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IAF completes 40 yrs of flying

In ruthless terrain of Siachen

New Delhi, Apr 13 (PTI): The IAF on Saturday recalled its contribution in 'Operation Meghdoot' 40 years ago when its tactical and strategic air-lifters and key helicopters had ferried men and material to "dizzying heights" in Siachen, the world's highest battlefield. The Indian Army marked four decades of its presence on the strategically-significant Siachen glacier. Operation Meghdoot was launched on

April 13, 1984, when the Indian Army and Indian Air Force had advanced to the Siachen glacier to secure the heights dominating the northern Ladakh region, officials said. Playing an "irreplaceable role" in this effort, IAF's tactical and strategic airlifters, AN-12s, AN-32s and IL-76s transported stores and troops and air-dropped supplies to high altitude airfields, from where Mi-17, Mi-8, Chetak and Cheetah helicopters "ferried men and material to dizzying heights on the glacier, far above the limits set by the helicopter manufacturers," a senior official said.

'Corruption increases when Cong comes to power'

Dantewada, Apr 13:

Union minister Rajnath Singh on Saturday said corruption increases every time the Congress comes to power whereas there was not a single allegation of irregularity against the Narendra Modi government in its 10-year rule.

Addressing a rally in Geedam in Dantewada district, the Defence minister said the Congress would be finished in the state after the Lok Sabha polls and the party would be extinct like dinosaurs in the next few years.

"Corruption increases whenever the Congress comes to power. Since Independence, the party has faced charges of corruption. However, no one can point a finger or level a single corruption charge at the Narendra Modi government," Singh said. The

Iran seizes Israel-linked ship off UAE coast

Dubai, Apr 13 (AP):

17 Indians on ship

Of the 25 crew members aboard the container ship seized by Iran's Revolutionary Guards off the UAE coast on Saturday, 17 are Indian, sources have said. The container ship, MCS Aries, was seized near the Strait of Hormuz by carrying out a "heliborne operation", and it is now headed towards the territorial waters of Iran, the country's state-owned IRNA news agency reported. A source said, "We are aware that Iran has taken control of a cargo ship 'MSC Aries'."

Iranian retaliation over a suspected Israeli strike earlier this month on an Iranian consular building in Syria that killed 12

people, including a senior Guard general who once commanded its expeditionary Quds Force there.

The Israeli war on Hamas in the Gaza Strip meanwhile is now 6 months old and is inflaming decades-old tensions across the whole region. With Iranian-backed forces like Hezbollah in Lebanon and Yemen's Houthi rebels also involved in the fighting, any new attack in the Mideast threatens to escalate that conflict into a wider regional war.

NIA charges two accused

Mohd Nur Hasan and Minlun identified as key conspirator

New Delhi, Apr 13 (PTI):

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a charge sheet against two accused, including the key conspirator, in last year's Manipur car bomb blast case in which three people were

injured, an official statement issued on Saturday said. The agency filed the charge sheet before a special NIA court in Manipur's Bishnupur on Friday, it said.

The explosion, triggered by a bomb planted in a Mahindra Scorpio, took place on a bridge adjoining Phougakchao Ikhai Awang Leikai and Kwakta area, along Tiddim road (NH-02), in Kwakta ward

no. 07 (KMC), Bishnupur on June 21, 2023. Three people were injured in the blast which damaged the bridge, an electric pole, electrical assets and surrounding houses.

Mohammed Noor Hussain alias Tomba alias Mohammed Nur Hasan and Seiminlun Gangle alias Minlun, who was identified as the key conspirator, were arrested in connection with the blast.

'Terrorists don't play by rules, so response can't have rules'

Pune, Apr 13 (PTI):



External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has said that India was committed to respond to any act of terrorism perpetrated from across the borders, and asserted that since terrorists do not play by rules, there cannot be any rules in the country's answer to them.

Attacking the United Progressive Alliance (UPA) dispensation over its response to the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks in 2008, he said that after a lot of deliberation

Bharat Matters: Opportunity for youth and participation in global scenario' here, he asked that if a similar attack happens now and one does not react to it, how can the next such attacks be prevented.

Jaishankar also said that the country's foreign policy has undergone a change since 2014 and it is the way terrorism is dealt with.

When asked about countries with which India finds it challenging to maintain relationships, Jaishankar said India should question

whether it should maintain any relationship with certain countries.

"Well, one is just next to us. Let us be honest, the one country that is very, very difficult is Pakistan, and for that, we should only introspect why. One reason for this is us," he said.

He added that had India been clear from the start that Pakistan was indulging in terrorism, which India should not tolerate under any circumstances, the country would have had a vastly different policy.

'Remove drinks, beverages from 'health drinks' category'

New Delhi, Apr 13 (PTI):

The government has asked all the e-commerce companies to remove drinks and beverages, including Bournvita, from the health drinks category from their portals. "National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), a statutory body constituted under section (3) of the Commission of Protection of Child Rights (CPCR) Act 2005 after its inquiry under Section 14 of CRPC Act 2005 concluded that there is no 'health drink' defined under FSS Act 2006, rules and regulations submitted by FSSAI and Mondelez India Food Pvt Ltd," the Commerce and Industry Ministry said in an advisory to all e-commerce companies.

BJP to release its poll manifesto today

New Delhi, Apr 13 (PTI):

The BJP will release its manifesto -Sankalp Patra - for the Lok Sabha polls on Sunday, with its planks of welfare and development besides a roadmap for 'viksit Bharat' expected to figure prominently in its election agenda.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other senior leaders of the party are expected to attend the unveiling of the manifesto at the party head-

quarters that coincides with the birth anniversary of B R Ambedkar, a towering leader from the Dalit community and an architect of the Indian Constitution. As the BJP government has fulfilled most of its core ideological promises, including the construction of the Ram temple in Ayodhya and the repeal of Article 370, all eyes will be on how the ruling party's larger cultural and Hindutva agenda figures in the manifesto.



BJP's '400 paar' claim creating doubts: Kanhaiya

- Among people about democratic process, EVMs

Bilaspur, Apr 13 (PTI):



The BJP's claim that it will win more than 400 seats in the Lok Sabha polls has created doubts among people on the country's democratic process and electronic voting machines, Congress leader Kanhaiya Kumar said on Saturday.

In order to protect the Constitution, which the BJP wants to change in order to snatch fundamental rights of people, there was need to transform the 2024 Lok Sabha polls into a mass movement, he added.

Kumar was addressing a rally in Bhadaura village in Chhattisgarh for his party's Bilaspur Lok Sabha candidate Devendra Yadav.

"How does he (Prime Minister Narendra Modi) know his party will get 400 seats in the Lok Sabha elections. Is he an astrologer? Such acts raise doubts on the democratic process," Kumar claimed, adding he had met several people during the Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra who said they had voted for the Congress but saw the "lotus bloom in their areas".

"People are asking

whether the EVM machine is fine or not. They are questioning the credibility of the EVMs," Kumar claimed.

On one hand the BJP is seeking votes and on the other it proclaims it will win more than 400 seats, Kumar said.

"It seems as if they are not asking for votes but are threatening us (the general public). It is arrogance of power and an insult to the country's citizens," he claimed.

The way General Dyer was thrown out by freedom fighters, "general kayar (coward) can also be driven out", Kumar said without taking names.

He was referring to Brigadier General Reginald Dyer who ordered his troops to open fire at a gathering in Jallianwala Bagh in Amritsar on April 13, 1919.

It resulted in the deaths of several hundred persons, and the incident sent shockwaves across the world.



Hyderabad, Apr 13 (PTI):

Rejecting BJP Hyderabad Lok Sabha candidate K Madhavi Latha's allegation of about six lakh bogus votes in the constituency, AIMIM president Asaduddin Owaisi on Saturday said the Election Commission takes care of the issue of voters' lists. He was responding to a query from scribes about Madhavi Latha's charge that Owaisi wins with the help of the six lakh bogus votes. The allegation amounts to "abusing" the Election Commission, he added.

Asked about the reported comments of a Congress leader in Hyderabad that he has to be friends with the AIMIM, Owaisi said his party does not have any alliance with any party in

Telangana for the Lok Sabha elections. His party has formed PDM in Uttar Pradesh and his colleague MP in Maharashtra Intiaz Jaleel is holding talks on the issue in the western state.

To a query on the Centre's advisory to Indians not to travel to Iran or Israel till further notice, Owaisi pointed out that the union government had signed an agreement with Israel as per which 6,000 Indian workers had gone to that country. "After sending 6,000 Indian citizens into the jaws

of death, you issue an advisory. What type of humanity is this by the Narendra Modi government?" he asked.

He demanded that the government immediately call back those 6,000 Indian citizens. Lashing out at the Israeli government, Owaisi said it was committing a "genocide" against Palestinians.

Asked about the BJP candidate's alleged comments about his attire, he claimed that there is hate against his food, beard, 'hijab' and existence. "But, the people of Hyderabad would not make hate successful. (They will) make love successful."

Responding to External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar's reported comments that China has not occupied any Indian land, he said on X social media platform that SP of Leh had earlier stated that our soldiers are unable to go to 26 of the 65 patrolling points in Ladakh.

In the old course, the first paper is Algebra and the second paper is Calculus, whereas in the new course, the first paper is Calculus and the second paper is Algebra. Probably due to this similarity, the error is likely to have occurred during the printing of question papers. Dr Patel further clarified that the packets of question papers received from the printing press are not opened in the University. These are sent directly to the examination centres. Therefore, the examination department of the university did not realize the error in the question paper.

According to Dr Patel, as soon as the question papers were distributed to the candidates in the examination halls this morning, the error came to notice and was brought to the knowledge of the examination center coordinators. The coordinators in turn informed the university administration. It being a holiday, Dr Aruna Palta, the Vice Chancellor, discussed the situation with the officials online and thereafter gave instructions to postpone the examination of B Sc/B Sc B Ed first year new course. The old course examination was conducted as usual.

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Gopi Thotakura to become 1st Indian space tourist

Washington, Apr 13 (PTI):

Gopi Thotakura, an entrepreneur and a pilot, is set to become the first Indian to venture into space as a tourist on Amazon founder Jeff Bezos's Blue Origin's NS-25 mission.

Thotakura was selected as one of the six crew members for the mission, making him the first Indian space tourist and the second Indian to venture into space after the Indian Army's Wing Commander Rakesh Sharma in 1984.

The flight date is yet to be announced, the aerospace company said.

This mission will be the seventh human flight for the New Shepard programme and the 25th in its history. To date, the programme has flown 31 hu-

mans above the Karman line, the proposed conventional boundary between Earth's atmosphere and outer space.

New Shepard is a fully reusable sub-orbital launch vehicle developed for space tourism by Blue Origin.

According to Blue Origin, "Gopi is a pilot and

aviator who learned how to fly before he could drive." He is the co-founder of Preserve Life Corp, a global centre for holistic wellness and applied health located near Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport. In addition to flying jets commercially, he pilots bush, aerobatic, and

seaplanes, as well as gliders and hot air balloons, and has served as an international medical jet pilot.

A lifelong traveller, his most recent adventure took him to the summit of Mt Kilimanjaro in Tanzania.

Andhra Pradesh-born Thotakura is a graduate of Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University.

Other crew members of the flight include Mason Angel, Sylvain Chiron, Kenneth L. Hess, Carol Schaller, and former Air Force Captain Ed Dwight, who was selected by President John F Kennedy in 1961 as the nation's first Black astronaut candidate but was never granted the opportunity to fly to space.

During the flight, each astronaut will carry a postcard to space on behalf of Blue Origin's founda-

tion, Club for the Future.

This programme gives students access to space on Blue Origin's rockets, including an all-digital method to create and send postcards. The Club's mission is to inspire and mobilise future generations to pursue careers in STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics) for the benefit of Earth.

From an environmental standpoint, nearly 99 per cent of New Shepard's dry mass is reused, including the booster, capsule, engine, landing gear, and parachutes.

New Shepard's engine is fuelled by highly efficient liquid oxygen and hydrogen. During the flight, the only byproduct is water vapour with no carbon emissions, the company said.

Iran's Revolutionary Guard seizes a container ship near Strait of Hormuz

Dubai, Apr 13 (AP):

Commandos from Iran's paramilitary Revolutionary Guard rappelled down from a helicopter onto an Israeli-affiliated container ship near the Strait of Hormuz and seized the vessel Saturday, the latest in a series of attacks between the two countries.

Iran's state-run IRNA said a special forces unit of the Guard's navy carried out the attack on the vessel, which other media in the country widely identified as the Portuguese-flagged MSC Aries, a container ship associated with London-based Zodiac Maritime.


Charting a Path to Peace for Ukraine

India's IndiGo airline has become the world's third largest airline with a market capitalization of Rs.1.47 lakh crore, overtaking USA's Southwest Airlines. Now USA's Delta Airline is in first place in the world with a market capitalization of Rs.2.53 lakh crore, while Ireland's Ryan Air Holding airline is in second place with a market capitalization of Rs.2.16 lakh crore.

IndiGo Airlines is ranked fourth in the world with a market capitalization of Rs.1.47 lakh crore, while Southwest Airlines is ranked fifth with a market capitalization of Rs.1.44 lakh crore, Air China is ranked sixth with a market capitalization of Rs.1.21 lakh crore, Singapore Airlines and United Airlines are ranked seventh with a market capitalization of Rs.1.19 lakh crore respectively and Turkish Airlines is ranked eighth with a market capitalization of Rs.1.09 lakh crore.

According to the updated data of the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), IndiGo airline has a share of 60.2 percent in India's aviation sector in terms of number of passengers, while Air India is in second place, with a share of 12.2 percent. Vistara's stake is 9.9 percent and Air Asia's stake is 6.1 percent. The total share of airlines flying under the Tata group is 28.2 percent. Among other airlines, SpiceJet's stake is 5.6 percent, Akasa Airlines' stake is 4.5 percent and other airlines' stake is 1.5 percent.

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In the month of March last year, IndiGo was ranked 14th in the list of world's airlines based on market capitalization, but IndiGo overtook United Airlines in terms of market capitalization in December 2023, then Air China Airlines in January 2024 & left Singapore Airlines behind in February 2024.

IndiGo Airline's shares have increased by 50 percent in the last 6 months, while in the last one year its shares have given a return of 102.55 percent to investors. At the same time, last month its shares gave a return of 18.25 percent to the investors. Since January 1 this year, its shares have given a return of 27.78 percent to investors.

IndiGo Airlines had announced the results for the December quarter of the financial year 2023-24 on February 2, 2024, according to which IndiGo's net profit increased by 110.7 percent year-on-year to Rs.2,998 crore, compared to Rs.1,422.6 crore in the same quarter last year. Not only this, but IndiGo had also registered a net profit of Rs.188.9 crore in the second quarter. For the first time in the last 5 years, an Indian aviation company has registered profit in the second quarter of any financial year, as the second quarter is considered a season of weak demand for the aviation industry.

Indian airline IndiGo becoming the third largest airline in the world in terms of market capitalization can be a matter of joy and pride. This can also be a matter of

happiness for the investors investing in the stock market, because investors have earned a lot of money by investing in its shares, but this cannot be a moment of pride for the needy passengers, because even today, the number of needy passengers is high among the passengers traveling by air. For leisure travellers the cost of air tickets may not matter, but for those traveling to treat a sick person or to contribute to a job, attend an important meeting, etc. The increase in ticket prices has become a cause of difficulty.

An analysis by travel website Ixigo showed that fares on some airlines have climbed as much as 39 per cent in the period from April 1 to 7 compared to the period from March 1 to 7. During this period, one-way fares for flights between Delhi and Bangalore have increased by 39 percent, while airfares from Delhi to Srinagar have increased by 30 percent. At the same time, there has been an increase of 12 percent in the airfare between Delhi and Mumbai and an increase of 8 percent in the airfare between Mumbai and Delhi. Only 1 IndiGo flight flies per day between Patna to Ahmedabad and Ahmedabad to Patna, whose fare in the month of April had reached the level of more than Rs.22,000, which is usually between Rs.6,500 to Rs.8,000. However, other airlines with 1 or 2 stops have fares below Rs.10,000.

IndiGo Airlines, the country's largest airline, has a fleet of more than 320 aircraft, which makes more than 1900 trips every day to domestic and international cities. However, IndiGo had a grounded fleet of 74 aircraft in December 2023. At the same time, 90 aircraft of Go First, SpiceJet, Air India and Vistara were standing on the ground. According to experts, more than 200 aircraft will be grounded in the next few months, whose number was 164 by

December 2023.

In the year 2024, 150 new aircraft have been added to the fleet for domestic flights, which is 34 percent more than the new aircraft added last year. Nevertheless, this number is unable to meet domestic demands. The number of domestic passengers is increasing by 24 percent on year-on-year basis. In the year 2023, the total number of domestic passengers has increased to more than 15.2 crores.

This year the aviation industry is facing many challenges in increasing capacity in line with the demand. It is even using larger aircraft on domestic routes. Despite this, there remains a huge gap between demand and supply. Apart from IndiGo, due to frequent cancellation of flights of other airlines and strong passenger demand, air fares have already increased by 20 to 25 percent.

Passengers have to pay more for air tickets for domestic flights in summer. Right now, the prices of tickets of all the airlines going towards the hill stations are skyrocketing. Air ticket prices are expected to increase further during summer vacations. However, air ticket prices in India were much cheaper in the world 18 to 24 months ago.

According to Honourable Civil Aviation and Steel Minister Shri Jyotiraditya Scindia, the price of air ticket is decided on the basis of demand and supply. Though the Parliamentary Standing Committee, which works under the Aviation Ministry and makes recommendations to control the price of air tickets, has also stressed on stopping the increase in air ticket prices during holidays and festivals. Despite this, there is no possibility of reduction in the price of air tickets soon, because today many aircraft are standing on the ground and due to operational issues, the operation of the aircraft is also being cancelled.

Indigo Airlines, the country's largest airline, has a fleet of more than 320 aircraft, which makes more than 1900 trips every day to domestic and international cities. However, IndiGo had a grounded fleet of 74 aircraft in December 2023. At the same time, 90 aircraft of Go First, SpiceJet, Air India and Vistara were standing on the ground. According to experts, more than 200 aircraft will be grounded in the next few months, whose number was 164 by

Jalianwala Bagh – An Immortal History of Indian Freedom Movement

In 1919 a Committee chaired by a British judge, Sir Sidney Rowlatt, recommended the Anarchical and Revolutionary Crimes Act. In March 1919 the British Legislature passed the Act, which was commonly called the "Rowlatt Act" after the name of the chairperson of the committee recommending the legislation. The Act empowered the British Government to arrest anyone suspected of revolutionary movement that was termed as terrorist activities and to detain the persons arrested for up to two years without trial. The Act also authorised the police to search without a warrant. Further, the Act placed severe restrictions on the freedom of press. In other words, the Rowlatt Act provided the British Government enormous powers to

repress political activities and movement for freedom of India from British colonisation.

The repressive Rowlatt Act was resisted by the Indians. Mahatma Gandhi led a nationwide satyagraha movement opposing the Act. Rallies were organised in various cities to protest against the Act. Workers went on strikes in railway workshops to demonstrate their solidarity in this protest. Shops were closed as mark of protest against this Act.

Two nationalist leaders of Punjab, Dr. Satya Pal and Dr. Saifuddin Kitchlew, who stood firmly for the principles of freedom, non-violence and religious unity, gave call for a general strike and urged the people to carry out Satyagraha against the Rowlatt Act. It was this call that led to their arrest on 10th April, 1919.

On 13th April, 1919, around

twenty-five thousand unarmed people consisting of men, women and children of different caste and religion assembled at Jalianwala Bagh to protest against the tyrannical Rowlatt Act and arrest of two nationalist leaders, Dr. Satya Pal and Dr. Saifuddin Kitchlew. Jalianwala Bagh, a garden near Harmandir Sahib in Amritsar within the Indian province of Punjab, sprawled over six to seven-acre area, with a huge open area, and surrounded on three sides by ten-foot-tall walls and dwellings. Jalianwala Bagh had exit only on one side since it was surrounded by buildings on the other three sides.

Suddenly, a British military officer, Brigadier General Reginald Dyer entered Jalianwala Bagh with his troops. He ordered his troops to carefully guard the only entry-exit gate of Jalianwala

Bagh to prevent anyone from leaving the place. Without warning the people to evacuate, he instructed his troops to fire, which lasted for about ten minutes and continued till the ammunition was exhausted. Brigadier Dyer ordered his soldiers to fire at the densest portions of the crowd in front of Jalianwala Bagh's guarded exit through which the anxious people were trying to leave. The firing and the consequent stampede resulted in death of several thousand people and many more injured.

This barbaric incident shocked Rabindranath Tagore, the Nobel Laureate, to such an extent that he renounced his knighthood and many other patriotic Indians reacted strongly. The brutal massacre at Jalianwala Bagh inspired countless immortal revolutionaries like Udhamp Singh, Bhagat Singh to fight for the freedom of

Sober pilots needed

Globally, pilots are expected not to consume spirits eight hours within or before flying. Some countries do have a twelve-hour restriction. India's Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), the aviation regulator, is doing a reasonable job though surprise checks are the need of the hour. Recently, an Air India pilot failed the mandatory breath analyser test before she was to operate a domestic flight. Last month, Air India terminated a pilot who was found drunk after flying an international flight. The aviation regulator is strictly invoking the Civil Aviation Requirement rules. It is worthwhile to mention that if the pilots fail their mandatory test for the first, second and third time, their licences are suspended for three months, three years and for life respectively. In the first half of 2023, as many as 33 pilots and 97 cabin crew failed the breath analyser test. As alcohol interferes with the psychosomatic functioning of a person, drunk pilots are big threats to hundreds of lives.

India biz helps TCS post 9 pc jump in Q4 net profit

Mumbai, Apr 13 (PTI):

IT services major TCS on Friday reported a 9 per cent growth in net profit at Rs 12,434 crore in January-March quarter of FY24 due to strong domestic business even as the company struggled in its key markets overseas.

In the entire fiscal year, the Tata Group company's net profit surged 9 per cent to Rs 45,908 crore, while the revenue went up to Rs 2,40,893 crore from Rs 2,25,458 crore a year ago.

The company said its overall workforce declined by over 13,000 during the last 12 months and now stands at 6,01,546.

North America, the biggest market by geography, reported a 2.3 per cent dip in revenues, while continental Europe, the third biggest, witnessed a 2 per cent decline in revenues during the latest January-March period. However, its domestic business, which saw nearly 38 per cent growth in revenues, helped

ance, but exuded confidence

that things are bottoming out and growth should return.

"It is difficult to say when growth will return... but FY25 will be better than FY24," Krishivasan said, adding that though he is not disappointed with the performance, an additional

growth of up to 1 percentage point would have made him happier. Company's chief operating officer N G Subramanian, who is retiring soon, explained that discretionary spends have been impacted at client ends, hitting revenues, while the spending on non-discretionary part continues.

Pak has highest living cost in all of Asia with a 25 per cent inflation rate: ADB

Islamabad, Apr 13 (PTI):

Pakistan has the highest living cost in all of Asia with a 25 per cent inflation rate and its economy may grow at the fourth lowest pace of 1.9 per cent in the region, according to a new Asian Development Bank (ADB) report. The report was released on Thursday in Manila.

The Express Tribune reported that the Asian Development Outlook also painted a gloomy picture for the next fiscal year as well, projecting a 15 per cent inflation rate for the next fiscal year -- again the highest among 46 countries and a 2.8 per cent growth rate -- the fifth lowest for FY 2024-25.

The Manila-based lending agency stated that the inflation rate in Pakistan is expected to be 25 per cent in the

current fiscal year -- the highest in all of Asia. This makes Pakistan the most expensive nation in Asia. Earlier, the cost of living in Pakistan used to be the highest in South Asia. The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) and federal government had set the inflation target at 21 per cent for this fiscal year but they are going to miss it despite inflicting huge losses in the shape of a 22 per cent interest rate. The ADB said during the current fiscal year, the country's economic growth rate might remain at 1.9 per cent -- the fourth lowest after Myanmar, Azerbaijan and Nauru.

Pakistan is in a stagflation phase for a prolonged period and the World Bank too said last week that another 10 million more people might fall into the poverty trap because of any adverse shocks. The Manila-based lending agency stated that the inflation rate in Pakistan is expected to be 25 per cent in the

About 98 million people are already living a poor life in Pakistan. In the past, the ADB gave a rather optimistic economic scenario close to Pakistan's official forecasts. However, the latest ADB report stated that Pakistan would continue to face challenges from substantial new external financing requirements and the rollover of old debt, exacerbated by tight global monetary conditions.

The Manila-based lender said political uncertainty that affected macroeconomic policymaking would remain a key risk to the sustainability of stabilisation and reform efforts. It said with Pakistan's large external financing requirements and weak external buffers, disbursement from multilateral and bilateral partners remained crucial.

Amended India-Mauritius tax treaty protocol yet to be ratified, notified: IT dept

New Delhi, Apr 13 (PTI):

The Income Tax Department on Friday said the amended India-Mauritius protocol on double taxation avoidance agreement is yet to be ratified and notified by the department.

India and Mauritius on March 7, 2024, signed an amendment to the DTAA and included a principal purpose test (PPT) in the pact which aims to curtail tax avoidance by ensuring that treaty benefits are only granted for transactions with a bona fide purpose.

Historically, Mauritius has been a preferred jurisdiction for engaging in investments in India due to the non-taxability of capital gains from the sale of shares in Indian companies until 2016. "As and when the Protocol comes into force, queries, if any, will be addressed, wherever necessary," the I-T department said.

Only Indian nationals or entities should be eligible to participate in telecom regulatory sandboxes that can provide real-time but regulated access to networks and customer resources during product or technology tests, sector regulator Trai recommended on Friday.

The Telecommunications Act, 2023, has introduced the provision of setting up multiple regulatory sandboxes.

The regulatory sandbox (RS) will emphasise on testing of new products, services, processes, and business models in a live testing environment on a limited set of users for a specified period of time after obtaining certain regulatory relaxations. The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (Trai) recommended

that the Department of Telecom shall put in place an end-to-end digital process to handle RS applications and all related activities, including intimations, approvals, sharing of information, monitoring, reporting requirements etc.

"Only Indian nationals or entities will be eligible," Trai said in its recommendation on "Encouraging Innovative Technologies, Services, Use Cases, and Business Models through Regulatory Sandbox in Digital Communication Sector". The regulator has recommended a non-refundable processing fee of Rs 10,000 for the applications. During the testing period, the applicants will need to demonstrate in application ways to prioritise the protection of consumer interests and prevent any harm to consumers.

Govt asks all gas-based plants to be operational from May 1 to June 30

As electricity demand surges

New Delhi, Apr 13 (PTI):

The government has directed all gas-based power generating stations to operationalise their plants from May 1 to June 30 in view of rise in electricity demand due to a likely prolonged heat wave this summer.

A significant portion of Gas-Based Generating Stations (GBSS) is currently unutilized, primarily due to commercial considerations.

The ministry has projected 260 GW peak power demand this summer (April to June 2024). Peak power demand had



touched an all-time high of 243 GW in September last year. To ensure maximum power generation from Gas-Based Generating Stations, the government has issued directions to all Gas-Based Generating Stations under Section 11 of the Electricity Act, 2003, under which the appropriate government may specify

that a generating company shall, in extraordinary circumstances operate and maintain any generating station in accordance with the directions of that government," the statement said. The order under Section 11, which is on similar lines as done for imported coal-based power plants, aims to optimise the availability of power from GBSS during the ensuing high demand period.

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MS Dhoni in spotlight as CSK and MI resume rivalry in new era

Mumbai, Apr 13 (PTD):

The legendary Mahendra Singh Dhoni will be in the spotlight in what could be his final game at the iconic Wankhede Stadium when defending champions Chennai Super Kings take on Mumbai Indians in the Indian Premier League here on Sunday.

Dhoni returns to the hallowed turf of Wankhede for the first time ever as a non-captain of the CSK, potentially in his last IPL season. It will also be his first appearance as just a player for any team since November 2005.

Even at 42, Dhoni's glove-work remains impeccable and so does his assessment of the game like always. But CSK will hope that his tactical acumen also helps them improve a dismal away record this season, having suffered two defeats on the road.

CSK would also hope their recent record against MI — four wins in last five matches including their seven-wicket win here last



season — holds them in good stead.

Two of IPL's most successful teams with five titles each, both sides are witnessing a tectonic shift of leadership change with Hardik Pandya taking over the mantle from Rohit Sharma at MI and Ruturaj Gaikwad succeeding Dhoni at CSK, but there is nothing that suggests their intense rivalry would expect any such shift.

Pandya's MI have found their footing after a jittery start. Their batters have done well in the last two

outings and Suryakumar Yadav's 17-ball fifty against RCB provides an ominous sign to CSK bowlers, who have shown mastery on slow, turning pitches at the Chepauk but remain untested on flat, batting-friendly surfaces.

Ishan Kishan (161 runs) and Rohit's opening stand would thus be crucial in the scheme of things but CSK would also have a lot of assurance with their own batting.

Kolkata, Apr 13 (PTD):

Two-time champions Kolkata Knight Riders will seek home comfort in their bid to return to winning ways when they face a depleted Lucknow Super Giants in an Indian Premier League match here on Sunday.

The match will be KKR's first of the five matches at home on the trot and the Gautam Gambhir-mentored side will be fully aware this can prove decisive to clinch the play-off spot for the first time since 2021.

In the points tally, nothing separates the two teams, both of whom have secured three wins each, and lost their respective last-round matches. KKR's over-reliance on their Caribbean ageing duo of Sunil Narine and Andre Russell was exposed by defending champions Chennai Super Kings when they lost by seven wickets in their previous outing.

Narine (27) and Russell (10) failed with the bat and the team, who had posted

two 200-plus scores from three matches on the back of the Caribbean duo's blazing form, could manage an under par 137/9 at Chennai. That sums up KKR's batting that has relied on some odd fireworks and missed an anchor in the absence of Nitish Rana (finger injury), who is slated to sit out of another match. In the spotlight since the beginning of the

season, KKR captain Shreyas Iyer has failed to impress and his scores give an abysmal picture — 0, 39 not out, 18 and 34. While KKR will be overwhelming favourites at Eden, LSG with their unassuming approach will not give up easily, even as they will miss their pace sensation Mayank Yadav for a second successive match. Recovering from a

side strain that ruled him out of their match against Gujarat Titans, Mayank is doing "good" but skipper KL Rahul has said that he may take "a couple of more games before coming back". Mayank's replacement Arshad Khan failed to impress, conceding at 10.73 runs over as they failed to defend 167 at home against DC last evening.

Nine years after he won the last of his two titles at the clay-court tournament, the top-ranked Serb secured a spot in the last four with a 7-5, 6-4 win over Alex De Minaur on Friday.

"I am very happy to be back in the semis. It has been a while," Djokovic said. "The past seven, eight years have been tough for me to win seven or eight matches consecutively, but here we are, another semis."

Djokovic struggled with consistency at the Country Club against his Australian rival and dropped his serve three times. But De Minaur, who made Djokovic work and run a lot with his solid baseline game, had even more trouble with his serve. Djokovic broke De Minaur five times to move into a record-breaking 77th Masters 1000 semifinal. At 36, Djokovic is the oldest semifinalist in the tournament's Open era, which began in 1968.

De Minaur could not hold his nerve when it mattered the most. He hit five unforced errors when Djokovic broke to seal the opening set and could not withstand the pressure applied by the 24-time Grand Slam champion in the 10th game of the second set. "It was tough and very tiring, I suffered a lot on the court," Djokovic said. "This is what you get on this slow surface with a lot of rallies."

Indians still in hunt at Candidates Chess

Indian Grandmasters R Praggnanandhaa and D Gukesh would look to bridge the gap with leader Ian Nepomniachtchi of Russia when they restart their campaigns in the eighth round of the Candidates chess tournament here.

Teen sensation Praggnanandhaa will be up against Frenchman Firouza Alireza, while Gukesh will take on compatriot Vidit Gujrathi when the tournament resumes on Saturday.

While all three Indians have had a decent outing in the open section so far, it is defending champion Nepomniachtchi who is in prime position to complete a hat-trick of titles at the halfway stage.

With 4.5 points to his credit, Nepomniachtchi would be happy with his performance and stands as the favourite with half point more than nearest rivals Praggnanandhaa, Gukesh and top seed Fabiano Caruana of Azerbaijan.

It has been a story of less hits and more misses for the Indian trio.
