting that since no ex-facie scheduled offence (main offence) exists against them, no offence under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) was made out.

"As there is no scheduled offence, there cannot be any proceeds of crime as defined under clause 2(u) of the PMLA. If there is no proceeds of crime, the offence under PMLA is not made out," the bench ruled.

'Corrupt Congress overlooked needs of poor'

I ended party's licence to loot

Jagdalpur, Apr 08:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday hit out at the opposition Congress, saying it overlooked needs of the poor for decades since Independence and never understood their pain.

Addressing the BJP's 'Vijay Sankalp Sankhnad' rally in Bastar district, which will go to polls on April 19, he also said the Congress' manifesto for the Lok Sabha elections has the imprint of the Muslim League. During the Congress regime, corruption had become the country's identity, and the party thought it had a licence to loot, he said.



'PM failed' to protect rights of tribals'

The Congress on Monday alleged that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had "failed" to protect the rights of tribal communities in Chhattisgarh and asked whether he will ever meaningfully commit himself to tribal welfare. Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh posed questions to Prime Minister Modi ahead of his rally in Bastar. "The dealings of the BJP here (Bastar) have shown that their friendship with corporate cronies runs much deeper than their sense of duty to the people," he said.



How many will be jailed before polls?: SC's big remark

New Delhi, Apr 08:

Observing that everyone who makes allegations on social media cannot be put behind bars, the Supreme Court on Monday restored the bail to a YouTuber who was accused of making derogatory remarks against Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin in 2021.

"If before elections we start putting behind bars everyone who makes allegations on YouTube, imagine how many will be jailed?" a bench of justices

Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan told senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for the Tamil Nadu government, as it set aside the order cancelling A Duraimurugan Sattai's bail. The apex court said that the accused did not misuse his liberty by protesting and expressing his views and also rejected the request of the state government to impose a condition on Sattai to refrain from making scandalous remarks while on bail.

Bihar has 'maximum anti-incumbency': Prashant Kishor

New Delhi, Apr 08 (PTI):

Political strategist Prashant Kishor has said that Bihar has a lot of space for a new party as it has "maximum anti-incumbency" following the nearly 35-year rule of ideologically similar formations headed by either Lalu Prasad Yadav or Nitish Kumar. His comments came as his ongoing 'Jan Suraj' yatra through his home state is expected to end with the formation of a political party before the assembly polls in the latter half of the next year.



Rice Mill gutted in fire at Durg

Bhilai, Apr 08:

A rice mill was gutted in a fire at village Kuthrel in Durg in the wee hours of Monday. Fire destroyed the mill causing a loss of over Rs 50 lakhs. Fire tenders from Durg conducted fire fighting operations and doused the flames.

According to information, the mishap occurred at the Rice Mill of Chhagan Lal Chadak situated at village Kuthrel of Anda Police Station limits. The control room of Fire and Emergency services received information regarding the mishap around 05:00 hrs



after which Fire tenders were sent to the spot. The first fire tender reached the spot around 05:20 hrs. The firemen discovered that it was a massive blaze after which three more fire tenders were sent to the spot. Fire was spreading fast due to dry paddy and gunny bags. The firemen managed to prevent the fire from spreading and with sustained efforts, doused the flames completely. Fortunately, there were no casualties. It is suspected that an electric short circuit triggered the fire. Further investigations are on.

BMC imposes fine for blocking drains

Bhilai, Apr 08:

The health department of Bhilai Municipal Corporation carried out a special campaign and took action against the people who blocked or encroached the drains. They collected Rs 14000 as fine. To prevent water logging during rainy days, the Municipal Corporation Bhilai is conducting cleaning works of small and big drains. Plenary action is also being taken against those who conduct illegal construction, put goods on the drains or who cause choking of drains by dumping garbage. The Commissioner is also visiting different areas to monitor the cleaning work.

■ After endless water woes at Bhatapara of Kohka

Bhilai, Apr 08:

The Bhatapara area of Kohka is suffering from water woes for the last 25 years as the local civic body has failed to ensure water supply in this area. Aggrieved residents led by the local INC Corporator staged a demonstration on Tuesday. Later, Mayor Neeraj Pal reached the dharna spot and assured for making water arrangements through bore wells and tankers.

On Monday, residents of Kohka Ward 13 Bhatapara launched a dharna as they



have been deprived of water supply for the last 25 years. Under the leadership of Ward 13 Corporator Anju Sinha, they staged a

protest and raised slogans against the working style of the civic body administration.

The people said that it

has become difficult to even fetch two buckets of water. High rise water tank has been constructed recently in Kohka, but even

after 7 years, about 600 families of Bhatapara, Hagini pond and Bandhan pond area are deprived of water supply.

Mayor Neeraj Pal reached the protest site and assured the people that water arrangements would be made immediately. It will take time to deliver water through pipelines. Considering the situation, he immediately instructed the officials to make arrangements for water supply through bore wells and water tankers in the affected areas.

Mayor Neeraj Pal said that it is the first priority to provide basic facilities to the people. Water supply arrangements will be made within two days. He said

that people will not have to wander for water.

The women of Ward 13 said that they do not want water from the tanker and need a permanent solution. They said that the tanker will make arrangements for 10 days, after which the situation will remain the same. The women asserted that the BMC administration should supply water to their homes through pipelines.

Ward 13 Corporator Anju Sinha said that highly aggrieved denizens resorted to agitation on Monday. She said that there is a great problem with water in the locality. Unfortunately, the corporation was not paying attention.

Raipur, Apr 08: The NDA government at the Centre is a well-wisher of industrialists and does not care for the welfare of tribals or the poor, claimed Congress leader Radhika Khera on Monday.

Addressing a press conference here, the AICC spokesperson said Prime Minister

Narendra Modi was silent on the issues facing tribals during his rally in Bastar earlier in the day.

"Chhattisgarh Congress chief Deepak Baij had said if the PM was a well-wisher of people of Bastar, then he should declare that Nagarbar Steel Plant (in Bastar) will not be privatised and locals

would be given priority in jobs there," Khera said.

Baij had also asked the PM to speak on a

bill related to reservation of tribals that is pending with the Governor as well as announce stopping of tree felling in Surguja for a "mine of Adani", she said.

"But the PM remained silent on these issues and left after doing jumblebaji (poll rhetoric). This shows the Modi government is not a friend of the tribals or the poor. It is a well-wisher of only industrialists," she alleged.

Speaking about the PM's attack on the Congress over corruption, Khera said leaders with graft allegations against them are joining the BJP and then getting clean chits.

Khera refuted Modi's claims that Congress expelled its leaders who attended the idol consecration of Ram Temple in Ayodhya on January 22 this year, adding that disciplinary action was taken against those who made objectionable comments about the party leadership and party policies.

Thief arrested stealing mobile from bike

Raipur, Apr 08: Lakhs of rupees have been stolen from the house of branch officer of Indira Gandhi Agricultural University. The family members had left home in the evening for different work. Meanwhile, unidentified thieves entered the house and made away with gold, silver jewellery and cash worth Rs 4 lakh 44 thousand.

According to Telibandha police Ajay Sharma, resident of Professor Colony Krishak Nagar Jora, is working as a branch officer in Indira Gandhi Agricultural University, Raipur. He had come to Raipur City at around 4 pm on April 5 for work. His wife Rashmi

Sharma and son Aadhar Sharma were present in the house. When the professor returned to the colony at around nine in the night, he saw that the door of the house was open. Ajay called his wife from outside but he did not get any response. When he called her over phone she told that she had gone out for a walk in the colony. After this he went inside the house and saw that the cupboard was open and the locker was broken. The items kept in the cupboard were scattered.

The cash amount kept in the cupboard locker was Rs 3 lakh 35 thousand and gold ring, gold earring, gold earring, silver vessel, silver coin worth Rs 10, 9000 totaling Rs 4 lakh 44 thousand were stolen by unidentified thieves.

On receipt of the complaints about mobile theft, continuous monitoring was done for the last few days through CCTV cameras in data centre.

On Monday the incident of mobile theft was seen in camera and thief was immediately caught red handed. Some addictive drugs and nearly 25 keys of scooters and bikes and three mobile sets were recovered from possession of thief.

Many MVY beneficiaries yet to get 2nd installment: Cong

Says it will give Rs 8333 to women every month after formation of Cong govt at Centre

Raipur, Apr 08:

Congress has demanded that the government should tell how many women have been credited with the second installment of Mahatma Vandana Yojana (MVY). According to Pradesha Congress Communication head Sushil Anand Shukla most of the women who had received the first installment have not yet received the second installment.

After giving the first installment, the BJP government is not giving the sec-

ond installment to the women, said Shukla, adding that government is only making statements about giving the second installment.

He demanded that government should make public the names of the women in whose accounts the second installment has been deposited.

Questioning BJP's intentions he said that when money was not coming into the accounts of women before the Lok Sabha elections, then it was guaranteed that the

MVY will be scrapped after the Lok Sabha elections. Vishnu Deo Sai's government has proved that lies, rhetoric and broken promises are Modi's guarantee, he said, adding that double engine government is only exploiting Chhattisgarh.

He said that married women between 18 to 21 years of age were completely cheated. Even the money of those who were declared eligible has not yet been credited to their accounts, he said.

Shukla said that women

will protest against BJP's breach of promise and will form the Congress government at the Centre. If Congress government is formed at the Centre, poor women of the state will get Rs 1 lakh, he said, adding that direct transfer will be done annually. That means approximately Rs 8333 will be given to women every month and Rs 5 lakh will be deposited in the accounts of poor women in 5 years, he said, adding that amount will be deposited by the Congress government.



EU Red Sea navy mission commander hopes for more ships to repel Houthi attacks

Brussels, Apr 08 (AP)

The commander of a European Union naval mission in the Red Sea wants to significantly increase its size to better defend against possible attacks by Houthi rebels based in Yemen, as just four warships are patrolling an area twice the size of the 27-nation bloc.

The EU mission — dubbed Aspides, from the Greek for "shield" — has escorted 68 ships and repelled 11 attacks since it was established less than two months ago. It only defends civilian vessels and does not take part in any military strikes. The southern part of the Red Sea is deemed a high-risk zone.

"Just a single transit of one of our ships between the two larger distances to the area might take about 10 days, and also to cross the high-risk area takes almost two days," Greek navy Rear Admiral Vasilios Gryparis, the commander of the mission, told reporters in Brussels on Monday.

He said the high-risk zone "has seen multiple attacks in the past months" ranging from threats and intimidation to "complex attacks" using "shore, air and sea-based assets, drones and ballistic missiles." No one has been hurt. Nineteen of the 27 EU nations are involved in the mission but only four frigates are patrolling.

The rebels have described

Houthi rebels, which control much of Yemen's north and west, launched a campaign of drone and missile attacks on shipping in the Red Sea in November. They have also fired missiles toward Israel, although those have largely fallen short or been intercepted.

The attacks have hit maritime trade to Egypt and Europe, with only around half the usual number of ships moving through the area.

It's added up to two weeks of transit time for vessels that want to avoid the Suez Canal, hiking transport costs and shipping insurance. Their campaign has continued despite more than two months of US-led retaliatory airstrikes.

The EU mission also remains "very vigilant" for any spike in attacks following last week's airstrike, widely blamed on Israel, which destroyed Iran's consulate in Syria, killing 12 people, including two elite Iranian generals, Gryparis said. Top Iranian officials have promised to retaliate.

Trump declines to endorse a national abortion ban

Says it should be left to the states

New York, Apr 08 (AP):

Former President Donald Trump says he believes abortion should be left to the states in a video released on Monday outlining his position after months of mixed messages and speculation. "Many people have asked me what my position is on abortion and abortion rights," Trump said in the video posted on his Truth Social site.

"My view is now that we have abortion where everybody wanted it from a legal standpoint, the states will determine by vote or legislation or perhaps both. And whatever they decide must be the law of the land — in this case, the law of the state."

He declined to lay out a timeline for when he believes abortion should be banned. He went on to describe the current legal landscape, in which differ-

ent states have different restrictions following the US Supreme Court decision ending Roe v. Wade.

"Many states will be different. Many will have a different number of weeks or some will have more conservative than others and that's what they will be," he said. "At the end of the day it's all about will of the people."

Trump, the presumptive Republican presidential nominee, had written on his social media site Sunday night that he planned to issue a statement on "abortion and abortion rights" after he sidestepped questions about when in a pregnancy he believes the line should be drawn.

Republican-led states have ushered in a wave of new restrictions following the overturning of Roe v. Wade in 2022. Democrats believe the fight over abortion rights helps them at the polls and have outperformed expectations in elections since.

"You must follow your

heart on this issue," Trump said in his message. "But remember, you must also win elections to restore our culture and, in fact, to save our country, which is currently and very sadly a nation in decline."

Trump had long argued that the Supreme Court's decision overturning Roe gave those who oppose abortion rights "tremendous power to negotiate."

He said he wanted to use that leverage to strike a deal that he hoped would "make both sides happy" and bring the country "together" — even though the issue is one of the most contentious in American politics, with opponents viewing abortion as murder and proponents seeing it as a fundamental women's right.

Trump had suggested last month in a radio interview that he was leaning toward supporting a national abortion ban at around 15 weeks of pregnancy — early in the second trimester.

JPMorgan's Dimon warns inflation, political polarization

Wars creating risks not seen since WWII

New York, Apr 08 (AP)

The nation's most influential banker, JPMorgan Chase CEO Jamie Dimon, told investors Monday that he continues to expect the US economy to be resilient and grow this year. But he worries geopolitical events including the war in Ukraine and the Israel-Hamas war, as well as US political polarization, might be creating an environment that "may very well be creating risks that could eclipse anything since World War II."

The comments came in an annual shareholder letter from Dimon, who often uses the letter to weigh in broad topics like politics, regulation and global events and what it might mean to JPMorgan Chase, as well as the broader economy. "America's global leadership role is being challenged outside by other nations and inside by our polarized electorate," Dimon

said. "We need to find ways to put aside our differences and work in partnership with other Western nations in the name of democracy. During this time of great crises, uniting to protect our essential freedoms, including free enterprise, is paramount." Dimon had particular concerns with continued large amounts of deficit spending by the US government and other countries, as well as the need for countries such as the US to remilitarise and continue to build out green infrastructure, all of which will likely keep inflation higher than investors expect. Because of these issues, Dimon said he is less optimistic that the US economy will achieve a "soft landing," which he defined as modest growth along with declining inflation and interest rates, compared to the broader market. While he says the investors are pricing in a "70 per cent to 80 per cent" chance of a soft landing, Dimon thinks the chances of such an ideal outcome are "a lot less" than that.

Espionage scandal rocks Austria

Ott is suspected of having provided sensitive information to Jan Marsalek, a fugitive fellow Austrian wanted on suspicion of fraud since the collapse in 2020 of German payment company Wirecard, where he was the chief operating officer. The warrant says that messages provided by British authorities link Marsalek directly to the Russian intelligence agency FSB. German and Austrian media have reported that Marsalek is believed to have had connections to Russian intelligence since at least 2014. He is now thought to be in Russia. Thomas Riegler, a historian and espionage expert affiliated with the Austrian Center for

Intelligence, Propaganda and Security Studies, said the case has "the potential for one of the biggest espionage stories in recent Austrian history".

"The case is special given its international dimension and the fact that it is not only about espionage but also about the infiltration of the Austrian political system and the weakening of the country's internal security," he said. Austria, which was located next to the Iron Curtain during the Cold War and long had good connections with Moscow, is a European Union member with a policy of military neutrality — and a long-standing reputation as a spying centre.

The Vatican on Monday declared sex change operations and surrogacy as grave threats to human dignity, putting them on par with abortion and euthanasia as practices that violate God's plan for human life.

The Vatican's doctrine office issued "Infinite Dignity," a 20-page declaration that has been in the works for five years. After substantial revision in recent months, it was approved March 25 by Pope Francis, who ordered its publication.

In its most eagerly anticipated section, the Vatican repeated its rejection of "gender theory" or the idea that one's gender can be changed. It said God created man and

woman as biologically different, separate beings, and said they must not tinker with that plan or try to "make oneself God."

"It follows that any sex-change intervention, as a rule, risks threatening the unique dignity the person has received from the moment of conception," the document said.

It distinguished between transitioning surgeries, which it rejected, and "genital abnormalities" that are present at birth or that develop later. Those abnormalities can be "resolved" with the help of health care professionals, it said.

The document's existence, rumoured since 2019, was confirmed in recent weeks by the new prefect of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, Argentine Cardinal Victor Manuel Fernández, a close Pope Francis confidante.

Palestinians returning to Khan Younis after Israeli withdrawal find an unrecognisable city

Deir Al-Balah, Apr 08 (AP)

Streams of Palestinians fled into the southern Gaza city of Khan Younis on Monday to salvage what they could from the vast destruction left in the wake of Israel's offensive, a day after the Israeli military announced it was withdrawing troops from the area.

Many came back to the Gaza Strip's second-largest city to find their former hometown unrecognisable. With scores of buildings destroyed or damaged, piles of rubble now sit where apartments and businesses once did. Streets have been bulldozed. Schools and hospitals

were damaged by the fighting.

Israel sent troops to Khan Younis in December, part of its blistering ground offensive that came in response to a Hamas-led attack on October 7 into southern Israel. Israeli authorities say 1,200 people, mostly civilians, were killed and roughly 250 people taken hostage.

The war, now in its seventh month, has killed more than 33,000 Palestinians, mostly women and children, according to local health authorities, displaced most of the territory's 2.3 million people and left vast swaths of the beleaguered

Gaza Strip uninhabitable. "Many areas, especially the city centre, have become unfit for life," said Mahmoud Abdel-Ghani, who fled Khan Younis in December when Israel began its ground invasion of the city. "I found that my house and my neighbours' houses turned to rubble."

Israel's withdrawal of troops from Khan Younis signalled the end of a key phase in its war against Hamas and brought Israeli troop levels in the tiny coastal enclave to one of the lowest since the war began.

Israel said the city was a major Hamas stronghold and says its operation over

the past few months killed thousands of militants and inflicted heavy damage to a vast network of tunnels used by Hamas to move weapons and fighters. It also claimed to have found evidence that hostages were held in the city. With no military presence in the city, Hamas could seek to regroup there as it has in other areas where the military has scaled back forces.

The latest Israeli withdrawal also cleared the way for some Palestinians to make their way back to the area to comb through the mountains of debris to try to hold on to any possessions that remained.

Najwa Ayyash, who also

was displaced from Khan Younis, said she was unable to reach her family's third floor apartment because the stairs were gone.

Her brother climbed his way up through the destruction and pulled down some possessions, including lighter clothes for her children.

Bassel Abu Nasser, a Khan Younis resident who fled after an airstrike hit his home in January, said much of the city turned into rubble.

"There is no sense of life there," the 37-year-old father of two children said. "They left nothing there." On Sunday, shortly after the military announced it had with-

Together, these biological characteristics are referred to as your phenotype. And the biological system that most directly influences your phenotype is your metabolism.

So if you are eating something, take medications, smoke or exercise, your metabolism is responsible for transferring that biological information throughout your body for it to adapt.

Your metabolism consists of a network of tens of



thousands of molecules and proteins that convert the food you eat into the energy and building blocks your body uses to move, grow and repair itself. At the chemical level, energy metabolism begins when the three macronutrients – carbohydrates, fats and protein – are broken down atom by atom to release electrons from chemical bonds. These electrons charge components in cells called mitochondria.

Akin to how batteries work, mitochondria harness this electrical potential to create a different form of chemical energy that the rest of the cell can use.

Simply put, a primary role of metabolism is to convert chemical energy into electrical energy and back into chemical energy. How this energy is transferred throughout the body might play a central role in determining whether you're sick

or healthy. I am a biochemist who studies the various networks of metabolism that are used as your body changes. My team and I have been able to define specific traits of metabolism, such as the presence and amount of certain metabolites – products made from breaking down macronutrients – across a wide range of conditions. These conditions include diseases such as COVID-19, diabetes, multiple sclerosis and sickle cell anemia, to experiencing unique environments such as radiation exposure, high altitude, aging and sports performance. Each of these settings influences which parts of your metabolic network are used and how they communicate with one another.

Given the alarming rise in obesity and its associated metabolic syndrome – about 1 in 8 people across the globe was living with obesity in 2022 – defining a healthy or impaired metabolism can help identify what's gone wrong and how to address it.

Elite athletes offer a prime population to study metabolic function at its best, since their network of molecular and chemical reactions must be finely tuned to compete on the world stage.

Traditionally, lactate threshold has been a critical measure of athletic performance by pinpointing exercise intensity when lactate starts to rise in muscles and blood. Contrary to common belief, lactate is not merely a waste product but an energy source as well, and it accumulates when it's produced faster than mitochondria can use it. While a moderately active person might reach their threshold at an exercise intensity of around 2 watts per kilogram, elite cyclists can sustain an intensity up to nearly two to three times higher.



Governor Das for greater participation of banks in rupee derivatives in India, abroad

Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das on Monday stressed the need for greater participation of Indian banks in rupee derivatives market, both domestically and offshore, while being prudent. The governor noted that participation of domestic banks in derivative markets remains limited with only a small set of active market-makers.

Also, participation of Indian banks in global markets is growing but it is quite small. "Domestic banks are dealing with market-makers in global markets rather than with end clients and are yet to emerge as market-makers of note globally," Das said in his keynote address at the FIMMAD-PDAI Annual Conference in Barcelona. Of course, he added banks need to do their own due diligence, assess their risk appetite, and then move forward carefully in this direction.

Coffee exports rise 13.35 pc to 1.25 lakh tonnes in January-March

New Delhi, Apr 08:

Coffee shipments from India rose 13.35 per cent to 1,25,631 tonnes during January-March period of this year on higher demand for Robusta coffee, according to the official data. The country had exported 1,10,830 tonnes of coffee in the same period in 2023. India, Asia's third-largest producer and exporter, grows Arabica and Robusta varieties of coffee. Arabica coffee bean has lesser caffeine content than the Robusta. Arabica has a sweet and smoother taste, while the Robusta is generally more bitter and harsher on the taste buds. According to the Coffee Board of India's latest data, export of Robusta coffee bean rose by 18 per

cent to 69,637 tonnes in the first quarter of the 2024 calendar year from 59,050 tonnes in the year-ago period. However, the shipment of Arabica coffee bean declined to 13,419 tonnes from 15,468 tonnes in the said period. Instant coffee exports rose 16,218 tonnes during January-March of this year as against 15,238 tonnes in the year-ago period, while re-export of coffee also increased to 26,239 tonnes from 20,952 tonnes in the said period.

In terms of value, total coffee exports were at Rs 3,644 crore during January-March of 2024, higher than Rs 2,604.44 crore achieved in the year-ago period. The unit value realisation was Rs 2,90,057 per tonne.

Gold jumps Rs 350 to hit fresh record high of Rs 71,700 per 10 grams

New Delhi, Apr 08:



Gold prices in the national capital hit an all-time high on Monday and jumped Rs 350 to Rs 71,700 per 10 grams following a pick-up in safe-haven demand for the precious metal, according to HDFC Securities. The yellow metal prices have seen remarkable gains so far in 2024, becoming costlier by over Rs 7,700 per 10 grams. In the previous session, gold had ended at Rs 71,350 per 10 grams. Silver prices also soared Rs 800 to scale a fresh peak of Rs 84,000 per kg. In the previous trade, it had settled at Rs 83,200 per kg. "Spot gold prices (24 carats) in the Delhi markets are trading at a record high of Rs

71,700 per 10 grams, up Rs 350, taking bullish cues in the overseas markets," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst of Commodities at HDFC Securities, said. In the international markets, spot gold at COMEX was trading at USD 2,336 per ounce, up USD 7 from the previous close. Traders didn't pay attention to the upbeat US jobs report and instead focused on the bullion's upward trend that has been going on for a few weeks. This caused the price of gold to reach another record high on Monday, Gandhi added.

Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst at LKP Securities, said, "Gold prices continued their upward trajectory, supported by a surge in global COMEX prices, which touched USD 2,350 per ounce in the early morning hours. The ongoing buying of gold by global central banks has provided significant support to prices, along with sustained geopolitical tensions and the anticipation of imminent interest rate reversals."

Sebi cracks down on finfluencer, orders to impound Rs 12 cr 'unlawful gain'



Sebi has barred Ravindra Bharti Education Institute, co-founded by finfluencer and YouTuber Ravindra Balu Bharti, from the securities market and directed to deposit Rs 12 crore "unlawful gain" earned from the alleged unregistered investment advisory business. It has been directed to deposit the amount to an interest-bearing escrow account creat-

ed specifically for the purpose in a nationalised bank. Additionally, the regulator has barred Ravindra Balu Bharti, his wife Shubhangi Ravindra Bharti and directors -- Rahul Ananta Gosavi and Dhanashri Chandrakant Gosavi -- from the securities market. Also, these persons have been restrained from associating themselves with any intermediary registered with Sebi in any capacity. Ravindra Bharti Education

Rupee settles on flat note at 83.31 against US dollar

The rupee settled on a flat note on Monday at 83.31 (provisional) against the US dollar, as the support from positive domestic equities was negated by the strength of the American currency in the overseas market. Forex traders said investor sentiments got a boost as crude oil prices retreated from their elevated levels, but the strength of the American currency in the overseas market weighed on the local unit and restricted the uptick. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 83.27 against the greenback. The unit hit an intra-day high of 83.23 and a low of 83.33. The local unit finally settled at 83.31 (provisional) against the dollar, unchanged from its previous close. On Friday, the rupee appreciated 8 paise to close at 83.31 against the US dollar as the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) kept the benchmark interest rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent for the seventh time in a row.

"We expect the rupee to trade with a slight positive bias on the rise in risk appetite in global markets on reports that Israel has withdrawn its soldiers from Southern Gaza. FII inflows and strength in the domestic markets may also support the rupee. "However, a positive tone in the greenback

may cap sharp gains. Investors may remain cautious ahead of inflation data from the US and India later this week. USDINR spot price is expected to trade in the range of Rs 83.10 to Rs 83.50," said Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst, Sharekhan by BNP Paribas. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading 0.07 per cent higher at 104.37 on declining expectations of a rate cut by the US Federal Reserve following a strong jobs report and hawkish comments from Fed officials last week. Brent crude futures, the global oil benchmark, fell 0.92 per cent to USD 90.33 per barrel. On the domestic equity market front, Sensex advanced 494.28 points, or 0.67 per cent, to close at an all-time high of 74,742.50 points.

Indian CEOs average salary at Rs 13.8 cr, up 40 pc compared to pre-COVID-19: Deloitte report

New Delhi, Apr 08:

The average CEO compensation in India stood at Rs 13.8 crore, up 40 per cent compared with pre-COVID-19 times, and more than half of the overall remuneration is linked to short-term and long-term incentives, says a Deloitte report. According to the Deloitte India Executive Performance and Rewards Survey 2024, average CEO compensation stands at Rs 13.8 crore, while CEOs who were also promoters or members of the promoter family are paid Rs 16.7 crore on average. "Promoter CEO compensation is very wide, and that affects the higher averages," said Anandrapur Ghose, Partner, CHRO Programme Leader, Deloitte India. According to Deloitte, while CEO promoter CEOs due to the longer tenure of promoter CEOs at an aggregate. ARMY CHIEF TO FORCE

'Be prepared for 'black swan' events, expect the unexpected'

New Delhi, Apr 08 (PTI)

Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande on Monday called upon the force to be always prepared for 'black swan' events and "expect the unexpected" even as he identified technology as the new area for strategic competition among nations.

In an address at the Defence Services Staff College in Wellington, Gen Pande highlighted the weaponisation of technology, especially its extension across various domains - from information to supply chains.

The Army Chief emphasised the importance of cross-functional synergy among the three services to effectively assess threats, articulate strategies, identify capabilities, formulate policies, achieve preparedness, and respond appropriately within the national security framework.

He further delved into the expansion of warfare into new domains, including space, cyber, electro-

The Chief of Army Staff urged the officers to be always prepared for 'black swan' events and "expect the unexpected".

A black swan event is a high-impact event that is

difficult to predict.

The Army Chief pointed out the emergence of new trendlines triggered by this rapid change, underscoring how disruptive technologies are reshaping conventional combat force ratios.

Highlighting India's ascent on the global stage, Gen Pande stressed the growing need to safeguard India's national interests across expanding strategic horizons.

The Army Chief called for strategic balance, underscoring the necessity for India to be strong and self-reliant in defence capabilities.

He also shed light on the Indian Army's ongoing "transformative initiatives", particularly emphasising the forces' approach in making 2024 the "year of technology absorption".

He highlighted the key areas of focus in the process and said it includes aligning and synergizing technology at strategic, operational, and tactical levels within existing systems.

Under the new initiative, mapping futuristic and emerging technologies as drivers of military technology is a priority, he said, adding strengthening the defence technology ecosystem to maintain a lead in the military technology curve is another focus area.

The Army Chief said the force is ensuring that acquisition and procurement facilitates the seamless induction of technology and it fosters "techno warriors and commanders".

Gen Pande was addressing the faculty and officers of the 79th Staff Course, including 36 officers from friendly foreign nations.

His address covered critical topics such as national security, the geostrategic landscape and emerging trends, and the Indian Army's transformational initiatives.
