Naxalite killed in encounter

SUKMA: A Naxalite was killed in an encounter with security personnel in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district on Monday morning, police said.

The gunfight took place in a forest under Kistaram police station area when separate teams of the District

Reserve Guard (DRG) and Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (CoBRA - an elite unit of CRPF) were out on an anti-Naxal operation, Sukma Superintendent of Police Kiran G Chavan told PTI.

The exchange of fire took place between Naxalites and the DRG team in the forest, located around 450 km from the

state capital Raipur, he said. After the gunfight stopped, the body of a Naxalite and a weapon were recovered from the spot, the SP said, adding that search operation was still underway in the area. With this incident, 81 Naxalites have been killed so far this year in separate encounters in Bastar region.

BJP-RSS want to change Constitution, quotas

BILASPUR: The BJP and RSS want to subvert and change the Constitution, which gives rights to the poor and protects their future, but the people are aware of this attack, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi said here on Monday.

Addressing a rally in Sakri village in support of Congress' Bilaspur Lok Sabha candidate Devendra Yadav, Gandhi said leave alone Prime Minister Narendra Modi no power in the world can reject or tear apart the country's Constitution.

"The PM, BJP leaders and RSS want to subvert and change the Constitution. While they are trying to destroy the Constitution, the Congress is trying to protect it. This Lok Sabha poll is not an ordinary poll. It is about saving democracy, Constitution, reservations and

Gandhi said the Congress will remove the 50 per cent ceiling on reservations if it comes to power.

Taking a swipe at the BJP after two phases of the Lok Sabha polls, Gandhi said the PM was speaking about "400 paar" but "is he saying it now?"

Polls will be held in Bilaspur on May 7, while votes will be counted on June 4.

Supreme Court halts CBI probe against West Bengal officials

Apex Court was hearing a plea by the WB government against a HC order



NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Monday stayed a Calcutta High Court order directing the CBI to probe into the role of West Bengal government officials in a teacher recruitment scam.

The top court was hearing a plea by the West Bengal government against a high court order invalidating the appointment of 25,753 teachers and non-teaching staff made by the School Service Commission (SSC) in state-run and state-aided schools.

A bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, Justice JB Pardiwala and Justice Manoj Misra said it will hear the matter on May 6.

"We will stay the direction which says the CBI (Central Bureau of Investigation) will undertake further investigation against officials in the state government," the bench said.

Calcutta High Court had said the CBI would undertake further investigations with regard to the persons involved in the state government approving the creation of supernumerary

post to accommodate illegal appointments.

If necessary, the CBI will undertake custodial interrogation of such persons involved, it had said.

Challenging the order, the state government, in its appeal filed before the top court, said the high court cancelled the appointments "arbitrarily".

"The high court failed to appreciate the ramifications of cancelling the entire selection process, leading to straightaway termination of teaching and non-teaching staff from service with immediate effect, without giving sufficient time to the petitioner state to deal with such an exigency, rendering the education system at a standstill," the plea said.

cumb to disappointment or stress, both pre and post results declaration. She also advised parents against placing excessive expectations on their children.

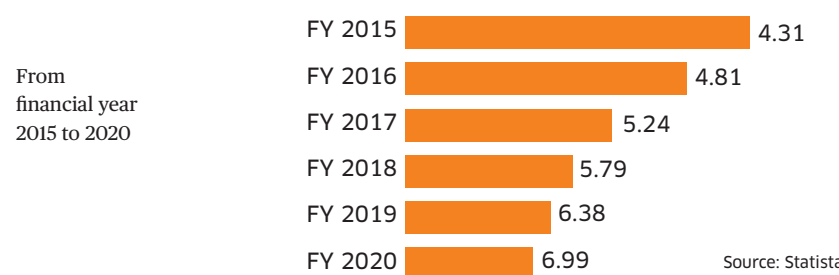
School Education Secretary Siddharth Komal Singh Pardeshi stressed the importance of not allowing stress to overwhelm children, particularly if results fall

Elderly to make up 20 per cent of the population by 2050

RAIPUR: According to the United Nations Population Fund's 'India Ageing Report 2023', by 2036, the number of people above 50 is expected to surge to 404 million from 260 million in 2020. By 2050, one in every five individuals will be above the age of 50. Dr. Arun Kumar Kedia, MD, Senior Consultant Physician at Lifeworth Hospital, Raipur said, "While childhood vaccinations have significantly reduced disease prevalence, the importance of adult immunization cannot be understated. It is a misconception that vaccinations are solely for children. Adults aged 50 years and above can greatly benefit from vaccinations to guard against vaccine-preventable diseases like shingles, pneumococcal disease, and influenza and their severe complications."

These infections not only compromise the quality of life but also impose a significant burden on India's healthcare system.

He complained that his younger brother Kishan Lal had acquired a BSP job by producing forged marksheet of Class 10th.

During investigation, police found that the father of the complainant as well as the accused, Lainu Ram Tandon worked as a senior operator in the Coke Oven Department of Bhilai Steel Plant.

Due to bad health and being medically unfit, Kishan Lal was appointed in his place on compassionate grounds on the post of Attendant in Civil

Maintenance Department. Police sought the copies of the documents submitted by Kishan Lal at Bhilai Steel Plant. The BSP conducted a departmental inquiry and found that Kishan Lal had submitted forged documents regarding his educational qualification to seek compassionate appointment. Kishan Lal

Congress names 4 more candidates for Punjab Lok Sabha seats

NEW DELHI: The Congress on Monday announced four more Lok Sabha candidates from Punjab, fielding PCC chief Amarinder Singh Brar (Raja Warring) from Ludhiana and party general secretary Sukhjinder Singh Randhawa from Gurdaspur. The party has fielded former MP Vijay Inder Singla from Anandpur Sahib and Kulbir Singh Zira from Khadoor Sahib, replacing sitting MP Jasbir Singh Gill. Congress MP from Anandpur Sahib Manish Tewari has been shifted to Chandigarh Lok Sabha constituency while Ludhiana MP Ravneet Singh Bittu has joined the BJP. With Monday's list, the party has announced candidates for 12 of the 13 Lok Sabha seats in Punjab. The latest names were finalised at the party's Central Election Committee meeting held on Saturday. Punjab goes to polls on June 1, the last phase of elections.

When is Modi govt going to pay Karnataka's MGNREGS workers their wages, asks Cong



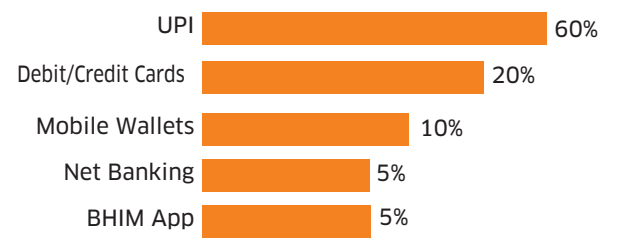
NEW DELHI: Attacking the Modi government over key issues in Karnataka, the Congress on Monday questioned the "delay" in the vital Bagalkote-Kudachi Railway line project and also asked when it is going to pay the state's MGNREGS workers their wages. Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh posed questions to Prime Minister Narendra Modi ahead of his rally in Bagalkote in Karnataka. "Why has the Modi Government failed to deliver the Bagalkote-Kudachi Railway line? Why is the Modi Government holding up the Upper Bhadra and

Mahadayi projects? When will the PM pay Karnataka's MGNREGA workers?" Ramesh said in a post on X. Elaborating on what he said were "jumla details", Ramesh said the Bagalkote-Kudachi line of the South-Western Railway has now been delayed by more than eight years. As of today, only 33 per cent, or 46 km of the 142 km line has been completed, he said. "Originally sanctioned in 2010-11 at an outlay of Rs 986 crore, the project has now seen its cost balloon to Rs 1,649 crore.

Hindus in no way will benefit from UCC: Mamata

JANGIPUR: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Monday criticised the BJP for using the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) as a political ploy in the elections, asserting that Hindus will not benefit from it. Addressing back-to-back rallies in minority-dominated Murshidabad and Jangipur constituencies in Murshidabad district, Banerjee accused the BJP of resorting to divisive tactics fearing defeat in the initial phases of polling. "Whenever there are elections, they use one issue or the other to flare up communal tensions. This time they are talking about the UCC and propagating that it is against a particular community. But this UCC is nothing but political rhetoric, and Hindus in no way will benefit from it," she said.

Banerjee highlighted a growing anti-BJP sentiment nationwide, especially evident after the first two phases of voting.

Youth dies due to bomb blast in Jamsarar farm house

DONGARGAN: A young man has died due to a bomb blast in a farm house in village Jamsarar adjacent to the city. The incident has caused panic in the area and as per reports; the bomb was made and planted in a way, the first of its kind in the region. The gunpowder or bomb system was installed by wiring the buttons of the bore machine, which is a first for this area and as soon as the button of the bore machine was pressed, there was an explosion and a person was blown to pieces. According to the information received the inci-

dent happened in an agricultural farm of one named Santosh Vaishnav on Maneri road in village Jamsarar where banana and cucumber are currently being produced. There is a bore pump installed in this farm house, through which water is supplied to the crops. It is said that Santosh Vaishnav's younger brother Sunil Vaishnav used to come to this farm house early in the morning every day and would start the bore pump as per requirement to supply water to the crops. Since there was no need of water on Sunday, he did not turn on the button of the bore pump and went out for a

walk as usual. Hence without knowing the availability of water, Naresh Kumar Oti, S/o Dhirpal Singh, age 30, R/o Maneri working in the farm house, had reached the farm house in the morning and as per his daily routine started the bore machine, which caused a huge explosion in which Naresh Kumar was blown to pieces. The explosion of gunpowder was so severe that many body parts of the

deceased were scattered up to a distance of 20-30 feet. After the incident, a person from Jamsarar village present there immediately informed the farm owner, after which the police and administration were informed and this being the first incident of its kind has spread sensation in the entire area. After the information, the police team immediately arrived and considering the seriousness of the incident, higher officials and the forensic investigation team were called. In the initial investigation, it is being said that it was a gunpowder explosion and the police is investigating from all aspects. In this

regard, Santosh Vaishnav, owner of the farm house, said that about one and a half months ago, his harvester was also set on fire and now due to this incident of explosion, he fears for his and his family's life.

News has been received that in the farm house of Santosh Vaishnav in village Jamsararka of Dongargaon, around 6.30-7 in the morning, Naresh Oti, a youth working there, switched on the motor switch to water the fields, as soon as it was switched on, there was an explosion, due to which the young man working there became a victim of the accident, and died on the spot.

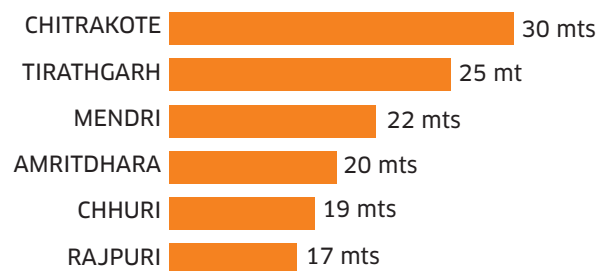

The electoral debacle in Surat, where BJP candidate Mukesh Dalal won unopposed, has reignited discussions around the efficacy of the NOTA (none of the above) option for voters. While it symbolizes dissent, NOTA's true potential lies in catalyzing systemic change and dissuading parties from fielding unfit candidates. Countries like Indonesia mandate repolls if NOTA emerges as the 'winner', ensuring comprehensive redressal of citizens' dissatisfaction. The ECI must explore avenues to bolster NOTA's effectiveness, including the possibility of annulment of elections in constituencies where it secures the highest number of votes. This proactive approach will compel political parties to nominate candidates of impeccable integrity. Promoting NOTA as a 'fictional' nominee can transform it into a potent instrument of democratic expression. The Surat debacle underscores the imperative of revitalizing NOTA to serve as a genuine mechanism for voters to exercise their democratic rights effectively. It's time to recalibrate NOTA from a symbolic gesture to a catalyst for meaningful electoral reform.

Cross-Border Heart Transplants: Bridging Hope

A heartwarming tale of a Pakistani girl's successful heart transplant in India sheds light on cross-border medical challenges and aspirations. by *Press Trust of India*

The heartwarming story of a 19-year-old Pakistani girl getting a new lease on life after a successful heart transplant in India highlights how borders can be eased for humanitarian purposes and the challenges faced by heart patients in the neighbouring country.

Ayesha Rashan from Karachi underwent a heart transplant surgery at MGM Healthcare, Chennai.

After a suitable brain-dead donor was available, she underwent cardiac transplantation on January 31, 2024. Following procedures, she was discharged this month.

Dr K R Balakrishnan, Chairman, Cardiac Sciences Director, Institute of Heart and Lung Transplant and Mechanical Circulatory Support, said Ayesha first came to them in 2019 when she was 14 years of age with severe heart failure and a very poorly functioning heart.

"She became very sick and had a cardiac arrest and had to be resuscitated with CPR and put on a machine called ECMO to sustain circulation then we put in an artificial heart pump that time and eventually she recovered and went back to her country," he said.

"Over the next couple of

years, she became sick again because one of her valves started leaking...and she developed severe failure on the right side of the heart and developed an infection and it became very difficult to treat her in that country," he added. Balakrishnan said getting a visa for her was very difficult. "Her mother is a single mother, they had no money or resources. We had to take care of the entire expenses including repeated hospitalisation," Dr Balakrishnan told PTI Vid-

eo.

Ayesha underwent surgery with the support of Aishwarya Trust, a Chennai-based NGO, and other transplant patients' contributions. The transplant was done after getting a donor organ from a brain-dead elderly man from Delhi.

"The biggest challenge was there was no money," he said. The condition required Rs 30 to Rs 40 lakhs to treat.

"The hospital is a private hospital. And so we had to raise money through the trust, through our own resources and generous patients. So that

was a huge challenge. And these are high-risk procedures where the outcomes are not predictable. But we had to do it because otherwise, this young girl would not have survived," he said. Ayesha, who aspires to be a fashion designer, thanked the Indian government for giving her a visa to visit the country for the treatment. Ayesha's mother said the problem is that Pakistan does not have such a facility. Several transplant and cardiac surgeons cite a lack of expertise, high costs,

limited post-operative care and a shortage of deceased donors as the primary reasons for the absence of a heart transplant programme in Pakistan.

"The two main reasons we don't perform heart transplants are the lack of deceased donors (transplant hearts can only be taken from deceased individuals) and a lack of expertise," said renowned liver transplant surgeon Dr Faisal Saud Dar.

Dr Dar, dean and CEO of the Pakistan Kidney and Liver Institute and Research Center in Lahore, emphasised the importance of raising awareness about organ donation after death to save lives.

Renowned cardiac surgeon Dr Pervaiz Chaudhry believes heart transplants will become a reality in Pakistan soon.

He has asked the authorities to define "brain death" in Pakistan, facilitating requests for organ donation from deceased individuals, the report said.

"While I understand heart transplants are complex and expensive, travelling to India for such procedures is a huge burden. I wish we had our own centres offering transplants at free or affordable rates to save more lives," he said.

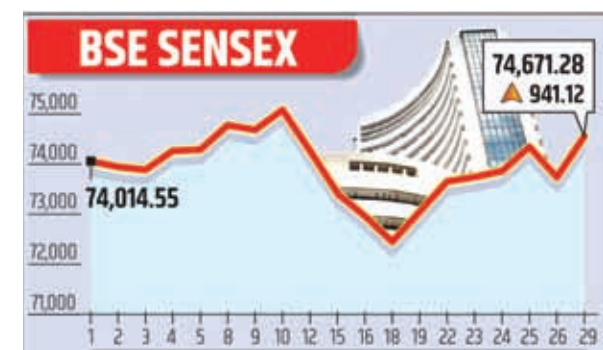

Markets rebound sharply on buying in bank stocks firm global trends



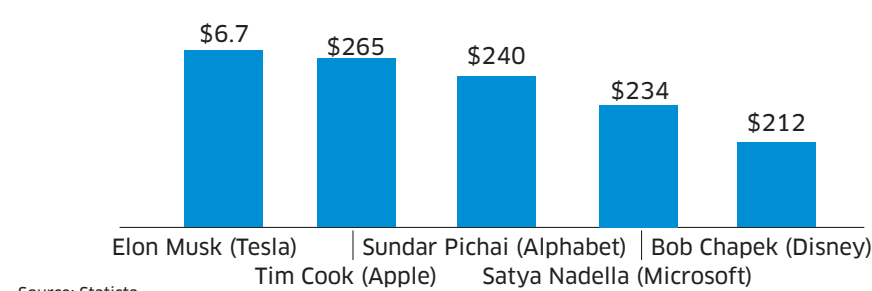

sugar content in Cerelac is much lower than the upper limit prescribed by FSSAI, he added. "There is nothing in this product that makes it a product that is potentially of any risk or any kind of harm to the child," he said. As far as Nestle is concerned, he said a majority of sugars present in the product are natural sugars. As per the Food Safety & Standards

Authority of India (FSSAI), the permissible level of added sugar is 13.6 grams per 100 grams of feed. "Nestle is 7.1 grams, which is well below the standards and the maximum limits set up," Narayanan asserted. Earlier this month, Swiss FMCG major Nestle was accused of selling products with more sugar content in less developed countries.

NEW DELHI: Leading stock exchange BSE is expected to shell out more regulatory fee after the markets watchdog Sebi asked the bourse to pay the fee based on the "notional value" of its options contracts rather than on the premium value. Reacting to the development, shares of BSE have

slumped as much as 18.64 per cent to an intra-day low of Rs 2,612.0 on the NSE on Monday. Market experts expect an increase in the BSE's regulatory fee payments to Sebi due to the significant variance between the notional and premium values. This discrepancy arises from the calculation method, which involves multiplying the contract



size by the underlying price. Notional turnover represents the overall strike price of all contracts traded in derivatives, whereas premium turnover is the sum of premiums paid on all contracts traded. As the notional value exceeds the premium turnover, opting for notional turnover as the basis entails a higher fee outlay.

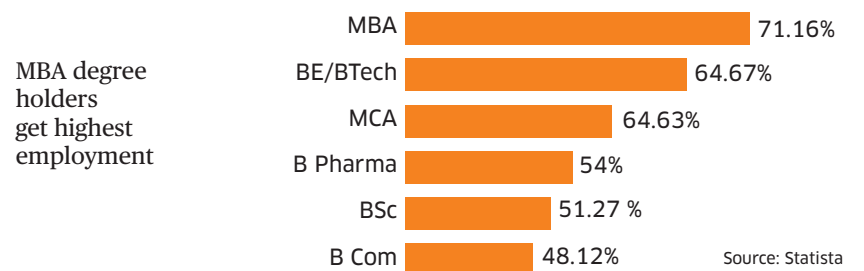

NEET aspirant from Haryana hangs self in his hostel room in Kota

KOTA: A 20-year-old NEET aspirant was found hanging from the ceiling fan of his hostel room in this city's Kunhari area, with his parents suspecting he was murdered, police said on Monday. This is the seventh case of suspected suicide by a NEET or JEE aspirant in this coaching hub so far this year, according to the police.

The deceased, Sumit Panchal, hailed from Haryana's Rohtak and had been preparing for NEET at a coaching institute here for over a year, the police said. His parents have demanded the registration of a murder case against unidentified persons and an impartial investigation into the matter. On demand of the deceased's parents, a medical board is being constituted to perform the autopsy, said Assistant Sub-Inspector Kaptan who is investigating the case. The boy had allegedly hanged himself around 9 hours earlier before his body was spotted by the hostel staff, the ASI said. **PTI**

36 out of 266 candidates in Gujarat face criminal cases

AHMEDABAD: Thirty six out of the 266 candidates for the Lok Sabha polls in Gujarat have criminal cases against them, with some also facing attempt to murder and dacoity charges, as per an analysis of their affidavits by the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR).

Elections to 25 out of the 26 Lok Sabha seats in Gujarat will be held on May 7. The BJP candidate from Surat seat has already been declared elected unopposed.

"Out of the 266 candidates, 36, or 14 per cent, have criminal charges against them, as

per details provided by them in the affidavits. Out of them, 21, or 8 per cent, have serious criminal cases against them," ADR's Gujarat coordinator Pankti Jog told reporters here on Monday.

Serious criminal cases are those which attract a maximum punishment of 5 years or more, -bailable, related to murder, rape, kidnapping, bribery, assault, causing loss to the exchequer, crimes against women, hate speech, and offences under the Prevention of Corruption Act, she said.

Out of the 23 Congress candidates, six, or 26 per cent, are named in criminal cases, with three facing serious charges, showed the ADR analysis of the Election Commission data. Tribal leaders Anant Patel and Dilip

Vasava, contesting from Valsad and Bharuch seats respectively, are facing cases on charges of attempt to murder.

Patel is the Congress candidate, while Vasava is the Bharat Adivasi Party nominee.

Aam Aadmi Party candidate Chaitar Vasava and independent nominee Ismail Patel, both contesting from Bharuch seat, have the highest number of 13 criminal cases each against them.

The cases against Chaitar Vasava include of dacoity, sexual harassment, abetment of suicide and hate speech, as per the ADR data.

Ismail Patel is facing

various charges including dacoity, forgery and voluntarily causing hurt.

Out of the total 118 independent candidates, 18 have criminal cases against them, with 11 facing serious charges, the ADR said showed.

Anant Patel is also accused in cases of attempt to murder, dacoity and voluntarily causing hurt. In one case, he was also convicted and fined Rs 99. Dilip Vasava, who is facing the charge of attempt to murder, was sentenced to three years imprisonment in 2016. He has filed an appeal against the court order which is currently pending, the data showed.

Fire at bank's zonal office in Odisha

BARIPADA: Three persons were injured after a fire broke out at the zonal office building of a public sector bank in Odisha's Mayurbhanj district on Monday, an official said.

They were rescued from the smoke-filled three-storey office building in Baripada, but they were in unconscious condition at that time, he said. The injured were admitted to PRM Medical College and Hospital here and their condition is stated to be stable, the official said, adding that others who were in the office came out safely. Two fire tenders were pressed into service to douse the blaze, first spotted around 1 pm, assistant fire and emergency services officer Bhabendra Nath Dey said. It was suspected that the fire broke out at the Bank of India's zonal office canteen, located on the third floor.

Missile attack by Houthi rebels targets container ship in Red Sea

The attack happened off the coast of Mokha, Yemen, the British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations center said.

JERUSALEM: A suspected missile attack by Yemen's Houthi rebels targeted a container ship in the Red Sea on Monday, authorities said, the latest assault in their campaign against international shipping in the crucial maritime route. The attack happened off the coast of Mokha, Yemen, the British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations center said, without offering any other immediate details. It urged vessels to exercise caution in the area. The private security firm Ambrey said a salvo of three missiles targeted a

Malta-flagged container ship traveling from Djibouti onward to Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. "The vessel was targeted due to its listed operator's ongoing trade with Israel," Ambrey said. CMA CGM, a Marseille, France-based shipper, had its Malta-flagged CMA CGM Manta Ray due to sail to Jeddah from Djibouti on Monday. However, the shipper said the vessel remained at harbor in Djibouti and could not have been targeted in the incident. The Houthis did not immediately acknowledge any attack, though suspicion fell on the group. It typically takes the rebels

The Houthis say their attacks on shipping in the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden are aimed at pressuring Israel to end its war against Hamas in Gaza, which has killed more than 34,000 Palestinians there. The

war began after Hamas-led militants attacked Israel on Oct. 7, killing 1,200 people and taking some 250 others hostage. The Houthis have launched more than 50 attacks on shipping, seized one vessel and sunk another since November, according to the U.S. Maritime Administration. Houthi attacks have dropped in recent weeks as the rebels have been targeted by a U.S.-led airstrike campaign in Yemen. Shipping through the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden has declined because of the threat. American officials have speculated that the rebels may be running out of

weapons as a result of the U.S.-led campaign against them and after firing drones and missiles steadily for months. However, the rebels have renewed their attacks in the past week. The Houthis on Saturday claimed they shot down another of the U.S. military's MQ-9 Reaper drones, airing footage of parts that corresponded to known pieces of the unmanned aircraft. U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. Bryon J. McGarry, a Defense Department spokesperson, acknowledged to The Associated Press on Saturday that "a U.S. Air Force MQ-9 drone crashed in Yemen."

Top scientist behind China's first COVID-19 vaccine expelled

BEIJING: China's top scientist, who developed the first inactivated COVID-19 vaccine at the height of the pandemic in the country in 2020, has been dismissed from Parliament for alleged corruption. Yang Xiaoming, the chairman of China National Pharmaceutical Group's vaccine subsidiary China National Biotec Group (CNBG), has been stripped of his membership in the National People's Congress (NPC) due to serious discipline and law violations, official media reported here on Monday. The charge of serious discipline and law violations is a common euphemism for corruption under the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) disciplinary practice. Yang, 62, is a veteran researcher who headed the CNBG - a vaccine subsidiary of state-owned Sinopharm - and led a team that developed Sinopharm's BBIBP-CorV vaccine, China's first coronavirus shot approved for general use. **PTI**

Hong Kong transgender activist gets ID card reflecting gender change

HONG KONG: A Hong Kong transgender activist on Monday received a new ID card reflecting his gender change, after a years-long legal battle to change the document, and he vowed to continue working for equality for the LGBTQ+ community. Henry Tse won his appeal over the government's refusal to change the gender on his ID card in February 2023. Previously, Tse was not able to make the change because he did not undergo full gender-affirmation surgery. **PTI**

UK's 'world first' laws crack down on cyber attacks

LONDON: All internet connected smart devices will be required to meet minimum security standards under what the UK government has dubbed as "world first" laws, effective from Monday to protect consumers and businesses from hacking and cyber-attacks. Under the new regime,

manufacturers will be banned from having weak, easily guessable default passwords like "admin" or "12345" and if there is a common password, the user will be prompted to change it on start-up. An investigation conducted by the Which? consumer group found that a UK home filled with smart devices could be exposed to more than 12,000 hack-

SKorea's oppn leader urges President to accept probes

SEOUL: Emboldened by his party's recent election win, South Korea's opposition leader pressured President Yoon Suk Yeol to accept special investigations into allegations involving top officials and his wife, as they met Monday for talks on bipartisan cooperation. The meeting was their first since Yoon took office in 2022 after defeating Lee in the country's closest presidential election. During their 2022 campaigns, Yoon, Lee and their supporters demonised each other and filed dozens of lawsuits against one another. Yoon proposed the meeting as he faces growing calls to cooperate with Lee's Democratic Party.
