Disqualified

Bhubaneswar: Odisha Assembly Speaker Pramila Malik has disqualified two ruling BJD MLAs as members of the House under Anti-Defection Law. The legislators - Arabinda Dhali and Premananda Nayak - recently joined the opposition BJP after resigning from the BJD.

Booked

Hyderabad: A former Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) arrested in the phone tapping case, has now been booked by police for "kidnapping" and "extortion" over a complaint by a businessman who said he was abducted and threatened to make him give up his company to his business partners in 2018.

Acquit

New Delhi: A court here has acquitted 11 persons accused of being involved in the 2020 northeast Delhi riots, saying they were entitled to the "benefit of doubt" as charges against them were not proved "beyond reasonable doubt". Additional Sessions Judge Pulastya Pramachala was hearing a case against 11 men who were accused of being part of an unlawful assembly during the riots that committed arson and theft at a property in Ganga Vihar on February 24, 2020.

Surrender

Ranchi: Twelve Maoists surrendered before security personnel in Jharkhand's West Singhbhum district on Thursday, police said. The red rebels were operating in Saranda and Kolhan forests.

Watery grave

Thane: Four persons, including a 18-month-old boy, drowned in three separate incidents in Palghar and Thane districts on Thursday, police said. In the first incident in Bhigaon in Palghar's Vasai area, 80-year-old Natal Dabre and her daughter Meenal Dabre (56) drowned in Bhola lake in the morning, a police official said.

Arrested

Bhopal: Former Bhopal Rajiv Gandhi Proudयोगी Vishwavidyalaya vice chancellor Dr Sunil Kumar was arrested on Thursday for alleged involvement in financial irregularities, a Madhya Pradesh police official said. Dr Sunil Kumar was arrested from Raipur (in neighbouring Chhattisgarh), Bhopal Commissioner of Police Harinayanachari Mishra told PTI.

ACB/EOW conducts raids at 21 places

- Cash of Rs 19 lakh seized
- Including Durg, Raipur, Bilaspur and Rajnandgaon
- In connection with liquor scam

Raipur, Apr 11:

ACB/ EOW has conducted raids at 21 places all over Chhattisgarh and seized cash of Rs 19 lakh and also seized many electronic devices. The raids were conducted at 9 places in Raipur, 7 in Bhilai-Durg, 1 in Rajnandgaon and 4 in Bilaspur, totaling 21 places. In the search conducted at these places, ACB/ EOW seized cash of Rs 19 lakh and many electronic devices viz. laptops, pen drive, bank statements, documents related to moveable and immovable assets, ornaments worth crores and details of investment worth crores in Banks and other important documents. ACB/ EOW would be conducting examining these documents and prepare final report. It is learnt that through these documents, the persons by generating disproportionate and illegal money from Excise have made investment in general and Shell companies in layering, taken unsecured loans and others.

As per information in this regard, ACB/ EOW conducted raid at the residence and offices of Pappu Dhillion in Khursipar in Durg and at Vijay Bhatia's residence in Nehru Nagar and many other establishments of liquor barons and businessmen in Devendra Nagar and Sadar Bazar and Pandri Raipur. In this entire raid and search, more than 30 officials from ACB/ EOW were present.

AP Tripathi taken into arrest: ACB/ EOW in its action has taken into arrest former Special Secretary AP Tripathi from Bihar. An FIR has already been lodged against him in EOW. Prior to this ACB/ EOW has taken into arrest Anwar Debarh and Arvind Singh.

Raid in Raipur, Bilaspur as well: The ACB/ EOW team had conducted raids at Devendra

Nagar, Sadar Bazar, Pandri in Raipur and at the residence of Chartered Accountant Sanjay Mishra in Bilaspur. It is notable here that ACB/ EOW conducted raids and searches at many places in state on Thursday and in this the team reached Bilaspur and two member team raided the house of Sanjay Mishra in Bilaspur and held interrogation with him.

It is learnt that Sanjay Mishra is CA of liquor businessman Atul Singh, as he owns FL 10A liquor license. The last government in the state by linking A in FL10, made a new system and made a dozen liquor businessmen as licensed owners. Actually as per the new system, all licensed FL10A owners used to get liquor stocked from godown of State Beverage Corporation and it was done only to get commission from the Companies. As result of this ACB/ EOW is conducted investigations in all such aspects involved in liquor scam.

Rohan Gupta joins BJP

Five killed, two injured in separate road accidents

Korba, Apr 11:

Five persons were killed and two others injured in three road accidents in Korba district, police said on Thursday.

These accidents occurred on Wednesday evening and night, they said. Three motorcycle-borne men were killed when a coal-laden trailer truck hit them on Rungadha bypass road under Balco police station limits, a police official said. The deceased were identified as Madhav Prasad (47), Jagarsai Kenvat (53) and

Leeladhar Kenvat (45), all relatives, he said. After the accident, the driver of the truck fled the scene, leaving his vehicle behind, he said. Enraged over the incident, several local residents staged a protest and blocked the path of vehicles engaged in coal transportation. They also damaged some vehicles. Subsequently, senior police and administration officials reached the spot and pacified them, he said.

In another accident, a man identified as Tejal Yadav (49) was killed and his brother Sukhram (26) in-

jured after the motorcycle they were riding collided with a tractor engaged in the transportation of sand, he said. The victim duo was returning home in Kudmura village from Korba when the accident happened in Rampur area under Civil Lines Police Station limits, he said. In the third incident, a man identified as Ritesh Kumar (24) was killed and his friend Pradip Kumar injured after their motorcycle crashed into a stationary truck at a toll plaza near Mohanpur village on Korba-Katghora road, he said.

Man acting as courier for top Naxalite leaders held

Rajnandgaon, Apr 11:

A man allegedly working as a courier for senior Naxalite leaders was arrested in the Mohla-Manpur-Ambagarh Chowki district on Thursday, a police official said.

Maoist pamphlets and posters urging people to boycott Lok Sabha polls were seized from Ashwant Aandhia, who was held on a tip off at a mobile check post of the Indo Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) and personnel of Sitagaon police station, he said.

During interrogation, Aandhia admitted he was a courier for senior Naxalite

Two Naxalites held

Bijapur: Two Naxalites, one of them carrying a reward of Rs 1 lakh, were arrested from Bijapur district on Thursday, police said. Hemla Hunga (41) and Punem Budhru (40) were nabbed by a team of personnel from the Central Reserve Police Force, its elite unit CoBRA (Commando Battalion for Resolute Action), and the district force during a search in a forest between Bugdicheru and Gundam villages, a police official said.

'Modi's guarantee that the corrupt will go to jail'

Jaipur, Apr 11 (PTI):

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday asserted that the corrupt will have to go to jail and that he would not be deterred by any threats.

Addressing a rally in Rajasthan's Karauli ahead of the Lok Sabha polls, Modi said strict action is being taken against the corrupt not only in the state but across the country. This is why the opposition has formed the "INDI alliance" against him, he said.

"On one side there is Modi, who says remove corruption. On the other side are those who say save the corrupt. All these people who have set out to save

the corrupt listen carefully, no matter how many threats you give to Modi, the corrupt will have to go to jail. This is Modi's guarantee," he said.

Modi said the 2024 Lok Sabha elections are not about who will become an

MP and who will not. "This election is about giving a new energy to the resolve of 'Viksit Bharat'," he said.

Hitting out at the Congress, Modi said the party raised the slogan of 'Gareebi Hatao' for decades but it was he who worked

to bring 25 crore people out of poverty. The Congress, which is steeped in nepotism and corruption, seeks profit in people's compulsions. It found opportunities to loot even in jobs for the youth and a paper leak industry flourished under the patronage of its erstwhile government in Rajasthan, the PM said. Modi said every moment of his life is dedicated to the country. "Every moment in your name, every moment in the name of the country and that is why I say, 24x7 for 2047," he said.

"Modi was not born to rest or have fun. Modi works hard because Modi has very big goals connected to the people of the country," he said.

Six kids killed after school bus overturns

- 20 injured

Chandigarh, Apr 11 (PTI):

Six schoolchildren were killed and around 20 sustained injuries after a bus carrying them overturned in Haryana's Mahendragarh on Thursday, police said.

The Haryana government has ordered a probe into the incident following the registration of an FIR, officials said.

The bus belonged to a private school and was being driven rashly at a high speed due to which the driver lost control and rammed the vehicle into a tree after which it overturned, police said, citing reports. Reports also suggest that the driver

was under the influence of alcohol, police said, adding that he has been arrested and his medical report is awaited. The bus was carrying 30 children and the accident occurred near Unhani

village in Kanina, they said. Officials also said that the district authorities are ascertaining why the school was functioning despite a holiday owing to Eid festival.

Principal among three arrested....

The principal of the school whose bus overturned in Haryana's Mahendragarh, killing six children, is among three people who have been arrested in connection with the incident. The driver, who allegedly jumped out of the bus just before it rammed into a tree, has also been taken into custody, along with the secretary of the school. A senior police official said the medical test conducted on the driver has confirmed that alcohol was present in his bloodstream.

SBI refuses to share electoral bonds info under RTI

New Delhi, Apr 11 (PTI):

The State Bank of India (SBI) has refused to disclose under the RTI Act the details of the electoral bonds furnished to the Election Commission (EC), claiming that it is personal information held in a fiduciary capacity, even though the records are in the public domain on the poll panel's website.

Holding that the electoral bonds scheme was "unconstitutional and manifestly arbitrary", the Supreme Court directed the SBI on February 15 to furnish the complete details of the bonds purchased since April 12, 2019 to the EC, which would publish the information on its website by March 13.

On March 11, the court dismissed the SBI's petition seeking an extension of the deadline and ordered it to disclose the details of the electoral bonds to the EC by the close of business hours on March 12. RTI activist Commodore Lokesh Batra (retired) approached the SBI on March 13 seeking the complete data of the electoral bonds in the digital form, as provided to the EC after the Supreme Court's order.

The bank denied the information citing two exemption clauses given under the Right to Information (RTI) Act - section 8(1)(e) that is related to records held in a fiduciary capacity and section 8(1)(j) that allows withholding personal information.

CBI arrests K Kavitha in Tihar jail

- In corruption case

New Delhi, Apr 11 (PTI):

The CBI on Thursday arrested Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) leader K Kavitha in connection with a corruption case linked to the alleged Delhi excise policy scam, officials said.

Kavitha, 46, the daughter of former Telangana chief minister K Chandrashekar Rao, was held in Tihar jail where she was lodged after her arrest by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in a money laundering case linked to the excise "scam" on March 15, they said.

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) had questioned Kavitha in-

side the prison on Saturday after obtaining permission from a special court. The BRS leader was questioned on WhatsApp chats recovered from co-accused Buchi Babu's phone and documents related to a land deal after which Rs

100 crore was allegedly paid to Delhi's ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in kickbacks to swing the now-scrapped excise policy in favour of a liquor lobby.

The CBI arrested Kavitha in jail number 6 of Tihar prison around 12 noon on Thursday under Section 120-B (criminal conspiracy) read with Section 477-A (falsification of accounts) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Section 7 (offence relating to public servant being bribed) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, the officials said.

While Kavitha will remain in Tihar jail on Thursday, the agency is likely to produce her before a court on Friday to seek her remand.

LeT terrorist slain in J-K's 1st encounter

- In 3 months

Srinagar, Apr 11 (PTI):

A Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist was killed in an encounter with security forces in Jammu and Kashmir's Pulwama district on Thursday, police said.

This was the first encounter between terrorists and security forces in Jammu and Kashmir in more than three months.

The security forces had launched a cordon-and-search operation in Fressipora village in the Rajpora area of the south Kashmir district following inputs about the presence of terrorists there, a police spokesperson said.

A terrorist was killed in an encounter with security forces at Fressipora village in Rajpora area of Jammu and Kashmir's Pulwama district



He said the search operation turned into an encounter after the terrorists opened fire on the forces, who retaliated.

In the ensuing encounter, a terrorist was killed, the police spokesperson said.

ACB-EOW raids seven places in twin-city

Bhilai, Apr 11: The Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB) and Economic Offences Wing (EOW) conducted simultaneous raids at seven places in Durg - Bhilai in connection with the alleged liquor scam in Chhattisgarh.

Early in the morning, the ACB sleuths reached the residences of two close aides of the former Chief Minister. The EOW teams reached the residence of Pappu Bansal in New Khursipar and Vijay Bhatia at Nehru Nagar (East). The EOW also con-

ducted raids at the places of some other people associated with liquor business. A team of about one dozen officers conducted a search at the bungalow of Vijay Bhatia in Nehru Nagar, East. Another team raided the house of Pappu Bansal alias Lakshmi

Narayan Bansal, in New Khursipar. According to information, Bansal's house was found locked and no one was inside. The sealed the house and pasted the notice at the main gate. The raids were conducted in connection with a case registered under

Section 7, 12 of Anti-Corruption Act as well as Sections 420, 467, 468, 471, 120B of IPC. The ACB teams recovered cash, electronic devices like laptop, pen-drive, bank statements, movable and immovable property documents, jewellery, etc.

- Last date for filing nomination is April 19
- Voting on May 07 and counting on June 04

Bhilai, Apr 11:

Collector and District Election Officer Richa Prakash Chaudhary is going to publish the notification for Parliamentary Constituency 07 Durg under Lok Sabha Elections-2024 at 11:00 hrs on April 12. With the publication of notification, the nomination process will start. The work of filing nominations will be done from 11:00 hrs to 15:00 hrs except public holidays. The last date for filing nominations is Friday, April 19, 2024 till 15:00 hrs. Scrutiny of nomination papers will take place from 11:00 hrs on Saturday, April 20, 2024. The candidates will be able to withdraw their nominations till 15:00 hrs on Monday April 22, 2024. Voting will be held from

7:00 hrs to 18:00 hrs on Tuesday, May 7, 2024. Counting of votes will begin at 8:00 hrs on Tuesday, June 4, 2024. The election work will be completed before Thursday, June 6, 2024. Nomination room has been established in the Collector's Court, Room No 04 (First Floor) and Office of Collector Durg for Parliamentary Constituency 07 Durg. Only a maximum of 5 persons including the candidate, his proposer and election agent will be able to enter the Returning Officer's room. Only three vehicles of the candidate and his agent will be allowed within the radius of 100 meters. It will be mandatory to obtain prior permission from the Additional District Magistrate for the use of vehicles. Collector staff will be able to enter their office room in the Collectorate till 10:00 hrs. The deposit amount for general candidates con-

testing elections is fixed at Rs 25000, for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates it is fixed at Rs 12500. Nomination letter format 2A can be obtained from Nodal Officer Raghavendra (Senior Treasury Officer) or the appointed employee, in the Mineral Branch of the Collector's office. The voter list can be viewed through the nodal officer in the Excise Branch of the collector's office, Aditya Kunjam (Superintendent of land records) or the concerned employee. Receipts can be obtained by depositing the deposit amount in cash. For election, the candidate will have to open a separate bank account at least 1 day before filing the nomination and the candidate will have to mention this separate bank account while filing the nomination form. The limit of election expenditure to be incurred by a candidate during the election will be Rs 95 lakh.

Bhilai Steel providing strength to Sela Tunnel in Arunachal

Bhilai, Apr 11:

SAIL-Bhilai Steel Plant has supplied more than 7,300 tonnes of steel for use in construction of the strategic Sela Tunnel Project in Arunachal Pradesh. Constructed at an altitude of 13,700 feet in West Kameng district on the road connecting Tezpur to Tawang, the Tunnel project, consisting of two tunnels and a link road, is aimed at providing all-weather connectivity to Arunachal Pradesh's Tawang region. The project will not only provide a faster and more efficient transport route in the region but is of strategic importance to the country. Executed by the Border Road Organisation (BRO), the tunnel will cut down the travel time to Tawang by at least one hour. As of now, Sela Pass stays closed for a few winter months. The



project will provide a new alignment on the axis towards the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with easier movement for military personnel and equipment throughout the year. While other integrated steel plants of SAIL have also supplied steel for the project, Bhilai Steel Plant has supplied 6545 Tonnes of TMT Bars, 512 Tonnes of TMT Bars in Coils, 88 tonnes of Wire Rods, 46 Tonnes of angles and channels, 94 Tonnes of Plates and 22 tonnes of Joists - all in the specified grades for use in construction of the

Sela Tunnel Project. The total volume of steel supplied by SAIL is 24,216 Tonnes. Durgapur Steel Plant and IISCO Steel Plant at Burnpur, the other two Plants of SAIL that produce TMT Bars and rods have also supplied 8937 Tonnes and 3118 T of TMT Bars, respectively. DSP has also supplied 3662 Tonnes of Joists for the tunnel project. The question paper for the voting teams has been prepared by Kedar Patel, Employment Officer and

Assistant Nodal Officer Remarkably, the polling process has been framed into a poem. This has been provided to the staff in the form of a song. The aim is to make it easier to memorise the process through songs, as poll duty teams find it easier to recall the voting process through these catchy tunes. A feedback form is also provided, inviting suggestions to improve the training. The addition of audio-visual techniques and a

one-minute song related to the voting process is helping the polling teams grasp the basics easily. The training material has been prepared under the guidance of District Panchayat CEO Vishwadeep, with contributions from IT Nodal, Ujjwal Porwar and DEO, P. C. Verma. Trainees praise innovative training methods and appreciate the district administration's efforts. Dr. Ritu Shrivastava, a lecturer from Government School, Dumartarai, who attended the training, said there were many changes in this year's training. Collector Dr. Singh's video message was very motivating. The trainers explained the processes in a structured manner through audio-visual content. Durga Devi Nirmalakar from Dharmapura Primary School said that the trainers explained everything through videos, and urged them to treat this as a festival, which removed their fear.

Workers condition will improve if Cong govt is formed at Center: Baij

Congress promises to increase MNREGA wages from Rs 200 to Rs 400

Raipur, Apr 11:

The condition of workers in the country will improve if the Congress government is formed at the Centre. State Congress President Deepak Baij said that when Congress was in power in the country, Congress had given legal guarantee to employment. For this, Mahatma Gandhi Employment Guarantee (MNREGA) was created in which it became the legal right of every labourer to get work for 100 days. The Modi gov-



ernment has maliciously cut the MNREGA budget by a huge 15 to 25 percent every year, due to which it has become difficult to get employment for even 20 days. Leaders quit MNS over Raj Thackeray supporting Modi

Mumbai, Apr 11 (PTI):

Many office-bearers of the Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) have resigned in protest after their party chief Raj Thackeray declared support to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the BJP-led Mahayuti alliance in the state. MNS general secretary Kirtikumar Shinde, one of those who have quit, took to Facebook to explain his decision. In a post on the social media platform on Wednesday, he said MNS chief Thackeray had taken a stand against PM Modi and BJP in 2019.

Political analysts will tell how wrong he is and how right. "Nowadays leaders can play the political role they want, whenever they want. But the fighters (a reference to party workers) who believe in their thoughts are crushed. What about that," he asked in the post.

In his annual Gudi Padwa (the first day of Marathi New Year) rally on Tuesday, Thackeray announced his unconditional support to PM Modi and the Mahayuti alliance comprising the BJP, Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena and the NCP under Ajit Pawar.

Formed in 2006, the MNS backed Modi's candidature for the PM's post in

2014. However, Thackeray, a firebrand leader known for his oratory, became a bitter critic in 2019 and attacked Modi's policies. He has now backed Modi just before the 2024 Lok Sabha polls. Mihir Dave and office-bearers of MNS' student wing in Dombivali, on the outskirts of Mumbai, also quit the party citing Thackeray's inconsistent positions.

Dave said they exited the party in protest after Thackeray declared his support to PM Modi. "We found it difficult to cope with the changing stances of Raj saheb. The difference of opinion over Raj saheb's decision has also led to disagreements among the workers, so it is better to part ways," he said.

NDMC launches 'tree ambulance' to protect green cover

New Delhi, Apr 11 (PTI):

The NDMC has launched a 'tree ambulance' for treating ailing trees and maintaining the green assets in the areas falling under it, officials said. The New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) has customised an eco-friendly CNG-run 'tree ambulance' equipped with two water tanks, having storage capacities of 750 litres and 250 litres, and a high-pressure pump with a jetting hose.

staff related to pest infestation, hollow or drying trees on a regular basis for need of treatment, washing of trees on regular basis, a statement said.

The tree ambulance will be used to treat the ailing trees for infestation of diseases, pests, termites, etc. The hollow trunk of trees shall be provided a new lease of life through surgery, the statement added.

The procedure of tree surgery involves removing the infected or hollowed-out part, cleaning it with a brush, washing it properly, applying insecticides, and fungicides on the infested portion and filling the hollow trunk with inert material like foam and covering it with

chicken mesh followed by sealing it, it explained.

The NDMC area has green assets including approximately 1.80 lakh trees. The council maintains approximately 1500 acres of green area and 135 green avenues, 10 major parks, 1400 residential colony parks, 50 roundabouts, 10 departmental nurseries including three hi-tech nurseries, and three international relationships memorial parks.

Infrastructure upgrade enhances accessibility to Amamora, Odh area

Mainpur, Apr 11:

The once remote village of Amamora and the Odh area, nestled under the shadow of the Udanti Sitanadi Tiger Reserve in Gariaband district, is now witnessing improved accessibility, thanks to ongoing road construction efforts. Previously, reaching this tribal settlement, home to the Kamar tribes, required navigating rocky and uneven paths, often hindered by challenging terrain and lack of proper infrastructure. However, with the initiation of construction on a 31.65 km road from Dhawalpur National Highway to Kukur, residents can now traverse the distance in just 40 minutes.

Under the Prime Minister Rural Roads Scheme, the Department has commenced work on this vital roadway, slated to be built at a cost of Rs 20 crore, with five separate tenders issued for its construction. Progress has been notable, with 10 km of road already completed, including the construction of a 5 km stretch of cement concrete road from Chikhali Plateau to Odh, a particularly steep sec-



tion of the mountains. Remaining portions have been treated with Murum soil, facilitating smoother movement and enhancing accessibility to the region.

EE BR Soni of the Prime Minister's Rural Roads Department provided updates on the construction efforts, highlighting the ongoing pace of work and addressing challenges, including objections from the Forest Department in some areas. Efforts to resolve these issues are underway, with construction anticipated to conclude by June-July.

CRPF supervised road construction boosts development

The road construction, meticulously supervised by CRPF



Battalion 65, signifies a significant stride towards development in the region. With CRPF camps established in Chhindaula and Odh just a year ago, the presence of the battalion has facilitated the construction process, ensuring safety and security in the area.

Under the guidance of Gariaband SP Amit Tukaram Kamble, successful joint operations conducted by DRG and CRPF have effectively driven out Naxalites, paving the way for infrastructural development. This initiative holds paramount importance from a tribal perspective, with the region earmarked for road construction as early as 2007.

However, repeated threats from Naxalites stalled progress, with multiple tender processes initiated but subsequently halted due to security

concerns. Tragic incidents, including the martyrdom of soldiers in Naxal ambushes in 2011 and 2015, underscored the challenges faced in executing the construction project.

Following a strategic decision to deploy security forces in 2022, the path to road construction was finally cleared. Despite numerous hurdles, the concerted efforts of CRPF and local authorities have culminated in the realization of this essential infrastructure project, heralding a new era of development eagerly awaited by the villagers.



Healthcare challenges The healthcare infrastructure in the area faces significant challenges, with a sub-health center serving the community but lacking a dedicated building. Additionally, the absence of accommodation for health

workers necessitates their residence in Dhawalpur, located 30 km below.

Educational struggles in remote villages

In seven villages of the region, access to education beyond middle school remains a challenge, with only two ashram schools catering to students up to the middle school level. Despite 12 to 15 eligible children passing each year, the absence of a high school poses a significant hurdle to their educational advancement. Concerned individuals like Panch Lakhan Yadav and Bhagwan Yadav, along with other community members, express apprehension about the future prospects of the children. Limited accessibility due to the lack of a smooth road further exacerbates the situation, with only a handful of students able to travel for higher education. The construction of the road holds promise for addressing this issue, potentially bringing educational opportunities closer to home for the students in the area.

Hope for economic stability

Ramsingh Kamar, the Sarpanch of Odh, belonging to the Kamar tribe, lamented the minimal development in the region compared to other Panchayats, attributing it to limited accessibility. The area's classification as a forested region restricts opportunities for work under MNREGA, leading to an annual migration of over 100 Qamar laborers from Hathoradih and surrounding areas to Andhra Pradesh for employment in brick kilns. Even students from local ashram schools often flee in search of better opportunities elsewhere. However, with the anticipated improvements in infrastructure, there is renewed optimism that migration due to lack of work will cease, fostering economic stability and development within the community.

Anticipated access to electricity

With the ongoing road construction, significant progress is being made in installing elec-

tric poles along the roadside. Previously, transportation challenges hindered the installation of power infrastructure in the upper village. However, with the road project advancing, the administration is now actively preparing to extend electricity to the area, heralding a new era of accessibility and development for the community.

Potential for tourism growth

Situated at a high altitude, this area maintains a pleasant climate even during the summer months and transforms into a snowy landscape in winter. Additionally, the presence of two captivating waterfalls, promoted by the Udanti Sitanadi Sanctuary, adds to its allure. The commencement of road construction has already attracted foreign tourists to the region, with anticipation for further growth in tourism upon completion of the project. This influx of visitors promises to bolster the income of local forest committees, signaling a significant boost to the area's economy.

Current developments in Pakistan may lead to another 'Dhaka tragedy': Imran Khan

Islamabad, Apr 11 (PTI):

Jailed former prime minister Imran Khan drew a parallel between the political developments in Pakistan now and the circumstances leading to the 1971 Dhaka tragedy, warning that the present situation in the cash-strapped country could result in economic collapse.

The Dawn newspaper reported that the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founding chairman in a message from Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail reminded the current dispensation that "countries and institutions could not survive without a stable economy".

PTI Central Information Secretary Raouf Hasan relayed Khan's message to the media during a press conference after the



party's legal team met the 71-year-old cricketer-turned-politician in jail on Wednesday, the day Eid was celebrated in Pakistan.

Barrister Raja told the media that Khan looked determined, though worried for the country and its people.

Raja, who narrated Khan's message, said, "When you don't give

rights to the people, you cannot say the economy will grow."

"In 1970, army chief Yahya Khan wanted a hung Parliament, but when Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's party got a clear majority, the army held a fraud by-election in which 80 seats of Awami League were snatched as Yahya Khan wanted to become president," he said, referring to the political developments in the then East Pakistan.

"I want to remind the Hamoodur Rahman Commission report that we are again going to repeat the same blunders which we made in the past. In 1970, there was the London Plan and today again a government has been imposed through the London Plan," Raja quoted Khan as saying.

Israeli strike kills 3 sons of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh

Jerusalem: An Israeli airstrike in Gaza killed three sons of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh, according to Israel's army and the militant group's official media, with Haniyeh accusing Israel of acting in "the spirit of revenge and murder." The Israeli military confirmed it carried out the attack Wednesday, saying the men conducted militant activity in central Gaza, without elaborating. Hamas said four of the leader's grandchildren were also killed. In an interview with the Al Jazeera satellite channel, Haniyeh said the killings would not pressure Hamas into softening its positions amid ongoing cease-fire negotiations with Israel, brokered by international mediators. Haniyeh left Gaza in 2019 and lives in exile in Qatar. The top Hamas leader in Gaza is Yehya Sinwar, who masterminded the October 7 attack on Israel that sparked the war.

12 Indians arrested in UK visa raids on bedding, cake factories

London, Apr 11 (PTI):

Eleven men and one woman, all said to be Indian nationals, have been arrested by the UK's immigration authorities in a series of raids on suspicion of being in breach of their visa conditions and working illegally at a bedding and cake factory.

According to a statement from the UK Home Office on Wednesday, Immigration Enforcement officers descended on the bedding and mattress business in the West Midlands region of England following intelligence that illegal work was taking place on-site.

They arrested seven men - all Indian nationals - for suspected illegal

working," the Home Office said. "Four more Indian men were arrested at a nearby cake factory. They were found to be in breach of their visa conditions, and one was also working illegally. An Indian woman was then arrested for immigration offences at a private home, with further raids planned throughout the afternoon," it said.

The officials said four of the offenders were detained pending consideration for removal from the UK or deportation to India, and the remaining eight have been bailed on the condition they report regularly to the Home Office. Meanwhile, the two businesses could now face substantial fines if it is established they employed ille-

gal workers at their factories and failed to conduct relevant pre-employment checks. "This operation is a clear example of the way we are stepping up immigration enforcement activity across the country," said Michael Tomlinson, UK Minister for Countering Illegal Migration. "Employers found to be breaching the rules can expect significantly increased fines, and if workers are found to have no right to live or work here, we will not hesitate to act and remove them from the country," he said. In February this year, the Home Office tripled fines for employers who allow illegal migrants to work for them. For a first breach, this has gone from

GBP 15,000 to GBP 45,000 per illegal worker, and for repeat breaches within three years, the fines have increased from GBP 20,000 to GBP 60,000. "Illegal working causes serious harm to communities, puts vulnerable people at risk and defrauds the public purse. The arrests send a clear message that we are clamping down on this dangerous practice," said Eddy Montgomery, Director of Enforcement, Compliance and Crime at the Home Office. "People smugglers sell migrants the lie that they can work in the UK. The reality is that they can't - and those found to be working illegally or facilitating this crime will face the full weight of the law," he said.

Hungary will impose new restrictions on agricultural imports from Ukraine

Budapest, Apr 11 (AP):

Hungary's government will place new restrictions on the import of Ukrainian agricultural products, the country's agricultural minister said Thursday, a move designed to protect Hungarian farmers from market fluctuations caused by cheaper Ukrainian imports.

Agricultural Minister István Nagy told a news conference that a 2022 European Union decision to allow for duty-free imports from Ukraine, meant to help keep its economy afloat after Russia's invasion, had led to "severe oversupply and significantly low prices" in the European agricultural market.

He blamed the EU and its executive commission for failing to protect European farmers who could not compete with the cheaper imports, and said Hungary would pass additional protections "in its national competence".

"Brussels and the European Commission have betrayed Hungarian farmers and are supporting Ukrainian oligarchs instead," Nagy said.

Hungary has had a fraught relationship with neighbouring Ukraine, and is among the EU countries that has offered the least support to Kyiv during its war with Russia.

Soon after the full-scale Russian invasion in February 2022, Hungary declared it would not pro-

vide weapons to Kyiv or allow their transfer across its eastern border. It has also argued against sanctions on Moscow and threatened to derail EU financial assistance to its war-ravaged neighbour.

On Thursday, Nagy said the government had decided on a five-point plan to assist Hungarian farmers, including a requirement for sellers and logistics companies to report to Hungary's government on restricted products being imported via Ukraine regardless of those products' country of origin.

Nagy added that processed products made from Ukrainian grain would also be subject to the restrictions. Hungary last year intro-

duced a ban on the import of 24 Ukrainian agricultural products, but said it would allow their transfer across its territory. The ban applied to grains, oil seeds, flour, cooking oil and several meat products. The government removed Ukrainian natural honey from the list last month.

In March, the EU struck a deal to renew its temporary suspension of import duties and quotas on Ukrainian agricultural exports to the bloc. But the deal comes with a reinforced safeguard that will force the European Commission to reintroduce tariff-rate quotas if imports of various staples surpass the average volumes imported in 2022 and 2023.

Imran Khan's wife meets him at Adiala Jail on Eid

Islamabad: Imran Khan could meet his wife Bushra Bibi at the Adiala Jail on the Eid-ul-Fitr day after a Pakistani court allowed her to meet the former prime minister in prison, a media report said on Thursday. While Khan, also the founder of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party, has been lodged at the Adiala Jail since August last year, Bushra Bibi was imprisoned at Khan's Bani Gala residence that had been turned into a sub-jail since she was sentenced in the 'un-Islamic nikah' case in February. The police scheduled the meeting and shifted Bushra Bibi from the Bani Gala sub-jail to the Adiala Jail on the occasion of Eid on Wednesday. The Adiala Jail Conference Room served as the venue for the meeting. To facilitate Bushra Bibi's visit, one side of the road heading to the jail was blocked, The Friday Times reported.

Sound and stable ties' serve common interests

China reacts to PM Modi's border row comments

Beijing, Apr 11 (PTI):

China on Thursday said that "sound and stable ties" serve the common interests of China and India as it reacted to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's remarks that for New Delhi, ties with Beijing are important and the "prolonged situation" at the borders should be addressed urgently. In an interview with Newsweek magazine, which described India's rise as "unstoppable", Prime Minister Modi expressed hope that through positive and constructive bilateral engagement at the diplomatic and military levels, the two countries will be able to restore and sustain peace and tranquillity at their borders. "China has noted the remarks by the prime minister," Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson Mao Ning told a media briefing here when

asked for her reaction to Modi's statement. "We believe that sound and stable ties, India relations serve the common interests of both sides and are conducive to peace and development of the region and beyond," she said.

In his interview, which is the first to be given to a US magazine in the recent past, Modi said that for India, the relationship with China is important and significant.

"It is my belief that we need to urgently address the prolonged situation on our borders so that the abnormality in our bilateral interactions can be put behind us. Stable and peaceful relations between India and China are important for not just our two countries but the entire region and world," he said. Foreign ministry spokesperson Mao said the boundary question "does

not represent the entirety of the India-China relations. It should be placed appropriately in the bilateral relations and managed properly".

The two sides are in close communication through diplomatic and military channels, she said. "We hope India will work in the same direction with China, handle the bilateral relations from the strategic heights and long-term perspective, enhance mutual trust, stick to dialogue and cooperation, handle differences properly and put the bilateral relations forward on sound and stable track," she said. The relations between India and China have been frozen except for trade ties ever since the eastern Ladakh border standoff erupted on May 5, 2020, following a violent clash in the Pangong Tso (lake) area.

Mali's junta suspends all political activities until further notice

Bamako (Mali), Apr 11 (AP):

Mali's ruling junta issued a decree suspending all political activities until further notice late on Wednesday, citing a need to preserve public order, a move that follows last year's decision to call off elections indefinitely.

Junta spokesman Abdoulaye Maiga read out the statement on state television in the evening, while the country was celebrating Eid al-Fitr, the holiday marking end of the holy month of Ramadan in which observant Muslims fast from dawn until dusk. Mali has experienced two coups since 2020, setting off a wave of political instability that has swept across West and Central Africa. The country has battled a

worsening insurgency by jihadi groups linked to Al Qaeda and the Islamic State group for over a decade. Col Assimi Goita, who took charge after a second coup in 2021, promised to return the country to democracy in early 2024. But in September, the junta canceled elections scheduled for February 2024 indefinitely, citing the need for further technical preparations. Mali previously relied on French troops to help push back the insurgents. Amid growing frustration over the lack of progress, the ruling junta ordered French troops out and turned to Russian contractors instead for security support. The last French forces departed in August 2022 after almost a decade of operations in Mali.

Biden to meet with Philippines, Japanese leaders

Worry grows about Chinese action in Indo-Pacific

Washington, Apr 11 (AP):

President Joe Biden is bringing together Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida at the White House on Thursday as the three nations use their first-ever trilateral summit to try to show they are in lockstep about countering China's military assertiveness in the Indo-Pacific. The leaders are expected to announce that their coast guards will hold a joint patrol in the Indo-Pacific in 2024, a follow-up on law enforcement drills carried out last year by the allies in waters near the disputed South China Sea. The US Coast Guard will also welcome Filipino and Japanese coast guard members onto a US Coast

Guard vessel during the patrol for training, according to senior Biden administration officials who requested anonymity to preview the talks. The summit comes a day after

Tokyo's growing clout on the global stage. It was also designed to send a clear signal that the Democratic administration remains determined to build what it calls a "lattice-work" of alliances in the Indo-Pacific even as it grapples with the Israel-Hamas war and Russia's ongoing invasion of Ukraine. Biden on Wednesday reflected on the fact that Japan, once a fierce US enemy, has become one of the closest American partners and an indispensable ally in a shared push for peace, security and prosperity in the Pacific and beyond.

"Just a few generations ago, our two nations were locked in a devastating conflict," Biden said with Kishida by his side for a pomp-filled arrival ceremony at the White House.

China sanctions 2 US companies over 'support for arms sales to Taiwan'

Beijing, Apr 11 (AP):

China on Thursday announced sanctions against two US defence companies over what it says is their support for arms sales to Taiwan, the self-governing island democracy Beijing claims as its own territory to be recovered by force if necessary. The announcement freezes the assets of General Atomics Aeronautical Systems and General Dynamics Land Systems held within China. The measure also bars the companies' management from entering the country.

Filings show General Dynamics operates a half-dozen Gulfstream and jet aviation services operations in China, which remains heavily reliant on

foreign aerospace technology even as it attempts to build its own presence in the field.

The company helps make the Abrams tank being purchased by Taiwan to replace outdated armour intended to deter or resist an invasion from China.

General Atomics produces the Predator and Reaper drones used by the US military. Chinese authorities did not go into details on the company's alleged involvement with supplying arms to Taiwan.

Beijing has long threatened such sanctions, but has rarely issued them as its economy reels from the COVID-19 pandemic, high unemployment and a sharp decline in foreign investment.

The responsibility lies squarely with governments to enact meaningful reforms in areas such as energy, infrastructure, and conservation. ADB raises India's GDP growth forecast for FY25 to 7%

To remain major growth engine in APAC region

New Delhi, Apr 11:

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) on Thursday raised India's GDP growth forecast for the current fiscal to 7 per cent, from 6.7 per cent earlier, saying the robust growth will be driven by public and private sector investment and improvement in consumer demand. In its April edition of the Asian Development Outlook, ADB said India would remain "a major growth engine" in the Asia and Pacific region. For the 2025-26 fiscal, ADB has projected India's growth at 7.2 per cent. Growth will be robust despite moderating in FY2024 and FY2025, it said. The growth estimates for the current fiscal



is lower than 7.6 per cent estimated GDP expansion in 2022-23 fiscal. Strong investment drove GDP growth in the 2022-23 fiscal as consumption was muted, ADB said.

The Manila-based multilateral institution in December last year projected the Indian economy to expand by 6.7 per cent in the 2024-25 fiscal. "The economy grew robustly in fiscal 2023 with strong momentum in manufacturing and services. It will continue to grow rapidly over the

forecast horizon. Growth will be driven primarily by robust investment demand and improving consumption demand. Inflation will continue its downward trend in tandem with global trends," said the Asian Development Outlook.

ADB's growth forecast for the current fiscal is in line with the projections made by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). The RBI last week had said GDP growth in the current fiscal is projected at 7 per cent on expectations of normal mon-

soon, moderating inflationary pressures and sustained momentum in manufacturing and services sectors.

The triggers for growth in FY2024 will come from higher capital expenditure on infrastructure development both by central and state governments, rise in private corporate investment, strong service sector performance and improved consumer confidence.

Growth momentum will pick up in FY2025, backed by improved goods exports and an increase in manufacturing productivity and agricultural output, the ADB said. "Notwithstanding global headwinds, India remains the fastest growing major economy on the strength of its strong domestic demand and supportive policies," said ADB Country Director for India Mio Oka.

Unfazed by impending entry of Tesla, new EV policy has safeguards: Mercedes-Benz India

New Delhi, Apr 11:

German luxury carmaker Mercedes-Benz is unfazed by the likelihood of Tesla entering India with imported electric cars at much lower duty and believes that the country's new EV policy has safeguards for existing players, a senior company official said on Thursday.

While the entry of the likes of Tesla and VinFast will help expand the market and accelerate EV adoption in India, Mercedes-Benz is confident to maintain leadership in the luxury EV space as the new entrants would play in the lower segment. "I think new competitors and new players are always welcome. It helps to expand the market, spread

more awareness, which is also the need of the hour to get more EV penetration," Mercedes-Benz India Managing Director & CEO Santosh Iyer told PTI. He was responding to a query on the implications of India's new EV policy and if it puts manufacturers which have already invested in the country at a disadvantage.

"Any duty-free or any reduced-duty tariffs are always welcome because we have always been advocating free trade in India and globally. So for us, any such things are welcome," he said. Iyer further said, "We have to go deeper into the policy and check the implications but there are caps and ceilings and there are safeguards put in by the

government. So at this stage it is not a major threat that we see for our business."

Under the new EV policy, companies that would set up manufacturing facilities for EV passenger cars will be allowed to import a limited number of cars at lower customs/import duty of 15 per cent on vehicles costing USD 35,000 and above for a period of five years from the date of issuance of the approval letter by the government. At present, cars imported as completely built units (CBUs) attract customs duty ranging from 70 per cent to 100 per cent, depending on the type of fuel, engine size and cost, insurance and freight (CIF) value below or above USD 40,000.

Q4 earnings: IT pack seen bracing for muted show amid weak global macros, tight spends

New Delhi, Apr 11:

Indian IT companies are seen signing off FY24 on a subdued note with an uncertain global macroeconomic environment dragging tech demand and client spends, analysts said, forecasting modest commentary and cautious tone by the tech pack on FY25 outlook. The grand IT earnings season opens on Friday with results of Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), followed by Infosys scorecard on April 18 and Wipro on April 19. Tech Mahindra is scheduled to announce Q4 and full-year numbers on April 25, whereas HCL Technologies will declare its numbers on April 26. Emkay in its quarterly preview recently said subpar growth should persist in Q4 as muted demand trends continue on



account of weak discretionary spending and cautious behavior by clients amid uncertain macros. It predicted FY24 ending on a "weak footing", and noted that recovery hope has shifted to the second half of FY25. "Global companies such as ACN (Accenture), CTSI (Cognizant Technology Solutions), and CAP (Cappgemini) have also guided for muted growth, particularly during H1CY24 (first half of calendar year 2024), with recovery expected towards the end of CY24," it said.

Govt's focus on infra development to nurture sustained revival in investment cycle: RBI report

Mumbai, Apr 11:

The government's focus on infrastructure development, coupled with buoyant business optimism, could nurture a sustained revival in the investment cycle, according to a Reserve Bank report. According to the RBI's Monetary Policy Report-April 2024, domestic economic activity, backed by strong fundamentals, remained robust in the first half of 2023-24, weathering challenges from muted global demand. The report further said that while the fixed investment and the lower drag from net external demand propelled real GDP growth, private con-



sumption received support from steady urban demand. On the supply side, it added, manufacturing activity strengthened further, benefiting from lower input costs and the improvement in global supply chains.

Construction activity remained firm on the back of buoyant housing demand and the government's

CBDT issues FY'25 interim action plan for tax officers

New Delhi, Apr 11:

The income tax department has come out with an interim action plan for 2024-25 fiscal year, which include identification of potential cases of prosecution, wherein there is short-payment of TDS and faster disposal of appeals. The action plan also stipulates timeline for approval of refunds, identification of cases where seized assets are due for release and release the same by June 30, 2024. It also called for finalisation of compounding proposals pending as on March 31, 2024, and disposal of at least 150 appeals by June 30. Priority should be given to disposal of the appeals filed prior to April 1, 2020, followed by disposal of appeals filed after April 1, 2020, it said. AKM Global, Partner-Tax, Sandeep Sehgal said the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) has unveiled its interim action plan for FY 2024-25, marking a significant stride towards enhancing tax administration efficiency.

Comm Min may seek 5 year extension of interest equalisation scheme for exporters

New Delhi, Apr 11:

The commerce ministry is likely to seek further extension of the interest equalisation scheme on pre- and post-shipment rupee export credit for another five years to promote the country's outbound shipments, an official has said. The scheme will end on June 30 this year.

"The ministry will do re-vamping of some schemes like interest equalisation scheme. We would propose an extension of the scheme for five years. The scheme is doing good, and it is helping the exporters," the official said. On December 8, 2023, the Union Cabinet approved an additional allocation of Rs 2,500 crore for the continuation of the scheme up to June 30. The scheme helps exporters from identified sectors and all MSME manufacturer exporters to avail of rupee export credit at competitive rates at a time when

the global economy is facing headwinds. Exporters get subsidies under the Interest Equalisation Scheme for pre and post-shipment rupee export credit. The additional outlay of Rs 2,500 crore, over and above the current outlay of Rs 9,538 crore under the scheme, was made available to bridge the funding gap to continue the plan up to June 2024. The scheme was started on April 1, 2015, and was initially valid for five years up to March 31, 2020. It has been continued thereafter, including a one-year extension during COVID-19, and with further extensions and fund allocations.

Currently, the scheme provides an interest equalisation benefit at the rate of 2 per cent on pre and post-shipment rupee export credit to merchant and manufacturer exporters of 410 identified tariff lines at 4 digit level and 3 per cent to all MSME manufacturer exporters.

India's economic performance good, efforts needed to sustain it: EAC-PM member Sanjeev Sanyal

New Delhi, Apr 11:



India's economic growth performance is 'good' and efforts now will be needed to sustain it, as there are concerns about the external environment, which are not quite settled, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister (EAC-PM) member Sanjeev Sanyal said on Thursday. Sanyal noted that if the weather condition and the monsoon turns out to be favorable, then food prices will hopefully get tempered as well. This will lay out conditions that will be quite conducive for a growth momentum of 7 per cent or so, to be carried through even under somewhat uncer-

tain global situations. "Our current economic growth performance, I would argue, (is) rather good. And the game now from here on is to be able to sustain it," he told PTI in a video interview. India's economy grew by better-than-expected 8.4 per cent in the final three months of 2023 -- the fastest pace in one-and-a-half years. The

growth rate in October-December was higher than 7.6 per cent in the previous three years, and it helped take the estimate for the previous fiscal (April 2023 to March 2024) to 7.6 per cent. Recently, the Reserve Bank retained the GDP growth forecast of 7 per cent for 2024-25 financial year.

"... While we are very confident of our domestic growth momentum in our economy, there are certainly concerns about the external environments, which are not quite settled," he said. Sanyal explained that exports continue to be quite weak, and there is not yet any momentum in global exports. Moreover, "very recently,

there was spike in oil prices... going up to USD 91 per barrel because of tensions in the Middle East, destruction of Russian oil facilities by Ukrainian attacks and a variety of other reasons," the EAC-PM said. Asked about long-term solutions to high food prices, Sanyal said high food prices to a large extent is not a production problem, but actually a storage problem. "After all, Singapore and Dubai do not grow tomatoes and onions. Their onion and tomato prices don't go spiking in the way we have this and every year. Some vegetable or the other, onion, tomato, potato, whatever, something will go spiking off the charts," he said.

Digi Yatra likely to be rolled at 14 more airports in April



New Delhi, Apr 11:

Digi Yatra is likely to be rolled out at 14 more airports by the end of this month and efforts are on to make the facility more user friendly with certain changes in the architecture, according to a top executive.

Based on Facial Recognition Technology (FRT), Digi Yatra provides for contactless, seamless movement of passengers

at various check points at airports and currently, there are nearly 5 million users. The facility is now there at 14 airports for domestic passengers and discussions are ongoing with various stakeholders concerned to make it available for international travellers as well. Digi Yatra Foundation CEO Suresh Khadkabhavi told PTI that Digi Yatra is expected to be available at 14 more airports by the end of April.

Apple warns of Pegasus-like spyware attacks on select individuals

New Delhi, Apr 11:

iPhone maker Apple has warned its users about ongoing Pegasus-like sophisticated spyware attacks that target a very small number of individuals often journalists, activists, politicians and diplomats. Though deployed against a small number of individuals and often involve exceptional costs, mercenary spyware attacks are "ongoing and global", according to an Apple threat notification. Apple in the threat notification issued on April 10 indicated that such attacks have historically been associated with state actors as per past research and reports. "Apple threat notifications are designed to inform and assist users who may have



been individually targeted by mercenary spyware attacks, likely because of who they are or what they do. Such attacks are vastly more complex than regular cybercriminal activity and consumer malware, as mercenary spyware attackers apply exceptional resources to target a very small number of specific individuals and their devices," the notification said. The notification

has come at a time when around 60 countries, including India, are going for elections this year.

The Cupertino-based firm said that mercenary spyware attacks cost millions of dollars and often have a short shelf life, making them much harder to detect and prevent. Besides, the vast majority of users will never be targeted by such attacks.

Elon Musk confirms India visit, says looking forward to meet PM Modi

New Delhi, Apr 11:

American electric car maker Tesla CEO Elon Musk on Wednesday confirmed his visit to India and his planned meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi. In a post on X, he wrote, "Looking forward to meeting with Prime Minister @NarendraModi in India." Earlier in the day, sources said Musk is expected in India the week of April 22. He is likely to announce the company's investment plans in the country during his visit, the sources said. In June last year, Musk had met Modi during the prime minister's US visit. The Tesla CEO had then said that he planned to visit India in 2024 while expressing confidence that the company would enter

the Indian market soon. His planned visit comes weeks after the government announced a new electric vehicle policy under which import duty concessions will be given to companies setting up manufacturing units in the country with a minimum investment of USD 500 million, a move aimed at attracting major global players like US-based Tesla. According to the policy, the companies that would set up manufacturing facilities for EV passenger cars will be allowed to import a limited number of cars at lower customs/import duty of 15 per cent on vehicles costing USD 35,000 and above for a period of five years from the date of issuance of the approval letter by the government.

World goods trade growth in volume terms may dip 1.2 pc in 2024: GTRI

New Delhi, Apr 11:

The growth in the global merchandise trade is likely to decline by 1.2 per cent, in value terms, due to the ongoing geopolitical uncertainties, economic think tank Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI) said on Thursday. The US dollar value of world merchandise trade fell 5 per cent in 2023 to USD 24.01 trillion, but this decline was mostly offset by a strong increase in commercial services trade, which rose 9 per cent to USD 7.54 trillion, it said. This allowed world goods and commercial services exports on a balance of payments basis to slip 2 per cent in

2023 to USD 30.8 trillion. "Despite the World Trade Organization (WTO) expecting a 2.6 per cent rise in trade volume for 2024, the value of world merchandise trade is still seen to decline by 1.2 per cent in 2024 from 2023, continuing the trend of trade values falling behind the trade volumes," the think tank said. The WTO has projected that the world merchandise trade volume will grow by 2.6 per cent in 2024 and 3.3 per cent in 2025.

"The WTO forecast does not include impact on trade values, which is a commonly used parameter to measure trade performance. Calculating the trade value is straightfor-

ward, as it involves adding up the values of all transactions. However, calculating trade volume is not as simple as just adding up quantities of different goods like iron ore and diamonds, which could lead to inaccurate conclusions," GTRI founder Ajay Srivastava said.

He said the WTO employs a complex method to calculate changes in trade volumes. He added that "probably" the WTO did not want to be the harbinger of bad news about slowing merchandise trade. "The WTO adjusts the value of trade to account for changes in prices, a process known as deflation.

In man riding system, instead of walking on foot, workers reach near the

As a result of the efforts being made by the company towards safety awareness, the number of serious accidents has decreased by more than 54% in the year 2023-24, while the fatal accidents have decreased by 25%.

Reflectors have been installed on vehicles traveling in open mines in night shifts, while red patrolling flags are being installed on light motor vehicles during the day. In mega proj-

ects like Gevra, Dipka, separate lanes have been created inside the mines for the operation of light vehicles so that heavy machines can move freely.

In the meeting, the members of the Security Committee discussed the Mission Sudesh started by CMD Dr. Prem Sagar Mishra and described it as very useful. Everyone congratulated team SECL for recording the highest coal production in its history of 187.4 million tonnes with an increase of more than 20 million tonnes for the second consecutive year, OBR - 323.2 million cubic meters and dispatch - 180.5 million tonnes during the recently concluded financial year 23-24.

In other Indian results, the women's doubles combination of Tanisha Crasto and Ashwini Ponnappa also lost in the pre-quarterfinals, going down 17-21 12-21 against third seeded Japanese pair of Nami

Matsuyama and Chiharu Shida. The Indian started on a bright note in the first game and used her experience to race to a 8-4 lead, which she increased to 14-8 before the Chinese made a gallant comeback as errors started to creep up in Sindhu's game. The Chinese engaged Sindhu in long rallies, tiring her up to draw level at 15-15. With the momentum on her side, Yue never looked back from there on, keeping control of the proceedings to wrap up the first game in her favour.

A jolted Sindhu was in attacking mode in the next game and played aggressively, using her reach and experience to good effect to race to a 16-8 lead.

Although Yue tried her best to claw her way back into the contest, Sindhu did not give any chance to her opponent and pocketed the second game comfortably to level the contest.

DC eye improvement; LSG look to keep winning

Delhi Capitals' bowling unit will have to punch above its weight against an in-form Lucknow Super Giants, who will start as overwhelming favourites in an Indian Premier League match here on Friday.

nings. The major concern for the Lucknow outfit, however, remains Devdutt Padikkal who is yet to reach double digits.

The visitors, on the other hand, are looking like an outfit bereft of a Plan B as it became apparent in their

106-run hammering by Kolkata Knight Riders. The latest loss to a struggling Mumbai Indians has left them languishing at the bottom of the points table with the worst net run rate of -1.370. The primary worry is the composition of

the Indian pace attack, which just lacks spunk.

The onus will be on Khaleel Ahmed and old warhorse Ishant Sharma once again but the duo hasn't been able to deliver consistently. Mukesh Kumar is expected to be back from injury but he has also not set the stage ablaze with his performance.

And, medium pacers Sumit Kumar and Rasikh Dar could well be lambs for slaughter against the likes of de Kock, Stoinis and Pooran.

To add to their woes, pace spearhead Anrich Nortje has been unable to shrug off the rust since coming off his injury, leaking runs at an economy of 13.43 in four outings. DC has struggled to find the silver lining in their 2024 campaign barring skipper Rishabh Pant and Tristan Stubbs' form.

The main issue is the team's lack of depth in Indian talent on the bench. This deficiency does not instil confidence in the team.

Prithvi Shaw got some much-needed runs but he needs to do more at the top. But, save Abhishek Porel, none of the uncapped Indian players have measured up, which has led to over-reliance on their overseas recruits who have also been stuttering.

Riyan Parag's potential is there for everyone to see: Sangakkara

Rajasthan Royals director of cricket Kumar Sangakkara has praised the inform Riyan Parag, saying his potential is there for everyone to see but the Sri Lankan legend fell short of stating that the youngster deserves a place in India's T20 World Cup squad.

The 22-year-old is second only to Virat Kohli in the leading run-getter's list this IPL season having scored 261 runs, with a top score of 84 not out and a strike rate exceeding 158.

The hard hitter's 76 off 48 balls went in vain as Gujarat Titans overhauled the imposing 196-run total off the last ball of the innings here on Wednesday to break the Royals' four-match winning streak on Wednesday.

"I think his (Parag's) potential is there for everyone to see. I think for Riyan it's really about concentrating on Rajasthan and this season, and whatever happens (being considered for T20 World Cup) will happen after that," said Sangakkara in response to a question about whether the Assam cricketer could be in line for an India berth for the World Cup later this year in the West Indies and the USA. "I think you should never get too ahead of looking at things to find the future. As long as he keeps his head down, he is working hard, he is batting well, he is very organised, he's worked hard in the off-season, he just needs to keep doing those good things and, if he does all that, good things will happen," added the charismatic former Sri Lankan, one of the greatest batters with more than 12,000 Test and 14,000 ODI runs.

I might breach the 90m mark before Paris Olympics: Neeraj Chopra

New Delhi, Apr 11 (PTI):

Olympic gold-medallist javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra is aiming to breach the 90m mark before the Paris Olympics and says the way his preparations are going, it could happen anytime soon.

Chopra's best throw in competition came during the 2022 Stockholm Diamond League, where he hurled the spear to a distance of 89.94m. While he has breached 90m in training, he has yet to match it in competition.

The 26-year-old, who will be aiming to retain his Olympic gold in Paris, said on Thursday, "I will try to breach the 90m mark before that (Paris Olympics). Hopefully, it happens before Paris, everything is going on smoothly, so (people) might not have to wait till the Olympics, it might hap-



pen before that. The preparation is good."

The reigning world champion's confidence stems from the fact that he has had a good off season, where he focused on fitness and strength, coupled with the success he has achieved after winning gold in 2020

Tokyo. "During the start of the season, the focus was on fitness and strength and no specific javelin training. I think I got a lot of improvement in technique because of that. Besides, the strength and conditioning training in South Africa and Turkey has also gone well," said Chopra during a virtual interaction from Turkey.

Chopra added that following the Tokyo Olympics success his "self-confidence" had really gone up, which will help him tremendously going into Paris.

"After Tokyo, the self-confidence has definitely gone up. Besides, I have also played quite a few events... two world championships, a silver and a gold there, won the Diamond League trophy, made some good throws, then retained the Asian Games gold (in Hangzhou) as well.

Praggnanandhaa, Vidit score crucial victories

Toronto, Apr 11 (PTI):

Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa and Vidit Gujrathi scored crushing victories, while D Gukesh held on to the joint top spot with a draw in a brilliant sixth-round outing for the Indian men's team at the Candidates Chess Tournament here.

Praggnanandhaa prevailed over Nijat Abasov of Azerbaijan, while Gujrathi got the better of Frenchman Alireza. Gukesh's draw came against American Hikaru Nakamura.

With eight rounds still remaining, the 17-year-old Gukesh and Ian Nepomniachtchi continue to share the lead in the men's section with four points each in their kitty.

Russian Nepomniachtchi, who is playing under the FIDE



flag, played out a draw with top seeded American Fabiano Caruana.

There was disappointment for India in the women's competition as R Vaishali suffered a reversal, losing to Kateryna Lagno of Russia. Vaishali, who is the elder sister of Praggnanandhaa, now has a lot of ground to cover if she has to come back in the tournament. Koneru Humpy also lost, to Tingjie Lei of China, while Nurgul Salimova of Bulgaria found her nemesis in Aleksandra Goryachkina of Russia.

Asian Games medallist Jyothi Yarraji to train in Spain



New Delhi, Apr 11 (PTI):

Asian Games medallist sprinter Jyothi Yarraji's proposal to train in the upcoming season and Paris Olympics was on Thursday cleared by the

government.

The 24-year-old, who won the silver medal in the 100m hurdles event at the Hangzhou Asian Games, will fly to Spain for 45 days, according to a statement by the Sports Ministry's Mission

Olympic Cell (MOC).

The government will bear the cost of her airfare, boarding/ lodging cost, visa application fees, facility access cost, sports massage expenditure, local transportation cost and out-of-pocket allowance, among other expenditures.

MOC also approved India shuttlers Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy's proposal for financial assistance towards sparring partners to train ahead of the Paris Olympics. The star shuttlers will train with Alexander Dunn and Adam Hall of Scotland in Mumbai in June followed by the Indonesian pair of Rian Agung and Berry Agriawan in Hyderabad in July. TOPS will fund the pair's airfare and boarding/ lodging costs.

RR skipper Sanju Samson fined Rs 12 lakh for slow over rate

Jaipur, Apr 11 (PTI):

Rajasthan Royals skipper Sanju Samson has been fined Rs 12 lakh after his team maintained a slow over rate during the Indian Premier League match against Gujarat Titans here.

The Royals' four-match winning streak was broken by the Shubman Gill-led Titans, who won the match by three wickets in a last-ball thriller on Wednesday.



"Sanju Samson, the Rajasthan Royals captain, has been fined after his team maintained a slow over rate during their TATA Indian Premier League (IPL) 2024 match against Gujarat Titans at the Sai Man Singh Stadium, Jaipur on April 10," said an IPL statement.

"As it was his team's first offence of the season under the IPL's Code of Conduct relating to minimum over rate offences, Samson was fined Rs 12

laks," the statement added.

Samson scored an unbeaten 68 off 38 deliveries and was ably assisted by Riyan Parag (78) as the Royals scored an imposing 196 for 3.

However, GT skipper Gill's fine 72 at the top and a cameo innings by Afghanistan spinner Rashid Khan (24 off 11 deliveries) at the back end took the former IPL champions past the finish line off the last delivery.

First time ever Eid namaz not on roads: Delhi LG

New Delhi, Apr 11 (PTI):

Lt Governor VK Saxena said this year's Eid was perhaps for the first time in the history of Delhi that 'namaz' was offered inside mosques and not on the roads, and added that it was an excellent example of harmony and co-existence. Saxena greeted people on the occasion of Eid on Thursday and said this showed that all the issues could be solved with mutual discussions and goodwill.

In a series of posts on X, Saxena said nowhere in Delhi namaz was offered on the road and that there was no "untoward incident" anywhere.

"Reiterating the greetings of Eid-ul-Fitr, I heartily thank the Imams of all

the mosques and Eidgahs of Delhi and all our Muslim brothers for offering prayers inside the mosque premises," L-G Saxena wrote on X in

Hindi. He said that by organising and offering prayers inside the mosque premises, albeit at staggered timings, the 'imams' and members of the

Muslim community "ensured that traffic on the roads was not affected, and no untoward incident took place and the common people did not face any problem."

"This is perhaps the first time in the history of Delhi that people offered 'namaz' entirely inside the mosques and Eidgahs and not on the roads. By doing this today, Delhi has set a great example of harmony and cooperation for the country," he said.

The L-G said that on April 4, he had discussed and appealed in this regard in a meeting with several 'imams' of Delhi. The community welcomed his suggestion of staggered timings of 'namaz' and assured him that it will be implemented.

2010 BAREILLY RIOTS CASE

SC relief for Muslim cleric Tauqeer Raza Khan

New Delhi, Apr 11 (PTI):

In a relief to prominent Muslim cleric, Maulana Tauqeer Raza Khan, the Supreme Court has granted an interim stay on the execution of the non-bailable warrant issued against him in the 2010 Bareilly communal riots case.

On March 2, 2010, riots had broken out in the Uttar Pradesh town over a religious procession route. Many were injured and shops and vehicles burned and attacked.

"Issue notice limited to the impugned order having been passed without assigning any reason. In the meanwhile, there shall be stay of operation of the impugned order," a bench of Justices MM Sundresh



and SVN Bhatti ordered after taking note of the submissions made by lawyer Asad Alvi, appearing for the cleric.

The top court was hearing an appeal filed by the cleric against the March 19 order of the Allahabad High Court. The high court had refused to grant

any "indulgence" for the time being to Tauqeer Raza Khan over the warrant.

"So far as a non-bailable warrant against the revisionist (the cleric) is concerned, I am not inclined to grant any indulgence to the revisionist at this stage.

"However, keeping in view the ensuing Holi vacations, the revisionist is directed to appear before the learned trial court on or before March 27, 2024 and apply for bail and his bail application shall be disposed of strictly in accordance with law. It need not be impressed that a non-bailable warrant shall not be executed against him by March 27, 2024 only with a view to give him an opportunity to appear before the court below," the single judge HC bench of Justice Ram Manohar Narayan Mishra had ordered.

The top court took note of the submissions of Alvi that the high court had passed the order without assigning reasons and granted the interim stay.

India, US to reactivate observation system for Indian Ocean

New Delhi, Apr 11 (PTI): India and the US have decided to reactivate the Indian Ocean Observing System (IndOOS), a network of 36 moored buoys in the high seas to collect high-resolution ocean and atmospheric data for weather forecasts.

The IndOOS array of buoys fell into neglect and disrepair during the years of the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to gaps in observational data considered crucial by weather forecasters, particularly since the links between the Indian Ocean Dipole phenomenon and monsoon were established.

The reactivation of IndOOS was discussed last month during a meeting of Earth Sciences Secretary M Ravichandran with Rick Spinrad, Administrator of National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) of the US.

The moored buoys are part of the Research Moored Array for African-Asian-Australian Monsoon Analysis and Prediction (RAMA) programme that was born out of a collaboration between the Ministry of Earth Sciences and NOAA in 2008.

'Still associated with socialist ideology'

Ballia (UP), Apr 11 (PTI):

Former prime minister Chandra Shekhar's son Neeraj Shekhar, who has been fielded by the BJP from Ballia in Uttar Pradesh in the upcoming Lok Sabha polls, on Thursday said he is still associated with the socialist ideology and slammed the Samajwadi Party (SP) for allegedly doing away with the ideas of Ram Manohar Lohia.

"The socialist ideology should not be linked with the SP. I am still personally associated with the socialist ideology," Neeraj Shekhar told PTI over the phone.

The assertion by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) candidate assumes significance as his late father was a proponent of the socialist ideology and a vocal critic of the saffron

party. Chandra Shekhar's entire family is currently in the BJP. His elder son Pankaj Shekhar as well as younger son Neeraj Shekhar are in the saffron party while his grandson Ravi Shankar Singh Pappu is a BJP member in the Uttar Pradesh Legislative Council. Neeraj Shekhar, who has

been an SP MP from Ballia in the past, said a wrong perception is being created about the socialist ideology.

"The SP claims to be associated with the socialist ideology, but it has actually abandoned it. Dr Ram Manohar Lohia had raised the slogan of breaking caste barriers, whereas the SP today is hoisting the flag of a caste census," he said.

In its Lok Sabha polls manifesto released by party president Akhilesh Yadav on Wednesday, the SP has promised that a caste census will be conducted by 2025 if it comes to power.

Neeraj Shekhar, who lost the 2014 Lok Sabha poll contest from Ballia to the BJP's Bharat Singh, was denied a ticket by the SP in the general election five years later.

Northwest India braces for rains, storms this weekend

New Delhi, Apr 11 (PTI):

A spell of moderate rainfall is expected over the mountains and the plains of northwest India this weekend due to two back-to-back western disturbances and high moisture incursion from the Arabian Sea, the India Meteorological Department said on Thursday.

States and Union territories, including Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, and northwest Uttar Pradesh,

could also experience thunderstorms, lightning strikes, hailstorms, and gusty winds between April 13 and 15.

"An intense western disturbance as a cyclonic circulation lies over west Iran in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies, and another one in middle tropospheric westerlies runs along longitude 72 degrees east to the north of latitude 32 degrees north. High moisture feeding from the Arabian Sea into northwest India is likely during April 13-15," the IMD said in a statement.

India-born researcher led NASA's sounding rockets mission

During solar eclipse

Mumbai, Apr 11 (PTI):

NASA's mission that launched sounding rockets during the recent total solar eclipse was led by Aroh Barjatya, an India-born researcher who studied in cities across the country before moving to the United States, his family said. The US space agency on April 8 launched three sounding rockets during the solar eclipse - visible in North America - to study how Earth's upper atmosphere is affected when

sunlight momentarily dims over a portion of the planet. "The mission was led by Aroh Barjatya, a professor of engineering physics at Embury-Riddle Aeronautical University in Florida, where he directs the Space and Atmospheric Instrumentation Lab," NASA said in a statement.

The Atmospheric Perturbations around Eclipse Path (APEP) sounding rockets were launched from the agency's Wallops Flight Facility in Virginia.
