NEW DELHI: Noida: The Special Task Force of the Uttar Pradesh police on Thursday arrested a Noida-based businessman in connection with a probe into the alleged scam, officials said. An FIR was lodged at the

Kasna police station in Greater Noida in July last year on the complaint of a deputy director of the Enforcement Directorate (ED), which is investigating the alleged scam. Those named as accused were Niranjn Das, IAS officer and former excise commissioner of Chhattisgarh, Arunpati Trip-

athi, managing director of Chhattisgarh State Marketing Corporation Limited and special secretary (excise), Chhattisgarh, Anil Tuteja, IAS officer and former industries secretary, Chhattisgarh, Anwar Dhewar, a politician, and Noida-based businessman Vidhu Gupta.



Rahul makes 'chess move' with shift to Rae Bareli

Gandhi hopes that the move will checkmate opponents but BJP sees it as a cowardly retreat.

NEW DELHI: Rahul Gandhi describes himself as the best chess player among Indian politicians, and his latest gambit appears to be his decision to contest from Rae Bareli instead of his home ground Amethi.

"He is an experienced player of politics and chess. The party leadership takes its decisions after much discussion, and as part of a larger strategy. This single decision has befuddled the BJP, its supporters, and its sycophants," Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said in a post on the much-anticipated decision. "The BJP's self-proclaimed Chanakya, who used to talk about 'paramparagat seat' is now not sure how to respond," he said. The chess reference by Ramesh comes days after the Congress put

Amethi in 2004 and saw relative smooth sailing in the first 10 years with the UPA being in power, while the last 10 years have been challenging.

He won the 2014 polls against the BJP's Smriti Irani by over a lakh votes but she had run a spirited campaign and made inroads into the Congress citadel of Amethi.

She finally breached the fortress in 2019, beating the Gandhi family scion by over 55,000 votes. However, Gandhi's 'Plan B' seemed to have worked as he contested the polls from two constituencies and won from Kerala's Wayanad, ensuring that his stint in Parliament continued.

Some of the earlier electoral gambles of Gandhi such as pitching the 2019 polls campaign of the Congress on the Rafale issue have not paid off but Gandhi maintained his attack on Narendra Modi.

A bench of Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra said the first thing that comes to the mind of the woman, her parents and relatives is police, as if police are the panacea of all evil. No sooner the matter reaches police, even if there are fair chances of reconciliation between the spouses, they would get destroyed, the bench

EC for quick no dues certificate to people to contest polls

NEW DELHI: The Election Commission on Friday directed states to ensure that those intending to contest polls are provided with 'no dues certificate' within 48 hours of the request as those who do

not submit the document while filing nominations face the prospect of their papers being rejected.

If a candidate is not able to provide 'no dues certificate' even after he has cleared all such dues, it goes against his candidature at the time

NEW DELHI: The ED Friday said it has attached assets worth over Rs 205 crore of retired IAS officer Anil Tuteja, the Raipur mayor's brother and a former excise department special secretary, besides others, in a money-laundering probe linked to an alleged

liquor scam in Chhattisgarh. The attached properties include 14 assets of Tuteja worth Rs 15.82 crore, 115 properties of Anwar Dhebar, the elder brother of Raipur Mayor and Congress leader Aijaz Dhebar, worth Rs 116.16 crore, properties of Vikash Agarwal alias Subbu worth Rs 1.54 crore and 33 properties

of Arvind Singh worth Rs 12.99 crore, it said in a statement. A property worth Rs 1.35 crore of Arunpati Tripathi, an Indian Telecom Service officer and special secretary of the excise department, nine properties worth Rs 28.13 crore of liquor businessman Trilok Singh Dhillon and jewel-

Charging the Prime Minister Modi with spreading lies about Congress' manifesto, Sappal said that Modi was lying because he was afraid of the truth of Congress manifesto about inflation. Inflation has increased in the last 10 years and the data of Reserve Bank of India shows that in the last one year, the liability of the general public in India

When the Congress' INDIA Alliance government comes to power at the Centre, first of all women will be given Rs 1 lakh annually under the Mahalaxmi Yojana and women will get 50 percent reservation in government jobs, he said.

According to him unemployment in this country has increased the most in 4 decades. 'The policy that Modi government talks about

was never implemented, like neither smart city was made, nor Make in India was made, nor was it able to clean the Ganga, nor was it able to double the income of the farmers', he said. According to him manufacturing has fallen by almost a quarter during the Modi government and therefore there is no employment. Modi brought GST which every businessman is unhappy with and the entire business class has been ruined, he said. Moreover recruitment in railways and banks has stopped, he said.

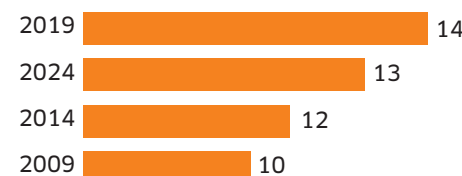

Three dry days Chhattisgarh in view of LS polls



RAIPUR: In view of the third phase of Lok Sabha elections to be held on May 7, liquor shops will remain closed for 3 days in Chhattisgarh. Liquor shops will remain closed on 5, 6 and 7 May. The shutters of the shops will open only on the next day of elections i.e. on 8th May.

The Excise Department has declared three days as dry day in view of the Lok Sabha elections. Liquor shops will remain closed 48 hours before voting i.e. from 5 pm on May 5. This order will be applicable to Durg, Bilaspur, Janjgir-Champa, Korba, Raigarh, Surguja Lok Sabha constituencies including Raipur.

Gang of thieves busted, 4 arrested for stealing lakhs

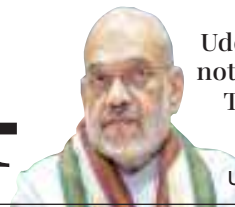

BJP names Santosh Khatua for Nilgiri assembly seat

BHUBANESWAR: The BJP on Friday named Santosh Khatua as its candidate for Nilgiri assembly seat in Odisha's Balasore district, thus completing the process of announcing nominees for the simultaneous elections in the state. The Lok Sabha and assembly polls will be held in the state from May 13 to June 1. Khatua had on Thursday resigned from the BJD after being denied a party ticket from Nilgiri seat. He joined the BJP and was nominated by the saffron party. In the 2019 polls, Khatua had contested from the seat as a BJD candidate but lost to BJP's Sukant Nayak. Nayak, on the other hand, joined the BJD on March 31 and has been nominated by the regional party for the Nilgiri seat. Nayak had won the Nilgiri seat twice, in 2014 and 2019. In 2014, he had contested as a BJD candidate and in 2019, he fought on the BJP's symbol and defeated Khatua by a margin of 1,577 votes.

LDF, BJP in Kerala criticise Rahul nomination from Rae Bareli

Congress leader cheated the people of Wayanad where he contested the general election on April 26

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: The CPI(M)-led Left Democratic Front and the BJP in Kerala lashed out at Rahul Gandhi on Friday for filing his nomination from Rae Bareli in Uttar Pradesh for the Lok Sabha polls. They alleged that the Congress leader cheated the people of Wayanad in Kerala, where he contested the general election on April 26, and said that fighting polls from another seat "does not align with political morality". Gandhi, the sitting MP of

Wayanad, today filed his nomination papers from Rae Bareli.

The Congress, however, justified the decision, saying that contesting from Rae Bareli was an emotional matter for him as it had been represented by his grandmother Indira Gandhi and later by his mother Sonia Gandhi.

"The party had entrusted the decision on Amethi and Rae Bareli seats with the Congress president. After discussing with the senior leadership the party asked Rahul Gandhi to con-

test in Rae Bareli and he agreed," said AICC general secretary in-charge of Organisation, K C Venugopal.

He also added that if Rahul wins both seats, the decision to retain one seat will be taken

accordingly.

However, senior CPI leader and the Left candidate from Wayanad, Annie Raja, told the media that Rahul Gandhi has done injustice to the people of the constituency. Meanwhile, senior leader of the Indian Union Muslim League (IUML), a major ally of the Congress in Kerala, PK Kunhalikutty supported the decision of Gandhi and said this was not the first time a politician was contesting from two seats. The IUML leader asked the Left to refrain from criticising

the decision and claimed that Rahul's candidature in Rae Bareli will increase the chances of the INDIA bloc parties winning the polls.

BJP state chief K Surendran said Rahul fooled the people of Wayanad constituency. Surendran, who was also the NDA's Wayanad candidate in the recently concluded polls in Kerala, said the "double standards" of Rahul Gandhi were exposed today. The BJP leader also said that the decision to contest from Rae Bareli instead of Amethi "shows his cowardice."

Uddhav running 'nakli' Shiv Sena

Real party lies with Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, says Amit Shah

MP Congress chief Jitu expresses regret

BHOPAL: Madhya Pradesh Congress chief Jitu Patwari on Friday expressed regret after his alleged derogatory remarks about state BJP leader Imarti Devi sparked a controversy, prompting criticism from Union minister Jyotiraditya Scindia. It started after an audio clip went viral on social media in which a woman can be heard supporting the Congress candidates from the Bhind and Gwalior Lok Sabha seats, with the claim that the voice was of Imarti Devi, a former MLA from Dabra in Gwalior district. Imarti Devi, however, denied that it was her voice in the audio clip and termed it a conspiracy. Asked about the piece of audio and the ex-MLA's denial, Patwari allegedly made some offensive remarks using wordplay with the term 'imarti', a popular sweet.

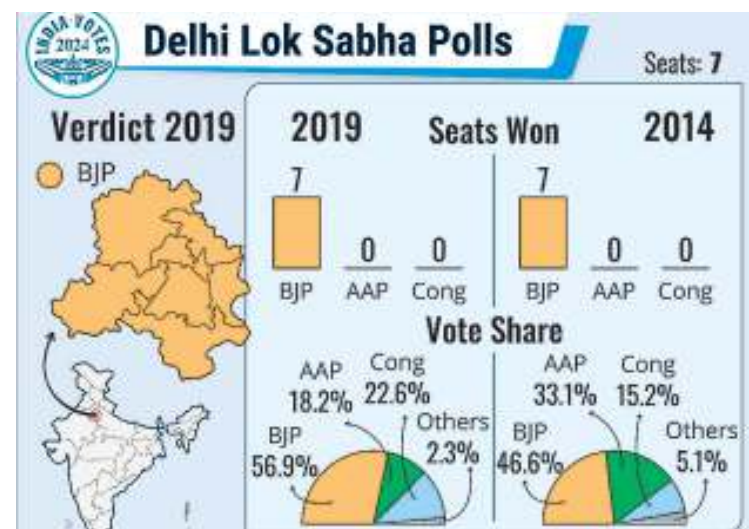
had gone to Raj Bhavan looking for a job. Banerjee questioned why Prime Minister Narendra Modi,

Bose on Thursday said he will not be cowed down by "engineered narratives" and the "truth shall triumph", hours after TMC leaders claimed that the woman had lodged a police complaint against the governor for molestation.

Banerjee also criticised the Election Commission for transferring around 1,500 police officers from West Bengal to other states for election duties, without reciprocal assistance from other states.

Modi must release 'White Paper' on funds released by Centre to under PMAY

NANOOOR: Trinamool Congress leader Abhishek Banerjee on Friday urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to release a 'White Paper' detailing the funds allocated by the Centre to West Bengal under the 'PM Awas Yojana' over the past three to four years.

Banerjee said if Modi could prove that his government has provided a single penny to Bengal for the scheme, he would cease campaigning for party candidates in the ongoing Lok Sabha election.

"The central government has conspired not to release funds for the people of Bengal. I would urge the PM that instead of giving lectures, he must release a 'White Paper' detailing the funds disbursed to the people of Bengal for the Awas Yojana," Banerjee said while speaking at an election rally in support of party candidate Asit Pal.

Jailed separatist leader's brother files nomination from Baramulla

BARAMULLA: Jailed separatist leader Nayeem Khan's brother, Munir Khan, on Friday filed his nomination papers from Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla Lok Sabha constituency, which is going to polls in the fifth phase on May 20. Nayeem Khan was arrested on July 24, 2017 in a terror-related case. He headed the Jammu Kashmir National Front, which was banned by the government under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. Munir Khan, who is a part of the Jammu Kashmir Nationalist People's Front Party, launched two years ago, filed the nomination papers before Baramulla Deputy Commissioner Minga Sherpa, the returning officer of the constituency.

Former J&K chief minister and National Conference VP Omar Abdullah, People's Conference president and separatist-turned-mainstream-politician Sajad Lone, former RS MP and PDP leader Mir Fayaz and former MLA SA Rashid, who is currently in jail, have also filed nominations from the seat.

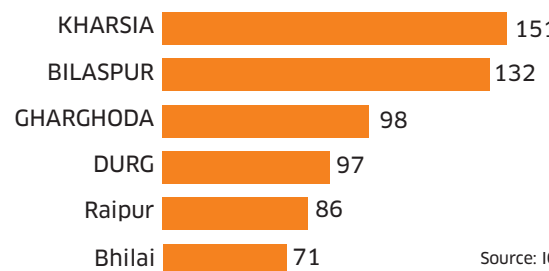

5000 lives in turmoil amid crusher mine chaos

KHAIRAGARH: The rural heartlands of Khairagarh continue to grapple with a pressing issue as the devastating impact of crusher mines persists, leaving a population of 5000 in dire straits. Journalists, equipped with both training and innate qualities, navigate the responsibility of providing accurate and insightful reporting. Despite continuous scrutiny, the press remains vital in safeguarding democratic principles, empowering citizens with the information required to make informed decisions and actively participate in civic life.

New words are continuously added to the political lexicon in India and one such and the latest being the frenemy politics. The Congress and Left parties are the ones who popularized the frenemy concept through their weird policy of friends in Bengal and enemies in Kerala. Ideologically, both Congress and Left, accept that there nothing common between them and their manifestos for the current Lok Sabha elections testifies that. Congress continues to abide by the bourgeois democratic system while the Left follows the diametrically opposite socialist agenda with a single party dominance as proscribed by Lenin-Mao. They are bitter enemies even during the pre-independence time and continues to be except during the formation of opportunistic alliance, this time to keep their bitter foe Right away from the power.

Rahul Gandhi wondering why the Kerala CM Pinarayi Vijayan is not in jail along with Kejriwal and Hemant Soren though facing the same financial scandals and the CPM leaders questioning the genetic as well as intellectual credentials of Rahul Gandhi. The CPI on its part questioned the rationale of Rahul Gandhi's contest in Kerala's Waynad without challenging the BJP in North. That party doubted the sincerity of Congress in taking on BJP ideology. It is strange that despite such a bitter relation in the west coast state that Congress and CPM and other Left parties still stay in INDI alliance and Congress party entertain Left parties despite their bitter attack on Rahul Gandhi.

The current frenemy political arrangement of Left and Congress is the best example for the self-serving, negative

brand of politics. There is nothing common before the elections and there no commonality in the post-election scenario if their INDI alliance fails to form the government at Delhi. Left always ran negative politics outside their three strongholds. They know their limitation at the national scene, hence its convenient shift from one side to the other. It fought with Congress by joining hands with Janata Party in 1977 elections. It supported the UPA formation in 2004 and withdrew its support in 2008 and fought against Congress in 2009 election. With Modi's ascendancy at national level and growing irrelevance of Left ideology it turned friendly with Congress. Left is the cheer leader of "Modi Hatao" group. The recent secret meeting of Kerala CPM politburo member E.P. Jayaraman meeting BJP in-charge Prakash Javadekar is causing ripples in Left island. Whether it is extension of frenemy political policy of Left or its conversion to 'no permanent friends or enemies in politics' dictum.

Collapse of earth's magnetic field may made life complex

Discoveries suggest Earth's magnetic field collapse over 500 million years ago could have spurred the complexity and diversity of life. by Press Trust of India.

The Earth's magnetic field, a crucial shield against harmful space radiation, has long intrigued scientists with its fluctuations and potential impact on life. Recent research suggests a fascinating link between the weakening of this magnetic shield over 500 million years ago and the diversification of complex biological life forms, shedding new light on Earth's ancient past.

The emergence of complex multicellular organisms, such as the Ediacaran fauna, between 575 and 565 million years ago marks a pivotal period in Earth's biological evolution. Fossil records reveal a significant uptick in complexity and diversity during this timeframe, sparking curiosity among researchers about the driving forces behind this evolutionary leap.

Previous studies have highlighted the role of rising oxygen levels in facilitating the proliferation of complex life forms. However, the mechanisms triggering this increase remained elusive until recent investigations delved deeper into the Earth's magnetic history.

An international team of researchers, spearheaded by the University of Rochester, US, embarked on a ground-

breaking study to unravel the mysteries of Earth's magnetic field during the Ediacaran period. Their findings, published in the journal 'Communications Earth and Environment,' provide compelling insights into the interplay between geomagnetism and biological evolution.

By analyzing 21 plagioclase crystals extracted from a 591-million-year-old rock formation in southern Brazil, the researchers uncovered a remarkable revelation: the Earth's magnetic field was at

its weakest ever recorded during this epoch. These crystals, ubiquitous in the Earth's crust, preserve invaluable information about the magnetic field intensity at the time of their formation.

The team's analysis revealed that the magnetic field strength was approximately 30 times weaker than the current intensity. This unprecedented weakening, termed a "near-collapse" by the researchers, had profound implications for Earth's atmospheric composition and, consequently, the

evolution of life.

The weakened magnetic field likely facilitated the escape of hydrogen from the Earth's atmosphere, leading to an increase in atmospheric oxygen levels. This surge in oxygen concentration provided a conducive environment for the development and proliferation of complex organisms, fueling the diversification observed in the fossil record.

The researchers postulate that extreme coronal mass ejection (CME) events, dur-

ing which the Sun ejects large quantities of plasma and magnetic field from its corona, played a pivotal role in exacerbating the weakening of Earth's magnetic field. These events may have pushed the boundary of the magnetic field closer to the planet's surface, facilitating hydrogen escape and amplifying the oxygen-rich environment.

Remarkably, the ultra-low magnetic field strengths persisted for an estimated 26 million years, coinciding with the timeframe of increased oxygen levels and biological diversification. This temporal alignment reinforces the potential causal link between geomagnetic fluctuations and biological evolution during the Ediacaran period.

The implications of these findings extend beyond mere geological curiosity. Earth's magnetic field, a fundamental component of its habitability, exerts a profound influence on the planet's climate, atmosphere, and biological evolution. Understanding the intricate dynamics between geomagnetism and life's emergence sheds light on the intricate interplay shaping Earth's history and underscores the delicate balance sustaining life on our planet.

Sensex tumbles 700 points amid broadbased selloff; Nifty slips 172.35 points



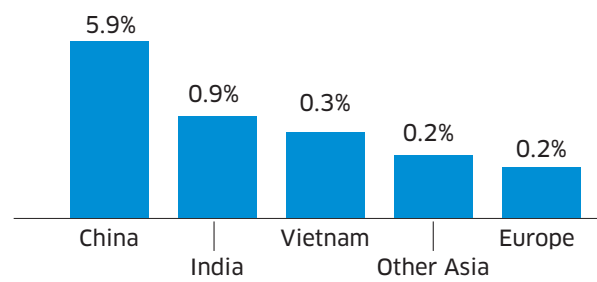

NIA chargesheets 4 CPI (M) cadres in case related to firing at commandos

ED intended to arrest Kejriwal from day 1, Shah admitted in interview: AAP minister Atishi



NEW DELHI: The Aam Aadmi Party on Friday claimed that Amit Shah in an interview made it clear that Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal was arrested by the ED under a conspiracy. 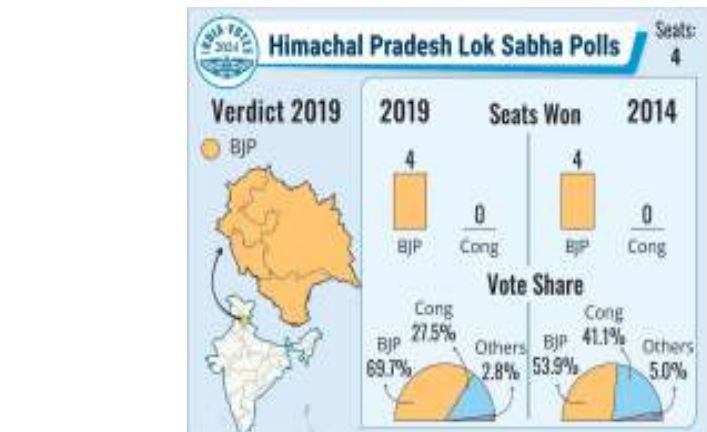

"The first ever Nilgiri Tahr Synchronised Survey by the Tamil Nadu Forest Department successfully concluded on May 1," Sahu said. "Survey teams from 138 blocks included 700 members from 13 forest divisions and 100 forest beats," she said in a post on social media platform X.

Briefing and data collection were going on, she said, and thanked the experts from IUCN, WII and WWF for their wholehearted support and collaboration.

"A big shout out to the team members, including forest staff, researchers, experts, and volunteers. Gratitude to the forest department, Government of Kerala. Survey data is likely to be available in three weeks from now. @tnforestdept @ WWFINDIA @wii india @ IUCN #ProjectNilgiriTahr #TNForest," Sahu further said, posting photographs and a video.

Special Judge Kaveri Baweja issued notice to the investigating agencies and directed them to file their responses by May 6, when the court will hear the arguments on Kavitha's application.

In her application, the BRS leader's advocate Nitesh Rana told the court that she wishes to be produced physically before the court instead of being produced through video

conference from Tihar central jail, where she is currently lodged.

"The applicant is a victim of grave persecution and harassment meted out against her for wholly mala fide and vexatious considerations. She is sanguine to expose the falsity, lack of substance and hollowness in the case set up against her in due course of the proceedings," the application claimed.

Three killed after Bolero jeep hits their bike

BANDA (UP): Three people, including a minor, were killed after their motorcycle collided with a Bolero jeep here, police said on Friday.

Deputy Superintendent of Police Rajveer Singh said the incident occurred on Thursday night when the victims, identified as Gulam Mohammad (18), his brother Rajju (12) and their neighbour Kamlesh Sahu (26), were returning home from a market in Musiwa village.

A Bolero jeep hit the victim's motorcycle on Kamasin-Dadaun road near the Sikri bus stop, the DSP said.

Upon receiving the information, the police rushed the victim to the Community Health Center (CHC) where the doctors declared Kamlesh Sahu and Ghulam Mohammad dead on arrival.

While Rajju died on the way to Kanpur for treatment, he said. The bodies were sent for post-mortem.

SC asks Centre to consider making changes in Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Friday asked the Centre to consider making necessary changes in sections 85 and 86 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita to avoid its misuse for lodging of false or exaggerated complaints after taking into consideration the pragmatic realities.

Section 85 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita states, "Whoever, being the husband or the relative of the husband of a woman, subjects such woman to cruelty shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years and shall also be liable to fine." Section 86 expands the definition of "cruelty" to encompass both mental and physical harm to a woman. The top court said it had asked the Centre 14 years ago to have a relook at the anti-dowry law as exaggerated versions of the incident are reflected in a large number of complaints. A bench of justices J B Par-

diwala and Manoj Misra said it looked into sections 85 and 86 respectively of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, which is to come into force with effect from July 1, so as to ascertain whether the Legislature has seriously looked into the suggestions of the court. "The aforesaid is nothing but verbatim reproduction of Section 498A of the IPC. The only difference is that the Explanation to Section 498A of the IPC, is now by way of a separate provision, i.e., Section 86 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

"We request the Legislature to look into the issue as highlighted above taking into consideration the pragmatic realities and consider making necessary changes in Sections 85 and 86 respectively of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, before both the new provisions come into force," the bench said.

The observation from

the apex court came while quashing a dowry-harassment case filed by a woman against her husband. According to the FIR lodged by his wife, the man and his family members allegedly demanded dowry and caused mental and physical trauma to her. The FIR said the woman's family had spent a large sum at the time of her wedding and also handed over her "stridhan" to the husband and his family. However, shortly after the wedding, the husband and his family started harassing her on the false pretext that she had failed to discharge her duties as a wife and daughter-in-law and pressuring her for more dowry. The bench said a plain reading of the FIR and the charge sheet indicates that the allegations levelled by the woman are quite vague, general and sweeping, specifying no instances of criminal conduct. The top court directed the registry

to send a copy each of this judgment to the Union law and home secretaries, to the government of India who may place it before the Minister for Law and Justice as well as the Minister for Home.

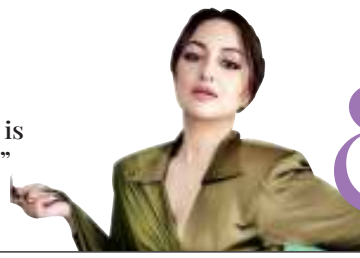

Tottenham's Champions League hopes hit further by loss at Chelsea

LONDON: Tottenham's hopes of qualifying for the Champions League are getting thinner by the day. By falling 2-0 at Chelsea on Thursday, Tottenham slumped to a second loss to a London rival in the space of four days in the Premier League – after a 3-2 home defeat to Arsenal in the north London derby on Sunday.

In between those losses came confirmation that England will have just four places in next season's expanded Champions League, and not five. That's another blow to Spurs, who are fifth and stayed seven points behind fourth-place Aston Villa with one game in hand. They still have to play Liverpool and Manchester City in their remaining four games so it is looking increasingly unlikely they will close the gap to Villa. "We lacked belief and conviction in our game," Tottenham manager Ange Postecoglou said.

HYDERABAD: Experienced seamer Bhuvneshwar Kumar said he wasn't thinking much and just focussed on bowling two good deliveries after scripting Sunrisers Hyderabad's sensational one-run win with a last-ball wicket in an IPL thriller here on Thursday. Defending 12 in the final over, Bhuvneshwar trapped Rovman Powell in front of the wicket in the last ball to stop Rajasthan Royal's run chase at 200 for 7 and pull off a heist in the end.

Sunrisers had scored 201 for 3 in their 20 overs, riding on fifties from Travis Head and Nitish Reddy.

"I wasn't thinking much about the result in the last over. There was no discussion in the last over, was just focussed on the process. Was thinking just about bowling two good balls, anything could have happened," Bhuvneshwar, who was adjudged the Player of the Match for his 3 for 41, said at the post-match presentation.

MATCH FIXING

West Indies cricketer Devon Thomas banned for 5 years for match fixing



DUBAI: West Indies batter Devon Thomas was banned for five years by the International Cricket Council on Thursday for match fixing. The Dubai-based ICC said 34-year-old Thomas admitted to "breaching seven counts of the anti-corruption codes of Sri Lanka Cricket, the Emirates Cricket Board, and the Caribbean Premier League."

The breaches relate to attempting to fix the outcome of games and obstructing investigations by conceal-

ing, tampering with or destroying evidence. Thomas' ban was backdated to May 23 last year, the date when he was provisionally suspended. The final 18 months of the ban are suspended.

"This ban is apt and should send a strong message to players and corrupters that attempts to corrupt our sport will be dealt with firmly," ICC general manager Alex Marshall said.

Four of the breaches relate to matches in the Lanka Premier League in Sri Lanka in 2021.

Iyer one of the strongest mentally, will overcome disappointments: Nayar

MUMBAI: Kolkata Knight Riders' assistant coach Abhishek Nayar said on Thursday that Shreyas Iyer had taken some major disappointments, including an injury setbacks ahead of a crucial international season, in a "positive way" and will return to the grind of playing domestic cricket to come back stronger.

Iyer was grappling with a back problem ahead of IPL 2024 and there were reports he could even miss a few games for KKR in IPL 2024. But the skipper has come back strongly, scoring more than 250 runs, including a half century. The BCCI also dropped Iyer from the annual central contract list. "Mentally, to have a mindset like that after being rejected or not getting his due, he has taken it very positively. Even when he talks about it, he is not negative, he understands he needs to go back and do well," Nayar told the media during KKR's training session.

He gets a little cushion and gets to understand the game, he has so much going on, in his mind as a captain," Jadeja told Jio Cinema.

appear fragile. Moreover, the bowling unit, spearheaded by Rashid Khan, has failed to live up to expectations. With key bowlers like Mohammed Shami absent due to injury, the burden falls heavily on the shoulders of Umesh Yadav and Mohit Sharma, who have struggled to contain runs.

As both teams brace themselves for a make-or-break encounter at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium, they understand the gravity of the situation.

No discussion regarding Kohli's strike-rate: Agarkar

MUMBAI: Virat Kohli's vast experience is worth its weight in gold in an event like the T20 World Cup and the selection committee never discussed about his strike-rate in the ongoing IPL, chairman of selectors Ajit Agarkar said on Thursday. Kohli has so far scored 500 runs in 10 innings with a hundred and four half-centuries. But what has been questioned is a strike-rate of 147 plus after opening the innings, which is less compared to some of the overseas openers like Travis Head (194 plus), Phil Salt (180 plus) and Sunil Narine (182 plus). "I don't think we've been discussing it. He's been in great form, fortunately in the IPL so no concerns there at all."

Swiatek returns to Madrid Open final by beating Keys

MADRID: Iga Swiatek cruised to a straight-sets semifinal win over Madison Keys to reach the Madrid Open final and a rematch against No. 2 Aryna Sabalenka. India retain top spot in white-ball formats

In the latest ICC annual ranking update, India maintains top positions in ODIs and T20is, while slipping to second in Test rankings.

DUBAI: India have retained their top position in ODIs and T20is but slipped to the second position in the men's Test Team Rankings in the latest ICC annual ranking update issued on Friday. India conceded the top spot in the five-day format to Australia, the

reigning World Test champion, following the annual update that drops results from the 2020-21 season and reflects all series completed since May 2021. India (120) are just four points behind Australia (124) and 15 points clear of third-

placed England. South Africa are the fourth team above the 100-point mark with 103 points. India slipped mainly because their 2-1 series win in Australia in 2020-21 has dropped from the rankings. The order of teams ranked from third to ninth remains the same.

Only nine teams are now ranked as Afghanistan and Ireland have yet to play sufficient Tests, while Zimbabwe too are out as they have played only three Tests over the past three years. Teams need to play a minimum of eight Tests over a three-year period to get on the rankings table. India, however, remain atop the ODI and T20I rankings after the annual updates, that weight matches completed prior to May 2023 at 50 per cent and subsequent matches at 100 per cent.

Australia in second place in T20I rankings, SA in 3rd

DUBAI: India may have lost the ODI World Cup final to Australia but have increased their lead over them from three to six points, leading the table with 122 points. There are no changes in the top 10 but Ireland have overtaken Zimbabwe to 11th position.

Third-placed South Africa have closed the gap with Australia from eight to four points, while Sri Lanka are just two points behind fifth-

New Zealand also have 250 points like South Africa but behind on fractions, while the West Indies are at 249 points, which means that just three points separate third-placed England from sixth placed West Indies.

Pakistan to play Tests against England, Bangladesh

LAHORE: Pakistan will be playing a total of seven Tests against England, Bangladesh and South Africa between August 2024 and January 2025 as part of the ICC World Test Championship's (WTC) third cycle, which concludes next year.

Pakistan will host England and Bangladesh at home for two and three Tests respectively before heading to South Africa for three T20is, three ODIs and two Tests in the latter half of this year. Pakistan is yet to win a Test series in South Africa and Australia. On Friday, the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) announced that Durban, Centurion and Johannesburg will host the T20is from December 10-14, while the ODIs will be played from December 17-22 in Paarl, Cape Town and Johannesburg.

Lunar probe mission to collect samples from far side of moon

Chang'e-6 mission is tasked with collecting and then returning samples from moon's far side

BEIJING: China on Friday launched a 53-day-long lunar probe mission to collect samples for the first time from the far side of the moon and bring them for scientific studies. The Chang'e-6 mission is tasked with collecting and then returning samples from the moon's far side to Earth -- the first endeavour of its kind in the history of human lunar exploration, China

National Space Administration (CNSA) said. The entire mission would last for 53 days. The far side of the moon is not visible from Earth. An hour after the launch, an official announced that Chang'e-6's launch was "a complete success". The lunar probe was carried by a Long March-5 Y8 rocket blasted off smoothly from the Wenchang Space Launch Site on the coast of China's southern island

province of Hainan. The launch was telecast live by state-run television. Chang'e 6 consists of four components: an orbiter, a lander, an ascender and a re-entry module, according to CNSA. After collecting dust and rocks on the moon, the ascender will transport the samples to the lunar orbiter for transfer to the re-entry module, which will carry them back to Earth. The CNSA said earlier that the mission is poised to make

breakthroughs in key technologies, such as automatic sample collection, take-off and ascent from the far side of the moon. Meanwhile, the probe will carry out scientific exploration of the landing zone. The CNSA has announced that scientific instruments from France, Italy and the European Space Agency/Sweden will be on board the lander of the Chang'e-6 mission and a Pakistani payload on the orbiter.

Steps to prevent pro-Palestinian protest

Intro-With student protests over Israel-Hamas war disrupting campuses nationwide, several major universities are intent on ensuring that commencement ceremonies go off without a hitch this weekend.

Asian shares advance ahead of US jobs report

TOKYO: Business Writer Asian shares were mostly higher Friday ahead of a report on the US jobs market, while several major markets including Tokyo and Shanghai were closed for holidays. Oil prices and US futures were higher. The Japanese yen strengthened slightly against the US dollar

amid signs of heavy central bank intervention to tamp down the dollar's advance. The financial newspaper Nihon Keizai Shimbun reported that estimates showed the government spending an estimated 8 trillion yen (about \$50 billion) this week in trying to keep the yen from slipping further against the dollar. The weaker yen has helped



boost prices for imported goods, a factor behind the Bank of Japan's recent decision to give up its negative interest rate policy and raise its benchmark rate to zero to 0.1% from a longstanding level of minus 0.1%. It might raise rates further, Marcel Thieliand of Capital Economics said in a commentary, even if its target of 2% isn't met.
