## 'Development, trust, and security failed under BJP rule'

Sharma began by accusing the BJP of accepting defeat by cancelling the tickets of seven out of nine MPs in the state, alleging their lack of representation and efficacy in Parliament.

**RAIPUR:** Amidst the fervor of the ongoing Lok Sabha elections in Chhattisgarh, Alok Sharma, the spokesperson of the All India Congress Committee (AICC), launched a scathing critique of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government's track record in the state. Addressing a press conference at the state Congress headquarters in Raipur, Sharma highlighted issues of development, trust, and security that he claims have deteriorated under BJP rule. Sharma began by accusing the BJP of accepting defeat

by cancelling the tickets of seven out of nine MPs in the state, alleging their lack of representation and efficacy in Parliament. He asserted that the BJP's promises, including the assurance of providing Minimum Support Price (MSP) of Rs. 3100, remained unfulfilled, leading to disillusionment among the electorate.

Furthermore, Sharma lambasted the BJP for purportedly fostering an environment of insecurity and escalating crime rates, particularly citing the resurgence of Naxalism in various districts. He accused the BJP government of

being "remote-controlled" and failing to address the growing security concerns adequately. The spokesperson also criticized the BJP's economic policies, claiming that they have

adversely affected farmers, with the imposition of GST on agricultural equipment exacerbating financial burdens. He pointed out that Chhattisgarh's farmers, the backbone of the state's economy, have been disproportionately impacted by the central government's policies. Sharma highlighted the alleged lack of representation and advocacy by BJP MPs from Chhattisgarh in addressing public grievances and advocating for the state's interests in the Lok Sabha. He accused the BJP of prioritizing political expediency over genuine governance,

citing the cancellation of MP tickets to evade anti-incumbency sentiments. In his closing remarks, Sharma accused the BJP of propagating falsehoods and failing to deliver on its electoral promises, contrasting this with what he described as the successful implementation of welfare schemes during the Congress government's tenure.

He criticized the Election Commission for purportedly neglecting complaints against BJP leaders and expressed concerns about the integrity of Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) under BJP rule.

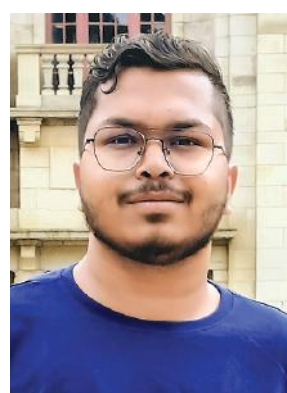

# IPL betting racket: CG cops arrest 26 persons from Pune

34 bookies apprehended in connection with a case registered under Gambling Act.

**RAIPUR:** The Chhattisgarh police have arrested 26 people from Maharashtra in connection with a racket involved in betting on IPL matches through online applications, including the Mahadev app, a senior police official said on Saturday.

A team from the anti-crime and cyber unit (ACCU) arrested the accused from two apartments in Pune, Raipur senior superintendent of police Santosh Singh said. With this, the ACCU has apprehended 34 bookies in connection with a case registered under the Gambling Act and the Chhattisgarh Gambling (Prohibition) Act, 2022 at Ganj police station here, he said.

A joint team of the ACCU and Ganj police had recently raided a flat in Goa, arrested eight people involved in online betting on IPL matches and seized four laptops, a camera, a calculator, 27 mobile phones and other items, he said. During interrogation, the accused revealed that their associates were involved in betting through the Mahadev app panel in Pune, Singh said.

A team of the ACCU Raipur, which was already in Maharashtra as a part of a probe in another case, conducted a recce of the two apartments in the Bharti Vidyapeeth area of Pune, posing as a vegetable vendor, milk and paper delivery boys for seven days before conducting the raid, he said.

"Twenty-six people indulging in online betting using laptops and mobile phones were arrested from the two flats," he said.

## Each ID panel was purchased for Rs 35 lakh to Rs 50 lakh

The police have recovered 11 laptops, 98 mobile phones, a calculator and other items worth Rs 25 lakh from the accused, he said. "The accused have revealed that they were operating through 67 ID panels/branches of the Reddy app, 149 panels of the Mahadev app and 10 panels of laser book. They had purchased each ID panel for Rs 35 lakh

tops and mobile phones revealed transactions worth Rs 30 crore, while information about 1,000 players involved in betting was also obtained from mobile phones and bank accounts, he said. The accused informed that they were associated with Pappu Jethwani, a history-sheeter from the Purani Basti area of Raipur, who is absconding.

## ITC worth Rs 71.38 cr recovered from 13 fake firms

A special campaign is being run by Central GST against those availing benefit of Input Tax Credit by setting up fake firms. During investigation GST officials have busted the network of 13 fake firms.

**RAIPUR:** The CGST Raipur recently busted a racket of 13 fake firms which were created only for the purpose of making fake invoices and passing Input Tax Credit (ITC). The action has been taken on the basis of special intelligence, data analysis and extensive surveillance. With this another accused associated with this network has been arrested. Racket mastermind Hemant Kaseria was arrested a month ago.

It was found in the investigation of CGST Raipur, that a large amount of such fake ITC was given by the firms run by Hemant Kaseria to M/s Triveni Metallic Industries Pvt. Ltd. and M/s Triveni Enterprises based in Raipur. In investigation, it was found that not only 2 firms but other 4 firms are controlled and managed by Sarvesh Kumar Pandey. After thorough scrutiny of documents, accounts and returns, it was found that Sarvesh had purchased fake bills not only

from Hemant Kaseria but also from many other fake firms. In the investigation so far, fake ITC worth Rs 71.38 crore has been detected, the benefit of which was taken by Pandey with the intention of avoiding GST.

The Central GST team arrested Sarvesh Kumar Pandey, the accused in this case, under Section 69 (1) of the CGST Act, 2017 and presented him in the court. After hearing the arguments of both the parties

in the hearing, the court has approved the judicial custody of the accused. ### POLICE ACTION

Habitual offender nabbed for assaulting girl with sharp weapon

**BHILAI:** Police arrested a habitual offender on charges of trespassing into a house and assaulting a girl with a sharp weapon. ASP Sukhnandan Rathore informed that the accused Amit Josh is a notorious goon of Bhilai Nagar police station, against whom a total of 49 cases like murder, attempt to murder, robbery, kidnapping and assault are registered in Bhilai Nagar police station and other police stations of the district. On April 30, the accused trespassed into the residence of Garima Sahu (27) daughter of Nandlal Sahu, a resident of near Surya Mall, Junwani. The girl was alone at home when the accused forcefully entered her house and abused her. He threatened the girl with a sharp weapon. 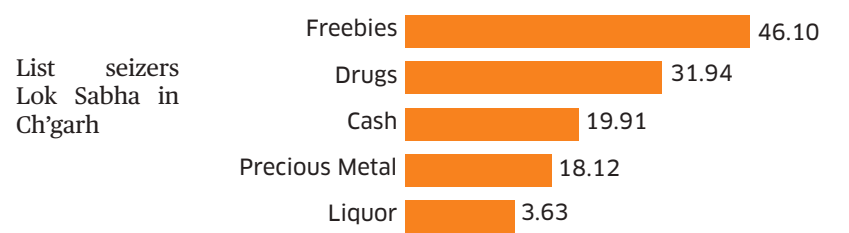

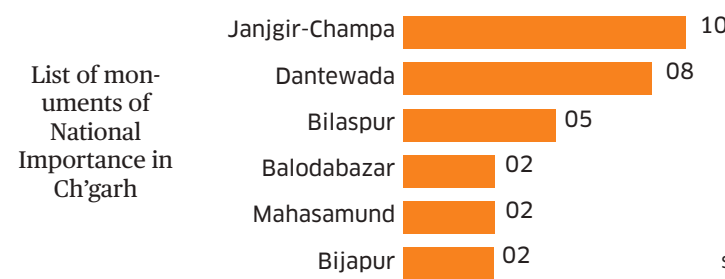


tal, whereas the support price of thin paddy is Rs 2203 and that of thick paddy is Rs 2103.

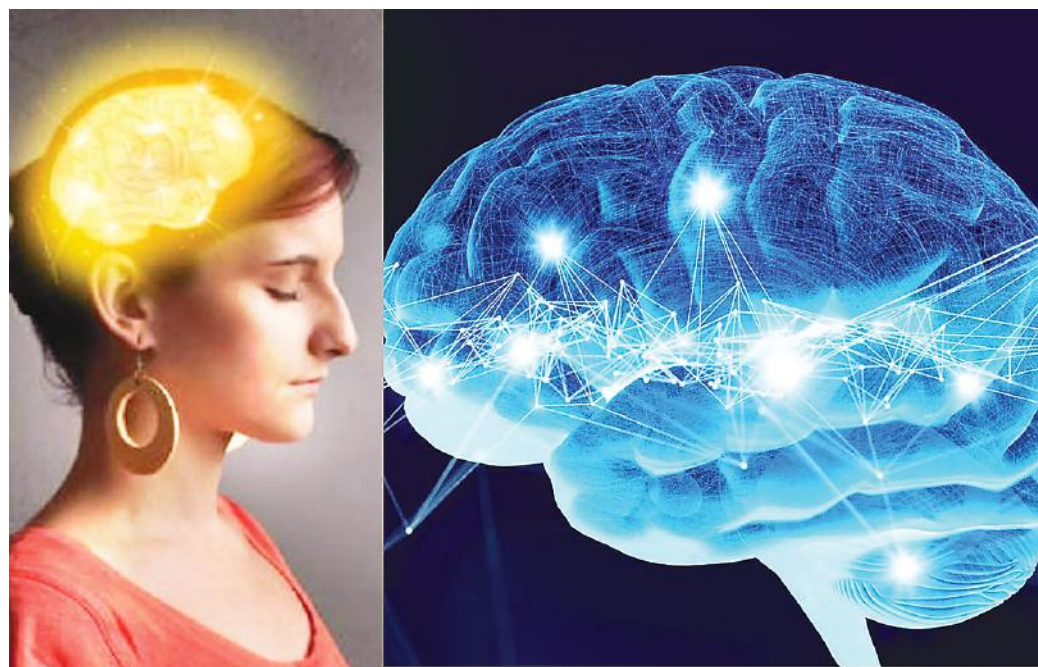

## Sleep's Role: Brain connections and reset

Exploring sleep's depths: Unveiling the brain's journey of synaptic remodeling and renewal, shedding light on the mysteries of rest. *by Press Trust of India*

Recent research delving into the intricacies of sleep, using zebrafish as a model organism, offers profound insights into the relationship between sleep and brain function. This study, published in the esteemed journal 'Nature', provides compelling evidence regarding the dynamic nature of neural connectivity during periods of sleep and wakefulness.

Lead author Jason Rihel, affiliated with University College London, elucidates the findings of this groundbreaking study. During periods of wakefulness, the brain actively forms new connections between neurons, a process known as synaptic potentiation. This phenomenon contributes to the strengthening of neural circuits and is essential for learning and memory consolidation.

However, the study reveals a fascinating aspect of sleep physiology—during the initial phases of sleep, particularly the first half of the night, the brain undergoes a process of synaptic pruning. Contrary to the intuitive assumption that sleep is a period of neural quiescence, this research suggests that sleep plays an active role in shaping neural connectivity.

Excessive neuronal activity during wakefulness can lead to the formation of an overwhelming number of connections between neurons. While this may seem advantageous for learning and information processing, it poses a significant challenge to the brain's energy resources. Continuous synaptic potentiation without periodic downscaling would be energetically unsustainable and could impede the brain's ability to adapt to new information.

To address this challenge,

the brain engages in synaptic remodeling during sleep. This process involves the selective weakening and elimination of redundant synaptic connections, thereby optimizing neural circuitry for efficient information processing. Jason Rihel aptly describes sleep as an "off-line" period, during which the brain prunes unnecessary connections in preparation for new learning experiences the following day.

The study employed zebrafish as a model organism due to their optical transparency,

which facilitates the visualization of neuronal connections in live animals. By monitoring the activity of these genetically modified zebrafish across multiple sleep-wake cycles, researchers were able to observe the dynamic changes in synaptic connectivity associated with sleep.

Key findings from the study include the observation that synaptic gain occurs during wakefulness, followed by synaptic loss during sleep. Furthermore, the extent of synaptic remodeling during sleep

is influenced by sleep pressure—the accumulated need for sleep experienced by the organism.

In instances where sleep deprivation was induced, zebrafish exhibited continued synaptic growth until allowed to rest. This underscores the critical role of sleep in regulating synaptic plasticity and maintaining neural homeostasis.

Moreover, the observed pattern of synaptic rearrangement during the first half of the night corresponds with the characteristic slow-wave activity observed in the brain during this period. Slow-wave activity, characterized by synchronized neural oscillations, is believed to facilitate the off-line processing of information and memory consolidation during sleep.

While the study offers valuable insights into the role of sleep in synaptic maintenance, questions remain regarding sleep's function during the latter half of the night. Future research endeavors will seek to unravel the mechanisms underlying sleep's effects on neural connectivity and explore potential therapeutic interventions for optimizing sleep and promoting brain health.

The central bank's draft rules include a classification of the projects as per their phase and higher provisioning of up to 5 per cent during the construction phase, even if the asset is standard. cycle, project loans were seen to have led to a build-up of stress on bank books. The standard asset provisioning otherwise stands at 0.40 per cent. Under the proposed norms, first announced in September 2023 and the details revealed on Friday, a bank has to set aside 5 per cent of the exposure during the construction phase, which goes down as the project becomes operational. The paper industry has faced shortage of wood, the key raw material, and it is the biggest concern for mills in India, the Indian Paper Manufacturers Association (IPMA) said in a statement on Saturday. While the paper industry is continuing with agro forestry efforts, pulpwood plantations need to be enhanced rapidly.

## 'Over regulation has led to hike in two-wheeler prices'

The two-wheeler industry has been seeking a cut in GST on two-wheelers from 28 per cent to 18 per cent.

**NEW DELHI:** Bajaj Auto Managing Director Rajiv Bajaj on Friday asserted that "over regulation" in the two-wheeler segment has led to increase in the prices of vehicles which are mainly used by the masses. While acknowledging the benefits of the latest emission norms for the society, he noted that the government should consider reducing GST rates on two-wheelers from the current rate of 28 per cent. ## Govt lifts onion export ban; imposes MEP of \$ 550/tonne

**NEW DELHI:** The government on Saturday lifted the ban on onion exports but imposed a minimum export price (MEP) of USD 550 per tonne, amid ongoing Lok Sabha elections in the country. Last night, the government imposed a 40 per cent duty on export of onions. In August last year, India had imposed

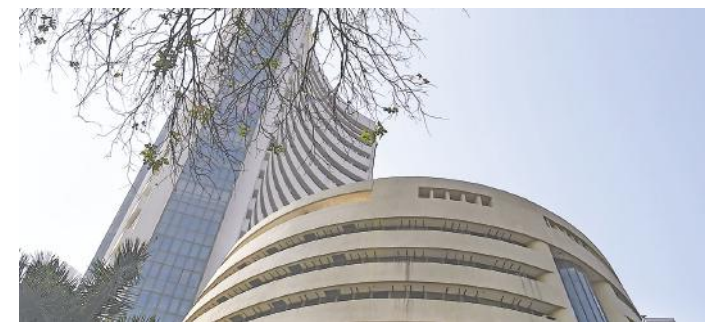
a 40 per cent export duty on onions up to December 31, 2023. "The export policy of onions is amended from prohibited to free subject to MEP of USD 550 per metric ton with immediate effect and until further orders," the directorate general of foreign trade (DGFT) said in a notification. On December 8, 2023, the government banned export of onions



from March 31 this year. In March, the export prohibition was extended till further orders. In March, the Union Agriculture Ministry released the data for onion production. As per the data, onion production in 2023-24 (First Advance Estimates) is expected to be around 254.73 lakh tonnes compared to around 302.08 lakh tonnes last year.

### Markets Crash

#### Investors' wealth erodes by Rs 2.25 lakh crore as Sensex, Nifty crashes



**NEW DELHI:** Investors' wealth eroded by Rs 2.25 lakh crore on Friday, the day when the BSE Sensex tanked 733 points, amid profit-taking and worries over premium valuations of local stocks. The 30-share BSE benchmark dropped 732.96 points or 0.98 per cent to settle at 73,878.15 after soaring 484.07 points earlier in the day. From its intra-day high of 75,095.18, the benchmark tanked 1,627.45 points to the day's low of 73,467.73.

The market capitalisation of BSE-listed companies eroded by Rs 2,25,543.41 crore to Rs 4,06,24,224.49 crore (USD 4.89 trillion).

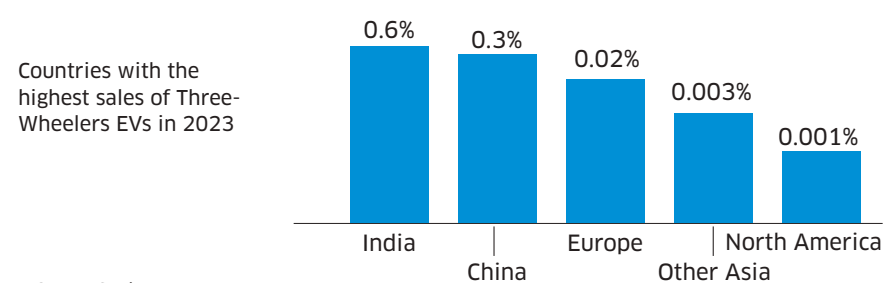
"Markets failed to capitalise on the

firm start despite upbeat US and European cues and crashed on the back of broad-based selling, as investors worried over premium valuations of local stocks offloaded their holdings. #### Air India reduces cabin baggage allowance to 15 kg for lowest fare

**NEW DELHI:** Loss-making Air India has reduced the free cabin baggage allowance to 15 kilogram from 20 kilogram for the lowest economy fare segment on domestic flights. The changes have been made in the menu-based pricing model fare families that were introduced by the Tata Group-owned Air India last August, with the airline saying that a one-size-fits-all approach is no longer ideal. There are three fare families -- Comfort, Comfort Plus and Flex -- that offer different levels of benefits and fare restrictions at various price points, an airline spokesperson said on Saturday. With effect from May 2, the free cabin baggage allowance for the 'Comfort' and 'Comfort Plus' categories has been reduced to 15 kg from 20 kg and 25 kg, respectively. Prior to the introduction of the fare families concept, passengers on Air India's domestic flights were allowed to carry 25 kilograms of cabin baggage free of any additional charge. **PTI**

### FOREX RESERVES

#### Forex reserves drop USD 2.41 bn to USD 637.92 bn in third consecutive week

**MUMBAI:** India's forex reserves dropped USD 2.412 billion to USD 637.922 billion as on April 26, in the third consecutive weekly decline in the reserves, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said on Friday. In the previous reporting week, the overall reserves had declined USD 2.28 billion to USD 640.33 billion. For the week ended April 5, the reserves had hit an all-time high of USD 648.562 billion following multiple weeks of increases. The earlier high of USD 642.453 billion achieved in September 2021 got surpassed in March this year. **PTI**

**KEITHELMABI:** A year after ethnic clashes polarised the state and its people, a Kuki-Meitei couple running an orphanage fostering children from both communities are testimony to the harmony that once was and hope that it will be so again one day soon.

Donjalal Haokip and Rebati Devi, who have no biological children of their own, operate the The Ema Foundation home in Keithelmanbi, the sensitive zone between the Imphal Valley and Kangpokpi, the former dominated by Meiteis and the latter by Kukis. Is it an easy task

considering the tense situation in the state?

"No. But love is the only counter for violence and the way to peace," 52-year-old Haokip told PTI from the home located in the foothills of West Imphal and Kangpokpi. The couple, who have been running the orphanage since 2015, fosters 17 children, including Meitis, Kukis, Nagas and even Nepalis.

They remember vividly the events of May 3, 2023 when ethnic clashes broke out over a 'Tribal Solidarity March' organised in the hill districts to protest against the Meitei community's demand for Scheduled Tribe (ST) status.

"When the violence began on May 3 last year, we thought by the grace of god the situation will be ok by morning. But another day passed and each passing moment felt like a nightmare. I sent an SOS to Assam Rifles. They assured us support and made some deployment

outside the orphanage," Haokip, a Kuki, said

The months that followed were tough and the couple was constantly fearful of what lay next for the children and them. "The first threat was that we are a Meitei-Kuki couple and then we had children from the communities...our family feared that we will be a very easy target. But we decided to stay put and despite difficulties we have managed to survive," he said. The couple got married in 2012 and children at the home call them "mummy" and "papa". The kids attend a nearby school run by the Assam Rifles. The eldest

among them studies in Class 10 while the youngest is four years old.

"When my mother passed away in 2008, my wife and I were planning to erect a memorial stone...but we thought again that instead of spending money on a stone erection we can start this and hence named it Ema, which means 'mother' in Manipuri. I sold some family land, we used some savings and then constructed this space.

"Later, officials from Assam Rifles approached us to offer free education to the children and they started going to their school," Haokip added.

## Women and children of Badnapur village go on daily water hunt

Tucked away in the interiors of Badnapur tehsil, Tapovan village, located near the Jalna-Bhorkardan road, does not have natural water sources and is dependent on water tankers every day.

**SAMBHAJINAGAR:** Women and children of a village in Jalna district in the drought-prone Marathwada region of Maharashtra spend most of their days scouring nearby areas for drinking water. Tucked away in the interiors of Badnapur tehsil, Tapovan village, located near the Jalna-Bhorkardan road, does not have natural water sources and is dependent on water tankers every day. According to villagers, the groundwater sources in the village have dried up in the last three months, forcing the women and children to walk at least 2 to 4 km looking for drinking water in the nearby areas and making several trips in the blistering heat daily.

Various parts of the district are facing an acute water shortage due to inadequate rainfall in the last monsoon season.

Talking to PTI, one of the villagers, Amrapali Borde, said a tanker supplies water for domestic

use every day, but it has a yellowish tint and can't be used for drinking and cooking.

"The tanker empties water in the artificial tank in the village. We have to carry water back to our homes. But this water is not consumable. We fetch potable water from water sources located in fields in other villages," Borde said.

Often, owners of wells don't allow them to draw water, she said.

Nearby villages of Tapovan Tanda, Tupewadi and Banegaon are also dependent on water tankers. As of April 30, 282 villages and 68 hamlets in Jalna depended on 419 tankers. Chayabai Borde, another resident of Tapovan, said, "We walk around 2 km one way in search of drinking water. Sometimes, we make two to three trips as per requirement." And now, as schools are closed for the summer holidays, children are helping women in their water hunt, she said.

## Firozabad Glass bangle industry looks for revival

**FIROZABAD:** Their livelihoods now as fragile as the glass bangles they make, lakhs of people in Uttar Pradesh's famed 'city of glass' are hoping this election will bring in change and their industry will get a much-needed revival.

The once ubiquitous vendors selling bangles on carts have slowly faded away over the years and today you can

see but a few, a visible sign of a once vibrant industry in decline. It has long been a symbol of local craft but now battles modern challenges, say artisans, factory owners and shopkeepers. The immense competition from plastic and metal bangles has eaten into their market share, resulting in a noticeable decline in sales of the traditional glass variety.

"The demand for our handmade glass



bangles is diminishing. The younger generation is not interested in learning our traditional art, and cheap plastic bangles are flooding the market. Also, not many women wear glass bangles now," said Ram Lal, an artisan at Natraj Lakshmi Bangles. "Additionally, the industry is grappling with the encroachment of mechanisation, with machines replacing artisans," he said.

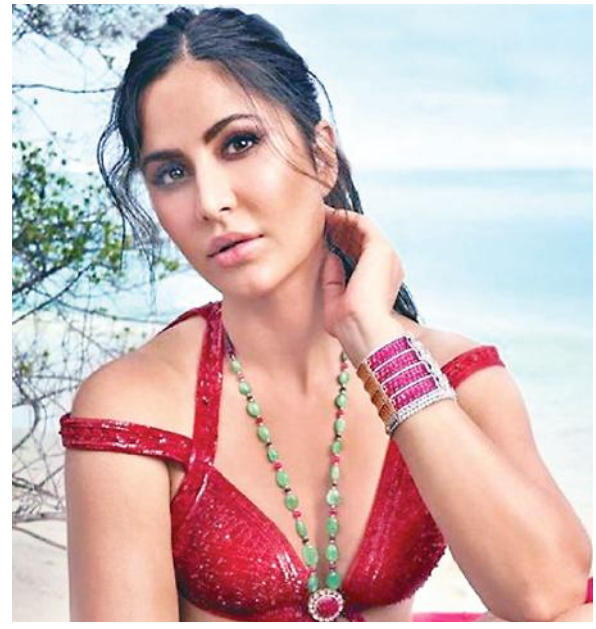

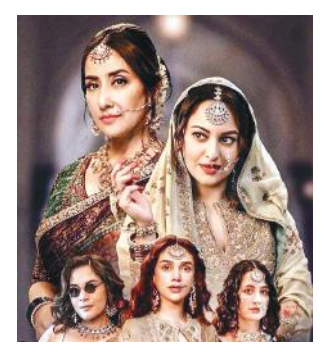
