**NEW DELHI:** Seventeen officers have been appointed as joint secretaries or at equivalent posts in different central government departments and organisations, as part of a bureaucratic rejig effected on Tuesday.

Rajeev Kumar, a 2000-batch Indian Ordnance Factories Service (IOFS) officer, has been appointed as joint secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, a personnel ministry order said. Vrunda Manohar Desai, a 2003-batch officer Indian Revenue Service (Income Tax), has been named as joint secretary in the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, for a tenure upto April 12, 2027, it said. Abhishek Bhagotia, a 2007-batch Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer of Assam-Meghalaya cadre, will be joint secretary, Lokpal, the order said. # Cong encouraged violence to hide its corruption

**DHAMTARI:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday alleged that Congress encouraged violence to hide its corruption, and promised that he would "root out" Naxalism from Chhattisgarh.

Modi was speaking at a campaign rally in the state's Dhamtari district, part of the Mahasamund Lok Sabha constituency.

Congress and development can not go hand in hand, and wherever it was in power, corruption and violence reached their peak, the PM said.

When it was in power in the North East, violent activities could not be brought under control, and as long as it ruled in Chhattisgarh, Naxalite violence kept on rising, Modi said. "What is the connection between Congress and violence? The answer is corruption.

## Judicial custody of Kejriwal till May 7

**NEW DELHI:** A Delhi court on Tuesday extended till May 7 the judicial custody of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and BRS leader K Kavitha in a money laundering case related to the alleged excise policy scam.

Special judge for CBI and ED matters Kaveri Baweja extended the custody of Kejriwal and Kavitha along with co-accused Chanpreet Singh, who allegedly managed the Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) funds in the 2022 Goa assembly elections, after they were produced before the court through video conference on the expiry of their remand.

The judge also extended the judicial custody of Kavitha, a Telangana MLC and the daughter of former Telangana chief minister K Chandrashekar Rao, till May 7 in a related corruption case being probed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). The court, meanwhile, adjourned for Wednesday the hearing on Kavitha's bail application in the money laundering case.

The judge had on April 22 reserved for May 2 its order on her bail application in the corruption case. Kavitha is in judicial custody in both the cases lodged by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and the CBI. She was arrested by the ED from her Banjara Hills residence in Hyderabad in the money laundering case on March 15. Later, she was arrested by the CBI from Bihar jail on April 11.

Kejriwal was arrested by the ED on March 21, hours after the Delhi High Court refused to grant him protection from coercive action by the federal anti-money laundering agency. He is currently lodged in Tihar jail.

## India test fired new version of medium-range ballistic missile

**NEW DELHI:** India on Tuesday carried out a successful test firing of a new version of a medium-range ballistic missile.

The defence ministry said the user launch has proven the operational capability of the missile with new technologies. The test firing was conducted under the aegis of the strategic forces command. "A successful launch of the new variant of a medium-range ballistic missile was carried out under the aegis of the Strategic Forces Command on April 23," the ministry said.

"The user launch has proven the operational capability of the Command and validated new technologies," it said in a brief statement. It is learnt that the missile is not from the 'Agni' family of weapons systems.

The court has "only decided on the issue of proof and not faith", a single bench of Justice Gautam Patel said while dismissing the suit initially filed by Khuzaima Qutbuddin.

#### Female employee lose Rs 6 lakh in online fraud

Caller sent a telegram link on April 16 on her WhatsApp and sought some amount in return and then got huge amount of cash deposited into his account one after another.

# PM slams Cong over its Goa leader's remark

Congress, which 'divides the country in the name of religion,' has been indulging in appeasement since day one after independence

**SAKTI:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday hit out at Congress over a remark by its Goa candidate that the Constitution was imposed on the coastal state, and said it was a "ploy" to break the country.

Speaking at an election rally in Chhattisgarh's Sakti district, Modi said Congress, which 'divides the country in the name of religion,' has been indulging in appeasement since day one after independence.

"Congress is not able to digest the participation of Dalits, Adivasis and backward classes in power. Now the party has started a big game. Earlier a Congress MP from Karnataka said south India should be declared a separate country, now a Congress candidate from Goa said the Indian Constitution is not applicable in Goa," he said.

"He is saying the Constitution was forced on Goa. He has told this to 'shehzade' (apparently referring to Rahul Gandhi)...Isn't this an insult

to Babasaheb Ambedkar? Isn't this an insult to the Constitution? Is this

not tampering with the Constitution of India?" the prime minister asked. "People of Jammu and Kashmir also used to say...You gave blessings (to BJP), now their mouths are shut. Now the Constitution of India is in force there (after the abrogation of Article 370)," he said.

The Congress candidate (in Goa) made this statement publicly and said he told his leader about it, which means his leader has given a tacit consent to it, Modi said, in apparent swipe at Rahul Gandhi. "It is a

ploy to break the country. A huge part of the country has rejected Congress, and therefore the party wants to create such small islands," he claimed. The prime minister was referring to Congress candidate from South Goa, Viriato Fernandes, who said on Monday that then Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru had said that Goa will decide its own destiny after it was liberated from Portuguese rule, but "this did not happen", and the Indian Constitution was "forced" on the state.

## Two video songs launched for 100% voting for voter awareness

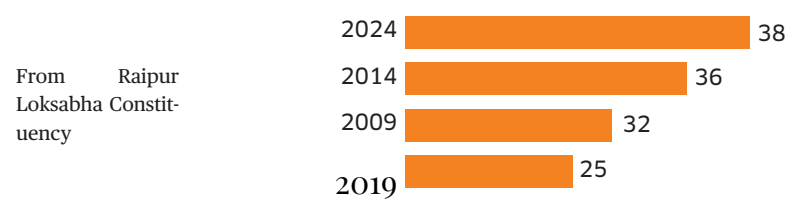

# Training given for EVM and VVPAT commissioning

Technical aspects of EVM and VVPAT machines were explained in the training

**BHILAI:** Under the guidance of Collector and District Election Officer Richa Prakash Choudhary, training was provided for the commissioning and mock poll work of EVM and VVPAT machines to be used in six assembly constituencies that fall under Durg Lok Sabha constituency (No 07). The training was conducted at Bhilai Institute of Technology (BIT) and the assembly constituencies covered were Patan- 62, Durg Rural- 63, Durg City- 64, Bhilai Nagar-65, Vaishali Nagar-66, and Ahiwara- 67.

During the training, the master trainers explained that commissioning means preparing the machine for voting. In this, pre-feeding the details of slips in VVPAT, installing paper rolls, setting ballot paper in BU and providing buttons for voting, determining the number of candidates in CU, sealing etc. were explained in detail.

Along with this, information was given about the technical aspects of EVM and VVPAT machines. EVM and

VVPAT commissioning work is a very responsible job. In this, not only is the machine prepared for voting, but it is also sealed properly so that the possibility of any tampering can be eliminated. For uninterrupted and smooth conduct of election work, it is necessary for the commissioning work to be done with full quality. He asked the officials to do proper sealing during commissioning. The work of commissioning is important and sensitive.

## Control unit of EVM is the CPU of the entire system

It was explained that the entire set of all parts of EVM - CU, BU, VVPAT - will be commissioned together. Two address tags in each CU, one ballot paper in each BU, three address tags and one pair pink paper seals, two address tags in each VVPAT, twin thread, sheets, materials will be required.

A one-vote mock poll conducted at the time of commissioning and sealing is only to see that the VVPAT slips are being printed correctly and all the buttons on BU and CU are working properly.

## BSP despatches second rake of heat-treated rail

BSP rolls out the world's longest 130 metre rails in single piece from its modern URM and supplies 260 metre welded rail panels to Indian Railways

**BHILAI:** The second rake with around 1000 Tonnes of R350 heat-treated rails in 260 metre length was despatched to Indian Railways from SAIL-Bhilai Steel Plant. Indian Railways that is modernizing itself & moving towards faster rail transportation with higher axle loads has been demanding both micro-alloyed rails and heat-treated rails from SAIL.

To fulfill the requirement of micro-alloyed rails, SAIL-Bhilai Steel Plant had developed a new grade of rails named R260 with new 60 E1 profile, which is being

rolled out and supplied to Indian Railways since July 2022. This new grade of rails has norms and specifications more stringent than Grade-880 or UTS-90 rails that SAIL-Bhilai was producing earlier and even European standards. Universal Rail Mill (URM) had taken up trial rolling of heat-treated rails as per the demand of Indian Railways. Following successful trials, tests at SAIL's research wing RDCIS and clearance from Indian Railway's research wing RDSO, commercial production of R350 HT rails started at Universal Rail Mill in October 2023. The first lot of 1000 Tonnes of R350HT rails in 260 metre length was dispatched to Indian Railways by Bhilai Steel Plant on October 31, 2023.

These special grade heat-treated rails that are under field trials now in southern parts on India, are best suited.

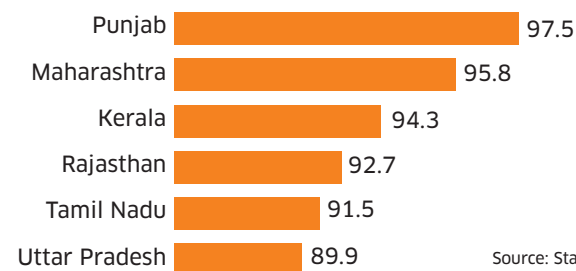

**KHAIRAGRH:** A case of repeated cancellation of auction orders of newly constructed eight commercial premises in Gram Panchayat Udaipur, has come to fore. Four of these commercial complexes have been constructed under the Chief Minister Samagra Vikas Yojana, at a cost of Rs 8 lakh 92 thousand and 4 other commercial complexes have been constructed under the Panchayat Development Head at a cost of Rs 7 lakh 30 thousand.

As per information, some unemployed youths of the village had been doing trade in this area,

prior to construction of the complex, and they were given assurance of allotment with priority, however the tale took a twist when these youths were allotted the shop segments of the complex but a show cause notice was soon issued to the Gram Panchayat Udaipur by the District Panchayat Chhuikhadan, citing irregularities.

Also after the construction of 8 nos. of commercial premises, the Gram Panchayat had invited the villagers for the allotment process, on which a complaint by a person named Sheikh Subrata of the village about the poor quality of the commercial

premises and cancellation of allotment was submitted to the District Panchayat Chhuikhadan. On the basis of the complaint, an order was given to cancel the allotment citing the reason that the allotment process was not followed as per the rules. Hereafter after the cancellation, an application was submitted by Gram Panchayat Udaipur for allotment of newly

constructed commercial premises in the name of District Panchayat Rajnandgaon along with evaluation, verification and completion certificate of the commercial premises. According to the application, the commercial premises will be allotted from District Panchayat Rajnandgaon as per the rules of the government, which unanimously passed the resolution and announced the allotment process and issued an order at the Gram Panchayat level inviting the interested villagers to apply, and 7 days time to raise claims and objections. Repeatedly on March 28, for the

third time, Sheikh Subrata complained that a piece of commercial premises had been allotted for money without any auction notice and on the basis of the complaint, on April 15, 2024, the District Panchayat again issued a show cause notice to Gram Panchayat, Udaipur. While the Gram Panchayat has unanimously passed a resolution and allotted the commercial premises, the disruption being created by the District Panchayat in the allocation process that has been going on for the last 6 months, which is irking the youths awaiting the allotment, of whom many are unemployed.

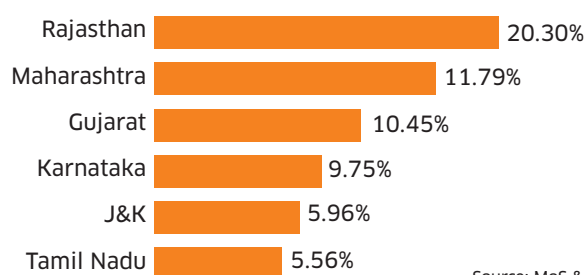

## Alliance Ambiguities: Mamata Banerjee's Political Maneuvers

In her recent address at an election rally in Malda, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's statements shed light on the intricate dynamics of political alliances. While claiming credit for forming the opposition alliance INDIA, Banerjee criticized the CPI(M) and Congress for allegedly aiding the BJP in West Bengal. However, her earlier declaration of contesting the Lok Sabha elections alone contradicts her current stance. Despite asserting the possibility of reviving the alliance post-elections, Banerjee's conditional willingness to join forces underscores the complexities of power dynamics. Moreover, her insinuation that the TMC could potentially claim the Prime Minister's seat if the alliance secures majority raises questions about the true motivations behind political maneuvers. Accusations of the TMC being a covert ally of the BJP, coupled with doubts about the cohesion within the opposition bloc, highlight the fragility of political alliances driven more by power ambitions than ideological unity. As the electoral drama unfolds, the fate of the INDIA bloc hangs in the balance, caught between conflicting interests and ambitions, ultimately risking collapse due to its inherent contradictions and lack of cohesive leadership.

The political landscape in Kerala is indeed at a crucial juncture, with the upcoming elections poised to reshape the dynamics of power in the state. As the battle lines are drawn, each party finds itself grappling with distinct challenges and aspirations.

For the Communist Party of India (Marxist) or CPM, the stakes transcend mere electoral victories. At the heart of their campaign lies the imperative to safeguard their national party status and emblematic symbol, the hammer, sickle, and star. These symbols not only represent the ideological moorings of the party but also serve as potent identifiers for their base. Losing recognition as a national party would not only undermine their standing within Kerala but also impede their ability to contest future elections with the same visibility and credibility.

Leading the charge for the CPM is their stalwart campaigner and incumbent Chief Minister, Pinarayi Vijayan, whose rhetoric reflects the

gravity of the situation. His aggressive stance against the Congress and its leader, Rahul Gandhi, underscores the party's determination to stave off any encroachments on their turf, particularly from the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). Meanwhile, the Congress finds itself in the precarious position of defending the gains made in the previous Lok Sabha elections, where it secured 19 seats. Their focus is on retaining these constituencies amidst a charged political environment, where the BJP is aggressively expanding its footprint.

CPM is left with only three members in the Lok Sabha, out of which only one member is from Kerala. Despite LDF being in power in the state during the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, it suffered defeat in 19 constituencies. CPM has only 78 state legislatures across the country out of which 61 are from Kerala and other 17 are from other states. There are not many seats which it won on its own and all those victories outside the Kerala are through the cour-

tesy of other parties including Congress. But to retain the national party status the CPM have to win at least 2% of the total strength of 543 Lok Sabha, which means a minimum of 11 seats has to win in the current election. As things stand the prospects of winning for CPM elsewhere in the country are very bleak. That party was uprooted by Mamata Banerjee lead TMC in 2011 and since then the decline was sorapid that it drew a blank both in 2019 Lok Sabha and 2021 assembly elections in Bengal. Its second citadel Tripura, where the party has ruled for 25 uninterrupted years, there are only 10 MLAs and no Lok Sabha representative. Barring Bihar, Tamil Nadu where it is part of larger INDI alliance there is not much scope for CPM to win any Lok Sabha seats. Even those two states put together the tally of CPM may not go beyond 3 or 4. So for the retention of party's national status it is do or die in Kerala and unless it wins at least 12 seats in the current election the CPM may land in the trouble for recognition. The CPI retained the status of

national party because of the lenient view of the Election Commission of India and none contested the continuance of the recognition to CPI. Or else it would have been reduced to an unrecognised party without a reserved symbol which was hitherto in use.

The CPM's frenemies policy with Congress is not cutting much ice with Kerala voters. The CPM stand of opposing Congress in the west coast state of Kerala and friendship with that party in the east coast state of Bengal is not seen as an honest politics.

In conclusion, the Communist Party of India (Marxist) faces a pivotal moment in the Kerala elections, where the stakes extend far beyond mere electoral victories. As the centenary year of the communist party approaches, the CPM finds itself grappling with existential challenges and the need for strategic recalibration. The complex dynamics of alliances and ideological shifts underscore the precarious nature of its position, making the Kerala elections a make-or-break moment for the party's political fortunes.

## Invisible killer lurking in the air

Air pollution poses a deadly threat, especially with short-term spikes from bushfires and industrial emissions. Urgent action needed. By Wenhua Yu and Yuming Guo

Air pollution, a silent killer, poses a significant threat to global health, particularly in densely populated cities. Recent research sheds light on the alarming impact of short-term exposure to high levels of air pollution, with more than one million deaths attributed to it annually. While Asia and Africa bear the brunt of this crisis, Australia is not immune to its dangers.

Australia, known for its generally excellent air quality, faces periodic spikes in pollution levels, especially during bushfires. The "Black Summer" bushfires of 2019-2020, for instance, led to a drastic deterioration in air quality, resulting in premature deaths and hospitalizations due to smoke-related health issues.

Aside from bushfires, dust storms and industrial emissions contribute to these pollution peaks. Fine particulate matter (PM2.5), tiny particles smaller than a red blood cell, poses a grave risk to health, affecting the lungs, heart, and even the brain. Exposure to high levels of PM2.5 can exacerbate asthma, cause respiratory issues, and increase the

likelihood of hospitalization or premature death.

Vulnerable populations, including children, pregnant women, and the elderly, face heightened risks from air pollution, particularly during short, intense pollution episodes. The urban heat island effect exacerbates these risks in densely populated urban areas, where stagnant air allows pollutants to accumulate. Until recently, much of the focus on air pollution's

health impacts centered on long-term exposure. However, emerging research highlights the deadly consequences of short-term pollution spikes, often triggered by wildfires, dust storms, or other environmental events. Asia bears the highest burden of deaths linked to short-term air pollution, followed by Africa and Europe. While Australia and New Zealand boast relatively low death rates from acute fine par-

ticulate air pollution, there has been a concerning 40% increase in such deaths over the past two decades. This uptick is attributed to more frequent and severe extreme pollution events, such as bushfires and dust storms, underscoring the urgent need for action.

Addressing air pollution requires a multi-faceted approach, encompassing both mitigation and adaptation strategies. Efforts to

reduce pollution must focus on transitioning to cleaner energy sources, improving energy efficiency, and curbing emissions from vehicles and industries. Additionally, emergency response plans and public awareness campaigns are essential for protecting vulnerable populations during pollution spikes. Individuals can also take steps to protect themselves and their families from the harmful effects of air pollution. This includes staying indoors during periods of poor air quality, using masks when venturing outside, and investing in air purifiers for indoor spaces. Furthermore, reducing outdoor activities during times of heightened pollution can minimize exposure and mitigate health risks. Ultimately, tackling air pollution requires concerted efforts at the global, national, and local levels. By implementing effective pollution control measures, raising awareness, and prioritizing public health, we can mitigate the deadly impacts of air pollution and create healthier environments for present and future generations.

# In India, uniformity in religion, language, dress code won't work

**NEW DELHI:** Uniformity in religion, language and dress code would not work in India as the nation is not for one particular community, JNU Vice Chancellor Santishree D Pandit has said. In an interaction with PTI editors at the agency's headquarters here, Pandit said educational institutions should respect individual choices and allow those wanting to wear a hijab to do so. "I would not agree on uniformity in either religion, race or language. One language should not be imposed. If some people want to change it (offi-

cial language) to Hindi in some states, they can. But in the south, it will be difficult... in east India, even in Maharashtra, I don't think Hindi is acceptable," she said. "I would rather say that Hindi can be there but I don't think a single language should be imposed. Both (Jawaharlal) Nehru and Indira Gandhi were not fools to talk about the tri-language formula because, in India, uniformity doesn't work in any form," she added. The vice chancellor was responding to a question on the push for Hindi as a national language and one of the main mediums of instruction

in teaching and learning. "Language is a sensitive issue, one should be careful with it. If you ask me, you should go slow in having one language," she said. Pandit also said a single identity and religion would not work in the country. "I don't think any one religion will work here as these

are individual issues, but people at the helm want to do this. As a university, we should be above all this. For us, seeking knowledge is important. The nation is not for one particular community." Emphasising the need for multilingualism, Pandit said, "I believe everybody should be multilingual because in India we have to celebrate cultural diversity. All languages are good. I am not against any language but for me, I am the most comfortable in English." Asked about her views on a dress code in educational institutions, Pandit said it should be a personal choice. "I am against a

dress code. I think (educational) spaces should be open. If somebody wants to wear a hijab, it's their choice and if somebody doesn't want to wear it, they should not be forced.

"In JNU, people wear shorts and there are also those who wear traditional attire, that's their personal choice. As long as they don't force me to do the same I have no problem." The hijab row erupted in Karnataka in 2022 after six students who attended classes wearing headscarves in violation of the stipulated dress code were sent out of the government PU College in Udupi.

### Jobs a major issue for young Muslim women voters in Aligarh in these Lok Sabha elections



**ALIGARH:** For young Muslim women voters in Aligarh, jobs are not only a means of livelihood but crucially a pathway to independence and security. ### SC suspends sentence of Cong MLA

**MALE:** The pro-China Maldivian president's statement came at a celebratory event on Monday, a day after the People's National Congress (PNC), led by him, won 68 out of 93 seats in Sunday's polls and its coalition partners Maldives National Party (MNP) and Maldives Development Alliance



(MDA) won one and two seats, respectively, taking the total to more than two-thirds in the People's Majlis. A majority in Parliament would mean that Muizzu's party has con-

trol not just over lawmaking but also over the legislature which ratifies the laws; which till now had two opposing coalitions and saw several instances of a conflict between the government and the legislature. The PNC's "super majority" in parliamentary elections is being seen as a strong endorsement of his pro-Beijing foreign policy.

## The UK pledges \$620 million in new military aid for Ukraine

**WARSAW:** The UK on Tuesday pledged an additional \$620 million in new military supplies for Ukraine, including long-range missiles and four millions rounds of ammunition, at a time when Ukraine is struggling to hold off advancing Russian forces on the eastern front line of the war, now in its third year.

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak spoke with Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on Tuesday morning to confirm the assistance and "assure him of the UK's steadfast support for Ukraine's defence against Russia's brutal and expansionist ambitions," Sunak's office said. Sunak was travelling to Warsaw later Tuesday to meet with Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk and

NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg for talks about further aid for Ukraine.

Ahead of the visit, the UK government said Sunak would announce 500 million pounds (\$620 million, 580 million euros) in new British military supplies, including 400 vehicles, 60 boats, 1,600 munitions and 4 million rounds of ammunition. The shipment will include British Storm Shadow long-range missiles, which have a range of some 150 miles and have proved effective at hitting Russian targets. "President Zelenskyy thanked the Prime Minister for the UK's continued support, saying the new military assistance would make a material difference to ordinary Ukrainians fighting on the front line to defend their country," Downing Street said.

## South Korean sentenced to 14 months

**SEOUL:** A South Korean man has been sentenced to 14 months in prison for killing 76 cats in one of the country's most gruesome cases of animal cruelty in recent years. The man, who is in his 20s, was convicted of violating South Korea's animal protection law last week, the Changwon District Court in southeastern South Korea said Tuesday. The court did not identify the man. The man went on a cat-killing spree between December 2022 and September 2023 due to a deep hatred of the animal that he began harbouring after other cats scratched his car, according to a court verdict seen.
