Latehar: Security forces recovered and defused improvised explosive devices (IEDs) kept in eight cans in a forest in Jharkhand's Latehar district on Monday, police said. Kolkata: Amid the controversy surrounding a student's alleged violation of the dress code during the birth anniversary celebration of BR Ambedkar at Visva Bharati University in Santiniketan, the central varsity on Monday issued a statement expressing regret over the incident and assured that such deviations will not occur in future. The incident, which involved a student wearing shirt-trouser attire instead of the prescribed white robes at the function held in Lipika auditorium within the campus, prompted an apology from the officiating vice-chancellor, Sanjoy Kumar Mallik.

Phulbani: At least 25 people, including eight women, were injured in separate road accidents in Odisha's Kandhamal district, officials said on Monday. However, there was no report of any death, they said. A bus and a truck collided head-on at Ranipathar ghat, about 25 km from here, injuring 20 passengers, the officials said.

Seize

Hyderabad: Law enforcement agencies have seized cash, gold, liquor, and articles meant for distribution as freebies totalling over Rs 126 crore, till April 14 as part of implementing the Model Code of Conduct for the Lok Sabha elections in Telangana, elections officials said on Monday.

Jailed

Thane: A court in Navi Mumbai on Monday convicted eight Bangladeshi women for illegal stay in India and sentenced them to 25 months of rigorous imprisonment (RI). Additional Sessions Judge KR Deshpande at Belapur also imposed a fine of Rs 11,000 each on them. The Bangladeshi women, who worked as labourers, were arrested in December 2022 from Turbhe in Navi Mumbai for staying without valid documents, according to police.

'No one needs to be scared'

New Delhi, Apr 15:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi dismissed allegations that the Bharatiya Janata Party would try to change the Indian Constitution if it secured more than 400 seats in the Lok Sabha, urging Opposition parties to stop fearmongering about the party's agenda.

"When I say that I have big plans, no one should be scared. I don't take decisions to scare or run-over anyone, I take decisions for the wholesome development of the country," PM Modi said during an interview with news agency.

"...The problem lies with them (opposition) - they want to cast the country in the same mold. We worship diversity. We celebrate it," PM added.

He further said that his government has worked in the right direction, but



there is still a lot to be done. "Governments always say that we have done everything. I don't believe we have done everything. I have tried to do everything in the correct direction, but there still a lot to be done. How do I fulfill the dreams of

'Everyone will regret'

The scrapping of the electoral bonds - in a landmark decision by the Supreme Court in February - is a decision "everyone will regret when there is honest reflection" and has "completely pushed the country towards black money", Prime Minister Narendra Modi told news agency Monday. The Prime Minister said the electoral bonds scheme launched by his government was meant to fight the use of 'black money', referring to unaccounted cash or funds from criminal activities, in election campaigns, and that he had "never claimed this was an absolute way" to achieve that goal. Modi also attacked the opposition for spreading "lies" about the bonds and said his government had introduced the scheme to cut down on 'black money' during elections. He countered criticism - that his Bharatiya Janata Party was the largest beneficiary, to the tune of thousands of crores.

every family, that is why I say this is a trailer," PM said during the interview.

"I have been working on 2047 for the past two years. And for that, I asked for opinions and suggestions from people across the country. I have taken suggestions from more than

15 lakh people on how they want to see India in the coming 25 years," he said.

"I contacted universities, I contacted different NGOs and 15-20 lakh people gave their inputs. Then I took the help of AI and classified it subject-wise. I made a dedicated team of

officers in every department to work on this. How can it be done for the next term? For 25 years. And then I sat with them and they gave presentations for two to 2.5 hours," the Prime Minister told news agency.

Furthermore, PM Modi also claimed that in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections, voters of the country will have chose between a "failed Congress model" and the BJP model that had shown its performance in the last 10 years. "If we look at the 2024 elections, there is an opportunity before the country - there is a model of the Congress government and the BJP government. They have worked for 5-6 decades and I have only worked for 10 years. Compare these in any field. Even if there are some shortcomings, there will be no shortcomings in our efforts," the PM said.

EC seizes record Rs 4,650 cr ahead of LS polls

New Delhi, Apr 15:

The Election Commission on Monday said authorities under its supervision have made seizure worth Rs 4,650 crore, including drugs worth Rs 2069 crore, in the run up to the Lok Sabha elections. The poll panel said the seizures made since March 1 exceed the over Rs 3,475 crore recovered during the 2019 parliamentary polls.

The seven phased Lok Sabha polls were announced on March 16. The first phase is on April 19 and the last one on June 1.

The Commission said authorities have been making seizures worth Rs 100 crore every day since

March 1. Out of the total recoveries worth Rs 4,658 crore, the cash component stands at over Rs 395 crore, while liquor stands at more than Rs 489 crore.

Significantly, 45 per cent of the seizures are of drugs (Rs 2,069 crore).

Use of black money, over and above political financing, could disturb the level playing field in favour of more resourceful party or candidate, it noted, adding that the seizures are a critical part of its resolve to hold the Lok Sabha elections free of inducements and electoral malpractices and to ensure a level playing field. Drug seizures accounted for approximately 75 per cent of the total seizures in January and

February this year with the poll panel focussing on the menace much before the poll schedule was announced. Over the past few years, significant seizures have been made during elections to state assemblies in Gujarat, Punjab, Manipur, Nagaland, Tripura, and Mizoram. CEC Rajiv Kumar, while announcing the polls last month, had underlined money power as one of the '4M' challenges, the poll authority recalled. The poll panel pointed out that it has been taking action to ensure level playing field such as checking vehicles of prominent leaders and even removing officials for laxity in carrying out their mandate.

Kejriwal's custody extended

No relief from SC too

New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

A Delhi court on Monday extended till April 23 the judicial custody of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in a money laundering case linked to the alleged excise scam.

Special Judge for the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and Enforcement Directorate (ED), Kaveri Baweja, extended Kejriwal's custody after he was produced before the court through video-conferencing on the expiry of his period of custody granted earlier.

SC notice to ED

A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta issued notice to the ED on Kejriwal's plea challenging the Delhi High Court's April 9 order that had upheld his arrest in the case. The bench said the matter would be heard in the week commencing April 29. Senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for Kejriwal, questioned the timing of his arrest after the model code of conduct for the general elections had come into force and said it was done to disable him from campaigning. Terming it a "very unusual matter", not just because Kejriwal was a chief minister, Singhvi told the bench that he wanted to show some facts which would "shock" the conscience of the court. He said a lot of "selective leaks all over the place" was giving everybody a wrong impression. "I am not aware of selective leaks," Justice Khanna said, adding, "Let a notice be issued." Solicitor General Tushar Mehta and Additional Solicitor General S V Raju, who represented the ED, said the probe agency will file its reply to the petition.

Iran to allow Indian authorities to meet 17 crew members

Of seized cargo vessel

New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

Iranian foreign minister Hossein Amir-Abdollahian has said that Tehran will "soon" allow Indian authorities to meet 17 Indian crew members of a cargo vessel that was seized by Iran's military near the Strait of Hormuz on Saturday.

Amir-Abdollahian conveyed this to External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar during a telephonic conversation on Sunday, according to an Iranian foreign ministry readout.

It said Amir-Abdollahian also ap-

prised details of Iran's "legitimate defence" and punitive measures against the Israeli regime, in a reference to Tehran's missile and drone attacks on the Jewish nation.

The Iranian foreign minister urged the Indian government to maintain its active role through international bodies, including the United Nations Security Council, to halt the war in Gaza as it is at the core of the current crisis in the region, the readout said.

In the talks, Jaishankar called for the release of the Indians onboard the Portuguese-flagged cargo vessel MSC Ariès.

'Flight landed with 1-2 mins of holding fuel'



New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

An IndiGo flight from Ayodhya to the national capital was diverted due to bad weather to Chandigarh where it landed with just 1 or 2 minutes of fuel left on Saturday, a Delhi police officer has said even as the airline on Monday asserted that the aircraft had sufficient fuel.

In a post on X, Satish Kumar, who is DCP Crime

with the Delhi Police, said he had a harrowing experience with IndiGo flight 6E 2702 from Ayodhya to Delhi. He said the flight's scheduled departure time was 3:25 pm and scheduled arrival time was 4:30 pm but at around 4:15 pm, the pilot announced that there was bad weather at the Delhi airport and that the plane had 45 minutes of holding fuel.

"The pilot attempted landing twice, couldn't due to bad weather and still wasted lot of time deciding the next course of action. "At 5:30 p.m. (after a lapse of 75 minutes since the Holding fuel announcement) the pilot announced that he'll finally attempt landing at Chandigarh... finally the plane managed to land at 6:10 p.m. at Chandigarh Airport after a lapse of 115 minutes since the 45 minutes holding fuel announcement," Kumar said in the post on Sunday evening. Kumar also said that he got to know after landing from the crew that there was only 1 or 2 minutes of fuel left.

Ahead of Bastar LS polls, 26 Naxalites surrender

Dantewada, Apr 15:

A total of 26 Naxalites, including five women and three teens, surrendered on Monday in Dantewada, which is part of Bastar Lok Sabha seat that will go to polls on April 19, a senior police official said. Of these, Joga Muchaki was head of 'Korajguda Panchayat janatana sarkar' of the outlawed Communist Party of India (Maoists) and had a bounty of Rs 1 lakh on his head, Dantewada Superintendent of Police Gaurav Rai said.

"They laid down arms in front of police and CRPF officials. They were part of Kistaram, Bhairamgarh, Malangir and Katekalyan area committees of the Maoists in south Bastar. They said they were impressed by the police's

rehabilitation drive 'Lon Varratu' and disappointed with the hollow Maoist ideology," Rai said. "These cadres were tasked with digging roads, felling trees to block roads and putting up posters and banners during shutdowns called by the Naxalites. They will be provided facilities as per the government's surrender and rehabilitation policy," the SP added.

The 26 persons included five women as well as two girls and a boy, all three aged 17 years, as per police.

With this, 717 Naxalites, including 176 of them carrying cash reward on their heads, have so far joined the mainstream in the district under the police's 'Lon Varratu' (return to your home/village) campaign launched in June 2020, officials said.

HC sets conditions for Ram Navami rally

Kolkata, Apr 15 (PTI): The Calcutta High Court on Monday granted permission to the Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) to hold a procession on Ram Navami in Howrah city while imposing certain conditions to ensure the event proceeds without tension.

The petitioners had requested permission for the procession, starting from near Shibpur IEST to Ramkrishnapur ferry ghat on the banks of the Hooghly. Justice Jay Sengupta permitted the procession, stipulating that no provocative slogans are to be chanted and that it must proceed without stopping en route on Ram Navami, which falls on Wednesday.

'India to get above-normal rainfall this monsoon'



New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

India will experience above-normal monsoon rains this season on the back of favourable La Nina conditions, the IMD said on Monday, bringing cheer to farmers and policy-planners.

M Ravichandran, the secretary in the Ministry of Earth Sciences, told a press conference that the

seasonal rainfall will be on the higher side of 'above-normal', and pegged it at 106 percent of the long-period average (87 cm).

Parts of the country are already battling extreme heat and a significantly high number of heat wave days are expected in the April to June period. This could strain power grids, and result in water shortages in several areas.

Police nabs notorious woman drug peddler of Nagpur

Four arrested with brown sugar worth Rs 5 lakhs

Bhilai, Apr 15: Notorious woman drug peddler of Nagpur, Chanda Thakur and her three accomplices were arrested with Brown sugar worth Rs 5 lakh. She had smuggled brown sugar with two others in a car from Nagpur to Durg. She has been detained several times in Nagpur in narcotics cases.

SP Jitendra Shukla informed that Padmanabhpur Police Station had received a tip off that Chanda Thakur accompanied by her son-in-law Manoj Rahangdale and driver Yasin Shaikh had come to Durg city for delivering brown sugar Prem Thakur, a resident



of Green Chowk Durg. Acting on this tip off, a team of Padmanabhpur Police Station swung into action and rounded up the suspects near Central Jail Durg.

On searching the accused, police recovered 235 sachets of brown

sugar and Rs 25000 cash from them. Police also seized four mobile phones and a Fiat Linea car (MH/49/U/0994) from them.

During interrogation, the accused disclosed that they purchased brown sugar from an anonymous

person near Nagpur (Maharashtra) Railway Station at the rate of Rs 150 per sachet. They brought it to Durg city and were selling it near the Central Jail Durg at the rate of Rs 250 per sachet.

Police arrested Chanda Pradeep Thakur (60) wife of Late Pradeep Thakur, a resident of Shantinagar, Nagpur (Maharashtra); Manoj Rahangdale (36) son of Bisram Rahangdale, a resident of Shantinagar, Nagpur; Yasin Sheikh (36) son of Najeeb Sheikh, a resident of Kalamana, Nagpur; and Prem Thakur (25) son of Vijay Thakur, a resident of Green Chowk, Durg under sections 21(b), 27(a) of NDPS Act.

Two arrested for online cricket betting

Bhilai, Apr 15: Durg Police arrested two persons on charges of operating an online cricket betting racket. Laptops, mobiles, bank passbook, ATM cards, cheque books, cash and a car were seized from them.

SP Jitendra Shukla informed that considering the IPL season, they have activated the network of informers and are maintaining vigil on the suspects. In this sequel, police received a tip off regarding some youth, who were sitting in a Honda City car at a lonely place near Newai Dam. They were accepting bets and running the online cricket betting racket through laptop and mobile phones.

Acting on this tip off, Inspector Anand Shukla and his team reached the spot and rounded up the suspicious car bearing registration number CG 04 ZE 4444. Two persons identi-



fied as Lakshadeep and Shivam were found sitting in the car. When questioned, they confessed to using Reddy Anna's app for online betting.

Their four other accomplices identified as Rahul Tamrakar, Hrithik Tamrakar, Niraj Sahu and Purnanand Gaur, were operating the same racket from Rewa (MP). The accused had opened bank accounts with the IDs of in-

nocent people and were using those bank accounts for transactions of cricket betting.

The accused further disclosed that they used to erase the data of betting after settlement. 04 laptops of different companies, 04 mobiles, 14 nos passbook, ATM cards, cheque books of different banks, cash Rs 10,000 and hand written betting transactions on blank papers, as well as a Honda

City car used in the incident, have been seized.

The accused Lakshadweep Dahariya (23) son of Shiv Kumar Dahariya a resident of Sector 10, Bhilai and Shivam Singh Tomar (26) son of Balveer Singh Tomar, a resident of Sector 03 Bhilai have been booked under section 419, 420 of the Indian Penal Code and sections 6, 7, and 8 of the Gambling Act.

Vinod Singh and Chiman Singh. The remaining 26 accused have not surrendered in the e-court. Two accused in the murder of NCP leader Ramawatar Jaggi surrendered before the court of Special Judge Justice Pankaj Kumar Sinha here on Monday.

It is notable here that the Chhattisgarh High Court had rejected the appeal by the 27 accused in the Jaggi's murder case last on April 4. Though five of the accused in this case have got relief from the Supreme Court (SC) and

the Supreme Court has given additional time of 3 weeks to these five accused to surrender.

This includes in-Charge Crime Branch RC Trivedi, the then Moudhapara Thana TI VK Pandey and CSP Kotwali Thana Amrik Singh Gil and Suryakant Tiwari and Mayor Eijaz Dhebar.

There are reports that the Court could issue the arrest warrant against these accused on Monday. After surrendering shooter Chiman Singh and Vinod Singh said that they received the notice and they have surrendered. Both said that they have been made accused based upon the story and they were not

paid any amount for the contract killing. Shooter said that they have family relations with Jaggi's family and added that he is a businessman and this is my first case and there is no crime record against him in entire India and would approach Supreme Court against this decision. Satish Jaggi, S/o Late Ramawatar Jaggi said that they saw the entire Court's proceeding the whole day and the shooter Chiman Singh and his assistant Vinod Singh have surrendered.

Till 5:00 pm the Court will see and then issue the orders. Satish Jaggi said that the accused have been named based upon the charge-sheet presented by the police. On the issue that five persons have got relief for three weeks from the Supreme Court (SC), Satish Jaggi said that no accused would get any relief and this can be termed as just some extra time.

ED arrests man who 'managed' AAP funds

■ For Goa polls

New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

The Enforcement Directorate has arrested Chanpreet Singh, who allegedly "managed" cash funds for AAP's campaign in 2022 Goa Assembly polls, in connection with the Delhi excise policy-linked money laundering case, official sources said Monday.

Singh was taken into custody under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) on April 12 and was produced before a special court here the next day, the sources said.

He has been sent to the

ED custody till April 18 by the court, they said.

This is the 17th arrest in the case by the ED. Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, his party colleague and former Delhi deputy CM Manish Sisodia, BRS leader K Kavitha and a number of liquor businessmen and others have been arrested earlier by the federal agency.

Singh was earlier arrested by the Central Bureau of Investigation too in the same case. The money laundering case stems from the CBI FIR.

The ED has informed the court through its official documents that Chanpreet Singh "managed" cash payments for

the campaign of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) during the 2022 Goa elections and had a "relationship" with the political outfit that rules Delhi currently.

It has been alleged by the agency that the 'South Group'-- comprising Kavitha, TDP candidate from Ongole Lok Sabha seat Magunta Sreenivasulu Reddy, his son Raghav Magunta, businessman Sarath Chandra Reddy and others --paid Rs 100 crore bribe to the AAP for obtaining a prime position in the Delhi liquor market as part of the now-scraped excise policy for 2021-22.

Out of these alleged kickbacks, the ED has claimed, Rs 45 crore was

used by the AAP to fund its Goa election campaign.

The ED has claimed that cash payments were made to survey workers, area managers, assembly managers and others in Goa who were engaged in election campaign activities of the AAP and these people told the agency that this was "managed" by a person named Chanpreet Singh.

It also said that an employee of an 'Angadia' firm, which allegedly moved cash funds illegally, had "admitted" to disbursing huge amounts of cash in Goa to some people including Singh, who used to work for Chariot Productions Media Pvt Ltd.

Farmer forced to cut down 300 sweet lime trees

Amid water shortage in Sambhajinagar

Sambhajinagar Apr 15 (PTI):

A farmer in Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar was forced to cut down 300 sweet lime trees amid an acute water shortage in the drought-prone Marathwada region. Rajendra Lembhe felled the 11-year-old trees on his farm in Murma village of Paithan tehsil on Saturday after two wells he sourced water from became dry.

Talking to PTI, Lembhe said, "It was painful to cut down the trees with a JCB machine. But I had no way out. I have a 300-foot-deep bore well and a 70-foot-

deep well, but both have gone dry in the last three months." There has been no significant rainfall in the region since August last year, he said.

Lembhe said he tried to save the trees by sourcing water from tankers but could not bear the expenses. "A tanker with a capacity of 5,000 litres costs Rs 1,000. I could water the trees for 15 to 20 minutes through drip irrigation," he said. A tanker transports 25,000 litres of water to Murma in a week, but it is not nearly enough, he said.

Cong releases LS poll campaign song focused on 'Nyay'

New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI): The Congress on Monday released a campaign song for the Lok Sabha polls, focusing on the theme of "Nyay" for women, youngsters, farmers and labourers as well as on participatory justice. Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh and spokesperson Supriya Shrinete released the song with the lyrics "Hum Saath Hain To Haath Ye Halat Badal Dega" at the AICC headquarters here. The Congress leaders also spoke about the various phases of the party's campaign, saying it started with the "mere vikas ka do hisaab" slogan and then moved on to "haath badlega halat", which is based on five "nyay" (justice) -- naari nyay, kisaan nyay, yuva nyay, shramik nyay and hissedari nyay. "Our party is distributing our guarantee cards to eight crore households. About 80 per cent of the cards have been distributed in the constituencies that go to polls on April 19," Ramesh said.

CT scan machines at GB Pant Hospital lying non-functional

■ For 10 months

New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

CT scan machines at the GB Pant Hospital, known for the treatment of cardiology and neurological diseases, in the national capital have been non-functional for about 10 months, due to which patients are facing troubles. Critical patients are being referred to the nearby LNJP Hospital, where they have to wait for hours for the test which takes just five minutes.

A patient's relative, requesting anonymity, told PTI that his father was referred to the GB Pant Hospital from the Hedgewar and the GTB hospitals in east Delhi after suffering a heart attack on April 1. After the initial treatment, he was asked to undergo a CT scan. "Since the machines at the hospital were out of

order, I was asked to take my father to the nearby LNJP Hospital. We were asked to get the CT scan done at 10 am but the LNJP Hospital staff asked us to come at 4 pm. Such a long time can prove fatal for an emergency patient," he said.

A woman who took her 62-year-old mother to the hospital after she suffered a heart attack told PTI, "I am taking my mother to the hospital after she suffered a heart attack. On March 21, she was brought to the 'Emergency' department of the hospital, where after giving first aid, she was immediately asked to undergo a CT scan.

"We were told that both the CT scan machines in the hospital are out of order. We were asked to order the patient to a nearby hospital. But since it would have taken too much time, I got my mother's CT scan done at

a private centre located in the Model Town area, which cost us Rs 18,500," she said. In the entire GB Pant Hospital, only 'A' and 'D' blocks have CT scan machines, and that too have been non-functional for about 10 months.

Dr Kalpana Bansal, associate professor, Department of Radiology at the GB Pant Hospital told PTI that one machine has been out of order since last February-March. The process of purchasing a new machine in place of the other machine which has been out of order since June last year, is almost complete, she said, adding that the machine is likely to be brought to the hospital by July-August. A senior officer of the Radiology Department confirmed this and further said on the condition of anonymity that due to repeated cancellation of

the tender for the second machine, its procurement is getting delayed.

A senior official of the technical department of the LNJP Hospital told PTI that on normal days, the number of patients coming to the hospital for CT scan ranges from 125 to 130 per day, which sometimes crosses 200. Out of these, the number of patients coming from the GB Pant Hospital is around 40, which sometimes reaches 60, he said.

Sources said that even at the LNJP Hospital, only one of the two CT scan machines is working. On the condition of anonymity, an official said that for the last four months, about 1,500 patients have been coming here every month from the GB Pant Hospital for CT scan. He said that the CT scans of patients admitted in the wards of the LNJP Hospital, patients coming from the GB Pant

Hospital and patients of the Deendayal Upadhyay (DDU) Hospital as well as inmates are also done here.

Dhantari, Apr 15:

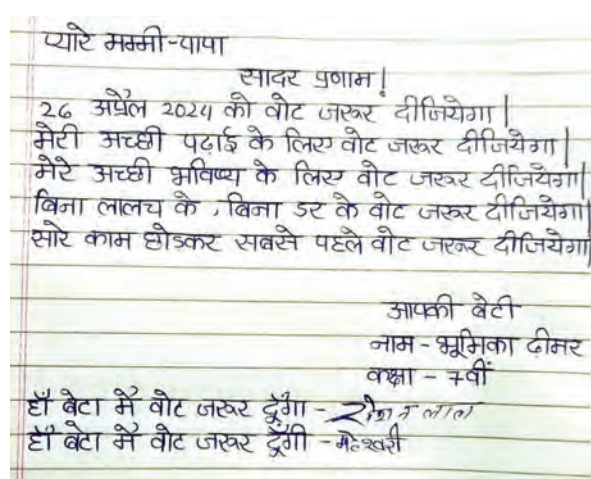

Seeking change, slain Salwa Judum leader's son enters LS poll fray

Raipur, Apr 15 (PTI):

He was just 19 when Naxalites killed his father, a former Salwa Judum leader. Defying the odds, he studied MBBS in Kyrgyzstan. Now, this man from a sleepy village in Chhattisgarh's insurgency-hit Bijapur district has entered the fray for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections.

Meet Prakash Kumar Gota, an independent candidate from Scheduled-Tribe reserved Bastar Lok Sabha seat.

Though the polls in Bastar are primarily a contest between the BJP and Congress, Gota claims he holds sway over tribal youths in the region.

Talking to PTI, Gota said tribals constitute 32 per cent of the state's population, yet somehow, they

have not been able to reap the benefits of development works and schemes.

"The two leading parties have always disappointed the people of Bastar, which is why I decided to enter the poll battle to bring real change in the region," he said.

The 32-year-old member of the Muria tribe hails from Farsegarh village in Bijapur and is currently staying in a rented house in Jagdarpur, the headquarters of Bastar district, due to elections.

His father, Chinna Ram Gota, an active leader of Salwa Judum, an anti-Maoist civil militia disbanded in 2011, was shot dead by Naxalites at his farm in Kukrel village, around 2 km away from Farsegarh in 2012.

Maoists also killed his father's older brother in a

similar attack in 2013.

Gota said his father had worked with late Congress leader Mahendra Karma, popularly called 'Bastar tiger' for his tough stand against Naxalites during the Salwa Judum movement.

Karma was killed in the Jhiram valley Naxalite attack during the Congress's Parivartan Yatra in 2013.

"I was a first-year student at a nursing college when my father was murdered. I had to quit my studies midway as my family's financial condition was not good. I have four brothers and two sisters. I am the second eldest. My mother is a housewife", Gota said.

Gota worked as a subcontractor for construction works in the area and tendu leaf collection, and this helped him fund his

medical studies in Kyrgyzstan.

"In 2016, I went to Kyrgyzstan for MBBS. I tried unsuccessfully to avail an education loan. The struggle continued as I had to return home during the COVID-19 pandemic due to my family's financial condition," he said.

Gota again worked as a subcontractor and managed to resume his medical studies in Kyrgyzstan and returned to India in June 2023 after completing his MBBS.

He has, however, not appeared for the Foreign Medical Graduates Examination (FMGE) conducted by the National Board of Examination for eligibility to practice medicine in India.

"Another tragedy struck my family in August last year when Naxalites abducted my older brother Mahesh Kumar, who was the chief of the publicity wing of the BJP's Bijapur district unit," he said.

Mahesh was later traced to a forest and admitted to a hospital in a critical condition. He has been in a coma ever since,

he said. Asked why he did not join the BJP like his brother, Gota said he did not want to be in politics and wanted to take up a job.

"There is a provision for a safe settlement and a government job under a rehabilitation scheme for victims of Maoist violence, but we did not get any of this. After all this, I was disappointed with the BJP and Congress," he said.

Over the years, Bastar has become a Maoist stronghold due to large-scale poverty, illiteracy, and lack of health facilities and amenities, Gota said.

"My father contributed to the fight to free the region from the Naxalite menace, and I wanted to address all these issues to bring a change in Bastar,"

he said, citing why he wanted to contest the elections.

However, Gota's decision to enter the fray was sudden.

"When candidates had already started filing nominations for the first phase of the polls, my friends and social workers encouraged me to throw my hat in the ring," he said.

People have been voluntarily contributing to and providing vehicles for Gota's campaign.

"I cannot spend money in electioneering like big parties. I have some savings that have come in handy," he said.

Gota exuded confidence about securing the support of the youth in the region. "BJP nominee Mahesh Kashyap is a communal person and does

not take all religions together, while the Congress's candidate Kawasi Lakhma is inactive. Both parties have ignored their dedicated workers and leaders while giving tickets," he said.

Eleven Lok Sabha seats in Chhattisgarh will go to polls in three phases on April 19, April 26 and May 7, and the counting of votes will take place on June 4.

Bastar will be the only seat to go to polls in the first phase.

The ruling BJP has fielded Kashyap, a fresh face who had been an active member of the Vishwa Hindu Parishad, and the Congress has given the ticket to Lakhma, an MLA who has served as a minister in the previous Bhupesh Baghel-led Congress government.

EU releases blocked funds of \$6.7 billion to Poland

As part of its post-pandemic recovery package

Warsaw, Apr 15 (AP):

The European Union disbursed 6.3 billion euros (about \$6.7 billion) to Poland as a part of the 27-nation bloc's post-pandemic recovery fund, the biggest single transfer ever to the country, a government minister said Monday.

Poland's former national conservative government, voted out of power in October, made changes to the judiciary which the EU said violated demo-

cratic checks and balances, and so decided to block the money.

The European Commission had said at the time Poland must meet certain "milestones" to guarantee the independence of the judiciary to get the funds. Brussels emphasized that an independent judiciary is vital to respecting the EU's democratic norms, while some also argue that independent courts boost investors' confidence in the country's ability to adjudicate commercial disputes.

Katarzyna Pelczynska-Nalecz, Poland's minister of funds and regional policy, hailed the move while stressing that the value of

EU membership goes beyond money.

"Being in the EU pays off, but the EU is not only about money, which our predecessors forgot," she tweeted. "We are united by values: democracy, equal opportunities, rule of law, civil liberties!"

Poland's pro-European coalition of three center-left parties led by current Prime Minister Donald Tusk won parliamentary elections and took over in December. It succeeded the nationalist Law and Justice party that had ruled for eight years and introduced changes to the justice system, reproductive rights and the media that put Poland on a colli-

sion course with the EU.

The Commission announced in February that it would start releasing funds, confident in promises by the pro-EU Tusk to restore democratic norms.

The fund, known as the Recovery and Resilience Facility, was set up in 2020 and approved a 672.5 billion euro (\$815 billion) recovery package a year later to help member nations recover more quickly from the coronavirus pandemic.

Poland is set to receive 25.3 billion euros (about \$26.9 billion) in grants and 34.5 billion euros (nearly \$36.7 billion) in loans as part of a post-COVID-19 pandemic recovery plan.

Iran President Raisi set to visit Pakistan on April 22 amidst Middle East tensions: Report

Islamabad, Apr 15 (PTI):

Amidst spiralling tensions in the Middle East, Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi is set to visit Pakistan on April 22 and hold meetings with Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, President Asif Ali Zardari and the military leadership, according to a media report on Monday.

The 63-year-old leader's expected visit will take place days after Tehran launched more than 300 drones and missiles at Israel in retaliation to an alleged Israeli airstrike on its Damascus consulate in Syria that killed several people, including two senior commanders of Iran's elite Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps, Geo News reported.

The visit also assumes significance as it comes amidst ongoing efforts by Pakistan and Iran to deepen their cooperation which received a tempo-

rary setback earlier this year. In January, Pakistan, in retaliation to Iran's cross-border strikes, carried out precision strikes using killer drones and rockets to target terrorists inside Iranian territory, the report said.

Two bases of the Sunni Baloch militant group 'Jaish al-Adl' in Pakistan's unruly Balochistan province were targeted by missiles and drones, Iranian state media reported. Jaish al-Adl, or the 'Army of Justice', is a Baloch Sunni militant group founded in 2012 that largely operates in Pakistan.

Pakistan had even withdrawn its ambassador from Iran and announced that it would not allow the Iranian envoy, who was visiting his home country at that time, to return as a gesture of protest against the breach of its sovereignty by Iran, Geo News reported.

However, the diplomatic ties were soon restored with the ambassadors of the two countries returning to their respective posts.

The sources, as per the report, said the agenda of President Raisi's visit includes bilateral ties, security cooperation, a gas pipeline and a potential Free Trade Agreement (FTA).

The Iranian president's visit also holds significance as the two countries share key economic interests, most notably the Pakistan-Iran gas pipeline, the report said.

In another development, Iran announced on Monday that they would release Pakistanis stranded on a ship seized by the Iranian forces, after confirmation of their nationalities and completing legal formalities due to brotherly ties between the two countries, the report said.

Former Australia cricketer Michael Slater remanded in police custody

For assault and stalking

Brisbane, Apr 15 (PTI):

Former Australia cricketer and commentator Michael Slater has been remanded in police custody after being charged with offences including common assault and stalking. According to the Guardian, the 54-year-old Slater has been charged with more than a dozen offences including unlawful stalking or intimidation, common assault, breaking into a dwelling with intent at night, assault occasioning bodily harm and choking or suffocation.

Slater's case was mentioned at the Maroochy Dore Magistrates Court in Queensland on Monday. The report did not identify the alleged victim.

He is facing a total of 19 charges on the alleged offences at the Sunshine Coast on various dates between December 5 last year and April 12.

The local police confirmed arresting a 54-year-old man from Noosa Heads at the Sunshine coast last Friday after alleged domestic violence incidents 'over several days'.

Slater was also charged with breaching bail and 10 counts of 'contravening a domestic violence order'. Police confirmed they arrested a 54-year-old Noosa Heads man at a Sunshine Coast address on Friday following alleged domestic violence incidents over several days. The former right-handed Australian opener played 74 Tests and 42 ODIs between 1993 and 2003.

Germany's Scholz calls for fair competition

Warns against dumping during China visit

Beijing, Apr 15 (AP):

German Chancellor Olaf Scholz called for fair competition in trade relations with China while warning about dumping and overproduction as he spoke to students in Shanghai on Monday.

Scholz is visiting China against the background of looming EU tariffs on Chinese-made electric vehicles and other trade-related tensions. The two countries are also split over how to handle Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

"The one thing that must always be clear is that competition must be fair," Scholz told students at Tongji University in Shanghai, according to

German news agency dpa.

"Of course we would like our companies to have no restrictions, but conversely we behave exactly how we are demanding here," he said, adding there must be no dumping or overproduction.

The European Union is mulling tariffs to protect its producers against cheaper Chinese electrical vehicle imports, which some fear will flood the European market.

The head of Germany's auto industry association, the VDA, expressed opposition to such tariffs ahead of Scholz's visit. Hildegard Müller told the Welt am Sonntag newspaper in comments published Saturday the tariffs would not help the European and German auto industries and instead "could quickly have a negative effect in a trade conflict."

"Current business with China secures a large

number of jobs here in Germany," Müller said.

Scholz made comparisons to reservations years ago when Japanese and Korean automakers entered the German market.

"There was great agitation in the newspapers: Now the Japanese cars will come and clean up' — nonsense," he told the Tongji University students. He said there are German cars in China that were made with Chinese manufacturers, and at some point there would also be Chinese cars in Germany and Europe.

Scholz began his three-day China trip on Sunday in the industrial hub of Chongqing, where he and his delegation of ministers and business executives visited a partially German-funded company and other sites in the vast city, which is a production base for China's auto and other industries.

Israeli military renews warnings to Palestinians not to return to war-torn northern Gaza

Deir Al-Balah (Gaza Strip), Apr 15 (AP): The Israeli military renewed warnings on Monday for Palestinians in Gaza not to return to the embattled territory's north, a day after Gaza hospital officials said five people were killed as throngs of displaced residents tried to reach their homes in the war-torn area.

Northern Gaza was an early target of Israel's war against Hamas and vast parts of it have been flattened, forcing much of the area's population to flee south. While around 250,000 people are said to be living in the north, the Israeli military has prevented most displaced people from returning throughout the six-month-long war, saying the area

is an active battle zone.

The military has reduced the number of troops it has in Gaza and has said it has loosened Hamas' control over the north, but Israel is still carrying out airstrikes and targeted operations in the area against what it says are reorganizing militants, most prominently at Gaza's main hospital, Shifa, which is in ruins after a two-week raid and fighting last month.

Israeli military spokesman Avichay Adraee wrote on X, formerly Twitter, that Palestinians should stay in southern Gaza, where they have been told to shelter, because the north is a "dangerous combat zone."

People appeared to be

heading the new warning, especially after the violence on Sunday.

Hospital authorities in Gaza said that five people were killed by Israeli forces while trying to travel north to their homes. Their bodies were taken to the Awda hospital in the urban Nuseirat camp in central Gaza, hospital records showed. A further 54 were wounded in the incident, the records showed.

The Israeli military had no immediate comment and the precise circumstances behind the deaths were not immediately clear.

Anaam Mohammad, who was displaced from the northern city of Beit Hanoun and was trying to return, said the military

was allowing women and children to cross, but when a group of Palestinians did not make room for them to pass, two tanks arrived and opened fire. Forces also threw smoke bombs, dispersing the crowd.

"People started to run away. People were afraid and could not take the risk and enter a dangerous area," she said.

Ahead of the violence Sunday, throngs of people crowded a coastal road and moved north by foot and donkey cart. The returnees said they were prompted to make the dangerous journey because they were fed up with the difficult conditions they are forced to live under while displaced.

A key plank in Britain's plan to send migrants to Rwanda is set to become law

London, Apr 15 (AP):

A key plank in the British government's plan to send some asylum-seekers on a one-way trip to Rwanda is expected to become law this week, but opponents plan new legal challenges that could keep deportation flights grounded.

A bill aimed at overcoming a UK Supreme Court block on sending migrants to Rwanda is expected to pass Parliament this week after the government overcomes efforts to water it down in the House of Lords. The Rwanda plan is key to Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's pledge to "stop the boats" bringing unauthorised migrants to the

UK, and Sunak has repeatedly said the long-delayed first flights will take off by June. It has been two years since Britain and Rwanda signed a deal that would see migrants who cross the English Channel in small boats sent to the East African country, where they would remain permanently. The plan has been challenged in the courts, and no one has yet been sent to Rwanda under an agreement that has cost the UK at least 370 million pounds (USD 470 million). In November, the UK Supreme Court ruled that the Rwanda plan was illegal because the nation wasn't a safe destination for asylum-seekers. For decades, human rights

groups and governments have documented alleged repression of dissent by Rwanda's government both inside the country and abroad, as well as serious restrictions on internet freedom, assembly and expression. In response to the ruling, Britain and Rwanda signed a treaty pledging to strengthen protections for migrants. Sunak's government argues the treaty allows it to pass a law declaring Rwanda a safe destination. The Safety of Rwanda Bill pronounces the country safe, making it harder for migrants to challenge deportation and allows the British government to ignore injunctions from the European Court of Human Rights

that forbid removals. Human rights groups, refugee charities, senior Church of England clerics and many legal experts have criticised the legislation. In February a parliamentary rights watchdog said the Rwanda plan is "fundamentally incompatible" with the UK's human rights obligations.

The Safety of Rwanda Bill has been approved by the House of Commons, where Sunak's Conservatives have a majority, only for members of Parliament's unelected upper chamber, the House of Lords, to insert a series of amendments designed to water down the legislation and ensure it complies with international law.

Man arrested after a stabbing at a church service in Sydney

Police say no lives are in danger

Sydney, Apr 15 (AP):

Police in Australia say a man has been arrested after a bishop and three churchgoers were stabbed in Sydney. There are no life-threatening injuries.

It occurred during a televised service at the church on Monday evening, police said. The Orthodox Assyrian church streams services online.

A video on social media shows a man dressed in black approaching a cleric at the altar identified as the bishop at Christ the Good

Shepherd in suburban Wakenly and appearing to stab him repeatedly in the head and upper body.

Members of the congregation are seen screaming and rushing to the bishop's aid. The church website identified the bishop as Mar Mari Emmanuel.

NSW Ambulance service said it had treated a man in his 50s for multiple cuts and taken him to a hospital, and three others were treated for one or more cuts at the scene. "A large police response is underway and the public is urged to avoid the area," police said. Australians are still in shock after a lone assailant stabbed six people to death in a busy Sydney shop-

ping mall on Saturday and injured more than a dozen others. Christ the Good Shepherd had been preparing for Palm Sunday later this month. The bishop was featured in national news last year. A video posted in May 2023 by the Australian Broadcasting Corporation about a campaign targeting the LGBTQ+ community showed the bishop in a sermon saying that "when a man calls himself a woman, he is neither a man nor a woman, you are not a human, then you are an it. Now, since you are an it, I will not address you as a human anymore because it is not my choosing, it your choosing." Russian soldiers.

Islamic State-linked attackers kill at least 11 people

Torch vehicles in eastern Congo

Kinshasa (Congo), Apr 15 (AP):

Extremist-linked rebels attacked villages in eastern Congo over the weekend, killing at least 11 people, torching vehicles and taking possessions, a local official said. The attacks occurred Saturday and were reported by the local mayor on Sunday. Allied Democratic Forces rebels with ties to the Islamic State group have long operated in the border area near Uganda. The United Nations said

earlier this month that almost 200 people have been killed there this year.

Iran-Israel Conflict Brink of Larger Confrontation

The escalation between Iran and Israel underscores the precarious situation in the Middle East, with potentially far-reaching consequences for global stability. Iran's missile and drone attack on Israel, following earlier hostilities, signals a dangerous escalation of tensions in the region. However, this commitment must be balanced with efforts to prevent further conflict. It is imperative that diplomatic channels remain open, with a concerted effort to engage in dialogue and mediation. The United Nations, as a neutral arbiter, has a crucial role to play in facilitating discussions between the parties involved. India, with its longstanding relationships with both Iran and Israel, can also contribute to peace efforts in the region. Urging restraint and prioritizing the safety of its nationals caught in the crossfire should be a paramount concern for Indian authorities. The recent events serve as a stark reminder of the fragility of peace in the Middle East. The disproportionate use of force by both sides has already resulted in civilian casualties and humanitarian crises. Further escalation risks destabilizing the entire region, with potentially catastrophic consequences. Ultimately, the pursuit of peace must outweigh any short-term geopolitical interests. The international community must unite in its commitment to resolving conflicts through dialogue and diplomacy, ensuring that the specter of war does not engulf the Middle East and beyond.

Voter-ID versus NRC-CAA

I was a student of class VII when my father was posted to another place. I had mixed feelings about going to a new place. There was the excitement that I would get a chance to explore a new place, a new environment along with the sadness of leaving an area that had become a part of myself. My father took me to a nearby school in our new locality and got me admitted there. But I was bullied on the first day in my new school. It was my first encounter with ragging as well as with the game of othering. Initially, some students behaved as though I were an enemy from outer space. Was it just fun or a ritual to welcome a fresher? If it was so, then where was its origin? The paranoia for anyone outside one's herd might be its origin. Be that as it may, fortunately for me, the school administration and teachers did not treat me in a different way; rather they accepted me as their own. This helped the hostile environment change into a friendly and cordial one within a few days. What would have happened, had my class teacher after calling my roll number asked me to enrol my name again as a student in my school! In that case, instead of the change that the situation underwent from hostile to friendly, it would have become unbearable. Then, I would have faced more ragging with renewed vigour in the hands of some heartless students. Plus, it would cause tremendous harassment for me and my parents. But should any teacher ask such a question to a student when his roll number had already been recorded in the attendance register? It was the school authorities who had recorded the name of the student in the attendance register. Therefore, asking such a question actually means the authorities do not have faith in themselves.

The same question arises regarding the non-acceptance of a voter-ID as a sufficient document for citizenship. Given the Members of the Lok Sabha and Vidhan Sabha are directly elected by voters, it is akin to putting a big question mark behind all of them. Should a government ask some voters to prove whether they are citizens of a country or not after being elected by the votes including the votes of those voters? How could a government challenge the way it had been elected while completing its term of five years? Moreover, the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019 (CAA) has gone against the secular character of the Constitution by removing one particular religion from the selection process. Two back to back incidents that happened last month brought back my memory of the first day in my new school. Sujit Dutta (my namesake) and Esan Singh were found dead at Ichamati in Meghalaya's East Khasi Hills district on March 27 hours after an organisation took out a protest against the CAA. It appears that the CAA has increased the divide between tribal and non-tribal people of Meghalaya. Debashish Sengupta (37), a resident of Kolkata, was found hanging from the ceiling fan on March 20. His father, Tapan Sengupta said, "Since the notification of the CAA, my son has been suffering from tremendous mental trauma and agony and was also in acute fear psychosis for not having all the required documents as shown in the social media and as prescribed in the said notification." The Centre should heed to the apprehension someone has expressed in a newspaper after Debashish Sengupta took his own life, "The moment I formally apply for Indian citizenship, it will be an acknowledgment that I am not an Indian citizen. That is a huge risk." Anything that can increase the divide between different communities and create fear psychosis in the minds of the voters of our country should be avoided. It could spell disaster in our country which has achieved unity by accepting its rich diversity.

Mounting Cybercrime in India

An international team of researchers has recently prepared the "World Cyber Crime Index", according to which India ranks 10th in the world in terms of cybercrime. 100 countries have been included in this index. According to this, Russia is at the top in terms of cybercrime, while Ukraine is at second, China, third, America, fourth, Nigeria, fifth, Romania, sixth and North Korea is at seventh. Many types of cybercrimes occur in India. In recent years, there has been a significant increase in the incidents of cybercrimes being committed through call forwarding. Telecom companies provide call forwarding facility to the consumers, under which calls, and SMS are forwarded. Consumers use this facility when they are busy in meetings or any important work, so that they do not miss any important call. Consumers get the facility of call forwarding by activating the USSD based call forwarding service on the number. USSD codes are usually used to know the balance or IMEI number of the mobile phone. This is a feature with the help of which services can be started or stopped by dialling a code. Through call forwarding, scammers call consumers and tell them that they are calling from your telecom provider company. We noticed that there is a network problem on your number. To overcome the problem, you have to dial the number "Star 401

Hashtag". After dialling this number, the consumer is asked to call an unknown number. As soon as the consumer calls, all his calls and messages reach the scammer, including OTPs of bank and credit card transactions. Call and OTP are used by scammers to withdraw money from the consumer's bank account, access social media and get a new SIM issued. To prevent cybercrimes being committed through call forwarding, the government has stopped the service of USSD based call forwarding from 15 April 2024. Therefore, smartphone users are asked to check the settings of their mobile phones and turn off the call forwarding service immediately if they see it running when dialling the "Star 401 Hashtag" number. In the past years, along with digitalization, there has been a sharp increase in cybercrime. Now even Facebook and Instagram have become means of fraud. Such fraud is being perpetrated by creating fake profiles of friends or relatives. For the past few years, people have been searching for answers to all their questions on Google search engine. Keeping such psychology in mind, fraudsters are saving their numbers on the internet in the name of famous payment apps like Google Pay, Phone Pay, Paytm, due to which people automatically fall into the trap of hackers. Now cybercrimes are also being committed through down-

loading of browser extensions.

This work is done through viruses. Mobiles and laptops also get infected through public charger ports. Online transactions done through browsers like Chrome, Mozilla etc. are saved in the server of the browser, which need to be deleted by going to the settings, but due to ignorance people do not do so and cybercriminal get the benefit of this. Therefore, there is a need to be especially careful while using banking digital products like debit and credit cards, ATM, UPI, internet banking, QR codes etc., because carelessness in using them can drain your pockets. Under phishing, by creating a fake website of a big or renowned company or the user's company, whose appearance is like the real website, tempting mails are sent, in which it is said that expensive things will be given for free. With the increase in the popularity of mobile phones, hackers also send offer messages through SMS or WhatsApp, which contain hyperlinks containing malware. It causing damage to the software installed on the computer or mobile or tab, steals the user's financial information like, debit or credit card details, their passwords, OTP, mobile number, address, bank account number, date of birth etc. It can also send fake emails from the user's email account to others without the user's knowledge and through this, along with cheating, sensitive information can also be sold to unwanted people and with its help, someone's social reputation can also be tarnished.

Nowadays, cyber criminals are exporting money from people by calling them as borrowers without taking any loan through phone calls or SMS. Such blackmailing is being done more for small amounts like Rs 2000 to Rs.5000, so that financially weak people do not complain to the police. Loan recovery agents threaten that you have taken a loan from us and if you do not return the money within two-three days, your objectionable pictures will be made

viral or shared with your relatives or colleagues and will be used as evidence. They send morphed photos and videos. Whether the user is educated or illiterate; Today everyone is becoming a victim of cybercrime. Neither the people of urban areas nor the people of rural areas can escape from cybercrimes. Administrative officials, bank officials, judges, MLAs, MPs, ministers, police all are becoming victims of this. Bank's digital products have become a medium for cybercrime. Nevertheless, cybercrimes committed through digital products can be avoided by being alert. If people are wary of suspicious pop-ups during browsing sessions, ensure that the URL contains https://pad lock symbol or not, do not share card information on websites or mobile or public laptops or desktops, unknown numbers, or email IDs.

If you immediately delete the attachments and ignore the messages related to online lottery, casino, gaming, shopping, or free download, then you can avoid the trap of phishing mail or suspicious hyper link forwarded through SMS or WhatsApp. Taking loan from mobile app is more dangerous than taking loan from a moneylender. Many times, loan recovery agents not only cheat people of money but also defame them in the society. Moneylenders were largely limited to villages and towns, but today the prevalence of loan recovery agents goes beyond the country and time, because most of the mobiles are made in China and their servers are outside India. For this reason, most of the recovery agents are doing fraud business from China, Vietnam, Thailand, Philippines, South Africa etc. Therefore, despite filing a complaint with the police, it is not easy to catch the cyber criminals. Caution is the only protection in this matter. Don't be greedy. This is the root of all problems. Do not come under psychological pressure. Do not hesitate to seek police help if you receive threats. Be fearless, only then you can avoid becoming a victim of cybercrime.

Democracy's Cornerstone: Voter is the King

In the bustling heart of democracy, where the fate of nations hangs in the balance, lies the pivotal role of the voter. First phase of voting will be held on April 19 and the canvassing will be up to April 17, 5 pm. These two days are crucial as voters must make important decisions based on the speeches of political leaders regarding whom to vote for. The outcome of this decision will determine the fate of the country, and any erroneous choice could mean waiting for the next five years for a chance to rectify it. The criteria for voting vary from voter to voter.

If no candidate aligns with a voter's preferences, they have the option to choose NOTA (None of the Above), indicating the mood of the electorate. During elections, the issues that drive voters to the polls vary greatly. Some voters may assess candidates based on their track record, others may prioritize daily challenges they face, while others still may be influenced by advice, financial incentives, emotional appeals, caste affiliations, or the economic trajectory of the country.

The unpredictable nature of Indian elections stems from the vast diversity across states, languages, cultures, and identities. This diversity makes it challenging to forecast electoral outcomes precisely. Rare moments of unanimity among voters, such as those witnessed in 1977 and 1984, are noteworthy exceptions rather than the norm. In 1977, amidst the anti-Emergency fervour, the public united to elect a non-Congress government for the first time. Similarly, in 1984, following the tragic assassination of Indira Gandhi, the Congress party capitalized on a wave of sympathy, resulting in a record number of Congress MPs being elected to the Lok Sabha. Recent examples, such as the Punjab Assembly elections, where traditional parties were rejected in favor of AAP, underscore the rarity of such collective unanimity among voters. Achieving such collective consensus requires exceptional leadership, as exem-

plified by figures like Jay Prakash Narayan in 1977. Leadership plays a pivotal role in galvanizing public trust and steering voter sentiment towards a particular direction. However, despite the influence of leadership, electoral outcomes are often multifaceted and influenced by a myriad of factors. The transformation witnessed in the 2014 elections was marked by growing resentment towards the incumbent UPA government, which had faltered on various fronts.

The emergence of Narendra Modi as a charismatic leader, amplified through social media, provided voters with an alternative vision and spurred discontent about their electoral choices. This highlights the complex interplay between public sentiment, leadership appeal, and prevailing socio-political dynamics in shaping electoral outcomes. Interestingly, electoral patterns often defy regional stereotypes or uniform criteria. Even in landmark elections like 1977, variations in voting patterns between North India and South India were evident. This underscores the nuanced nature of voter decision-making, influenced by a spectrum of factors unique to each region. In Indian politics, the influence of local leaders often transcends party affiliations, with voters backing familiar faces regardless of party changes. For instance, in a Punjab by-election, a Congress leader secured victory on an AAP ticket, only

to contest the next election as a BJP candidate, illustrating voters' pragmatic approach over ideological allegiance.

Despite conventional wisdom linking economic performance to electoral success, the reality is more nuanced. Historical examples, such as P.V. Narasimha Rao's tenure with a GDP growth of 5.2%, ending in electoral defeat, and Rajiv Gandhi's government ousted despite a 5.9% GDP growth due to the Bofors scandal, highlight the lack of a clear correlation between economic indicators and election outcomes. Similarly, governments with low inflation rates have faced defeats, revealing the complexity of voter decision-making. Various regional and national issues further complicate the electoral landscape. From farmer protests in Punjab to demands for Jammu and Kashmir's statehood restoration, agitation in Gujarat over parliamentary statements, and calls for peace in Manipur, each region grapples with distinct concerns. Nationally, debates over the Citizenship Amendment Act, Uniform Civil Code, and the arrest of politicians like Kejriwal in Delhi dominate discourse, indicating diverse voter priorities across states.

Recent surveys suggest unemployment, inflation, and corruption as key concerns, but the impact on election results remains uncertain. Despite the significance of political manifestos, their implementation often falls short.

Amit Shah's admission on a televised interview regarding the "Rs 15 lakh" promise being an election gimmick underscores this disparity, reflecting a broader disillusionment with political rhetoric. In modern electoral politics, many parties resort to offering freebies as a strategy to attract voters, particularly targeting women. These enticements, such as free electricity, travel, or education, hold significant sway over voter sentiments. However, the exact criteria guiding women's voting decisions remain elusive and difficult to pinpoint accurately.

As the Lok Sabha elections unfold, the current government's actions and decisions are under scrutiny by voters. Opposition parties leverage social media platforms to highlight various issues, adding complexity to the electoral discourse. Yet, the true criteria driving voter choices will only become apparent after the election results are announced. In essence, the crux of the matter lies in the uncertainty surrounding the factors influencing women voters and the broader electorate. As the nation stands on the cusp of electoral reckoning, the true essence of democracy shines through: the sovereignty of the voter. In the intricate dance of power and governance, it is the individual citizen who holds the ultimate sway, guiding the ship of state through the turbulent waters of democratic choice.

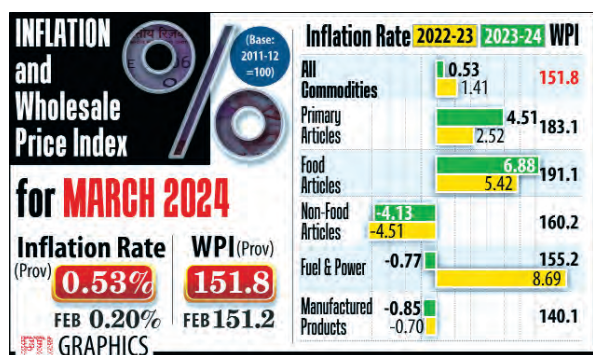

Wholesale inflation hits three-month high of 0.53 pc in March

New Delhi, Apr 15:

Wholesale inflation in the country rose marginally to three-month high of 0.53 per cent in March compared to 0.20 per cent in the preceding month due to increase in prices of vegetables, potato, onion and crude oil. The Wholesale Price Index (WPI)-based inflation was in the negative zone from April to October and had turned positive in November at 0.26 per cent. The inflation in March 2023 was 1.41 per cent. "The annual rate of inflation based on all-India Wholesale Price Index (WPI) number is 0.53 per cent (provisional) for the month of March, 2024 (over March, 2023)," the commerce and industry ministry said in a statement on Monday. Food inflation moved up marginal-



ly to 6.88 per cent in March from 5.42 per cent in the same month a year ago, data showed. Inflation in vegetables was 19.52 per cent, up from (- 2.39) per cent in the same month a year ago. WPI for potato witnessed a jump of 52.96 per cent against a deflation of 25.59 per cent, while for onion 56.99 per cent as compared to (-) 36.83 per cent in

March 2023. The food inflation also shot up to a three-month high of 4.6 per cent in March 2024. "The increase in the food inflation largely emanated from the cereal's inflation which stood at a 12-month high of 9 per cent. The other items such as pulses and vegetables which are important for ordinary consumers' /households' basket wit-

nessed elevated inflation of 17.2 per cent and 19.5 per cent, respectively in March 2024," India Ratings and Research Senior Director Sunil Kumar Sinha said. However, core inflation continues to be in a deflationary mode with March print at (-) 1.1 per cent.

The data showed that inflation in the crude petroleum segment rose by 10.26 per cent in March this year against a deflation of 23.53 per cent in March 2023 due to hardening of crude prices globally.

Positive rate of inflation in March 2024 is primarily due to increase in prices of food articles, electricity, machinery & equipment and other manufacturing etc.

The prices of manufactured products also declined 0.85 per cent.

Ola Electric cuts prices of entry-level e-scooter by up to Rs 10,000

New Delhi, Apr 15:

Ola Electric on Monday slashed prices of its entry-level scooter S1 X by Rs 5,000 to Rs 10,000 across variants, bringing it at par with conventional scooters. The new S1 X was launched in February this year with a price range of Rs 79,999 to Rs 1,09,999 across three variants.

In a virtual address, Ola Electric Chief Marketing Officer Anshul Khandelwal said the prices of the company's entry-level scooter have been reduced with immediate effect and deliveries would start next week. Under the new prices, S1 X with 4kWh battery will now cost Rs 99,999, down from Rs 1,09,999 announced earlier. Similarly, S1 X with 3kWh battery has been priced at Rs 84,999 instead of Rs 89,999 earlier. The S1 X 2kWh battery variant will cost Rs 69,999 (introductory price), reduced

from Rs 79,999 earlier, he said. "We feel that India needs much more. India needs a price at which they (consumers) can truly adopt EVs," Khandelwal said. An average scooter is priced at Rs 1 lakh, he said adding consumers have given feedback that they would think about electric scooters when prices are at the price of petrol scooters.

"We thought why not do that. Let's just ensure that we give you everything and much more than a petrol scooter," he asserted. Ola Electric's announcement comes just over a week after rival Ather Energy introduced a range of family electric scooter 'Rizta' priced between Rs 1,09,999 lakh and Rs 1,44,999 (ex-showroom Bengaluru). The company said the S1 X range marks its entry into the mass market segment. It comes with an 8-year/80,000 km complimentary battery warranty.

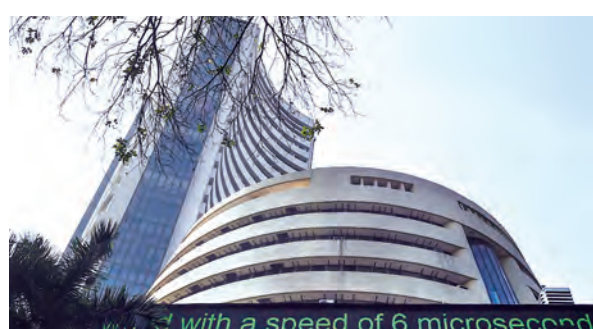

Sensex, Nifty tank over 1 pc on concerns over Middle East conflict, weak global trends

Stock markets took a beating on Monday with benchmark Sensex and Nifty tumbling over 1 per cent as escalating conflict in the Middle East and weak trends from global markets unnerved investors. Falling for the second session in a row, the 30-share BSE Sensex tanked 845.12 points or 1.14 per cent to settle at a more than two-week low of 73,399.78. During the day, it plunged 929.74 points or 1.25 per cent to 73,315.16.

The NSE Nifty declined 246.90 points or 1.10 per cent to settle at 22,272.50. Key indices had plunged by over 1 per cent in the previous session on Friday due to profit taking by investors at record high lev-



els. Sensex lost 1,638 points or 2.19 per cent while Nifty plunged 481 points or 2.13 per cent to slip below the 22,300 level in two straight sessions. Foreign fund outflows and hotter-than-expected US inflation data also played spoilsport for the markets. Analysts said the renewed conflict in the Middle East, proposed changes in the India-Mauritius tax treaty and

the hotter-than-expected US inflation proved to be major drags. From the Sensex basket, Wipro, ICICI Bank, Bajaj Finserv, Bajaj Finance, Tata Motors, Larsen & Toubro, Tech Mahindra and HDFC Bank were the major laggards. Nestle, Maruti and Bharti Airtel were the gainers. In the broader market, the BSE smallcap gauge declined 1.54 per

cent and midcap index dipped 1.50 per cent. Among the indices, services dropped by 2.12 per cent, financial services by 1.81 per cent, IT by 1.58 per cent, bankex by 1.55 per cent and utilities by 1.37 per cent. Energy and oil & gas were the gainers.

A total of 2,991 stocks declined while 913 advanced and 145 remained unchanged. In Asian markets, Seoul, Tokyo and Hong Kong settled lower while Shanghai ended in the positive territory. European markets were trading on a mixed note. Wall Street ended significantly lower on Friday. "Geopolitical tensions and higher-than-expected US inflation impacted investor sentiment and dragged the indices to a lower note.

Gold rises Rs 300; silver jumps Rs 500

New Delhi, Apr 15:

Gold price rose Rs 300 to Rs 73,050 per 10 grams in the national capital on Monday in line with firm trends in the global markets, according to HDFC Securities.

The precious metal had closed at Rs 72,750 per 10 grams in the previous session. Silver prices also jumped Rs 500 to Rs 85,700 per kilogram. In the previous trade, it had ended at Rs 85,200 per kilogram. "Spot gold prices (24 carats) in the Delhi markets are trading at Rs 73,050 per 10 grams, up Rs 300, taking positive cues from overseas markets," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst of Commodities at HDFC Securities, said. In the international markets, spot gold at Comex was trading at USD 2,355



per ounce, up USD 12 from the previous close. Gold resumed trading on a positive note, mainly lifted by safe haven buying after the escalation in the conflict between Iran and Israel over the weekend. Iran's attack on Israel reduced investor's appetite for risky assets, and increased demand for safe haven assets like bul-

lion, Gandhi said. Additionally, silver prices were trading higher at USD 28.25 per ounce. In the previous session, it had finished at USD 27.84 per ounce. According to market analysts, recent US inflation data diminished the possibility of an interest rate cut in June by the US Federal Reserve.

Rupee falls 6 paise to settle at 83.44 against US dollar

Mumbai, Apr 15:

The rupee declined 6 paise to settle at 83.44 (provisional) against the US dollar on Monday, in line with deep losses in equity markets and an elevated dollar against major rivals overseas amid geopolitical tensions. However, weakening crude oil prices in the international markets and positive domestic macroeconomic data restricted the rupee's fall, forex traders said. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 83.46 and traded between 83.42 and 83.47 against the greenback. The local unit finally settled at 83.44 (provisional), registering a loss of 6 paise from its previous close. On Friday, the rupee declined 7 paise to settle at



83.38 against the US dollar. Anuj Choudhary Research Analyst, Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, said the Indian rupee weakened on a strong US dollar and a decline in domestic markets. However, the sharp downside in the rupee was contained amid upbeat domestic macroeconomic data and possible intervention by the central bank. "We expect the rupee to trade with a slight negative bias on heightened global tensions in the

Middle East, which could impact global equities and strengthen the dollar further," Choudhary said, adding that "traders will take cues from India's trade deficit and US retail sales data. USD-INR spot price is expected to trade in a range of Rs 83.20 to Rs 83.80".

Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading 0.15 per cent lower at 105.68. Brent crude futures, the global oil benchmark, declined 0.94 per cent to USD 89.60 per barrel.

On the domestic equity market front, Sensex declined 845.12 points, or 1.14 per cent, to settle at 73,399.78. The Nifty fell 246.90 points, or 1.10 per cent, to close at 22,272.50.

India's engineering exports edge up to USD 109 bn in FY24 despite geo-political tensions

New Delhi, Apr 15:

India's engineering exports edged up to USD 109 billion in 2023-24 despite a slowdown in some of the major global markets amid geo-political tensions, EEPCC said on Monday. India's engineering exports are competitive globally and expected to gain further market share in the coming years, with the country entering into more FTAs, it added. The apex body of engineering goods exporters expects the value of shipments from the sector to rise to USD 300 billion by 2030 and generate a significant number of jobs and foreign exchange earnings in the process. Notably, the engineering sector is the largest contributor to India's overall exports, with a share of 24 per cent, and also contributes approximately 40 per cent of the country's total manufacturing exports. "The engineering

goods exports in FY24 surpassed the previous year's numbers despite a slowdown in some of the key global markets, geo-political tensions, Red Sea crisis and high freight rates," said EEPCC India Chairman Arun Kumar Garodia. Engineering exports in FY24 rose to USD 109.31 billion from USD 107.04 billion in the previous financial year, thus registering a growth of 2.13 per cent, the Commerce Ministry data released on Monday showed. According to EEPCC, FY24 closed on a strong note, with engineering exports rising 10.66 per cent year-on-year to USD 11.28 billion in March against USD 10.19 billion in the same month last year. "The monthly, as well as cumulative numbers, clearly show that the Indian engineering sector is quite competitive globally and consistently achieving success in penetrating new markets.

CSK have a man behind stumps telling them what's working: Pandya pats Dhoni

Mumbai Indians skipper Hardik Pandya could not hide his appreciation for Mahendra Singh Dhoni's tactical acumen following his team's 20-run loss to Chennai Super Kings at the Wankhede Stadium here on Sunday.

While Dhoni's barrage of three sixes and a hurriedly-completed two runs off the fourth and last delivery was something that gave CSK the winning cushion, it was the former India skipper's reading of the game from behind the stumps that Pandya felt made the difference on a better of a track.

"They (CSK) were smart with their plans and used the longer boundary well. They got the hang of it and they have a man behind the stumps telling them what's working," said Pandya after his side

failed to chase 206 despite Rohit Sharma smashing his second IPL century and batting from start to finish. CSK skipper Ruturaj Gaikwad gave Dhoni a huge compliment, saying his power-hitting with just four balls remaining made the differ-

ence between victory and defeat. Dhoni, 42, scored 20 off four deliveries, which in the end made the difference to the match's outcome. "Our young wicket-keeper (MSD) scoring three sixes down the order helped a lot and I think that was the difference. To

start off, on this kind of ground, you need 10-15 extra runs. We were looking at 215-220, but Bumrah bowled well," said Gaikwad, who took over the captaincy duties from Dhoni this season.

"Bowling-wise, we were spot-on with our execution. Even in powerplay, I would have taken six overs for 60. These kinds of venues demand both skills: batting and bowling. Our (Lasith) Malinga (Matheesha Pathirana) bowled exceptionally well and nailed those yorkers," he said.

On why he did not open the innings and instead sent Ajinkya Rahane with Ravindra, Gaikwad said, "Nothing, Jinks (Rahane) was carrying a bit of a niggle. Thought it was better for him to open and get away quick runs. I'm fine batting anywhere."

RR brace for Narine spin treat as KKR eye top spot

Rajasthan Royals' star-studded batting will face the serious challenge of decoding Sunil Narine's mystery at Eden Gardens when they take on two-time champions Kolkata Knight Riders in a top-of-the-table IPL clash here on Tuesday.

Narine, who is one month shy of turning 36, had played a pivotal role in KKR's twin triumphs under former skipper Gautam Gambhir in 2012 and 2014.

Ever since joining the side way back in 2012, Narine has sizzled at Eden Gardens with his crafty bowling, proving to a big threat to opposition batters.

Now after reuniting with Gambhir, who re-

turned to the team as their mentor, Narine dished out an all-round show, reigniting their title hopes again and a win against RR will hand them the pole position in the 10-team standings ahead of the halfway stage of the season.

His 1/19 against the Sunrisers Hyderabad or 1/17 against Lucknow Super Giants may have failed to grab attention but those eight overs where he did not concede a single boundary made all the difference in the end for KKR.

Phil Salt may have walked away with the player-of-the-match award in their solid eight-wicket win over LSG here on Sunday, but it was Narine, who choked LSG in the middle overs to limit them to a below-par 161 for 7.

Come Tuesday, the likes of Sanju Samson, Riyan Parag and Shimron Hetmyer -- who all have struck at the rate of more than 155 this season -- will be up against the Narine challenge.

It remains to be seen if Jos Buttler is fit to be included in the playing XI after missing their last fixture against Punjab Kings.

With his ability to express himself at the top, Narine, who has a strike-rate of 183.51 and averages 33-plus this season, has a Rashid Khan-like aura at KKR.

Their IPL record buy Mitchell Starc has also shut all the noise to return to his elements, claiming two wickets in the last over for his 3/28 against LSG.

In such a scenario, the top-of-the-table contest may well boil down to KKR's bowling versus RR's batting.

KKR's only weaklink could be their skipper Shreyas Iyer's poor form with the bat.

RR have a formidable bowling lineup in Trent Boult, Avesh Khan, Yuzvendra Chahal and Keshav Maharaj, while it remains to be seen if Ravichandran Ashwin is fit for the match.

Absolutely ordinary bowling, ordinary captaincy: Gavaskar

Star India all-rounder Hardik Pandya faced scathing criticism from prominent former players after Mumbai Indians' fourth loss in the ongoing IPL with the great Sunil Gavaskar slamming him for his "absolutely ordinary bowling and ordinary captaincy" so far.

Booed and heckled by fans ever since he took over MI's captaincy, Pandya found himself in the line of fire of the legendary Gavaskar and former England captain Kevin Pietersen after his team slumped to yet another defeat, this time to Chennai Super Kings, here on Sunday night.

It was the 26 runs that Pandya conceded in the final over with Mahendra Singh Dhoni going hammer and tongs, which

proved to be decisive as Chennai Super Kings notched up a 20-run win over MI. "Oh, absolutely ordinary bowling, ordinary captaincy. They should have been restricted despite the fact that Ruturaj Gaikwad had batted so well along with Shivam Dube. I do believe that they should have been restricted to 185-190," Gavaskar said. "Probably the worst kind of bowling that I've seen for a long, long time," Gavaskar said on Star Sports during the innings break after CSK posted 206 for 4. "It almost looks like I've had this embrace with my hero. I've got the kind of deliveries that he's gonna hit for sixes. One six is fine. The next one is a length ball when you know this batter is hunting for a length ball that he wants to hit."

"Third ball is again a full toss on the legs when you know he (Dhoni) is looking for a six." Pandya finished with figures of 2 for 43 from his three overs and also had a tough time with the bat, managing a mere two runs off six balls at a crucial juncture of the game as MI ended at 186 for six despite a fine 63-ball 105 by former skipper Rohit Sharma.

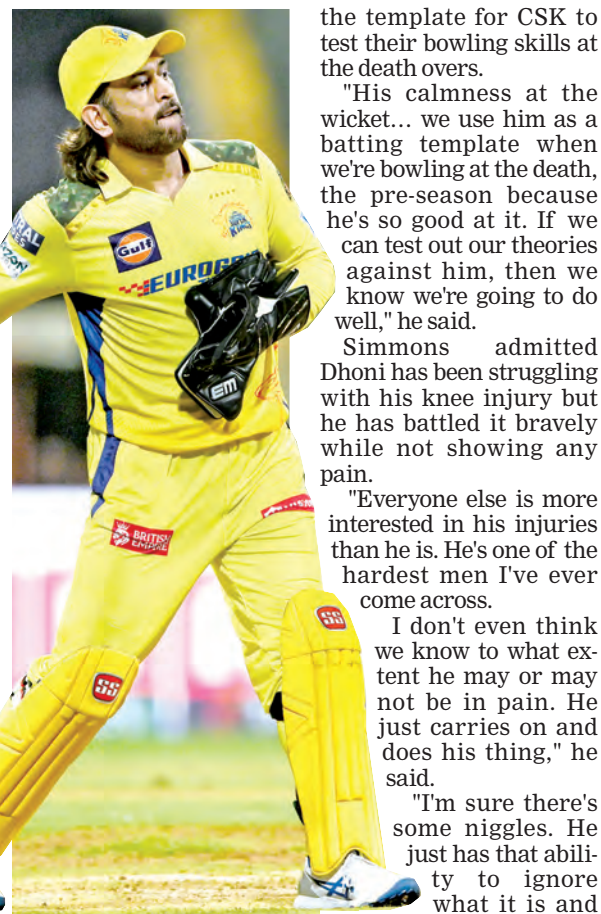

His late blitz proved to be the difference as CSK pipped MI by 20 runs to take the third position in the IPL points table. "They're looking at restricting us to under 200 and then they're suddenly facing 206 with an over like that. Every time — we live close to him — we continue to amaze us. To go out there and hit the first ball like that for six and then continue the way he does. "But he has been batting exceptionally well in

the template for CSK to test their bowling skills at the death overs. "His calmness at the wicket... we use him as a batting template when we're bowling at the death, the pre-season because he's so good at it. If we can test out our theories against him, then we know we're going to do well," he said. Simmons admitted Dhoni has been struggling with his knee injury but he has battled it bravely while not showing any pain. "Everyone else is more interested in his injuries than he is. He's one of the hardest men I've ever come across. I don't even think we know to what extent he may or may not be in pain. He just carries on and does his thing," he said. "I'm sure there's some niggles. He just has that ability to ignore what it is and do what needs to be done. We're more concerned about his injuries. When I say we, I mean the public (which) is more concerned about his injuries than he is," Simmons added.

Pollard defends Pandya amid criticism, urges support

said at the post-match press conference Sunday night. "He (Pandya) is a confident guy. He has been great around the group. In cricket, you have good days and you have bad days. I'm seeing an individual who's working bloody hard to continue his skill and to ply his trade."

Pollard reminded fans about the possibility of Pandya being picked for India's T20 World Cup campaign, saying if that happens everyone would be "singing his praises". "This is an individual that's going to represent the country in less than six weeks' time.

15-year-old Tanvi hopes to emulate Sindhu's aggression in Uber Cup

New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

Groomed by a sports-loving mother, inspired by the peerless P V Sindhu and aspiring to be Indian badminton's aggressive new kid on the block, Tanvi Sharma is nothing like an average 15-year-old.

Her claim to limited fame at this point is the fact that she is the youngest member of India's women's squad for this month's Thomas and Uber Cup in Chengdu, China. "I



want to become like Sindhu didi, she is my inspiration. I watch all her matches. 'Kejriwal being treated like hardcore criminal'

New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann met Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal in Tihar jail on Monday and alleged the AAP chief was not being given amenities that are provided even to hardcore criminals.

Mann, who was accompanied by AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sandeep Pathak, said they met Kejriwal for half-an-hour but they were separated by a glass wall and interacted over a phone call.

"I became emotional seeing him. He is being treated like a hardcore criminal. What is his fault? Is it his fault that he built mohalla clinics?" said Mann.

The Punjab chief minister said he was asked by Kejriwal to visit different places for campaigning for INDIA bloc candidates.

He also said the Aam

Aadmi Party will emerge a strong political force on June 4, when Lok Sabha election results are announced.

Pathak said Kejriwal was worried about the people of Delhi and was constantly inquiring whether they were getting subsi-

dies. "Even while being inside jail, he is worried about the people of Delhi. He said that from next week, he will call two ministers to discuss issues. He has also asked party MLAs to go out among people," Pathak said.

The meeting took place in the 'mulakat jangla,' a room divided with a glass wall, a Tihar jail official said.

Security was already heightened with local police being deployed outside Tihar jail, given that Mann is Z+ protectee.

The Delhi chief minister and AAP national convenor was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on March 21. His current judicial custody is expiring on Monday.

The ED has accused Kejriwal of being involved in the "entire conspiracy of Delhi liquor scam, in drafting and implementation of the policy, for favouring and benefitting the quid pro receiving kickbacks and eventually using part of proceeds of crime generated out of the scheduled offence in the election campaign for Goa Assembly elections".

'BJP to crack whip against Eshwarappa'

Hassan, Apr 15 (PTI):

Karnataka BJP President B Y Vijayendra said on Monday that the party would take disciplinary action against rebel leader K S Eshwarappa, who has decided to contest as an independent in Shimoga Lok Sabha segment.

This is the first time the party has reacted on the issue. Vijayendra said that his brother and Shimoga MP B Y Raghavendra, who is seeking re-election, will win the seat by over two lakh votes and people will teach a lesson to Eshwarappa.

Eshwarappa, a former Deputy Chief Minister who had also served as the party's state unit President, has entered the fray blaming Vijayendra and his father and veteran party leader B S Yediyurappa for his son K E Kantesh being denied

the ticket to contest from the Haveri Lok Sabha seat.

"We will take disciplinary action against him (Eshwarappa), and voters of the constituency will also take action against him. The more he speaks, double the votes that will come in favour of Raghavendra," Vijayendra said here in response to the 75-year-old's allegation of Yediyurappa favouring his sons and the party's Bangalore North seat candidate Shobha Karandlaje.

Speaking to reporters here, he said Raghavendra is a popular MP and people will reject such "loose talks" by Eshwarappa.

"What is the contribution of Eshwarappa to Shivamogga district having been the Minister and Deputy Chief Minister. How Raghavendra has done development works as an MP, and what are Yediyurappa's contribution as CM to the district and the state is discussed in every household. There is no need to learn for him," he said.

Leader of Opposition R Ashoka had earlier this month indicated that BJP will decide on taking disciplinary action against Eshwarappa, once he files his nomination against the party's official candidate.

Eshwarappa is steadfast on his decision to contest spurning efforts by party leaders to pacify him.

SC refuses plea for voting facilities to 18,000 internally-displaced

● In Manipur polls

New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

The Supreme Court on Monday refused to entertain a plea seeking voting facilities for around 18,000 people displaced internally due to the ethnic strife in Manipur for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections.

The polling for the two Lok Sabha seats of Manipur will be held in two phases on April 19 and 26.

A bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra said interference of this court, particularly at this related stage, would cause substantial impediments in the conduct of the ensuing general elections of

the Lok Sabha for Manipur.

"You have come at the last minute. At this stage, what can be virtually done? We cannot interfere at this stage," the bench said.

The top court was hearing a plea by Manipur resident Naulak Khamsuanthang and others seeking a direction to the Election Commission of India (ECI) to make arrangements to enable internally-displaced persons settled outside Manipur to enable them to cast their votes in the Lok Sabha elections by setting up special polling booths in the states where they are residing.

"There are 18,000 internally-displaced people. They want to vote in the elections in Manipur," the lawyer appearing for the petitioners said.

SC appreciates protective measures by railways

● Disposes of petition

New Delhi, Apr 15 (PTI):

The Supreme Court on Monday appreciated the steps taken by the Indian Railways to prevent train accidents, including the automatic train protection system 'Kavach', to avoid collisions. A bench of Justices Surya Kant and K V Viswanathan disposed of a petition that raised several issues related to passenger safety after taking note of multiple steps taken by the public sector behemoth to prevent accidents and promote safe travel. "We appreciate the steps taken by the Railways," the bench said, while taking note of the status report filed by Attorney General R Venkataramani.

While hearing the plea filed by petitioner Vishal

Tiwari on January 2, the apex court had sought to know about the protective measures, steps implemented so far or proposed to be taken by the Centre, including the 'Kavach' system. It had asked the petitioner to hand over a copy of his plea to the office of the Attorney General.

Referring to the train accident in Odisha's Balasore district in June last year that had left 288 people dead, the petitioner had claimed non-implementation of the 'Kavach' scheme was resulting in accidents. He had said a lot of accidents have taken place in the past due to collision between trains.

The plea had sought directions to the Centre to set up an expert commission headed by a retired judge of the apex court and consisting of technical members to analyse and review the risk and

safety parameters in the railway system and to suggest systematic safety modifications for strengthening the safety mechanism. It claimed that non-implementation of 'Kavach' at the earliest had resulted in a massive loss of life and damage to public property which imputed direct liability of gross negligence and breach of duty of care to respondent authorities.

It had also sought issuance of guidelines for implementation of the 'Kavach' system with immediate effect.

The petition was filed days after the crash involving Bengaluru-Howrah Superfast Express and Shalimar-Chennai Central Coromandel Express, which were carrying around 2,500 passengers, and a goods train in June last year near Bahanaga Bazar station in Balasore.

Azam Khan loyalists to be under test in Rampur

Rampur (UP), Apr 15 (PTI):

The absence of Samajwadi Party leader Azam Khan from Rampur politics has left party workers in a dilemma whether to vote for his alternative or keep their allegiance to the stalwart who has dominated the local politics for over five decades.

Khan, who is currently lodged in Sitapur jail, has been replaced by Mohibullah Nadvi, a cleric of a mosque located on Delhi's Parliament Street.

Changing party candidates may be normal for any other Lok Sabha constituency, but in the case of Rampur, it is not at all trivial.

Asim Raja, a close aide of Azam Khan, had also filed his nomination describing himself an SP candidate, despite the party giving ticket to Nadvi. His nomination was rejected during scrutiny.

Azam Khan has undisputedly been the most influential leader in Rampur in the last five decades and has had direct involvement in all activities of the SP in the district all along.

The SP, however, has this time been apparently forced to duke it out without his clout, and a whole-hearted support of his followers.

Speaking about the confusion in the local unit, party's district president

Ajay Sagar said, "We are deeply saddened that this time neither mantri ji (Azam Khan) nor any member of his family is in the electoral fray. We are missing him a lot."

"Every possible effort will be made to make the candidate sent by the party win," he told PTI.

Rampur Parliamentary seat will go to vote in the first phase on April 19.

Nadvi, throughout his campaign, has called Azam Khan his "bade bhai" (elder brother) and sought people's votes, so that Khan could be freed.

While a hero for many in the area, Khan has been described by the rival BJP as someone who stalled progress and wrought a

"rule of injustice."

According to the BJP workers, the party's Ghanshayam Lodhi, who became MP recently in a bypoll, deserves more opportunity to bring development to the place.

Sagar had earlier held a press conference demanding that SP President Akhilesh Yadav contest the election from Rampur and threatened with a boycott if he did not.

Sagar claimed that for the last few years, the district administration has been threatening the Muslim voters to not cast their votes.

When such arbitrariness reigns, only a stalwart like Akhilesh can stop it, he said.

Omar challenges Ghulam Nabi Azad to contest LS polls against him

Jammu, Apr 15 (PTI):

National Conference (NC) vice-president Omar Abdullah challenged Democratic Progressive Azad Party (DPAP) chairman Ghulam Nabi Azad on Monday to contest the upcoming Lok Sabha polls against him, instead of "hiding behind a camera" and making statements targeting his party.

Abdullah, a former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister, is contesting the election from north Kashmir's Baramulla parliamentary constituency. He is cur-



rently on a four-day tour of the Chenab valley region to garner support for INDIA bloc candidate Choudhary Lal Singh.

The Chenab valley, comprising Doda, Kishtwar and Ramban districts, is an area where Azad has considerable influence. It also forms part of the Udhampur parliamentary constituency,

which is going to polls on April 19.

Azad, also a former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister, was named as the DPAP candidate from the Anantnag-Rajouri Lok Sabha seat but he subsequently said he is not sure about his candidature as he was not consulted by the party about it. "I challenge him (Azad) to contest (the polls) against me to test his strength. Hiding behind a camera and giving statements (against the NC) is very easy. If he is a man, let him fight against me. I

will see how many votes he gets," Abdullah told reporters on the sidelines of his roadshow in the Thathri area of Doda district.

Braving inclement weather, the NC leader carried on with his roadshow in support of Lal Singh, who is contesting the polls on a Congress ticket against Union minister Jitendra Singh.

Asked about Azad's onslaught against the NC in his election rallies, Abdullah claimed that he is doing so at the behest of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP).

Rajkot LS seat to remain BJP fortress

● Despite anti-Rupala stir by Rajputs

Rajkot, Apr 15 (PTI):

Even as Parshottam Rupala, the BJP's nominee from Gujarat's Rajkot Lok Sabha seat, is facing agitation by Kshatriya community members, political analysts and voters believe the Union minister will emerge victorious.

While the analysts claim Rajkot is an "unbreachable fortress" of the BJP, voters laud the development works done by the government under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership.

Rupala recently claimed the erstwhile 'maharajas'

succumbed to the persecution of foreign rulers, including the Britishers.

Despite Rupala's apology, the Kshatriyas, also called Rajputs, see his re-

marks as an insult to them and have asked the BJP to withdraw his candidature or face defeat in Rajkot, a Patidar-dominated seat considered as BJP's

stronghold. Elections to all the 26 Lok Sabha seats in Gujarat will be held on May 7.

The BJP has dropped two-time MP Mohan Kundariya and nominated Rupala, belonging to the Kadva sub-set of Patidar community.

The Congress has fielded former MLA Paresh Dhanani, a Leuva Patidar. Rupala and Dhanani belong to neighbouring Amreli district.

Three-term Rajya Sabha member Rupala is contesting the Lok Sabha election for the first time. He was an MLA from Amreli in 1991, 1995 and 1998.

In the 2022 assembly polls, Dhanani defeated Rupala from Amreli. Dhanani also won the assembly seat in 2012 and 2017 but lost to BJP's Kaushik Vekaria in 2022.

In the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, Dhanani contested from Amreli but lost to BJP's Naran Kachhadia.

Rajkot Lok Sabha seat has nearly 23 lakh voters. The Patidars - Kadva and Leuva - are a decisive force with around 5.8 lakh electors.

There are also 3.5 lakh Koli voters, 2.3 lakh Maldharis (both OBCs), 1.5 lakh Rajputs, 1.8 lakh Dalits, around 2 lakh voters from minorities and 3 lakh from Brahmin and Lohana communities.

Police search Cong MLA's premises in MP

Chhindwara, Apr 15 (PTI):

Police and excise personnel searched the residence and other premises of a tribal Congress MLA in Madhya Pradesh's Chhindwara district after a complaint of hoarding of cash and liquor but no such recovery was made, an official said on Monday.

The opposition Congress, however, termed it as harassment of its tribal MLA Nilesch Uikey through misuse of power by the BJP government.

Superintendent of Police Manoj Khatri said following a complaint about hoarding of cash and liquor, a team of police and excise department personnel searched several places in Rajola Raiyat village on Sunday evening.

But, the team returned

after not finding anything at those places, he said. Legislator Uikey, who represents Pandhurna (ST) assembly seat in Chhindwara, said the police and excise team "raided" his house and agricultural fields at around 4 pm on Sunday.
