PM Modi to address rallies in Chh'garh in next two days

RAIPUR: The campaigning for the second phase of Lok Sabha elections in Chhattisgarh is heating up with Prime Minister Narendra Modi scheduled to address rallies over the next two days. Union Home Minister Amit Shah addressed a public meeting in Kanker Lok Sabha constituency in the Bastar region on Monday, said BJP state media co-incharge Anurag Agrawal. PM Modi will address campaign rallies on April 23 and 24 in Sarguja, Mahasamund, and Janjgir-Champa Lok Sabha constituencies, he added. Polling will be held for Rajnandgaon, Mahasamund, and Kanker seats in the second phase on April 26. Shah landed at Swami Vivekanand Airport in Raipur on Sunday evening and chaired a meeting of senior party leaders at the state BJP headquarters.

Rs 600 for enrolling law graduates as lawyers

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court said on Monday that not more than Rs 600 can be charged for enrolling law graduates as advocates across the country, as it reserved its verdict on pleas challenging "exorbitant" fees being levied by state bar bodies for the purpose. Reserving the judgement on as many as 10 petitions, a bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and Justice JB Pardiwala referred to Section 24 of the Advocates Act, 1961 and said the fee for a law graduate to be enrolled as a lawyer is Rs 600 and Parliament alone can increase it by amending the law.

NEW DELHI: Former vice president M Venkaiah Naidu, founder of Sulabh International Bindeshwar Pathak and a host of other prominent persons were conferred with Padma Awards by President Droupadi Murmu at a ceremonial function held at the Rashtrapati Bhavan here on Monday. Naidu, Pathak, who was given the award posthumously, and renowned Bharatanatyam dancer Padma Subrahmanyam were conferred with the Padma Vibhushan. Actor Mithun Chakraborty, singer Usha Uthup, former Uttar Pradesh governor Ram Naik and industrialist Sitaram Jindal were conferred with the Padma Bhushan. Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah and External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, among others, were present at the function. Padma Awards, one of the highest civilian honours of the country, are conferred in three categories -- Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri. The awards are given in various disciplines or fields of activities, viz.- art, social work, public affairs, science and engineering, trade and industry, medicine, literature and education, sports, civil service, etc. The Padma Vibhushan is awarded for exceptional and distinguished service, the Padma Bhushan for distinguished service of high order and the Padma Shri for distinguished service in any field.



No normalisation of scores for CUET-UG, NET

Students have been raising concerns about the normalisation of scores

NEW DELHI: Normalisation of scores for the Common University Entrance Test-UG and the National Eligibility Test is being done away with from this year, according to UGC Chief Jagadesh Kumar. "No normalisation of scores will be required this year since both exams will be conducted in a single shift for a subject," Kumar told PTI. Normalisation is a process for revising the score of a student in a way that it becomes comparable with the score of another. This becomes necessary when an examination in the same subject is held in multiple sessions, each with a different paper. Students have been raising concerns about the normalisation of scores "unfairly" impacting their performance in the exam. "Earlier, we had to conduct the test for the same paper for two or three days in our endeavour to provide the first-choice centre to the students as much as possible. But this year, by adopting the OMR mode, a large number of centres will be available at schools and colleges, enabling us to conduct the test across the country on the same day. "If the test is conducted on multiple days for the same paper, normalisation is required and it is a scientific method," the UGC chairman said. The CUET-UG will be conducted from May 15 to 24 this time. In a shift from the earlier pattern of conducting the crucial exam for admission to undergraduate courses in a Computer Based Test (CBT) mode, CUET-UG for 15 subjects will be conducted in pen and paper mode while for 48 subjects in online mode.

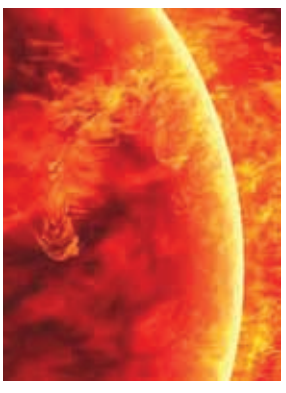

Intense heat wave to continue for five days

NEW DELHI: The intense heat wave scorching large parts of east India will continue for another five days, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Monday. The ongoing spell of heat wave, the second this month, is broiling parts of West Bengal, Odisha, Jharkhand and Bihar. Heatwave conditions have been prevailing in Odisha since April 15 and the Gangetic West Bengal since April 17, according to the MeT department. In a statement, the MD said heat wave to severe heat wave conditions are expected in parts of West Bengal, Karnataka, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and Jharkhand during the next five days. High humidity could add to people's inconvenience in coastal Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Karnataka, Goa, Kerala, West Bengal and Bihar, it said. Substantially high night temperatures are likely in east Madhya Pradesh on April 22 and April 23. High night temperatures are considered dangerous because the body doesn't get the chance to cool down.

According to the information, when

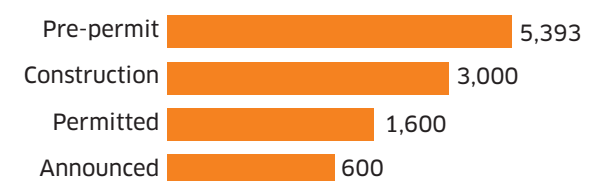

JUDICIAL REMAND

No relief to Ex-IAS Anil Tuteja on judicial remand for two days

RAIPUR: Retired IAS Anil Tuteja, arrested in the excise scam case, was presented in the court through video conferencing after completion of one-day judicial remand. During the hearing in the case, the court of District Judge passed an order to send Tuteja to jail on judicial remand for 2 days.

Now, after the special judge of PMLA court returns from leave, the District Judge court has given instructions to produce him on April 24 and take remand.

On Saturday, ED had summoned Anil Tuteja and his son Yash Tuteja from the ACB/EOW office and took both with them to the zonal office for questioning. While after a long interrogation of both of them, Yash Tuteja was released early in the morning but Anil Tuteja was arrested and presented in the court. ED had sought 14 days' ED remand from Anil Tuteja to interrogate him in the fresh ECIR registered by ED in the excise scam case.

Injured Naxalite Sindhu caught by Odisha Police

RAIPUR: Mango Nureti, a female Naxalite cadre, was injured in an encounter between Naxalites and police that took place on April 12 in Kanker district of Chhattisgarh.

She was absconding after the encounter in which 29 Naxalites were killed, including some

notorious leaders with bounties on their heads worth lakhs of rupees.

On the night of April 20, the Navrangpur Police team of South Odisha arrested the injured Nureti and handed her over to the Chhattisgarh Police.

RAIPUR: Pediatric emergency physicians should be encouraged to become familiar with it, as it is a safe technology. POCUS can be extremely helpful in performing diagnosis, managing critical situations, and guiding procedures, which results in globally improving pediatric patient care, said experts in the 10th National Conference on 'Emergency Medicine: Pediatric Advances and Recent Trends' (EMPART-24).

While inaugurating the CME, Lt Gen Ashok Jindal (Retd), Executive Director, said that pediatrics is a specialized medical discipline that needs to be explored regularly because every child is different from others. 'Pediatric emergencies are always challenging, as infants and children cannot express their health issues properly. In a large country such as India, we need to explore technological innovation and equip medical officers in the periphery with it. This will help to reduce pediatric emergency cases in tertiary care centers. Our overall aim should be to reduce the mortality rate and ensure the

It can be used by various specialties and may be broadly divided into diagnostic and procedural applications. 'All facilities are available in the pediatric emergency for the children. The department has been focusing on POCUS, as children are usually unable to explain their symptoms. New technology and techniques have been introduced for early diagnosis by the department,

Course Director Dr. Prena Batra said that 'EMPART-24' provided training and academic knowledge to the participants to deal with every aspect of pediatric emergencies. The 10th successful program will ensure providing pediatric emergency services to the most needed and vulnerable population.

The Pediatrics Emergency Department at AIIMS receives an average of 30 cases of 0-14-year-old children per day. Most

of them were found to be suffering from nephrotoxicity, trauma, burns, accidental poison intake, insect bites, pneumonia, and respiratory distress. Half of them needed to be admitted immediately. CME covered a wide spectrum of topics, including transfusion, cardiac emergencies, renal management, life-threatening rashes, and decontamination techniques.

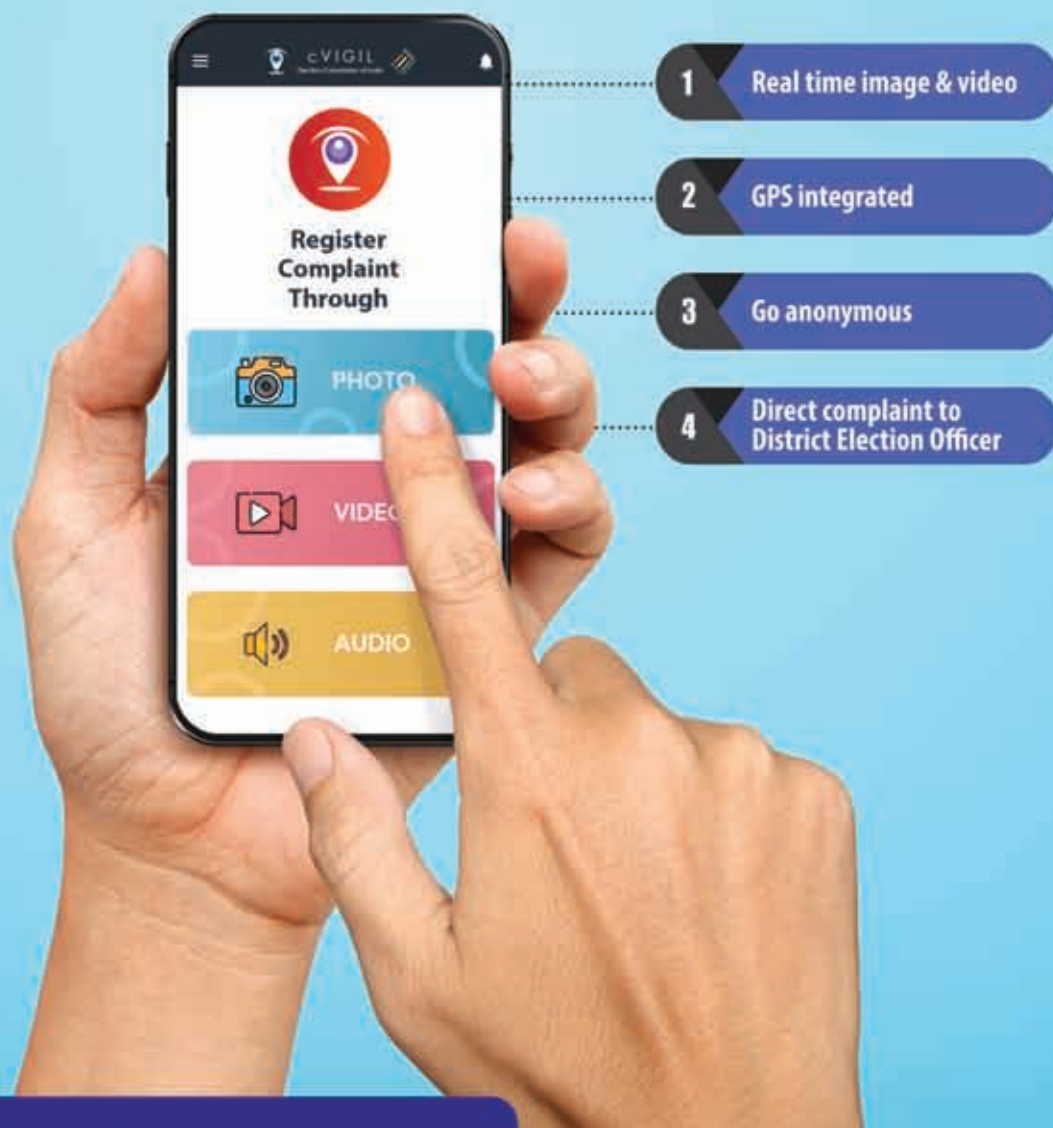

Narcotics worth Rs 3.24 cr seized in West Singhbhum ahead of LS polls

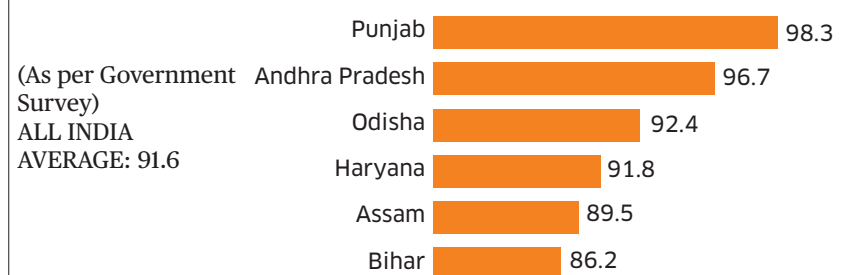

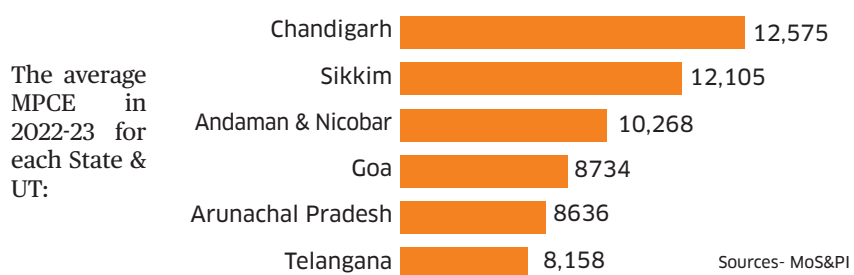

The veto by the US in the UN Security Council, thwarting a resolution recommending full UN membership for Palestine, echoes a persisting stance that impedes progress toward a just resolution in the Middle East. Despite the draft's substantial backing, with 12 out of 15 members expressing support, the veto stifled a significant opportunity for peace and equity in the region. The rationale offered by the US, advocating for direct negotiations between Israel and Palestine, disregards the glaring reality of entrenched stonewalling from Israeli authorities. This veto perpetuates a status quo where impunity shields injustice, rendering the aspiration for a sustainable peace increasingly elusive. Palestine's quest for full membership resonates with the global community, as evidenced by overwhelming support anticipated in the UN General Assembly. Over 140 member states already recognize Palestine, underscoring the widespread acknowledgment of its rightful place among nations. The denial of this recognition only prolongs the suffering of Palestinian civilians, who have endured the ravages of conflict and occupation. The timing of this veto is particularly poignant, coming on the heels of a devastating assault on Gaza, which wrought unimaginable suffering on innocent civilians. The window for meaningful dialogue and reconciliation narrows with each instance of international inaction. The US insistence on bilateral negotiations overlooks the power dynamics at play, where one party holds disproportionate leverage and the other faces systemic marginalization. Direct talks have consistently faltered in the face of Israeli intransigence, perpetuating a cycle of violence and dispossession. Palestine's current status as a non-member observer state falls short of the recognition it deserves. While its flag may flutter outside UN headquarters, it remains symbolically distanced from the community of nations. Bridging this divide is not merely a symbolic gesture but a crucial step towards affirming the dignity and rights of the Palestinian people. In the pursuit of peace, unilateral actions that perpetuate injustice must be challenged.

Sandeep Pandey returned his Magsaysay Award last year in protest against America's approach towards Palestine. He also returned all the degrees he had got from American universities - a dual MS in Manufacturing from Syracuse University, New York and a PhD in mechanical engineering from the University of Berkeley. He correctly highlighted the contrast between America's internal and foreign policy. While expressing his sincere admiration for America's high regard for human rights within its boundaries, he criticised the USA for showing a different face in Gaza. He said, "I think the US is one country which respects human rights the most and offers the best freedom of expression, but sadly it is true only within the country."

He observed that the US actions of abruptly leaving Afghanistan and helping Israel against Palestine were against its commitment to human rights. He said, "It is strange that the US, which not very long back handed over Afghanistan, much bigger in area, to Taliban on a silver platter knowing very well that it was jeopardizing the civil liberties of common Afghans, especially

the women, parrots the Israeli position about Hamas being a terrorist organisation ignoring the fact that Hamas has won an election in Palestine, unlike the Taliban." Interestingly, there is so much to be learned from the internal policy of the United States. The same thing is applicable to Germany because of its sensitivity to human rights violations. In a recent development, Germany has reiterated its sensitivity against even a faint trace of racism. The display of any Nazi symbol includ-

ing the "SS" has long been banned in Germany. Recently, Germany has withdrawn jerseys with number 44 immediately after it was pointed out that there was a resemblance between that number and the stylized SS used by Nazi Party's Schutzstaffel group.

However, it appears that just like America, Germany leaves its commendable sensitivity against human rights violations far behind in their foreign policy. Nicaragua has recently brought a case against

Germany at the International Court of Justice. In the case file, Nicaragua said, "Germany is facilitating the commission of genocide" in Gaza and violating the Genocide Convention by providing Israel with military and financial aid.

Earlier, South Africa sought emergency measures from the court. The court in its order asked Israel to ensure that its citizens and soldiers must not violate the Genocide Convention. The convention forbids actions intended to destroy a

national, ethnic, racial or religious group.

It has become extremely difficult to supply food to the Gazans because of Israel's blockade. The United Nations officials have warned that the amount of food entering Gaza cannot feed its 2.2 million people. Now, Gazans have been relying on a wild plant known as Khobeza to battle hunger. The Ministry of Health in the Gaza Strip said that over 33,000 Palestinians, including many children and women, had been killed in Gaza. Samantha Power, the director of the US Agency for International Development has admitted that famine has begun in Gaza. She said, "In northern Gaza, the rate of malnutrition prior to October 7 was almost zero, and it is now almost 1 in 3 kids." Global experts and aid agencies have warned for months that nearly all 2.2 million Palestinians would soon face extreme hunger. The dichotomy between the internal and foreign policy of the United States of America and Germany is profound. It is said that charity begins at home. Vodafone Idea FPO subscribed 3.3 times, retail lags

NEW DELHI: Debt-saddled telecom operator Vodafone Idea Ltd's Rs 18,000 crore follow-on offering (FPO) on Monday was subscribed more than 3.3 times, as institutional investors poured in money but the retail segment lagged. On the last day of the offering, as many as 4,212.56 crore shares were sought against the issue size of 1,260 crore at 14.30 hrs, according to information on stock exchanges.

The final numbers will be known when the issue closes on Monday evening. Qualified institutional buyers sought 8.71 times of their 360 crore shares reserved for them, while non-institutional investors bid for 2.7 times of the 270 crore shares earmarked for them. Response from retail investors, who have been offered the biggest chunk, lagged with just 56 per cent of 630 crore shares being picked up. **PTI**

NEW DELHI: Sustaining the economic growth momentum of 7 per cent in 2024-25 and beyond is feasible on the back of favorable monsoon, higher farm productivity and improved global trade, RBI Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) member Shashanka Bhide said on Monday. During 2023-24, the economy is likely to record a growth

rate of near 8 per cent on account of good performance of manufacturing and infrastructure sectors. "(India's economic) Growth in the current year is likely to be supported by agriculture with a favourable monsoon and improved global trade. Sustaining the growth momentum of 7 per cent seems feasible," he told PTI. Bhide further said that in the long-term, the need for productiv-

NEW DELHI: Gold and silver prices retreated from record high levels in the national capital on Monday, with the precious metal plunging by Rs 450 per 10 grams, due to weak global trends and easing tensions in West Asia. Gold prices declined by Rs 450 to Rs 73,650 per 10 grams amid weak trends in the overseas markets, according to HDFC Securities. The yellow metal had settled at Rs 74,100 per 10 grams on Friday. Silver prices also tumbled by Rs 1,100 to Rs 85,500 per kg. In the previous close, it had closed at Rs 86,600 per kg. "Spot gold prices (24 carats) in the Delhi markets are trading at Rs 73,650 per 10 grams, down by Rs 450 against the previous close," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst of Commodities at HDFC Securities, said.

When contacted, Apple declined to comment on the projection. Apple has plans to scale up production in India by over five-fold to around USD 40 billion (about 3.32 lakh crore) in the next 4-5 years. According to market research firm Counterpoint Research, Apple led the India market with

the highest revenue in 2023 for the first time, while Samsung topped the chart in terms of volume sales. The firm in its recent report said Apple surpassed the 10-million-unit mark in shipments and captured the top position in revenue in a calendar year for the first time.

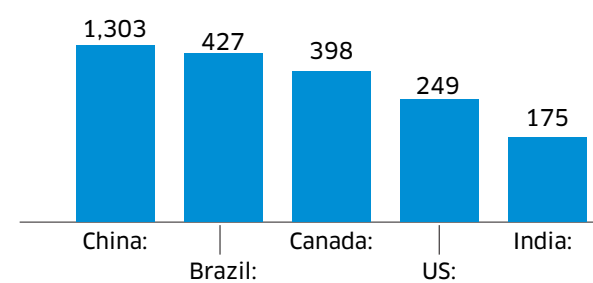

NEW DELHI: A political slugfest erupted on Monday over the Ghazipur landfill fire incident with the BJP attacking AAP-led MCD over the blaze which left local residents gasping for breath and racked with other health issues.

Delhi cabinet minister Atishi said the incident will be investigated to ascertain its cause.

A major fire broke out at the landfill site in east Delhi on Sunday evening. Officials cited hot and dry weather conditions as the likely trigger for the fire.

Police have registered an FIR against unidentified persons.

According to police, a case under section 336 (act endangering life or personal safety of others) and 278 (making atmosphere noxious to health) has been registered at Ghazipur Police Station and a probe has begun.

ited the site and charged it was an example of "corruption" of the AAP government even as mayor Shelly Oberoi, who also went to the site, said this is not the time for politics. a major fire broke out there. A wall made of tin panels marking the boundary of the landfill also fell as a portion of garbage broke away. The several metres long wall was erected on the poultry market side. "It has been 15 hours since the fire broke out. This smoke is not any common smoke, it is very poisonous. We are unable to keep our eyes open due to irritation and are experiencing difficulty in breathing," Ram Kumar from Gharoli village, close to the landfill, said.

Several residents told PTI that due to the smoke they were not able to send their children to

school. They accused the MCD and the city government of not taking any action to give a better life to them. "It has been 15 years. Ministers visit us only during elections. But after that not a single one returns to our door to know if we are facing any problem. This landfill is a curse for us. We are forced to suffer foul smells every day. And now this fire has caused several health problems for us. Why do they (ministers) want us to die?" Ilayas Khan said. Rakesh Kumar, a heart patient, said he had to move to his relative's place because he could not bear the suffocation any longer.

While granting relief to the convicts, the high court had noted that they have been in custody for 14 years.

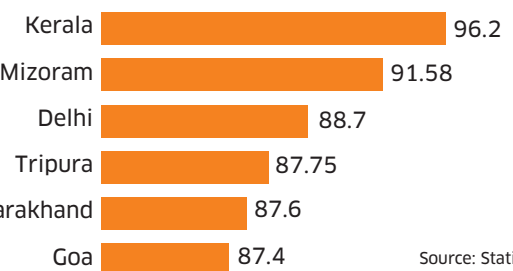
It has "returned triumphant to her base port at Goa on April 21 after a historic transoceanic expedition of nearly two months duration", the Navy said.

Australian PM criticises X over church violence content

Australian PM Anthony Albanese criticised social media platform X for refusing to remove graphic posts about a knife attack on a bishop and priest in a Sydney church.

MELBOURNE: X Corp, the tech company founded last year by billionaire Elon Musk to succeed Twitter, announced last week it would fight in court Australian orders to take down posts relating to a knife attack on a bishop in an Assyrian Orthodox church as a service was being streamed online. Albanese said social media posts, misinformation and dissemination of violent images had exacerbated suffering from the Christ the Good Shepherd Church attack, which the two clerics survived, and a knife attack at a Sydney shop-

ping mall two days earlier which killed six people.

He said he was surprised that X was fighting in the Australian Federal Court orders to take down violent content from Australia's eSafety Commission, which describes itself as the world's first government agency dedicated to keeping people safer online. "Social media has a social responsibility," Albanese told reporters. "I find it extraordinary that X chose not to comply and are trying to argue their case."

The platform's Global Government Affairs team said on Saturday Australia's eSafety Commis-

sioner Julie Inman Grant had ordered it to remove some posts that commented on the church attack, but it said the posts did not violate X's rules on violent speech.

X said the Australian

regulator had demanded the platform "globally withhold these posts or face a daily fine of \$785,000." "X believes that eSafety's order was not within the scope of Australian law and we complied with the directive pending a legal challenge," the Global Government Affairs account said. "While X respects the right of a country to enforce its laws within its jurisdiction, the eSafety Commissioner does not have the authority to dictate what content X's users can see globally," it said. "We will robustly challenge this unlawful and dangerous approach in court,"

it added. The material is geoblocked from Australia but remains available elsewhere. The live feed of the church attack and social media posts that followed attracted a crowd of 2,000 people and fuelled a riot against police, who barricaded the young suspected attacker inside the place of worship. The rioting injured 51 police officers and damaged 104 police vehicles, officials said.

Three alleged rioters had been arrested by Sunday and police on Monday released images of 12 suspects they accuse of being the main instigators of the violence, taken from video of the riot.

Israeli military intelligence chief resigns over failure to prevent October 7 attack



TEL AVIV: The head of Israel's military intelligence directorate resigned on Monday over the failures surrounding Hamas' unprecedented October 7 attack, the military said, becoming the first senior figure to step down over his role in the deadliest assault in Israel's history.

Maj. Gen. Aharon Haliva's resignation sets the stage for what's expected to be more fallout from Israel's top security brass over Hamas' attack, when militants blasted through Israel's border defences, rampaged through Israeli communities unchallenged for hours and killed 1,200 people, most civilians, while taking roughly 250

hostages into Gaza. That attack set off the war against Hamas in Gaza, now in its seventh month.

The military said in a statement that Haliva had asked to end his service "following his leadership responsibility." Shortly after the war, Haliva had publicly said that he shouldered blame for not preventing the assault as the head of the military department responsible for providing the government and the military with intelligence warnings and daily alerts.

The military said in the statement that the military chief of staff accepted Haliva's request to resign and thanked him for his service.

bura alongside Violet Kenyana Kakyomya, the UN resident coordinator in Burundi. Between September and April 7, some 203,944 people were affected by flooding, with 19,250 homes and 209 classrooms destroyed during that time. The number of people internally displaced by flooding rose by 25 per cent,

reaching over 98,000 people, according to Kakyomya. Burundi is one of the world's poorest countries, with 80 per cent of its 13 million people employed in agriculture, according to the World Bank. Flooding there has created surreal scenes like game rangers entering the waterlogged Rusizi National Park in a canoe. The Boulevard du Japon, a major highway in Bujumbura, has been completely flooded in recent days. Climate experts say flooding events in Burundi and elsewhere in the region are part of extreme conditions linked to the El Niño weather phenomenon. "It must be said directly that these floods are associated with climate changes that affect Burundi like other countries in the region," said Jean Marie Sabushimike.

Ban on single-use plastics in Hong Kong

HONG KONG: Hong Kong has long been a major producer and consumer of great food, and a great amount of plastic and Styrofoam to go with it. That's going to change as new legislation aims to stop the sale and distribution of Styrofoam products and single-use plastic cutlery went into effect

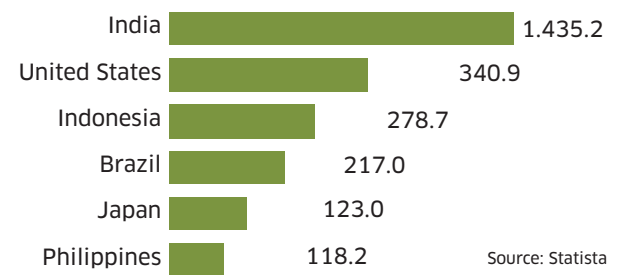
