

Ram Lalla honoured with 'Surya Tilak'

This is the first Ram Navami since the consecration of the Ram idol at the new temple at Ayodhya at noon on Wednesday

AYODHYA: The 'Surya tilak' of Ram Lalla in Ayodhya was done at noon on Wednesday on the occasion of Ram Navami using an elaborate mechanism involving mirrors and lenses by which sunbeams were directed on the forehead of the Ram idol.

This is the first Ram Navami since the consecration of the Ram idol at the new temple, inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on January 22.

Prakash Gupta the spokesperson of the temple told PTI, "The Surya Tilak was done for around 4-5 minutes when the sun rays were directly focused on the forehead of the Ram Lalla idol."

"The temple administration prevented the devotees from entering the sanctum at the time of the Surya Tilak

BRI, Roorkee, told PTI, "As planned, the Surya Tilak of Ram Lalla was perfectly executed at 12:00 pm". The system was tested by the scientists on Tuesday.

Dr S K Panigrahi, a scientist at CSIR-CBRI Roorkee, who was also associated with the project said that the basic objective of the Surya Tilak project is to focus on the 'tilak' on the forehead of Shri Ram idol on every Shri Ram Navami day. Under the project, sunlight will be brought on the forehead of Lord Ram in the Chaitra month every year.

10 killed as car rams into parked truck

NADIAD: Ten persons travelling in a car, including a child, died after their speeding vehicle crashed into a stationary truck on the Ahmedabad-Vadodara Expressway near Nadiad town of Gujarat's Kheda district on Wednesday, police officials said. Preliminary probe revealed the Maharashtra-registered truck was parked on the extreme left lane of the busy expressway after it developed a mechanical fault and the car rammed into it from the rear side, said Kheda Superintendent of Police Rajesh Gadhia. He said all the ten occupants of the car, including the driver and a five-year-old child, died in the crash. "The Gujarat-registered car was going towards Ahmedabad from Vadodara when it rammed into the rear side of the parked truck on the expressway near Nadiad.

Campaign ends for Bastar LS seat

JAGDALPUR: Acrimonious exchanges between main rivals Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Congress over issues like corruption, poverty and

pre-poll promises made by them dominated the high-decibel campaign for the first phase of Lok Sabha elections in Chhattisgarh covering the Bastar seat that ended on Wednesday evening.

Naxal-affected Bastar is the only seat among the 11 Lok Sabha constituencies in the state that will vote in the first phase on April 19, an exercise that will take place in shadow

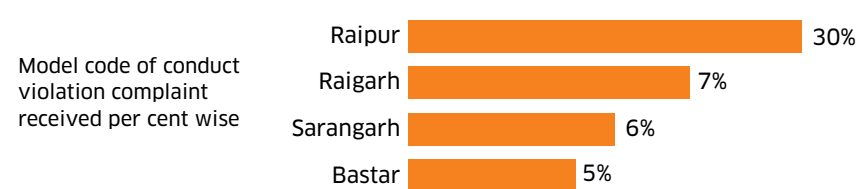

ninth day is also marked by Rama Navami, celebrating the birth of Lord Rama, the seventh incarnation of Lord Vishnu. Maa Siddhidatri is worshipped as the Goddess of Supernatural Powers. Devotees engage in spiritual activities on this day, seek divine blessings, and worship Goddess Siddhidatri and Lord Rama. The word "Siddhi" refers to supernatural powers, and "Datri" means provider. Maa Siddhidatri is particularly worshipped by those seeking spirituality and enlightenment. Maa Siddhidatri has eight forms of Siddhis "Anima, Mahima, Garima, Laghima, Prapti,

Prakamya, Ishitva and Vashitva. It is believed that the goddess offered these siddhis to Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva to help them carry out their duties. She additionally allowed them nine treasures and ten types of supernatural powers.

Jawara puja was observed in Raipur during the Navratri celebration. The puja which started on the first day of Navratri concluded with the immersion procession on the occasion of Navami on Wednesday. Similarly, the Mahtari Vandan Yojana that promised 1,000 to women in the state has seen patchy

Two peddlers caught with ganja worth Rs 4 lakh

Silence in air, bullet marks on trees at encounter site stands testimony

KANKER: Silence hangs over the hillocks adjoining Hidur and Kalpar villages in Chhattisgarh's Kanker district where 29 naxalites were gunned down by security forces in an encounter.

Hours after the biggest encounter ever in the state ended, bullet marks could be seen on the trees at the site on Wednesday. Bloodstains were also visible on the

ground which is covered by a thick carpet of fallen bamboo leaves. In the nearby villages, local tribals, most of them women, could be seen outside, but they were reluctant to speak about what they saw or heard during the encounter on Tuesday.

Lingaram, a resident of Akameta village in the area, claimed that his cousin Sukku, an active Naxalite, was killed in the encounter. He came to know about it only on



Wednesday, he said, talking to reporters at Kalpar village.

Sukku had joined the outlawed CPI (Maoist) as a child and despite the family members trying to persuade him to quit, he stayed with the Maoist movement, Lingaram said.

The family was yet to contact the police to claim Sukku's body, he added. The route to the encounter site, mostly dirt roads or forest paths,

was dug up at multiple locations. Naxalite posters appealing locals to boycott the Lok Sabha elections and crude memorials of slain Maoists could be seen nearby. To reach the area, considered as a stronghold of the North Bastar Division Committee of Naxalites, one has to cross the Kotri river which runs dry in summer. The local administration has been trying to construct a bridge on the

river for a long time, but the work did not make any progress as villagers are opposed to it, an official claimed.

On climbing the hill, which has thick bamboo vegetation, blood stains and bullet marks on trees could be seen in places. Empty syringes and bottles of soft drinks and a makeshift stretcher used by the security personnel to ferry their injured colleagues were lying in a dry rivulet.

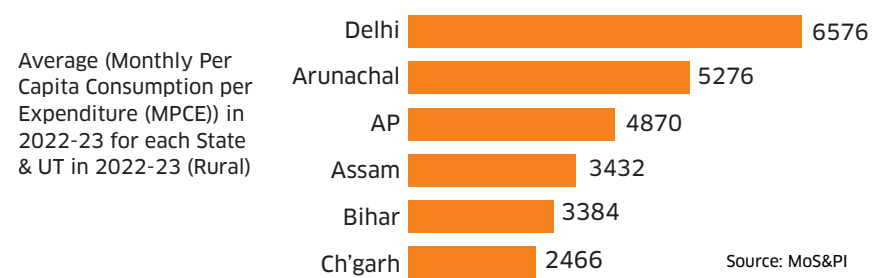

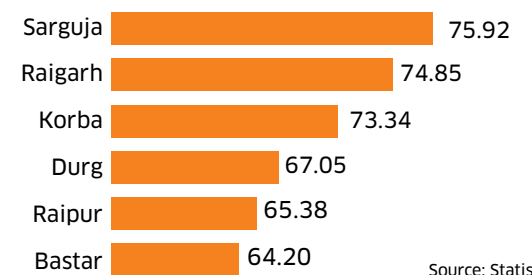

MNREGA workers paid Rs 200 a week instead of Rs 243 a day

KHAIRAGARH: Hundreds of villagers of Pachpedi Panchayat working under MNREGA scheme are facing the arbitrariness of the officials as they are allegedly being paid Rs 200 a week instead of the fixed pay norm of Rs. 243 a day. Demanding justice the effected villages particularly women here reached the Collectorate and submitted a memorandum to ADM Premkumar Patel citing the arbitrariness of the MNREGA officers in paying only Rs 200 a week.

While submitting the memorandum to the ADM, the villagers alleged that the villagers of the Gram Panchayat have been working under MNREGA for the last eight weeks and the work of pond deepening is underway. The villagers also informed that approximately 250 villagers of the village are getting employment, via the employment scheme, but were let off the benefits when a mere sum of Rs 200 a week in total was paid to them. calculated are coming to only Rs 20 to 30 per day, they attributed.

Women workers namely, Seema, Lakshmi, Khileshwari, Manisha, Kiran, Sangeeta, Maneka, Rameshwari, Revati, Ashabai, Lokeshwari, Satrupa, Sunita, Malti, Naina, Triveni, Shashibai, Gayatri, Sunita Jangade, Jethiyabai and many others who arrived to hand over the memorandum, also said that a 13 by 13 pit

India ranks number 10 in cybercrime

A new study, the 'World Cybercrime Index,' surveyed 100 countries, identifying top-ranking nations like Russia, Ukraine, and China. | by Press Trust of India

India ranked number 10 in cybercrime, with frauds involving people to make advance fee payment being the most common type, according to a new research that surveyed cybercrime experts around the world.

An international team of researchers has compiled the 'World Cybercrime Index' that ranks roughly 100 countries and identifies key hotspots according to various categories of cybercrime, including ransomware, credit card theft and scams.

Russia topped the list, and was followed by Ukraine, China, the US, Nigeria and Romania. North Korea was at the seventh position, while the UK and Brazil were at the eighth and ninth positions, respectively, according to the research published in the journal PLoS ONE.

Through the survey, the researchers asked the experts to consider major types of crime in the virtual world and nominate countries that they thought contributed significantly to each of them.

The major categories that the researchers identified were - technical products

and services such as malware and compromising systems; attacks and extortion including ransomware; data and identity theft including hacking, compromising accounts and credit cards; scams such as advance fee fraud; and cashing out or money laundering involving illegitimate virtual currency.

Invites to respond to the survey were sent out from March to October 2021. The team received 92 complete survey responses.

The top six countries appeared among the top ten countries under each cybercrime category, the researchers found. They further found that countries that are cybercrime hubs "specialise" in particular categories. "Russia and Ukraine are highly technical cybercrime hubs, whereas Nigerian cybercriminals are engaged in less technical forms of cybercrime," the authors wrote in the study.

Among the top ranking

countries, while some may "specialise" in cybercrime types with middling technical complexity - such as those involved in data and identity theft - others may "specialise" in both high-tech and low-tech crimes, they said.

India was found to "specialise" in scams. Further, while Romania and the US were found to "specialise" in both high-tech and low-tech crimes, India was found to be a "balanced hub", "specialising" in mid-tech crimes.

"In short, each country has a distinct profile, indicating a unique local dimension," the authors wrote.

"We now have a deeper understanding of the geography of cybercrime, and how different countries specialise in different types of cybercrime," said study co-author Miranda Bruce from the University of Oxford, UK.

The "intensive" three-year-long research "will help remove the veil of anonymity around cybercriminal offenders, and we hope that it will aid the fight against the growing threat of profit-driven cybercrime," said Bruce. The experts contacted by the researchers were professionals engaged in cybercrime intelligence, investigation and attribution for at least five years, were "not actively involved in tracking offenders" and had an "excellent" reputation among peers.

The World Cybercrime Index reveals global cybercrime trends, with India ranking 10th. Specialized hubs exist, highlighting the need for targeted intervention in combating evolving cyber threats worldwide.

Demographic dividends

India not reaping benefits of demographic dividend: Raghuram

WASHINGTON: India is not reaping the benefits of demographic dividends, former RBI governor Raghuram Rajan said on Tuesday, emphasising that there is a need to focus on improving the human capital and enhancing their skill sets. "I think we are in the midst of it (demographic dividend), but the problem is we are not reaping the benefits," Rajan said at a conference on "Making India an Advanced Economy by 2047: What Will it Take" at the George Washington University here.

"That's why I said 6 per cent growth. If you think that's about what we are right now, take away the fluff in the GDP numbers. That 6 per cent is in the midst of a demographic dividend. It is much below where China and Korea were when they reaped their demographic dividend. "And that's why I'm saying we are being overly complacent when we say this is great.

Civil aviation ministry asks airlines to carry out risk assessment

NEW DELHI: Amid escalating tensions in the Middle East, the civil aviation ministry has asked airlines to carry out their own risk assessment on international flight operations. Air India, Vistara, IndiGo and various international airlines have opted for alternative flight paths to the West and are avoiding the Iranian airspace against the backdrop of tensions flaring up between Iran and Israel.

Civil Aviation Secretary Vumlunmang Vualnam told PTI that airlines have been asked to make their own risk assessment with respect to their flight operations. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) is handholding and interacting with the airlines, and also in touch with the external affairs ministry, he added. The secretary was responding to a query on whether there is an advisory by the ministry or the DGCA to airlines amid the crisis in the Middle East.

Middle East conflict, US inflation, foreign fund outflows drag mkts lower

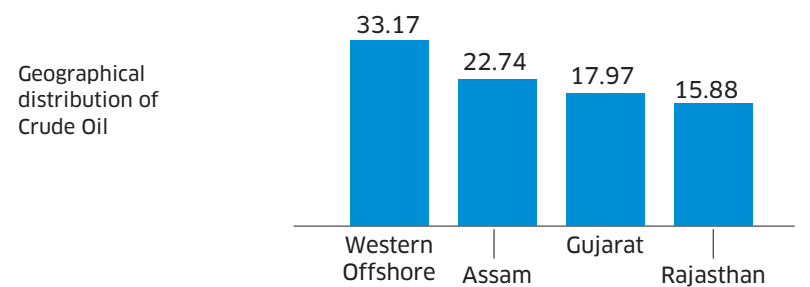


NEW DELHI: Global uncertainties, mainly escalating tensions between Iran and Israel, have led to a massive correction in the equity markets in the last three days after a record-shattering rally that saw the BSE Sensex crossing the historic 75,000 mark last week. Hotter-than-expected US inflation data fuelled concerns that the Federal Reserve will hold back on delivering the cuts to interest rates. Also, foreign fund outflows and profit-taking contributed to the correc-

tion in the equity markets. In the past three days, the BSE benchmark tanked 2,094.47 points or 2.79 per cent. Investors' wealth tumbled Rs 7.93 lakh crore in the three days of the market crash amid simmering tensions in the Middle East and weak global trends. "The heavy correction in the market can be attributed to several factors, including the escalating tensions between Iran and Israel, which have heightened geopolitical uncertainties and prompted risk aversion among investors.

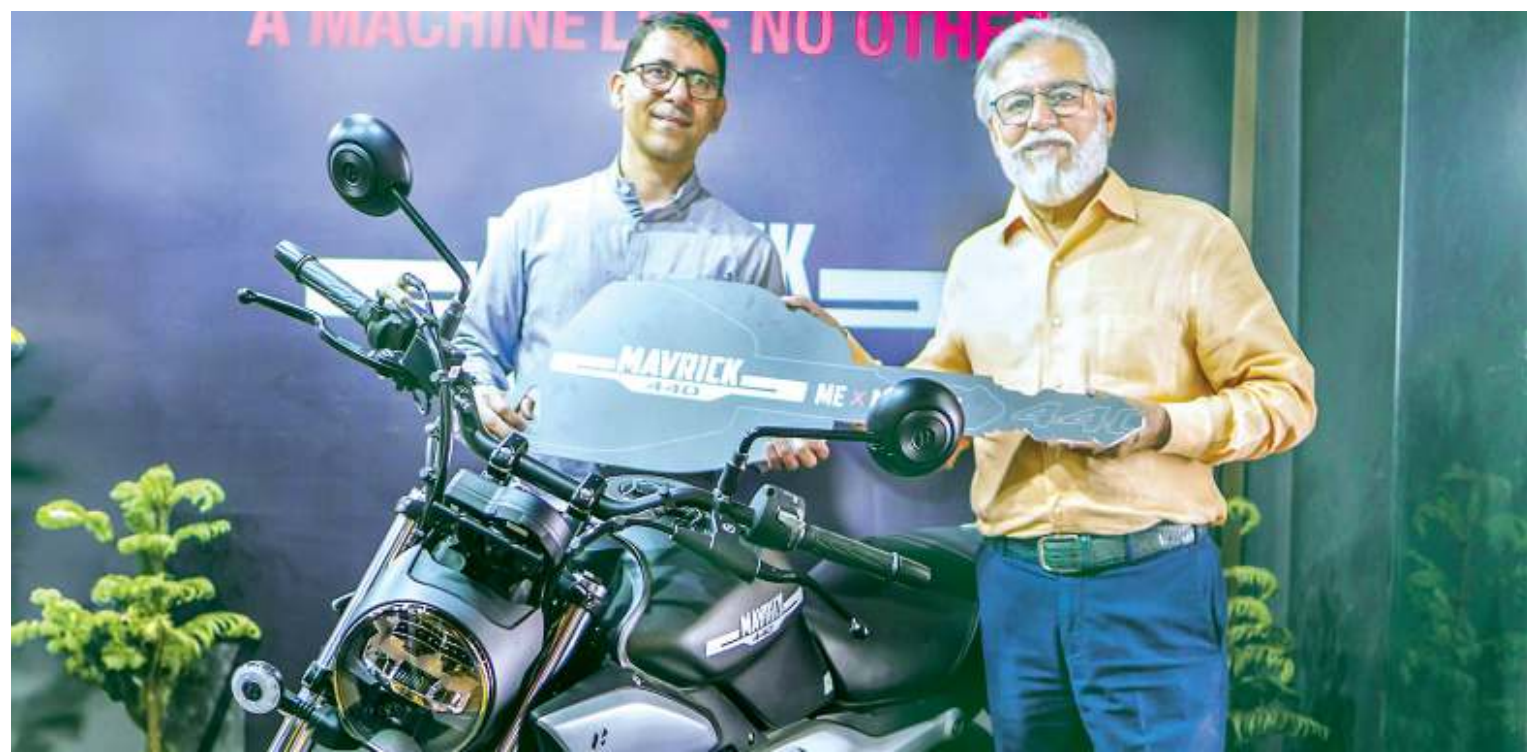
Zomato introduces 'large order fleet' for serving groups of up to 50 people

Reserve Bank issues draft guidelines on payment aggregators

MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank came out with draft guidelines to further strengthen regulations on payment aggregators, a move aimed at boosting the payment ecosystem. The draft also covers the physical point-of-sale activities of payment aggregators (PAs). The RBI said that given the growth in digital transactions and the significant role that PAs play in this space, the current directions on PAs are proposed to be updated and cover, inter alia, KYC and due diligence of merchants and operations in Escrow accounts.

WASHINGTON: India is "one of the strong performers", the International Monetary Fund, which in a report projected a 6.5 per cent growth rate for the country for the year 2024, said. With this, India continues to be the fastest growing economies of the world and ahead of China's growth projection of 4.6

per cent during the same period, it said. "Indeed, India is one of the strong performers. We had a fairly sharp revision in the Fiscal Year 2023 to 2024, the one that is ending, and that has just ended. Then we have 0.3 percentage point upgrade for Fiscal Year 2024 to 2025. So India is doing quite well," Pierre-Olivier Gourinchas, chief economist of the IMF,



told reporters at a news conference here. Growth in India is projected to remain strong at 6.8 per cent in 2024 and 6.5 per cent in 2025, with the robustness reflecting continuing strength in domestic demand and a rising working-age population, according to the latest edition of the World Economic Outlook released by the IMF.

YSRCP MLC Thota Trimurthulu convicted in Dalits atrocity case

VISAKHAPATNAM: A court here has convicted YSRCP candidate for Mandapeta Assembly seat, Thota Trimurthulu and eight others for tongsuring and assaulting a group of Dalits in East Godavari district in 1996, and sentenced them to 18 months simple imprisonment, along with a penalty.

The XI Additional District and SC/ST Court delivered the verdict in the case on Tuesday. The incident took place on December 29, 1996 at Venkatayapalem village in undivided East Godavari district. The Court convicted Trimurthulu and others under various sections under IPC, CrPC and SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act, 1989 for beating, tongsuring and shaving the eyebrows of K Chinna Raju and D Venkata Ratnam. Besides those two, three others were also assaulted. Expressing dissatisfaction over the punishment meted out to Trimurthulu, Ramayya, one of the victims, told PTI.

SMART MOVE

Smart cards to 650 prison inmates in Harsul Central Jail

SAMBHAJINAGAR: Authorities have distributed smart cards to nearly 650 inmates from the Harsul Central Jail in Maharashtra's Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar city to help them stay in touch with their family members and lawyers, an official said on Wednesday. The smart cards will allow the inmates to make three free calls, each for six minutes, a week, a district official said in a release. "Many families cannot come to meet their prisoner relatives in jail due to financial conditions. Therefore, to connect the prisoners with their families (and lawyers), smart cards have been provided to 650 prisoners at Harsul jail," the release said. However, the release did not specify if the inmates can call only those numbers shared in advance with the jail authorities or any number they choose. The facility - calling booth - has been made available on the prison premises for the prisoners as well as those under judicial custody, it said. **PTI**

Indian woman in Pakistan refuses to leave the country without her kids



VISAKHAPATNAM: Farzana Begum, an Indian national hailing from Mumbai, is currently in Pakistan fighting for the custody of her children, has refused to return to her native country, stating that her children's lives are in danger.

Farzana Begum married a Pakistani citizen, Mirza Mubin Elahi, in Abu Dhabi in 2015. Later, the couple came to Pakistan in 2018 and have two sons aged seven and six. Farzana's case gained public limelight after she allegedly tortured her husband over a dispute regarding the custody of her sons

and some properties in the name of her sons. Farzana rejects her husband's claims that he had divorced her, stating: "If he has divorced me, then there must be a certificate." "Me and my children's lives are in danger in Pakistan over a property dispute. I am confined to my house in Rehman Gardens, Lahore, and my children are enduring hunger," she said. Farzana called on the government of Pakistan to provide her with protection until the case was resolved, refusing to leave to her native country without her sons. **PTI**

BJP worker killed by Naxalites in Narayanpur ahead of the LS elections

NARAYANPUR: A worker of the ruling BJP was killed by Naxalites in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur district, police said on Wednesday. The incident, which took place at Dandvan village on late Tuesday night, came three days ahead of the Lok Sabha elections in the area. The district falls in the Bastar constituency which will go to polls on April 19.

This was the ninth killing of a local BJP worker by the Naxalites in a Maoist-affected region of the state since February 2023. Panchamdas, the victim of the latest incident, was the deputy sarpanch of his village, a police official said. While the body was sent for autopsy, security forces have launched an operation in the area to trace the assailants, the official added.

Talking to reporters in Narayanpur town, Chhattisgarh forest minister Kedar Kashyap condemned the incident. A probe will be conducted and those found guilty will face stern action, he said.

SURVEY REPORT

Unseasonal rains claim ten lives and 150 animals in Marathwada region

NARAYANPUR: Unseasonal rains have claimed the lives of 10 persons and 150 animals in Marathwada region of Maharashtra in a week's time since April 9, a primary survey report prepared by the state revenue department said. The Marathwada region comprises eight districts - Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar, Jalna, Beed, Parbhani, Latur, Nanded, Dharashiv and Hingoli.

The report said that spells of unseasonal rains lashed parts of Marathwada since April 9, causing loss of human and animal lives. The rainfall and hailstorms also damaged over 450 houses in 481 villages across the region. Crops standing on over 5,256.86 hectares of land belonging to 9,127 farmers were affected by unseasonal rains and hailstorms, it said. "Since April 9, unseasonal rains and hailstorms claimed the lives of 10 people, while as many others were injured. The highest number of three deaths occurred in Beed, followed by two more," the report added.

Centre will eliminate Naxals in very short period of time

AHMEDABAD: The Narendra Modi government will eliminate Naxals from the country in a very short period of time, Union Home Minister Amit Shah asserted on Wednesday.

The central government has been conducting incessant operations against terrorism and Naxals, he said in a statement, a day after security forces gunned down 29 Maoists in Chhattisgarh.

"I can say with conviction that operations against Naxals will continue in the times to come, and under the leadership of Modi, we will uproot Naxalism from our nation in a very short period of time," Shah said.

The home minister said since the formation of a BJP government in Chhattisgarh three months ago, more than 80 Naxals have been eliminated, more than 125 arrested and more than 150 have surrendered.

Shah said a large number of camps of security forces have been set up in Maoist-affected areas since 2014. Since 2019, as many as 250 such camps have been set up, ending the security vacuum, he said.

The airport has been pausing operations and rescheduling flights twice every year for decades to enable the bi-annual centuries-old ceremonial procession of the shrine to pass through the runway.

The practice of the temple procession tak-

ing that path to reach the Shangumugham beach for the holy bath of the idols began centuries ago and it has been continuing even after the establishment of the airport in 1932.

When the airport was constructed at the particular place, the then Travancore King Sree Chithira Thirunal had made it clear that facility would be open for public for 363 days in a year and for two days for Lord Padmanabha, the titular deity of the royal family, according to historians.

Schools in Odisha to remain closed from April 18-20 for heatwave

BHUBANESWAR: The Odisha government on Wednesday announced the closure of all schools in the state from April 18 to 20 in view of the India Meteorological Department's (IMD) heatwave forecast.

In a press statement, the School and Mass Education Department said the government has decided to close down all schools including those run by the government, government-aided and private for three days in view of prevailing heatwave conditions and rise in day temperature.

As per IMD's forecast, the temperature is likely to rise gradually by 2 to 4 degrees Celsius at many places during the next two days. The temperature is expected to cross the 45 degrees Celsius mark in a few places in Odisha from April 18 to 20. Baripada town in Mayurbhanj district was the hottest place in the entire country on Tuesday with a temperature of 43.6 degrees Celsius, weather scientist Umashankar Das said. In a bulletin, IMD's

Tribal paintings adorn polling booths

BERHAMPUR: In a bid to promote the elections as a festival of democracy among tribal people, the Gajapati district administration has adorned polling booths with idital, a unique painting of the Souras, a particularly vulnerable tribal group (PVTG) in Odisha.

"When people to go polling booths on May 13 to cast their votes, they will find their own painting in polling stations," a senior official said.

Saura and Lanjia Saura communities traditionally embellish their homes and villages with murals during festivals and ceremonies, including marriages.

Polling booths have been primarily set up in schools in PVTG-inhabited areas. Additionally, the administration has also roped Soura people to create awareness about voting through the



tribal language. This initiative is part of the SVEEP (Systematic Voters' Education and Electoral Participation) programme aimed at attracting voters to booths and increasing the turnout, an official said.

"The aim of setting up ethnic booths is to attract tribals, who seldom exercise their franchise and remain busy with their routine work, to vote", said Birendra Kumar Das, additional district magistrate-cum-returning officer, Mohana assembly segment in the district. Most of the Soura and its sub-group Lan-

jia Saura people live in Mohana and Gumma blocks of Gajapati district. Their population is over 33,000 (Soura 18,600 and Lanjia Soura 14,670), spread over two assembly segments - Mohana, reserved for the Scheduled Caste, and Paralakhemundi under Berhampur Lok Sabha constituency.

"The administration has decided to set up 33 ethnic booths, which will be managed by the polling personnel of tribal communities," he said.

Meanwhile, a team of officers is raising awareness in remote villages to enhance voter turnout.

Croatia votes in a parliamentary poll in president-PM showdown

ZAGREB: Croatia is voting Wednesday in a parliamentary election after a campaign that centred on a bitter rivalry between the president and prime minister of the country.

The ballot pits the ruling conservative Croatian Democratic Union, or HDZ, led by Prime Minister Andrej Plenkovic, against an alliance of centrist and left-wing parties informally led by populist President Zoran Milanovic and his Social Democratic Party, or SDP. The election is being held as Croatia, a European Union and NATO member, struggles with the highest inflation rate in the eurozone, a labour shortage, illegal migration and reports of widespread corruption. At stake in the race for Croatia's 151-seat parliament isn't just the Adriatic Sea country's future domestic policies, but also the EU's unity as it grapples with the instability from Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine. **PTI**

Ten arrested in raid against an international human smuggling gang in Germany



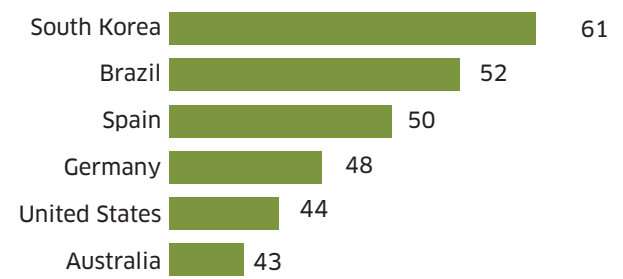
BERLIN: German authorities conducted a large-scale raid against an international human smuggling gang early Wednesday, police said in a statement. More than 1,000 police officers searched dozens of homes, stores and offices across western and southern Germany and arrested 10 suspects, including two lawyers. The suspects are accused of having illegally taken advantage of special German immigration rules reserved only for skilled foreign workers to procure residency

permits for around 350 mostly Chinese nationals – who don't meet the needed criteria – in exchange for hundreds of thousands of euros (dollars). According to the daily Bild newspaper, several employees of immigration offices were bribed in the scam. Raids were carried out in the states of North Rhine-Westphalia, Schleswig-Holstein, Hesse, Rhineland-Palatinate, Baden-Wuerttemberg and Bavaria, Hamburg and Berlin where police seized assets and collected evidence.

Italy seeks G7 message to de-escalate Mideast tensions

ROME: Group of Seven foreign ministers are meeting on the Italian resort island of Capri, with soaring tensions in the Mideast and Russia's continuing war in Ukraine topping the agenda. Under Italy's rotating stewardship, the G7 leaders are expected to issue a united call for Israel to exercise restraint after Iran's unprecedented weekend attack involving hundreds of drones, ballistic missiles and cruise missiles fired toward the Jewish state.

Italian Foreign Minister Antonio Tajani said he had spoken to his Israeli counterpart, Israel Katz, on Tuesday and urged Israel to not only de-escalate any reaction to Iran's attack but to stave off a planned offensive into the southern Gaza city of Rafah. "I reiterated this message and I believe that on the occasion of the G7 foreign ministers in Capri, tomorrow and Friday morning, a similar message will be sent," Tajani told state-run RAI. **PTI**

PARIS: With the Paris Olympic Games 100 days away, police carried out a large-scale eviction at France's biggest squat in the south of the capital. Authorities, including dozens of gendarmes, cleared out the makeshift camp at an abandoned bus company headquarters in Vitry-sur-Seine on Wednesday. The camp had become home to about 450 migrants, with images of the eviction spreading rapidly across social media. Aid workers are concerned that the broader effort by Paris authorities to clear out migrants. **PTI**

Sunak to Netanyahu: Exercise restraint after Iran's attacks

UK PM says significant escalation was in no one's interest and would only deepen insecurity in the Middle East. This was a moment for calm heads to prevail

LONDON: British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak has called on his Israeli counterpart Benjamin Netanyahu to exercise restraint and let "calm heads" prevail in the wake of Iran's missile attacks as his Foreign Secretary David Cameron landed in Tel Aviv for talks on Wednesday. In a phone call, Sunak reiterated the UK's "steadfast support" for regional stability and told the Israeli leader that Iran had miscalculated its move, being isolated

on the global stage as a result. Netanyahu is said to have thanked Britain for its "rapid and robust" support in the face of Iran's unprecedented direct attack on Israel on Saturday. "The Prime Minister [Sunak] said Iran had badly miscalculated and was increasingly isolated on the global stage, with the G7 coordinating a diplomatic response," Downing Street said in a readout of the call on Tuesday evening. "He stressed that significant escalation was in no one's

interest and would only deepen insecurity in the Middle East. This was a moment for calm heads

to prevail," the statement said. On the ongoing Israel-Hamas conflict in Gaza, Sunak told Netanyahu that he remained gravely concerned about the deepening humanitarian crisis. "The UK wanted to see a massive step change in aid access to flood Gaza with vital supplies, including Israel opening up new aid routes as quickly as possible. The Prime Minister said it was deeply disappointing that Hamas blocked a deal at the weekend that would have saved Palestinian

lives and secured the safe release of hostages," Downing Street added.

The call will form the backdrop for Cameron's discussions in Israel, where he is expected to meet Netanyahu and senior Israeli officials and attempt to talk the country out of retaliating to Iran's assault. The visit will include meetings in the occupied West Bank, after which Cameron will travel to a gathering of Group of Seven (G7) ministers in Italy to discuss further sanctions on Iran.

planes flown by the government go through clouds burning special salt flares. Those flares can increase precipitation. Several reports quoted meteorologists at the National Center for Meteorology as saying they flew six or seven cloud-seeding flights before the rains. The center did not

immediately respond to questions Wednesday, though flight-tracking data analyzed by The Associated Press showed one aircraft affiliated with the UAE's cloud-seeding efforts flew around the country Sunday.

The UAE, which heavily relies on energy-hungry desalination plants to provide water, conducts cloud seeding in part to increase its dwindling, limited groundwater.

The rains began late Monday, soaking the sands and roadways of Dubai with some 20 millimeters (0.79 inches) of rain, according to meteorological data collected at Dubai International Airport. The storms intensified around 9 am local Tuesday and continued throughout the day, dumping more rain and hail onto the overwhelmed city.
