Kasna police station in Greater Noida in July last year on the complaint of a deputy director of the **Enforcement Directorate** (ED), which is investigating the alleged scam. Those named as accused were Niranjan Das, IAS officer and former excise commissioner of Chhattisgarh, Arunpati Trip-

athi, managing director of Chhattisgarh State Marketing Corporation Limited and special secretary (excise), Chhattisgarh, Anil Tuteja, IAS officer and former industries secretary, Chhattisgarh, Anwar Dhewar, a politician, and Noidabased businessman Vidhu Gupta.

She finally breached the fortress in 2019, beating the Gandhi family scion by over 55,000 votes. However, Gandhi's 'Plan B' seemed to have worked as he contested the polls from two constituencies and won from Kerala's Wayanad, ensur-





### LDF, BJP in Kerala criticise Rahul nomination from Rae Bareli

Congress leader cheated the people of Wayanad where he contested the general election on April 26

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: The CPI(M)-led Left Democratic Front and the BJP in Kerala lashed out at Rahul Gandhi on Friday for filing his nomination from Rae Bareli in Uttar Pradesh for the Lok Sabha polls. They alleged that the Congress leader cheated the people of Wayanad in Kerala, where he contested the general election on April 26, and said that fighting polls from another seat "does not align with political morality". Gandhi, the sitting MP of

Wayanad, today filed his nomination papers from Rae Bareli.

The Congress, however, justified the decision, saying that contesting from Rae Bareli was an emotional matter for him as it had been represented by his grandmother Indira Gandhi and later by his mother Sonia Gandhi.

"The party had entrusted the decision on Amethi and Rae Bareli seats with the Congress president. After discussing with the senior leadership the party asked Rahul Gandhi to con-

test in Rae Bareli and he agreed," said AICC general secretary in-charge of Organisation, K C Venugopal.

He also added that if Rahul wins both seats, the decision to retain one seat will be taken

accordingly. However, senior CPI

leader and the Left candidate from Wayanad, Annie Raja, told the media that Rahul Gandhi has done injustice to the people of the constituency. Meanwhile, senior leader of the Indian Union Muslim League (IUML), a major ally of the Congress in Kerala, PK Kunhalikutty supported the decision of Gandhi and said this was not the first time a politician was contesting from two seats. The IUML leader asked the Left to refrain from criticising

the decision and claimed that Rahul's candidature in Rae Bareli will increase the chances of the INDIA bloc parties winning the polls.

BJP state chief K Surendran said Rahul fooled the people of Wayanad constituency. Surendran, who was also the NDA's Wayanad candidate in the recently concluded polls in Kerala, said the "double standards" of Rahul Gandhi were exposed today. The BJP leader also said that the decision to contest from Rae Bareli instead of Amethi "shows his cowardice."

**BJP** names Santosh Khatua for Nilgiri assembly seat

BHUBANESWAR: The BJP on Friday named Santosh Khatua as its candidate for Nilgiri assembly seat in Odisha's Balasore district, thus completing the process of announcing nominees for the simultaneous elections in the state. The Lok Sabha and assembly polls will be held in the state from May 13 to June 1. Khatua had on Thursday resigned from the BJD after being denied a party ticket from Nilgiri seat. He joined the BJP and was nominated by the saffron party. In the 2019 polls, Khatua had contested from the seat as a BJD candidate but lost to BJP's Sukant Nayak. Nayak, on the other hand, joined the BJD on March 31 and has been nominated by the regional party for the Nilgiri seat. Nayak had won the Nilgiri seat twice, in 2014 and 2019. In 2014, he had contested as a BJD candidate and in 2019, he fought on the BJP's symbol and defeated Khatua by a margin of 1,577 votes.





### India's Stand Against Chinese Border Encroachments

ndia has vocalized its unwavering opposition to China's construction activities in the Shaksgam LValley, situated in the sensitive region of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has vehemently condemned these actions as illegal attempts to tamper with ground realities. The stance adopted by India resonates with historical and legal assertions regarding the Shaksgam Valley. It is imperative to underscore that India steadfastly refutes the validity of the 1963 China-Pakistan agreement, which purportedly transferred control of the region to China. This steadfast refusal underscores India's principled stand on territorial integrity. Randhir Jaiswal, spokesperson for the MEA, emphasized India's sovereign rights over the Shaksgam Valley. The assertion of these rights is not merely a matter of rhetoric but a testament to India's commitment to safeguard its territorial boundaries. The Shaksgam Valley issue is not an isolated concern but part of a broader pattern of Chinese encroachments along the Line of Actual Control (LAC). China's strategic maneuvers, as evidenced by incursions and military infrastructure development, pose a significant challenge to India's security paradigm. The international community has increasingly recognized the gravity of China's aggressive posturing along the border. Recent studies underscore the strategic calculus behind China's incursions, aimed at establishing a lasting presence in contested regions. India's response to these provocations is not only a defense of its own sovereignty but also a deterrent against unilateral alterations of the status quo. While the path to resolution may be protracted, India remains steadfast in its commitment to dialogue and diplomatic engagement. The forthcoming engagements signify a concerted effort to address these complex issues and uphold the principles of peaceful coexistence. The onus lies on the international community to uphold principles of justice and respect for established borders in the face of such provocations.

### The Enigma of Frenemy Relations in Indian Politics

ew words are continuously added to the political lexicon in India and one such and the latest being the frenemy politics. The Congress and Left parties are the ones who popularized the frenemy concept through their weird policy of friends in Bengal and enemies in Kerala. Ideologically, both Congress and Left, accept that there nothing common between them and their manifestos for the current Lok Sabha elections testifies that. Congress continues to abide by the bourgeois democratic system while the Left follows the diametrically opposite socialist agenda with a single party dominance as proscribed by Lenin-Mao. They are bitter enemies even during the pre-independence time and continues to be except during the formation of opportunistic alliance, this time to keep their bitter foe Right away from the power. The Left is adept at

defending its political moves, however wrong or disastrous they may, as they had a huge media support. 

Locally known as 'Varai Aadu', the Nilgiri Tahr is the state animal.

CHENNAI: The Tamil Nadu forest department conducted the first ever Nilgiri Tahr synchronised survey and the data is likely to be made available within three weeks from now, Additional Chief Secretary, Environment Climate Change & Forests, Supriya Sahu said on Fridav.

This endangered species is endemic to the Western Ghats and is known for its gravity-defying skills in climbing steep cliffs.

"The first ever Nilgiri Tahr Synchronised Survey by the Tamil Nadu Forest Department successfully concluded on May 1," Sahu said. "Survey teams from 138 blocks included 700 members from 13 forest divisions and 100 forest beats," she said in a post on social media platform X. Debriefing and data

collection were going on, she said, and thanked the experts from IUCN, WII and WWF for their wholehearted support and collaboration.



"This ban is apt and should send a strong message to players and corrupters that attempts to corrupt our sport will be dealt with firmly," ICC general manager Alex Marshall said.





BEIJING: China on Friday launched a 53-day-long lunar probe mission to collect samples for the first time from the far side of the moon and bring them for scientific studies.
