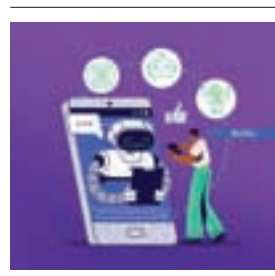
A bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, however, permitted the CBI to continue with its investigation and probe even members of the state cabinet.
The top court, however, asked the CBI not to take any precipitate action like arresting a suspect during the investigation. Earlier in the day, it

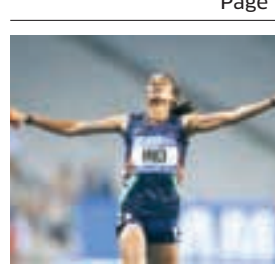

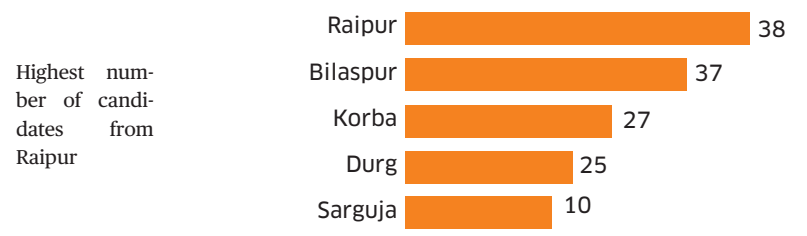

FINE IMPOSED RERA imposes fine of 18.82 lakh on Real Estate Project Promoters in Chhattisgarh

RAIPUR: In a significant development, the Chhattisgarh Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA) has levied fines totaling Rs. 18.82 lakh on promoters of real estate projects for violating provisions outlined in the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016. Under Section 4 (2) (I) (D) of the Act, promoters are obligated to deposit funds received from allottees into specified accounts and utilize them in accordance with RERA stipulations. However, investigations conducted by the Registrar, Chhattisgarh RERA, revealed non-compliance by promoters, prompting stringent action. The projects implicated in the violation include V.I.P. City Sector-01 Extension, V.I.P. City Sector-02, and others. Despite clear directives, the RERA specified accounts associated with these projects were found to be improperly operated. Subsequently, a case was registered against the non-compliant promoters on March 11, 2024, under Section 60 of the Act.

It was found that men were seated in the open waiting area on the reserved platform designated for women.

RAIPUR: The South East Central Railway Raipur Division has designated a suitable location on the platform for waiting female passengers under the name 'Akshita,' where facilities for sitting during train waiting along with other necessary amenities have been provided for female travelers.

Senior Divisional Commercial Manager Avadhesh Kumar Trivedi conducted an unannounced inspection of the station in disguise and found that men were seated in the open waiting area on the reserved platform designated as the Akshita Safe Bubble for women. If men are found sitting in the waiting area designated for women, passengers are advised to immediately call 139 for notification.

As a step towards women empowerment and to provide a safe and secure feeling to solo female travelers during railway platform waiting, it was necessary to provide such a place where they feel safe. With this objective, South East Central Railway Raipur

Railway Division has designated such a place on its important stations like Raipur, Durg, and Bhilai, usually located in the middle of the platform, near Railway Protection Force posts, station masters' offices, etc. Here, CCTV cameras are mandatory, and facilities like water are nearby. Considering the above facilities at these stations, places were marked and barricaded to create a safe bubble. Female railway

personnel of the Railway Protection Force continuously monitor these locations. Entry of male passengers is prohibited in this area, which allows solo waiting women to comfortably spend their waiting time on the platform without any hesitation. Due to being marked, the attention of every railway employee remains on this safe bubble, making it suitable for women from a security perspective. The Railway Protection Force Control Office continuously monitors this location through CCTV cameras.

Two arrested for hunting bear with potash bomb

The anti-poaching team arrested two persons from Odisha border Kalimati for allegedly hunting bears with potash bombs in Udanti Sita River Sanctuary area.

GARIABAND : The arrest comes 25 days after the incident. Both arrested persons used to hunt bears by purchasing bombs from hunters of Madhya Pradesh. Gariaband Police Cyber Cell played important role in this action against boachers. The arrested persons are suspected to be involved in a big gang operating in Central India.

On Monday, confidential information was received that a bear has been hunted with a potash bomb under the hill in room number

1243 of Indagaon (Ghurvaturi) buffer zone. Acting on this information the anti-poaching team arrested Hazari, son of Tulsiram and Uttam, son of Khageshwar. The action was taken under the direction of Sudhir Agrawal, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife), Raipur Chhattisgarh, Vishvesh Kumar Jha, Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife), Field Director Udanti Sitanadi Tiger Reserve Raipur and Varun Jain, Deputy Director Udanti Sitanadi Tiger Reserve Gariaband. Both arrested persons were brought to the office of Assistant Director Udanti (Mainpur) for questioning. Both talked about hunting the bear with potash bombs.

They told that, a year ago, they purchased one potash bomb for Rs 500 from a person of hunter community who had come from Katni, Madhya Pradesh.

According to Section 77 of The Representation of The People Act, 1951, every candidate should provide the correct account of their expenditures from the date of filing nomination to the date of results, the official said.

abheji, a lot of tendu leaves are plucked. Tendu leaves are given more importance than paddy.

According to the information received, this year the payment of tendu leaves will be made through banks, since the bank is located at a few places on the main road, due to which the villagers have to travel from a distance of 100 kilometers and make rounds of the crowd in the banks for 4 to 5 days. Due to which the villagers are troubled.

Their time and money

is also wasted. Therefore, a demand has been made to pay for tendu leaves in cash.

Last year also, tendu leaves worth more than 50 crore rupees were plucked in Sukma district, for which the villagers were paid in cash. This year also the villagers should be paid in cash for plucking tendu leaves.

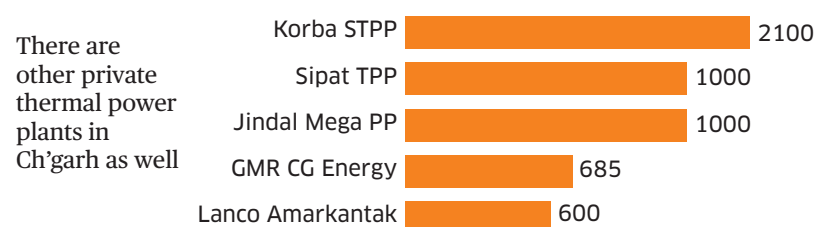

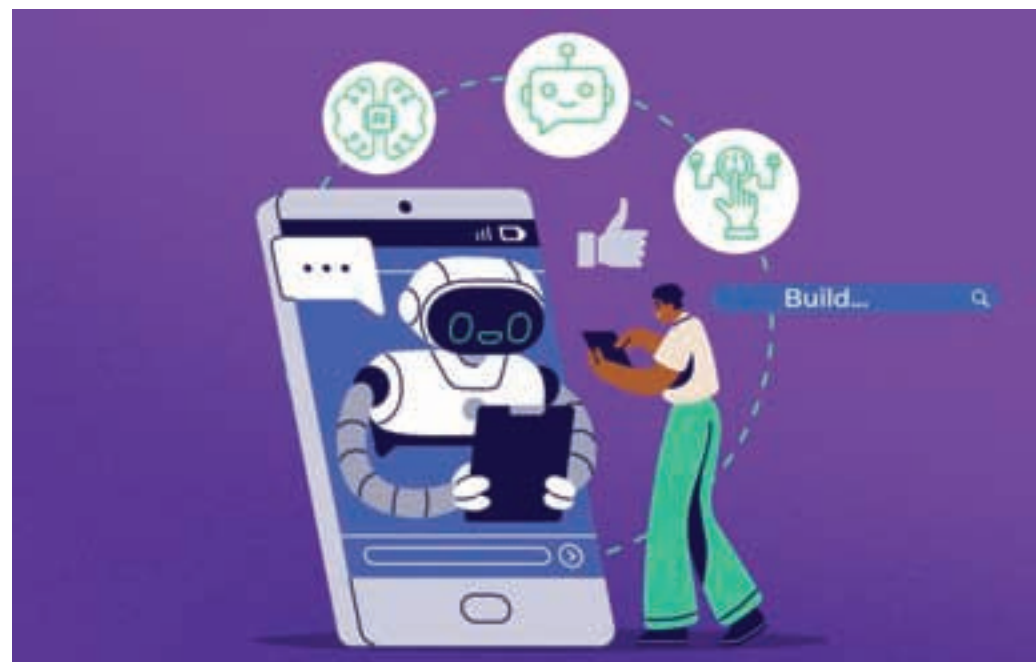

'Govt adopted pro-poor approach in GST execution'

In a post on X (formerly Twitter), Sitharaman said without GST, states' revenue from subsumed taxes from FY 2018-19 to 2023-24 would have been Rs 37.5 lakh crore.

NEW DELHI: Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said the government has adopted "a pro-poor approach" while implementing Goods and Services Tax, and despite lower tax rates the revenues as a percentage of GDP have reached the pre-GST level. In a post on X (formerly Twitter), Sitharaman said without GST, states' revenue from sub-

sumed taxes from FY 2018-19 to 2023-24 would have been Rs 37.5 lakh crore. With GST, states' actual revenue amounted to Rs 46.56 lakh crore. "Despite the GST rate being less than the prescribed Revenue Neutral Rate and COVID-19 affecting the revenues, GST collections (as a percentage of GDP) have now reached the levels they were before GST (both net and gross). "This demonstrates that the Centre & States, collec-

tively, through better tax administration, are able to collect the same revenue with a lower burden on our taxpayers," she said. GST, which was rolled out on July 1, 2017, had subsumed 17 taxes and 13 cesses into a 5-tier structure, thereby simplifying the tax regime. The turnover threshold for registration rose to Rs 40 lakh for goods and Rs 20 lakh for services (from Rs 5 lakh on average under VAT).

GST also reduced 495 different submissions (challan, forms, declarations, etc) across states to just 12. Sitharaman in a detailed post on GST talked about the origin of GST and its role in streamlining the indirect tax system. She also penned down how GST has benefitted people through a pro-poor approach, while underscoring its role in promoting cooperative and fiscal federalism.

BPCL, HPCL to consider bonus share issue this week

NEW DELHI: Oil refining and fuel marketing companies Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) will this week consider issuing bonus shares to their shareholders. In separate filings to the stock exchanges, the two firms said their boards will meet on May 9 to consider and approve the issuance of bonus shares. A bonus issue, also known as a scrip issue or a capitalization issue, is an offer of free additional shares to existing shareholders. It increases a company's outstanding shares but not its market capitalisation. Companies issue bonus shares to make their stock more attractive for retail investors, provide an alternative to a cash dividend, and/or reflect a position of financial health. If approved, this would be the fifth bonus issue by BPCL, the last being in July 2017.

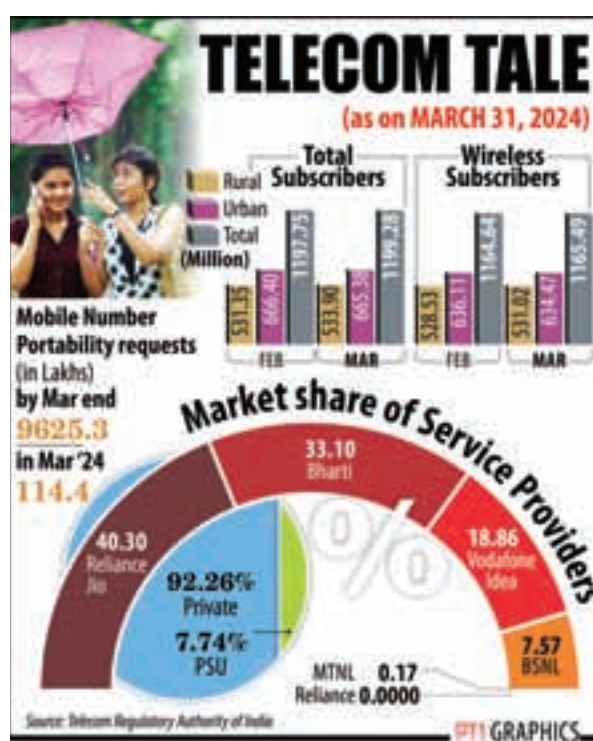
NEW DELHI: Telecom operators Reliance Jio, Bharti Airtel, and Vodafone Idea have submitted their application to bid for Rs 96,317-crore spectrum auction, which is scheduled to start from June 6, according to sources. The last auction held in 2022 had the Adani Group firm as a surprise bidder but there is no new name for the upcoming auction. "Reliance Jio, Bharti Airtel, and Vodafone Idea have submitted applications for spectrum auction," an official source said. The government will auction eight spectrum bands for mobile phone services at a base price

of about Rs 96,317 crore. All the available spectrum in the 800 MHz, 900 MHz, 1,800 MHz, 2,100 MHz, 2,300 MHz, 2,500 MHz, 3,300 MHz, and 26 GHz bands are part of the auction. The total frequencies being put under the hammer are valued at Rs 96,317 crore on base price. The spectrum will be assigned for 20 years and successful bidders will be allowed

to make payments in 20 equal annual instalments. The DoT has provided an option to surrender the spectrum acquired through the upcoming

ArcelorMittal Q1 net income falls 10 pc to USD 900 million

NEW DELHI: Global steel giant ArcelorMittal posted 10 per cent fall in net income at USD 900 million for the first quarter ended March 31, 2024. It had posted a net income of USD 1 billion for the year-ago quarter, the company said in a statement.

Luxembourg-based ArcelorMittal is the world's largest integrated steel and mining company. It follows January-December fiscal year.

The company said it had a "net debt of USD 4.8 billion at the end of the quarter compared to a net debt of USD 2.9 billion on December 31, 2023. Over the past 12 months net debt has declined by USD 0.4 billion despite strategic growth capex investments of USD 1.6 billion and returns to shareholders totalling USD 1.7 billion." Capex in Q1 2024 includes USD 400 million on strategic growth projects, which are estimated to add approximately USD 1.8 billion to the company's EBITDA by the end of 2026. **PTI**

In Asian markets, Seoul, Tokyo and Shanghai settled with gains while Hong Kong ended lower. European markets

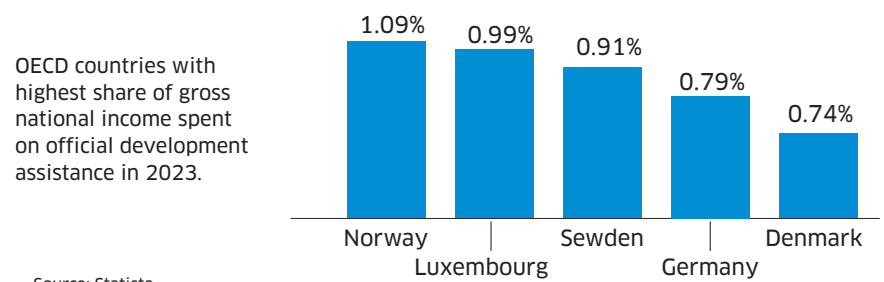

More than 50% patients face delay in discharge due to medioclim: Study

NEW DELHI: A new study from healthcare provider Pristyn Care found that 5 out of 10 patients face delays in discharge due to the time taken to process medical insurance claims. To alleviate the hassle experienced by health insurance policyholders, the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) is likely to introduce a 100% cashless hospital network that will include both empanelled and non-empanelled hospitals. According to PwC, the use of AI and ML in claims processing can reduce processing time by upto 90%, a report said. Commenting on the findings, Dr. Vaibhav Kapoor, Co-founder of Pristyn Care, said, "There is a huge gap between the intended ease of cashless health insurance and the reality experienced by policyholders. Despite 75% of survey respondents having cashless insurance, a significant number still face challenges during the claim process.

RICE EXPORT

India to export 14,000 tonnes of non-basmati white rice to Mauritius



NEW DELHI: The government on Monday permitted exports of 14,000 tonnes of non-basmati white rice to Mauritius. The export is permitted through National Cooperative Exports Limited (NCEL), the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) said in a notification. Though exports of non-basmati white rice have been banned since July 20, 2023 to boost domestic supply, exports are allowed on the basis of permission granted by the government to certain countries to meet their food security needs on request. "Export of 14,000 MT of non-basmati white rice to Mauritius has been permitted through NCEL," it said. **PTI**

Sebi rejects NSE's proposal to extend trading hours

NEW DELHI: Capital markets regulator Sebi has rejected a proposal by the National Stock Exchange (NSE) to extend the trading hours in the equity derivatives segment citing a lack of feedback from the stock brokers community. "Currently, there is no plan to extend the timings as Sebi has returned our applica-

tion as the stock brokers have not given the feedback that Sebi wanted. So, as of now, the extended time frame (plan) is shelved," NSE MD and CEO Ashishkumar Chauhan said in a post-earnings analysts call. This came after the NSE had urged Sebi to extend trading hours in the equity derivatives segment in a phased manner. This was aimed at potentially cur-



tailing the overnight risk arising from global information flow. Sriram Krishnan, Chief Business Development Officer of NSE, had told PTI in September that the bourse was planning a session from 6 pm to 9 pm after a break from the closure of the regular session from 9.15 am to 3.30 pm. Based on the response, a gradual extension of the market timing till 11.55 pm

was proposed on the lines of commodity derivatives. To begin with, only index derivatives in phase 1 were proposed to be available followed by single stock options and others. In 2018, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) allowed stock exchanges to set their trading hours in the equity derivatives segment between 9 am and 11.50 pm.

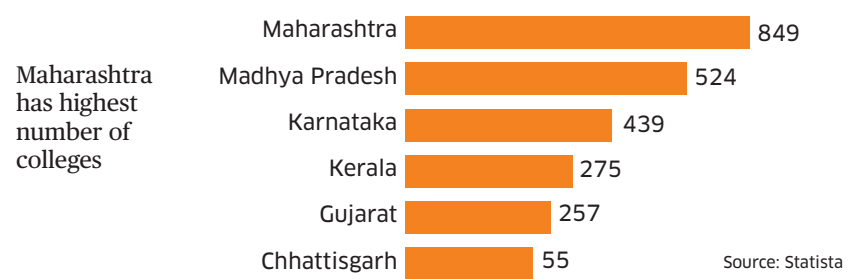

'Educate minors on 'virtual touch' and its dangers'

NEW DELHI: Teaching minors about 'good touch' and 'bad touch' is not enough in today's virtual world and children must be educated on the emerging concept of 'virtual touch' and its potential dangers, the Delhi High Court has said.

This involves teaching them appropriate online behaviour, recognising warning signs of predatory behaviour and understanding the importance of privacy settings and online boundaries.

"This court is constrained to note that in today's virtual modern world where virtual space

has also become a breeding ground of alleged virtual affections between teenagers, they are not equipped to deal with the potential dangers of human trafficking for prostitution and other side of crimes which exists in the virtual world," Justice Swarana Kanta Sharma said on Monday. The high court's observations came while dismissing a bail plea by a woman, Kamlesh Devi, accused of helping her son in sexually assaulting a minor girl after kidnapping her and forcing her into prostitution.

The 16-year-old was allegedly kidnapped by Rajiv who befriended her on social media and

kidnapped her when she came to meet him. The girl was taken to Madhya Pradesh and confined there for several days. She was allegedly sexually assaulted by the man and others.

It was also alleged that the girl was forced to marry a 45-year-old man in exchange for money. The teen alleged that the accused persons would

bring various men to the premises where she was confined and she was forced to present herself to these men for sexual gratification.

"Traditionally, efforts to protect minors from harm have focused on teaching them about 'good touch' and 'bad touch' in the physical realm. However, in today's virtual world, it is crucial to extend this education to encompass the concept of 'virtual touch'. Minors must be equipped with the knowledge and tools to navigate online interactions safely and recognise potential risks lurking in cyberspace," the court said. It added that just as children

are taught to exercise caution in the physical world, efforts must be made to teach them to develop critical thinking skills to assess the credibility of online contacts and safeguard their personal information. "Moreover, parents, guardians and educators play a crucial role in fostering digital literacy and promoting responsible online conduct among minors. By fostering open communication channels and providing guidance on navigating the digital landscape, adults can empower children to make informed decisions and protect themselves from online threats," the court said.

Man stabbed to death over personal enmity

MUMBAI: A 27-year-old man was killed and his friend injured in a knife attack outside a polling booth in Maharashtra's Dharashiv district, where polling is underway in the third phase of the general election on Tuesday, police said.

The attack was due to personal enmity and had nothing to do with the elections, an official said.

The incident occurred outside the polling booth in Patsangvi village of Bhoom tehsil around 11.30 am, he said.

The victim, Samadhan Nanasaheb Pawar, and his friend were standing outside the polling booth when they were attacked by the accused, Gaurav alias Lalya Naiknavare, he said. The duo sustained serious injuries in the attack, he said. Pawar was rushed to a private hospital in Barshi, where he succumbed to injuries.

West Nile fever grips Kerala: districts to remain vigilant

Main symptoms of infection are headache, fever, muscle aches, dizziness.

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: The Kerala government on Tuesday said that West Nile fever cases have been reported from Thrissur, Malappuram and Kozhikode districts of the state.

State Health Minister Veena George, in a statement, confirmed that cases of the viral infection have been reported in the state and that all the districts have been asked to be vigilant.

As part of the vigil against the viral fever, spread by the Culex species of mosquitoes, the Minister has ordered that steps be taken for mosquito control by destroying their breeding grounds, the statement said. The minister said that there was no need to be concerned, but requested anyone showing signs of fever or other symptoms of the West Nile infection to seek treatment immediately.

The main symptoms of West Nile infection are headache, fever, muscle aches, dizziness and loss of memory, but most patients do not experience these, she said.

Some people experience symptoms like fever, headache, vomiting and itching and in one per cent of the cases, it can lead to

brain damage resulting in unconsciousness and sometimes death, the minister's statement said.

But the death rate is relatively low compared to Japanese encephalitis which shows similar symptoms and is more dangerous. It said that instructions to begin pre-monsoon cleaning activities were already given in a high-level meeting held last week and now the District Medical Officers (DMOs) have been directed to further intensify the same.

Awareness drive about teenage pregnancies of girls

Drive was aimed at educating girls to remain alert and be cautious.

BHUBANESWAR: Ahead of summer vacations in schools, an awareness campaign was undertaken by the Odisha government at hostels, educating girls about sexual harassment which was found to be rampant, resulting in teenage pregnancies, when they are at home for holidays, a senior official said.

The ST and SC Development, Minorities and Backward Classes Welfare Department undertook the drive, which started last week and ended on Monday, in around 5,800 hostels run by the department, targeting over 2.5 lakh girls before summer vacation, which officially started on April 25 but most of them left for home on Tuesday after improvement in weather, he said, adding schools are likely to reopen in the second week of June.

"The drive was aimed at educating girls to remain alert and be cautious while visiting their homes after it was noticed that many girls faced sexual harassment by close family and relatives during summer vacations, resulting in

teenage pregnancies.

"Such incidents happen when parents remain outside for livelihood and the girls are left alone at home in a vulnerable state," the official said. Besides creating awareness among girls on how to protect themselves and understand the difference between 'good touch' and 'bad touch', the department has also launched 'Mo Parikalpana' initiative, under which the parents

are informed what they should do to safeguard their daughters while they are alone at home and their issues are heard, the department's secretary Roopa Roshan Sahoo said.

Another official said that 'Mo Parikalpana' is like a listening window to capture the voices from the ground so that the observations could lead to policy action. The department has also asked the sexual harassment committees in the hostels to remain alert.

Conduct safety audit of Bombay High Court building

A special bench of Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and Justices B R Gavai and J B Pardiwala also asked the government to expedite draw-

ings of the site earmarked for constructing new high court building in Mumbai. Observing that the state government "must act with alacrity" to fulfil the needs for facilities in the high court, the bench asked the state PWD to take up the matter in right earnest. It also said the high court may consult the state PWD and others on expediting the drawings. "In order to ensure the structural safety of the existing premises, the State PWD will forthwith conduct a safety audit and apprise it on the next hearing of the steps taken on that regard," the bench said. SC exercised its suo motu (on its own) jurisdiction in taking note of an April 29 letter petition of Bombay Bar Association president Nitin Thakker and other bar leaders.

Public figures must act sensibly

NEW DELHI: It is imperative for celebrities and public figures to act responsibly while endorsing a consumer product as advertisers and endorsers are equally responsible for issuing misleading advertisements, the Supreme Court said on Tuesday. Clamping down on misleading advertisements, the apex court directed that before an advertisement is permitted to be issued, a self-declaration be obtained from the advertisers on the line of the Cable Television Networks Rules, 1994. Rule 7 of the 1994 rules deals with advertisement code and stipulates that advertisements carried in the cable service shall be designed to be in conformity with the laws and should not offend morality, decency and religious susceptibilities of the subscribers.

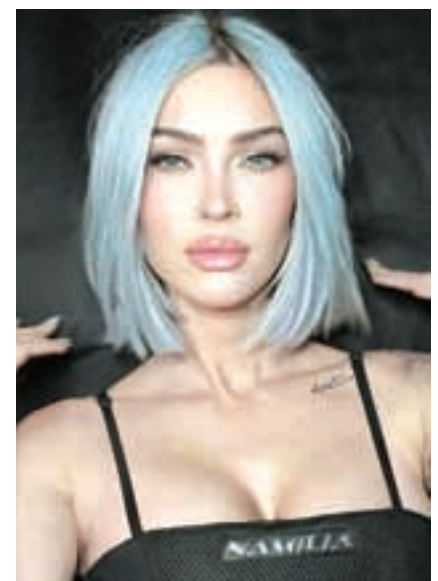

Target of women's 4x400m team is to break NR

NEW DELHI: The senior-most member of the Indian women's 4x400m relay quartet that booked a Paris Games berth in Bahamas, MR Poovamma feels that the team can produce the country's best-ever show in the Olympics and break the 20-year-old national record at the French capital in August.

"We wanted to better the timing but we could not do it. We will do it this season in the upcoming competitions," Poovamma told PTI.

"This time, the target for the team in the Paris Olympics is to break the national record, reach the finals and better the earlier best. The national record is 20 years old and we have to better it. This team can do it."

Poovamma said the Paris Olympics qualification of the women's 4x400m relay team should not be considered as a surprise result as the quartet was "sure" of achieving the feat.

"We knew that we had a good chance to qualify for the Olympics in men's and women's 4x400m relay. We were sure about it," said the 33-year-old athlete. She said the decision to reach one month before the event also helped in the

team's quest for Olympics qualification as the move gave them enough time to acclimatise to the conditions. "Because of visa issues, I could reach 20 days before competition but others reached here one month before the event. That really helped. For example, it is too windy here and you cannot suddenly come and do well here. It is good that we came here early and adapted to the conditions. "Even in food also, we were provided almost similar to Indian

food. I was thinking that it was like the food I used to get in Thiruvananthapuram (where the team trained before going to Bahamas)."

Poovamma said she continued full-time training during the two-year ban for a doping offence committed in 2021, before she finally returned to action during the Goa National Games last year.

"Had I taken break in training during the ban period, it would have been really difficult to come back."

Manika Batra stuns world no.2 from China, advances to Saudi Smash Pre-quarters

Five Indian youth boxers shine at ASBC Asian U-22 & Youth Championships

ASTANA: Five youth Indian boxers Brijesh Tamta, Aryan Hooda, Yashwardhan Singh, Laxmi and Nisha put up impressive performances to clinch gold medals at the ASBC Asian U-22 & Youth Boxing Championships here on Monday. Brijesh gave India its first gold medal of the tournament with a unanimous 5-0 win over Tajikistan's Muminov Muinkhodzha in the men's 48kg final. Aryan (51kg) continued the momentum with an equally dominant 5-0 victory against Kyrgyzstan's Kamilov Zafarbek. Yashwardhan Singh (63.5kg) had to work hard against Gafurov Ruslan of Tajikistan as both the boxers showed great attacking intent but it was the Indian who ultimately clinched the contest with a 4-1 verdict. In the women's category, reigning junior world champion Nisha grabbed the yellow metal in the 52kg category as she outperformed Kazakhstan's Otynbay Bagzhan in a 5-0 win. **PTI**

Israeli forces seize Gaza side of Rafah border crossing

CAIRO: An Israeli tank brigade seized control on Tuesday of the Gaza Strip side of the Rafah border crossing with Egypt as Israel moved forward with an offensive in the southern city even as cease-fire negotiations with Hamas remain on a knife's edge. The development came after hours of whiplash in the Israel-Hamas war, with the militant group on Monday saying it accepted an Egyptian-Qatari mediated cease-fire proposal. Israel, meanwhile, insisted the deal did not meet its core demands. The high-stakes diplomatic moves and military brinkmanship left a glimmer of hope alive – if only barely – for an accord that could bring at least a pause in the 7-month-old war that has devastated the Gaza Strip. COLOMBO: Sri Lanka has approved a 20-year power purchase agreement between the island nation's government and Adani Green Energy for the development of 484 megawatt wind power stations in the northeast region. "The negotiated tariff rate of USD 0.0826 per kilo watt hour is to be paid in local rupees on the prevailing exchange rate at the time of payment," energy minister Kanachana Wijesekera said in a post on social media platform X. He added that the purchasing cost would be below the current average cost of energy at 39.02 Sri Lanka rupees per kilo watt hour. According to a cabinet note, the development of wind power stations of 484 Mega Watt in Mannar and Poonerin had already been granted cabinet approval in March 2022. PTI

The Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei and Taiwan have counterclaims. The three Indian naval ships were welcomed by personnel of the Singapore Navy and the High Commissioner of India in Singapore. The "visit is poised to further strengthen the longstanding friendship and cooperation between the two maritime nations through a series of engagements and activities," the Ministry of Defence in New Delhi said in a statement.

Bugging equipment found in room where Polish government was to meet

WARSAW: Bugging devices were found in a room where Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk was scheduled to meet with his Cabinet on Tuesday, an official said. The Cabinet ministers were meeting in Katowice, a southwestern Polish city where Tusk was attending an economic conference. Jacek Dobrzynski, the spokesperson for the head of Poland's secret services, said a routine security check uncovered equipment that could be used for recording or eavesdropping. He wrote on social media on Tuesday morning that "the State Protection Service, in cooperation with the Internal Security Agency, detected and dismantled devices that could be used for eavesdropping in the room where the meeting of the Council of Ministers is to be held today in Katowice." "The services are conducting further activities in this matter," he added. The Cabinet traditionally holds a weekly meeting in Warsaw but exceptionally held it in Katowice due to the European Economic Congress taking place there, at which European Commission president Ursula von der Leyen delivered a speech. Tusk and the government ministers went to Katowice on Tuesday morning by train. PTI
