



Supreme Court to hear Kejriwal bail plea today

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court will consider on Tuesday whether to enlarge Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on interim bail in view of the ongoing Lok Sabha elections when it hears his petition challenging his arrest in an excise policy-linked money laundering case. Whether Kejriwal,

who has been in custody through the Lok Sabha elections so far, is able to campaign during the remaining phases will depend on the outcome of the proceedings. A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta will take up as the first matter the plea of the AAP leader. Kejriwal was arrested on March 21 and is currently lodged in Tihar jail under judicial custody.

RAIPUR: Amid heightened security with the deployment of 202 companies of Central forces and more than 60,000 personnel of police force and District Reserve Guard, the remaining seven Lok Sabha seats in Chhattisgarh will vote on Tuesday in the third phase with 168 candidates in the fray.

The main contest lies between the BJP, which had won 10 out of 11 seats in the state in the 2004, 2009 and 2014 general elections. In 2019, the BJP bagged nine constituencies and Congress 2.

A total of 1,39,01,285 voters are eligible to exercise their franchise in seven seats, including the high-profile Raipur where state minister and BJP leader Brijmohan Agrawal

LS polls: 38 candidates in fray in Raipur seat in 9 Assembly constituencies

RAIPUR: As many as 38 candidates are in the fray in Raipur Lok Sabha seat and 2385 polling stations have been set up in 9 Assembly constituencies under this seat. Voting under Raipur Lok Sabha Election 2024 will start from 7 am on May 7 and will end at 6 pm.

As many as 23 lakh 75 thousand 379 voters including 11 lakh 86 thousand 504 men, 11 lakh 88 thousand 571 women and 304 third gender voters will exercise their franchise. Three ballot units will be used in each polling station. Micro observers have been appointed after selecting a total of 245 polling stations in the district. Webcasting has been done after selecting 954 polling stations. Women have been given the responsibility of 857 polling stations in Raipur. Women will operate 203 polling stations of Raipur North Assembly. Similarly, 7 polling stations have been selected for the disabled.

SECURITY MEASURES

18 CAPF and 7 CAF companies are in the fray for Lok Sabha elections

RAIPUR: As Raipur braces itself for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections, security preparations reach unprecedented levels with a multitude of forces deployed across the district. Under the vigilant direction of Inspector General of Police Raipur Range, Amresh Mishra, and Senior Superintendent of Police Raipur, Santosh Singh, a massive security apparatus has been mobilized to ensure the sanctity of the electoral process.

RAIPUR: Chhattisgarh Congress president Deepak Baij on Monday hit out at his former party colleague Radhika Khera a day after her resignation and accused her of speaking the language of the Bharatiya Janata Party and claimed she deliberately created a controversy before exit.

Khera, the AICC's communication and media coordinator for Chhattisgarh for the Lok Sabha polls, resigned from the Congress's primary membership on Sunday, days after her altercation with another leader at the party's state unit office in Raipur. Khera also claimed she was facing opposition in the party for her visit to the Ram temple in Ayodhya. In her resignation letter to Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, she claimed criticism over her visit to Lord Ram temple in Ayodhya led to the denial of justice to her in the incident that happened at the party's Chhattisgarh office last month.

Talking to reporters in Raipur, state Congress president Baij alleged the entire resignation episode was a "pre-planned political plot" of the BJP and claimed Khera was

speaking the saffron party's language. "It was an in-house matter and linking it with temple (visit) and religion is not appropriate. The issue would have been resolved within the party. But if someone's mentality is to switch (to another party) and deliberately commit such acts, then such acts have no place in democracy," he said.

Asked about her allegations related to the April 30 altercation with a party colleague, Ram temple visit and denial of justice, Baij noted, "It was a fabricated story and deliberate attempt to create a new controversy. It was pre-planned and done at the BJP's behest. This planning was going on for long."

The Congress leader said quitting the party was Khera's personal decision, but she could have waited for the outcome of the ongoing investigation into the matter (of altercation).

Meanwhile strongly refuting Radhika's charges, PCC Communication head Sushil Anand Shukla maintained the script of Khera's story was written soon after Arvinder Singh Lovely (former Delhi Congress chief) quit the party in April-end.

Chaubebandha bridge deteriorates, imperiling commuters

Chronic neglect plagues the vital Rajim Parswani Chaubebandha bridge, echoing broader issues of infrastructure decay in Chhattisgarh.

RAJIM: Rajim Parswani Chaubebandha bridge, a once-promising link between Gariaband and Dhamtari districts, now marred by neglect and decay. Constructed in 2000 and inaugurated by former Chief Minister Dr. Raman Singh, this vital artery, conceived to reduce travel time and foster connectivity, now stands as a testament to administrative oversight and indifference.

The passage of heavy sand-laden vehicles over the years has taken a toll, causing rebar rods to protrude through the bridge's surface, rendering it treacherous for commuters. What was once a symbol of progress has become a hazard, with joints resembling makeshift speed breakers, posing dangers to two-wheeler riders and pedestrians alike. The disintegration of the bridge has led to the dispersal of ballast and cement, creating hazardous conditions reminiscent of a cratered lunar landscape. Despite serving as a life-

line for more than 50 villages in Dhamtari district and facilitating the flow of commerce and education, the Rajim Parswani Chaubebandha bridge languishes in disrepair. The road leading to it mirrors the neglect, making travel arduous for those dependent on it. Calls for action from the administration have fallen on deaf ears, leaving the populace to navigate through clouds of dust and debris. Even during the annual Rajim

Changing issues in campaign make LS contest interesting

As the third phase for Lok Sabha elections, has reached its accomplishment, it is high time to discuss the major issues, that effected the campaign so far. The issues have been changing in every phase of this election. The first phase of voting, which started with the issue of Modi's guarantee and misuse of central agencies, has moved to the distribution of resources in the second phase and reservation in the third phase. BJP and Congress are attacking each other with claims of abolishing SC, ST and OBC reservations.. Obviously, new issues may be introduced in the election campaign in the next four phases. Soon after the Election Commission announced seven-phase Lok Sabha elections, BRS chief was the first in the Delhi Excise Policy scam. The opposition had made the arrest of Kavita and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal a big issue. After the end of the first phase of elections, Rahul Gandhi, while holding a press conference in Telangana, raised a new issue of caste based census as well as nationwide survey and distribution of property. Explaining this in detail, Overseas Congress President Sam Pitroda advocated policies like inheritance tax for equitable distribution of resources. Going a step further, citing the reservation given to Muslims from OBC quota in Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka, BJP termed Congress as the real opponent of SC, ST and OBC reservation and also gave a guarantee to maintain the reservation. Prime Minister Modi made it clear that no one can snatch reservation during his tenure. On the contrary, BJP is alleging that reservation will be in danger if India coalition government comes to power. Prime Minister Narendra Modi immediately made it a big issue for the middle class and linked it to snatching of Mangalsutra from women and taking two rooms in a four-room flat and giving it to someone else. Till the second phase of voting, there was a dispute between the leaders of BJP and opposition parties on this issue and Priyanka Gandhi, citing the martyrdom of Rajiv Gandhi, responded by Sonia Gandhi's sacrifice of her Mangalsutra for the country.

Pranksters of 'bomb threat' causing panic to schools

Bomb scare threw over 100 schools in Delhi and the National Capital Region(NCR) out of gear disrupting classes. The perverted minds that sent emails to schools failed in creating chaos although a sense of fear prevailed among the children and parents. Moreover, it is nigh on impossible to plant bombs in more than 100 schools at a time. Earlier, too, there were bomb threats to schools in the national capital and elsewhere in India including in Bengaluru. And, not one, was found to be a genuine threat. By now, the school managements and the law enforcing agencies would have accustomed themselves to threat perceptions, and ways to tackle them. Such emails have complicated origins and are never traced with pin--point precision. The schools, however, reacted to the situation with utmost restraint and dignity after an early, and understandable, panic. Even the police who descended on the schools were quick to ensure the safety and security of children, parents and teachers. Parents, too, though ruffled seem to have learnt from last examples while silently collecting and carrying their wards to a point of safety.

By the end of this decade, Indian policymakers are ambitiously aiming to propel the country to the forefront of the semiconductor sector. Presently, a substantial portion of the world's chip production, approximately 68%, is concentrated in Taiwan. Heightened concerns over potential disruptions to the semiconductor supply chain, exacerbated by geopolitical tensions, have prompted a reevaluation of sourcing strategies by major technology companies. The specter

of a Chinese invasion looms large, prompting a shift in investment preferences towards safer regions like Vietnam and India. Notably, Apple has already signaled its intention to relocate a significant portion of its manufacturing operations from China to India, a move indicative of the shifting dynamics in global supply chains.

However, merely attracting a handful of production units will not suffice. Achieving silicon independence necessitates the establishment of benchmark-quality infrastructure, the cultivation of a skilled labor force, and the seamless integration of auxiliary supplies. India's nascent foray into the semiconductor industry presents inherent challenges, particularly during the initial phase where substantial financial investments yield no immediate returns. Overcoming these challenges requires a strategic approach, one that acknowledges the long-term nature of the endeavor and prioritizes sustainable growth over short-term

gains.

In pursuit of this objective, legislative measures mandating the utilization of locally manufactured chips by domestic businesses may be warranted. Additionally, rather than striving to match the cutting-edge technology of established players, India should focus on honing expertise in the fabrication of 28-nanometer chips, commonly used in consumer electronics and automotive applications. Despite the seemingly antiquated nature of this technology, its widespread adoption underscores its enduring relevance in modern manufacturing processes.

To realize this vision, India must cultivate a robust ecosystem that fosters innovation and collaboration across the semiconductor value chain. While the country currently boasts a significant presence in chip design, with over 125,000 professionals comprising 20% of the global workforce, continued investment in other critical areas of the supply chain is imperative. This includes semiconductor

fabrication facilities, research and development centers, and educational institutions that nurture the next generation of talent in semiconductor engineering and related fields.

Ultimately, the success of India's silicon independence campaign hinges on the collective commitment of both the government and the private sector. The allocation of financial resources and the willingness to invest in the long-term viability of the semiconductor industry will determine the trajectory of India's journey towards self-reliance. As the global landscape undergoes profound transformations, India stands at a pivotal juncture, poised to carve out a niche for itself in the highly competitive semiconductor market. Through strategic planning, unwavering determination, and sustained investment, India can emerge as a formidable player in this critical sector, safeguarding its technological sovereignty and driving economic growth for years to come.

Combatting TB and Tobacco epidemic

Tobacco is the single-largest cause of death worldwide and TB continues to be the deadliest of infectious diseases in high burden countries. by Dr Tara Singh Bam-CNS

The intersection of tobacco consumption and tuberculosis (TB) poses a significant public health challenge, demanding urgent recognition and concerted intervention. Tobacco stands as the leading preventable cause of death globally, while TB remains a persistent threat in high-burden countries, maintaining its status as the deadliest infectious disease despite the overshadowing presence of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Within this landscape, Indonesia emerges as a focal point, grappling with the dual burdens of TB and tobacco use. According to the World Health Organization's (WHO) Global TB Report 2023, Indonesia ranks second globally in TB burden, trailing only behind India. The statistics are staggering: in 2022 alone, over 1 million Indonesians fell ill with TB, with a significant proportion of cases attributed to tobacco smoking - an estimated 303,000 individuals. Tragically, TB claims the lives of nearly 141,000 Indonesians each year, disproportionately affecting marginalized communities and those entrenched in poverty.

Compounding Indonesia's TB crisis is the perva-

sive culture of smoking, which serves to exacerbate the epidemic. Data from the Global Adult Tobacco Survey underscores the scale of the challenge: in 2021, the prevalence of tobacco use among Indonesian adults stood at 34.5%, with an estimated 70 million smokers - a substantial increase from a decade prior. Notably, approximately two-thirds of adult males in Indonesia are smokers, with a staggering 96.7% prevalence observed among male TB patients. This alarming

trend positions Indonesia as a global epicenter for tobacco consumption, with far-reaching implications for public health, including the TB epidemic. The lethal synergy between TB and smoking is well-documented, with tobacco exerting profound effects on respiratory health and immune function. Smokers face heightened susceptibility to TB infection, with compromised lung function facilitating disease transmission and progression. Moreover, individuals who smoke

and contract TB are more likely to develop active disease and experience severe complications, leading to prolonged illness and elevated mortality rates. The toxic chemicals present in tobacco smoke further impair the immune system's ability to combat TB bacteria, exacerbating the severity of the disease.

In response to this dual crisis, global health initiatives such as the WHO End TB Strategy and the United Nations General Assembly

High-Level Meeting on TB have underscored the imperative of integrating tobacco control and TB management efforts. By aligning strategies at the primary care level, policymakers can leverage synergies to address both epidemics effectively.

Government commitment is paramount for driving progress in TB and tobacco control, necessitating robust policy development, implementation, and monitoring mechanisms. Efforts to eliminate tobacco smoking among TB patients represent a critical step towards advancing TB elimination goals. By prioritizing comprehensive tobacco cessation interventions within TB care settings, policymakers can mitigate the adverse effects of smoking on TB outcomes and improve patient outcomes.

Beyond policy interventions, public awareness and education campaigns play a pivotal role in shifting societal norms and reducing tobacco use prevalence. Community engagement initiatives, tailored to address the unique challenges faced by marginalized populations, can empower individuals to make informed choices about their health and well-being.

The seasonally adjusted HSBC India Services Business Activity Index fell from

61.2 in March to 60.8 in April, highlighting one of the strongest growth rates seen in just under 14 years. Survey members attributed the latest upturn in output to favourable economic conditions, demand strength and rising intakes of new work. In the Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) parlance, a print above 50 means expansion, while a score below 50 denotes contraction. "India's

service activity rose at a slightly softer pace in April, backed by a further rise in new orders, with a notable strength in domestic demand," said Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC. the series started in September 2014. On the job front, a few service providers in India showed an increased appetite for new hires in April, amid rising inflows of new business. The domestic indices traded in a range-bound manner, said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services. "The broader indices also witnessed major selling pressure due to valuation concerns and profit-booking," he added.

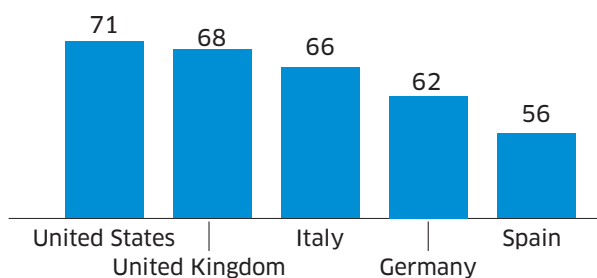

ED recovers huge cash during raids in Ranchi

RANCHI: The Enforcement Directorate on Monday claimed to have recovered a huge amount of "unaccounted" cash during searches at the premises of a domestic help allegedly linked to the secretary of a Jharkhand minister, official sources said.

Videos and photos shared by the sources showed officials of the central probe agency taking out wads of currency notes from large bags in a room. Some central force security personnel were also seen. The premises are alleged to be of the domestic help of Jharkhand

Rural Development Minister Alamgir Alam's personal secretary Sanjiv Lal.

ED sources said the cash was being counted to ascertain the exact amount which could range between Rs 20-30 crore. The cash is largely in the denomination of Rs 500 and some jewellery has also been recovered, the sources said.

Alam (70), is a Congress leader and represents the Pakur seat in the Jharkhand assembly.

The searches are linked to a money laundering case against the former chief engineer of the rural development department, Veerendra

Kumar Ram, who was arrested by the ED last year. "Veerendra Kumar Ram, posted as chief engineer in the Rural Works Department in Ranchi, had generated proceeds of crime in the name of commission from contractors in lieu of allotment of tenders to them," the agency had alleged in a statement

issued last year in April after it attached assets worth Rs 39 crore of the officer. "The proceeds of crime thus generated were used by Veerendra Kumar Ram and his family members to live a very lavish lifestyle," it said.

The money laundering case against Ram stems from a complaint of the Jharkhand anti-corruption bureau (ACB).

Responding to the raids, Alam said it would not be right to comment since the probe agency is still investigating the case. "Sanjiv Lal is a government employee. He is my personal secretary. Sanjiv Lal has already been a personal secretary

of two former ministers. There are several government employees and we usually appoint personal secretaries based on experience. It is not right to comment on the raids before the ED investigation is completed," he said.

"Corruption is not ending in Jharkhand. This money during elections indicates that there is a plan to spend this money in the elections. The Election Commission should take action on this," said Jharkhand BJP spokesperson Pratul Shahdev.

Another ED team is conducting raids in the Bariatu, Morhabadi, and Bodia areas.

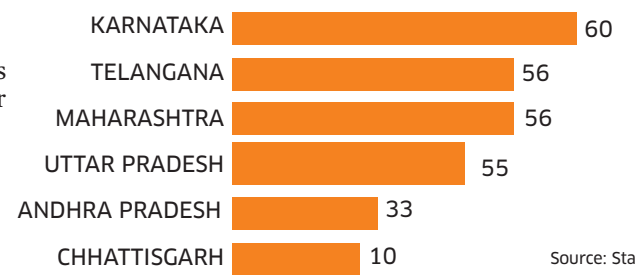

MEDICAL COLLEGES IN STATES (TOTAL NUMBER)



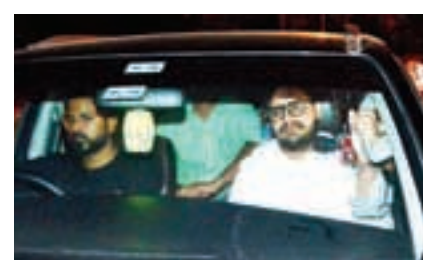

CISCE results: Girls outshine boys yet again

The pass percentage for Class 10 is 99.47, while it is 98.19 for Class 12.

NEW DELHI: Girls outshone boys yet again in Class 10 and 12 board exams conducted by the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE), while the pass percentage for both the classes recorded an increase. The results were announced Monday morning.

The pass percentage for Class 10 is 99.47, while it is 98.19 for Class 12. Last year, the respective pass percentage was 98.94 and 96.93. "In Class 10, the pass percentage of boys is 99.31 per cent while that of girls is 99.65 per cent. Similarly, boys have achieved a pass percentage of 97.53 per cent in class 12 exams while the pass percentage of girls stood at 98.92 per cent," CISCE Chief Executive and Secretary Joseph Emmanuel said.

"We have discontinued the practice of issuing merit lists for board exams from this year. The move is aimed at avoiding unhealthy competition among students," he added. The CBSE had last year stopped the practice of announcing merit lists for the both these board classes.

During the pandemic, when board exams were not conducted due to closure of schools and students were marked using alternative evaluation methods, both CBSE and CISCE had not issued any merit list. However, the practice was resumed after the schools reopened. In Class 10, the best-performing schools abroad are from Indonesia, Singapore and Dubai with a pass percentage of 100.

No breakthrough in terror attack

JAMMU: A breakthrough eluded the security forces in the Poonch terrorist attack on a convoy of Indian Air Force even as a massive search operation in a vast area of the Jammu and Kashmir district entered the third day on Monday, officials said. More than 20 persons were detained for questioning as the security forces are gathering clues to neutralise the terrorists who fled into nearby dense forests after carrying out the ambush near Shahsitar in Surankote area on Saturday evening. Five IAF personnel were injured in the attack.

Indian relay teams secure Paris Olympics qualification

NASSAU: Indian men's and women's 4x400m relay teams secured their spots for the Paris Olympics, finishing second in their respective heats at the World Athletics Relays in Nassau. The women's team comprising Rupal Chaudhary, M R Poovamma, Jyothika Sri Dandi, and Subha Venkatesan, clocked 3:29.35, while the men's team, featuring Muhammed Anas Yahiya, Muhammed

Ajmal, Arokia Rajiv, and Amoj Jacob, finished with a time of 3:03.23. Despite not achieving their best timings, their focus remained on securing Olympic qualification. The Indian men's team, renowned for breaking Asian records, secured their berth after a fantastic anchor-leg run by Amoj Jacob. Their journey towards Paris included impressive performances at the Tokyo Olympics and the 2023 World Championships. The women's team,



despite finishing fifth in the first-round qualifying heat, rallied to secure their place for Paris.

India's participation in the mixed 4x400m relay was uncertain due to Rajesh Ramesh's absence after suffering muscle cramps. Ramesh's versatility had him competing in both the mixed and men's relays on Sunday. The women's 4x400m team will make a return to the Olympics after missing out on Tokyo, marking their eighth appearance since 1984. For the men's team, this will be their fourth Olympic participation since Sydney 2000.

PCB promised \$100,000 reward for T20 WC victory

LAHORE: Each member of Pakistan's T20 World Cup squad will get USD 100,000 if the team wins the ICC event in June in Americas, the country's cricket board announced on Sunday. The announcement was made by the PCB chief Mohsin Naqvi after spending nearly two hours with the players here before their departure for the away T20 series against Ireland and England on Monday night. Naqvi also said that the prize money held no importance compared to lifting the trophy, expressing the hope that the team would raise the Pakistan flag. He also told the players "not to care about anyone" but to just play for Pakistan and demonstrate teamwork, and, "God willing", victory will be gained by the team.

Spain's Prado Museum confirms rediscovery of lost Caravaggio

MADRID: Spain's Prado Museum on Monday confirmed that a painting that was due to be auctioned in Madrid in 2021 is in fact a work by Italian Baroque master Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio that was considered lost. It will be unveiled to the public for the first time in the museum later this month.

The Prado said in a statement on Monday the work titled "Ecce Homo" (Latin for Behold The Man) will go on display from May 27 until October as a special one-piece exhibition following an agreement with its new owner, who has not been identified.

Danish King Frederik and his Australian-born wife visit Sweden on their first official trip abroad



COPENHAGEN: Denmark's King Frederik X arrived in Stockholm on Monday with his Australian-born wife Queen Mary, as they begin their first official visit abroad as new Danish monarchs. The 55-year-old Frederik was proclaimed king on Jan 14 after his 83-year-old mother, Queen Margrethe II, who was Europe's longest-reigning monarch, abdicated.

In the Swedish capital, Frederik and Mary were first greeted by Crown Princess Victoria and her husband Prince Daniel, who boarded the Danish royal yacht Dannebrog.

They then took the gilded Swedish Royal Barge to shore and were wel-

comed there by King Carl XVI Gustaf, Sweden's longest-reigning monarch, and German-Brazilian-born Queen Silvia.

The welcome also included a cannon salute and music by Sweden's Royal Guards, lined up on the quay at the foot of the Swedish royal palace.

Relations between the two royal houses are close. Frederik's grandmother, Queen Ingrid who died in 2000, was a Swedish princess.

Boeing's Starliner will blast off for the International Space Station from Cape Canaveral in Florida. Starliner will carry Williams, 58, and Butch Wilmore to the International Space Station.

WASHINGTON: Indian-origin astronaut Sunita Williams is ready to fly into space for the third time on Tuesday as the pilot aboard Boeing's Starliner spacecraft in its first crewed test flight. Boeing's Starliner will blast off for the International Space Station from Cape Canaveral in Florida. Starliner will carry Williams, 58, and Butch Wilmore to the International Space Station, marking what could be a momentous and long-awaited victory for the beleaguered Boeing programme. The scheduled lift-off is set for 22:34 local time on

Monday (8:04 am IST on Tuesday)
"We are all here because we are all ready. Our friends and family have heard about it and we've talked about it and they are happy and proud that we are part of the process to fix it all," the BBC quoted Williams as saying. The mission has been delayed for several years because of setbacks in the spacecraft's development. If it is successful, it will become the second private firm able to provide crew transport to and from the ISS, alongside Elon Musk's SpaceX. Chad holds presidential election after military rule

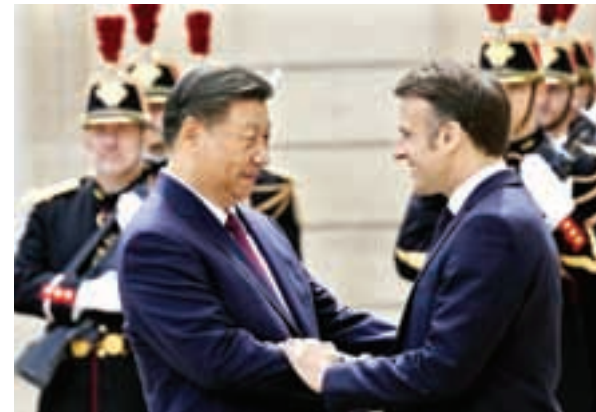
N'DJAMENA (CHAD): Voters in Chad headed to the polls on Monday to cast their ballot in a long delayed presidential election that is set to end three years of military rule under interim president, Mahamat Deby Itno. Deby Itno seized power after his father who ran the country for more than three decades was killed fighting rebels in 2021. Last year, the government announced it was extending the 18-month transition for two more years, which provoked protests across the country. There are 10 candidates on the ballot, including a woman. Analysts say Deby Itno is expected to emerge among the front runners. The main opposition figure Yaya Dillo, the current president's cousin, was killed in February.

Macron sets trade and Ukraine as top priority

United Kingdom facing 'disaster' of hung Parliament

LONDON: Prime Minister Rishi Sunak warned on Monday that an analysis of the local election results shows the country is headed for a hung Parliament led by the Opposition Labour Party, which "would be a disaster for Britain". The 43-year-old British Indian leader told "The Times" in the wake of

a debacle for the governing Conservative Party, who lost hundreds of local council seats and key mayoralities across England in results over the weekend, that he was bitterly disappointed but determined to fight back. He sought to paint a less bleak picture for party rebels, demanding a change of political course to win back voters in time for a general



election, expected later this year. "These results suggest we are heading for a hung parliament with Labour as the largest party," Sunak told the newspaper. "[Labour Leader] Keir Starmer propped up in Downing Street by the SNP [Scottish National Party], Liberal Democrats and the Greens would be a disaster for Britain.
